

**Iowa vs. #10 Wisconsin Postgame Notes**  
**Oct. 22, 2016**

**POSTGAME NOTES**

Iowa (5-3, 3-2) defeated Wisconsin (5-2, 2-2), 17-9, Saturday at Kinnick Stadium.

Wisconsin wins possession of the Heartland Trophy and snaps Iowa's streak of six consecutive rivalry trophy wins. Iowa successfully defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy against Iowa State (W, 42-3) and Floyd of Rosedale at Minnesota (W, 14-7) in 2016. It hosts Nebraska on Nov. 25 in defense of the Heroes Trophy.

**INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES**

**RB Akrum Wadley's** set a career-highs in receptions (7) and receiving yards (72). Wadley was Iowa's top rusher and receiver today (10 carries, 44 yards).

**DT Jaleel Johnson** recorded a career-high 2.0 sacks today (18 yards).

**LB Josey Jewell** (16) and **DB Desmond King** (12) matched career highs in tackles. Jewel finished with one breakup and a forced fumble. King added a fumble recovery. Jewell climbed into the all-time top 30 in career tackles (254).

**P Ron Coluzzi's** 58-yard punt in the second quarter was a career long. Coluzzi averaged 41.1 yards on eight punts.

**K Keith Duncan's** 40-yard field goal in the second quarter was a career long.

**K Miguel Recinos's** 47-yard field as time expired in the first half was his first career field goal. (missed only previous career attempt, 50-yard at Minnesota).

**MISCELLANEOUS**

Iowa trailed 7-6 at halftime. It was the first time this year Iowa trailed at halftime.

Iowa was 2-for-3 in the red zone with two field goals. Iowa entered the game 23-of-24 in the redzone (19 TDs), best in the Big Ten. Iowa missed a field goal attempt (38) in its failed scoring trip to the red zone.

Iowa was plus-one in turnovers today, and is plus-7 on the season. Iowa has 12 takeaways (five interceptions, seven fumble recoveries). Iowa scored a field goal off its takeaway today.

**RT Cole Croston** returned to the starting lineup at right tackle. Croston missed last week at Purdue due to injury. He started in place of LT **Boone Myers**, who missed the game with injury. **Ike Boettger** moved to left tackle. **James Daniels** started at C, **Sean Welsh** started at RG, and **Keegan Render** made his second career start at LG.

Wisconsin won the toss and elected to defer. In 18 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes have started the game on offense in 175-of-222 games (105-70). Iowa has opened on defense in 47-of-222 games (27-20). Iowa is 1-2 when starting on offense this season.
