**RADIO** - - (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak call the action, with sideline reporter Rob Brooks.

**TELEVISION** - - The game will be televised by FOX. The announcers are Gus Johnson, Joel Klatt, and Molly McGrath.

**THE RECORDS** - - Iowa is 1-0 after opening the season with a 31-14 home win over Illinois State. The Hawkeyes were 7-6 last season, earning a trip to the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. Iowa was 4-4 in Big Ten play and 3-2 in nonconference games last season.

Iowa State is 1-0, opening the season with a 31-7 home win over Northern Iowa. The Cyclones were 2-10 in 2014.

**THE SERIES** - - Iowa holds a 40-22 advantage in the series that began with a 16-8 ISU win in 1894. The Hawkeyes have won four of the last seven meetings, but the Cyclones won 20-17 last season in Kinnick Stadium and have won two of the last three. The visiting team has won the last three meetings and the last four games have been decided by six points or less.

The teams have met every year since 1977.

**IOWA CORN CY-HAWK TROPHY** - - Iowa Corn is the sponsor of the Cy-Hawk Series, including the annual football game between the two schools. Iowa and ISU have played for the Cy-Hawk Trophy from the time the series resumed in 1977, with the Hawkeyes holding a 24-14 advantage in those games.

Saturday's game is the third event in the 12th annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. Iowa and Iowa State meet in both soccer and volleyball Friday in Iowa City. ISU leads the alltime Cy-Hawk Series, 6-5.

**COACHING RECORDS** - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th year as a college head coach and his 17th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 128-106 and he is 116-85 at Iowa. He is the 12th Big Ten Conference coach to win 100 games.

Paul Rhoads is in his seventh season as a college head coach, all at Iowa State. He holds a 30-46 record.

**NEXT GAME** - - Iowa returns home to host Pittsburgh next Saturday in the first of two night games in Kinnick Stadium this season. Game time is 7 p.m. (BTN). Iowa State travels to Toledo.

Iowa Corn is the sponsor of the Cy-Hawk Series and the annual football game between the two schools.

Iowa and Iowa State played for the Cy-Hawk Trophy from the time the series resumed in 1977, with the Hawkeyes holding a 24-14 advantage in those games. That original Cy-Hawk Trophy was donated to the series by the Des Moines Athletic Club. The Cy-Hawk Trophy currently resides in Ames as a result of Iowa State's 20-17 victory in Iowa City last season.

Saturday's game is the third event in the 12th annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk series. The schools' soccer and volleyball teams meet Sept. 11 in Iowa City. Iowa State leads the all-time Cy-Hawk Series, 6-5.

The Cy-Hawk Trophy is the first of four trophy games on Iowa's slate in 2014. Iowa also has trophy games against Wisconsin (Heartland), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), and Nebraska (Heroes).

SERIES EXPERIENCE

Junior QB C.J. Beathard is making his first Cy-Hawk Series appearance. Former Iowa QB Jake Rudock took every snap at quarterback against the Cyclones in 2013 and 2014. Junior RB LeShun Daniels did not appear against the Cyclones in 2013 or 2014. The Hawkeyes combined for 104 rushes and 347 rushing yards in those games.

Ten active Hawkeyes, five on offense and five on defense, have previously started games against Iowa State. C Austin Blythe is making his fourth start against the Cyclones. RG Jordan Walsh, DE Drew Ott, and DB Desmond King are making their third starts in the series. Other Hawkeyes with starting experience in the Cy-Hawk Series include DE Nate Meier, DB Greg Mabin, FS Jordan Lomax, WR Jacob Hillyer, LG Sean Welsh, and TE George Kittle.

## THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark the 63rd meeting in the series. Iowa holds a 40-22 advantage in the series that began with a 16-8 ISU win in 1894. The Hawkeyes are 17-8 all-time in games played in Ames, having won the most recent meeting, 27-21, in 2013. The visiting team has won the last three meetings, and the last four contests have been decided by one possession. Iowa won 15 straight games in the series from 1983-1997, including eight straight in Ames during that time.

The teams did not meet between 1935 and 1976. Iowa holds a 24-14 advantage since the series resumed in 1977. Here are the results:

IOWA VS. THE BIG 12

Iowa holds an all-time record of 55-34 (.618) against current members of the Big 12 Conference, having met all but Baylor and West Virginia at least once. Iowa State is the only Big 12 opponent on the Hawkeye schedule this season.

LAST MEETING

Iowa State rallied from a 14-3 halftime deficit to edge Iowa, 20-17, in front of a sold out crowd at Kinnick Stadium on Sept. 13, 2014.

RB Mark Weisman and QB Jake Rudock accounted for Iowa's first-half touchdowns. Weisman scored from 1-yard to cap a 16-play, 55-yard drive that consumed 7:54 off the play clock in the first quarter. Rudock's 5-yard run completed a 10-play drive that saw Iowa convert two fourth-down plays.

Iowa thwarted a Cyclone scoring threat late in the second quarter when LB Quinton Alston forced an ISU fumble at the goal line. CB Greg Mabin recovered the fumble in the end zone with 1:28 left in the first half.

Iowa State quarterback Sam Richardson connected with WR EJ Bibbs in the end zone on a fourth-and-one midway through the third period to make the score 14-10. Later in the fourth quarter, the Cyclones claimed the lead on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Richardson to RB DeVondrick Nealy.

Iowa tied the game on its ensuing drive with a 44-yard field goal from Marshall Koehn. The Cyclones answered with a 51-yard drive that culminated with Cole Netten's game-winning 42-yard field goal with two seconds remaining. Netten also split the uprights from 47 yards in the first period.

Rudock finished the game 16-of-24 for 146 yards. Richardson completed 25-of-37 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns for the Cyclones.

Weisman led the Hawkeye ground attack, rushing 16 times for 49 yards, while Aaron Wimberly led Iowa State's ground game with 33 yards on 11 carries.

THE 99-YARD DRIVE

Iowa put together a 99-yard scoring drive on its second possession of the season. It was the Hawkeyes' first 99-yard touchdown drive since 2002. Iowa passed six times and rushed six times while converting five first downs on the drive. QB C.J. Beathard was 4-of-6 passing for 63 yards. He also carried once for two yards. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., carried four times for 18 yards, and RB Jordan Canzeri took his first carry of the season five yards into the endzone. Canzeri also had a 21-yard reception.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

Seven Hawkeyes made their first career start in Iowa's season opener: RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., LT Boone Myers, DT Nathan Bazata, DT Jaleel Johnson, LB Cole Fisher, LB Ben Niemann, and SS Miles Taylor.

REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Three true freshmen played in the 2015 season opener: OL James Daniels, WR Jerminic Smith, and WR Adrian Falconer. Daniels is the first true freshman to play offensive line since Bryan Bulaga in 2007. Daniels joined the Iowa program last spring and participated in spring practice.

## HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 17th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.



- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ranks ninth with 116 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 68 Big Ten wins, ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 107-64 (.626) overall mark and a 63-46 (.578) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 116-85 (.577) and a 68-60 (.531) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 128-106 (.547). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his fourth season.

### YARDS, RECEPTIONS TO FILL

Iowa opened the 2015 season without its returning leader in passing yards (Jake Rudock, 2,436), rushing yards (Mark Weisman, 812) or receptions (Kevonte Martin-Manley, 52). It is the first time since 2004 Iowa opened the season without a returning statistical leader in at least one of those categories (2003: QB Nathan Chandler, RB Fred Russell, WR Ramon Ochoa).

In the season opener a trio of juniors stepped into those statistical roles. QB C.J. Beathard passed for 211 yards in his first career start at Kinnick Stadium. RB LeShun Daniels rushed for 123 yards in his first career start, and WR Matt VandeBerg caught six passes, one for a touchdown.

### **QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 209)**

#### Career Games Played/Starts: 15-2

Junior QB C.J. Beathard improved to 2-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback following Iowa's 31-14 win over Illinois State. Beathard made his first career start at Kinnick Stadium on Sept. 5. He was 15-of-24 for 211 yards passing and one touchdown. He rushed eight times for 26 yards and two touchdowns. The eight rushing attempts were a career high. He became the fourth quarterback during the Ferentz era to record a passer rating over 150 on a season opener: Drew Tate (2006), Ricky Stanzi (2010), James Vandenberg (2001), and C.J. Beathard's 150.1 rating in 2015. Beathard has never played against Iowa State.

Beathard is 32-of-61 passing for 456 yards and two touchdowns in two career starts. He has also rushed for 55 yards and a pair of touchdowns in those starts.

#### **Beathard in 3-2-1:**

- Making his third career start (2-0), second on the road (1-0). He won 24-10 at Purdue in 2014.
- Named Iowa's starting quarterback in January 2015, just two weeks after completing 13-of-23 passes for 145 yards and a career-high two touchdowns (31, 18) at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Against Illinois State, he became the first Iowa quarterback since Brad Banks in 2002 to throw a touchdown (9) and rush for two touchdowns (6, 1).

### **OL AUSTIN BLYTHE (SR., 6-3, 290)**

#### Career Games Played/Started: 37/36

Senior C Austin Blythe is making his fourth straight start against the Cyclones. Blythe has started at center in each of the last two seasons, and was Iowa's starting right guard as a redshirt freshman in 2012.

#### **Blythe in 3-2-1:**

- 32 consecutive starts on the offensive line.
- Iowa's opening day starting center for three straight years.
- Rimington and Outland Trophy Watch Lists.

## RB LeSHUN DANIELS, JR. (JR., 6-0, 225)

Career Games Played/Starts: 13/1

Junior RB LeShun Daniels set career highs in carries (26), rushing yards (123), and longest rush (27) in his first career start against Illinois State. He was Iowa's eighth different opening day starting running back since 2007. Daniels has played in 13 career games, but none against the Cyclones.

## Daniels in 3-2-1:

- Recorded his first career 100-yard game (123) in the 2015 season opener.
- Missed the final five regular season games in 2014 due to injury and saw limited action in the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, rushing one time for seven yards.
- Scored his only career touchdown in Iowa's 2014 season opener against Northern Iowa.

## RB JORDAN CANZERI (SR., 5-9, 192)

Career Games Played/Starts: 30/2

Senior RB Jordan Canzeri had 118 all-purpose yards (28 rushing, 90 receiving) in the season opener. The 90 receiving yards were a career best and the second most by a Hawkeye running back under Kirk Ferentz (100 by Damon Bullock at Maryland in 2014), and his 51-yard reception in the second period was a career long. Canzeri ranked second on the team with 752 all-purpose yards in 2014, including 494 yards rushing, 123 yards receiving, and 135 yards in kickoff returns. He was the only player on the team with 100 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving.

## Canzeri in 3-2-1:

- Has 1,117 career rushing yards, one of 45 players in program history with 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Rushed for a team-high 120 yards on 12 carries against Tennessee in the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. Had a game-high 148 all-purpose yards in the bowl game, adding two catches for 13 yards and returning one kickoff 15 yards.
- 212 yards on 41 carries (5.2 ypc) in three postseason games (2011 Insight, 2014 Outback, 2015 TaxSlayer).

## CB DESMOND KING (JR., 5-11, 190)

Career Games Played/Starts: 27/26

Junior CB Desmond King is making his third consecutive start against Iowa State. He had five tackles in 2014, and six tackles and a breakup in 2013.

## King in 3-2-1:

- Has started 26 consecutive games since entering the starting lineup in Week 2 of his true freshman season.
- Started all 13 games in 2014, sharing the team lead with three interceptions.
- Led all Big Ten freshmen in tackles (69) in 2013.

## FS JORDAN LOMAX (SR., 5-10, 205)

Career Games Played/Starts: 34/14

Senior FS Jordan Lomax is starting at free safety against the Cyclones for the second straight year. Lomax had six tackles and forced a fumble against the Cyclones last season. He had five tackles in Iowa's season opener. He started 12 games last season and led the Hawkeyes with six pass break-ups.

## Lomax in 3-2-1:

- Moved from cornerback to safety during 2014 spring practice.
- 92 tackles in 2014 ranked third on the team.
- Saw action in 11 games as a true freshman before redshirting in 2012 with shoulder injury.

**HAWKEYE INJURY UPDATES**

- Jake Duzey -- out (knee)

**DE DREW OTT (SR., 6-4, 272)****Career Games Played/Started: 42/26**

Senior DE Drew Ott recorded two sacks for a loss of 20 yards and forced one fumble in Iowa's season opener. His two sacks last week are the first time a Hawkeye collected multiple sacks in a season-opener since Mitch King had a pair in 2007. Ott led the team and tied for third in the Big Ten with 8.0 sacks in 2014. He is making his third career start against Iowa State.

**Ott in 3-2-1:**

- Has started 26 of the last 27 games at defensive end.
- One of 11 players on Big Ten Players to Watch List.
- Picked up a deflected punt against Nebraska in 2014 and returned it 12 yards for his first career touchdown.

**WR TEVAUN SMITH (SR., 6-2, 205)****Career Games Played/Starts: 36/16**

Senior WR Tevaun Smith had three catches, two for first downs, in Iowa's season opener. Smith led Iowa with 596 yards receiving and ranked second on the team with 43 receptions in 2014. He has 961 career receiving yards.

**Smith in 3-2-1:**

- Needs 39 yards to become the 37th player in program history to accumulate 1,000 yards receiving in a career.
- Had a team-high eight plays of 30-plus yards from scrimmage in 2014, including two touchdowns (37, 31) and a 35-yard rush.
- Shared the team lead with three touchdown receptions in 2014 (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Jake Duzey).

**WR MATT VANDEBERG (JR., 6-1, 185)****Career Games Played/Starts: 24/4**

Junior WR Matt Vandenberg played 22 career games before catching his first touchdown, but has now caught a touchdown in two consecutive contests. Vandenberg hauled in an 18-yard pass from QB C.J. Beathard at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, and caught a nine-yard TD reception from Beathard in Iowa's 2015 season opener.

**Vandenberg in 3-2-1:**

- Had a career and team-high six receptions in Iowa's season opener against Illinois State.
- Has caught a touchdown in each of the last two games, dating back to 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Averaged a team-best 18.3 yards per catch on 14 receptions in 2014.

**TE JAKE DUZEY (SR., 6-4, 248)****Career Games Played/Starts: 37/13**

Senior TE Jake Duzey had 36 receptions, a single-season career high and tied for the second most by a Big Ten tight end this season.

**Duzey in 3-2-1:**

- Three touchdown receptions in 2014 tied for the team lead (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Tevaun Smith).
- Suffered a knee injury in the final week of spring practice and is currently not available for game action.
- 85-yard TD reception at Ohio State in 2013 is ninth longest scoring reception in school history.



**ROOKIE TACKLES MAKING THE GRADE**

Iowa starting tackles LT Boone Myers and RT Ike Boettger entered 2015 with one combined career start (Boettger started as a second tight end against Wisconsin in 2014). The sophomores replace a pair of NFL linemen -- 2014 Outland Trophy winner LT Brandon Scherff (Washington Redskins) and RT Andrew Donnal (St. Louis Rams).

Iowa rushed for 210 yards and did not allow a sack in the 2015 season opener against Illinois State.

Myers joined the program as a walk-on and was put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season. He saw action in four games last season. Boettger joined the team as a tight end but was moved to offensive line in 2013. He saw action in seven games as a redshirt freshman in 2014.

**FIND THE NFL-ER**

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach, the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player start on the offensive line in every season.

In each of the last eight years, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Both players were second round draft picks in 2003.

**PAULSENS ARE A FAMILIAR FACE**

Freshmen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The Paulsens are one of three sets of brothers on Iowa's 2015 roster, joining DB Kevin Ward and OL Ryan Ward, and OL James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels.

**TURN ON THE LIGHTS**

For the first time in program history Iowa plays two night games at Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes' host Pittsburgh on Saturday, Sept. 19, and Minnesota on Saturday, Nov. 14. Both games are televised live on BTN beginning at 7 p.m. (CT).

Iowa has not played a night game at Kinnick Stadium since entertaining Penn State in October, 2012. Iowa has hosted 10 evening games in Kinnick Stadium, with five of those starting after 7 p.m.

Iowa is 6-4 in night games in Kinnick Stadium. Iowa has wins over Northwestern (2011), Penn State (2010), Michigan (2009), Syracuse (2007), Arizona State (2003), and Northern Illinois (1999), and losses to Penn State (2012), Ohio State (2006), Iowa State (2002), and Miami, Florida (1992).

**GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE**

- The Hawkeyes open Big Ten play at Wisconsin on Oct. 3. This marks the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz's 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes open the conference season on the road.
- For the first time in program history Iowa plays more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Home games against Pitt (Sept. 19) and Minnesota (Nov. 14) kickoff at 7 p.m. (CT). Both games are televised on BTN.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Illinois State, 31-14, in the season opener. The Redbirds lost to North Dakota State in the 2014 FCS title game. Iowa opens the 2016 season hosting North Dakota State.
- Iowa will face Maryland on Oct. 31 in Iowa City. It marks Maryland's first football game in Iowa City. It also marks the 16th time in Iowa program history the Hawkeyes play on Halloween (6-8-1).
- The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- Iowa's Homecoming game is Oct. 10 against Illinois at 11 a.m. Iowa is 56-42-5 all-time in Homecoming contests, and has won five of its last Homecoming games. Illinois is visiting Kinnick Stadium for the first time since 2007.
- Three of Iowa's nonconference opponents are led by coaches who have been assistants in the Big Ten, including Illinois State's Brock Spack (Purdue), Pitt's Pat Narduzzi (Michigan State), and North Texas' Dan McCarney (Iowa, Wisconsin). Iowa State's Paul Rhoads was a graduate assistant under John Cooper at Ohio State.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney and North Texas quarterback Andrew McNulty are Iowa City, Iowa, natives. McNulty was North Texas' leading passer in 2014.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney is the second Iowa City native in the last three seasons to coach in Kinnick Stadium (Terry Allen, Missouri State, 2013). McCarney, a Hawkeye assistant from 1977-89, will make his seventh appearance on the opposing sideline at Kinnick. He was 3-3 as a visitor as Iowa State's head coach.
- Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2015: Iowa State (Cy-Hawk), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), Wisconsin (Heartland), and Nebraska (Heroes).

**HAWKEYES AT THE HEAD OF CLASS IN COACHING LANDSCAPE**

The University of Iowa has produced more active FBS head coaches than any other school. Bret Bielema (Arkansas), Bob Diaco (UConn), Dan McCarney (North Texas), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), and Mark Stoops (Kentucky) all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Bielema, Diaco, Bob Stoops, and Mark Stoops played for former UI head coach Hayden Fry. McCarney played on teams coached by Frank Lauterbur and Bob Commings. All five head coaches served as assistants under Fry.

Bielema played on the defensive line from 1989-92. He was team captain his senior season, played in the 1991 Rose Bowl, and served as an assistant coach on the Iowa staff from 1993-2001.

Diaco played linebacker from 1992-95 and was a graduate assistant on the staff from 1996-97. The Hawkeyes advanced to the Alamo Bowl in 1996 and the Sun Bowl in 1997.

Bob Stoops was a defensive back from 1979-82. He was named team MVP in 1982, and played in the 1982 Rose Bowl and 1982 Peach Bowl. He served on the Iowa staff from 1983-87.

Mark Stoops was a defensive back from 1987-89. He played in the 1987 Holiday Bowl and 1988 Peach Bowl, and served as a graduate assistant coach from 1989-91.

McCarney played on the offensive line from 1972-74. He was named team captain his senior season, and eventually joined Fry's staff in 1977. He was an assistant coach at Iowa from 1977-89.

**FERENTZ AMONG TOP 10**

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 116 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, the ninth most in conference history. He has 68 Big Ten wins, also the ninth most in conference history. He is 1-of-8 coaches to rank among the top 10 in both categories. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Barry Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (9).

**IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of four Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared the poll 297 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.
- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 17th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

**AMONG THE BEST IN THE BIG TEN**

Iowa has posted a 6-6 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State has won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. Following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

**57 AND COUNTING**

The Hawkeyes have played 57 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation. Iowa has converted on 172 consecutive PATs during the streak.

**HAWKEYE HISTORY**

Iowa has played 1,194 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 614-541-39 (.530). That includes a 387-213-16 (.641) record in home games, a 227-328-23 (.413) record in games away from Iowa City, a 306-366-25 (.457) mark in Big Ten games and a 270-177-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

**HOME GROWN HAWKEYES**

Iowa's roster of 115 players includes 50 players from Iowa. The roster includes 14 players from Illinois; nine from Texas; seven from Maryland; six from Missouri, five from Ohio; four from Michigan; three from Florida, Nebraska, and New Jersey; two from South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Canada; one from Alabama, Minnesota, New York, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.

**IOWA WILL RECEIVE**

Iowa received the opening kickoff in the 2015 season opener. In 17 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeye received the opening kickoff in 163-of-201 games (96-67). Iowa has started the game on defense in 38-of-201 games under Ferentz (20-18).

**IOWA AMONG TOP 25 IN WINS, 2002-15**

Iowa has posted 105 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 21st highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (149); Ohio State (143); Oklahoma (138); USC (136); LSU (134); Georgia (129); Alabama (128); TCU (127); Oregon (127); Texas (126); Florida State (125); Virginia Tech (123); Wisconsin (122); Auburn (118); Florida (118); West Virginia (115); Utah (113); Virginia (111); Nebraska (110); Miami, FL (106); Iowa (105); Texas Tech (105); Michigan (102).

**IOWA BOWL NOTES**

Iowa has appeared in 28 bowl games with a record of 14-13-1 (.518). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

Iowa has played 12 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-6).

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 13 of the last 14 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 45 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (43), Iowa (28) and Wisconsin (26).
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including





The Cy-Hawk Series is in its 12th season in 2015-16, being sponsored for the fifth time by Iowa Corn.

Iowa State leads the all-time series, 6-5, including a 15-11 win in 2014-15.

Iowa captured the inaugural Cy-Hawk Series in 2004-05 (13-8), and won again in 2006-07 (13-8), 2008-09 (21-4), 2010-11 (15-11), and 2012-13 (17-9).

Iowa State won the competition in 2005-06 (13-8), 2007-08 (18-9), 2009-10 (16-11), 2011-12 (17-11), 2013-14 (14-11), and 2014-15 (15-11).

The series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, one point is awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA.

A commemorative Cy-Hawk Series Cup, which stands 31 inches tall and weighs 19 pounds, is displayed on the winning team's campus for an entire year after a victory. Replica cups are also presented as "traveling trophies" for individual victorious teams in the head-to-head competition.

- For just the second time in league history, 10 Big Ten Conference teams competed in bowl games in 2014 (2011). Ohio State won the inaugural College Football Playoff, while Michigan State won the Cotton Bowl, another College Football Playoff bowl.

### KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week beginning Wednesday, Sept. 2. The 90-minute radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

### IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players on its 2015 Leadership Group, including 13 seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are OL Austin Blythe, RB Jordan Canzeri, DL Darian Cooper, FB Adam Cox, TE Jake Duzey, WR Jacob Hillyer, PK Marshall Koehn, DB Jordan Lomax, DE Nate Meier, DE Drew Ott, LB Travis Perry, FB Macon Plewa and WR Tevaun Smith. The junior class is represented by QB C.J. Beathard and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., and LB Josey Jewell represents the sophomore class.

### ALL IN THE FAMILY

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2015. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach. Steven is an offensive lineman who is in his fourth season as a redshirt junior. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in May 2013. Ferentz is the only FBS coach ever to coach three sons at the same school.

### MORE THAN ONE

Eleven high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois; and Solon HS in Solon, Iowa, all graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include DeMatha Catholic HS (Washington, D.C.), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Waukeet HS (Waukeet, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), Williamsburg HS (Williamsburg, Iowa), Woodbury Central HS (Moville, Iowa).

### THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE

Redshirt freshman WR Brandon Bishop and freshman WR Emmanuel Ogwo are the lightest Hawkeye players at 170 pounds. Junior DL Jaleel Johnson is the heaviest at 310 pounds. A total of seven Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more.

The tallest player at 6-8 is redshirt freshman DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is sophomore WR Jonathan Parker.

The average Hawkeye player is 6-2 and weighs 232 pounds. That is the one inch taller and two pounds heavier than the average Iowa player in 2013.



## HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 22 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 29 Hawkeyes are on active NFL rosters.

**Former Hawkeye, Current NFL Team**

**IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- There are 29 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Kirk Ferentz has produced seven first-round draft picks, tied for ninth most among active college coaches.
- Since 2011, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State matches Iowa's NFL total. Iowa has had five first round picks in the last six NFL drafts, tying Wisconsin (5) for the league lead.
- Iowa had 22 players drafted from 2010-15, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a four-time Pro-Bowler (2011-14) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, and 2014.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie (including 2015 rookie Ray Hamilton).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 13 years, 123-of-137 (90 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.



**LAST TIME OUT**

Iowa scored the game's first 31 points en route to a 31-14 season-opening victory over Illinois State at Kinnick Stadium.

In his second career start, first at home, QB C.J. Beathard accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing and one passing), while throwing for 211 yards (15-of-24). Beathard scored on runs of six and one yard, while completing a 9-yard score to WR Matt Vandenberg. Beathard became the first Hawkeye quarterback to rush for two TD's and pass for another in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes dominated the game in the trenches, rushing 44 times for 210 yards offensively, and collecting 10 tackles for loss, including five first-half sacks, defensively.

RB LeShun Daniels and RB Jordan Canzeri led the Hawkeyes offensively, combining for 241 all-purpose yards. Daniels led the Hawkeye ground attack rushing for 123 yards on 26 attempts. Canzeri had a game-best 90 yards receiving on four catches, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries.

Iowa took a 17-0 lead into halftime after PK Marshall Koehn split the uprights from 40 yards as time expired in the second quarter. The field goal followed rushing scores from Beathard (six yards) and Canzeri (five yards) earlier in the half. Canzeri's score capped off a 12-play, 99-yard drive -- Iowa's first 99-yard TD drive since its game at Miami (OH) in 2002.

The only scoring in the third quarter was Vandenberg's 9-yard reception. Beathard closed out the Hawkeye scoring with a one-yard plunge midway through the fourth quarter. Illinois State added two late touchdowns against the Hawkeyes' second unit.

The Hawkeye defense was in the Illinois State backfield applying pressure most of the afternoon. DE Drew Ott had two sacks for a combined loss of 20 yards. DE Nate Meier had two tackles for loss, including a sack, while LB Ben Niemann had 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. LB Cole Fisher led the team with eight total tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a sack and blocked Illinois State's 50-yard field goal attempt.

As a unit, the Hawkeyes held the Redbirds to 35 yards rushing on 28 attempts, including zero yards on 15 carries in the first half.

**TYLER SASH, 1988-2015**

Former University of Iowa defensive back Tyler Sash passed away on Tuesday, Sept. 8. He was 27.

"We are all very saddened to hear about the untimely loss of Tyler," said Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz. "It is always so difficult when it involves someone this young. Our heartfelt condolences and prayers go out to Tyler's family during this extremely difficult time -- and we want them to know they are not in this alone. The commitment, passion, and excitement that Tyler brought to football and to life will always endear him to Hawkeye coaches, teammates, and fans. He touched our hearts in many ways and will be missed by all of us."

The Oskaloosa, Iowa, native lettered from 2008-10 before declaring for the NFL Draft prior to his senior season. Sash was selected by the New York Giants in the sixth round of the 2011 draft and earned a Super Bowl championship in his rookie season.

Sash started the final 34 game of his Iowa career and had 37 career starts. He ranks fifth in career interceptions (13) and shares the Iowa single-game record with three thefts in a 35-3 win at Iowa State in 2009. He is Iowa's career leader with 392 interception return yards, a total that ranks fourth all-time in the Big Ten. His 203 return yards in 2009 ties for second best in the Big Ten for a single season.

Sash earned first team All-Big Ten honors in both 2009 and 2010, and was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award following each season. He earned Associated Press third team All-America honors in 2009 and was named to several freshman All-America squads in 2008.

Sash had an 86-yard interception return for a touchdown in a 2009 win over Indiana, which ranks fifth longest in school history. He set Iowa bowl records for longest return (48 yards) and interception return yards (94) in Iowa's 2009 Outback Bowl win over South Carolina. He concluded his Iowa career with 217 tackles and was twice a member of the UI Leadership Group.
