The University of Iowa volleyball team opens regular season play at the Northern Illinois Invitational in DeKalb, Illinois, Aug. 29-30. The Hawkeyes take on the South Dakota State at 10 a.m. (CT) and Pacific at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, and conclude weekend action against the host Huskies at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday. Each match will take place on Victor E. Court.

#### **2014 IN REVIEW**

In his first season at the helm, Bond Shymansky led the Hawkeyes to a 14-17 overall record and a 6-14 mark in Big Ten Conference action.

The Hawkeyes won four consecutive Big Ten Conference matches midway through the 2014 season, topping Maryland (3-0) and Rutgers (3-1) on the road before returning to lowa City and extending its win streak with victories over Indiana (3-2) and No. 12 Purdue (3-1). It marked the longest streak since 1994, when the Hawkeyes won eight straight Big Ten matches and went on to clinch a berth to the NCAA Tournament -- the most recent postseason appearance for the program.

lowa also defeated its first ranked opponent since 2012 with a 3-1 victory over No. 12 Purdue on Mediacom Court in Carver-Hawkeye Arena on Nov. 8, 2014.

#### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Fourteen of Iowa's 2015 opponents are ranked in the preseason American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Top 25 Poll, released on August 12. No. 1 Penn State, T-No. 5 Nebraska, T-No. 5 Wisconsin, No. 8 Illinois, No. 14 Ohio State, No. 18 Hawaii, No. 19 Michigan State, No. 20 UCLA, and No. 21 Iowa State are all ranked within the top 25, while Purdue, Texas A&M, Minnesota, Michigan, and American are receiving votes.

#### NEW FACES

The 2015 roster features eight newcomers, including four with collegiate experience.

Junior setter Loxley Keala joins the program following two years at Missouri, while junior middle blocker Ashley Mariani transfers after spending two seasons at Tennessee. Sophomore Taylr McNeil -- an outside hitter -- played her freshman season at South Carolina, and sophomore defensive specialist Annika Olsen adds depth to the back row following a year at Georgia Tech.

The Hawkeyes also welcome four incoming freshmen, including right side hitter Reghan Coyle, outside hitter Reagan Davey, and defensive specialists Libby Koukol and Molly Kelly.

#### **BIG TEN NETWORK COVERAGE**

The University of Iowa volleyball team competes live on the Big Ten Network (BTN) or BTN Plus 16 times this season. The Hawkeyes' match against Wisconsin on Oct. 23 in Iowa City will be televised live on BTN. First serve is set for 7 p.m. (CT).

#### ON THE RADIO

Twelve of Iowa's 20 Big Ten Conference matches will air live on KXIC Radio this season. The first broadcast of the season is Sept. 26 at Nebraska at 7 p.m. (CT). Second-year play-by-play announcer Tim Keating will call the action. Audio for all of Iowa's home and away matches are available online as part of the premium content package on Hawkeye All-Access at <u>hawkeyesports.com</u>.

#### ALL-TIME SERIES

• Iowa leads South Dakota State, 3-0, all-time. The teams last met on Aug. 24, 2012 at the Hawkeye Invitational in Iowa City, Iowa. The Hawkeyes recorded a 3-1 win (27-25, 20-25, 26-24, 25-22).

• Pacific leads lowa, 1-0, all-time. The Tigers defeated the Hawkeyes, 3-1 (17-25, 19-25, 26-24, 22-25), at the Marquette Invitational on Sept. 14, 2012.

• The Hawkeyes own a 6-4 all-time series advantage over the Huskies. Northern Illinois won the last meeting, 3-0 (22-25, 17-25, 23-25), on Sept. 19, 2010 in DeKalb, Illinois.

#### NATIONALLY SPEAKING

Nine Big Ten teams appeared in the AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Preseason Poll, released on August 12. No. 1 Penn State, T-No. 5 Nebraska, T-No. 5 Wisconsin, and No. 8 Illinois made the Top 10, while No. 14 Ohio State, and No. 19 Michigan State also made the list. Purdue (131), Minnesota (78), and Michigan (12) also received votes in the poll.

#### **B1G PRESEASON POLL**

The Hawkeyes were picked to finish 11th out of 14 teams in the Big Ten, as announced by the conference office on August 13. Defending national champion Penn State was at the top of the poll, followed by Nebraska, Illinois, Big Ten Champion Wisconsin, and Minnesota. Michigan State, Purdue, Ohio State, Michigan and Northwestern round out the top 10. Iowa occupies 11th ahead of Indiana, Maryland and Rutgers.

#### **QUICK HITTERS**

• Alyssa Klostermann ranks 19th all-time with 992 career assists. The junior dished out 484 as a freshman and added 508 as a sophomore.

• In 2014, the Hawkeyes went 8-1 in matches lasting four or five sets. The squad was a perfect 5-0 in four-set matches, and 3-1 in five-set matches.

• Senior Mikaela Gunderson started every match (31) in 2014. She led the team in total blocks (103) and blocks per set (0.98) with eight solo stuffs and 95 block assists.

• Lauren Brobst started all but one match (30) in 2014. The junior led the team in kills (286) and kills per set (2.75) last season.

• Junior transfer Loxley Keala appeared in every match (33) and set (128) for Missouri last season. She led the team in assists (718) and assists per set (5.61), was second on the squad in service aces (22) and third in digs (264).

• Sophomore transfer Taylr McNeil played in 28 matches and notched 25 starts for South Carolina in 2014. She led the Gamecocks with a kills per set average of 3.06, a total that ranked ninth in the SEC and second among league freshmen.

### HEAD COACH BOND SHYMANSKY



Bond Shymansky 2nd Season Alma Mater: Iowa, 1995 Career Record: 304-126 Win Percentage: .707

Bond Shymansky -- a University of Iowa graduate and Iowa City native -renewed excitement surrounding the Hawkeye volleyball program with success in his first year as head coach in 2014.

In his 13th season overall as a head coach, Shymansky guided the Hawkeyes to a 14-17 overall record and a 6-14 mark in Big Ten Conference action. He has amassed a 304-126 record and .707 win percentage over 13 seasons, earning his 300th win milestone on Oct. 31, 2014, with a 3-0 sweep of Maryland on the road.

The program's six conference victories in 2014 were the most for the program since 2008. Four of the Big Ten wins came consecutively, as the Hawkeyes defeated Maryland (3-0), Rutgers (3-1), Indiana (3-2) and No. 12-ranked Purdue (3-1). It is the longest conference win streak for the program in 20 years, dating back to 1994 when lowa won eight straight matches and went on to clinch a berth to the NCAA Tournament. The team's win over the Boilermakers marked the team's first ranked win since 2012.

Alessandra Dietz and Alex Lovell wrote their names in the lowa volleyball record book in the final season of their careers under Shymansky. Dietz broke Jen Barcus' eight-year-old career attack percentage record (.276), finishing her career with a .278 attack percentage. She also broke the program's five-year-old single match attack percentage record, hitting .882 with 15 kills in lowa's 3-0 win at South Dakota State, and ended her career ranked 11th all-time with 274 career blocks. Lovell closed her career ninth all-time with 1,279 kills, and earned the team's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.

University of Iowa Director of Athletics Gary Barta announced Shymansky as the volleyball program's ninth head coach on January 31, 2014.

Shymansky's 12-year resume as a head coach boasted 24 all-conference honorees, three conference players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year, 17 AVCA All-Americans, two AVCA Region Freshman of the Year selections, and eight professional volleyball players.

Shymansky arrived at the University of Iowa after spending five seasons (2009-13) at the helm of the Marquette volleyball program, where he has developed a winning culture and created a postseason tradition. On his watch, the Golden Eagles earned their first NCAA berth and NCAA victory in school history in 2011, and returned to the postseason in 2012 and 2013. Marquette also won its first Big East regular season title and Big East Tournament championship in 2013.

Shymansky was instrumental in the accomplishment of many more firsts for the Marquette volleyball program. He developed 10 honorable mention All-Americans and the program's first third team All-American, helped the program accomplish its first-ever Top 25 national ranking and a No. 8 RPI rating in 2013, and signed the first top 25 ranked recruiting class in program history.

Shymansky, a two-time Big East Conference and Regional Coach of the Year, also understands the importance of academic success. The Golden Eagles posted a team grade point averages of 3.3 or higher each season of his tenure.

Before Marguette, Shymansky spent seven seasons as the head coach at Georgia Tech (2002-09), where he guided the Yellow Jackets to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including Elite Eight and Sweet Sixteen finishes, and three Atlantic Coast Conference championships. In his tenure, Georgia Tech posted an overall mark of 172-64 (.729), including a 96-38 (.716) record in ACC action, and earned No. 4 and No. 6 RPI rankings.

Shymansky produced a first team All-American and a three-time second team All-American at Georgia Tech, signed a Top 5 recruiting class, and was named ACC Conference and Regional Coach of the Year.

Shymansky has a deep understanding of what it means to be a Hawkeye, as he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Communications in 1995 and a Master of Arts in English Education in 1997 from the UI. From 1991-93, Shymansky was a setter and outside hitter on the UI men's volleyball club team.

He and his wife, Iowa City native Catherine (Cruikshank) Shymansky, have a daughter, Corrina, and two sons, Nicholas and Bond.

#### **INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE**

Middle/right side hitter Jess Janota represented the Hawkeyes on a international platform this summer. The sophomore joined 13 other Big Ten student-athletes -- one from each Big Ten institution -- to play seven matches from June 13-25 in Croatia, Slovenia, and Italy.

#### **IOWA TIES**

Head coach Bond Shymansky and five student-athletes -- Lauren Brobst, Reghan Coyle, Molly Kelly, Alyssa Klostermann and Alli O'Deen -- on the 2015 roster were born and raised in the state of Iowa.

For a few Hawkeyes, playing volleyball at the UI is a family affair. O'Deen's mother is a former lowa volleyball player, while Shymansky, an lowa City native, earned a Bachelor of Arts in Communications in 1995 and a Master of Arts in English Education in 1997 from the University of Iowa. He played men's volleyball for the UI club team as a student.

#### ON DECK

The Hawkeyes travel to Honolulu for the Hawaiian Airlines Wahine Volleyball Classic on Sept. 5-6. The Hawkeyes take on the host Rainbow Warriors (12 a.m. CT) and UCLA (9:30 p.m. CT) on Saturday, Sept. 5, and conclude weekend action on Sunday, Sept. 6 with a 7:30 p.m. (CT) match against American.


