HEAD COACH TOM BRANDS



The 2008 NWCA, W.I.N. Magazine and Big Ten Coach of the Year, Tom Brands, is in his third season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time all-American and three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 50-6 overall and 13-3

Big Ten record at Iowa, and a 67-26 career mark.

In his second season at Iowa, Brands guided the squad to NCAA and Big Ten titles, as well the Big Ten regular season title with an undefeated 8-0 league mark. It was Iowa's 21st NCAA team title - the first since 2000 - and the Hawkeyes' 32nd Big Ten championship - the first since 2004. Iowa also won the 2007 Midlands title and the Division I trophy at the NWCA/Cliff Keen National Duals in January. The Hawkeyes posted a 21-1 dual mark, ending the season on a 14-match winning streak. Senior Mark Perry and junior Brent Metcalf each won NCAA titles, and Iowa crowned a total of seven all-Americans, which was the most for Iowa since 2001.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at lowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 all-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, GA. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001. Brands was a four-time all-American at Iowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at Iowa. His career mark of 158-7-2, included an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

Youth, ages eighth grade and younger, are invited to participate in the annual free clinic put on by members of the University of Iowa wrestling coaching staff. Participants will receive a free ticket at the ticket office window to the Iowa-Illinois dual and a complimentary clinic t-shirt. Friends and family members will be able to purchase their ticket into the dual at this time as well. Check-in will start at 2:30 p.m. at the Carver-Hawkeye Arena north entrance.

WISCONSIN BADGERS

Wisconsin is 6-3 with wins over Virginia (25-15), North Carolina (27-8), North Carolina State (20-15), Oregon State (24-13), Northern Iowa (36-9) and Indiana (19-15), and Iosses to Iowa State (7-27), Boise State (12-24) and Minnesota (15-22). The Badgers are ranked 13th by *W.I.N. Magazine* and 15th in the *USA Today/* NWCA/Intermat coaches poll.

Head Coach Barry Davis is 161-103-10 in 15 seasons at Wisconsin. During his tenure, he has coached two NCAA Champions, 10 Big Ten Champions and 17 all-Americans. The 1985 Big Ten Athlete of the Year, Davis was a four-time all-American and Big Ten Champion, and three-time NCAA Champion at 118 and 126 pounds for Iowa (1981-85). A two-time Olympian, he holds Iowa records for most wins in a season (46) and career (162). He served as a graduate assistant for the Hawkeyes for two seasons (1986-87) and an assistant coach for five (1988-92).

Davis is married to the former **Nan Doak**, who was Iowa's first NCAA women's track and field champion. She won the NCAA 10,000 meters in 1985, earning a total of nine all-America honors in cross country and track for the Hawkeyes. A three-time Big Ten champion and native of Hedrick, IA, she still holds the Iowa outdoor 5,000-meter record of 15:45.84.

Davis is assisted by Bart Chelesvig (Iowa, 1992), Donny Pritzlaff (Wisconsin, 2002) and Cory Wallman (Wisconsin, 1999). Chelesvig was a three-time all-American at 167 and 177 for the Hawkeyes (1988-92). Chelesvig and Hawkeye coaches Tom and Terry Brands wrestled together during the 1990-92 seasons, helping the Hawkeyes to three Big Ten and two NCAA team titles. Davis was an assistant coach for the Hawkeyes during those seasons.

Wisconsin is led by seniors Zach Tanelli (141), Dallas Herbst (197) and Kyle Massey (Hwt), and junior Kyle Ruschell (149). Tanelli, who beat Hawkeye senior **Alex Tsirtis** in the 2008 Midlands finals (10-3), is 16-3 this season and has won his last nine matches. Herbst is 12-2, and is ranked third or fourth in the nation. Ruschell has a record of 17-4, while Massey is 15-5.

ILLINOIS FIGHTING ILLINI

Illinois is 7-0 with wins over North Carolina State (40-7), Virginia (39-7), North Carolina (26-9), Findlay (32-6), McKendree (39-9), West Virginia (26-19) and Pittsburgh (26-10). The Fighting Illini are ranked seventh in the *USA Today*/NWCA/Intermat coaches poll and 15th by *W.I.N. Magazine*.

Head Coach Mark Johnson is 197-42-3 in 17 years at Illinois and has a 217-46-5 mark in 19 years as a collegiate head coach. He was a member of the lowa coaching staff for 11 seasons, serving as an assistant coach from 1983-90 and a graduate assistant from 1980-83. During his tenure lowa won seven NCAA and 11 Big Ten titles.

Johnson is assisted by Big Ten alums Jim Heffernan (Iowa, 1987), Carl Perry (Illinois, 2000) and Jeremy Hunter (Penn State, 2001). Heffernan was a four-time all-American and Big Ten champion for the Hawkeyes at 150 pounds (1983, 1985-87). His career win total of 131 ranks seventh in school history.

The Fighting Illini are led by junior Jimmy Kennedy (133) and seniors Mike Poeta (157) and John Wise (Hwt.). Kennedy, who was a high school teammate of Hawkeye junior **Daniel Dennis** at Grant High School in Ingelside, IL, is ranked between second and fourth in the nation with an 18-1 record. Dennis handed the Fighting Illini all-American his lone loss (5-3, SV-2) at the 2008 Midlands in December. Poeta, a two-time all-American and the defending Big Ten champion, made his season debut in January after missing the first five weeks of the season due to a knee injury. He is ranked either first or second in the nation. Wise is ranked between seventh and 10th nationally, and has an 11-4 mark.

THE SERIES

Wisconsin - Iowa leads the series, 71-8-3, and has a 36-4-1 mark in Iowa City. Iowa's last win in the series was 22-20 at Madison in 2008. Wisconsin's last win in the series was 21-14 in Iowa City in 2007. The Hawkeyes have won 33 of the last 34 meetings. Iowa Head

lowa's overall dual meet record is 843-215-30 (.789) in 97 seasons. The Hawkeyes have won 21 national titles and 32 Big Ten titles. Iowa's 49 NCAA champions have won a total of 76 NCAA individual titles, crowning six three-time and 14 two-time champions. The Hawkeyes' 101 Big Ten champions have won a total of 182 conference titles. There have been seven four-time, 18 three-

time and 24 two-time lowa winners. Iowa's 135 all-Americans have earned all-America status 273 times, including 17 four-time, 27 three-time and 33 two-time honorees.

Illinois - Iowa leads the series, 44-26-1, and holds a 20-9-1 lead in Iowa City. Iowa's last win in the series was 21-12 in Champaign in 2008. Illinois' last win in the series was 24-13 at Iowa City in 2006. Hawkeye Head Coach **Tom Brands** is 1-0 against Illinois, while Fighting Illini Head Coach Mark Johnson is 3-6 against the Hawkeyes.

MARQUEE MATCH-UPS

There are six marquee match-ups based on the probable starters for this week-end's duals in Iowa City. The individual rankings listed below are the most recent from the NWCA/Intermat/NWCA poll.

Iowa vs. Wisconsin

141 - #1 Alex Tsirtsis vs. #3 Zach Tanelli

Tanelli won the first career meeting between the two - a 10-3 decision in the championship final of the 2008 Midlands. Tsirtsis has been looking for a rematch. Tsirtsis held a 3-2 lead early in the third period of his match. He took a brief injury timeout after colliding with Tanelli during an offensive flurry. After the timeout, Tanelli scored a takedown, rolled off two three-point nearfalls and secured the riding time point to win 10-3. That match is Tsirtsis' only loss (16-1) of the season, and he brings a five-match winning streak to the dual. Tanelli is 16-3 and currently riding his own nine-match winning streak.

149 - #1 Brent Metcalf vs. #6 Kyle Ruschell

Metcalf owned the first meeting between the two - a 14-5 major decision in the championship final of the 2008 Midlands. The Hawkeye junior is 20-0 with a 52-match winning streak. Ruschell is 17-4 this season.

165 - #3 Ryan Morningstar vs. #9 Andrew Howe

This will be the first meeting between Morningstar and Howe. The Hawkeye junior brings a 18-2 record to the dual, while Howe is 14-4.

Hwt - #12 Dan Erekson vs. #7 Kyle Massey

This will be the first meeting between Erekson and Massey. The Hawkeye junior brings a 14-5 record to the dual, while Massey has a season record of 15-5.

<u>Iowa vs. Illinois</u>

133 - #5 Daniel Dennis vs. #3 Jimmy Kennedy

Dennis and Kennedy are no strangers on the wrestling mat. The duo both attended Grant High School in Ingelside, IL. In their only collegiate meeting, Dennis posted a 5-3 win in the second sudden victory period in the championship semifinals of the 2008 Midlands. Dennis is 16-2 this season and handed Kennedy (18-1) his only season loss.

Hwt - #12 Dan Erekson vs. #10 John Wise

This will be the first meeting between Erekson and Wise. The Hawkeye junior brings a 14-5 record to the dual, while Wise has a season record of 11-4.

HAWKEYES LOOK TO EXTEND WINNING STREAKS

lowa has won its last 29 duals, and its last 25 duals away from lowa City. The school record for overall consecutive dual wins is 42 (1994-97), and for consecutive away dual wins is 31 (1994-97). The 25 straight away duals rank second best in school history. Hawkeye junior **Brent Metcalf** (149) also has a winning streak of his own, winning his last 52 bouts.

THE LAST TIME IOWA...

Top-ranked lowa used bonus points to defeat #13/#15 Wisconsin, 22-20, Feb. 3 at Madison, WI. Each team won five matches, but the Hawkeyes used pins from sophomores **Brent Metcalf** (149) and **Phillip Keddy** (184) and a major decision by sophomore **Jay Borschel** (174) to win their ninth-straight dual. Head Coach Tom Brands picked up his 30th win at lowa and his 10th in the Big Ten, as lowa improved to 16-1, 5-0 Big Ten. Wisconsin fell to 11-3-1, 2-2.

lowa opened the dual with back-to-back decisions from junior Charlie Falck (125) and sophomore Joe Slaton (133). Borschel and Keddy's bonus point wins gave the Hawkeyes a 22-11 lead, but the Badgers weren't finished. Wisconsin scored a pin of its own at 197 and junior heavyweight Kyle Massey upset Hawkeye senior Matt Fields, 6-5, in the afternoon's final bout.

LAST MEETING - IOWA 21, ILLINOIS 12

The top-ranked Hawkeyes won their final dual of the 2007-08 season, defeating #11 Illinois 21-12 in Champaign. The Hawkeyes earned the Big Ten regular season title outright with the win, going 8-0 in conference competition. Iowa ended the dual meet season on a 14-match winning streak and posted a 21-1 record. Illinois fell to 13-4, 5-3 in the Big Ten.

lowa opened the dual at 125 pounds with junior **Charlie Falck** beating senior Gabe Flores, 6-4 in sudden victory. Falck, who was 0-2 against Flores in his career, trailed 4-2 in the third period, but scored a takedown with 15 seconds left in regulation to force the match to sudden victory. He scored the winning takedown with 37 seconds left in sudden victory to post his sixth-straight win and improve to 26-2.

The Hawkeyes were on the losing end of the other marquee match-up of the day. Iowa sophomore **Joe Slaton** (23-2) and Illinois sophomore Jimmy Kennedy (23-4) both entered the dual with undefeated Big Ten records and significant winning streaks at 133. Kennedy posted the 8-4 win, handing Slaton his first Big Ten loss and snapping his 11-match winning streak.

lowa responded with wins at 141 and 149 to take an 11-3 lead. Hawkeye sophomore **Dan LeClere** (141) posted his 20th season and career win when he beat Illinois freshman Ryan Prater, 6-5. Iowa sophomore **Brent Metcalf** dominated redshirt freshman Joey Kotowski at 149, scoring an 18-3 technical fall in 4:56. Metcalf is 8-0 in Big Ten duals and on a 23-match win streak.

Illinois followed with decisions at 157 and 165 to tighten the team score at 11-9, but a major decision from lowa sophomore **Jay Borschel** at 174 and a decision by Hawkeye sophomore **Phillip Keddy** at 184 gave lowa an 18-9 lead with two bouts remaining. Borschel picked up his 20th dual win, while Keddy scored his 35th career victory.

Illinois sophomore Patrick Bond gave Illinois a chance at the team win when he scored a takedown in the first tiebreak period to beat Hawkeye sophomore **Chad Beatty**, 7-5, at 197. Hawkeye senior heavyweight **Matt Fields** ended the dual with his 7-5 win in sudden victory over Illinois junior John Wise. Fields trailed Wise, 3-1, after two periods, but tallied an escape, a takedown and a stalling point in the third period to tie the match at 5-5. Fields scored a quick takedown in sudden victory to win, 7-5, and post his 20th dual win of the season.

Krutsinger was wrestling for injured Hawkeye starter Charlie Falck. Iowa rolled off wins at the next three weights to take an 11-3 lead and never looked back. Iowa junior Daniel Dennis started the streak at 133 with his 3-2 win over junior Chris Notte. Hawkeye senior Alex Tsirtsis posted his 85th career victory and his fifth-straight win at 141 with a 4-1 victory over redshirt freshman Jamal Parks. Tsirtsis also remains undefeated at 13-0 in dual competition. Iowa junior Brent Metcalf posted his 52nd straight win with a 23-6 technical fall in 5:47 over Luke Silver at 149. Metcalf, who scored lowa's only team bonus points on the afternoon, is now 20-0 this season.

Oklahoma State won a decision at 157 when sophomore Neil Erisman posted a 4-1 victory over Hawkeye sophomore **Matt Ballweg**, but three lowa juniors followed with decisions to seal the team win. At 165, **Ryan Morningstar** scored nearfall points in the second period to beat Shenandoah, IA, native Brandon Mason, 3-1. **Jay Borschel** fought off a last second takedown attempt by Cowboy senior Newly McSpadden to gain a 3-2 win at 174. **Phillip Keddy** posted his fifth straight win with a 12-7 decision over sophomore Cody Hill at 184 to remain undefeated (15-0) in dual competition.

The Cowboys won the final two bouts, but it wasn't enough for the team win. Senior Clayton Foster scored a 9-1 major de-

cision over Hawkeye redshirt freshman **Brodie Ambrose**, who was wrestling for injured starter **Chad Beatty**, at 197. Hawkeye heavyweight **Dan Erekson** put up a fight against top-ranked junior Jared Rosholt in the final match, but lost, 9-5.
