The University of Iowa soccer team returns home to the Iowa Soccer Complex this weekend for a pair of Big Ten Conference contests. The Hawkeyes host Ohio State on Friday at 7 p.m. (CT) before facing No. 12 Penn State on Sunday at 1 p.m.

POSTGAME FIREWORKS

Friday night's game against Ohio State is Community Appreciation Night at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The first 100 fans will receive a free Iowa soccer scarf and there will be postgame fireworks.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- The Buckeyes, who are receiving votes in the latest NSCAA top 25 poll, bring a 5-2-2 record into Friday's match. Last weekend, Ohio State went 0-1-1 at home, falling to Minnesota, 2-1, before tying Wisconsin in double overtime on Sept. 20.
- Ohio State has scored 15 goals in nine games this season with Nichelle Prince leading the team with three goals and four assists. Nine different Buckeye players have scored -- four of which have multiple goals.
- Three Buckeyes have seen time in goal in 2015. Jillian McVicker has posted a 4-2-2 record with one shutout in nine starts. She has a 0.89 goals against average with 17 saves.
- Ohio State is led by head coach Lori Walker, who is in her 19th season. Buckeye assistant coach Nick Flohre spent two years (2012-13) on the Iowa coaching staff under Ron Rainey.





HEAD COACH DAVE DILANNI

Dave Dilanni is entering his second season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 235-25-19 (.876) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .876 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his first season in Iowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, Iowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. Iowa's defense also was in the top-35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).

Academically, the Hawkeyes garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award for an eighth straight season and nine soccer student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. Seniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott were also received Scholar All-Region recognition.

OHIO STATE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- The Buckeyes lead the all-time series, 11-6-1.
- Iowa and Ohio State have split the last four meetings. Iowa won 2-1 last season in Columbus.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

- The Nittany Lions, who are ranked 12th in the NSCAA poll, bring a 6-2-1 record into the weekend. Penn State went 1-1 last weekend, downing Wisconsin, 4-0, before falling, 1-0, to Minnesota on Sept. 20.
- Penn State has scored 17 goals in nine games this season with Mallory Weber leading the team with five goals and two assists. Seven different Penn State players have scored.
- The Nittany Lions' Britt Eckerstrom has started every game this season in goal. She has a 0.56 goals against average with 29 saves and three shutouts.
- Penn State is led by head coach Erica Walsh, who is in her ninth season.

PENN STATE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series, 20-2-0.
- Iowa posted its first two wins of the series in 2013, winning 3-2 at home Oct. 25 before winning 1-0 at the Big Ten Tournament.
- Penn State edged Iowa, 2-1, last season in University Park.

QUICK HITTERS

- Iowa will face its first ranked foe of the season when Penn State comes to Iowa City on Sunday. The Hawkeyes went 1-2-1 against ranked teams last season with a win over No. 23 Rutgers, 1-0, at the Big Ten Tournament and a draw at No. 12 Wisconsin.
- Senior Hannah Clark currently ranks third in the Big Ten in saves per game (4.22) and fourth in saves (38) and save percentage (.864).
- Iowa is outscoring opponents by a margin of 14-6 and is outshooting opposing teams, 132-114, in nine games this season, which includes a 68-44 advantage in shots on goal.

- Junior Bri Toelle leads the Big Ten in shots per game (5.67) and is second in the league in shots (51). Toelle, who has scored four goals this season, is tied for fifth in the league in goals.
- Sophomore Karly Stuenkel is second on the team with three goals and two assists for eight points this season. She notched her first game-winning goal in Iowa's, 2-1, overtime victory over UNI.
- Eight of Iowa's 14 goals have come in the second half or later, with seven goals scored in the second and one overtime goal.
- The Hawkeyes have used a different starting lineup in 8-of-9 contests. Five players -- Hannah Clark, Brooke Backes, Kyrie Seying, Rachele Armand, and Amanda Lulek -- have started every game.
- The Hawkeyes finished nonconference play with a 6-1 record. Iowa is 36-2 in the nonconference during the last five seasons.
- Freshmen Rose Ripslinger and Hannah Brobst made their Iowa debuts Sept. 13 against UIC.
- Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 -- Iowa's first Freshman of the Week honoree since 2012.

LAST GAME

Iowa lost a heartbreaker at Michigan, 1-0, on Sept. 20. The Wolverines scored on a header in the final minute of the game.

CLARK EYES HISTORY

Senior Hannah Clark has been in goal for 35 wins in her UI soccer career. With her next victory, Clark will surpass Emily Moran as the winningest goalkeeper in program history. Clark is also the school record holder in career shutouts (26), and is third all-time with 254 saves.

INSTANT OFFENSE

Freshman Alina Magruder, who made her first career start at Michigan on Sept. 20, has three goals in 226 minutes in 2015. She is averaging 25 minutes of action a game. Magruder scored her third goal Sept. 18 at Michigan State.



B1G DEFENSE

The Hawkeyes allowed three goals during their nonconference slate, tied for the second-fewest in the league. Senior Hannah Clark is tied for fifth in the conference in goals against average (0.66) and tied for fifth in shutouts (4).

TOELLE PACES TEAM

Junior forward Bri Toelle is leading the team with four goals, four assists, and 12 points early in the 2015 season. The four goals tied a career-high and the Virginia native matched her career high points she set as a freshman in 2013.

TOELLE TIES PROGRAM RECORD

Junior Bri Toelle tied the school record for single game assists after notching three assists in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Nebraska Omaha on Aug. 23. The total is the high water mark in the Big Ten this season.

Toelle shares the Iowa school record with Morgan Showalter (Sept. 23, 2008) and Jenna Sorensen (Sept. 5, 1997).

QUICK STRIKES

- Freshman Hannah Brobst notched her first career goal, minutes into her first game as a Hawkeye in Iowa's 3-0, win over UIC on Sept. 13.
- Iowa scored two goals in the span of 1:39 seconds in its 2-1 win over Utah State.
- The Hawkeyes scored their third and fourth goals in a span of 29 seconds in their 4-0 win over Omaha on Aug. 23.

MAGRUDER NAMED B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

University of Iowa midfielder Alina Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 after scoring a pair of goals in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Omaha. The honor is the first of Magruder's career and she is the first Hawkeye freshman to earn the weekly conference honor since Hannah Clark on Oct. 8, 2012.

TEAM CAPTAIN

Senior Hannah Clark has been named Iowa's team captain for the 2015 season. She is joined on Iowa's Leadership Council by senior Sarah Mazur, juniors Corey Burns and Amanda Lulek, and redshirt freshman Aubree Larson.

B1G IN THE POLLS

Penn State, Rutgers and Ohio State are ranked in the NSCAA Top 25 poll as of Sept. 22.

Penn State is ranked No. 4, Rutgers was voted No. 15, and Ohio State sits at No. 20. Wisconsin (8) and Michigan (2) are receiving votes.

2014 IN REVIEW
