SCOUTING RUTGERS:

The Scarlet Knights have a record of 3-6 after going 1-2 against No. 21 Texas A&M last weekend.

Rutgers is led by DH Jon Gosard who leads the team in RBI with nine, infielder Tom Edwards who leads the team with 11 hits and power hitting first basemen Jaren Matthews who has two home runs on the year.

SCOUTING STETSON:

The Hatters' record is 7-6 and 5-2 at home.

The dangerous Stetson offense is hitting .305 as a team and has 36 doubles on the year, 12 home runs and 82 RBI.

Leading the Hatters is Jeremy Cruz, who is hitting .519 with two triples, four home runs and 20 RBI.

HOT HITTING:

Junior **Justin Toole** had a hot bat last weekend, going 5-for-11 (.455) with a weekend-high four RBIs.

Senior **Caleb Curry** also continued to swing the bat well for the Hawkeyes. Curry hit 3-for-9 (.333) against Missouri State and had two RBIs.

Freshman **Trevor Willis** swung with authority in his first game as a Hawkeye last weekend. He went 2-for-3 with a double.

HAWKEYE BULLPEN KEEPS MISSOURI STATE BEARS AT BAY:

In last weekend's series with Missouri State, ten Hawkeye bullpen pitchers threw 13.1 innings and only allowed three earned runs on 14 hits and struck out eight.

CHASING THE RECORD BOOK:

After being hit by two pitches in the series against Missouri State, junior **Kevin Hoef**, who is the Iowa all-time leader of career hit-by-pitches with 35, has six on the year.

The next record in sight for the junior is Iowa's single-season record held by **Kris Welker** with 17.

MISSOURI STATE SUMMARY:

Iowa was swept by the Missouri State Bears last weekend in Springfield, MO.

Iowa lost to the Bears Saturday, 6-3. Iowa's bullpen threw well in the loss and the Hawkeyes chipped away at the Bears lead throughout the game.

In the Iowa loss, the Hawkeyes' defense played well and had no errors. The Black and Gold were led by **Matt Mossey** who was 2-for-3 with two doubles and one RBI. **Tyson Blaser** went 2-for-4 and **Kurtis Mueller** went 1-for-3 for the Hawkeyes.

The Hawkeyes dropped the first game of the Sunday doubleheader to the Missouri State at Hammons Field, 8-3.

Kevin Hoef led the Hawkeyes going 2-for-3, scoring all three runs. **Justin Toole** and **Kyle Riffel** both went 1-for-2 for the Black and Gold.

Iowa lost the second game of Sunday's double header to Missouri State, 12-5.

For the Hawkeyes, Hoef continued to hit well, going 1-for-3 and scoring two Iowa runs. Freshman **Trevor Willis** swung the bat well for Iowa, going 2-for-3. Additionally, Toole was 3-for-5 with three RBIs.

The Iowa bullpen featured five Hawkeyes, and in five and two-third innings they only allowed two runs on eight hits.

TAKING ONE FOR THE TEAM:

The Hawkeyes have gotten hit by 19 pitches so far this season, with **Kevin Hoef** leading the team with six. In contrast, Iowa pitchers have only hit six total opponents in nine games this season.

IOWA OFFENSE IS STREAKING:

Justin Toole started his hitting streak last weekend and is currently on a four-game rampage.

On top of that, Curry and **Kevin Hoef** both have five multi-hit games, while Toole has five multi-RBI games.

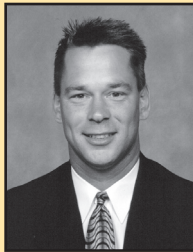

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm is in his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 388-402-2 overall record and is 105-126 at Iowa.

Last season, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three this past spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAAs Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 41-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married 14 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

This season the Hawkeyes have out-run their opponents, going 21-for-28. Leading Iowa in steals are **Caleb Curry** with seven and **Kyle Riffel** with five.

LEADING OFF THE INNING:

The Hawkeyes are hitting .506 to leadoff the inning. Reaching base 40 times in 79 chances. Leading the Hawkeyes are **Kurtis Mueller** and **Justin Toole**, hitting .750 in leadoff situations.

BY THE NUMBERS IN THE BIG TEN:

Caleb Curry has taken the Big Ten by storm, when compared with the league's players he ranks in the top three in: batting average (.486), on base percentage (.550), runs batted in (12) and stolen bases (7).

Other Hawkeyes who rank well in the conference include: **Matt Mossey** is tied at second in doubles (5), **Justin Toole** is tied for first in runs batted in (14), **Kevin Hoef** leads the league in hit-by-pitches (6) and **Kyle Riffel** is second in the league in stolen bases (5).

BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

Wes Freie was named Big Ten Player of the Week on March 4. In addition, **Brock Alberts** earned co-Pitcher of the Week accolades, sharing the honor with Minnesota's Phil Isaksson.

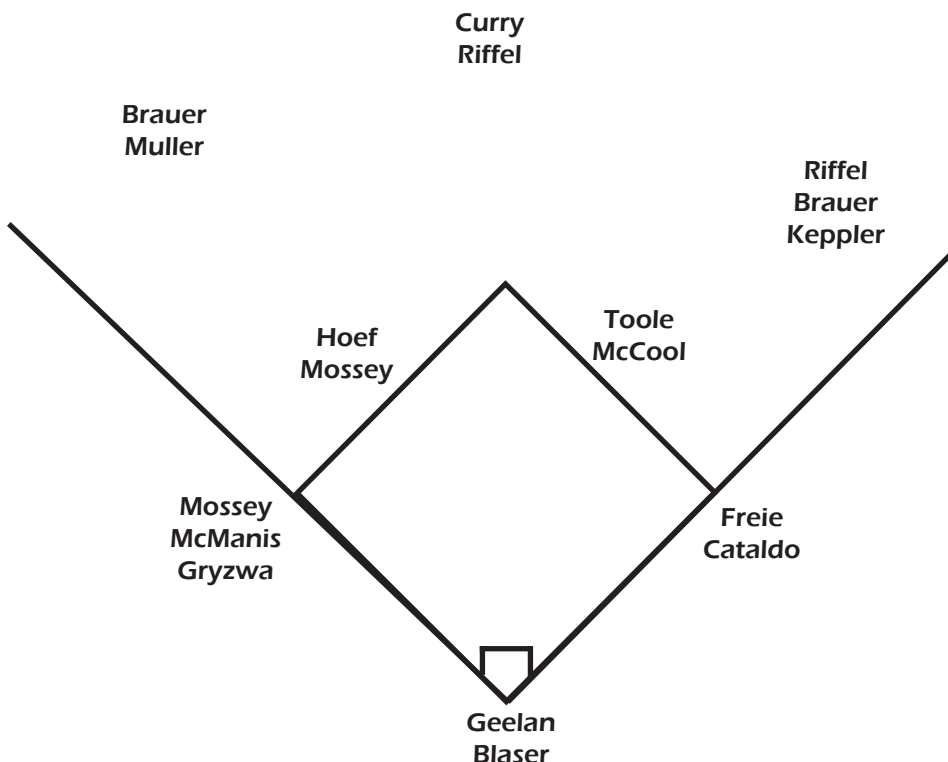
Freie had a stellar weekend helping lead Iowa to a 2-1 record, including a 6-3 upset win over fifth-ranked Vanderbilt, at the Music City Classic in Nashville, TN. The first baseman, who was named tournament MVP, was 9-for-12 with a double, home run, two RBI and two walks. The junior led the Black and Gold against No. 5 Vanderbilt, going a perfect 4-for-4 with an RBI.

Alberts had a great season debut in Iowa's come-from-behind win over Xavier Feb. 29. The senior right hander threw five and one-third innings in relief for the win. The Swisher, IA, native allowed no runs, scattered five hits with no walks and struck out a career-high 10 of the 21 batters he faced.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH:

Iowa will play one of its toughest schedules in 2008 as it will face nine teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. The Hawkeyes will welcome NCAA Tournament teams Minnesota, Nebraska and Ohio State to Iowa City and will take on Albany, Creighton, Michigan, Rutgers, Stetson and Vanderbilt on the road. Iowa will face three teams in conference action that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

LAST SEASON:

Iowa posted a 31-23 record in 2007, the Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13, and earned their second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

During the season, Iowa defeated five teams (Nebraska, Fresno State, Ohio State, Minnesota and Michigan) that reached the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes also posted a 12-game winning streak, which is the second-longest in school history. Included in the streak was a school-record 10-game Big Ten winning streak.

BIG TEN NETWORK SCHEDULE:

Some Hawkeye games will be televised on the Big Ten Network for the first time this season. The following games have been picked by the network:

HAWKEYE SIGN EIGHT FOR 2009:

The Iowa Baseball program has signed eight recruits for next year. **Nick Brown, Sean Flanagan, Cory Glieden, Jarred Hippen, Mike McQuillan, Zach Robertson, Phil Schreiber** and **Chett Zeise** all signed national letters of intent to attend Iowa.

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY :

Hawkeye baseball ties run deep, and it shows in the support staff. Baseball administrator **Fred Mims**, academic advisor **Troy Wulf** and volunteer assistant coach **Kris Welker** are all former Iowa baseball players.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by batting coach **Ryan Brownlee** and pitching coach **Nick Zumsande**, along with volunteer assistant coach **Kris Welker** and Director of Baseball **Matt Haddy**.

Ryan Brownlee enters his fifth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

As hitting coach, Brownlee saw the team's batting average vault 55 points from 2005 to 2007 (.269 to .324). Additionally, the team also scored more runs (273 to 401) had more RBIs (249 to 345) and walks (152 to 245) during that time span. **Nick Zumsande** enters his fifth year as the Iowa pitching coach.

Under Zumsande's guidance, the Hawkeye pitching has had a pitcher named first team all-Big Ten three of the last four years, and a pitcher named all-conference in each of his four years.

Kris Welker is in his second year as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Hawkeye catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports and coaches first base.

As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He led the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBIs and 16 doubles. Welker also received the Bob Oldis, Jr MVP Award

Iowa Baseball lost a true Hawkeye January 23, 2008. Long time supporter **Rose E. Gilmore** (mother of Ray Gilmore) lost her battle with cancer at the age of 77.

Rose was an Iowa City native who retired from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in 1996 after 19 years of dedication.

Rose also served as a Captain in the US Army and was an avid Hawkeye and Cubs fan.
