THE MATCH-UP

The University of Iowa soccer team heads to Bloomington for a Big Ten Conference matchup against Indiana on Saturday night at Yeagley Field. Game time is 6 p.m. (CT).

SCOUTING INDIANA

- The Hoosiers bring a 3-5-4 record into Saturday's match, including an 0-2-2 Big Ten record. Last weekend, Indiana lost a pair of league road contests, falling at Wisconsin (3-0) and Minnesota (3-1).
- Indiana has scored eight goals in 12 games this season with Jessie Bujouves leading the team with two goals and one assist. Six different Hoosier players have scored -- two of which have multiple goals.
- Indiana's Sarah Stone has played every minute in goal for the Hoosiers, where she has posted a 1.24 goals against average. She has 53 saves and has five shutouts on the year.
- The Hoosiers are led by head coach Amy Barbary, who is in her third season with the program.

INDIANA VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- The Hawkeyes lead the all-time series over the Hoosiers, 10-8-0.
- Iowa has won four-straight games against Indiana, including a 1-0 victory in Iowa City last season.
- The Hawkeyes have won in shutout fashion in eight of its 10 victories in the series.

QUICK HITTERS

- Senior Hannah Clark currently ranks second in the Big Ten in saves (52), saves per game (4.73), and is seventh in save percentage (0.788).
- Junior Bri Toelle ranks third in the Big Ten in shots per game (4.91), shots (54), and is sixth in points (14). Toelle, who has a team-leading five goals this season, is tied for sixth in the





HEAD COACH DAVE DILANNI

Dave Dilanni is entering his second season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 235-25-19 (.876) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .876 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his first season in Iowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, Iowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. Iowa's defense also was in the top-35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).

Academically, the Hawkeyes garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award for an eighth straight season and nine soccer student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. Seniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott were also received Scholar All-Region recognition.

- Freshman Emma Rigby made her collegiate debut against Penn State on Sept. 27, registering 21:50 minutes of action.
- Iowa is outscoring opponents by a margin of 16-14. The Hawkeyes have registered 148 shots in 11 games, with a 72-68 advantage in shots on goal.
- Sophomore Karly Stuenkel is second on the team with three goals, two assists, and eight points this season. She notched her first game-winning goal in Iowa's, 2-1, overtime victory over UNI.
- The Hawkeyes have used a different starting lineup in 10-of-11 contests. Five players -- Hannah Clark, Brooke Backes, Kyrie Seying, Rachele Armand, and Amanda Lulek -- have started every game.
- The Hawkeyes finished nonconference play with a 6-1 record. Iowa is 36-2 in the nonconference during the last five seasons.

LAST GAME

Iowa fell to Penn State, 5-1, at home on Sept. 27. Bri Toelle tallied Iowa's goal on a successful penalty kick.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

Iowa had a school-record crowd of 1,847 fans in attendance during its Big Ten Conference home opener against Ohio State on Sept. 25. The Hawkeyes have had two of the top three crowds in program history in 2015. A crowd of 1,314 -- third-most all-time -- was in attendance Sept. 11 for the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game against Iowa State.

CLARK EYES HISTORY

Senior Hannah Clark has been in goal for 35 wins in her UI soccer career. With her next victory, Clark will move past former Hawkeye Emily Moran as the winningest goalkeeper in program history. Clark is also the school recordholder in career shutouts (26), and is third all-time with 268 saves.

INSTANT OFFENSE

Freshman Alina Magruder, who made her first career start at Michigan on Sept. 20, has three goals in 296 minutes in 2015. She is averaging 26.9 minutes of action a game. Magruder scored her third goal Sept. 18 at Michigan State.

GAME WINNERS

Five different Hawkeyes have scored game winning goals this season. Bri Toelle has tallied two, while Brooke Backes, Tory Harman, Jenna Kengen, and Karly Stuenkel have each recorded one.

Toelle's two game winners currently rank seventh in the Big Ten.

TOELLE TIES PROGRAM RECORD

Junior Bri Toelle tied the school record for single game assists after notching three assists in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Nebraska Omaha on Aug. 23. The total is the high water mark in the Big Ten this season. Toelle shares the Iowa school record with Morgan Showalter (Sept. 23, 2008) and Jenna Sorensen (Sept. 5, 1997).

QUICK STRIKES

- Freshman Hannah Brobst notched her first career goal, minutes into her first game as a Hawkeye in Iowa's 3-0, win over UIC on Sept. 13.
- Iowa scored two goals in the span of 1:39 seconds in its 2-1 win over Utah State.
- The Hawkeyes scored their third and fourth goals in a span of 29 seconds in their 4-0 win over Omaha on Aug. 23.

MAGRUDER NAMED B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

University of Iowa midfielder Alina Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 after scoring a pair of goals in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Omaha. The honor is the first of Magruder's career and she is the first Hawkeye freshman to earn the weekly conference honor since Hannah Clark on Oct. 8, 2012.

TEAM CAPTAIN

Senior Hannah Clark has been named Iowa's team captain for the 2015 season. She is joined on Iowa's Leadership Council by senior Sarah Mazur, juniors Corey Burns and Amanda Lulek, and redshirt freshman Aubree Larson.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The Hawkeyes enter the season with five starters returning from last year's 14-win team. Head coach Dave Dilanni will lead a Hawkeye squad that features 10 incoming freshmen and one transfer in junior Rachele Armand. Iowa's five returning starters are juniors Amanda Lulek, Bri Toelle, Natalie Krygier, and Corey Burns, and senior goalkeeper Hannah Clark.

B1G IN THE POLLS

Minnesota, Penn State, and Rutgers are ranked in the NSCAA Top 25 poll as of Sept. 29.

Minnesota is ranked No. 11, Penn State was voted No. 13, and Rutgers sits at No. 25. Nebraska (11) is also receiving votes.
