Dave Dilanni is entering his fifth season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 259-54-22 (.806) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national



championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .806 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division. In three seasons at lowa, Dilanni has 38-33-2 record.

During his four year at Iowa, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes back to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2014. Iowa went 9-8-2 overall and tied for eighth in the conference with a 4-5-2 record. It was a four place improvement and the team finished with a plus-eight goal differential.

lowa was led by its underclassmen as 24 of the team's 31 goals were scored by the sophomore class. Sophomore forward Devin Burns led the team with nine goals -- the most by a Hawkeye since 2014 -- and she finished with a team-best 23 points, which rank in the top 10 in school history. Sophomore Claire Graves posted seven shutouts, including back-to-back in victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Maryland to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors.

Sophomore Natalie Winters earned her second career Big Ten recognition, being tabbed as a third-team All-Big Ten selection. Academically, the Hawkeyes earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award for the 11th straight year, and the team had 15 Academic All-Big Ten honorees.

In his third season in Iowa City, the Hawkeyes posted an 8-11-0 record with a young team featuring eight freshmen and 12 underclassmen. Freshmen Natalie Winters started all 19 games and was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team, goalkeeper Claire Graves started every game in goal, and forward Devin Burns was third on the team in goals.

lowa opened the season with six victories in its first seven games before losing 10 of its final 12 games. Six of the losses were decided by a single goal. Academically, the Hawkeyes thrived, as 16 student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition, tying a program record.

#### HEAD COACH DAVE DIIANNI

In his second season at lowa, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 7-10-1 overall record. Senior Hannah Clark led the Big Ten in saves (105), saves per game (5.83), and tied for sixth in shutouts (six). Clark ended her career as the winningest goalkeeper in program history (36 victories) and was tops in the record books in career shutouts (26) and third in career saves (321).

Dilanni's squad earned the NSCAA Ethics and Sportsmanship Award and six student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

On the recruiting front, Dilanni's 2016 class garnered national recognition, being ranked 28th by BigSoccer.com.

In his inaugural Hawkeye season, Dilanni led the team to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, lowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition. The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. lowa's defense also was in the top-35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).

Academically, the Hawkeyes garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award for an eighth straight season and nine soccer student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. Seniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott were also received Scholar All-Region recognition.

In his final season at Grand Valley State, Dilanni guided the Lakers to their third national title in five seasons and was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year for a third time. Grand Valley scored the second-most goals in program history (88), matched a program-high with 21 shutouts en route to winning the most games in school history. The team finished 24-0-1, claiming both the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles.

The Lakers opened the season with 13-straight shutouts, which matched the second-longest streak in Division II history, and five student-athletes garnered All-America recognition at season's end.

Dilanni led the Lakers to a 22-0-4 record in 2009 en route to his first national championship before winning a second-straight title in 2010. He was honored as the CaptainU Division II Women's Soccer Coach of the Year in 2009, and he coached the Division II National Player of the Year honoree in each season (Irie Dennis, 2009; Jenna Wenglinski, 2010).

Dilanni took over the Laker program in 2003 and swiftly guided Grand Valley State to a then-school best record of 17-2-2 to earn the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. In year three, Dilanni led the Lakers to their first conference and NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, finishing 19-3 overall, and his team finished eighth in the national poll.

By year four, Dilanni led Grand Valley State to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship game, finishing 19-2-1 overall. A year later, the Lakers made a second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, posting a 17-0-0 mark in the regular season before finishing 21-1-1 overall.

Dilanni joined Grand Valley State after a seven-year run as head coach of the Jackson Lumen Christi High School women's soccer team. He also spent three years as an assistant coach at Hillsdale College, where he helped begin the men's and women's soccer programs.

Dilanni spent seven years working with the Olympic Development Program in Michigan, training and developing the highest level of soccer in the state. He coached the team to four Region 2 and four ODP national championships.

Dilanni, a USSF B-licensed coach, earned his associate's degree from Seneca College in 1993 and his bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor University in 1997. He and his wife, Kristy, have two daughters, Karissa and Kelsey.

Rade Tanaskovic (pronounced Rah-day Tah-NAS-Kov-itch) is in his second season as an assistant coach with the University of Iowa soccer program. He coaches the Hawkeyes' goalkeepers.

During his first season in Iowa City, Tanaskovic helped lead Iowa back to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time in three seasons. The Hawkeyes finished with a 9-8-2 overall record and tied for eighth in the league standings at 4-5-2.



Under Tanaskovic's tutelage, sophomore goalkeeper Claire Graves posted seven shutouts -- tied for the third-most in school history -- and she was tabbed as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 10 after posting back-to-back shutouts over No. 23 Rutgers and Maryland. The win was lowa's first over a ranked foe since 2014.

Sophomore midfielder Natalie Winters earned third-team All-Big Ten honors. Academically, Iowa earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award and 15 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Tanaskovic joined the lowa program after a two-year stint at Louisville, where he helped the Cardinals to 15 victories in two seasons. Tanaskovic coached two All-ACC selections, including goalkeeper Taylor Bucklin in 2015.

Before making the jump to Division I soccer, Tanaskovic spent two years as an assistant coach at NCAA Division II Columbus State University, where he was responsible for team's defense and goalkeepers. He also was a men's assistant coach at Emmanuel College in 2012.

In 2014, Tanaskovic helped guide Columbus State to a 21-1-1 overall record, winning the PBC regular season and tournament titles. The Cougars won their region and were an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight participant. The team finished with a 0.52 goals against average and posted 14 shutouts.

#### ASSISTANT COACH RADE TANASKOVIC

Tanaskovic has a wealth of coaching experience at a variety of levels -- professional, college, high school, and club. He began his coaching career with FC Red Star (formally known as ZFK LASK), serving as an assistant and goalkeepers coach from 2004-07.

Following his tenure with FC Red Star, Tanaskovic came to the United States, where he played four seasons at the University of North Georgia. He was a three-time All-Peach Belt Conference performer, and finished his career seventh in program history with a 0.91 goals against average.

Tanaskovic, who has served as a goalkeeper coach for the Georgia Olympic Development program, earned his NSCAA Goalkeeping Level 1 and 2 diplomas in 2012 and his US Soccer Federation C license in 2014.

He graduated from North Georgia with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education in 2011. He is married to the former Courtney Cantrell.








#### ASST. COACHES KATELYN LONGINO/DRAGO CERANIC

Katelyn Longino is in her first season as an assistant coach with the University of Iowa soccer program. She joined the Hawkeyes in 2018 following coaching stints at Valparaiso, Xavier, and Columbus State.

Longino spent the 2017 season with the Crusaders in their first season in the Missouri Valley Conference. Valpo won nine games and finished 3-4 in MVC play. She spent the 2016 season





In her final year at Columbus State, Longino served as an intern in the athletics department, working directly with women's soccer as the team won 22 matches and reached the national championship match.

Longino, who holds a USSF "D" coaching license, has held coaching positions with the Ohio Elite Soccer Association, CFC Red Star, and Columbus Youth Soccer. She graduated from Columbus State in 2016 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science and she received her master's degree in coaching education and athlete development from Xavier in 2018.

Drago Ceranic is in his first season as a volunteer assistant coach with the University of Iowa soccer program.

Ceranic has coached with the Cedar River Soccer Association since 2009 and he has been a part of lowa's Olympic Development Program since 2016. With the CRSA, Ceranic helped the team to three Iowa State Cup titles (2013 U16 boys, 2014 U15 girls, and 2014 U17 boys). He also coaches three state runner-up teams.



Ceranic also coached with with Vermont Voltage of the Premier Developmental League (PDL) from 2008-11, he was junior varsity head coach at Linn-Mar (Iowa) High School from 2010-11, and was the junior varsity head coach at Cedar Rapids (Iowa) Xavier High School in 2009.

As a player, Ceranic played collegiately at Mount Mercy (lowa) University, where he was a four-time All-Midwest Collegiate Conference selection. He was the Mustangs' Newcomer of the Year in 2006, was team MVP in 2007 and 2008, and was a three-year team captain. Ceranic also was a three-time all-academic selection and was named to the NAIA Champion of Character Team in 2009.

Ceranic played professional soccer for the Voltage from 2008-11, where he was team captain in 2010-11.

The Serbia native graduated from Mount Mercy in 2010 with a degree in multi-media design and communications. He holds his USSF "C" coaching license.
