#### **SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE**

- The Spartans bring a 4-1-2 record into Friday's match. Last weekend, Michigan State went 1-0-1 at home, tying San Francisco, 1-1 in double overtime, before downing New Mexico, 1-0, on Sept. 13.
- Michigan State has scored nine goals in seven games this season with Kirsten Evans leading the team with two goals—both of which were game winners. Eight different Spartan players have scored.
- Gabrielle Gauruder has played every minute in goal for the Spartans, posting a 0.80 goals against average, while making 30 saves and posting two shutouts. She has allowed six goals in 677 minutes in goal.
- Michigan State is led by head coach Tom Saxton, who is in his 25th season.

#### **MICHIGAN STATE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES**

- The Spartans lead the all-time series between the two schools, posting a 6-8-5 record.
- lowa has won the last two meetings, 1-0.
- Last year, the Hawkeyes topped the Spartans, 1-0, in East Lansing --marking the first time lowa has won at Michigan State since 1999 when the Hawkeyes defeated the Spartans, 1-0.
- Three of the last six games have gone into double-overtime.
- Michigan State has not scored a goal against the Hawkeyes since a 1-1 tie in double overtime on Oct. 31, 2010.







#### **HEAD COACH DAVE DIIANNI**

Dave Dilanni is entering his second season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 235-25-19 (.876) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .876 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his first season in lowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, lowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. lowa's defense also was in the top-35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).

Academically, the Hawkeyes garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award for an eighth straight season and nine soccer student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. Seniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott were also received Scholar All-Region recognition.

#### **SCOUTING MICHIGAN**

- The Wolverines, who are receiving votes in the Sept. 15 NSCAA rankings, bring a 5-3-0 record into the weekend. Michigan went 1-1 last weekend, downing Central Michigan, 3-1, before falling, 2-0, at No. 13 Notre Dame on Sept. 13.
- Michigan has scored 22 goals in eight games this season with Taylor Timko leading the team with six goals and one assist.
   Ten different Michigan players have scored.
- Michigan currently leads the conference in assists (18), goals (22), shots (156) and points (62).
- The Wolverines have been outshooting opponents, 156-52-- 72 of which were on goal.
- Michigan is led by head coach Greg Ryan, who is in his eighth season.

#### **MICHIGAN VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES**

- The Wolverines lead the all-time series against the Hawkeyes, posting a 15-3-2 record.
- It is the second straight year lowa has traveled to Ann Arbor. The Wolverines won 4-2 last season.
- lowa's 1-0 victory over the Wolverines in the 2013 Big Ten Tournament marked the first Hawkeye win in the series since 2009.

#### **QUICK HITTERS**

- Junior Bri Toelle leads the Big Ten in shots (48), shots per game (6.86), assists (four) and assists per game (0.57). Toelle, who has scored at least one goal in three of the last five contests, is tied for fifth in the league in goals (4).
- Sophomore Karly Stuenkel is second on the team with three goals, one assist, and seven points this season. She notched her first game-winning goal in lowa's, 2-1, overtime victory over UNI.
- lowa is out-shooting its opponents, 121-73, in seven games this season, which includes a 61-29 advantage in shots on goal. The 121 shots are the third-most in the Big Ten.
- Eight of Iowa's 13 goals have come in the second half or later, with seven goals scored in the second and one overtime goal.

- The Hawkeyes have used a different starting lineup in 6-of-7 contests. Six players
- -- Hannah Clark, Brooke Backes, Jenna Kentgen, Kyrie Seying, Rachele Armand, and Amanda Lulek -- have started every game.
- Iowa currently ranks 10th in the Great Lakes region of the NSCAA poll.
- The Hawkeyes finished nonconference play with a 6-1 record. Iowa is 36-2 in the nonconference during the last five seasons.
- Freshmen Rose Ripslinger and Hannah Brobst made their Iowa debuts Sept. 13 against UIC.
- Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 -- lowa's first Freshman of the Week honoree since 2012.

#### **LAST GAME**

lowa closed out its nonconference slate with 3-0 win over UIC on Sept. 13. Bri Toelle, Karly Stuenkel and Hannah Brobst, all scored in the contest.

#### **CLARK EYES HISTORY**

Senior Hannah Clark has been in goal for 35 wins in her UI soccer career. With her next victory, Clark will move past former Hawkeye Emily Moran as the winningest goalkeeper in program history. Clark is also the school recordholder in career shutouts (26), and is third all-time with 242 saves.

#### **B1G DEFENSE**

The Hawkeyes allowed three goals during their nonconference slate, tied for the second-fewest in the league. Senior Hannah Clark is fourth in the conference in goals against average (0.43) and tied for fourth in shutouts (seven).

#### **BACKES NOTCHES 1ST GWG**

Senior Brooke Backes scored the first gamewinning goal in lowa's 2-1 come-frombehind victory over Utah State on Sept. 4. The strike was Backes' first goal since her freshman season and her third career strike.

#### **TOELLE PACES TEAM**

Junior forward Bri Toelle is leading the team with four goals and 11 points early





in the 2015 season. The four goals tied a career-high and the Virginia native is one point shy of matching a career high she set as a freshman in 2013.

#### **TOELLE TIES PROGRAM RECORD**

Junior Bri Toelle tied the school record for single game assists after notching three assists in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Nebraska Omaha on Aug. 23. The total is the high water mark in the Big Ten this season.

Toelle shares the lowa school record with Morgan Showalter (Sept. 23, 2008) and Jenna Sorensen (Sept. 5, 1997).

#### **IOWA IN THE RANKINGS**

The Hawkeyes are ranked 10th in the NSCAA Great Lakes Region rankings. Big Ten Conference schools occupy nine of the 10 spots in the team rankings.

#### **OUICK STRIKES**

- Freshman Hannah Brobst notched her first career goal, minutes into her first game as a Hawkeye in Iowa's 3-0, win over UIC on Sept. 13.
- lowa scored two goals in the span of 1:39 seconds in its 2-1 win over Utah State.
- The Hawkeyes scored their third and fourth goals in a span of 29 seconds in their 4-0 win over 0maha on Aug. 23.

### MAGRUDER NAMED B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

University of Iowa midfielder Alina Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 after scoring a pair of goals in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Omaha. The honor is the first of Magruder's career and she is the first Hawkeye freshman to earn the weekly conference honor since Hannah Clark on Oct. 8, 2012.

#### **HAWKEYES ON TV**

lowa will appear on BTN/BTN Plus on BTN2Go eight times during the 2015 season. The Hawkeyes' Oct. 11 home contest against Minnesota will be broadcast live on BTN.

BTN Plus will stream Iowa's games against Michigan State (Sept. 18),

Michigan (Sept. 20), Ohio State (Sept. 25), Wisconsin (Oct. 8), Illinois (Oct. 15), Nebraska (Oct. 23) and Rutgers (Oct. 28).

BTN will also be televising the Big Ten Tournament on Nov. 1-8.

#### **TEAM CAPTAIN**

Senior Hannah Clark has been named lowa's team captain for the 2015 season. She is joined on lowa's Leadership Council by senior Sarah Mazur, juniors Corey Burns and Amanda Lulek, and redshirt freshman Aubree Larson.

#### **B1G IN THE POLLS**

Penn State, Ohio State, and Rutgers are ranked in the NSCAA Top 25 poll as of Sept. 16.

Penn State is ranked No. 7, Ohio State sits at No. 15, and Rutgers was voted No. 19. Wisconsin (9) and Michigan (6) are receiving votes.

#### **2014 IN REVIEW**

The Hawkeyes finished the 2014 season with a 14-7-1 overall and 7-5-1 Big Ten record. The seven conference victories ties the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season, and the 14 wins are the second most in school history. After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, lowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the conference tournament championship game for a second straight season.

The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. lowa's defense also was in the top 35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).
