HEAD COACH MATT BOLLANT 11-8 // FIRST SEASON

Matt Bollant is in his first year as head coach at Illinois. Bollant comes to Illinois after a successful five-year stint at Green Bay where he guided the Phoenix to five straight Horizon League titles and four straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Under Bollant, Green Bay achieved a 148-19 record (.886 winning percentage), including an 85-5 mark in the Horizon League. The Phoenix were a combined 65-4 in the past two seasons, going 34-2 in 2010-11. Green Bay was ranked as high as No. 9 in the national polls each of the past two seasons, finishing the 2011 season with that ranking. Green Bay won its last seven games against Big Ten teams under Bollant.

Bollant was named the Horizon League Coach of the Year for the fourth time in 2012, guiding Green Bay to a 31-2 record despite losing Horizon League co-Players of the Year Kayla Tetschlag and Celeste Hoewisch. Senior Julie Wojta was a finalist for the Wade Trophy and earned WBCA Second Team All-America honors before being drafted by the Minnesota Lynx.

Bollant has an .837 winning percentage as a collegiate coach, including a 134-36 record at Bryan (Tenn.) College from the NAIA level. He guided the Lady Lions to four straight NAIA Tournaments, reaching the Sweet 16 in 2005-06. Bryan reached the top 25 rankings each of his last four years, reaching as high as No. 11 at the end of the 2006-07 season. Bollant coached four Appalachian Athletic Conference Players of the Year.

Bollant was as an assistant coach under Kathi Bennett, the daughter of former Wisconsin men's coach Dick Bennett, for five seasons before becoming a collegiate head coach. He served three years under Bennett at the University of Evansville, helping the Purple Aces to the 1999 NCAA Tournament, then followed her to Indiana, where the Hoosiers became the lowest seed (5) to win the Big Ten Tournament in 2002.

A 1994 graduate of Winona State University with a degree in business education, Bollant received a master's degree in education from American Intercontinental University.

He served as both the varsity and junior varsity head coach of Depper Life Academy in the Philippines and spent three years as the head coach at Tigerton (Wis.) High School, guiding the Tigers to a 63-10 record and to three Central Wisconsin Conference Small School titles from 1994-97.

Bollant and his wife, Kari, have two daughters: Abi and Regan.

QUICK HITS

• **THURSDAY'S GAME:** Illinois (11-8, 4-3) returns home for a Thursday tilt with Iowa (15-6, 5-2), which is ranked No. 24 in this week's *Associated Press* poll and No. 25 in the *USA Today* Coaches poll. It will be the only time the teams meet during the regular season. The Illini have a quick turnaround after playing Monday night game at Minnesota and a fog delay prevented the team from returning to Champaign-Urbana until Tuesday afternoon. Illinois has won four of its last six games overall but is looking for its first win at the Assembly Hall since a 70-59 triumph over then-No. 6 Georgia on Dec. 28.

• **RECAPPING THE WIN AT MINNESOTA:** In Monday's win at Minnesota, the Illini made 11 three-pointers, breaking the school record for treys in a Big Ten game, and totaled 23 assists, UI's most since tallying 28 against Cal Poly on Nov. 22, 2010. Karisma Penn and Adrienne GodBold each recorded a double-double, Taylor Tuck scored a career-high 16 points on 5-of-10 shooting (3-of-5 three-pointers) and Amber Moore hit 5-of-10 three-pointers as part of her 20 points.

• **TURNAROUND IN PROGRESS:** With 11 wins so far this season, the Illini have matched last season's win total and surpassed the program's nine victories in 2010-11. Through 19 games last season, the Illini were 6-13 overall, 0-6 in the Big Ten. Illinois started the 2011-12 conference season 0-7 before beating Michigan State on Jan. 26, 2012. The Illini didn't get their fourth Big Ten win until Feb. 12 and finished 5-11 in conference play. The last time the Illini won four Big Ten games before February was in 2009-10, when they went 4-6 in December and January.

• **ILLINI RELISH UNDERDOG ROLE:** Illinois has won two of its last three games against ranked opponents after beating AP-ranked No. 6 Georgia on Dec. 28 and Ohio State, who was No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, on Jan. 6. The loss was a 67-66 overtime thriller to No. 14 Purdue on Jan. 2. Illinois is 42-168 all-time against AP-ranked opponents and 29-68 at home.

• **ILLINI PUT FOES UNDER PRESSURE:** Illinois has ratcheted up the defensive pressure lately, forcing 204 turnovers in its last eight games (25.5 per game), and 178 in seven Big Ten games (25.4 pg). The Illini lead the league with 15.3 steals per game during conference play, and Illinois leads the league and ranks 21st nationally in steals (12.2 per game) overall. The Illini recorded 24 steals, the most in a Big Ten game in school history, and forced 34 turnovers against Northwestern on Jan 10. • **STEALING THE SPOTLIGHT:** Four Illini players rank in the top 10 in steals per game in conference play, as Karisma Penn ranks second (3.9 spg), Adrienne GodBold is fifth (3.1 spg), Ivory Crawford is sixth (3.0 spg) and Alexis Smith is tied for ninth (2.4 spg).

• **ILLINI 'TREY-MENDOUS' FROM DEEP:** Illinois radio play-by-play man Dave Loane has been using his

Evansville, tying the second-most in a game in school history and the most by an Illinois team in nearly nine years. The Illini broke the school record for threes in a Big Ten game with 11 at Minnesota on Jan. 28 and also hit 10 treys against Illinois State on Dec. 21.

• **ROAD WARRIORS:** The Illini have won four straight Big Ten road games (Ohio State, 1/6; Northwestern, 1/10; Nebraska, 1/17; Minnesota, 1/28), marking the first time since 2001 that Illinois has accomplished the feat. Like this season, the Illini also won their first four conference road contests in 2001. It also has been since 2001 that the Illini have won four or more Big Ten road games in an entire conference season, as that squad won five. Overall, the Orange and Blue are 5-1 this season in true road games.

• **GODBOLD SHOWS SHE WAS UI'S MISSING PIECE:** After missing the first semester for academic reasons, senior guard Adrienne GodBold has been a force. She poured in a career-high 28 points against Michigan State on Jan. 13, scored 21 against Northwestern on Jan. 20 and added 18 at Minnesota on Jan. 28. She has scored in double digits in all eight games she has played, including four 20-point efforts. In Big Ten play, GodBold ranks third in the league with 20.0 points per game.

• **ILLINOIS GETS IT DONE DOWN LOW:** Despite generally being out-sized, the Illini have held their own in the paint lately, outscoring their last eight foes 240-217 in the post, an average of 30.0-27.1 per game. Illinois out-paced No. 6 Georgia 32-18 and outscored No. 14 Purdue 38-28. The Illini have outscored five of their last eight foes in the paint.

• **RPI ON SOLID FOOTING:** The Illini's RPI, according to WarrenNolan.com, stands at No. 61 and the Orange

and Blue have faced one of the top schedules in the country, as Illinois' slate is rated No. 28. Six of the Illini's Big Ten foes have RPI figures in the top 40, while Minnesota is No. 70 and Ohio State is No. 74.

• **OFFENSE THRIVES UNDER BOLLANT:** The Illini rank second in the Big Ten and 22nd nationally in scoring, averaging 72.4 points per game. Illinois raised its scoring average an entire point per game with a 91-point performance at Minnesota on Monday. Through 19 games, the Orange and Blue are averaging 9.2 ppg more than last season's first 19 games scoring average of 63.2.

• **PENN DOES IT ALL:** Senior forward Karisma Penn leads the Big Ten in rebounding and blocked shots, ranks third in steals, fourth in scoring and sixth in field-goal percentage, making her the only player in the conference to rank in the top six in all five categories. Penn also is the only player in the country to average 18.0 points per game, 10.0 rebounds per game and 2.0 blocks per game. A career 13.9 ppg scorer, Penn is up to 18.7 ppg so far this year. For more on Penn's strong final season, see page 5.

• **MOORE IS BETTER:** Junior guard Amber Moore also has increased her productivity under first-year head coach Matt Bollant, averaging 12.8 points per game after entering the season with a career average of 9.2 ppg. Moore is averaging 2.68 three-point field goals per game, third-best in the Big Ten, and Illinois is 8-1 when she makes three or more triples in a game. Moore also ranks third in the league in free-throw percentage (.907) and second in minutes played (36.9 mpg), and is among conference leaders in scoring (16th) and three-point field-goal percentage (11th, .354). FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

SCOUTING THE HAWKEYES

Winners of its last three games and four of its last five, Iowa enters Thursday's game 16-5 and ranked No. 24 in the nation according to this week's *Associated Press* poll. The Hawkeyes also stand tied for third in the Big Ten with a 5-2 league record.

- Iowa opened the year with three straight wins before losing three of five games around Thanksgiving. But the Hawks rattled off seven straight wins from Dec. 1-Jan. 3.
- The Hawkeyes are No. 17 in WarrenNolan.com's RPI rankings and have a schedule strength of 11, the best schedule in the Big Ten. Iowa is 10-5 against RPI Top 100 teams, 4-4 against teams in the top 50.
- Iowa leads the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.0:1), and ranks second in the Big Ten in assists (16.3 per game) and blocked shots (5.7 per game). The Hawkeyes rank fourth in the league in three-pointers made per game (5.6), fourth in three-point percentage (.343), field-goal defense (.354) and three-point field-goal defense (.274).
- Senior Morgan Johnson is the Big Ten's active career leading rebounder, ranks eighth in scoring (15.7 ppg) and rebounding (7.5 rpg) and is third in field-goal percentage (.539). Senior Jaime Printy is the reigning Big Ten Player of the Week and is 13th in the Big Ten in scoring at 14.2 ppg.

IOWA SERIES HISTORY

Iowa holds a commanding 49-16 lead in the all-time series with the Illini and has won eight straight dating back to 2007. The Hawkeyes also have won 14 of the last 15 meetings, with Illinois' last victory coming by a 74-69 score in Iowa City on Feb. 15, 2007. The Illini last beat Iowa at the Assembly Hall on Feb. 9, 2003 (73-58). The Hawkeyes also hold a 20-10 lead in games in Champaign, having won seven straight.

LAST MEETING WITH THE HAWKEYES

Iowa hit its first three-pointer of the game with 10.9 seconds left and Lydia McCully's 12-foot baseline jumper was short as the Hawkeyes forced the game to overtime and pulled out a 69-62 win over Illinois at Carver-Hawkeye Arena on Jan. 5, 2012. Karisma Penn led the Illini with 20 points and nine rebounds, McCully added 11 and Kersten Magrum had 10. Illinois never trailed in the second half, but Iowa scored 17 of the game's final 24 points to close out the overtime victory.

LAST TIME OUT: MINNESOTA

Illinois finished on a 10-4 run to pull out a 91-86 victory over Minnesota in front of 2,476 fans at Williams Arena on Monday night. Karisma Penn led the Illini with 21 points and 12 rebounds, and Adrienne Godbold had 18 points and 11 boards as Illinois improved to 4-0 in Big Ten road games. Amber Moore added 20 points, including 5-of-10 from three-point range, and Taylor Tuck also added a career-high 16 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the floor.

ILLINI IN NCAA STATS

Illinois continues to rank among the national leaders in a handful of statistical categories, through games of Jan. 28. The Illini stand 21st in steals per game (12.2 spg), 22nd in scoring offense (72.4 ppg), 44th in turnover margin (+3.9 per game), 56th in blocked shots per game (4.4 bpg).

Junior **Amber Moore** is 38th nationally in three-point field goals made per game (2.68).

Senior **Karisma Penn** ranks 19th nationally in blocked shots per game (2.53), 20th in double-doubles (10), 31st in scoring (18.7 ppg) and rebounding (10.4 rpg), and 41st in field-goal percentage (50.8 percent). Also, her 16-of-17 free-throw performance against Ohio State on Jan. 6 is the second-best non-perfect outing in the nation by percentage this year and ranks 18th overall.

Sophomore **Alexis Smith** is 38th in the nation in assists per game (5.4). In addition, her 14 assists against Wake Forest (Nov. 29), are tied for the third-most in a game in the nation this year, and her 13 dimes against Cleveland State on Nov. 18 are tied for the fourth-most in the country.

DEFENSE PUTS CLAMPS ON OPPONENTS

Illinois has displayed an impressive ability to force turnovers, especially of late. The Illini have caused 445 turnovers on the season, 52 more than the next-best Big Ten team, and 178 in conference play, 39 more than the second-best Big Ten team.

ILLINOIS FLEXING ITS OFFENSIVE MUSCLES

Illinois is averaging 72.4 points per game, which ranks second in the Big Ten and 22nd nationally.

Illinois is on pace for its best scoring season since the Illini averaged 76.2 points per game in 1999-2000, the year of UI's last NCAA Tournament victory. The Illini have not averaged 70 points per game since 2002-03, their last trip to the NCAA Tournament.

The Orange and Blue have topped 80 points in six of their 11 wins and have scored 70-plus points in 11 of 19 games to this point, besting the number of times

that Illinois reached the 80-point (two) and 70-point (six) marks last season.

The Illini's 75-point output against Michigan State is the second-most the Spartans have allowed behind only Penn State's 76 on Jan. 6. In addition, Illinois' 79-point game at Ohio State was the most points the Buckeyes had allowed this year and the Illini's 70 points against No. 6 Georgia on Dec. 28 were the most the Bulldogs had allowed to that point. Earlier in the year, Illinois recorded a 95-point outburst against Wake Forest on Nov. 29, the Illini's highest scoring output against a BCS conference opponent since dropping 96 on Ohio State on Feb. 13, 2002.

PENN OFF TO FAST START

- Illinois forward Karisma Penn is a two-time All-Big Ten selection, but is positioning herself as a Player of the Year candidate in 2013. Penn scored 34 points at Ohio State (1/6), 30 on Wake Forest (11/29) and 29 on Bradley (11/15), and recording 10 double-doubles in 19 games.
- Penn is averaging a double-double on the season, the only Big Ten player to do so, with 18.7 points and 10.4 rebounds per game. Penn leads the Big Ten in rebounding and offensive rebounding (4.1 rpg) and blocked shots (2.5 bpg), ranks third in steals (2.7 spg), fourth in scoring, sixth in field-goal percentage (50.8 percent) and seventh in minutes played (35.2 mpg).
- Penn is the only player in the country to average 18.0 points per game, 10.0 rebounds per game and 2.0 blocks per game. She also is one of only nine players in the nation to average at least 18.0 points per game and 10.0 rebounds per game. Below is a complete list sorted by points per game:

- Penn has scored in double figures in 18 of 19 games this year and 90 of her 115 collegiate games (78.2 percent). She had a career-high 34 points at Ohio State (1/6), which marked her fourth career 30-point game, and she scored 21 at Minnesota (1/28) for her 29th contest with 20-plus points. Penn has reached the 20-point mark eight times this season after scoring 20 or more in only seven games in all of 2011-12.
- Penn is the active career Big Ten leader in rebounds (924) and double-doubles (38), and her 10 double-doubles this season also lead the league.
- Penn earned USBWA and espnW national player of the week, and Big Ten player of the week honors

after scoring 27 points, grabbing a career-best 19 rebounds and blocking two shots to break Ul's career blocks record in Illinois' 70-59 win over then-No. 6 Georgia on Dec. 28. She kept it rolling the next week, earning her second-straight Big Ten player of the week laurels by posting a career-high 34 points and pulling down 12 boards in Illinois win at Ohio State and adding 15 and nine, respectively, in a one-point overtime loss to then-No. 14 Purdue. Penn broke the Illinois record with 16 made free throws in 17 attempts against OSU and shot 60 percent (15-of-25) from the floor on the week.

- Penn has notched 15 or more rebounds four times this season, most recently grabbing 18 boards at Nebraska (1/17). She hauled in a career-high 19 against No. 6 Georgia (12/28), had 16 against Bradley (11/15) and 15 against Illinois State (12/21).
- Penn recorded six blocked shots against Illinois State, equaling the second-most of her career, and had two more against No. 6 Georgia, breaking Jenna Smith's school record for career blocked shots. Penn has 247 in her career and 48 this season, averaging 2.5 per game. Her 48 blocks stand 10th in a season in school history, meaning all four of her seasons now rank among the top 10. She had averaged 2.07 blocks per game entering this season.
- Penn passed Angelina Williams for fifth place on Illinois' career scoring list with her 12 points at Nebraska, and now has 1,687 in her career. With a strong finish to the season, she could pass Lisa Robinson (1,906) for fourth place.
- Penn also moved up the career rebounding list with 18 boards at Nebraska (Jan. 17), passing two former Illini. She now stands fourth with 924 and needs 10 to pass Jonelle Polk for third place.

SMITH SHORES UP POINT GUARD SPOT

After seeing limited time as a freshman, Alexis Smith has taken over as Illinois' point guard in 2012-13. Last year, Smith played in 19 games and totaled only 19 points and five assists. This year, Smith has been a driving force for a much-improved Illinois squad.

- Smith posted eight assists against four turnovers at Minnesota on Jan. 28, her most assists since totaling 14 against Wake Forest on Nov. 29, a string of 13 games.

FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

- She recorded her fourth double-digit scoring game with 14 points against Oregon while also grabbing six rebounds, dishing six assists and recording three steals. Smith had a career-high 17 points against Colorado, 15 against Tulsa and 10 against Bradley.

- Smith had a career night dishing the ball in Illinois' 95-82 win over Wake Forest on Nov. 29, totaling a career-high 14 assists while committing only three turnovers. Her 14 helpers mark the third-most in a game in school history and are tied for the third-most in a game in the nation this year.

- Smith had 13 assists and four turnovers vs. Cleveland State on Nov. 18. The 13 assists are tied for the fourth-most in a game in school history and the fourth-most in a game in the country this year.

- For the season, Smith has 102 assists and 95 turnovers. She ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 5.4 assists per game and 14th in assist/turnover ratio (1.1:1).

CRAWFORD BECOMING CONSISTENT CONTRIBUTOR

Ivory Crawford stands third on the Illini in scoring, averaging 13.2 points per game, an improvement of 6.6 ppg over last season. Crawford has led Illinois in scoring twice, including a 32-point outburst against Cleveland State on Nov. 18.

- Last year, Crawford averaged 6.6 points per game and reached double figures nine times in 30 games. With her 11 points against Northwestern (Jan. 20), she now has 13 double-figure performances in 19 games this year.

- She is ranked fourth in the Big Ten in steals (2.6 spg) and 14th in the league in scoring (13.2 ppg).

- Crawford has turned up her effort on the defensive end lately, posting a career-high five steals against No. 14 Purdue (Jan. 2) and posting 14 steals in four games from Jan. 10-20.

- In her 32-point game against Cleveland State, Crawford was 11-of-14 from the field, 4-of-4 from three-point range, and 6-of-7 from the line.

- Crawford posted a 26-point outing against Wake Forest on Nov. 29 on 9-of-14 shooting from the floor and 6-of-6 from the free-throw line.

MOORE CRANKS IT UP IN JUNIOR SEASON

Redshirt-junior Amber Moore is having a breakout junior season, averaging 3.6 more points per game and 0.8 more made three-pointers per game than her career averages entering this season.

- Moore ranks fourth on the team and 16th in the Big Ten in scoring with 12.8 points per game, and her 2.7 three-pointers per game rank third in the league. She entered the season averaging 9.2 ppg and 1.92 three-pointers per game.

- She exploded for 20 points, including 5-of-10 three-pointers, at Minnesota on Jan. 28, the most points she has scored since pouring in 21 at Texas Tech

on Dec. 5. The five treys also tied her season high, which she notched in the season-opener against Evansville.

- Moore has been strong with the basketball, tallying 49 assists to 40 turnovers, giving her a 1.2:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

- She also has been rock-solid from the free-throw line, hitting 39-of-43 (.907) on the season, a per-

centage that ranks third in the Big Ten. She had made 15 straight from the line before missing her first of two free throws at Minnesota on Jan. 28.

- Moore also has been the most durable Illini, averaging 36.9 minutes per game, which ranks second in the Big Ten, an improvement of 8.9 minutes per game over her career average entering this season.
- The Detroit, Mich., native moved into third place on Illinois' career three-pointers made list with her five treys at Minnesota, passing Mandy Cunningham and now holding 172 triples. She also stands third in career threes attempted (507) and eighth in three-point field-goal percentage (.339). She needs 23 more three-pointers to pass Krista Reinking for second on that list.

ILLINI PUT TOGETHER BOMB SQUAD

- Three-point shooting has been a big focus for the Illini so far in 2012-13, as they have attempted over 20 3s in 12 of 19 games and have made eight or more six times. Last season, Illinois only made eight 3s once and attempted more than 20 once.
- The Illini rank third in the Big Ten in three-pointers made per game with 6.0 but have seen that number dip in conference play, as they stand fifth in Big Ten games at 5.3 per game.
- Illinois made 11 three-pointers (11-of-25) against Evansville on Nov. 11, equaling the third-most in a game in school history and the most in nearly nine years. The Orange and Blue duplicated that feat by going 11-of-27 from beyond the arc at Minnesota on Jan. 28, which is a school record for threes made in a Big Ten game. The Illini notched 10 triples against Illinois State on Dec. 21, tied for the fourth-most in a game.

Jacqui Grant, 6-3, F, Park Ridge, Ill. (Maine South HS)

Grant helped Maine South to a third-place finish in the 2011 Class 4A Tournament. A first-team all-area selection, she is a three-time Central Suburban League all-conference performer. The team MVP led the Hawks in scoring (13.1 ppg), rebounding (6.4 rpg) and blocked shots (2.2) last season. She ranks third in school history in career rebounding and is seventh all-time on the Maine South career scoring list, on pace to at least crack the top two in each category.
