

Midway through the 2008 season, the Iowa football team was at a crossroads. With three losses by a combined total of eight points, the Hawkeyes were very close to a perfect record and the fast track to a successful season. But, those close losses also meant Iowa had to keep improving and be able to finish strong over the second half of the season to be bowl eligible for an eighth straight season.

The Hawkeyes chose the second option, winning five of their final six regular season games, including a last second 24-23 victory in Kinnick Stadium over third-ranked and previously undefeated Penn State. Iowa followed that victory with a home win over Purdue and a road win over Minnesota, claiming its eighth win in spectacular fashion with a 55-0 victory in Minneapolis. A bid to the 2009 Outback Bowl followed and the Hawkeyes added an exclamation point to the season with a 31-10 New Year's Day win over South Carolina to post a final 9-4 record.

With the bid to the Outback Bowl, Iowa became one of just 10 Division I programs to appear in five January bowl games since 2002. The Hawkeyes won three of those games. Led by a great group of 15 seniors, Iowa ended the campaign ranked 20th in both major polls; the four losses came by a total of 12 points. The Iowa trophy case is fully stocked again as the Cy-Hawk (Iowa State), Heartland (Wisconsin) and Floyd of Rosedale (Minnesota) trophies are all back in Iowa City. Add the 2009 Outback Bowl trophy and it's easy to see how Iowa's football hardware is piling up.

After earning their way into the top 20 to end the 2008 season, the Hawkeyes will be picked by most prognosticators to start the 2009 season in nearly that same position. The Iowa roster includes 49 lettermen, but just 15 seniors and five players who have earned three letters. While the Hawkeyes return eight starters on defense, six on offense and three kickers, just seven projected starters are seniors, including two on defense and five on offense, and none of the three kickers. In short, Iowa's veteran team in 2009 will still be a young team.

The Hawkeyes return eight defensive starters from one of the top defensive teams in the nation a year ago. Iowa led the Big Ten in scoring defense (13.0) and finished second in total defense (291.3), rushing defense (94.0) and redzone defense. The Hawkeye were third in league turnover margin, which is normally a big stat in regards to team success. The three senior starters in 2008, tackles Mitch King and Matt Kroul and cornerback Bradley Fletcher, will be hard to replace.

*"People didn't catch on to how young we were last year," says Ferentz. "We're still fairly young overall. Our defense wasn't flashy, but we gave up only about 13 points a game. You give yourself a chance to win a lot of games doing that. Our 2008 defense was a great story, as we didn't have much experience returning. The guys really fit together and played well together. We got a huge boost from Matt Kroul and Mitch King, being a pair of veterans up front. I think the potential for our defense this year is exciting; it will be interesting to see how it all fits together."*

The Hawkeye offense is a little less experienced, but the Hawkeyes have a number of veterans in the offensive line and quarterback Ricky Stanzi, who started the final nine games last season and 11 of 13 overall. Tackles Bryan Bulaga and Kyle Calloway anchor a solid line, while a pair of seniors, TE Tony Moeaki and WR Trey Stross, could prove to be Stanzi's top receiving targets. Ferentz doesn't expect to replace consensus first team all-American Shonn Greene with one player, saying

the Hawkeyes have several players who could share the load of the rushing attack. Wide receiver Andy Brodell and tight end Brandon Myers, who ranked second and third in receptions and yards, respectively, last season, also need to be replaced, along with top offensive linemen in center Rob Bruggeman and guard Seth Olsen.

*"We were excited about the way Ricky came on last year and we feel very good about his future over the next two years," added Ferentz. "Ricky impressed me with the way he handled any miscues. He was able to shake off tough situations and come back and compete with the next opportunity. Playing experience isn't something you can just hand to a player. He's been behind center when we've won some big games. We've seen him emerge as a leader and he's more of a confident player in all regards."*

Iowa's list of players expected to gain pre- or post-season honors include linebackers Pat Angerer and A.J. Edds, defensive ends Christian Ballard and Adrian Clayborn, defensive backs Amari Spivey and Brett Greenwood, tight end Tony Moeaki, quarterback Ricky Stanzi and offensive linemen Bryan Bulaga, Kyle Calloway and Julian Vandervelde. Junior punter Ryan Donahue is an all-America candidate as well, and others could certainly make the list as the season progresses. Angerer, Bulaga, Calloway, Donahue and Spivey earned second team all-Big Ten honors in 2008. DB Brett Greenwood and LB A.J. Edds earned honorable mention recognition.

Iowa will likely be picked among the top teams in the Big Ten and the nation heading into the season after not being on the pre-season radar the past two seasons. Ferentz and his 11th Hawkeye team know pre-season rankings won't matter when the season starts on the first Saturday of September.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"Basically, the predictions are a byproduct of two things. How did you finish, and what is the level of experience you have returning. It just so happens that we won nine games last year, we finished in pretty strong fashion, and we certainly have more experience returning than we have had in recent years. So it's natural to think we'll be mentioned in the pre-season. Last year we weren't mentioned by anybody and we went on and had a successful year. We've also had years where we have been mentioned and didn't do so well. We've seen it both ways. My feeling is that it has no bearing on how the season is going to go. It just gets down to what we choose to do with our opportunities."*

*We had a number of players who could not participate in the spring due to out of season medical reasons, so it's really tough to gauge the entire team collectively. The attitude was good, the work ethic was good. We saw some players emerge on an individual basis. The most important thing is what we do over the summer heading into August camp. If you look at some of our successful teams, the play of the seniors has been a key component. The entire senior class did a great job of giving the team direction a year ago. We're going to need to see that again. That is something that is built over the course of an entire season."*

Here is a look at the Hawkeyes, position by position:

#### QUARTERBACK

Junior signal caller and all-Big Ten candidate Ricky Stanzi (6-4, 218) started Iowa's final nine games (11-of-13 for the season) last year and has a hold on the starting position. The Hawkeyes were 8-3 in games Stanzi started, including the Outback Bowl win. Stanzi was fourth in the league's pass efficiency rating with a mark of 134.8. He passed for 1,956 yards and 14 touchdowns. He completed 150-of-254 passes and threw only nine interceptions. The yardage total ranks 19th best in Iowa history. He passed for a season-high 255 yards and three touchdowns in the regular season finale at Minnesota. He threw a pass for at least a 20-yard gain 27 times in 2008 and completed a personal-best 21 passes (30 attempts) against Northwestern.

Two talented redshirt freshmen are behind Stanzi as Iowa had just three quarterbacks in spring camp. Left-handed John Wienke (6-5, 220) and James Vandenberg (6-3, 205) were impressive during a season they primarily worked with the scout team. Both have good arms and the size to succeed in the Big Ten.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*We're really excited about the way Ricky came on last year. He made some young player mistakes. But the important thing, that impressed me, was the way he handled any miscues. He showed resiliency. He was able to shake off the tough situations and come back and compete. That's a great starting point. He will be a more confident player this year. The significant playing time gave him a good base to build from and he continued that this spring.*

*Quality starting experience is one of the things you can't just hand to players and Ricky has both positive and negative experience under his belt. He has been behind center when we've won some big games. We've seen him emerge as a leader, not just in the spring, but the start of the winter program as well. He's a more confident player now, in all regards.*

*We probably had as few quarterbacks as anybody during the spring with just three. We feel good about Ricky and his future over the next two seasons. James Vandenberg and John Wienke have both done a good job, both last fall, and in the spring. It's a healthy competition; both players have a good attitude and a good up side. The first order of business is deciding who is No. 2 and No. 3. The month of August will be important to continue bringing those guys along."*

#### RUNNING BACK

Iowa enters the 2009 spring campaign much like it did last year at this position. Shonn Greene returned to Iowa after sitting out a year because of eligibility problems. All he did was rewrite the Iowa records book for running backs and win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back.

Greene became Iowa's all-time rushing leader for a season with 1,850 yards. He set a season record for rushing touchdowns (20) and tied records for points in a season (120), points in a game (24) and touchdowns in a game (4). He was the only player in the country to rush for over 100 yards in 13 games. He became Iowa's first consensus all-America running back since Nile Kinnick (1939). But, he'll be doing his running on Sunday next year and the Hawkeyes need to find a replacement.

Sophomore Jewel Hampton (5-9, 210) played as a true freshman in 2008. He rushed for 463 yards and scored seven touchdowns. The seven TD's is the most ever by an Iowa true freshman. Three of his scores came in Iowa's win against his home state school,



Indiana. He played in every game and averaged 5.1 yards per rush. He was also the Hawkeyes' leading kickoff returner with 23 returns for 537 yards (23.3 avg.).

Behind Hampton is another player with considerable experience in junior Paki O'Meara (5-11, 211). O'Meara played in 10 games and rushed for 62 yards and two touchdowns. He also caught three passes out of the backfield. Joining O'Meara in the fight for playing time will be redshirt freshman Jeff Brinson (5-11, 215). Brinson has good running back skills and coaches are anxious to see what he'll do. Junior Jayme Murphy (5-11, 210) has lettered twice and played in 10 games last year.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"Shonn had a tremendously productive year; he just did a great job. To think any one player is going to pick up where Shonn left off isn't realistic. That being said, we feel good about our group of backs. Jewel got his feet wet last year. That worked out perfectly, he didn't have to play with pressure early in the season. As the season went on he was able to get comfortable. We feel confident he can play good, winning football. Paki O'Meara has done a good job and continues to improve. We feel good about him. We think Jeff Brinson has the potential to be a good player too. I anticipate all three will be involved in the equation, we feel confident with all three guys."*

#### FULLBACK

Veterans Brett Morse (6-3, 238) and Wade Leppert (6-0, 245) return after both played well a year ago. Morse, a junior, and Leppert, a sophomore, combined to start every game last year. Morse started Iowa's final six regular season games before sustaining an ankle injury. Leppert was the starter in Iowa's Outback Bowl win over South Carolina. Both players caught five passes and did a good job running after the catch. Added depth at this position could come from the 2009 recruiting class.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"Brett Morse returns and has played a lot of good football for us. Wade Leppert did a nice job as a first year player a year ago. As a group, I think overall we are in pretty good shape at running back and fullback. A big thing will be to determine how much of the load any given back can carry."*

*Brandon Wegher is a running back with good receiving skills; he has some flexibility in what he can do. We're excited about Brandon and Brad Rogers too. He is a big back. We haven't had that big running back until Shonn last year. He was the first truly big back we've had."*

#### TIGHT END

Gone is Brandon Myers, a first team all-Big Ten selection who was picked in the NFL draft. But this could still be one of the strongest and most talented positions for Iowa. Senior Tony Moeaki (6-4, 250) is an all-Big Ten candidate and is listed as the starter. He's had trouble staying on the field the last two years because of injury problems. He was off to his best season in 2007, with 14 receptions for 170 yards and three scores before a season-ending injury in the fourth game of the year. Moeaki caught 13 passes for 144 yards and a touchdown last year, while also missing time due to injuries. His career totals include 46 receptions for 566 yards and seven touchdowns.

Junior Allen Reisner (6-3, 235) is another tight end candidate with considerable experience. He played in all 13 games last year and had 11 receptions for 200 yards and a touchdown. He has 13 career catches for 231 yards. Sophomore Brad Herman (6-5, 242) played as a true freshman a year ago.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"We feel Tony Moeaki, like Andy Brodell a year ago, can come back and play at a high level in his final year. I'm hoping that is what happens for Tony. He had some real challenges the last couple of years with the injuries. If anybody deserves a year to stay healthy and enjoy the season, that would be Tony. We have no reason to believe that won't happen."*

*Allen Reisner was called into duty as a true freshman in 2007, which was tough, but he did a good job. He certainly played with more confidence last year. We think he has a chance to have a nice couple of years. Brad Herman played sparingly as a true freshman. He had a good spring. We're hoping last year will be a good investment for him too, as far as confidence and really having a sense of what he is doing out there."*

#### WIDE RECEIVER

The dependable services of Andy Brodell will be hard to replace. Brodell caught 36 passes for 533 yards and four touchdowns a year ago. He also returned 36 punts for 383 yards and a score. He had career numbers of 94 catches for 1,369 yards and nine touchdowns. The career receptions and yardage rank 19th and 21st, respectively, in school history. His speed and experience will be missed.

Veteran senior Trey Stross (6-4, 200) enters spring drills a starter at wide receiver. He caught 13 passes for 109 yards and a touchdown in 2008. He has 42 career receptions for 570 yards and five scores.

Junior Derrell Johnson-Koulianos (6-1, 200) returns as well. He was the team's leading receiver last season when he hauled in 44 passes for 639 yards and three touchdowns while starting 10 games. Johnson-Koulianos has caught 82 passes for 940 yards during his career. Junior Colin Sandeman (6-1, 200) had six receptions for 76 yards and two scores last year. He also served as Iowa's No. 2 punt returner. Sandeman's career numbers show 10 catches for 131 yards and 17 punt returns for 122 yards.

Also in the mix are junior Paul Chaney, Jr. (5-9, 167) and former quarterback Marvin McNutt (6-4, 215). McNutt, a sophomore and good all-around athlete, started the transition from quarterback to receiver last fall and made big strides during spring practice. He saw action in three games last year, catching one pass. Chaney caught two passes in five games last season before having a solid spring in both football and track. Junior Don Nordmann (6-6, 211) also played well during the spring and is on the radar screen heading into August.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"This position is somewhat similar to the offensive line right now. We're not sure how it will shake out, but we feel good about the guys we have out there. I do think we have good competition, we're excited about that. Trey Stross really had a good spring, which is critical. We feel good about what he can accomplish, if he can stay healthy."*

*Paul Chaney, Jr. had a real good year in track, both indoor and outdoor. We were excited to see that, for him, and he had a good spring with football as well. Hopefully this is the year he can contribute, and help us out."*

*Marvin McNutt really did a good job in the spring. He made the transition from quarterback in the fall, but that is tough to do during the season. There isn't a lot of time to work individually. He displayed a lot more comfort at wide receiver in the spring and is certainly on the rise right now. Derrell Johnson-Koulianos has played a lot and done a lot*

*of good things. He certainly has the potential to be a good player; we're hopeful that will materialize."*

*Colin Sandeman can play both receiver positions and is another guy with two years of experience. We're hoping all those guys can step up and play with confidence and consistency."*

*Don Nordmann also did some good things in the spring, he's a guy we've been watching. He may be ready to turn the corner a little bit; he really took advantage of his size and did some good things in the spring. He's certainly among our top six. I'm not sure the order of these guys; that will be determined in camp."*

*I do think the wide receiver and running back positions are first-year player friendly; newcomers have an opportunity to come in and get their feet wet and have some success. We'll keep an open mind at both the receiver and running back positions, in terms of seeing if any of the newcomers can make a contribution."*

#### OFFENSIVE LINE

Iowa's offensive line made solid strides during the 2008 season. It provided protection for a new and inexperienced Iowa quarterback and it provided enough running room for Iowa runners to gain 2,453 yards: a significant improvement from 2007. The improvement was good enough to help running back Shonn Greene become a consensus all-American and win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back. The Hawkeyes rushed for 30 touchdowns in 2008 after just 11 rushing scores in 2007.

Four members of the 2008 offensive line played well enough to land a spot on one of the first two all-Big Ten teams. Departed guard Seth Olsen was a first team selection. Center Rob Bruggeman and tackles Bryan Bulaga and Kyle Calloway were named to the second all-league teams. Bruggeman is gone, but Bulaga and Calloway return as on-the-field leaders of an offensive line that could become very good in 2009.

Bulaga (6-6, 312), a junior, and senior Kyle Calloway (6-7, 315) are solid all-Big Ten candidates at tackle and will lead a group of tested veterans. Calloway has started 25 consecutive games and Bulaga has a streak of 18 straight. They'll form the hub of Iowa's line. Both have played guard and tackle, but seem firmly entrenched at tackle for this year. Redshirt freshman Riley Reiff (6-6, 280) and sophomore Markus Zusevics (6-5, 278) hope to learn and gain experience behind the veteran tackles.

There's also a lot of experience at guard. Junior Julian Vandervelde (6-3, 300) is listed number one at right guard, ahead of senior Dan Doering (6-6, 300). Senior Dace Richardson (6-6, 305) is listed on the top line at left guard. He returns after missing most of the last two seasons due to knee problems. Senior Andy Kuempel (6-7, 300) and junior Kyle Haganman (6-5, 285) are listed behind Richardson. Vandervelde started the final nine games of 2008. Kuempel started two games last season before being injured and a healthy Richardson was a key contributor in his first two seasons. Sophomore Adam Gettis (6-4, 280) played well in the spring to jump into the mix.

Senior Rafael Eubanks (6-3, 280) is likely to return to the center spot he occupied as a sophomore before moving to guard last season. A three-year letterman, Eubanks has considerable starting experience at center and guard. He has started 25 games and was honorable mention all-Big Ten at the center spot in 2007. Junior Josh Koeppel (6-2, 267) saw action at center during the spring as well as the Hawkeyes try to fill the hole created by the loss of all-Big Ten center Rob Bruggeman.



## KIRK COMMENTS:

*"We lose Seth Olsen, who was nearly a four year starter, and Rob Bruggeman, who started just one year but played like a three year starter. Those two guys were really playing at a high level, so that's a major loss. And, we got great leadership from those two as well.*

*We have three guys returning, which is a positive. Julian, Kyle and Bryan were all playing well at the end of last year, so that gives us a good nucleus. We have a lot of guys who have played and are in contention. Andy Kuempel, Rafael Eubanks and Dan Doering have all played a lot of football. Among the newcomers, Riley Reiff had a good December and good spring. I would say the same about Josh Koeppl. Adam Gettis had as good a spring as anyone and Markus Zusevics made progress.*

*The best story of the spring might have been Dace Richardson coming back off injury. He appears to be on the road to recovery. I'm not sure how it will shake out, but I feel pretty good about it overall. We have good healthy competition going on; we'll see what happens in August. We may be as deep as we have been in some time, which we need to be, with five seniors in the group. We need the younger guys to keep coming along."*

## DEFENSIVE LINE

The Hawkeyes have the unenviable task of replacing what most consider the best tackle tandem to ever play for the Hawkeyes at one time. Gone are dependable standouts Mitch King and Matt Kroul. King, an all-American, was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and made both first all-Big Ten teams. Kroul, a second team all-Big Ten choice, set an Iowa record by starting a school record 50 consecutive games. King started 45 games, including 30 straight to end his Hawkeye career.

The career numbers for King and Kroul are staggering. King had 228 career tackles and 55 tackles for loss (second most among active FBS players last year). Kroul had 238 career stops with 20 tackles for loss. The loss of their talent and, more importantly, leadership will be very, very hard to replace.

Iowa coaches feel they have solid candidates waiting for the chance to be the next King or Kroul. Junior Karl Klug (6-4, 258) and sophomore Mike Daniels (6-1, 267) are listed as the top two tackles on the depth chart. Klug played in 12 games and had 17 tackles last year after missing most of the 2007 season due to injury. He was also credited with five tackles for loss and two quarterback sacks. He was named Big Ten Player of the Week following his nine tackle performance against Florida International. Daniels played in eight games last season and registered six tackles, one for a loss.

Also competing for jobs are junior Cody Hundertmark (6-4, 280), redshirt freshman Steve Bigach (6-3, 270) and senior Travis Meade (6-0, 285). Hundertmark played as a true freshman in 2007, but sat out last season with a shoulder injury. He's expected back 100% this season. Meade moved from offense to defense during the spring and made an impression. He originally joined the program as a defender.

A couple of junior all-Big Ten candidates are listed number one at defensive end. Adrian Clayborn (6-3, 282) and Christian Ballard (6-5, 285) were fulltime starters a year ago. Ballard started all 13 games last year while Clayborn was the starter in 11. Clayborn had 50 tackles, including eight for loss (-47 yards). He also had two sacks and forced one fumble. Ballard had 40 tackles that included 3.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and five quarterback hurries.

Sophomore Broderick Binns (6-2, 265) came on strong during the second half of last season and played in every game. He continued to improve, and impress, during the spring. Binns had 22 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pair of quarterback sacks. Sophomore Lebron Daniel (6-2, 250) also made strides towards a contributing role during spring practice.

Senior Chad Geary (6-3, 262) experienced an injury in the spring and is working hard to return this fall. Geary is a three-year letterman that started two games last year and one in 2007.

## KIRK COMMENTS:

*"We were encouraged with the way all the guys on the field competed. Cody Hundertmark was held out of spring practice, but he has played and we think he has a good future. Karl Klug and Mike Daniels did a good job. We expected that from Karl, and Mike has made strides. He really did a good job during the spring. Steve Bigach had a good spring; he's a young player with a good future. Travis Meade is a good story. He volunteered to move over from offense and we really think he has a chance to contribute this year. With Cody back out there we have five guys competing and we think all five will be able to carve out a role and be productive."*

*Adrian Clayborn and Christian Ballard returning at the end positions provide good experience. We have seen both of these guys play very well in the Big Ten. They are good players and good leaders and we're glad to have them back and expect them to lead the group.*

*Broderick Binns has improved as much as any player on our football team since last Nov. 1. We're really excited about where he is. Lebron Daniel really surfaced in the spring and did some good things. We have four guys there who are all capable of playing good football. We will fool around there in August to see different combinations. We didn't do it intentionally, but Adrian and Christian both jumped in at tackle a little during the spring. That was good to see. We'll definitely give some consideration to using different combinations for better match ups in certain situations.*

*We hope Chad Geary can return from knee surgery. He had worked hard to return and has played well in the past."*

## LINEBACKERS (Includes outside linebackers)

Last year, the Hawkeyes had the challenge of trying to fill the shoes of veteran linebackers Mike Humpal and Mike Klinkenborg. The answer came neatly wrapped in the form of Pat Angerer and Jeremiha Hunter. Both had stellar seasons and helped put Iowa's defense near the top (second) in Big Ten total defense.

Angerer (6-1, 235), a senior all-Big Ten candidate, started 11 of 13 games and was Iowa's leading tackler with 107. He also had 6.5 tackles for loss, five interceptions and a quarterback sack. Those are pretty good numbers for a player who thought about giving up the game two years ago because of injury problems. He was a second team all-Big Ten choice and was named Big Ten Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Wisconsin. His tackle totals ranked sixth amongst all-league defenders. Hunter (6-2, 235) is a junior who started every game last season. He was the Hawkeyes' second leading tackler with 80 stops. He had five tackles for loss and one interception.

Backup linebackers include Troy Johnson (6-2, 235) and Jeff Tarpinian (6-3, 233), both juniors. Tarpinian had 17 tackles after being slowed with injuries during the first half of the season.

Johnson had nine tackles, two for losses, last year. He has seen considerable action and has played well on special teams.

Senior all-star candidate A.J. Edds (6-4, 244) leads the list of players at outside linebacker. He could become one of the best in the Big Ten. Edds has started 25 straight games and is very dependable at his position. Last year he had 59 tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback sacks and an interception. He forced two fumbles and recovered one. Edds has 148 career tackles.

Looking for playing time behind Edds is sophomore Tyler Nielsen (6-4, 232). Tyler has seen considerable action, but not in a starting role and has also played significantly on Iowa's special teams. Nielsen had 12 tackles, while playing in all 13 games. Edds did not participate in spring practice due to injury, allowing Nielsen the opportunity to gain further experience.

## KIRK COMMENTS:

*"Pat Angerer was one of the great stories on our team last year. He was second team going into camp. He emerged and played as well as anybody on defense. It's good to have him back. Like Ricky Stanzi, we've seen him emerge as a leader. He expanded his realm of responsibility in January, we're really excited about the year ahead for him.*

*Jeremiha Hunter started at weak side linebacker last year and we have Jeff Tarpinian right behind him. Jeff had some injuries last year, we feel like that's a good situation there.*

*A.J. Edds is a two year starter at the outside spot. He does a great job and is a strong leader as well. A.J. really played well last year. That's a position, statistically, where you don't get the tackles like an inside guy, the stats don't reflect the value of the position. In our defense it's critical that we have a guy doing a good job out there. We've had good play there -- Mike Humpal, Grant Steen, and LeVar Woods -- it's a real important position in our scheme. A.J. has played at a real high level the last two years. He is a guy who is very mature; he sees the big picture and is a good team leader.*

*We think the linebacker core is pretty solid. Tyler Nielsen and Troy Johnson both had a good spring, they both got a lot of work and we feel confident with them. Troy can play a couple of spots for us.*

*We're curious to see how the competition unfolds in August; we have good competition at all positions right now.*

*Linebacker is one of our deeper positions, but we had some injuries in the spring and a number of guys were out. Troy Johnson should be OK in August, but his injury will impede him during the summer."*

## DEFENSIVE BACKS

The Iowa secondary will again feature a number of young players in 2009, but several of those players return with an added year of experience under their belts. The only departure from last year is cornerback Bradley Fletcher along with his 60 tackles and three interceptions. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten in pass efficiency defense last year while collecting 23 interceptions.

Three players who started virtually every game last season return to the backfield. All-Big Ten candidate Amari Spivey (6-0, 190), a junior, returns at cornerback after starting all 13 contests. He had 68 tackles, third best on the team, and four interceptions that were returned for 127 yards and one touchdown.



Competing for the top spot at the other corner are junior Jordan Bernstine (5-11, 205) and sophomore Shaun Prater (5-11, 175). Bernstine has logged considerable playing time in two seasons. He had 12 tackles and one interception while playing in 12 games last season. Prater collected 11 tackles and two pass break-ups while playing in all 13 games as a true freshman.

Sophomore William Lowe (5-10, 170) and redshirt freshman Greg Castillo (5-11, 180) will also be in the mix at the corner spots and both will be counted on to contribute on special teams as well.

The Hawkeyes should be strong at both safety positions. Junior Brett Greenwood (6-0, 200) has started 20 straight games and is a strong candidate for all-Big Ten honors in 2009. Greenwood had 68 tackles and two interceptions in 2008. He now has 113 career stops and four interceptions.

Sophomore Tyler Sash (6-1, 210) is the number one strong safety after earning the starting position in 11 of 13 games last season. Sash led the Big Ten with five interceptions for 147 yards and recorded 53 tackles. The return yardage is the second-most ever for a Hawkeye in one season. He earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors following an important late game interception in Iowa's upset win over third-ranked Penn State.

Backing up Sash will be sophomore David Cato (5-11, 205), who played last year as a true freshman. He registered 13 tackles and a forced fumble while playing in all 13 games. Behind Greenwood is redshirt freshman Jack Swanson (5-11, 195), a back with promise but no game experience.

Both Greenwood and Sash sat out spring practice, giving Cato and Swanson the opportunity to gain a lot of on the field experience.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"At cornerback, Amari Spivey really came on and did a great job as a first year starter. Amari was another great story last year. He was basically lost in every way his first year here; getting used to the campus, he was a long way from home. There was nothing natural about the way he played. But that year at Iowa Central probably helped him as much as any player I've seen. He came back much more comfortable, with a lot more maturity on and off the field. He really played at a high level last year; we're very excited about his future. He still has a lot of room for improvement. But he played pretty well and I'm excited to think where he might end up in the next two years, if he keeps improving.*

*Jordan Bernstine is the most experienced of the other guys. We have some younger players, Shaun Prater, Greg Castillo, and William Lowe, all three competing with Jordan. We're not sure how it will all play out, but like the offensive line, we have good competition. We've seen all the guys improve, I'm curious to see how it will materialize in August.*

*Spring practice was interesting at the safety positions, due to injuries. With both Brett and Tyler missing spring workouts, it opened the door for the young guys. David Cato and Jack Swanson got a lot of valuable work, hopefully that will prove to be invaluable for them. Taylor Herbst, Joe Conklin, Nick Nielsen, all were able to get on the field. It gave us a chance to work with younger players and get them some experience. We hope that will help our depth.*

*Norm Parker made reference to Brett's improvement last season. That first year, you are trying to play your position and don't always see the big picture quite as well. Certainly he was playing at a much higher level last year, due to his play in 2007 and taking advantage of his experience. Hopefully Tyler will be in that mode this year, seeing things in a broader scope, playing a little faster and being a little more efficient. That is one of the byproducts of gaining experience."*

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

The Hawkeyes were much improved in their special teams play last year and virtually all contributors return.

Junior punter Ryan Donahue (6-3, 180) is an all-America candidate. He was a semi-finalist for the 2008 Ray Guy Punter of the Year Award and was named to the second all-Big Ten team. He was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Minnesota. Donahue averaged 41.6 yards per punt last year and had a punt of at least 50 yards in nine of the last 11 games. In addition, 19 of his 50 punts were downed inside the 20-yard line and opponents had just 12 returns for 60 total yards. Sophomore Eric Guthrie (6-6, 240) is the backup punter, but hasn't seen game action.

Junior Daniel Murray (5-10, 185) and sophomore Trent Mossbrucker (6-0, 200) handled all the place-kicking chores last year. Murray's 31-yard field goal with a second left on the clock was the winner in Iowa's upset of third-ranked Penn State. Mossbrucker's 70 points are the most ever by an Iowa freshman.

Murray handled kickoffs and was 14-14 on PATs and 6-9 on field goals. Mossbrucker was 31-33 on PATs and made 13-15 field goal attempts. Mossbrucker made seven straight field goals during a portion of the 2008 season and led the Big Ten in field goal percentage (86.7).

The Hawkeyes ranked third in Big Ten punt returns last year. Finding a replacement for Andy Brodell will be a priority. Brodell returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown against Iowa State last year. Junior Colin Sandeman returned five last year and may have a step up on the competition after backing up Brodell for two seasons.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"We've been pretty good in not giving up big returns, and a big part of that is Ryan giving us a chance by getting the ball up in the air. Two things contribute to a good punting game; getting the ball up in the air, where your coverage can be effective, and the plus 50 punting. To really appreciate a good punter, you have to study those things, the return yards and field position. The value of that position and what it means to our defense never shows up in the stats. I can't imagine there are many punters in the country better than Ryan; we're thrilled that he has a couple more years, his future is really bright. I'm sure punting average affects the voting for recognition. But, the idea is to help your team win, and he does a great job. He really helps us out in that regard.*

*We're hoping the young guys on defense will be bolstered by their experience in the spring. Certainly an important part of our success will be getting contributions on special teams from those guys.*

*Place kicker is a competitive situation. Dan finished on top last year, but Trent's competing hard. We're not displeased with him by any stretch of the imagination. We have two*

*guys we feel very confident in, yet they both can improve. Like punting, the name of the game is consistency. We feel good about both of those guys going into the season.*

*Colin Sandeman has some experience returning punts, but we will have open competition during camp. The same can be said for kick returns. Jewel has done a good job, but we will take a look and let it be a competitive situation. Current players on the roster and newcomers, we'll give them all an opportunity to see if they can make a contribution. We certainly have room for improvement in the kick return area; we haven't had the production we'd like to get in that regard. We've been very fortunate with Ed Hinkel and Andy Brodell over the years. We have big shoes to fill.*

*You like to have the threat of the big return, but first and foremost is fielding the ball whenever possible, and doing it in a secure fashion. I'd start with that, but it's also nice to get something in return. Ed and Andy gave us good judgment and good production. That's what we are looking for, I'm just not certain who that person is right now."*

#### THE SCHEDULE

Iowa's 12-game regular season schedule includes seven home and five road games. The Hawkeyes do not have a bye week. Iowa has traditionally played one of the nation's top schedules and this year is no different. Eight of the 2009 opponents appeared in bowl games (or playoffs) last year. Three new non-conference foes are on the schedule; Northern Iowa, Arizona and Arkansas State. Iowa's other non-conference game is at intra-state rival Iowa State.

The Hawkeyes open with four of their first six games at home, including the Sept. 5 opener vs. Northern Iowa. Iowa travels to face Iowa State the next week before returning home to face former Hawkeye Mike Stoops and his Arizona Wildcats. Back on the schedule are Ohio State and Michigan following a two-year hiatus. Missing from Iowa's league schedule for the next two years are Illinois and Purdue.

The Hawkeyes open the Big Ten season at Penn State on Sept. 26th in prime time before returning home for non-conference foe Arkansas State on Oct. 3rd. The remainder of the schedule includes home games against Michigan, Indiana, Northwestern and Minnesota. League road games, in addition to Penn State, include Wisconsin, Michigan State and Ohio State. Along with the night game at Penn State, Iowa also has evening games against Michigan (home) and at Michigan State.

#### KIRK COMMENTS:

*"All 12 games will be tough. If you focus on the road segment of our schedule, it's easy to see we have some real challenges. Playing in Ames has never been easy for an Iowa team, and it won't be this year. That will be a big challenge. If you look at the four Big Ten road games, three of those teams were playing in January last year. Wisconsin has had a ton of success the last five to six years, and we're going up there. That in itself is tough.*

*Then you add two night games and that adds to the degree of difficulty on the road. With everything that is involved, sitting around all day is not easy; it helps to be at home. The atmosphere is a little more festive, you can usually count on that. When you get home in the middle of the night, or early the next morning, it can creep in and affect the next week too, if you aren't careful."*

## COACH KIRK FERENTZ

The 2002 Associated Press, Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year and two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents), is in his 11th season as Iowa's head football coach. Ferentz guided Iowa to Big Ten titles twice in the last seven years and four straight January bowl games, including three New Year's Day bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl and 2009 Outback Bowl). Iowa has posted a 59-29 (.670) overall mark and a 36-20 (.643) Big Ten record the last seven seasons. Ferentz, at Iowa, holds an overall record of 70-53 (.569) and a 43-37 (.538) mark in Big Ten games. In 13 seasons as a college head coach his career mark is 82-74 (.526). Ferentz, who boasts the second-most victories by a Hawkeye head coach, coached his 150th game as Iowa's head coach at Indiana (Oct. 11, 2008).

## HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,116 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 568-509-39 (.526). That includes a 359-198-16 (.640) record in home games, a 209-311-23 (.406) record in games away from Iowa City, a 281-343-25 (.452) mark in Big Ten games and a 242-162-15 (.595) record in Kinnick Stadium.

## GLANCE AT 2009 SCHEDULE

Iowa will play four of its first six games in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes open at home against Northern Iowa (Sept. 5). The following week, the Black and Gold play at intra-state rival Iowa State (Sept. 12). Iowa then returns home to host Arizona (Sept. 19) before opening the Big Ten schedule at Penn State (Sept. 26). This season marks the ninth time in Ferentz' 11 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes will play their conference opener on the road. After playing the league road opener, Iowa returns to Iowa City to host Arkansas State (Oct. 3) and Michigan (Oct. 10). The Hawkeyes conclude the season with road contests at Wisconsin (Oct. 17), Michigan State (Oct. 24) and Ohio State (Nov. 14), and home dates with Indiana (Oct. 31), Northwestern (Nov. 7) and Minnesota (Nov. 21). Seven of Iowa's 2009 opponents competed in bowl games at the conclusion of last season, along with Northern Iowa being involved in the Division I-AA playoffs. Of the seven bowl participants, Michigan State, Ohio State and Penn State played in January bowl events.

## IOWA UNDER THE LIGHTS

Iowa will play three games under the lights in 2009. Those include the Homecoming contest vs. Michigan (7 p.m. CT, Oct. 10) and road games at Penn State (7 p.m. CT, Sept. 26) and Michigan State (6 p.m. CT, Oct. 24). Iowa's non-conference home game against Arizona will start at 2:30 p.m. and contests at Iowa State (Sept. 12) and Wisconsin (Oct. 17) will start at 11 a.m.

## IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

Iowa's Leadership Group for the 2009 season includes three seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen and one true freshman. A member of the incoming freshman class will be named in late August. Permanent team captains are named at the conclusion of each season. The Leadership Group for this season includes seniors Pat Angerer, A.J. Edds and Tony Moeaki; juniors Bryan Bulaga, Adrian Clayborn, Brett Greenwood and Ricky Stanzi, sophomores Broderick Binns, Marvin McNutt, Tyler Nielsen and Tyler Sash, and redshirt freshmen Greg Castillo and James Vandenberg.

## HAWKEYES ON THE TUBE

All Iowa football games this season will be televised on either ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, Big Ten Network or Fox Sports Net. The last Iowa contest not televised was vs. Minnesota on Nov. 17, 2001. Iowa has appeared on television in its last 90 games.

## HAWKEYES BY THE NUMBERS

Iowa returns 48 lettermen from 2008, including 22 on offense, 22 on defense and four specialists. The 48 lettermen are four less than the 52 that returned a year ago. The Hawkeyes return six starters on offense, eight on defense and their place kicker and punter. The lettermen breakdown includes five three-year lettermen, 22 two-year lettermen and 21 one-year lettermen. The total roster has 114 players, and includes 15 seniors, 30 juniors, 25 sophomores, 23 redshirt freshmen and 21 true freshmen. The pre-season depth chart includes 10 seniors, 22 juniors, 16 sophomores and six redshirt freshmen.

## STARTERS RETURNING

Iowa returns six starters on offense, eight on defense and three specialists. The returning starters on offense include: tackles Bryan Bulaga and Kyle Calloway, guard Julian Vandervelde, receiver Derrell Johnson-Koulianos, quarterback Ricky Stanzi and fullback Brett Morse (plus part-time starters, guards Rafael Eubanks and Andy Kuempel, fullback Wade Leppert and receiver Trey Stross). The defensive starters returning include: ends Adrian Clayborn and Christian Ballard, linebackers Pat Angerer, A.J. Edds and Jeremiha Hunter and backs Brett Greenwood, Tyler Sash and Amari Spivey (plus part-time starters end Chad Reyan and linebacker Jacody Coleman). Punter Ryan Donahue and place kicker Daniel Murray also return (plus part-time starting place kicker Trent Mossbrucker).

## RETURNING WITH HONORS

Iowa returns seven players who earned all-Big Ten honors a year ago. That list includes LB Pat Angerer, OL Bryan Bulaga, OL Kyle Calloway, P Ryan Donahue and CB Amari Spivey, who were second team honorees by either the coaches or media. LB A.J. Edds and FS Brett Greenwood earned honorable mention accolades.

## STATION NAMED TO HALL OF FAME

Larry Station, the former University of Iowa linebacker who compiled nearly 500 career tackles and twice was named consensus All-American, has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. Station is the 14th former Hawkeye player or coach to earn the honor and the first since Hayden Fry in 2003. Fry was Station's coach at Iowa from 1982-85. The Hall of Fame class will be inducted at the National Football Foundation's Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 8, 2009, in New York City. The recipients will be officially enshrined at the Hall of Fame in South Bend, IN, in the summer of 2010.

## DOWN TO THE WIRE

Five of Iowa's eight 2008 Big Ten games were decided in the final minutes of play, including wins over Penn State and Purdue and losses to Northwestern, Michigan State and Illinois.

- In the 22-17 loss to Northwestern, Iowa had a first and goal at the Wildcat eight-yard line but failed to convert and Northwestern took over with 1:08 remaining.
- In the 16-13 loss at Michigan State, Iowa failed to convert a fourth and one at the MSU 21-yard line and the Spartans took over with 2:10 remaining.
- In the 27-24 loss at Illinois, Iowa tied the game at 24 with 2:46 to play before Illinois kicked the winning field goal with 24 seconds left in the game.
- In the 24-23 win over No. 3 Penn State, Iowa scored the game winning 31-yard field goal with one second remaining.
- In the 22-17 win over Purdue, the Boilermakers reached the Iowa 27-yard line in the final seconds before a pass into the end zone was incomplete as time expired.
- In non-conference play, Iowa lost by a single point (21-20) at Pittsburgh when the Panthers took the lead early in the fourth quarter.

## STANZI LEADS IOWA OFFENSE

Sophomore Ricky Stanzi emerged as Iowa's starting quarterback after four games in 2008. Stanzi completed 150-254 (.591) passes for 1,956 yards and 14 touchdowns in 2008. He ranked fourth in Big Ten passing efficiency and 40th in the country (134.8). The 1,956 yards passing ranks 19th-best in Iowa's single-season record chart. The 14 scores ties three others for the 13th-most in a single-season at Iowa.

Stanzi threw at least one touchdown pass in eight of the last nine contests. The native of Mentor, OH, completed 15-25 passes for 171 yards and a touchdown, including engineering Iowa's 15-play, 57-yard game-winning drive in the final minutes, vs. then-No. 3 Penn State. The sophomore completed 15-28 passes for a career-high 255 yards and three touchdowns in the regular season finale at Minnesota. He completed 13-19 passes for 147 yards and a touchdown in his first bowl game vs. South Carolina in the Outback Bowl.

## EXPERIENCED RECEIVERS RETURN

Five of Iowa's top eight receivers return for 2009, including its top receiver from a year ago, Derrell Johnson-Koulianos (DJK). Other wide outs returning include Trey Stross and Colin Sandeman, plus tight ends Tony Moeaki and Allen Reinsner. Johnson-Koulianos led the Black and Gold in receptions (44), receiving yards (639) and was second in kickoff returns (9-178-19.8). The native of Campbell, OH, averaged 14.5 yards per reception and had three touchdowns. DJK caught seven passes for a game and career-high 181 yards and a score at Minnesota. The 181 receiving yards are the eighth-most by an Iowa receiver in a single-game and the most since Tim Dwight had 187 yards on eight receptions vs. Iowa State on Nov. 20, 1997. He caught a game-high seven passes for 89 yards and a touchdown vs. Penn State. Moeaki battled through injuries, again, in 2008, finishing with 13 catches for 144 yards and a score, in nine contests. The native of Wheaton, IL, has accumulated 46 receptions for 566 yards and seven touchdowns during his injury-plagued collegiate career. Stross ranked fifth in team receiving a year ago, collecting 13 receptions for 109 yards and a touchdown, in 11 games. The native of Avon Lake, OH, enters his senior season with 42 career receptions for 570 yards and six scores. Juniors Reinsner and Sandeman posted 11 catches for 200 yards and a score and six receptions for 76 yards and two touchdowns, respectively, in 2008.

## SPECIALISTS RETURN

The Hawkeyes return all their kicking specialists, punter Ryan Donahue and place kickers Daniel Murray and Trent Mossbrucker. Murray and Mossbrucker shared kicking duties in 2008. Murray, a junior, handled all kickoffs and was 14-14 on PATs and 6-9 on field goal attempts. After not attempting a field goal since the Pittsburgh game (Sept. 20), he converted a 31-yard game-winning field goal with one second left to knock off then-No. 3 Penn State (Nov. 8) in a windy Kinnick Stadium. Mossbrucker, a sophomore, was 31-33 on PATs and 13-15 on field goals. His 70 points are a single-season Iowa freshman record and rank 20th overall in Iowa scoring annals. He averaged 1.08 field goals per game, which tied for 51st-best in the nation. Punter Ryan



Donahue, a finalist for the Ray Guy Award and a second team all-Big Ten performer, punted 50 times in 2008. He averaged 41.56 yards per punt, which ranked sixth in the Big Ten and 35th nationally. He averaged 42.4 yards per kick in eight conference games, which ranked fourth. Donahue, a junior, recorded at least one punt over 50 yards in nine of the last 11 contests. Additionally, 19 of his punts were downed inside the 20. Donahue broke two school punting records in 2007. The native of Evergreen Park, IL, established school records for punts in a single-season (86) and punt yardage (3,533). Furthermore, the 86 punts is a Big Ten single-season record. Donahue also earned freshman honorable mention all-American accolades by *The Sporting News*.

## TALENTED DEFENSIVE NUCLEUS RETURNS

Iowa returns eight talented defensive starters from a year ago. The list includes ends Adrian Clayborn and Christian Ballard, linebackers Pat Angerer, A.J. Edds and Jeremiha Hunter and backs Brett Greenwood, Tyler Sash and Amari Spivey. Eight of Iowa's top 11 tacklers from last season return in 2009. Angerer ranked first in team tackles (107) and tied with Sash for the team-lead in thefts (5). Hunter amassed 80 tackles to rank second. Spivey was Iowa's leading tackler in the secondary, collecting 68, 43 of which were solo. He also collected four interceptions. Greenwood also was credited with 68 tackles. Edds totaled 59 stops. Clayborn and Ballard registered 50 and 40 tackles, respectively. Sash accounted for 53 tackles and five interceptions, returning the thefts a team-best 147 yards. The 147 yards rank as the second-most interception return yards in a single-season.

## DEFENSE MAKES A STAND

Iowa's defense did not yield a touchdown the first three contests for the second straight year. The first touchdown scored against Iowa's defense was at the 6:06 mark of the first quarter in game four at Pittsburgh on Sept. 20. Iowa was the last FBS school to allow a touchdown in 2008. The Hawkeye defense did not allow a touchdown until the fourth game in 2007 (at Wisconsin). It is believed to be the first time since the 1923 and 1924 seasons that the Hawkeyes started consecutive seasons not allowing a touchdown in their first three contests. Iowa's defense allowed only seven rushing TDs, which ties for the fewest in a single-season (1981 and 1984). The Hawkeyes' 23 interceptions tie a school single-season record (23 in 1986). Nine different Hawkeyes intercepted at least one pass in 2008. Iowa ranked fourth in the country in interceptions (23), fifth in scoring defense (13.0) and pass efficiency defense (98.32), ninth in rushing defense (94.0), 12th in total defense (291.3) and 19th in red zone defense

(76%). Iowa's defense forced 67 punts, 42 three-and-outs (31.4%), blocked a field goal (Northwestern) and a punt (Wisconsin) and collected a safety (Maine).

## IOWA NOTES

- Iowa is one of 10 college football programs in the nation to compete in at least five January bowl games over the last seven seasons.
- Iowa is one of three football programs (joining Oklahoma and Texas) to have five different individual players earn national Player of the Year honors at their position since 2002. Iowa's national award winners have been: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback); 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back).
- Iowa sold out six of its seven home games in 2008. The Hawkeyes have sold out 36 of their last 37 games, dating back to the 2003 season.
- Iowa's four losses came by a combined 12 points (21-20 at Pittsburgh, 22-17 vs. Northwestern, 16-13 at Michigan State and 27-24 at Illinois) in 2008. Three of the four losses were on the road.
- After starting the season 3-3 a year ago, Iowa won six of its last seven games. The Hawkeyes were the only Big Ten team to win a bowl game.
- Iowa won all three traveling trophy games in 2008. The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State 17-5 to gain possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy, Wisconsin 38-16 to claim the Heartland Trophy and Minnesota 55-0 to keep Floyd of Rosedale.
- Iowa's +73 fourth-quarter point differential was the best in the conference. The Hawkeyes' +116 second-half point differential was second-best in the league behind Penn State (+160).

## DOMINANT AT HOME

Iowa has won 38 of its last 46 games (.826) in Kinnick Stadium, dating back to the 2002 season. The eight Hawkeye losses came to Western Michigan (28-19 in 2007), Indiana (38-20 in 2007), Michigan (23-20 in overtime in 2005), Ohio State (38-17 in 2006), Northwestern (21-7 in 2006 and 22-17 in 2008), Wisconsin (24-21 in 2006) and Iowa State (36-31 in 2002). Iowa recorded a school-record 22-game home winning streak between 2002-05. Iowa's 32-7 (.821) home record from 2003 thru 2008 ties West Virginia for 15<sup>th</sup>-best nationally and third in the Big Ten.

## HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster of 114 players includes 52 players from Iowa. The roster includes 17 players from Illinois; 13 from Ohio; four from Maryland and Florida; three from Indiana, Missouri, New Jersey and Minnesota; two from Pennsylvania, Nebraska, South Dakota, Texas and Wisconsin, one from Connecticut, Georgia, Kansas, Massachusetts, Maryland, Montana and Canada.

## MORE THAN ONE

Twelve high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. The leaders are Iowa City High (Iowa) with four, Humboldt (Iowa) and Glenville (Ohio) with three. Nine other Iowa high schools have two players on the roster.

## THE NAME GAME

Kyle and Tyler are the most popular first names. There are four Kyle's (Calloway, Haganman, Spading and Steinbrecher) and four Tyler's (Christensen, Harrell, Nielsen and Sash). There are three players named Brett (Greenwood, Morse and Van Sloten), James (Ferentz, Hurt and Vandenberg) and Joe (Conklin, Forgy and Gaglione). There are two named Adam (Gettis and Robinson), Andrew/Andy (Schulze and Kuempel), Brad (Herman and Rogers), Colin/Collin (Sandeman and Sleeper), Dan/Daniel (Doering and Murray), Jeff (Brinson and Tarpinian), John/Jonathon (Wienke and Gimm), Jordan (Bernstine and Cotton), Josh (Brown and Koeppel), Matt (Murphy and Tobin), Nick (Kuchel and Nielsen) Steve/Steven (Bigach and Staggs), Thomas/Tom (Nardo and Donatell) and Zach (Derby and Furlong).

## THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE

Junior WR Paul Chaney, Jr. is the lightest Hawkeye player at 167 pounds. Senior OL Kyle Calloway is the heaviest at 315 pounds. A total of eight Hawkeye players are listed over 300 pounds. The tallest players, at 6-7, are Calloway and OL Andy Kuempel, while the shortest players, at 5-9, are Chaney, Jr., sophomore RB Jewel Hampton and redshirt freshman RB Adam Robinson. The average Hawkeye player is 6-2 and weighs 231 pounds. That is the exact same height and two pounds lighter than the average Iowa player in 2008.

Statistics and play-by-play accounts of every Iowa football game are available live on the Internet. The statistical program allows viewers to read the play-by-play action just moments after it takes place, and to view all individual and team statistics while the game is in progress. This feature is available for all home games and most road contests during the 2009 campaign.

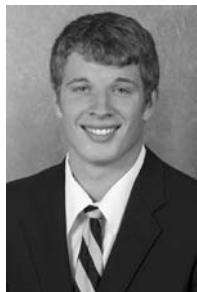
