OUICK HITTERS

• At 2-0 in Big Ten play, lowa is off to its best start in league competition since the 2007 season. A win at Minnesota would give the Hawkeyes their best Big Ten start in program history.

• Iowa made its debut in the Soccer America rankings, coming in at No. 16 on Sept. 16. It is the first time the Hawkeyes have been ranked since the 2012 season. Iowa is receiving votes in the NSCAA rankings.

• lowa has a Big Ten-leading six shutouts in eight games this season, three apiece by Kiley Beck and Hannah Clark. Clark is riding a streak of three-consecutive shutouts and a streak of 273:13 scoreless minutes.

• Senior Cloe Lacasse is tied for the Big Ten lead with 18 points and is second with seven goals and 37 shots.

• Iowa has used six different starting lineups in eight games this season. Senior Marissa Hurt made her first career start Sept. 14 against Northwestern.

SCOUTING MINNESOTA


The Golden Gophers are 4-4-0 overall and 1-1-0 in Big Ten play after splitting a pair of overtime matches to open Big Ten play. Minnesota dropped a 2-1 decision at Michigan before rebounding to down Michigan State, 1-0, on Sept. 14. The Gophers have scored 19 goals in eight matches this season, but 10 came in the season opener at Stetson (W, 10-0). Simone Kolander leads the team with 14 points (four goals, six assists), while Sydney Squires has 10 points (four goals, two assists). Nine different Minnesota players have scored this season. Tarah Hobbs has played all but 90 minutes in goal, posting a 1.24 goals against average with 36 saves. Hobbs has four shutouts in seven starts.

HEAD COACH DAVE DIIANNI

Dave Dilanni was named the fifth head coach in University of Iowa soccer history on May 17, 2014. Dilanni spent the past 11 seasons as head coach at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 221-18-18 (.895) record and has guided the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in the last eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths and coached 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage is the tops in NCAA Division II and the third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In 2013, Dilanni guided Grand Valley State to its third national title in five seasons and was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year for a third time. The Lakers scored the second-most goals in program history (88), matched a program-high with 21 shutouts en route to winning the most games in school history. The team finished 24-0-1, claiming both the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles.

The Lakers opened the season with 13-straight shutouts, which matched the second-longest streak in Division II history, and five student-athletes garnered All-America recognition at season's end.

Dilanni led the Lakers to a 22-0-4 record in 2009 en route to his first national championship before winning a second-straight title in 2010. He was honored as the CaptainU Division II Women's Soccer Coach of the Year in 2009, and he coached the Division II National Player of the Year honoree in each season (Irie Dennis, 2009; Jenna Wenglinski, 2010).

Dilanni took over the Laker program in 2003 and swiftly guided Grand Valley State to a then-school best record of 17-2-2 to earn the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. In year three, Dilanni led the Lakers to their first conference and NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, finishing 19-3 overall, and his team finished eighth in the national poll.

By year four, Dilanni led Grand Valley State to the school's first NCAA Divi sion II National Championship game, finishing 19-2-1 overall. A year later, the Lakers made a second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, posting a 17-0-0 mark in the regular season before finishing 21-1-1 overall.

Dilanni joined Grand Valley State after a seven-year run as head coach of the Jackson Lumen Christi High School women's soccer team. He also spent three years as an assistant coach at Hillsdale College, where he helped begin the men's and women's soccer programs.

Dilanni has spent seven years working with the Olympic Development Program in Michigan, training and developing the highest level of soccer in the state. He coached the team to four Region 2 and four ODP national championships.

Dilanni, a USSF B-licensed coach, earned his associate's degree from Seneca College in 1993 and his bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor University in 1997. He and his wife, Kristy, have two daughters, Karissa (11) and Kelsey (7)

 Iowa last defeated Minnesota in 2007, downing the Gophers in Minneapolis, 1-0, to clinch a berth in the Big Ten Tournament.

LAST GAME

lowa posted its third-straight shutout, blanking Northwestern, 1-0, on Sept. 14. The Hawkeyes lone goal came in rare form as sophomore Corey Burns bent a corner kick past the Wildcat defense and into the back of the net. The goal was the first of Burns' careeer. Junior Hannah Clark tallied three saves in the contest, anchoring an lowa defense that held Northwestern to 10 shots.

CLOE LACASSE...

 has scored in 4-of-8 contests this season. which includes three two-goal games, pushing her career total to 10 as a Hawkeye.

 tallied her 100th career point in Iowa's 2-0 victory over Illinois on Sept. 11, assisting on Nicole Urban's strike. Lacasse is the second player in lowa history to reach the 100-point mark.

 currently ranks second in lowa history with 38 goals and 100 points. Sarah Lynch is the record holder with 112 points and 46 goals. has seven goals and four assists for 18 points in 2014. As a junior, she had six goals and seven assists in 23 games.

 ranks sixth in the nation in points (18), seventh in goals (7), 15th in points per game (2.25) and 16th in goals per game (0.875).

IOWA RANKED 16TH BY SOCCER AMERICA

The Hawkeyes broke into the Soccer America rankings for the first time since the 2012 season when they were ranked 16th in the poll released Sept. 16. Iowa is 1-of-4 Big Ten teams in the rankings.

lowa is also receiving votes in the NSCAA Top-25 poll that was released Sept. 16.

IOWA FIFTH IN REGIONAL RANKINGS

After falling out of the NSCAA Great Lakes Region rankings last week, the Hawkeyes jumped to fifth in the poll released Sept. 16.

HONORS ALL-AROUND

 Senior Melanie Pickert and sophomore Corey Burns were named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week on Sept. 16 after leading

lowa to a pair of shutout victories over Illinois and Northwestern.

 Pickert was also named CS 360's National Primetime Player of the Week.

• Junior Hannah Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week by College Sports Madness. She made a combined seven saves in a pair of shutouts over Illinois and Northwestern.

CLARK APPROACHING RECORD

With her three-straight shutouts, junior Hannah Clark has pushed her career total to 14, which is one off from tying Emily Moran for the most shutouts in program history (15). Clark is currently riding a scoreless streak of 273:13 minutes.

STELLAR DEFENSE

If you don't shoot, you can't score. Iowa's defense has allowed four or fewer shots on goal in 7-of-8 games this season, and the Hawkeyes have allowed fewer than 10 shots in three contests.

HAWKEYES DISTRIBUTING

lowa has tallied 15 assists through eight games this year, which puts it in the upper half of the Big Ten Conference in sixth place. Five different Hawkeyes have at least two assists this season with senior Cloe Lacasse leading the team with four.

NOT 1, BUT 2 GKS

Senior Kiley Beck and junior Hannah Clark have split time in goal during the 2014 season. Beck is 4-1 with a 0.43 goals against average with 11 saves and three shutouts. Clark is 3-0 with a 0.57 goals against average with 11 saves and three shutouts. Iowa is sixth nationally with a 0.75 shutout percentage.

Prior to the 2014 season, Beck had played in five total games in her first three seasons as a Hawkeye. She posted her first career shutout and win in her first career start -- a 1-0 double overtime victory at Northern lowa on Aug. 23.

IOWA IN NCAA STATS

lowa ranks in the top-50 in five categories through eight games. The Hawkeyes rank seventh in shutout percentage (0.75), 13th in winning percentage (.875), 25th in goals

NEWCOMERS SHINE

- Freshman Katharine Woodruff got the Hawkeyes on the scoreboard in 2014 when she netted the game-winning goal in the 1-0 double-overtime win at Northern Iowa on Sept. 22.

- Natalie Krygier, a transfer from Connecticut, is tied for second on the team with three assists. The sophomore registered a pair of assists in Iowa's 3-0 victory over Fresno State on Aug. 29.

BROWN: A CONSTANT

Senior Caitlin Brown is the only lowa player to log every minute of game action this season. The defender has played every minute for the past 42 games dating back to the 2012 season -- a streak of 3,989 minutes.

SENIOR EXPERIENCE

Senior Melanie Pickert has started all 72 games of her Iowa career, while fellow seniors Caitlin Brown and Cloe Lacasse have started 71-of-72 games as Hawkeyes.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Kiley Beck, Caitlin Brown, and Melanie Pickert have been voted team captains for the 2014 lowa soccer team.

LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

In three-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the lowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently second in career goals (38), points (100), shots (261), game-winning goals (12), and assists (24).

Lacasse led Iowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons. She capped off her junior year by garnering second-team All-Big Ten selection and second-team NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region honors.

NEW FACE AT THE HELM

First-year head coach Dave Dilanni takes over the Hawkeyes' program after a successful run at Grand Valley State. Dilanni amassed a 221-18-18 record with the Lakers and guided the team to three NCAA Division II national championships and nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference titles.

Assistant coach Erica Demers joins the Hawkeye staff after spending the last nine years with Dilanni at Grand Valley State.

DIIANNI IN GOOD COMPANY

In 11 seasons at Grand Valley State, head coach Dave Dilanni posted a 221-18-18 overall record for a .895 winning percentage. The mark was the third-best all-time in women's soccer history entering the 2014 season.

RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert return for their senior seasons after earning secondteam All-Big Ten honors a year ago. Sophomore Amanda Lulek was selected to the Big Ten All-Freshmen team last season.

HAWKEYES ON TV

The Hawkeyes' Sept. 25 home contest against Maryland will be broadcast live on BTN. The network will also be televise the Big Ten Tournament from Nov. 5-9 in West Lafayette, Ind.

lowa will also appear four times -- Illinois (Sept. 11), Northwestern (Sept. 13), Indiana (Oct. 17), and Purdue (Oct. 19) -- on BTN Plus (which can be accessed via www. btn2go.com).

B1G IN THE POLLS

Penn State, Wisconsin, and Illinois are ranked in the latest NSCAA Top 25 poll of the 2014 season. The Nittany Lions are ranked No. 8, the Badgers follow at No. 9, and Ilinois checks in at No. 22. Michigan, Rutgers, and Iowa are all receiving votes.
