### THE MATCH-UP

The University of Iowa soccer team kicks off a stretch of three-straight road contests this week with matchups at Michigan State and Michigan. The Hawkeyes take on the Spartans in East Lansing on Thursday at 3:30 p.m. (CT) before facing the Wolverines in Ann Arbor on Sunday at 1 p.m.

### QUICK HITTERS

- Iowa is second in the Big Ten with seven shutouts in 11 games this season, four by Hannah Clark and three by Kiley Beck. Clark had her streak of four-consecutive shutouts and 379:26 scoreless minutes snapped in a 1-0 loss to Maryland on Sept. 25.
- Iowa is outscoring opponents by a margin of 20-6 and is outshooting opposing teams, 156-122, through 11 games this season.
- Senior Cloe Lacasse is tied for second in the Big Ten with seven goals and is third with 18 points and 46 shots.
- Iowa has used nine different starting lineups in 11 games this season. Senior Marissa Hurt made her first career start Sept. 14 against Northwestern, and Brooke Backes made her first start of the season Sept. 20 at Minnesota.
- Five-of-nine freshmen have seen the playing field for the Hawkeyes this season, including Katharine Woodruff who has appeared in all 11 games.

### SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE

Michigan State owns an overall record of 6-4-1 and is looking to notch its first conference win of the season after going 0-4-1 in the early portion of Big Ten play. Last time out, Michigan State gave up a goal in the final minute to lose a 2-1 heartbreaker to Michigan. The Spartans have posted four shutouts this season while tallying a league-best 63 saves, with senior Courtney Clem making 59 stops. Freshman Jamie Cheslik has a team-high six goals.

### MICHIGAN STATE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- The Spartans lead the all-time series between the two schools, posting a record of 8-5-5.
- Iowa won last year's meeting in Iowa City, posting a 1-0 victory in double overtime.
- The last time Iowa won at Michigan State was in 1999 when the Hawkeyes defeated the Spartans, 1-0.
- Four of the last six games have gone into overtime with three going into double-overtime.
- Michigan State has not scored a goal against the Hawkeyes since a 1-1 tie in double overtime on Oct. 31, 2010.





### HEAD COACH DAVE DIANNI

Dave Dilanni was named the fifth head coach in University of Iowa soccer history on May 17, 2014. Dilanni spent the past 11 seasons as head coach at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 221-18-18 (.895) record and has guided the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in the last eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths and coached 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage is the tops in NCAA Division II and the third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In 2013, Dilanni guided Grand Valley State to its third national title in five seasons and was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year for a third time. The Lakers scored the second-most goals in program history (88), matched a program-high with 21 shutouts en route to winning the most games in school history. The team finished 24-0-1, claiming both the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles.

The Lakers opened the season with 13-straight shutouts, which matched the second-longest streak in Division II history, and five student-athletes garnered All-America recognition at season's end.

Dilanni led the Lakers to a 22-0-4 record in 2009 en route to his first national championship before winning a second-straight title in 2010. He was honored as the CaptainU Division II Women's Soccer Coach of the Year in 2009, and he coached the Division II National Player of the Year honoree in each season (Irie Dennis, 2009; Jenna Wenglinski, 2010).

Dilanni took over the Laker program in 2003 and swiftly guided Grand Valley State to a then-school best record of 17-2-2 to earn the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. In year three, Dilanni led the Lakers to their first conference and NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, finishing 19-3 overall, and his team finished eighth in the national poll.

By year four, Dilanni led Grand Valley State to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship game, finishing 19-2-1 overall. A year later, the Lakers made a second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, posting a 17-0-0 mark in the regular season before finishing 21-1-1 overall.

Dilanni joined Grand Valley State after a seven-year run as head coach of the Jackson Lumen Christi High School women's soccer team. He also spent three years as an assistant coach at Hillsdale College, where he helped begin the men's and women's soccer programs.

Dilanni has spent seven years working with the Olympic Development Program in Michigan, training and developing the highest level of soccer in the state. He coached the team to four Region 2 and four ODP national championships.

Dilanni, a USSF B-licensed coach, earned his associate's degree from Seneca College in 1993 and his bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor University in 1997. He and his wife, Kristy, have two daughters, Karissa (11) and Kelsey (7).

### SCOUTING MICHIGAN

Seventh-year head coach Greg Ryan and the Wolverines are 8-3-0 overall and 4-1-0 in conference play. After suffering its first conference loss to Rutgers on Sept. 21, Michigan bounced back to defeat in-state rival Michigan State on Sept. 27. Sophomore Nicky Waldeck scored the game-winning goal with 24 seconds remaining to lift the Wolverines to a 2-1 victory. Michigan is 7-0 at home this season

-- which includes a 2-1 win over No. 9 Wisconsin on Sept. 14. The team has scored 18 goals off of 23 assists, which is good for second in the conference. Michigan features three players with three or more goals, including Waldek with team-high five strikes.

### MICHIGAN VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- The Wolverines lead the all-time series against the Hawkeyes, posting a 14-3-2 record.

- Iowa's 1-0 victory over Michigan in last year's Big Ten Tournament marked the first time Iowa defeated the Wolverines since 2009.

### LAST GAME

In only the second meeting all-time between the two schools, No. 17 Rutgers defeated the 13th-ranked Hawkeyes in Iowa City, 1-0.

After playing to a scoreless tie in the first half, the Scarlet Knights came out with a vengeance early in the second half, peppering five shots at Iowa goalkeeper Hannah Clark in the first four minutes. In the 50th minute, Tiernan received a pass from Amy Pietrangelo, gathered herself before firing into the far corner to give Rutgers a 1-0 lead. The goal would eventually prove to be the game winner as the Hawkeyes could not connect with the back of the net on a day which saw them fire off 12 shots.

### CLOE LACASSE...

- has scored in four contests this season, including three two-goal games, pushing her career total to 10 as a Hawkeye.

- tallied her 100th career point in Iowa's 2-0 victory over Illinois on Sept. 11, assisting on Nicole Urban's strike. Lacasse is the second player in Iowa history to reach the 100-point mark.

- currently ranks second in Iowa history with 38 goals and 100 points. Sarah Lynch is the record holder with 112 points and 46 goals.

- has seven goals and four assists for 18 points in 2014. As a junior, she had six goals and seven assists in 23 games.

- ranks 28th in the nation in points (18)

and 40th in points per game (1.64).

### IOWA SIXTH IN REGIONAL RANKINGS

After spending the previous two weeks at the the No. 5 spot in the NSCAA Great Lakes Region rankings, The Hawkeyes dropped to No. 6 after falling to Maryland and No. 17/25 Rutgers in back-to-back conference matchups. Big Ten schools occupy the top-seven spots of the 10-team ranking.

### HONORS ALL-AROUND

- Senior Melanie Pickert and sophomore Corey Burns were named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week on Sept. 16 after leading Iowa to a pair of shutout victories over Illinois and Northwestern.
- Pickert was also named CS 360's National Primetime Player of the Week on Sept. 16.

- Junior Hannah Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week by College Sports Madness on Sept. 16. She made a combined seven saves in a pair of shutouts over Illinois and Northwestern. On Sept. 23, Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week after compiling five saves in Iowa's 1-0 shutout victory at Minnesota.

### CLARK TIES SCHOOL RECORD

After posting four-straight shutouts -- a streak that saw junior Hannah Clark make 12 saves over the course of 379:26 scoreless minutes -- Clark tied former Hawkeye Emily Moran for the Iowa school record with 15 career shutouts. Clark has recorded a streak of four-straight shutouts in back-to-back seasons.

### STELLAR DEFENSE

If you don't shoot, you can't score. Iowa's defense has allowed four or fewer shots on goal in 7-of-11 games this season, and the Hawkeyes have allowed fewer than 10 shots in four contests.

### HAWKEYES DISTRIBUTING

Iowa has tallied 16 assists through 11 games this year. Five different Hawkeyes have at least two assists this season with senior Cloe Lacasse and sophomore Bri Toelle leading the team with four.

### NOT 1, BUT 2 GKS

Senior Kiley Beck and junior Hannah Clark have split time in goal during the 2014 season. Beck is 4-1 with a 0.43 goals against average with 11 saves and three



shutouts. Clark is 4-2 with a 0.62 goals against average with 22 saves and four shutouts. Iowa is 17th nationally with a 0.636 shutout percentage.

Prior to the 2014 season, Beck had played in five total games in her first three seasons as a Hawkeye. She posted her first career shutout and win in her first career start -- a 1-0 double overtime victory at Northern Iowa on Aug. 23.

**IOWA IN NCAA STATS**

Iowa ranks in the top-50 in three categories through 11 games. The Hawkeyes rank 17th in shutout percentage (0.636), 20th in goals against average (0.537), 38th in saves percentage (.846).

**BROWN: A CONSTANT**

Senior Caitlin Brown is the only Iowa player to log every minute of game action this season. The defender has played every minute for the past 45 games dating back to the 2012 season -- a streak of 4,259 minutes.

**SENIOR EXPERIENCE**

Senior Melanie Pickert has started all 75 games of her Iowa career, while fellow seniors Caitlin Brown and Cloe Lacasse have started 74-of-75 games as Hawkeyes.

**TEAM CAPTAINS**

Seniors Kiley Beck, Caitlin Brown, and Melanie Pickert have been voted team captains for the 2014 Iowa soccer team.

**IOWA MAKING HISTORY**

The week of Sept. 21 was a big one for the Hawkeyes. After starting 3-0 in Big Ten play, marking Iowa's best start in league play in program history, The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 13 in the Sept. 23 Soccer America rankings, the highest ranking in program history. Iowa also broke into the Top Drawer Soccer Top-25, coming in at No. 25 and received votes in the NSCAA poll.

**LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING**

In three-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the Iowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently second in career goals (38), points (100), shots (270), game-winning goals (12), and assists (24).

Lacasse led Iowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons. She capped off her junior year by garnering second-team All-Big Ten selection and second-team NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region honors.

**NEW FACE AT THE HELM**

First-year head coach Dave Dilanni takes over the Hawkeyes' program after a successful run at Grand Valley State. Dilanni amassed a 221-18-18 record with the Lakers and guided the team to three NCAA Division II national championships and nine-consecutive Great Lakes Inter-collegiate Athletics Conference titles.

Assistant coach Erica Demers joins the Hawkeye staff after spending the last nine years with Dilanni at Grand Valley State.

**DIANNI IN GOOD COMPANY**

In 11 seasons at Grand Valley State, head coach Dave Dilanni posted a 221-18-18 overall record for a .895 winning percentage. The mark was the third-best all-time in women's soccer history entering the 2014 season.

**RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS**

Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert return for their senior seasons after earning second-team All-Big Ten honors a year ago. Sophomore Amanda Lulek was selected to the Big Ten All-Freshmen team last season.

**HAWKEYES ON TV**

The Hawkeyes' Sept. 25 home contest against Maryland will be broadcast live on BTN. The network will also televise the Big Ten Tournament from Nov. 5-9 in West Lafayette, Ind.

Iowa will also appear four times -- Illinois (Sept. 11), Northwestern (Sept. 13), Indiana (Oct. 17), and Purdue (Oct. 19) -- on BTN Plus (which can be accessed via [www.btn2go.com](http://www.btn2go.com)).

**BIG IN THE POLLS**

Penn State, Wisconsin, Illinois, and Rutgers are ranked in the latest NSCAA Top 25 poll of the 2014 season. The Nittany Lions are ranked No. 7, the Badgers follow at No. 13, Illinois checks in at No. 19, and the Scarlet Knights come in at No. 25. Michigan is also receiving votes.

**NEXT UP**

The Hawkeyes are back in action on Oct. 8, facing No. 13 Wisconsin at the McClimon Soccer Complex in Madison, Wisconsin. The Wednesday night matchup is slated for a 7 p.m. start time.
