2008 SEASON PREVIEW

In his fifth season with the Hawkeyes, Iowa Baseball Coach Jack Dahm is looking to continue the success of last year's team, who posted a 31-23 record. With a solid and experienced group of players returning and a talented squad of new athletes, the Hawkeyes are set to continue their improvement in the Big Ten and have a run at the Big Ten title.

"Our players have worked extremely hard since the end of the 2007 season and look forward to even greater success in 2008," said Dahm. "This is the most balanced team we have had since we have taken over the program and we believe that will allow us to be more consistent throughout the season. Our schedule will again be very challenging but it should prepare us for the Big Ten season."

STARTING PITCHING

The coaching staff is excited about the pitching staff's potential this year as the squad has a nice combination of experienced arms, along with a talented group of newcomers. Coach Dahm has stressed the pitching staff needs to continue to make strides and pitch like they are capable in order to battle for championships.

"Coming out of fall baseball senior Brock Alberts, junior Nick Erdman, junior Steve Turnbull and sophomore lefty Michael Jacobs are the front runners for the starting rotation," Dahm said.

Alberts will be battling to be the Hawkeyes' Friday starter. Alberts made 12 appearances, 11 in relief and one start last season and was second on the team with a 3.47 ERA.

"Brock has made incredible progress since the middle of

last season and his confidence in all three pitches has grown," Dahm said.

Another key returnee is Erdman, who is coming off a very successful sophomore campaign. He posted a team-best 7-3 record in 12 starts and 13 appearances and went 6-1 with a 4.79 ERA and 47 innings pitched in Big Ten play in 2007. He was named second team all-Big Ten.

"I have been impressed with the strides that Nick has made the past two years," Dahm said. "I look for him to build off last year's success and develop into one of the most consistent pitchers in the conference."

Turnbull will be returning to the starting rotation after making 13 starts on the mound last season and leading the team with 44 strikeouts.

"I have seen Steve working with a little more sense of purpose the last couple of months," Dahm said. "If he continues he will have a chance to have an outstanding season."

After playing a key role as lowa's set-up man last year, Jacobs is taking on the role as a starter this season. The lefty made 19 appearances and posted a perfect 3-0 record his freshman campaign.

"Mike is one of the hardest working players I have ever coached and he has turned himself into one of our best pitchers," Dahm said.

The coaching staff also sees freshmen Zach Kenyon, Tony Manville, Patrick Shatz and seniors David Conroy and lefty

> Andrew Porter making mid-week starts and pushing to get into the rotation.




Senior transfer Matt Mossey will take on the role as the Hawkeyes' closer this season taking the place of Mike Schurz, who will redshirt to recover from elbow surgery. Mossey posted a 6.36 ERA with 14 appearances at North Dakota State last season.

"We are very excited about the experience Matt brings to our pitching staff," Dahm said. "We believe he has the mentality and stuff to develop into an outstanding closer."

With Jacobs joining the starting rotation, the Black and Gold will need someone to take on the role of set-up man and Jason Belk and lefty Kyle Heim are two returnees who could fill that role.

"Both Belk and Heim pitched very well at the end of last season," Dahm said. "We are counting on them to have key roles coming out of the pen."

Also coming out of the pen and contributing will be senior Joe Singer and three talented left-handers in senior George Rasiarmos, junior Matt Douglas and freshman Nic Jen-

While it will not be easy to replace Jason White and Dusty Napoleon in the infield, the Hawkeyes will still have an experienced and talented core. Kevin Hoef, Justin Toole, T.J. Cataldo, Wes Freie and Mossey will have major roles this season.

In addition to his pitching responsibilities, Mossey will play third base after spending three years as the starting shortstop at North Dakota State.

"He is a high-energy type of player that will bring some valuable experience to the left side of our infield," Dahm said.

Also battling for playing time at third will be senior Kody McManis.

"Kody has worked extremely hard in all phases of his game," Dahm said. "Kody will be looked at to play third base when Matt comes to close games out on the mound."

Junior Kevin Hoef will move to shortstop after two years as the Hawkeyes' starting third baseman. Hoef had 14 multihit games and seven multi-RBI games his sophomore season and led the team with 15 hit by pitches.

"Kevin had a great summer in Cape Cod and we believe he is going to have a big year both offensively and defensively," Dahm said.

Anchoring the right side of the infield after a breakout sophomore season is second baseman Justin Toole. The junior ranked in the Big Ten top 10 in batting last year (.374).

"I am looking forward to watching Justin step out and become one of our leaders both offensively and defensively," Dahm said. Also in the mix will be Zach McCool, who had a very good fall and will give second base depth. McCool will also battle for the right-handed designated hitter (DH) position and will be a valuable bat off the bench.

Wes Freie will see a majority of his time at first base. The junior made 18 starts at first base and eight at DH last season and hit a team-best .667 as a pinch hitter.

"Wes has worked extremely hard over the summer and has learned a lot over the past two seasons," Dahm said. "He will see a lot of action at first base and our right-handed DH."

T.J. Cataldo gives the Hawkeyes another left-handed hitter in the lineup and has the versatility to play first, second, third and lefthanded DH.

"T.J. is a self-made player and I could not be happier for him and the success he had last season," Dahm said.

The Black and Gold are also fortunate to have two talented left-handed hitting middle infielders in junior Ryan Gryzwa and freshman Trevor Willis, along with junior Mike Voitek. These three players will give lowa a lot of versatility in the infield.

CATCHER

The Hawkeyes come into the 2008 season with numbers and experience at catcher.

Ben Geelan enters this year as Iowa's No. 1 catcher after starting 33 games at catcher his junior campaign.

"Ben is one of the top catchers in the Big Ten and he brings experience and leadership to our program," Dahm said. "Ben has really matured as a catcher and he understands how we want him to handle our pitching staff."

Tyson Blaser will be sharing catching duties with Geelan this season and Coach Dahm believes he will also contribute as the Hawkeyes right handed DH.

"We are very excited about what Tyson brings to our program both offensively and defensively and we expect him to be a big contributor this year," said Dahm.

Kevin Lee, Kody McManis and Greg Gieslemann will also contribute.

2008 SEASON PREVIEW

OUTFIELD

The Hawkeyes will have a lot of depth in the outfield in 2008. Not only do this year's outfielders have depth, but a number of players have the ability to play multiple positions.

Caleb Curry moves from leftfield to center, where he will replace Travis Sweet, who is playing in the Houston Astros organization. Curry led the team with a 15-game hitting streak last season and had a .412 average with runners in scoring position.

"Caleb brings a lot of energy to our ballclub," Dahm said. "What I enjoy most about Caleb is that he loves to play the game and he has the ability to make his teammates better."

In right, the Hawkeyes will look to senior Kyle Riffel who hit .625 as the inning's leadoff hitter and did not make an error his junior season.

"Kyle is our best defensive outfielder," Dahm said. "He is an outstanding athlete that is really starting to make strides offensively."

Also expected to see a lot of playing time is Justin Brauer, after playing 14 games last season.

"Justin is an explosive athlete that can play anywhere," Dahm said. "He swung the bat very well this fall and is one of the best base runners we have."

After having a great fall season, Kurtis Muller will see action in the outfield.

"Kurtis impressed everybody this fall with the way he approached the field everyday," Dahm said. "He has put himself in a position to play a lot as a freshman."

Phil Keppler, Nick Muhlenbruch and Jeff Pacha are three talented left-handed hitting outfielders that will give the team some flexibility in the lineup, along with right-handed hitting Mike Feierstein.

SCHEDULE

The Black and Gold will once again face a very daunting schedule. Iowa opens the season with their first 13 games away from home. The Hawkeyes will play a total of eight teams (21 games) that played in the NCAA Tournament a year ago.

lowa starts with three games in Clearwater, FL (Albany, Notre Dame and Liberty), followed by a trip to Nashville, TN to compete against Kansas, Vanderbilt and Xavier. The Hawkeyes then travel to Springfield, MO, to challenge Missouri State in a three-game series. Iowa will be in DeLand, FL, during Spring Break for a three-game series against Rutgers and two against Stetson, both 2007 NCAA Tournament participants.

The non-conference schedule is highlighted by hosting Nebraska, a 2007 NCAA Tournament qualifier, playing Northern Iowa in the fifth annual Corridor Classic at Veterans Memorial Stadium in Cedar Rapids and facing Creighton at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha. The Hawkeyes will also play the Iowa-Cubs in an exhibition contest (Apr. 1).

Iowa's home opener will be against Grand View on March 22 at Duane Banks Field.

During Big Ten play, Iowa entertains Purdue, Northwestern, Minnesota and Ohio State and travels to Michigan, Indiana, Michigan State and Penn State.
