

THE MATCH-UP

HAWKEYES

- lowa hosts Kansas in a pair of mid-week games at Duane Banks Field on April 9-10. Opening pitch is set for 6:05 p.m. (CT) Tuesday and 4:05 p.m. (CT) Wednesday.
- It will be the Hawkeyes second and third mid-week games of the season. Iowa won its first mid-week match-up, downing Western Illinois, 10-6, on April 2.
- Duane Banks Field goes 395 feet to dead center, and plays 329 feet down the left and right field lines. Iowa is 2-5 at home this season, winning against Western Illinois (April 2) and Nebraska (April 7).

ON THE RADIO

Both games against Kansas will be broadcast on the radio on AM-800 KXIC and AM-1360 KMJM. Brent Balbinot will handle the play-by-play, while Jeff Duncan will provide color commentary.

THE SERIES

Kansas has won 16 of the 24 meetings between the Jayhawks and Hawkeyes, including the last four contests. Iowa last played Kansas on April 12, 2011, falling 12-5 at Duane Banks Field. The Hawkeyes last defeated the Jayhawks on March 5, 2010, winning 5-3 in Lawrence.



In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the lowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the lowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. Iowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his Iowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. Iowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

SCOUTING KANSAS

Kansas owns an 18-12 record after taking 2-of-3 against No. 19 Oklahoma State this past weekend in Lawrence, Kan. The Jayhawks are 4-6 in away games, defeating 11th-ranked Oklahoma, 10-8, in their most recent road contest.

The Jayhawks are hitting at a .286 clip as a team, led by sophomore Michael Suiter's .391 average. Suiter paces Kansas in hits (43), slugging percentage (.464), and total bases (51). Senior Alex DeLeon provides power at the clean-up spot, leading the team in home runs (2) and RBIs (22).

Sophomore Robert Kahana and senior Tanner Poppe, both righthanders, are expected to start on the mound for Kansas. Kahana will make his first start of the season Tuesday against the Hawkeyes. He has made 13 relief appearances, posting a 3-1 record with a 3.19 ERA over 17 innings. Poppe has made five appearances, including four starts. He is 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA in 20 2/3 innings.

The Jayhawks are coached by Ritch Price, who is in his 11th season.

IOWA TAKE SERIES FINALE VS. NEBRASKA

The Hawkeyes dropped 2-of-3 to Nebraska on April 5-7 at Duane Banks Field.

lowa won the series finale, 6-5, after avoiding a ninth-inning Cornhusker rally. The Hawkeyes took a 6-3 lead into the top of the ninth inning, but Nebraska used a sacrifice fly and an RBI single to make the score 6-5 before senior Ricky Sandquist induced a 4-6-3 double play to end the game, earning his first save of the season. Senior Andrew Hanse earned the win, throwing a career-best 6 2/3 innings.

Junior Trevor Kenyon and sophomore Eric Toole led the offense over the threegame set, as they both went 6-for-13 (.462) a the plate.

SWINGING THE STICK

The Hawkeyes have been swinging the bats over past week, recording 10 or more hits in four straight contests and in six of the last seven games. lowa's best output over the stretch came April 6 against Nebraska, tallying 14 hits. The 14 hits are the secondmost in a game this season, falling one short of a season-high 15 hits recorded Feb. 16 at Austin Peay.

Senior pitcher Matt Dermody is tied for first in the Big Ten with five wins. Dermody in 5-1 in eight starts this season, picking up wins against Austin Peay (Feb. 16), Western Illinois (March 2), Georgetown (March 9), Nebraska-Omaha (March 17), and Northwestern (March 23). The Norwalk, Iowa, native has thrown 52 1/3 innings, the seventh-most

among Big Ten pitchers, and leads the team with 34 strikeouts. His 34 strikeouts are tied for ninth in the conference.

Dermody's five wins set a career-high, besting the four wins he recorded during his sophomore season. lowa has won six of the eight games in which Dermody has started, as he has allowed two runs or less in five of the eight starts.

Dermody recorded his third career complete game March 23 against Northwestern. The 6-foot-5 lefthander allowed one unearned run and struck out five, scattering seven hits.

NO STRANGER TO THE BIG TEN

Senior Matt Dermody has made 20 career Big Ten starts, including Big Ten Tournament play, ranking third among active Big Ten pitchers. Dermody trails Penn State's Steven Hill and Illinois' Kevin Johnson, who have both made 26 career Big Ten starts . The Norwalk, Iowa, native has made three Big Ten starts in 2013 after starting eight Big Ten contests in 2011 and 2012.

CAN'T CATCH TOOLE

Sophomore Eric Toole is 13-of-15 in stolen base attempts this season. Toole's 13 swipes are a team-best and are two off the Big Ten lead, placing him tied for third among Big Ten athletes. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native has stolen six games during Big Ten play (nine games), ranking second in the conference.

THRIVING AGAINST LEFTIES

Five of lowa's regulars thrive against left-handed pitching. Sophomore Taylor Kaufman leads the team with a .440 (11-of-25) average against southpaws, while Keith Brand (.417; 5-of-12), Kris Goodman (.370, 10-of-27), Eric Toole (.350, 7-of-20), and Jake Yacinich (.333, 9-of-27) hit above .333.

22 AND COUNTING

Sophomore Taylor Kaufman has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games, setting a new career best. The streak began Feb. 17 at Austin Peay during the opening weekend of the 2013 season. Kaufman's streak in the longest since 2010 when Kurtis Muller and Mike McQuillan each ended the season with lengthy reached base streaks. Muller reached base in 27 straight games, while McQuillan reached safely in 23 consecutive games.

The Glenwood, lowa has drawn a teamhigh 17 walks, placing him tied for ninth in the Big Ten.

KENYON PROVIDES POP

Junior Trevor Kenyon has provided a muchneeded lift to the middle of the lowa batting order over its last seven games. Kenyon is





14-for-31 with four doubles, a triple, and 10 RBIs over the stretch, raising his batting average by 210 points (.154 to .364). His .364 average is tops on the team.

Kenyon has delivered two hits in six of the last seven contests, including a seasonbest three hits April 6 against Nebraska.

Kenyon is hitting .414 (12-of-29) with eight RBIs in Big Ten play, ranking seventh in RBIs and 10th in bating average.

SANDQUIST RETURNS

Senior Ricky Sandquist has made two relief appearances over the last four games, his first action since suffering an arm injury over three weeks ago. It has been a big lift to the Hawkeye bullpen, as the Fort Dodge, lowa, native has been spectacular this season after making an adjustment to his pitching mechanics, going to a 3/4 arm slot.

Sandguist is 1-0 with a 1.73 ERA -- the fifth best mark in the Big Ten. He has allowed two earned runs in seven relief appearances, holding opponents scoreless in six of the seven outings. Sandquist collected his first save April 7 against Nebraska, inducing a 4-6-3 double play to end the game. He tallied his first win March 24 after tossing three innings against Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Sandquist has also made two starts, posting a 3.12 ERA over 8 2/3 innings.

STARTING OFF WITH A BANG

Sophomore Eric Toole, the Hawkeyes leadoff hitter, has been on a tear as of late. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native is hitting at a .381 (16-of-42) clip wih 10 runs and six stolen bases over the 10 games, collecting a hit in eight of the last 10 contests. The stretch includes six multi-hit games and two three-hit performances.

Toole has reached base in 21 of the Hawkeyes' last 22 games, including the last seven games and a career-best 14 game streak from Feb. 16-March 23.

HEATING UP AT THE PLATE

Junior Keith Brand is currently on a careerbest five game hitting streak. Brand is 6-of-18 (.333) with five runs scored and three RBIs during the streak. The streak includes a two-RBI performance April 6 against Nebraska -- his team-best fourth multi-RBI game this season.

OUCH!

The Hawkeyes have been hit by 54 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten team. Iowa leads second place Indiana by 14, as the Hoosiers have been plunked 40 times this season. Four Hawkeyes -- senior Keith Brand, junior Taylor Zeutenhorst and sophomores Kris Goodman and Jake Yacinich -- rank in the top-seven in the Big Ten in hitby-pitches. Brand has been hit three times in a game three times (UALR, Maine, UNO), getting plunked a team and conferencehigh 14 times. Zeutenhorst, Goodman, and Yacinich have all been hit seven times, placing them tied for seventh in the Big Ten.

lowa was hit by a pitch seven times March 1 against Arkansas-Little Rock, the most a Big Ten club has been hit in a game this season.

THE HUMAN MAGNET

Junior Keith Brand has been hit prone to getting plunked by opposing pitchers this season. The Northbrook, III., native has been hit by 14 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten athlete. The 14 hit-by-pitches is the sixth-highest season total in program history, tying Kurtis Muller (2008) and Kevin Hoef (2007). Hoef holds the single season and career hit-by-pitch record, as he was plunked 20 times in 2008 and 62 times over his Hawkeye career (2006-09).

LEGGING OUT TRIPLES

Junior Taylor Zeutenhorst has his a teamhigh two triples this season, tallying threebaggers against West Virginia (March 10) and Nebraska-Omaha (March 18). The two triples are tied for the fifth-most among Big Ten athletes.

GOOD(MAN) HITTING

Sophomore Kris Goodman has been one of the Hawkeyes top offensive threats this season, leading the team in hits (36), runs scored (19), and total bases (39). The 36 hits rank 11th in the Big Ten, while his .346 batting average ranks 10th in the conference. He has posted a team-best nine multihit games, including a career-best three hits on six different occasions.

BRINGING THEM HOME

Sophomore Jake Yacinich paces the Hawkeyes with 17 RBIs and is hitting a team-best .378 (14-of-37) with runners in scoring

Yacinich has 30 hits this season, ranking second on the team. He is tied for first on the team with classmate Kris Goodman with nine multi-hit games, which includes three career-best three-hit contests (W. Illinois, Omaha, Nebraska).

DON'T RUN ON SHEPPARD

Senior Dan Sheppard has caught six base runners attempting to steal this season. The mark is tied for seventh in the conference. Sheppard threw out four base runners in Iowa's season-opening series at Austin Peay (Feb. 15-17).

DAHM COLLECTS 500TH WIN

Iowa head coach Jack Dahm won his 500th career game as a collegiate coach in the Hawkeyes 7-3 triumph over Western Illinois on March 2.

Dahm, who is in his 20th season as a head coach, currently has 507 career victories, winning 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and 224 games at lowa, beginning in 2004. His 224 wins at lowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Vogel (440 wins).

HAWKEYES SWEEP SNOWBIRD CLASSIC

The Hawkeyes posted a 3-0 record, defeating Maine, 9-2, on March 8, Georgetown, 7-2, on March 9, and West Virginia, 6-4, in 12 innings on Sunday. It is the first time lowa has won three games at a three day tournament since sweeping three games at the Austin Peay Tournament in 2006.

Senior Matt Dermody and sophomores Sasha Kuebel and Nick Hibbing collected wins on the mound, while junior Taylor Zeutenhorst led the offense by hitting .556 (4-of-9) with a double, a triple, four runs, and three RBIs.

KLEBERG CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Three Hawkeyes -- sophomores Taylor Kaufman, Kris Goodman and Sasha Kuebel -- were named to the Kleberg Bank College Classic All-Tournament team. Kaufman hit .545 with six hits and two RBIs, Goodman had six hits and an RBI, and Kuebel limited Oklahoma to two runs on eight hits over eight innings in the opener.


