The Leathernecks have a 1-13 record. They have dropped seven of their last eight games. Their lone win of the season was against Long Beach State who was then ranked seventh at the time.

Western Illinois is led by Kenny Price who is hitting .396 and leads the team in doubles (4).

SCOUTING NORTHERN ILLINOIS:

The 7-10 Huskies are led by Jeff Thomas who is hitting .388 on the year with 16 RBI and Dave Reynolds who is hitting .354 with five doubles.

The Huskies are a perfect 3-0 in the MAC.

In the school series, Iowa leads 18-7.

RUTGERS SUMMARY:

The Hawkeyes won their first series of the year against Rutgers in DeLand, FL. The teams competed in three games, and Iowa came out on top in two.

The Hawkeyes fell to Rutgers in the first game of a double header March 15, 8-6.

In the loss, Iowa scattered 14 hits. Justin Toole led the Hawkeyes and continued his hitting streak to five games, going 3-for-5 with a RBI. Caleb Curry hit well also, going a perfect 3-for-3 with a RBI.

The Hawkeyes took the second game of the double header against Rutgers, 9-2. Iowa out-hit the Scarlet Knights, 15-6, in the win and Michael Jacobs threw seven solid innings.

In the win, Curry continued to swing with bat well going 3-for-5 with three RBI. Toole continued his hitting streak going 2-for-3 and scoring two runs. And three Hawkeyes (Muller, Riffel and Freie) went 2-for-5.

Iowa defeated Rutgers, 16-14, March 16. The Hawkeyes' bullpen kept the Scarlet Knights at bay while Iowa's offense scattered 14 hits and capitalized on five errors.

Iowa hit .383 and swiped 13-14

bases in the series. The Hawkeyes had four doubles, a triple and six steals in the win. Curry continued his hitting rampage, going 2-for-5 with three RBIs. In the three game series, Curry went 8-for-13 to lead Iowa. Matt Mossey also swung the bat well, going 3-for-3 and scoring three runs with two RBIs. Muller had a big day at the plate going 3-for-4 with three RBIs and Willis had three walks. Blaser was 2-for-3 with a double and two RBIs.

STETSON SUMMARY:

The Hawkeyes split with the Hatters' in a two game series in DeLand, FL last week.

Iowa lost 9-6 at Stetson Tuesday night. The Hawkeye offense erupted in the third inning, but was unable to win their third straight game.

In the Iowa loss, Caleb Curry continued his hitting rampage, going 2-for-4 with two RBIs and a stolen base. Curry is 10-for-17 in DeLand. Kevin Hoef swung the bat well for the Black and Gold going 2-for-4 with a walk and Trevor Willis went 1-for-3 and scored a run.

The Hawkeye bullpen had another strong outing in the loss. The pitching staff included; Kyle Heim, Jason Belk and Andrew Porter. They pitched four innings allowing two runs on five hits and struck out five.

Iowa won 5-4 Wednesday against Stetson. In the game, Iowa had no errors and its pitching staff threw six scoreless innings.

The Hawkeye bullpen threw well in the win. The pitching staff included, Tony Manville, Andrew Porter and Matt Mossey. They pitched five and one-third innings allowing four runs on five hits and struck out five. Mossey recorded the final three outs to collect his second save.

In the Iowa win, the Hawkeyes took advantage of six walks and two Hatter errors. Toole went 2-for-4 with three RBIs and Cataldo was 1-for-2 with a run. Zach McCool was 1-for-1 as a pinch hitter.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm is in his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an overall record of 391-404-2 and is 108-128 at Iowa.

Last season, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejay baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three this past spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAA's Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 41-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married 14 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

The Hawkeyes are hitting .309 as a team on the year. The Black and Gold is led by **Caleb Curry** who is hitting .491 and by freshman **Trevor Willis** who has hit .375 in his first six games as a Hawkeye.

IOWA OFFENSE IS STREAKING:

After a week in Florida, **Kyle Riffel** is currently on a seven game hitting streak, going 7-for-21 on the week.

On top of that, **Caleb Curry** leads the team with nine multi-hit games, followed by **Justin Toole** and **Kevin Hoef** who have seven. Toole and Curry both lead the team with multi-RBI games with six.

CURRY RECEIVES HONOR:

Senior **Caleb Curry** received *CollegeBaseballHub.com's* Heartland Hitter of the Week honor for his performance against Rutgers.

Curry went 8-for-13 with seven RBI, two walks and three runs scored in the series.

DIAMOND THIEVES:

This season the Hawkeyes have out-run their opponents, going 39-for-50. Leading Iowa in steals are **Caleb Curry** with 12 and **Kyle Riffel** with six.

BY THE NUMBERS IN THE BIG TEN:

Caleb Curry has taken the Big Ten by storm, when compared with the league's players he ranks in the top three in: batting average (.491), on base percentage (.547), hits (27), runs batted in (21) and stolen bases (12).

Other Hawkeyes who rank well in the conference include: **Justin Toole** is tied for fourth in runs batted in (18), **Kevin Hoef** leads the league in hit-by-pitches (6) and **Kyle Riffel** is second in the league in hit-by-pitches (5). **Andrew Porter** is second in appearances (9).

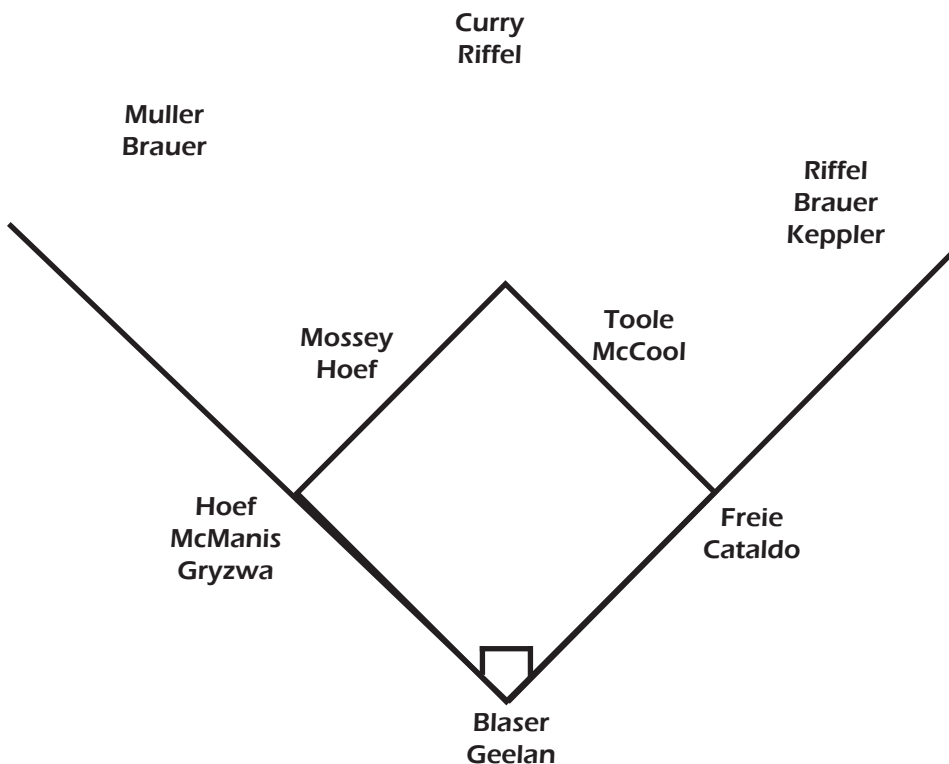
BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

Freie had a stellar weekend helping lead Iowa to a 2-1 record, including a 6-3 upset win over fifth-ranked Vanderbilt, at the Music City Classic in Nashville, TN. The first baseman, who was named tournament MVP, was 9-for-12 with a double, home run, two RBI and two walks. The junior led the Black and Gold against No. 5 Vanderbilt, going a perfect 4-for-4 with an RBI.

Alberts had a great season debut in Iowa's come-from-behind win over Xavier Feb. 29. The senior right hander threw five and one-third innings in relief for the win. He allowed no runs, scattered five hits with no walks and struck out a career-high 10 of the 21 batters he faced.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH:

Iowa will play one of its toughest schedules in 2008 as it will face nine teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. The Hawkeyes will welcome NCAA Tournament teams Minnesota, Nebraska and Ohio State to Iowa City and will take on Albany, Creighton, Michigan, Rutgers, Stetson and Vanderbilt on the road. Iowa will face three teams in conference action that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

LAST SEASON:

Iowa posted a 31-23 record in 2007, the Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13, and earned their second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

During the season, Iowa defeated five teams (Nebraska, Fresno State, Ohio State, Minnesota and Michigan) that reached the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes also posted a 12-game winning streak, which is the second-longest in school history. Included in the streak was a school-record 10-game Big Ten winning streak.

BIG TEN NETWORK SCHEDULE:

Some Hawkeye games will be televised on the Big Ten Network for the first time this season. The following games have been picked by the network:

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Nick Zumsande**, along with volunteer coach **Kris Welker** and Director of Baseball **Matt Haddy**.

Ryan Brownlee enters his fifth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

As hitting coach, Brownlee saw the team's batting average vault 55 points from 2005 to 2007 (.269 to .324). Additionally, the team also scored more runs (273 to 401) had more RBIs (249 to 345) and walks (152 to 245) during that time span. **Nick Zumsande** enters his fifth year as the Iowa pitching coach.

Under Zumsande's guidance, the Hawkeye pitching has had a pitcher named first team all-Big Ten three of the last four years, and a pitcher named all-conference in each of his four years.

Kris Welker is in his second year as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports and coaches first base.

As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He led the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBIs and 16 doubles. Welker also received the Bob Oldis, Jr MVP Award

Matt Haddy is in his third season as the Director of Baseball Operations for the University of Iowa.

He assists the coaching staff with the day-to-day operations and administrative areas of the program. Haddy also serves as the travel coordinator and director of Hawkeye Baseball Camps.

HAWKEYE SIGN EIGHT FOR 2009: The Iowa Baseball program has signed eight recruits for next year. **Nick Brown, Sean Flanagan, Cory Glieden, Jarred Hippen, Mike McQuillan, Zach Robertson, Phil Schreiber** and **Chett Zeise** all signed national letters of intent.

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY : Hawkeye baseball ties run deep, and it shows in the support staff. Baseball administrator **Fred Mims**, academic advisor **Troy Wulf** and volunteer assistant coach **Kris Welker** are all former Iowa baseball players.

2008 MUSIC CITY CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: After going 2-1 at the tournament and upsetting Vanderbilt, the Hawkeyes received six of the 12 spots on the all-tournament team, including the MVP.

Hawkeyes honored were: **Justin Toole** at second, **Kevin Hoef** at shortstop, **Kyle Riffel** in the outfield, **Caleb Curry** in the outfield and **Wes Freie** as utility and MVP.

SAME FACES, NEW PLACES: When you look around the diamond this season, your eyes don't deceive you. There are several familiar faces in the lineup playing different positions. Junior **Kevin Hoef** moved from third base to shortstop, while senior **Caleb Curry** moved to center field from left field.

HAWKEYES HIT THE CLASSROOM: In October, the Iowa baseball team was awarded the 2007 NCAA Public Recognition Award for being in the 90% percentile of Academic Progress Report (APR) for baseball.

THE 30-WIN CLUB: The Hawkeyes' 31 wins in 2007 were the most under Coach Jack Dahm, in his career at Iowa, and the most at Iowa since 1993. The 1993 squad posted a 32-20 record under Duane Banks.

O'ROURKE OUT:

Senior pitcher **Casey O'Rourke** has ended his collegiate career for medical reasons following his bout with testicular cancer in 2006. He will remain on the squad as a student assistant.

O'Rourke had 11 appearances and seven starts last season. He pitched 32.2 innings and had an 8.54 ERA. The native of Williamsburg, IA, was named to the academic all-conference team last year.

2008 UNITY COUNCIL: The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This year's council includes: senior **Ben Geelan**, junior **Kevin Hoef**, junior **Justin Toole**, sophomore **Tyson Blaser**, sophomore **Michael Jacobs** and freshman **Kurtis Mueller**.

WHISTLIN' RAY: Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 837-758-3.

IN MEMORY OF ROSE GILMORE: Iowa Baseball lost a true Hawkeye January 23, 2008. Long time supporter **Rose E. Gilmore** (mother of Ray Gilmore) lost her battle with cancer at the age of 77.

Rose was an Iowa City native who retired from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in 1996 after 19 years of dedication.

Rose also served as a Captain in the US Army and was an avid Hawkeye and Cubs fan.
