LEADING OFF

- The Buckeyes are the seventh seed in the tournament after going 13-11 in Big Ten play.
- Ohio State is 53-41 all-time in the Big Ten Tournament and making its 26th appearance. The Buckeyes have won eight tournament titles (91-94-95-97-02-03-05-07), which is tied for second-most in the Big Ten.
- Ohio State is 15-13 all-time in the opening game of the tounament and 3-1 under Coach Beals.
- The Scarlet and Gray are 2-1 vs. the Hawkeyes in the B1G tournament and will be facing lowa for the first time since the 1990 season in postseason action.
- Ohio State is No. 31 in the latest NCAA RPI. Seven Big Ten teams sit in the Top 60.
- Last time out, the Buckeyes were swept in a road series at Indiana to conclude the regular season.
- Ohio State fell out of the national rankings three weeks ago after being ranked for the first time since 2010.
- The Buckeyes hold a 3-0 mark in neutral site games and 1-2 all-time at Target Field.
- Ohio State is first in the conference in stolen bases (89). The Buckeyes have seven 13 more steals than lowa (76), who is second in the Big Ten.
- Overall, the Buckeyes are hitting .281 as a team led by Pat Porter (.332), while Troy Montgomery is batting .320 with a B1G-best 35 stolen bases and 38 walks. He needs one more steal to break the OSU single-season record.
- Montgomery is on a 30-game reached base streak headed into the tournament (career-high). Aaron Gretz has season-high nine-game hit streak.
- The OSU pitching staff has collected a 3.50 ERA, while the OSU bullpen has notched a 3.15 ERA.

2015 SEASON SUMMARY

Ohio State played its first 12 games on the road in 2015. It opened the season defeating 2014 NCAA Tournament participant George Mason Feb. 13 in Port Charlotte, Fla., before downing A-10 defending regular season champion St. Louis Feb. 14 and concluded the Snowbird Classic with a shutout win vs. Pittsburgh Feb. 15. Ohio State went a perfect 3-0 at the classic with two comeback wins. The Snowbird marked the lone tournament on the OSU schedule to begin the year - a change from previous seasons. The Buckeyes then fell in two of three games at FAU Feb. 20-22 in Boca Raton, Fla., and also went 1-2 in three-game set at UAB Feb. 27-March 1 in Birmingham, Ala. However, the Buckeyes bounced back with a two-game sweep at WKU March 8-9 in Bowling Green, Ky.

March was a good one for the Buckeyes. They were 15-3 during the second month and went 9-2 during an 11-game homestand from March 12-25. The Buckeyes won two of three vs. the Spartans March 20-22 in the first Big Ten series of 2015. The team took two of three at Rutgers March 27-29 and claimed its first B1G sweep since '13 April 4-6 in Columbus vs. Penn State. Two weeks ago, the team claimed three ranked wins over No. 4 Louisville and at No. 24 Nebraska. The Buckeyes swept Northwestern in Evanston, but fell in three games last week to Illinois. The Buckeyes went 12-3 in April. Last weekend, Ohio State fell in a series at Indiana to conclude the regular season.

EXPERIENCE RETURNS FOR THE BUCKEYES

Entering the 2015 campaign with little experience is no issue for the Buckeyes. Seven of the nine hitters from 2015 return, including two of the three starting pitchers in the weekend rotation. The team returns a total of 21 letterwinners from 2014.

Big Ten Freshman of the Year Tanner Tullly returns for his sophomore campaign on the mound, while senior Ryan Riga and sophomore Travis Lakins round out the starting weekend rotation. Senior co-captains Aaron Gretz and Connor Sabanosh will share the catching and designated hitter roles, junior second baseman Nick Sergakis, junior shortstop Craig Nennig, junior third baseman Troy Kuhn, sophmore left fielder Ronnie Dawson, sophomore center fielder Troy Montgomery and senior right fielder Pat Porter all return. Dawson garnered second team All-Big Ten laurels, while Kuhn was selected to the third team.

132ND SEASON OF BASEBALL

The 2015 season is the 132nd baseball season in the storied history of the oldest varsity sport at Ohio State. Varsity baseball was first played on the campus of The Ohio State University in the spring of 1881. Ohio State baseball has since gone on to achieve remarkable successes, highlighted by: 1 national championship (1966), 15 Big Ten regular-season titles and eight Big Ten Tournament crowns. The team has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 18 times.

SCOUTING THE HAWKEYES

- Iowa is 38-14 overall and earned the second seed in the tournament after finishing Big Ten play with a 19-5 record.
- The Hawkeyes posted their highest conference finish since the 1990 season.
- lowa is ranked for the eighth straight week with a highest ranked of No. 15 by Collegiate Baseball.
- The Hawkeyes are hitting .278 as a team led by Tyler Peyton with a .360 batting average, which is fourth in the Big Ten. Kris Goodman has registered a team-best 19 extra-base hits, while Eric Tool has scored 39 times with 27 stolen bases.
- Iowa has a 2.90 team ERA good for second in the Big Ten.
- Peyton is 6-4 with a 3.32 ERA, 62 strikeouts and 24 walks in 81.1 innings pitched.
- The Buckeyes lead the all-time series, 73-48-1. The two teams did not meet in the regular season. Last year, Ohio State took two of three games in Columbus.

B1G TOURNAMENT FORMAT

Illinois earned the top seed after finishing 21-1 during the regular season. The Fighting Illini will face eighth-seeded Nebraska at 5 p.m.

No. 3 seed Michigan will square off against sixth-seeded Indiana in the opening game of the tournament Wednesday at 9 a.m., while the final game of the opening day will feature No. 4 seed Maryland against No. 5 seed Michigan State at 9 p.m.

The tournament's double-elimination format will culminate with a single championship game on Sunday, with the winner earning the tournament title and the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. All eight teams will begin play in 1-of-2 brackets, with the No. 1, No. 4, No. 5 and No. 8 seeds appearing in one bracket, and the No. 2, No. 3, No. 6 and No. 7 seeds competing in the other bracket.

The tournament, which runs from May 20-24, begins with four contests on both Wednesday and Thursday, and two games slated for Friday. Saturday will feature the winners of each bracket facing the remaining one-loss team from the opposite bracket in the semifinals. As many as four games are scheduled for Saturday, with the opportunity for two "if necessary" games to be played to determine Sunday's championship game participants.

INDIANA SERIES NOTES

- Troy Montgomery batted .400 (4-for-10) with two runs scored, one RBI, four walks and three stolen bases, while Aaron Gretz batted .375 (3-for-8) with a double, RBI and two walks.
- Montgomery tied the OSU single-season stolen base record held by Mike Harris (2001) with his 35th steal in game one vs. the Hoosiers May 15.
- Ohio State batted .267 with seven extra-base hits and five steals.

BREAKOUT YEAR FOR MONTGOMERY

Lead-off hitter Troy Montgomery has fueled the Buckeye offense at the top of the lineup. The OSU centerfielder is batting .320 on a season-high 63 hits. Montgomery leads the Big Ten in stolen bases (35) and walks (38), second in triples (6) and third in runs scored (54). Montgomery has reached base safely in 30 straight games (career-high). His 35 stolen bases ranked 7th in the nation.

PORTER LEADING THE BUCKEYES

Pat Porter has been the Buckeyes' top hitter in his final season in the Scarlet and Gray. He leads the team in batting average (.332), hits (67), home runs (10), RBI (48) and slugging (.564). Porter had a 31-game reached base streak snapped last weekend vs. the Hoosiers.

- The Buckeyes are 23-7 when scoring first and 25-1 when leading after seven innings.
- Pat Porter is hitting .360 (36-for-100) with runners on base, while Troy Montgomery is batting .434 (43-for-99) leading off.

Ohio State concluded its midweek record with a perfect 12-0 mark after shutting out Youngstown State, 7-0, last week in Niles, Ohio. Left-hander John Havird threw 5.2 scoreless innings to improve to 4-0, while Pat Porter led the offense going 3-for-5 with a home run, two runs scored and four RBI.

MARYLAND SERIES NOTES

- Ohio State fell in two of three games against Maryland last weekend to conclude the home schedule.
- The Buckeyes batted .345 as a team with 10 doubles, two triples and four homers, while going 5-for-6 in stolen bases.
- Troy Kuhn batted .500 (7-for-14) with five runs scored, two doubles, two home runs, four RBI and a 1.071 slugging percentage, while Troy Montgomery batted .385 with four runs scored, one doubles, one triple and two stolen bases.
- Ohio State won the middle game by a score of 13-12. Connor Sabanosh led the Buckeyes at the
 plate with five RBI, posting his first career grand slam.

COACH BEALS COLLECTS WIN NO. 400.

With the victory over the Bearcats, head coach Greg Beals claimed his 400th career win. Beals holds a 402-325 overall mark in his 13th season. As the Buckeyes' 11th head coach in program history, Beals is 159-123 in his fifth year.

DEMPSEY BREAKS CAREER APPEARANCES RECORD

Dempsey made his 97th career appearance last time out at Cincinnatio May 6, passing former Buckeye Cory Cox (1998-01) for first on the OSU all-time list. He now has made 101 appearances in his OSU career.

DAWSON TIES SINGLE-GAME RBI RECORD

Ronnie Dawson had a career day at the plate in the big win over the RedHawks on May 5, going 4-for-6 with a double, grand slam and a career-high five runs scored and eight RBI. The eight-RBI total tied the school record set by Steve Caravati on March 10, 2001.

BIG ROAD SERIES WIN AT NO. 24 NEBRASKA

The team took two of three games at No. 24 Nebraska April 17-19 in Lincoln. The Buckeyes claimed back-to-back ten-inning wins to pick up their second road conference series win of 2015.

GANTT, TULLY PICK UP WEEKLY AWARDS

Tre' Gantt was named B1G Co-Freshmen of the Week April 20, while Tanner Tully was named B1G Co-Pitcher of the Week April 7. Gantt made an immediate impact in the Buckeye lineup after starting for the first time against No. 4 Louisville. He picked up his first career weekly award after batting .500 (6-for-12) with two RBI and a run scored. Tully notched his third career weekly honor after throwing seven scoreless innings vs. Penn State April 4.

UPSET VICTORY VS. NO. 4 LOUISVILLE

Adam Niemeyer claimed his first collegiate win in five shutout innings, while the Ohio State bullpen threw four scoreless frames to help the Buckeyes take down No. 4 Louisville, 2-0. April 14 in Columbus. The Buckeyes plated a pair of runs in the bottom of the third vs. the Cardinals and the defense stood strong highlighted by a SportsCenter Top Play by junior third baseman Nick Sergakis. Trace Dempsey closed the ninth inning with two strikeouts to pick up the save. Ohio State last defeated a Top 5 opponent during the 2009 campaign with a 7-1 victory at No. 2 Miami (Fla.).

RIGA SETS SCORELESS STREAK RECORD

Ryan Riga broke the Ohio State scoreless streak record in the bottom of the third at Rutgers March 29 and extended the streak to 30.2 IP, allowing his first run in over a month in a no decision April 6 vs. Penn State in the bottom of the second. The 30.2 IP scoreless stretch was the longest in the country this year. He passed Bob Spears' 1995 mark of 22.1.

DEMPSEY BREAKS SAVES RECORD

With his third and fourth saves vs. Michigan State, senior pitcher Trace Dempsey became the the OSU all-time career saves leader. The native of Huntington, W. Va., Demosev passed former Buckeye Jake Hale, who collected 29 career saves from 2006-09. He now has 33 career saves.
