THIS WEEK -- The seventh-ranked University of Iowa men's gymnastics team will travel to West Point, NY, Friday to compete in the NCAA Qualifier. The Hawkeyes will be one of six teams competing in Session II of the qualifying competition at 7 p.m. in the U.S. Military Academy's Hollender Center. Session I begins at 1 p.m. with the other six qualifying teams competing. The top three teams from each qualifying session will advance to the NCAA Championships Friday and Saturday. Competition will begin at 7 p.m. Friday to determine the team and all-around champion, while the top eight individuals on each event will compete in the event championships Saturday at 7 p.m.

TICKET INFORMATION -- All-session tickets are \$32, while single-session tickets are \$8 for Sessions I and II and \$10 for Sessions III and IV. Tickets may be purchased by contacting the Army Ticket Office at 1-877-TIX-ARMY or by logging onto www.goarmysports.com and following the "Tickets" link.

IOWA IN NCAA HISTORY -- The Hawkeyes have finished in the top five 15 times. Iowa's only NCAA title came in 1969. If the Hawkeyes advance to the team championships, it will mark the 36th time the program has done so. Iowa has crowned 11 individual champions in the history of the program, with the most recent being **Linas Gaveika** in the horizontal bar in 2003. Gaveika and **Michael Reavis** were all-Americans last year, as the Hawkeyes placed seventh in the team competition.

IOWA VS. THE COMPETITION -- The Hawkeyes are ranked seventh out of the 12 teams competing, and have competed against nine of the teams this season. Iowa recorded a fifth-place finish at the 2005 Big Ten Championships, behind Ohio State, Illinois, Michigan and Penn State but defeated Minnesota. Iowa also defeated Minnesota in dual competition, but fell to Michigan, Nebraska, Illinois and Oklahoma. Iowa opened the 2005 season with a fourth-place finish at the Windy City Invitational, behind Illinois, Ohio State and Michigan. Minnesota finished fifth. At the West Point Open, Penn State took the title and Iowa came in second. Nebraska and Army took third and fourth, respectively.

QUOTING HEAD COACH TOM DUNN -- "The team is anxious and ready to compete. We plan to switch a couple of guys around from our Big Ten line up and we hope the result will put us into the NCAA finals Friday night. Everyone knows it will take everything we've got to accomplish that goal, but I think the team is ready to put it all together."



Iowa Gymnastics Notes

IOWA IN THE RANKINGS -- In the latest GymInfo rankings (March 28), the Hawkeyes remained in seventh place nationally. As a team, the Hawkeyes are ranked in the top 10 in all six individual events. The Hawkeyes are the fifth-ranked team on horizontal bar, sixth on floor exercise and pommel horse, seventh on rings, eighth on vault and 10th on parallel bars.

NATIONALLY-RANKED INDIVIDUALS -- Hawkeye junior **Michael Reavis** leads the Hawkeyes in the rankings. Reavis is second on floor exercise, third in the all-around, eighth on horizontal bar and tied for eighth on vault. Senior **Linas Gaveika** is ranked fifth in the all-around and on horizontal bar and 13th on pommel horse. Junior **Michael McNamara** is eighth on floor exercise and 14th in the all-around while senior **Kenny Lin** is 16th on rings. Freshman **Curtis Kleffman** is 19th on pommel horse.

IOWA TAKES FIFTH AT BIG TENS -- The Hawkeyes took fifth place at the 2005 Big Ten Championships, scoring a school record 219.8 points. **Michael Reavis** was crowned Big Ten floor exercise champion and took fifth in the all-around competition. He was named to the First Team all-Big Ten. Senior **Linas Gaveika** took fifth on horizontal bar and finished in sixth place in the all-around. He was also named to the all-Big Ten first team. Senior **Kenny Lin** was fourth on rings while freshman Jacob Becker placed eighth on pommel horse.

HAWKS HIT THE RECORD BOOKS -- The 2005 Hawkeye squad smashed the record books, setting six individual and two team marks. Iowa broke two records at the Big Ten Championships alone, setting a rings record of 37.425 while junior **Michael Reavis** set a floor exercise record of 9.762. Reavis also holds Iowa records on vault (9.7) and in the all-around (54.825). On vault, Iowa posted a record 37.4 at the West Point Open. Senior **Kenny Lin** broke his previous record of 9.55 with a 9.7 performance on rings against Illinois. Sophomore **Matt Beiler** scored a record-breaking 9.4 on parallel bars against Oklahoma.

REAVIS SHINES FOR THE HAWKEYES -- After an already impressive season, junior **Michael Reavis** added a Big Ten title to his long list of accomplishments. He was crowned Big Ten floor exercise champion with a school-record score of 9.762. Reavis is nationally ranked in three events and the all-around heading into the NCAA Championships. He is currently second on floor exercise, third in the all-around, eighth on horizontal bar and tied for eighth on vault. He also holds three University of Iowa records, all of which he set this season. Against Oklahoma, Reavis posted a record-breaking all-around score of 54.825 and set the vault record of 9.7 against Minnesota.

Iowa Head Coach Tom Dunn



Tom Dunn
Head Coach
25 Years at Iowa

In his 24-year career as Iowa's head gymnastics coach, Dunn has elevated the program's status to one of a perennial national contender. With an Iowa record of 187 79 2, Dunn has led the Hawkeyes to 18 top-ten finishes in the NCAA Championships, and has competed in the national meet 18 of the past 21 seasons.

Iowa's performance in the Big Ten during Dunn's tenure as head coach has also been exceptional. In 21 of his 24 years, the Iowa coach has led his team to a top-four finish in the toughest gymnastics conference in the nation. The Hawkeyes won conference titles in 1986 and 1998, while placing second nine times under Dunn. In 1998, he was named Big Ten Coach of the Year and College Gymnastics Association Central Region Coach of the Year. Dunn also earned Big Ten co-coach of the Year honors in 1997 and Midwest Regional Coach of the Year honors in 1986.

Dunn has helped 29 individuals to earn 58 all-America honors and 19 gymnasts win 31 Big Ten titles. There have been 98 academic all-Big Ten selections and 55 all-America scholar athletes in his 23 seasons as Iowa's head coach. Iowa has had more all-America scholar athletes than any other university since the award began following the 1989-90 season. The 2004 Hawkeyes finished 6th in the nation academically, while the 2003 Hawkeyes placed 4th. Dunn's 2000 team won the College Gymnastics Association National Academic Team Championship by nipping the College of William & Mary in team grade point average for the year 3.392 to 3.378.

Athletic standards have also been high during Dunn's tenure. Linas Gaveika became Iowa's 11th NCAA gymnastics champion when he won the horizontal bar title in 2003. In 2000, pommel horse national champion Don Jackson and the rest of the Hawkeyes set four new school records on their way to a third place NCAA finish. Former Hawkeye, Todd Strada, was named University of Iowa Male Athlete of the Year and Big Ten Male Gymnast of the Year in 1999, and ended his collegiate career with five all-America honors. The 1998 squad recorded the fourth undefeated and untied season in school history (8-0) and won Iowa's seventh Big Ten title. In 1995, seven-time all-American Jay Thornton became the first Hawkeye NCAA Champion since 1969 when he placed first in floor exercise. Thornton won the NCAA vault title in 1996, making him the only gymnast in Iowa history to win back-to-back national titles. Dunn began his head-coaching career at the University of Massachusetts in 1972, where he coached the Minutemen to a 27-8 dual mark in three seasons. His 25 year collegiate dual mark is 206-81-2.

He has also coached many Hawkeyes in international competitions. Most recently, Dunn and Linas Gaveika participated in the 26th Men's European Championships held last April in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Linas and Dunn also went to the 2003 World Championships in Anaheim, CA. Dunn also coached Shane de Freitas in the 2001 World Championships in Ghent, Belgium. In 1999, Dunn and de Freitas traveled to the Pan American games in Winnipeg, Canada, and the 34th World Championships in Tianjin, China.

As an administrator, he served a two year term as president of the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches (1985-87). He was vice president of the U.S. Elite Coaches Association (1990-96) and chair of the Big Ten coaches group (1992-96). Dunn served as chair of the NCAA Men's Gymnastics Committee for three years (1996-99), and represented the NCAA on the U.S.A. Gymnastics Board of Directors during that time.

Dunn left U.Mass in 1975 and returned to his alma mater, Penn State, as an assistant coach. He was named co-coach of the Year in 1976 when the Nittany Lions won the NCAA championship. He served as an assistant at Iowa for one season (1979-80) prior to his appointment as head coach. He led Iowa from the 39th place national rating he inherited to an NCAA berth in just four seasons.

His competitive career was as storied as his coaching career has been. At Penn State Dunn earned two all America honors and the NCAA parallel bars title in 1971. As a prep Dunn won two Indiana state all around titles.

Dunn gained an NCAA Post Graduate scholarship after earning academic honors at Penn State. He received both his B.S. and M.S. degrees from Penn State.

Dunn was born on July 6, 1949 in San Mateo, California. He and his wife, Deborah, have two daughters, Shannon and Jamie. Both Shannon and Jamie are University of Iowa students.

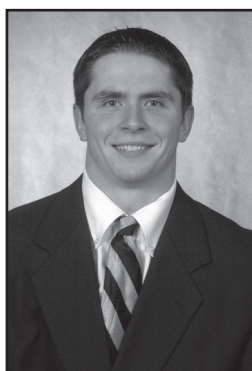

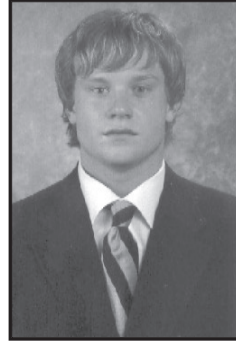
