2008 Season Review



Last season, Iowa finished with a record of 9-11-1, the club's most wins since 2002. The Hawkeyes went 3-6-1 in Big Ten Conference play.

POSTSEASON PLAY

For the second year in a row, the Hawkeyes earned a berth to the Big Ten Tournament, only the second time in school history the club has made it to the tournament in back-to-back seasons. Iowa fell to top-seed Penn State, 2-1.

INDIVIDUAL STANDOUTS

Underclassmen led the way for the Hawkeyes on the field in 2008. Freshman **Alyssa Cosnek** led the team in goals (nine), while freshman **Morgan Showalter** led the team in assists (nine). Sophomore **Keli McLaughlin** led the team in points (20), scoring seven goals and dishing out six assists.

Goalkeeping duties were split between freshmen Kali Feiereisel (25 saves in 13 matches) and Emily Moran (74 saves).

FOUR AMONG THE CONFERENCE'S BEST

Sophomore defender **Jenna Aleo** was a second team all-Big Ten selection last season. She started all 21 matches.

Moran and Showalter were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman team last season. Cosnek was named to the all-tournament team at the Big Ten Tournament after netting Iowa's lone goal in its opening round loss to Penn State.

STATE SUPREMACY

Since **Ron Rainey** was hired in 2006, Iowa is undefeated in contests against in-state rivals Drake, Northern Iowa and Iowa State (7-0-1). Last season, Iowa claimed road wins at Iowa State (3-2) and Northern Iowa (2-0), while defeating Drake at home (4-0).

MORE RECORDS SHATTERED

After just one season, Cosnek and Showalter put their names in lowa's record books. Cosnek is tied for second in season gamewinning goals (six), tied for fourth in career game-winning goals (six), and tied for eighth for goals in a single-season (nine).

After dishing out three assists in her first collegiate match against Drake (Aug. 23), Showalter became lowa's all-time leader for most assists in a single match. She ended the season with nine assists, putting her in a four-way tie for most assists in a single-season.



Kelsey Shaw started all 56 games of her career and was named to the 2008 Pepperdine Nike Challenge All-Tournament Team.

HOME SUCCESS

The Hawkeyes went 7-5 last season at the UI Soccer Complex, a new school record for most home wins in a season. Iowa is 14-10-2 at home over the last three seasons.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Twelve Hawkeyes were named academic all-Big Ten: Erica Clausen (second selection), Kali Feiereisel (first selection), Mandy Heimann (first selection), Stephanie Hyink (first selection), Jackie Kaeding (third selection), Amanda Martin (first selection), Kelsey McCarron (second selection), Alexandria Seydel (second selection), Nicole Slevin (second selection), Katie Smeltzer (second selection), Stephanie Swanson (first selection) and Heather Windsor (first selection).







Ron Rainey Head Coach Fourth Season

Ron Rainey is in his fourth year as head coach of the Hawkeyes.

Last season, Rainey coached the Hawkeyes to a record of 9-11-1, including a 7-5 record at

home and a second-straight berth to the Big Ten Tournament. Rainey has continued his success with the rebuilding of Iowa Soccer as the nine wins were the most since 2002 and Iowa's seven home wins were a school record.

The rebuilding effort continued in 2007, Rainey's second season at the helm of the Hawkeyes. Rainey coached the Hawkeyes to a record of 8-8-4, the program's best record since 2001. Iowa also earned a trip to the Big Ten Conference tournament for the first time since 2001.

Rainey joined the Hawkeyes from Ball State University before the start of the 2006 season, where he served as the school's head coach since the program's inaugural season in 1999. Under his tutelage, the Cardinals posted a 70-52-17 record in seven seasons.

Ball State showed swift improvement under Rainey's guidance, and amassed a 62-25-14 record in his last five years. In 2001, he coached the third-year program to a 12-6-2 mark and was named Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year. In 2005, Rainey guided Ball State to a 15-3-2 record and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament for the fifth-consecutive year.

Before starting the program at Ball State, Rainey served as an assistant coach at the University of Iowa for the first two seasons of the Hawkeye program (1997-98). In Iowa's first year of varsity soccer, Rainey and the Hawkeyes were named the No. 1 first-year program by *Soccer Buzz* Magazine.

Prior to his stint with Iowa, Rainey was the head women's coach at Towson State University for one year, where his team was 10-7-2 and won the America East Tournament. He has also served as an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati (1995-96), and head coach and sports information director at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside (1994-1995), where his first year team finished with a 10-6-2 record. Rainey was also the graduate assistant coach at Trenton State College (1992-94).

Outside the collegiate ranks, Rainey has served as a regional staff coach for the Region II Girls Olympic Development Program every summer since 1994. Currently, Rainey is the coach of Region II National team liason. He received his United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "A" License in 1996. He has also written articles for leading soccer publications such as Soccer Coaching Magazine and presented at numerous coaching clinics around the Midwest. He has also served on the NCAA and NSCAA ranking committees.

Rainey graduated from Wilkes University in 1992 with degrees in Mathematics and English. He went on to get his Master of Education degree from Trenton State College in 1994.

As a player, Rainey was a two-time captain and team MVP for Wilkes University. In 1990, he was a second team National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) all-region pick.

Rainey's wife Margaret earned her Masters degree in education at Iowa and played collegiate soccer at the University of Wisconsin. They have three children: Wade (8), Sally (6) and Mary (4).







Shane Meridith

Assistant Coach First Season

Shane Meridith is in his first season as an assistant coach at Iowa. His duties will include coaching the midfield and forwards, coordinate recruiting and administrative duties.

Meridith spent the previous two seasons as an assistant at Miami of Ohio. He has prior experience with Rainey, as he was an assistant on Rainey's staff at Ball State from 2000-01. He also spent one year at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) during the 2003-04 season.

He was previously the head coach for the Carmel United Soccer Club (2002) and has worked as Director of Coaching at Cincinnati's (OH) Westside Soccer Club. In addition, Meridith was a longtime staff coach for the Indiana Youth Soccer Association (1994-2007) and serves as a Region II staff coach for the United States Youth Soccer Federation. He has a USSF National "A" License.

Meridith, a four-year letterwinner at Earlham (84-87), coached at his alma mater for six years leading the Quakers to a 53-56-5 record between 1994-2000. He was named North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) Coach of the Year in 1998 and served on the NSCAA Great Lakes Region and Coaches Ranking Committee.

He earned his bachelor's degree in education from Earlham (1989) and has completed coursework towards a master's degree in sports psychology from Ball State. Meridith and his wife, Darcey, have a daughter, Josie (6).



Eileen Narcotta Assistant Coach Fourth Season

Eileen Narcotta is in her fourth season as an assistant coach for the Hawkeyes. Her duties at Iowa include coaching the defenders and goalkeepers, managing travel arrangements, video coordination, conditioning and recruiting.

Narcotta joined the lowa program from Ball State, where she was an assistant coach with Ron Rainey for four seasons. While at Ball State, Narcotta was in charge of coaching goalkeepers and defenders, while assisting in practice planning and recruiting. In 2005, Narcotta helped the Cardinals to a 15-3-2 record and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament

for the fifth-consecutive year. She has coached two goalkeepers to all-MAC honors, including Ali Becker, who transfered to Iowa from Ball State and finished her playing career in 2007. Narcotta also coached Becker to NSCAA All-Great Lakes region honors.

Narcotta received her masters in sports administration from Ball State in 2006. She graduated from Vermont in 2000 with a degree in nutritional and food sciences and was a member of the Vermont soccer team for five seasons. She was an assistant at Vermont for one season before accepting an assistant coaching at Bowdoin College in Brunswick, ME, in August of 2000.

Narcotta currently serves as a Regional Staff Coach for the Region II Girls' Olympic Development Program and for the Iowa Olympic Development Program. She holds both a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "B" License and an Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA).



The University of Iowa soccer team finished 9-11-1 during the 2008 season, improving yet again after a program-boosting 2007 season. Iowa's nine wins are the most the program has recorded since the 2002 season, including three against Big Ten Conference teams. For the second year in a row, the Hawkeyes earned a berth to the Big Ten Tournament, marking only the second time in school history the club has made it to the tournament in back-to-back seasons. This season's expectations are higher than ever for head coach **Ron Rainey**'s team.

"The last three years we've made strides with our competitive level and in the Big Ten," Rainey said. "We've been in more games that could go either way and that is a huge improvement from three years ago. We want to get greedy. We've made little jumps every year and now we want to make a big jump. There has to be a huge commitment from the team to get better every day in practice. There also has to be a huge commitment from the student-athletes how they handle classes and take care of themselves."

Co-captains this year will be **Jackie Kaeding** and **Heather Windsor**. The senior duo, along with five fellow seniors, will lead the team that consists of a good mix of experience and competitiveness. Rainey expects every position to be competitive for the starting spots, as many freshmen and sophomores have 20 games or more experience on the field. The squad will welcome nine freshmen that bring a range of knowledge about the game from high school to international competition.

This season, the Hawkeyes will welcome a new assistant coach. **Shane Meridith** comes to Iowa from Miami of Ohio and will reunite with Rainey after serving as his assistant at Ball State in 2000-01. Meridith, a graduate of Earlham College, has many years of coaching experience in the collegiate and club level. **Eileen Narcotta** returns for her fourth year at Iowa.

"Shane coming in will add a new set of eyes and a different outlook for the coaches and the team," said Rainey of his new assistant coach. "He's an excellent coach and he has a great personality, so I think that will help on the field. Eileen has done a good job with the goalkeepers and defenders, so that will help with continuity."

GOALKEEPERS

The lowa roster this year includes five goalkeepers-**Emily Moran**, **Kali Feiereisel, Erica Clausen**, **Stephanie Swanson** and **Rachel Spellerberg**. Feiereisel and Moran were the leaders in the net last year, but Rainey expects good competition this year for the starting position.

"We think Kali and Emily have separated themselves a little bit," Rainey said. "**Stephanie Swanson** has also pushed people in practice and some Big Ten games. **Erica Clausen** and **Rachel Spellerberg** will help with that dynamic as well. It is going to be a strong position for us." Feiereisel's season was cut short after breaking her arm in the match against North Dakota State, but Rainey looks for her to come back strong.

"We're looking forward to having Kali back from her arm injury, which caused her to miss the last seven games of the year. We're also interested to see if Emily can keep her strong play up from the fall and spring," Rainey said. "What was a young group of goalkeepers is now an experienced group, so we will call on them to make big saves for us this year."

DEFENDERS

Following a season with young defenders, the Hawkeyes look to their 2008 MVP, junior **Jenna Aleo**, to lead the backfield. Sophomores **Suzy Levett** and **Rachel Blakesley** will also bring experience for the defense. Blakesley started every match as a freshman, while Levett recorded minutes in all 21 matches. Junior **Mandy Heimann** will also add depth to the starting lineup, with 31 starts in her career as a Hawkeye, but Rainey expects competition at this position as well.

"They will be pushed by some of our newcomers, so that will be a competitive position through the preseason," Rainey said.

Incoming freshmen slated to record minutes in the back line include Gabby Ainsworth, Dana Dalrymple, Stefani Campbell and Katherine Lewis.

MIDFIELDERS

Possibly the most experienced group on the field, the midfielders, will be led by seniors **Jackie Kaeding** and **Alex Seydel**, who have each started every game of their career for an impressive combined 102 starts. Kaeding has been versatile playing minutes in the midfield and on defense.


"Alex has just been a rock for us out there and Jackie has shown the athletic and tactical ability to play both on defense and in the midfield," explained Rainey. "Those will be the two that will do a lot of positive things for us."

Morgan Showalter, a member of the 2008 all-Big Ten Freshmen team, leads the attack from midfield in her sophomore season. Showalter looks to improve her defensive play in the 2009 season, as well as continue to excel on the offensive side of play.

"We've told her her challenge this year is to become an all-Big Ten player," Rainey said. "She has to step up her game even more offensively and add a defensive presence to the game. She has been working hard through the spring and summer on these things."

Season Preview/Meet the Hawkeyes

The Hawkeyes will welcome six new midfielders to the team including **Dana Dalrymple**, **Jade Grimm**, **Emily Jaffe**, **Jenny Kahler**, **Katherine Lewis** and **Alyscha Mottershead**. Freshmen midfielders will bring an array of experiences to the squad led by Mottershead, who has competed in many international tournaments for the Canadian Under-17 National team.



FORWARDS

Junior **Keli McLaughlin** and sophomore **Alyssa Cosnek** will be the main threats up front. McLaughlin is currently tied for fifth in school history for assists in a single-season (6) and Cosnek started every match as a freshman. **Ron Rainey** looks for these two to be big playmakers on the field.

"We feel that those players with 40 and 20 games experience, and a couple springs under their belt, will be able to step up their games a little bit," said Rainey. "They need to know when they get scoring opportunities. We're counting on them to finish."

Rainey also looks for players such as **Alli Bellmer**, **Kim White** and **Amanda Martin** to help through the season with team competition, and be able to come off the bench to play solid minutes. Many players on this year's squad have game experience that Rainey expects to be crucial in the overall production of the team.




