TELEVISION - - The game will be televised by ESPNU. The announcers are Clay Matvick and John Congemi.

HOMECOMING - - Iowa is celebrating Homecoming this week. Iowa's Homecoming record is 56-42-5, including a 5-5-2 record vs. Illinois. Iowa has won five of its last six Homecoming games, including a 45-29 win over Indiana a year ago.

THE RECORDS - - Iowa is 5-0, 1-0, with wins over Illinois State (31-14), at Iowa State (31-17), Pittsburgh (27-24), North Texas (62-16), and at Wisconsin (10-6).

Illinois is 4-1 overall and 1-0 in Big Ten play. Illinois has defeated Kent State (52-3), Western Illinois (44-0), Middle Tennessee State (27-25) and Nebraska (14-13), with a loss at North Carolina (48-14).

THE SERIES - - Illinois holds a 38-30-2 advantage in the series that began with a 58-0 Iowa victory in 1899. Iowa won 30-14 at Illinois last year in the first meeting since 2008. Illinois has not played in Iowa City since a 10-6 Hawkeye win in 2007. Illinois holds an 18-16-2 advantage in games played in Iowa City.

COACHING RECORDS - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th year as a college head coach and his 17th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 132-106 and he is 120-85 at Iowa. He ranks ninth in the Big Ten Conference in coaching wins.

Bill Cubit is in his first season as head coach at Illinois and his third season as offensive coordinator. Cubit is in his 14th season as a college head coach, with a 89-66-1 record. He was the head coach at Western Michigan for eight seasons (2005-12), and Division III Widener from 1992-96.

NEXT GAME - - Iowa travels to Northwestern for the Wildcat Homecoming game (11 a.m., TBA). Illinois is idle.

- The Hawkeyes are trying to improve to 6-0 for the first time since 2009, the second time under Kirk Ferentz, and the seventh time in school history.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 120 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, which ranks ninth in conference history. Ferentz's 69 Big Ten wins trails John Cooper by one for ninth all-time.
- Iowa is ranked 22nd in the AP Poll and 23rd in the coaches poll. It is the Hawkeyes' first appearance in the AP Poll since Nov. 21, 2010, a span of 75 weeks.
- Iowa has scored 41 points off turnovers, after scoring 35 points off turnovers all of last season.
- Iowa is the only school in the country yet to allow a rushing touchdown. The Hawkeyes yield an average of 84.4 rushing yards per game, second best in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.
- Iowa did not allow a touchdown in its Big Ten opening win at #18 Wisconsin. The last time Iowa held a Big Ten opponent without a touchdown was in 2010, a 24-3 victory over No. 20 Penn State.
- Junior QB C.J. Beathard is undefeated in six career starts. He is 3-0 at home, 3-0 on the road, and 2-0 in the Big Ten. The last Iowa quarterback to win his first six career starts was Matt Sherman, who won seven from 1994-95.
- Junior DB Desmond King leads the Big Ten with five interceptions. The last Hawkeye to lead the conference in interceptions was Tyler Sash in 2009 (6).
- Junior WR Matt Vandenberg leads Iowa and ranks second in the Big Ten with 31 receptions. He has at least six receptions in four of five games.
- Senior RB Jordan Canzeri leads the Big Ten and is tied for eighth nationally with eight rushing touchdowns. He entered his senior season with two career rushing touchdowns in 29 career games.

IOWA/ILLINOIS NOTES

- The last time Iowa and Illinois met with undefeated conference records was 1983. Both teams were 1-0 in the Big Ten. Unranked Illinois defeated fourth-ranked Iowa 33-0 in Champaign and went on to win the Big Ten title and berth in the Rose Bowl. Iowa finished the season 9-3 with a Gator Bowl appearance.
- Saturday is Illinois' first visit to Kinnick Stadium since 2007, a 10-6 Hawkeye win.
- Iowa is one victory from becoming bowl eligible for the 14th time in 15 years.
- Iowa and Illinois tie for the conference lead with seven interceptions. Iowa CB Desmond King leads the Big Ten with five interceptions. Illinois DB Taylor Barton ties for second in the league with three interceptions.
- Iowa (+3) and Illinois (+4) both have 10 takeaways.
- Kirk Ferentz is 6-3 all-time against the Illini.
- Iowa allows 84.4 rushing yards per game, second in the Big Ten. Illinois' rush offense ranks 13th in the league with 155.8 ypg.
- Iowa's roster includes 14 Illinois natives, more than any other outside state. Illinois has one Iowa native on its roster (TE Andrew Davis, Marion, Iowa).
- Iowa outgained Illinois 587-235 in total yards in 2014.

HAWKEYES ON HOMECOMING

Iowa holds a 56-42-5 (.568) record in 103 Homecoming games. Iowa has won four of its last five Homecoming games, including a 45-29 win against Indiana last season.

Iowa is 16-4 on Homecoming since 1995, and 12-3 since 2000, including winning seven in a row from 2000-06. The Hawkeyes are 5-5-2 against the Illini on Homecoming, and 12-4 in Homecoming contests under Kirk Ferentz.

FROM 5-0 TO 6-0

Iowa is 5-0 for the 13th time in school history, and is aiming for its seventh 6-0 start all-time. Iowa started 9-0 in 2009, its best start in school history. The Hawkeyes were 7-0 in 1985, 1922, and 1921, and 6-0 in 1960 and 1928.

KING NAMED BIG TEN CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior DB Desmond King was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in Iowa's 10-6 win at Wisconsin.

The Big Ten honor is the second for King. He was also recognized on Oct. 21, 2013, after recording 12 in a 34-24 loss at No. 3 Ohio State.

King led Iowa's defensive effort in the win at Wisconsin as the Hawkeye defense held the Badgers to two field goals in snapping Wisconsin's 10-game home winning streak. King's first interception, and 15-yard return, led to the only touchdown in the game as Iowa took a 7-3 advantage. He recorded his second interception at the Iowa 11-yard line to stop Wisconsin's opening drive of the third quarter.

King also had five solo tackles, four assists and two pass break-ups against the Badgers. On special teams, King had three kick returns for 65 yards.

King is the third Hawkeye to earn the honor this season. QB C.J. Beathard earned the offensive award following Iowa's win at Iowa State, and PK Marshall Koehn was the special teams winner following Iowa's last-second victory over Pittsburgh. It is the first time since 2010 Iowa has had a weekly honoree on offense, defense, and special teams (O: Ricky Stanzi; D: Mike Daniels, Adrian Clayborn, Shaun Prater; ST: Pake O'Meara).

EARNING THE 'W' HIGH AND LOW

Iowa averaged 37.8 points per game in its first four wins, but scored just 10 in its Big Ten opener against Wisconsin. It marked the fewest points scored in a Big Ten win since defeating No. 18 Illinois, 10-6, in 2007.

The 151 points scored (37.8 ppg) through four games was Iowa's highest total since 2011, when it also scored 151 points (34, 41, 31, 45).

LAST MEETING: Iowa 30, Illinois 14 (Nov. 15, 2014 at Memorial Stadium)

Iowa scored 28 consecutive points en route to a 30-14 triumph over Illinois at Memorial Stadium in Champaign.

The Hawkeyes amassed season highs in total yards (587) and rushing yards (304); both totals rank as the fourth-highest by an Iowa team during the Kirk Ferentz era.

DT Louis Trinca-Pasat forced an Illinois safety and the defensive unit accumulated seven tackles for loss.

Iowa quarterbacks combined for 283 yards passing, 39 yards rushing, and four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing). QB Jake Rudock completed 14-of-21 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns. Rudock also rushed eight times for 39 yards and a touchdown. C.J. Beathard was 3-of-3 passing for 73 yards and a score.

Mark Weisman rushed 23 times for 134 yards.

Trailing 7-2, Iowa scored 28 consecutive points

to grab a 30-7 advantage. TE Ray Hamilton caught touchdown passes of one and six yards; the first scores of his career. Hamilton became the first Iowa tight end with two receiving touchdowns in a single game since Tony Moeaki in 2009 (Michigan).

Rudock scampered six yards for a score early in the fourth period, and WR Damond Powell caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Beathard to close Iowa's scoring.

TE Jake Duzey caught three passes for 110 yards. SS John Lowdermilk and DE Nate Meier led Iowa with seven tackles each. LB Josey Jewell made his first career start, collecting five stops.

The Hawkeyes dominated time of possession, holding the ball for a season-high 35:46, while the Illini maintained possession for only 24:14.

Iowa converted 10-of-15 (67 percent) third down attempts, while Illinois was 6-of-16 (38 percent) and was forced to punt eight times.

WE'LL GO FIRST

Iowa received the opening kickoff in four of five games this season. The Hawkeyes have scored touchdowns on two of four opening drives when starting on offense. The Hawkeyes have outscored their opponents 27-6 in the first quarter.

In 17 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes received the opening kickoff in 167-of-205 games (99-67). Iowa has started the game on defense in 39-of-205 games under Ferentz (21-18).

STARTING 5

The Hawkeyes are 5-0 for the second time under Kirk Ferentz. A win Saturday would be Iowa's second 6-0 start in the Ferentz era (2009). The 2009 Hawkeyes won their first nine games, finished 11-2 overall, and won the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.

RUSH DEFENSE... NO TOUCHDOWNS FOR YOU

Iowa is the only school in the country yet to allow a rushing touchdown. The Hawkeyes yield an average of 84.4 rushing yards per game, second best in the Big Ten and 11th nationally. Iowa limits its opponents to 2.6 yards per carry (161 attempts, 422 yards), 10th best in the country.

2-FOR-2 AGAINST POWER 5

Iowa recorded two wins against Power 5 schools in its nonconference schedule: Iowa State, 31-17, and Pitt, 27-24. The Hawkeyes were one of only two Big Ten schools with two wins against teams from a Power 5 league in nonconference play. The other was Northwestern (Stanford and Duke).



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 17th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.



- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ranks ninth with 120 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 69 Big Ten wins, ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 111-64 (.634) overall mark and a 64-46 (.582) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 120-85 (.585) and a 69-60 (.535) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 132-106 (.555). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his fourth season.

FERENTZ MOVES UP IN VICTORIES

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 120 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, The ninth most in conference history. Ferentz is two wins shy of tying Lloyd Carr for eighth all-time (122).

Ferentz has 69 Big Ten wins, the 10th most in conference history. He trails John Cooper (Ohio State) by one victory for ninth all-time.

Only eight coaches rank in the top 10 in both categories: overall wins as a member of the Big Ten, and conference wins. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Barry Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (9).

FERENTZ SECOND IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 17th season as Iowa's head football coach and ranks second in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (28). Ferentz is tied for second with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

6 THE OTHER WAY

Iowa ties for the league lead with seven interceptions (Illinois). The Hawkeyes returned two interceptions for touchdowns in Week 4 against North Texas. LB Josey Jewell recorded the first interception of his career, returning it 34 yards for a touchdown. LB Bo Bower returned an interception 88 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It is the seventh longest interception return in school history.

Iowa has at least one interception returned for a touchdown in each of the last eight seasons, and 13 of the last 15 seasons. The last time Iowa returned two interceptions for touchdowns was 2013 against Western Michigan (both by B.J. Lowery).

FIRST TIME STARTERS

The Hawkeyes have used 12 first time starters. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., LT Boone Myers, DT Nathan Bazata, DT Jaleel Johnson, LB Cole Fisher, LB Ben Niemann, SS Miles Taylor, TE Jameer Outsey, DE Parker Hesse, WR Riley McCarron, LT Cole Croston, and WR Jerminic Smith.

REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Three true freshmen have played in 2015, and all saw their college first action in the season opener: OL James Daniels, WR Jerminic Smith, and WR Adrian Falconer. Smith started at Wisconsin, becoming the first Iowa freshman to start at wide receiver since Matt VandeBerg started two games in 2013. Daniels is the first true freshman to play offensive line since Bryan Bulaga in 2007. Daniels joined the Iowa program last spring and participated in spring practice.

FLIRTING WITH 100

Junior QB C.J. Beathard gained 111 yards but lost 34 yards rushing against Iowa State on Sept. 12. His net gain of 77 yards threatened his career-high of 82 set at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. The last Iowa quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a single game was Butch Caldwell, who ran for 109 yards on 12 attempts against Michigan State on Nov. 24, 1973 in Iowa City.

QB C.J. BEATHARD (JR., 6-2, 209)

Career Games Played/Starts: 19/6

Junior QB C.J. Beathard threw for just 77 yards in Iowa's Big Ten opening win at Wisconsin. It was the first time Iowa won a game with fewer than 100 yards passing since 2008 vs. Purdue (72 yards).

Beathard entered the Wisconsin contest with consecutive games of career bests. He threw for a then career-high 258 yards against Pitt in Week 3, and topped that with 278 yards on 18-of-21 passing against North Texas in Week 4.

Beathard in 3-2-1:

- Undefeated in six career starts. Numbers include 101-of-168 (62.6) passing for 1,284 yards, eight touchdowns, and three interceptions, and 192 yards rushing with three rushing touchdowns.
- Has won his first six career starts. The last Iowa quarterback to win his first six career starts was Matt Sherman. Sherman won his first seven starts, including the final two games of 1994 and the first five games in 1995.
- Earned Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors after helping lead Iowa to a 14-point triumph at Iowa State. Beathard totaled 292 yards (215 passing and 77 rushing) against the Cyclones.

OL AUSTIN BLYTHE (SR., 6-3, 290)

Career Games Played/Started: 41/40

Senior C Austin Blythe is the veteran on an offensive line that includes three sophomores. He has started 40 games for Iowa, more than any other active Hawkeye, since debuting as Iowa's starting RG as a redshirt freshman in the 2012 season opener.

Blythe in 3-2-1:

- 35 consecutive starts on the offensive line.
- Iowa's opening day starting center for three straight years.
- Rimington and Outland Trophy Watch Lists.

RB JORDAN CANZERI (SR., 5-9, 192)

Career Games Played/Starts: 34/5

Senior RB Jordan Canzeri tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns in Week 4 against North Texas. He was named College Sports Madness Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week. It was the sixth time in program history a player rushed for four touchdowns, and the first time since Shonn Greene scored four times against Wisconsin in 2008.

Canzeri leads Iowa in rushing yards (441) and ranks second in receptions (14). His 600 all-purpose yards rank sixth in the conference.

Canzeri in 3-2-1:

- Eight rushing touchdowns ties for the Big Ten lead (Ezekiel Elliott, OSU) and ties for eighth nationally. He entered his senior season with two career rushing touchdowns in 29 career games.
- Five career 100-yard rushing games, including three this season.
- Second on the team with 14 receptions. Has eight straight games with at least one reception.

RB LeSHUN DANIELS, JR. (JR., 6-0, 225)**Career Games Played/Starts: 17/2**

Junior RB LeShun Daniels started the first two weeks of the season, but has seen limited action since leaving the Iowa State game due to injury. Daniels rushed for 179 yards through the first five-plus quarters of the season, but has been limited to 47 yards rushing over the last three games.

Daniels in 3-2-1:

- Set career highs in carries (26), rushing yards (123), and longest rush (27) in his first career start against Illinois State on Sept. 5. It was his first career 100-yard game.
- Entered the season with 184 rushing yards in 12 games. Has 226 rushing yards in 2015.
- He was Iowa's eighth different opening day starting running back since 2007.

CB DESMOND KING (JR., 5-11, 190)**Career Games Played/Starts: 31/30**

Junior CB Desmond King recorded his fourth and fifth interceptions of the season in Iowa's Big Ten opener at Wisconsin. He was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week. It was his second multi-interception game of the season (Pitt). His second quarter interception led to an Iowa touchdown. Three of his five interceptions this season have resulted in Iowa scores (2 TDs, 1 FG).

King in 3-2-1:

- Leads the Big Ten with five interceptions. The last Hawkeye to lead the league in interceptions was Tyler Sash in 2009 (6).
- First Hawkeye with five interceptions in a single-season since Brett Greenwood had five in 2010. He is the first Hawkeye to have two multi-interception games since Tyler Sash in 2009. First Hawkeye with two interceptions in a game since John Lowdermilk in the fourth period at Purdue in 2014.
- Totaled 180 return yards against North Texas (71 punt and 109 kickoff). He became the fourth Big Ten player in the last 20 seasons with 100-plus kickoff return yards and 70-plus punt return yards in a single game.

DE DREW OTT (SR., 6-4, 272)**Career Games Played/Started: 46/29**

Senior DE Drew Ott returned to the starting lineup against North Texas in Week 4, recording two tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. Ott saw limited action against Pitt in Week 3, one week after leaving the Iowa State game with three minutes left in the first quarter. He did not start against Pitt, snapping his streak of 15 consecutive starts at defensive end, but did play.

Ott recorded three tackles in the win at Wisconsin, including 2.5 tackles for loss and a QB sack. He forced a fumble in the second quarter that led to an Iowa field goal.

Ott recorded two sacks for a loss of 20 yards and forced one fumble in Iowa's season opener. His two sacks against Illinois State are the first time a Hawkeye collected multiple sacks in a season-opener since Mitch King had a pair in 2007. Ott led the team and tied for third in the Big Ten with 8.0 sacks in 2014. He had two tackles, one sack (7 yards), and two quarterback hurries against Pitt in 2014.

Ott in 3-2-1:

- Has started 29 of the last 31 games at defensive end and is tied for third in the Big Ten with three forced fumbles.
- One of 11 players on Big Ten Players to Watch List.
- Picked up a deflected punt against Nebraska in 2014 and returned it 12 yards for his first career touchdown.

FS JORDAN LOMAX (SR., 5-10, 205)

Career Games Played/Starts: 38/18

Senior FS Jordan Lomax ranks third on the team with 34 tackles. He had eight stops and one breakup in Iowa's Big Ten opening win at Wisconsin.

Lomax in 3-2-1:

- He has started 17 of Iowa's last 18 games.
- 10 tackles against Pitt were one shy of matching his career high (11), set at Maryland in 2014.
- Saw action in 11 games as a true freshman before redshirting in 2012 with shoulder injury.

WR TEVAUN SMITH (SR., 6-2, 205)

Career Games Played/Starts: 39/17

Senior WR Tevaun Smith missed the Wisconsin game with a knee injury. He is out indefinitely. Smith recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game in Week 4 against North Texas, the same game he suffered the injury. Smith had four catches for a career-high 115 yards, including a career-best 81-yard touchdown reception, the longest reception in the Big Ten this season. His 1,172 career receiving yards rank 31st in program history.

Smith in 3-2-1:

- Ranks second in the Big Ten averaging 19.6 yards per catch (12 for 235).
- Nine of his 12 catches have resulted in a first down, including two touchdowns (14, 81).
- Has at least one reception in 17 straight games played.

WR MATT VANDEBERG (JR., 6-1, 185)

Career Games Played/Starts: 28/7

Junior WR Matt Vandenberg had more catches through the first three games of the season (22) than any player in the Kirk Ferentz era (since 1999). Kevin Kasper had 21 receptions through the first three games of 2000, and Kevonte Martin-Manley, the school's all-time leader in receptions, had 19 catches through three games in 2013 and 2014.

Vandenberg in 3-2-1:

- Leads Iowa and ranks second in the Big Ten with 31 receptions.
- Has six or more receptions in four of five games this season. Career best entering the season was five.
- Set career highs with nine receptions and 114 receiving yards in Iowa's 31-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 12.

DE NATE MEIER (SR., 6-2, 252)

Career Games Played/Starts: 32/18

Senior Nate Meier leads the Hawkeyes and ranks fourth in the Big Ten with five sacks. Meier entered 2015 with three career sacks. His 30 tackles tie for fourth on the team.

Meier in 3-2-1:

- Leads Iowa in tackles-for-loss (6.5-36) and sacks (5-32). His five sacks rank fourth in the Big Ten.
- Meier and fellow defensive end Drew Ott were two of seven true freshmen to see action in 2012.
- One of three Hawkeye defensive linemen to play 8-man football in high school (Drew Ott, Nathan Bazata).

LB COLE FISHER (SR., 6-2, 236)**Career Games Played/Starts: 36/5**

Senior LB Cole Fisher leads Iowa and ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 47 tackles. He has started each of Iowa's first five games (his first five career starts).

Fisher in 3-2-1:

- Has been Iowa's leading tackler in four of five games (Illinois State, Pitt, North Texas, and Wisconsin).
- Recorded a career-high 14 tackles against Wisconsin in Iowa's Big Ten opener.
- Has three sacks, 4.5 tackles-for-loss, and one pass break-up. Entered senior season with zero sacks, TFL, or break-ups.

TE JAKE DUZEY (SR., 6-4, 248)**Career Games Played/Starts: 39/13**

Senior TE Jake Duzey made his first appearance of the season in Week 4 against North Texas. Duzey suffered a knee injury in the final week of spring practice and missed the first three games of his senior season.

Duzey in 3-2-1:

- Three touchdown receptions in 2014 tied for the team lead (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Tevaun Smith).
- Had 36 receptions in 2014, a single-season career high and tied for the second most by a Big Ten tight end this season.
- 85-yard TD reception at Ohio State in 2013 is ninth longest scoring reception in school history.

K MARSHALL KOEHN (SR., 6-0, 200)

Senior K Marshall Koehn has 19 touchbacks, the second highest total in the conference, on 27 kickoffs (70 percent).

Koehn also dabbles in the punt game, rugby-style. He has two punts for an average of 56.5 yard per punt. Both punts have been downed inside the opponent's 10-yard line.

He was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following his game-winning 57-yard field goal against Pitt on Sept. 19.

Koehn in 3-2-1:

- Has made five-of-six field goal attempts. Four-of-five made field goals are 40-plus yards, while his lone miss was from 27 yards.
- Hit a career-long 57 yard field goal as time expired to defeat Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19. It is the second longest field goal in school history (Tim Douglas, 1998) and ties a Kinnick Stadium record (Lee Pistor, Arizona, 1977). He has kicked two of Iowa's nine longest field goals in school history -- both coming against Pitt (52 at Pitt in 2014 and 57 vs. Pitt in 2015).
- Has 108 career points. He is the 36th player in program history with 100 career points and ranks 28th in career scoring.

P DILLON KIDD (SR., 6-2, 215)

Senior P Dillon Kidd shared punting duties in 2014, averaging 38.5 yards per punt. In near full-time duty in 2015 (Marshall Koehn has two of Iowa's 19 punts) Kidd is averaging 45.9 yards on 17 punts.

Kidd in 3-2-1:

- Ranks second in the Big Ten averaging 45.9 yards per punt.
- 64-yard punt against Pitt is a career long.
- Has seven punts of 50-plus yards, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten.

THE KICK

Marshall Koehn kicked a 57-yard field goal as time expired to defeat Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19. The game-winning field goal was the second longest in school history and tied the Kinnick Stadium record (Arizona's Lee Pistor in 1977).

After Pitt tied the game, 24-24, with 0:52 left in the fourth quarter, Iowa DB Desmond King picked up a squib kick at the 3-yard line and returned it 27 yards to the Iowa 30. QB C.J. Beathard picked up two rushing first downs to move the ball into Pitt territory, and after a pair of sideline routes to WR Tevaun Smith fell incomplete, Beathard scrambled for eight yards to the Pitt 39-yard line. Iowa then used its final timeout to stop the clock with two seconds left.

On fourth-and-2, Pitt called a timeout to freeze Koehn. Koehn let a kick sail anyway, but it landed far short of the goal post. On the ensuing attempt, Dillon Kidd placed a snap from Tyler Kluber on the Pitt 47-yard line, and Koehn split the uprights, giving Iowa its first walk-off field goal since 1986 (Holiday Bowl).

THE DRIVE

Iowa put together a 99-yard scoring drive on its second possession of the season. It was the Hawkeyes' first 99-yard touchdown drive since 2002. Iowa passed six times and rushed six times while converting five first downs on the drive. QB C.J. Beathard was 4-of-6 passing for 63 yards. He also carried once for two yards. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., carried four times for 18 yards, and RB Jordan Canzeri took his first carry of the season five yards into the end zone. Canzeri also had a 21-yard reception.

THE FOURTH QUARTER

QB C.J. Beathard and the Hawkeyes' rush defense have dominated the fourth quarter in 2015. Iowa's rush defense, the No. 2 defense in the conference, has yielded 73 total rushing yards in the fourth quarter this season. That includes a 55-yard effort from North Texas against Iowa reserves.

Beathard is 15-of-19 passing for 207 yards and one touchdown. He has also rushed nine times for 28 yards and one touchdown in the fourth quarter this season. He has engineered game-winning drives in the fourth quarter two times this season (Iowa State and Pitt). He was 4-of-4 for 46 yards and a touchdown against Iowa State, and he rushed for 27 yards on three carries to set up K Marshall Koehn's 57-yard game winning field goal against Pitt.

In Iowa's last six games, including the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, Beathard's fourth quarter numbers include 22-of-26 passing for 302 yards and three touchdowns, and 11 carries for 66 yards and one touchdown. Beathard did not play in the fourth quarter against North Texas.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach, the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player start on the offensive line in every season.

In each of the last eight years, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahan, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Both players were second round draft picks in 2003.

BAPTISM BY FIRE

Junior Cole Croston made his first career start at Wisconsin in the Big Ten opener. Croston started at left tackle in place of LT Boone Myers, who was out with injury. Myers and RT Ike Boettger entered 2015 with one combined career start (Boettger started as a

second tight end against Wisconsin in 2014). The sophomores replace a pair of NFL lineman -- 2014 Outland Trophy winner LT Brandon Scherff (Washington Redskins) and RT Andrew Donnal (St. Louis Rams).

Myers joined the program as a walk-on and was put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season. He saw action in four games last season. Boettger joined the team as a tight end but was moved to offensive line in 2013. He saw action in seven games as a redshirt freshman in 2014.

GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

- Iowa's Homecoming game is Saturday against Illinois at 11 a.m. Iowa is 56-42-5 all-time in Homecoming contests, and has won five of its last six Homecoming games. Illinois is visiting Kinnick Stadium for the first time since 2007.
- The Hawkeyes opened Big Ten play with a 10-6 win at Wisconsin. It marked the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz's 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes opened the conference season on the road.
- For the first time in program history Iowa plays more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa defeated Pitt, 27-24, in a BTN primetime game Sept. 19. The Hawkeyes host Minnesota on Nov. 14 at 7 p.m. (CT) on BTN.
- Iowa is one of four Big Ten teams (Iowa, Michigan, NW, Rutgers) with two power five schools on its nonconference schedule (Iowa State, Pitt). The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 31-17, on Sept. 12, and Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Illinois State, 31-14, in the season opener. The Redbirds lost to North Dakota State in the 2014 FCS title game. Iowa opens the 2016 season hosting North Dakota State.
- Iowa will face Maryland on Oct. 31 in Iowa City. It marks Maryland's first football game in Iowa City. It also marks the 16th time in Iowa program history the Hawkeyes play on Halloween (6-8-1).
- The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- Three of Iowa's nonconference opponents are led by coaches who have been assistants in the Big Ten, including Illinois State's Brock Spack (Purdue), Pitt's Pat Narduzzi (Michigan State), and North Texas' Dan McCarney (Iowa, Wisconsin). Iowa State's Paul Rhoads was a graduate assistant under John Cooper at Ohio State.
- Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2015: Iowa State (Cy-Hawk: W, 31-17), Wisconsin (Heartland; W, 10-6), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), and Nebraska (Heroes).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of four Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls four times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared the poll 298 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in

- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.
- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 17th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

PAULSENS ARE A FAMILIAR FACE

Freshmen Landan and Levi Paulsens are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The Paulsens are one of three sets of brothers on Iowa's 2015 roster, joining DB Kevin Ward and OL Ryan Ward, and OL James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels.

AMONG THE BEST IN THE BIG TEN

Iowa has posted a 6-6 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State has won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. Following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,198 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 618-541-39 (.530). That includes a 389-213-16 (.641) record in home games, a 229-328-23 (.413) record in games away from Iowa City, a 307-366-25 (.457) mark in Big Ten games and a 272-177-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster of 114 players includes 49 players from Iowa. The roster includes 14 players from Illinois; nine from Texas; seven from Maryland; six from Missouri, five from Ohio; four from Michigan; three from Florida, Nebraska, and New Jersey; two from South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Canada; one from Alabama, Minnesota, New York, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.



HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 22 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 30 Hawkeyes are on active NFL rosters.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- There are 30 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- Five Iowa graduates are active offensive tackles in the NFL, more than any other school (Virginia also has five).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Kirk Ferentz has produced seven first-round draft picks, tied for ninth most among active college coaches.
- Since 2011, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State matches Iowa's NFL total. Iowa has had five first round picks in the last six NFL drafts, tying Wisconsin (5) for the league lead.
- Iowa had 22 players drafted from 2010-15, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a four-time Pro-Bowler (2011-14) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, and 2014.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie (including 2015 rookie Ray Hamilton).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 13 years, 123-of-137 (90 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

IOWA AMONG TOP 25 IN WINS, 2002-15

Iowa has posted 109 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 20th highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (152); Ohio State (147); Oklahoma (141); USC (138); LSU (138); Georgia (132); Alabama (131); TCU (131); Oregon (129); Texas (127); Florida State (128); Virginia Tech (125); Wisconsin (125); Florida (122); Auburn (120); West Virginia (117); Utah (116); Virginia (112); Nebraska (112); Iowa (109); Miami, FL (108); Texas Tech (107); Michigan (106).

IOWA BOWL NOTES

Iowa has appeared in 28 bowl games with a record of 14-13-1 (.518). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

Iowa has played 12 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-6).

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 13 of the last 14 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 45 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (43), Iowa (28) and Wisconsin (26).
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including two appearances by Iowa (1-1).
- For just the second time in league history, 10 Big Ten Conference teams competed in bowl games in 2014 (2011). Ohio State won the inaugural College Football Playoff, while Michigan State won the Cotton Bowl, another College Football Playoff bowl.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players on its 2015 Leadership Group, including 13 seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are OL Austin Blythe, RB Jordan Canzeri, DL Darian Cooper, FB Adam Cox, TE Jake Duzey, WR Jacob Hillyer, PK Marshall Koehn, DB Jordan Lomax, DE Nate Meier, DE Drew Ott, LB Travis Perry, FB Macon Plewa and WR Tevaun Smith. The junior class is represented by QB C.J. Beathard and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., and LB Josey Jewell represents the sophomore class.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2015. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach. Steven is an offensive lineman who is in his fourth season as a redshirt junior. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in May 2013. He is currently playing for the NFL's Denver Broncos. Ferentz is the only FBS coach ever to coach three sons at the same school.

MORE THAN ONE

Eleven high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; and Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois each graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include DeMatha Catholic HS (Washington, D.C.), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Solon HS (Solon, Iowa), Waukegan HS (Waukegan, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), Williamsburg HS (Williamsburg, Iowa), and Woodbury Central HS (Moline, Iowa).

THE HAWKEYES. SIZE WISE

Redshirt freshman WR Brandon Bishop and freshman WR Emmanuel Ogwo are the lightest Hawkeye players at 170 pounds. Junior DL Jaleel Johnson is the heaviest at 310 pounds. A total of seven Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more.

The tallest player at 6-8 is redshirt freshman DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is sophomore WR Jonathan Parker.

The average Hawkeye player is 6-2 and weighs 232 pounds. That is the one inch taller and two pounds heavier than the average Iowa player in 2013.

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

Iowa has nine players on its 2015 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), WR Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

BEATHARD EARNS NATIONAL MANNING AWARD

Junior quarterback C.J. Beathard was selected as the Manning Award Quarterback of the Week following his play in Iowa's 31-17 win at Iowa State. He earned the honor over seven other Manning Award Stars of the Week in the Allstate Sugar Bowl's Facebook contest.

In his third career start, the Franklin, Tennessee, native completed 15-of-25 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns as the Hawkeyes scored 21 unanswered points in the second half to earn the road victory. His 25-yard touchdown pass to junior WR Riley McCarron in the fourth quarter gave the Hawkeyes the lead with 2:14 left in the game. Beathard also carried the ball a career high 10 times for 77 yards, showcasing his athleticism on runs of 44 and 57 yards in the first half. He was also named the Big Ten Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week.

Beathard earned the award over Washington State's Luke Falk, who completed 47-of-66 passes for 478 yards and four touchdowns in a 37-34 win at Rutgers. Third in the voting was Paxton Lynch from Memphis, who led the Tigers to a 55-23 win at Kansas to snap a 19-game losing streak against power-five teams.

Each week during the regular season, eight quarterbacks are recognized as Manning Quarterbacks of the Week. Sixty-two players from 58 different schools were honored during the 2014 season.

BEATHARD EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Junior quarterback C.J. Beathard was named co-Offensive Player of the Week by the Big Ten after leading Iowa to a 31-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 15. He completed 15-of-25 attempts for 215 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. He also rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including runs of 44 and 57 yards. His scoring strikes covered three, 14, and 25 yards, with the 25-yard score giving Iowa the lead with 2:14 remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the first for Beathard. He is the first Hawkeye to win the offensive honor since former WR Marvin McNutt, Jr., following a win over Indiana in 2011.



KOEHN EARNS BIG TEN HONOR

K Marshall Koehn was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in Iowa's 27-24 win over Pittsburgh on Sept. 19.

The Big Ten honor is the first for Koehn (6-foot, 200-pounds), a senior from Solon, Iowa (Solon HS). He is one of two Hawkeyes to earn a weekly conference honor this season (QB C.J. Beathard vs. Iowa State). He is the first Iowa kicker to earn the special teams award since Mike Meyer was recognized following a 19-16 double overtime win at Michigan State in 2012.

Koehn delivered the winning margin against Pittsburgh as he booted a 57-yard field goal as time expired. The kick tied the Kinnick Stadium record for longest field goal (Lee Pistor, Arizona, 1977) and ranks as the second longest in Iowa history (58 yards, Tim Douglas at Illinois, 1998). With a 52-yard kick in the 24-20 win at Pittsburgh in 2014, Koehn now has two of the nine longest field goals in Iowa history. It was the first walk-off field goal for Iowa football since Rob Houghtlin connected from 41 yards to win the 1986 Holiday Bowl.

JOE MOORE AWARD COMES KNOCKING

Iowa's offensive line earned a "Game Ball" from the Joe Moore Award following wins at Iowa State and against Pitt. The Joe Moore Foundation for Teamwork honors the most notable performances each week by offensive line units.

At Iowa State, Iowa's offense rushed for 260 yards, averaging 5.8 yards per rushing attempt. Iowa controlled the fourth quarter with 10:55 in possession time, scoring two touchdowns in the final 2:14 to earn the road win.

Against Pitt, the Hawkeyes owned more than a five minute advantage in time of possession and allowed just one sack, allowing QB C.J. Beathard to throw for then-career bests in completions (27), attempts (40), and yards (258).

Iowa's starting offensive line includes center Austin Blythe, tackles Boone Myers and Ike Boettger, and guards Sean Welsh and Jordan Walsh. Blythe and Walsh are seniors, while Myers, Boettger and Welsh are sophomores. True freshman James Daniels has rotated in at the guard positions.

The Joe Moore Award is named after Joe Moore, widely regarded as one of the best offensive line coaches in college football history, and is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is once again available for fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Iowa Football game days. The Hawkeye Express is in its 12th season. Adults can ride the train for \$12, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 31 points en route to a 31-14 season-opening victory over Illinois State at Kinnick Stadium.

In his second career start, first at home, QB C.J. Beathard accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing and one passing), while throwing for 211 yards (15-of-24). Beathard scored on runs of six and one yard, while completing a 9-yard score to WR Matt VandeBerg. Beathard became the first Hawkeye quarterback to rush for two TD's and pass for another in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes dominated the game in the trenches, rushing 44 times for 210 yards offensively, and collecting 10 tackles for loss, including five first-half sacks, defensively.

RB LeShun Daniels and RB Jordan Canzeri led the Hawkeyes offensively, combining for 241 all-purpose yards. Daniels led the Hawkeye ground attack rushing for 123 yards on 26 attempts. Canzeri had a game-best 90 yards receiving on four catches, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries.

Iowa took a 17-0 lead into halftime after PK Marshall Koehn split the uprights from 40 yards as time expired in the second quarter. The field goal followed rushing scores from Beathard (six yards) and Canzeri (five yards) earlier in the half. Canzeri's score capped off a 12-play, 99-yard drive -- Iowa's first 99-yard TD drive since its game at Miami (OH) in 2002.

The only scoring in the third quarter was VandeBerg's 9-yard reception. Beathard closed out the Hawkeye scoring with a one-yard plunge midway through the fourth quarter. Illinois State added two late touchdowns against the Hawkeyes' second unit.

The Hawkeye defense was in the Illinois State backfield applying pressure most of the afternoon. DE Drew Ott had two sacks for a combined loss of 20 yards. DE Nate Meier had two tackles for loss, including a sack, while LB Ben Niemann had 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. LB Cole Fisher led the team with eight total tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a sack and blocked Illinois State's 50-yard field goal attempt.

As a unit, the Hawkeyes held the Redbirds to 35 yards rushing on 28 attempts, including zero yards on 15 carries in the first half.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points to record a 31-17 come-from-behind road victory over Iowa State at Jack Trice Stadium and reclaim possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The Hawkeyes were led offensively by QB C.J. Beathard, RB Jordan Canzeri, and WR Matt Vandenberg. Canzeri rushed a career-high 24 times for 124 yards and a TD. Vandenberg posted career highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (114), while also scoring a TD. Beathard rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including a career-long rush of 57 yards, while also completing 15-of-25 passes for 215 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. Beathard's efforts earned the junior signal caller Manning Quarterback of the Week and Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.

After each team posted a field goal in the first quarter, the Cyclones grabbed a 10-3 advantage with an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Sam Richardson to Quenton Bundrage. The Hawkeyes evened the score two possessions later with a 14-yard WR Tevaun Smith scoring reception to culminate a 93-yard drive.

Iowa State took a 17-10 lead into halftime after a 29-yard scoring reception by Jauan Wesley.

The Hawkeyes controlled the second half, scoring three touchdowns and allowing Iowa State only 66 total yards on 31 plays.

Vandenberg recovered a TE Henry Krieger-Coble fumble on Iowa State's 3-yard line and crossed the goal line to tie the game in the third period. Riley McCarron then scored the game-winning TD, the first score of his career, on a 25-yard pass from Beathard in the back corner of the end zone with 2:14 remaining in the contest. Canzeri tallied Iowa's final score on an 8-yard scamper following Desmond King's first interception of the season.

Iowa's defense collected six tackles for loss, including four sacks by four different players. The Hawkeyes limited the Cyclones to 63 yards rushing on 27 attempts (2.3 avg.). DE Nate Meier and LB Josey Jewell each registered seven tackles. In addition to the interception, King had five tackles.

Iowa's DE Drew Ott and RB LeShun Daniels left the game in the first and second quarters, respectively, and did not return due to injury.

GAME RECAP

Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yard field goal as time expired to lift Iowa to a 27-24 triumph over Pittsburgh in Kinnick Stadium. The 57-yard field goal is the second longest in school history and tied a Kinnick Stadium record.

Koehn's kick marked the first time the Hawkeyes won a game with a field goal as time expired since Rob Houghtlin made a 41-yard game-winning kick in the 1986 Holiday Bowl to beat San Diego State, 39-38.

The victory marked the Hawkeyes' first 3-0 start in six seasons (2009).

C.J. Beathard improved to 4-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback after posting career bests in completions (27), pass attempts (40), and passing yards (258). He also rushed for a 9-yard score in the second quarter.

With Iowa leading 10-0 after a Koehn 43-yard field goal and Beathard's score, Pittsburgh cut the deficit to 10-7 after Scott Orndorff caught a 15-yard scoring reception one play after an Iowa turnover. Iowa extended its advantage to 17-7 with 44 seconds remaining before halftime with a Jordan Canzeri 4-yard run -- his first of two scores of the night.

The visitors evened the score with 10 special-teams points in the third period, via a Chris Blewitt 48-yard field goal and a 28-yard return by Pat Amara following a blocked punt.

Canzeri (1-yard run) and Pittsburgh's Tyler Boyd (8-yard reception) exchanged touchdowns in the fourth period before Koehn's heroics. The winning field goal was set up after the Hawkeyes drove 31 yards in the final 52 seconds after the Panthers had tied the score. It marked the second straight week that Beathard engineered a fourth quarter game-winning drive.

WR Matt VandeBerg (45 yards) and Canzeri (30 yards) each caught seven balls, while Canzeri also rushed for a game-high 49 yards on 12 carries.

Defensively, CB Desmond King had a career-best two interceptions, both in the first quarter, to go along with eight tackles. One of King's thefts came in the end zone to thwart a Panther scoring threat. LB Cole Fisher (12) and DB Jordan Lomax (11) posted double-digit tackles.

Koehn's two field goals, along with his first career punt of 64-yards, earned the senior placekicker Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

GAME RECAP

Jordan Canzeri tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns to lead Iowa to a convincing 62-16 victory over North Texas at Kinnick Stadium. The 62 points scored were the most by a Hawkeye team in 13 seasons.

Canzeri scored on runs of one, three, 10 and 16 yards to become the sixth Hawkeye running back to score four rushing touchdowns in a single game. The senior finished the game with 115 rushing yards on 22 carries.

Quarterback C.J. Beathard also had a stellar performance directing the offense, completing 18-of-21 passes for a career-high 278 yards and two touchdowns. Beathard connected on his first 15 pass attempts, becoming the first Big Ten quarterback to complete his first 15 pass attempts in a game since Wisconsin's Russell Wilson in 2011 (16-of-16).

Canzeri scored three of his four touchdowns in the first half, while Iowa's other two scores came via receptions of 43 and 81 yards by George Kittle and Tevaun Smith, respectively. Smith's 81-yard strike was Iowa's longest from scrimmage since an 85-yard score for Jake Duzey from Jake Rudock in 2013 at Ohio State. Smith finished the contest with a career-high 115 yards receiving on four catches.

Iowa scored 13 points or more in each quarter and tallied a season-high 35 points in the first half.

After yielding a field goal on the opening drive of the second half, the Hawkeyes put an exclamation mark on the win with four unanswered touchdowns. Two of the final four touchdowns came via interception returns of 34 yards (Josey Jewell) and 88 yards (Bo Bower). It marked the first time Iowa recorded two pick-sixes in a game since 2013 against Western Michigan (B.J. Lowery). Bower's 88-yard return is the seventh longest return in school history.

Desmond King had a career day on special teams, returning a total of six kicks for 180 yards. King returned four kickoffs for 109 yards and two punts for 71 yards.

Linebackers Cole Fisher and Jewell led the squad, each totaling nine tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a career-high four tackles to go along with his first career fumble recovery.

Iowa closed the nonconference portion of its schedule 4-0, marking the fourth time under Kirk Ferentz that the Hawkeyes have started a season 4-0.

GAME RECAP

Iowa forced four turnovers and held No. 18/19 Wisconsin without a touchdown in a 10-6 win at Camp Randall Stadium. The victory is Iowa's fifth straight to start the season and gives the Hawkeyes possession of the Heartland Trophy. It also marked Iowa's first road triumph over a ranked opponent since a 38-28 win over No. 24 Michigan in 2010.

Thirteen of the 16 points in the contest, including the final 13 points, were scored following turnovers. Wisconsin scored its only first-half points on its opening possession when PK Rafael Gaglianone converted a 46-yard field goal.

Iowa, who has won consecutive games in Madison and won four of its last five visits since 2004, stopped two Badger drives in the second quarter with a CB Desmond King interception and a DE Nate Meier fumble recovery -- both in Wisconsin territory that resulted in points.

TE George Kittle scored his second touchdown in as many weeks with a 1-yard reception from QB C.J. Beathard following King's first of two interceptions. PK Marshall Koehn connected from 33 yards after Meier recovered a fumble forced by DE Drew Ott.

King collected his second pick of the game on the Badgers' opening possession of the second half. The only points of the second half came on Gaglianone's second field goal (46 yards) following a Beathard interception in Iowa territory.

Iowa's defense held Wisconsin out of the red zone until its final two possessions of the game. With Wisconsin trailing 10-6 and on Iowa's 1-yard line, Badger QB Joel Stave fumbled and Iowa DT Faith Ekakitie recovered on the 4-yard line to maintain the four-point advantage.

The Badgers drove to Iowa's 16-yard line on their final possession before failing to convert fourth down with 36 seconds remaining.

Jordan Canzeri rushed a career-high 26 times for 125 yards. Beathard completed 9-of-21 passes for 77 yards, with Matt VandeBerg catching six of the nine targets for 61 yards.

Linebackers Cole Fisher (14) and Josey Jewell (10) were credited with double-digit tackles. King, in addition to the two thefts, had nine tackles and two pass break-ups and was recognized as Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week.

Iowa's 10 points marks the fewest by any team in a win at Wisconsin since the Hawkeyes won by the identical score in 1991.
