#### LAST WEEKEND

- The Gophers suffered a three-game home non-conference sweep at the hands of UC Irvine. Minnesota led late in each of the first two games before the Anteaters came back.
- Ben Meyer** pitched 7.2 innings, allowing two runs in his last 2/3 inning of work. The Gophers had led 2-0, but fell 3-2 after the 'Eaters took the lead in the ninth.
- Minnesota made two comebacks before losing 6-5 in 12 innings Saturday. They trailed 2-0, led 4-2, then trailed 5-4 in the ninth. **Connor Schaeffbauer** hit 4-for-5 and **Fred Manke** went 6.1 innings, settling in after a two-run first.
- The Gophers outthit UC Irvine for the second day in a row, but committed two costly errors and left 12 on base in a 6-2 Sunday loss.
- The Gophers overcame a 4-1 deficit to tie their Tuesday game at NDSU, but lost 5-4 in 10 innings.

#### SERIES NOTABLES

- Minnesota is 83-44 against Iowa under head coach **John Anderson**, including an 80-41 mark in regular-season conference games.
- The Gophers won last year's series opener in Iowa City, but the Hawkeyes won the next two. **Michael Handel** hit a home run and three doubles in the series.

#### ABOUT THE HAWKEYES

- In their second year under head coach **Rick Heller**, the Hawkeyes are currently second in the Big Ten standings behind Illinois.
- Projected rotation: RHP **Tyler Peyton** (5-3, 3.06 ERA), RHP **Blake Hickman** (7-1, 3.06 ERA), RHP **Calvin Mathews** (4-1, 1.77 ERA). Peyton leads Iowa in innings (70.2) and strikeouts (56). Hickman has the lowest opponent average (.211) of the starters.
- Peyton leads the Hawkeyes with a .357 batting average. He often plays 1B when he is not on the mound. **Nick Roscetti** is batting .426 in Big Ten play.
- Iowa has a team batting average of .276 and team ERA of 2.96. The Hawkeyes have hit 11 home runs and stolen 66 bases.

## HIT STREAK OVER, REACHED BASE STREAK CONTINUES

**Dan Motl's** hitting streak, which was suspended by injury when he was hit by pitch against Penn State on April 19, ended upon his return May 5. He batted 30-for-64 (.469) during the Gophers' longest hitting streak since **AJ Pettersen** in 2010-11 (22 games). Motl was hit by pitch in his first game back from the injury, extending his reached base streak to 19 games.

## TOO HOT TO HANDEL

**Michael Handel** leads the Gophers with a .331 batting average, which ranks 14th in the Big Ten. Within conference play, his .418 average rates third. He has 17 multi-hit games, seven multi-RBI games and four home runs, each good for at least a share of the team lead.

## FIEDLER ON OLERUD WATCH LIST

Right fielder/pitcher **Matt Fiedler** has been named to the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Watch List. He has played in all 45 of the Gophers' games as a right fielder, pitcher and/or designated hitter. He is batting .306, slugging .410 and has a team-high 15 steals (fourth in the Big Ten). On the mound, Fiedler has a 2.35 ERA and .122 opponent average in 15.1 innings of relief.

## FASTER, STRONGER

The Gophers have already more than doubled their 2014 season home run total of 12 with 26 this season in the new flat-seamed baseball era. The 26 homers are the most Minnesota has hit since knocking out 41 in 2010. **Michael Handel** and **Jordan Smith** have the most with four.

The Gophers have converted 55 of 72 stolen base attempts. They were 39-for-56 all last season.

**Matt Fiedler** (14-18), **Dan Motl** (11-13) and **Connor Schaeffbauer** (9-14) are leading the way. The 55 steals are the Gophers' most since swiping 78 bases in 2009.

## GOPHERS TOSS NO-HITTER

On the two-year anniversary of **Tom Windle's** no-hitter, the Gophers threw a combined no-hitter at Creighton on March 8. **Dalton Sawyer** pitched the first seven innings, then **Tyler Hanson** and **Lance Thonvold** went one inning each. Four walks and three hit batsmen reached base.

## MEYER AND SONS

**Bob Meyer** pitched for John Anderson's Gophers from 1980-83. Now his sons, **Ben** and **Reggie**, are both on the team. Ben, a senior, has been in the starting rotation since his sophomore year. He passed Bob (257.0) on the Gophers' career innings list, rating fourth with 273.2. Ben is eighth in Gophers history with 209 career strikeouts. He is sixth in the Big Ten with 61 strikeouts this year, and tied for eighth with 73.1 innings pitched. Reggie is a freshman, the third RHP in the family to put on the Maroon and Gold. He has made seven appearances, including four starts.

### ANDERSON LEGACY

Since **John Anderson's** first season as head coach, there have been 27 coaching changes in the Big Ten. Michigan has had the most coaching changes at five, while Michigan State has had four. Between Anderson and his legendary coach, Dick Siebert, the duo has coached in more than 3,000 Gopher games. Anderson coached his 1,900th game at Michigan last year.

Anderson is in his 34th year as the Gophers' head coach and 37th year overall coaching at the University of Minnesota. Anderson currently holds an all-time record of 1,170-798-3 (.594), including a 526-319 (.622) mark in Big Ten play. He is the conference's all-time wins leader.

The current full-time coaching staff has been together for 17 years. Assistant head coach **Rob Fornasiere** is in his 30th year and pitching coach **Todd Oakes** is in his 17th year. Volunteer assistant coach **Patrick Casey** is in his second year. Interim pitching coach **Scott Matyas** is in his first season working with the program.

### MATYAS CALLED FROM THE BULLPEN

Former Gophers closer **Scott Matyas** is serving as interim pitching coach until **Todd Oakes** is ready to come back on a full-time basis. Oakes' leukemia is in remission after his second bout with the disease. Matyas, who pitched under Oakes' tutelage from 2008-11, set a Big Ten record with 36 career saves. He holds the Minnesota record for appearances with 94, and the top two single-season save totals with 15 in 2009 and 11 in 2011 (tied for second).

### VETERAN INFIELD

Junior 2B **Connor Schaeffbauer** has started 44 of 45 games this year, while senior 3B **Tony Skjefte** has started 41. Redshirt senior SS **Michael Handel** has started 39 games. The trio has started a combined 433 career games, mainly in the infield. Handel has been the starting shortstop since his redshirt freshman season. Schaeffbauer started at second for most of 2013, with Skjefte starting the other games. In 2014, Skjefte made most of his starts at third while also filling in when needed in the outfield.

### MANAGER MOLITOR

The Minnesota Twins hired **Paul Molitor** as their manager in November. He is the first former Gopher baseball player to become an MLB manager. Molitor, a National Baseball Hall of Famer, was an All-American for the Maroon & Gold before going on to the pros. He has remained in contact with his college teammate, head coach **John Anderson**, and served as chairman of the Siebert Field campaign to fundraise for the new field that opened in 2013.

### MINNESOTA VS. MINNESOTA

On March 4 in Fort Myers, the Gophers went up 1-0 before losing 3-1 to the Twins in the two teams' first exhibition meeting since 19387. It was **Paul Molitor's** first game as the Twins' manager. Former Gopher **Glen Perkins** pitched an inning for the Twins. **Michael Handel** had the Gophers' only hit, scoring **Dan Motl**. The Gophers turned three double plays. **Toby Anderson** struck out the Twins' **Eddie Rosario**, who hit a home run in his first MLB at bat on May 6.

### GOPHERS IN THE MAJORS

Three former Gophers played in Major League Baseball games during the 2014 season. **Glen Perkins** (2003-04), the Minnesota Twins' closer, earned a save for the America League in the All-Star Game. **Seth Rosin** (2008-10) made his major league debut for the Texas Rangers. **Jack Hannahan** (1999-01) came off the disabled list to play in several games for the Cincinnati Reds. Perkins pitched a 1-2-3 inning against his former team in the exhibition game. Rosin is now part of the Philadelphia Phillies' minor league system, and Hannahan signed to play in South Korea.

### GOPHERS IN MLB'S MINOR LEAGUE SYSTEM

**Nate Hanson** (2006-08) is part of the Twins' minor league system. **Tom Windle** (2011-13) has been rated one of the top Philadelphia Phillies prospects. **Seth Rosin** (2008-10) is also in the Phillies' system. **DJ Snelten** (2011-13) is in the San Francisco Giants' system, and **Alec Crawford** (2013-14) spent last summer with the Colorado Rockies' Rookie team. **Mike Kvasnicka** (2008-10) and **Kyle Knudson** (2007-10) were in the Twins' system last year, playing with Hanson for much of the year. Kvasnicka has signed with the St. Paul Saints.

### WELCOMING NEW GOPHERS

Minnesota has announced nine members of the signing class for the 2016 season. **Eddie Estrada** (Litchfield, Minn.), **Ben Humbert** (International Falls, Minn.), **Nick Lackney** (Whitefish Bay, Wis.), **Cole McDevitt** (Apple Valley, Minn.), **Ben Mezzenga** (Shoreview, Minn.) and **Terrin Vavra** (Menomonie, Wis.) signed National Letters of Intent, while **Jordan Kozicky** (Minneapolis), **Riley Smith** (Broken Arrow, Okla.) and **Jake Stevenson** (Waconia, Minn.) each signed an Acceptance of Admission.

# JOHN ANDERSON

## HEAD COACH | 34th YEAR

SIX-TIME BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR  
ALL-TIME BIG TEN CONFERENCE LEADER IN VICTORIES  
ABCA HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

In the fall of 1981, John Anderson took over the job of leading the tradition-rich University of Minnesota baseball program, thereby retracing the footsteps of his mentor, legendary Hall of Fame coach Dick Siebert. Thirty-three years later, Anderson continues to uphold the lofty standards of the Golden Gopher baseball program.

### A HISTORY OF WINNING

On May 14, 2009, a 7-6 win at Penn State gave Anderson his 1,000th career victory. He became the 29th coach to reach 1,000 wins, and the 20th to do so with the same school. He was also the 10th-youngest coach to win 1,000 games. Entering the 2015 season, Anderson's career record is 1,151-772-3 (.598). He ranks 29th all-time among Division I coaches in collegiate victories, and 10th among active head coaches.

Anderson holds the record for overall wins and conference wins while coaching at a Big Ten university. He earned his 500th Big Ten victory on April 14, 2013, and has a 519-308 (.628) conference record through 2014. While Anderson has been the head coach at Minnesota since the 1982 season, there have been 27 coaching changes in the conference.

The Gophers' 8-5 victory against Iowa on May 12, 2002, made Anderson the winningest coach in school history. His 755th win moved him past Siebert, his mentor, in the record books. The Gophers have had winning seasons in 32 of Anderson's 33 years as head coach. Anderson has put together 28 seasons with at least 30 wins, and nine seasons with at least 40 wins.

### BIG TEN TITLES

Anderson has guided the Gophers to nine regular season Big Ten titles and a conference-best nine Big Ten Tournament titles. His regular season championships came in 1983, '84, '86, '87, 2000, '02, '03, '04 and '10, and his tournament championships in 1982, '85, '88, '92, '93, '98, 2001, '04 and '10. (The first four regular season titles were divisional.)

Anderson has led Minnesota to 22 finishes of second or better in the conference standings, and 19 tournament championship games. This included seven-straight title game appearances from 2001-07. Overall, the Gophers have played in the tournament in 28 of Anderson's 33 seasons.

The Gophers' 2003 and 2004 senior classes graduated with four Big Ten championship rings, from either regular season or conference tournament. The 2002-04 regular season titles were the Gophers' first string of three in a row since 1968-70. Minnesota won or split 38 of its 43 Big Ten series from 2002-07. It also set a conference record with 45 Big Ten wins in two seasons from 2003-04.

2004 was the Gophers' first time winning both the regular season and tournament championships. They did the same in 2010.

### NCAA APPEARANCES

Under Anderson, Minnesota has appeared 17 times in the NCAA postseason. The first was during Anderson's inaugural season, 1982, and the most recent back-to-back in 2009 and 2010. Twice in Anderson's tenure, the Gophers have put together four-year streaks of NCAA Regional appearances: 1991-94 and 1998-2001.

In 2009, the Gophers lost to eventual national champion LSU in the title game of the Baton Rouge Regional. At the 2010 Fullerton Regional, they won their first two games against Cal State-Fullerton before being eliminated.

### HALLS OF FAME

Anderson has been inducted into four different organizations' halls of fame: the American Baseball Coaches Association (2008), the University of Minnesota "M" Club (2002), the Minnesota High School Baseball Coaches Association (2013) and Hibbing Community College.

With his induction into the ABCA Hall of Fame on Jan. 4, 2008, Anderson joined his mentor, Siebert, and another former Gophers coach, Frank McCormick. Anderson was the eighth coach from the state of Minnesota and the 15th Big Ten coach to receive that honor.

He was inducted into the MHSBCA Hall of Fame despite never having coached at the high school level. Anderson's contributions to high school baseball in the state include organizing camps/clinics and fall leagues and fundraising for Siebert Field, which frequently hosts high school level games.

### COACHING AWARDS

Six times Anderson has been recognized as Big Ten Coach of the Year. He earned the honor as a rookie head coach in 1982, and again in 2000. Anderson became the first coach to win the award three times in a row (2002, '03, '04) a few years later. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the sixth time in 2010, a year in which Minnesota won both the regular season and tournament conference titles. Anderson was also named ABCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2010.

### INDIVIDUAL PLAYER ACCOLADES

#### All-Americans

Six different Gophers have earned seven All-America First Team honors under Anderson. Second baseman Brian Raabe and catcher Dan Wilson both earned the award in 1990. Shortstop Brent Gates (1991), second baseman Mark Merila (1993-94), catcher Shane Gunderson (1995) and second baseman Derek McCallum (2009)



also received first-team nods.

Merila (1992, '94), first baseman Robb Quinlan (1998), second baseman Luke Appert (2003) and pitcher Glen Perkins (2003-04) were named to All-America Second Teams, and Gunderson (1995), Quinlan (1998-99), third baseman Jack Hannahan (2001), Appert (2002-03) and Perkins (2004) to All-America Third Teams.

Anderson has coached seven Freshman All-Americans in catcher Darren Grass (1992), outfielder Sam Steidl (2001), Perkins (2003), catcher/DH Andy Hunter (2003), first baseman/DH Mike Mee (2004), outfielder Matt Nohely (2006) and shortstop AJ Pettersen (2009). Receiving Freshman All-America Honorable Mention were: pitchers James Brower and Mark Vandersall (1992), shortstop Rick Brousseau (1998), Appert (2000), first baseman Nick O'Shea (2009) and outfielder Justin Gominsky (2009).

### Big Ten Awards

Seven different Gophers have won eight Big Ten Player of the Year awards under Anderson's tutelage: catcher Terry Steinbach (1983), shortstop Brent Gates (1991), second baseman Mark Merila (1994), catcher Shane Gunderson (1995), first baseman Robb Quinlan (1999), third baseman Jack Hannahan (2001) and second baseman Luke Appert (2002-03).

C.J. Woodrow (2002) and Glen Perkins (2004) have earned Pitcher of the Year accolades, and three Gophers—Dan Wilson (1988), Merila (1991) and Perkins (2003)—have been named Freshman of the Year.

Minnesota has had 69 All-Big Ten First Team selections with Anderson at the helm. Most recently, pitchers Tom Windle and DJ Snelten were both named to the First Team in 2013. In 2014, pitcher Alec Crawford was selected to the Third Team and catcher Austin Athmann to the All-Freshman Team.

Anderson has also coached several Academic All-Americans, including Troy Larson (2012-13) and Matt Nohely (2009), and Academic All-District honorees, including Ben Meyer in 2014.

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Developing all-around student-athletes is Anderson's top priority. As well as succeeding on the field, the Golden Gophers have excelled in the classroom. Anderson has coached 244 Academic All-Big Ten selections, including 17 honorees in 2014.

### SIEBERT FIELD

Thanks to Anderson's fundraising ability, Minnesota was able to build the new Siebert Field, a state-of-the-art facility with a MondoTurf playing surface. Construction was completed in 2012, and the Golden Gophers opened their new home with a game against Ohio State on April 5, 2013. The addition of a lighting system brought the first night games to new Siebert in 2014.

### OTHER COACHING OPPORTUNITIES AND BASEBALL DEVELOPMENT

In the summer of 1993, Anderson served as head coach for USA Baseball. He guided Team USA to a 30-16 record, including a silver medal finish at the Intercontinental Cup in Parma, Italy. The squad also went 8-1 in the World Championships. Anderson had served as an assistant for USA Baseball in 1989-90.

Anderson co-authored a book, Why Good Coaches Quit—And How You Can Stay in the Game, with sports psychologist Rick Aberman. In the book, Anderson offers practical solutions to the problems that coaches at all levels routinely encounter on and off the field.

## GOPHERS IN THE PROS

Eighteen Gophers who played for Anderson have gone on to play Major League Baseball, with many others continuing their careers in the minor leagues. 2014 All-Star closer Glen Perkins (Twins) is the Gophers' top MLB name right now. Pitcher Seth Rosin made his MLB debut for the Rangers in 2014 and is currently in the Phillies' system. Jack Hannahan was with the Reds last season and signed to play in South Korea in the offseason. MLB teams have made 90 draft picks of Gophers since Anderson became head coach.

## FROM PLAYER TO COACH

After graduating from Nashwauk-Keewatin High School in northern Minnesota, Anderson was a pitcher for the Gophers in 1974-75. An injury ended his playing career, but he remained involved as a student coach. He was voted Team MVP of the 1977 Gophers squad which featured Future Hall of Famer Paul Molitor and played in the College World Series.

Anderson started his coaching career in 1978 as a graduate assistant under Siebert. After Siebert's death in December 1978, Anderson was elevated to the position of assistant coach under then-head coach George Thomas.

Upon Thomas' resignation after the 1981 season, Anderson was named the 13th coach in Gopher baseball history. At the time, at age 26, he was the youngest head baseball coach in Big Ten history.

## PERSONAL

Anderson and his wife, Jan, have been married for 21 years. Their daughter, Erin Elizabeth, attends the University of Minnesota.
