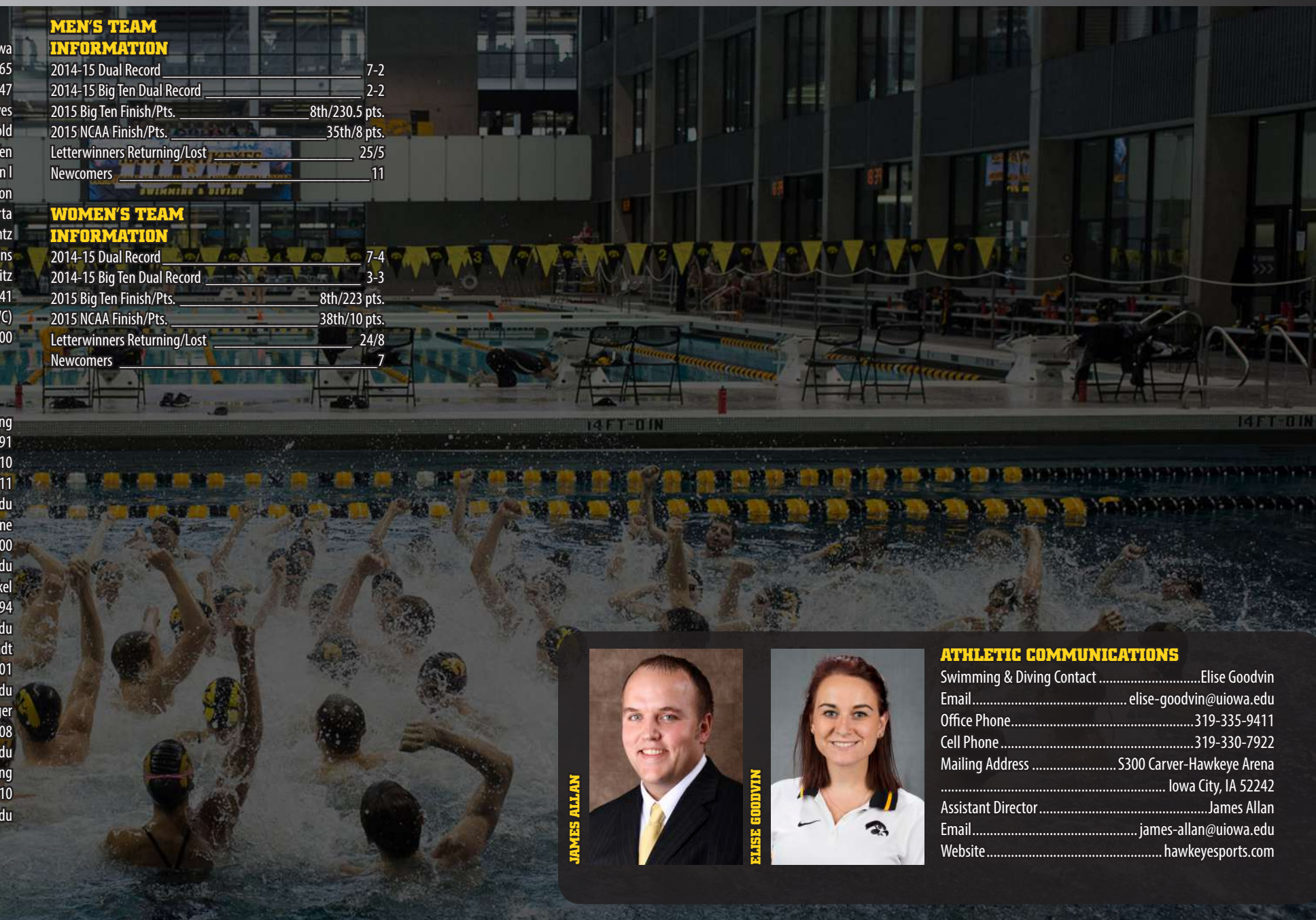

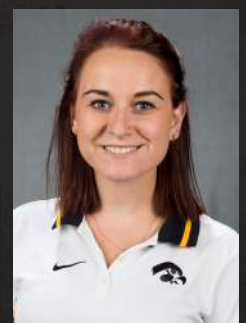

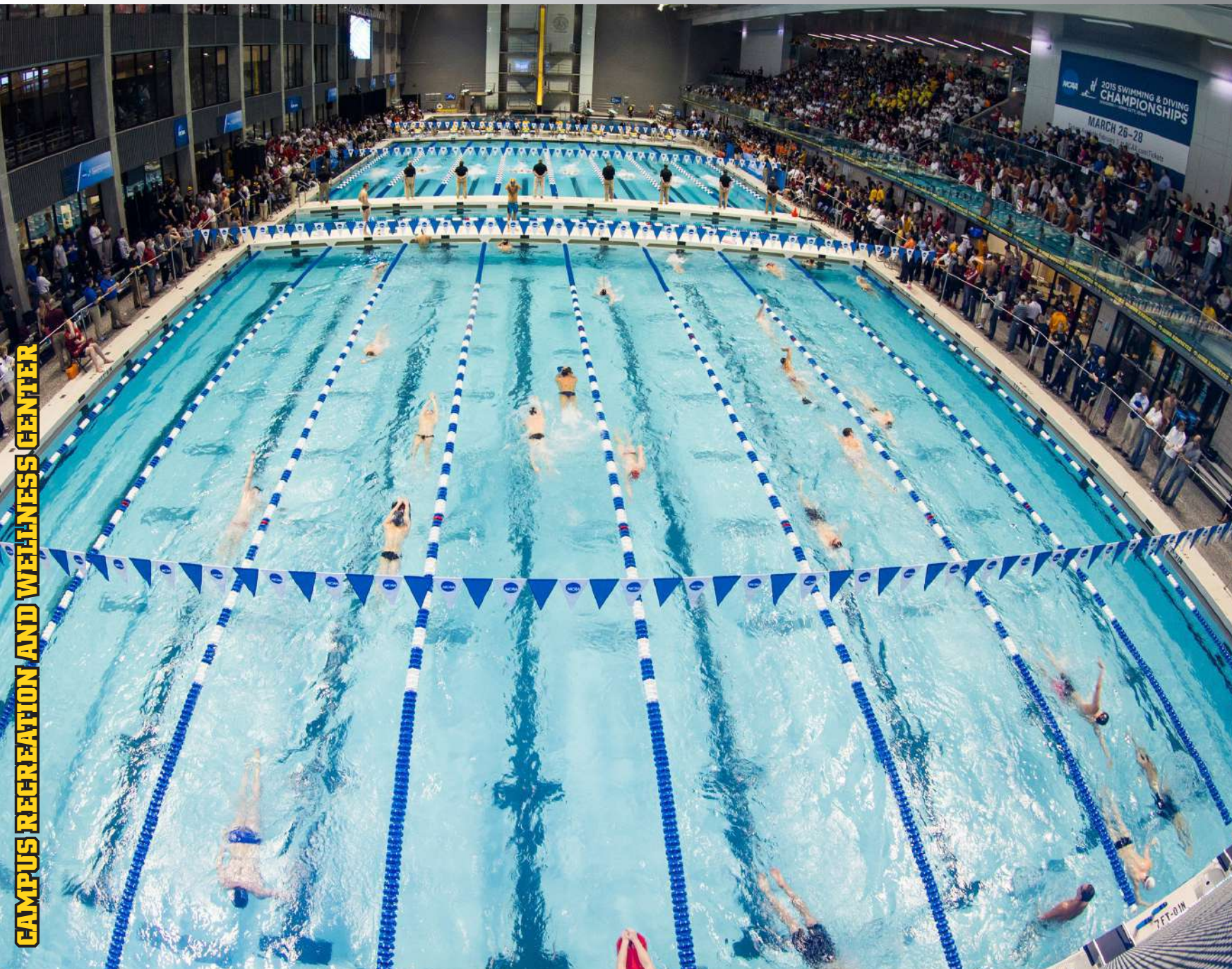

CAMPUS RECREATION AND WELLNESS CENTER



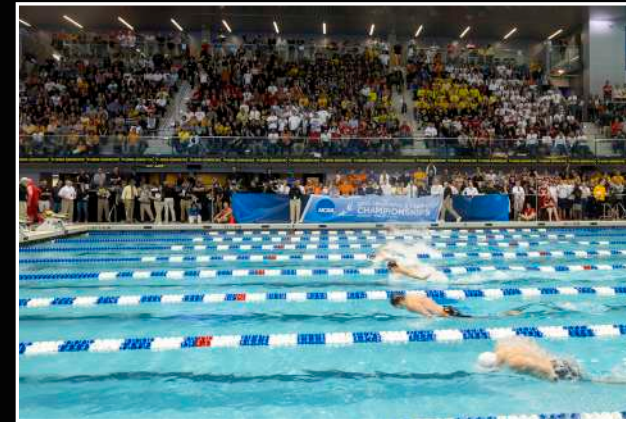
The University of Iowa Athletics Department and the University of Iowa Recreational Services partnered together to construct the new Campus Recreation and Wellness Center (CRWC). The \$69 million facility, which opened in the summer of 2010, serves as the home for the Hawkeye swimming and diving programs.

The UI swimmers have a state-of-the-art 50-meter competition pool and a separate diving well. The facility houses the team locker rooms, while boasting a swimming and diving specific training room space.

The CRWC was showcased nationally in 2015, hosting the NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships. The venue has also host three Big Ten Championships (2012 (men/women), 2015 (men), 2011 USA Diving Winter Nationals, 2011 USA Swimming Speedo Sectionals, and NCAA Zone Diving Qualifier.

The facility has 20,000 square feet of fitness space over three levels, a 52 1/2 foot climbing wall and a leisure pool among other amenities.

The CRWC is located at 309 South Madison Street, on the southwest corner of Burlington and Madison. Parking is available one block to the southeast.

THE HAWKEYE STRENGTH TRAINING PROGRAM

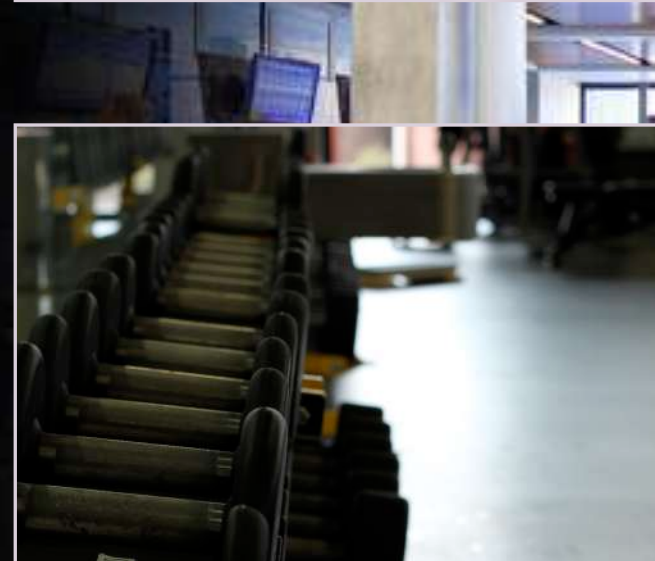
The University of Iowa strength and conditioning department is committed to providing the ultimate training experience for each Hawkeye student-athlete. Our focus is the development of the complete student-athlete through the use of proven scientific methods for reducing the risk of injury, as well as maximizing each student-athlete's athletic potential. Equally as important, our staff will foster a culture of relationship building in which we will seek to enhance the intangible character traits required for each Hawkeye to reach his or her championship potential on and off the playing stage.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING PHILOSOPHY

The philosophy of this program consists of two components. The first is to continually develop a scientifically sound program that will maximize strength, power and explosiveness in order to allow the athlete to get the utmost out of their genetic potential, and to reduce the chance of injury. This will primarily be accomplished through the use of ground based free weight exercises and the progressive incorporation of functional movements and plyometrics. The second is to establish a culture which will develop the discipline, character and mental toughness within each student-athlete and team as a whole so that they are able to make sacrifices in their training, leave their comfort zone and develop a championship ATTITUDE. This will encourage them to make the most out of every situation and opportunity given to them in athletics and academics, so that they might know what it is to be fully committed to something. When these two converge, they are not only able to reach their full potential; they become champions in and out of the pool.

SENIOR

The University of Iowa men's swimming and diving program returns 27 letterwinners and adds 11 newcomers for the 2015-16 season under 12th-year head coach Marc Long.

The Hawkeyes return their top performers in 10-of-14 swimming events, all three diving events, and four top performers in relays. Iowa has four NCAA qualifiers returning.

FREESTYLE

The Hawkeyes bring back virtually all of their top freestyle swimmers in juniors Jackson Halsmer and Kyle Gannon, senior David Ernstsson, and sophomore Chris Dawson.

Halsmer was an NCAA qualifier, swimming the freestyle leg of the school-record 200 (1:25.53) and 400-medley relays (3:08.56). The Byron, Illinois, native swam collegiate-best times in the 50 free (19.91) and 100 free (44.28) as a sophomore.

Dawson led the team in 1,000 free (9:09.81) and 1,650 free (15:12.17) and recorded collegiate-bests in 200 free (1:41.45) and 500 free (4:23.27) at Big Ten Championships. The Hawkeyes will look to Dawson to lead both mid-distance and distance events in 2015-16. The Colorado native scored in the 1,650 free at the Big Ten Championships, tallying a 10th place finish.

Ernstsson returns following an injury-plagued junior season. The 2013 NCAA qualifier was second on the team in the 100 free and third in the 200 free as a junior. He is a school record holder on the 800 free relay and ranks fifth all-time in the 200 free (1:36.04) in program history.

Gannon paced the team in the 500 free (4:22.76), recording a collegiate-best at the Big Ten Championships. The Saint Charles, Illinois, native scored in the 500 free at the Big Ten Championships, finishing 15th overall.

The Hawkeyes also added a pair of transfers for 2015-16 in junior Ike Casey and sophomore Logan Samuelson. Casey, an Iowa City native, joins the program following two years at Loras College, while Samuelson swam his freshman season at Auburn University, competing in the Southeastern Conference.

Freshman Jack Smith joins the program as a freestyle sprinter, where he will be an important addition. The Stroke-On-Trent, England, native is expected to be a key contributor in the 50, 100, and 200 free events and will provide an important boost to the freestyle relays.

BACKSTROKE

Following the graduation of school record holder Grant Betulius, the Hawkeyes will turn to seniors Andrew Parker and Matthew Boyd, sophomore Thomas Rathbun and newcomer Kenneth Mende in 2015-16.

Parker is being looked upon to step up as he enters his senior campaign with the fourth-best time in the 200 backstroke (1:44.45) and eighth-fastest time in the 100 backstroke (48.14) in the Iowa record books. Last season, he recorded NCAA "B" qualifying times in both events and posted 23 top-five finishes -- three of which were wins.

Boyd enters his final go-round with the 10th-fastest 100 back (49.14) and 200 IM (1:49.48) times in school history.

Rathbun begins his sophomore season with the eighth-best time in the 200 back (1:46.16). He swam an NCAA "B" qualifying time in the 200 back (1:46.16) and had 19 top-5 finishes, including a trio of wins in his inaugural collegiate season. Rathbun is an Olympic Trials qualifier in the 200-meter backstroke.

Mende joins the program following a redshirt season. The German is a talented backstroker with top times of 47.66 in the 100 and 1:44.07 in the 200 backstroke events.

BREASTSTROKE

The Hawkeyes have a plethora of experience returning in the breaststroke events with Roman Trussov and Mike Nelson headlining the group.

Trussov, an NCAA qualifier in two individual events as a freshman and four events as a junior, holds four school records -- 100 breast (52.85), 200 breast (1:54.57), 400-medley relay (3:08.56), and 200-medley relay (1:25.53). Trussov was part of the 200 and 400 medley relays that swam NCAA automatic qualifying times.

Nelson, an NCAA alternate as a junior, holds the fourth-fastest time in the 100 breaststroke (53.91) and sixth-best time in the 200 breast (1:59.16) in school history. Nelson posted his collegiate-best in the 200 breast (1:59.16) at the 2015 Big Ten Championships.

The Hawkeyes added a talented Iowa prep in Bettendorf's Tanner Nelson. Nelson was a three-time all-state selection and he broke the 34-year Iowa state record in the 100-breast as a junior and again as a senior.

BUTTERFLY

Iowa has a strong foundation returning in the butterfly events with sophomore Jerzy Twarowski returning in 2015-16 to go along with eight letterwinners, which includes senior Jackson Allen.

Twarowski was an NCAA Championships qualifier in two events as a freshman, finishing 18th in the 200-medley relay (1:26.19) and 19th in the 400-medley relay (3:10.03). The Poland native is Iowa's school record holder in four events, holding the top times in the 100 fly (46.70), 200 fly (1:44.00), 200-medley relay (1:25.53), and 400-medley relay (3:08.56).

Allen returns for his senior campaign, holding the fifth-fastest 100 fly time in Iowa history (47.57). He swam a NCAA "B" qualifying

time in the 100 fly (47.57) and collegiate-best times in four events -- 50 free (20.39), 100 free (44.54), 200 free (1:39.70), and 100 butterfly (47.57) -- as a junior.

The Hawkeyes will also look for contributions from senior Maverick Hovey, junior Kyle Patnode, sophomores Colter Allen and RJ Hemmingsen, and freshman Sam Sauerbrei.

IM

Iowa returns a pair of experienced swimmers to the fold in the individual medley events in senior Matthew Boyd and sophomore Chris Dawson. Newcomer Kenneth Mende will also be a factor for the Hawkeyes in the IM events.

Boyd returns after swimming a career-best in the 200-IM (1:49.48) at the Big Ten Championships -- a time that ranks 10th in school history.

Dawson burst on to the scene as a freshman, swimming the fourth-best 400-IM time (3:52.37) in the Iowa record books. The Colorado native holds the fourth-fastest 400 IM time (3:52.37) in school history. He swam NCAA "B" qualifying times in both the 500 free and 400 IM last season.



JACKSON HALSMER

DIVING

The Hawkeyes return their top divers in all three events in 2015-16, including honorable mention All-American Addison Boschult. Iowa also welcomes back junior Brandis Heffner, sophomore Matt Mauser and Evan Hull this season. The Hawkeyes added depth with Indiana transfer Andrew Hull and high school All-American Will Brenner.

Boschult is the headliner, following his breakthrough performance at the 2015 NCAA Championships. The Omaha, Nebraska, native finished 10th at the NCAA meet on the platform with a 386.50, and was the runner-up in the event at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships. Boschult led the team on the 3-meter (368.60) and platform (409.20) last season.

Heffner was Iowa's top 1-meter diver as a sophomore, posting a career-best 325.88 in the dual meet against Minnesota. The Illinois native ranks sixth in school history on the 3-meter (353.10) and is tied for eighth off the 1-meter (325.88).

Brenner was a three-time high school All-American and four-time all-state selection in Michigan.

EMMA SOUGSTAD
JUNIOR

The University of Iowa women's swimming and diving team enters the 2015-16 season following a 38th-place finish at the 2015 NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes won seven duals in 2014-15 and had a record-breaking season, taking down 11 school records.

The Hawkeyes bring back 24 letterwinners this season and add seven newcomers to the roster. Junior Emma Sougstad headlines the returnees after qualifying for the NCAA Championships in three events as a sophomore; senior Olivia Kabacinski is a school record holder in six events. Iowa returns its top performers in eight-of-14 individual events, on the platform and its top four relay swimmers.

FREESTYLE

The Hawkeyes will be experienced in the freestyle events in 2015-16 with Kabacinski headlining the returnees.

The La Porte, Indiana, native returns as the team's top sprinter. Kabacinski led the Hawkeyes in the 50 free (22.80), 100 free (49.61), and had the second-best 200 free (1:46.68) as a junior, posting NCAA "B" qualifying times in all three events. Kabacinski holds the Iowa records in the 50 (22.70) and 100 (49.61) freestyle events, while also being part of the school-record 200 (1:30.96), 400 (3:21.07), and 800 (7:12.49) freestyle relays and 200-medley relay (1:39.18).

Iowa will look to a quartet of sophomores in the sprinting corps. Meghan Lavelle and Mekenna Scheitlin set personal-bests in the 50-free at the Big Ten Championships, while Carly O'Brien and Nikol Lagodzinska ranked in the top-three in the 100 free on the Hawkeye roster.

Following the graduation of honorable mention All-American Becky Stoughton, the Hawkeyes will look to freshman Abby Schneider and senior Serena Wanasek, to step up in the distance events. Senior Jennifer Weigand and sophomore Izzie Bindseil will also impact in the mid-distance events and mile. Wanasek and Weigand posted life-time bests at the 2015 BIG Championships.

BACKSTROKE

With a year of collegiate experience under her belt, the Hawkeyes will look to sophomore Meghan Lavelle to anchor the backstrokers in 2015-16. The Hawkeyes have their top-four backstrokers returning and add a high school All-American in Natalie McGovern to the mix.

Lavelle had a solid freshman season, leading the team in the 100 (54.32) and 200 back (1:57.81), posting NCAA "B" qualifying times in both events. The Chicago native also holds school records as a member of the 200-free (1:10.96) and 400-medley relays (3:38.68). Lavelle's individual time in the 200 back is third-best in program history, while her 100 time ranks fourth.

Senior Allie Orvis returns with the second-fastest 100 and 200 back times. She had an NCAA "B" cut time of 54.43 in the 100 back. Sophomore Rowan Hauber was third on the team in both backstroke events, touching out with an NCAA "B" qualifying time of 54.94 in the 100.

McGovern joins the Hawkeyes by the way of Naperville, Illinois, where she was a Speedo Junior National and Winter National qualifier as a senior, and a two-time All-American. She was the state champion in the 100 back and 200-medley relay as a senior.

BREASTSTROKE

The Hawkeyes will be talented and experienced in the breaststroke events in 2015-16, and the depth starts with Sougstad, an NCAA Championships qualifier.

The Forest City, Iowa, native led the team in both events with school-record times. Sougstad finished 18th in the country in the 100 breast (59.96), 29th in the 200-breast (2:11.20), and 42nd in the 200 IM (1:59.12) at the NCAA Championships. Both breaststroke times were career bests. Sougstad was a stand-out performer at the 2015 Big Ten Championships, posting top-10 finishes in all eight events at the conference meet.

Sougstad is the Iowa school record holder in six events -- 100 breast, 200 breast, 200 IM, 200-free relay, 200-medley relay, 400-medley relay -- heading into her junior season.

The Hawkeyes also return seniors Colleen Champa and Olivia Kabacinski and sophomore Shea Hoyt in the breaststroke. Champa had the second-fastest 200 time (2:12.71) -- an NCAA "B" cut -- as a junior, which ranks third in school history. Hoyt had the second-best 100 time of 1:02.45 -- the sixth-best time in the Iowa record books. Kabacinski's career-best time of 1:01.36 set in 2014 is second-best in program history.

Iowa also adds a trio of freshmen in the breast in Katie Wells, Abbey Schneider, and Devin Jacobs. Schneider was an All-American in four events as a junior and senior.

BUTTERFLY

Iowa returns eight swimmers with experience in the butterfly events in 2015-16, which includes school-record holder Carly O'Brien.

The sophomore swam to the Iowa varsity record at the Big Ten Championships in the 100 fly as a freshman in 54.54 seconds. The Wisconsin native was also a member of the record-setting 200-medley relay (1:39.18).

Sophomore Tereysa Lehnertz returns after a strong summer, where she was a Pan American Games qualifier for Puerto Rico. The Iowa City native advanced to the "B" final in both the 100-meter and 200-meter

butterfly events in Toronto. As a freshman, Lehnertz had the second-best times in both the 100-butterfly (55.31) and 200-butterfly (2:00.84), while being a member of the record 400-medley relay (3:38.68). Her 200 fly is third-best in school history.

The Hawkeyes also return senior Ashley Horodyski and sophomore Summer Campbell.

IM

The Hawkeyes have their top nine 200 individual medley swimmers and two of their top 400-IMers back in 2015-16. Sougstad is the headliner after being an NCAA Championships qualifier in the 200 IM as a sophomore.

Sougstad holds the top time in the 200 IM, swimming to a mark of 1:58.74 at the 2015 Big Championships -- a school-record time. She finished 42nd at the NCAA Championships last season.

Senior Colleen Champa is the top returnee in the 400 IM. Champa also has the second-fastest 200-IM time on the Iowa roster, clocking in at 2:02.19 last season.

DIVING

In the diving well, Iowa graduated its top three divers on the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard events, but returns its top two competitors on the platform in juniors Calli Head and Lydia Lehnert.

Head is a returning NCAA Championships qualifier after finishing seventh at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships with a score of 279.80. She finished 40th overall at the preemptive NCAA meet with a score of 208.70. Head's career-best point total of 289.60 is the second-best in school history.

Lehnert is the school record holder on the platform, diving to a score of 312.20 at the 2015 Big Ten Championships. The Maryland native posted NCAA Zone standards on all three boards as a sophomore. She finished 11th on the platform at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships.

Adding to the depth in diving are senior Samantha Wagner and sophomore Morgan Rafferty. Iowa also added local product Jacintha Thomas to the roster. Thomas was an All-American and two-time all-state selection at Iowa City West High School. She won the state title on the 1-meter (561.10) as a senior.

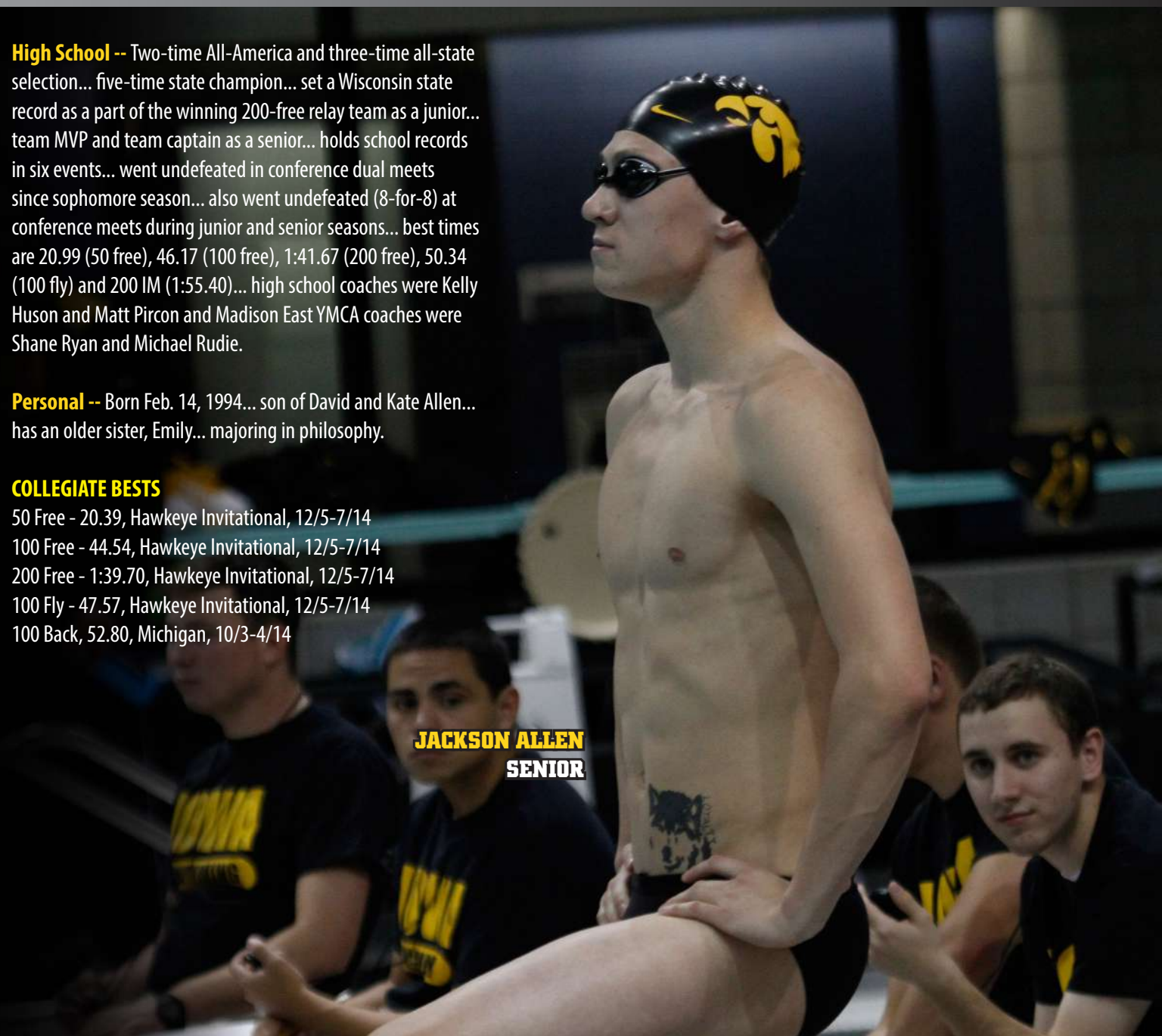

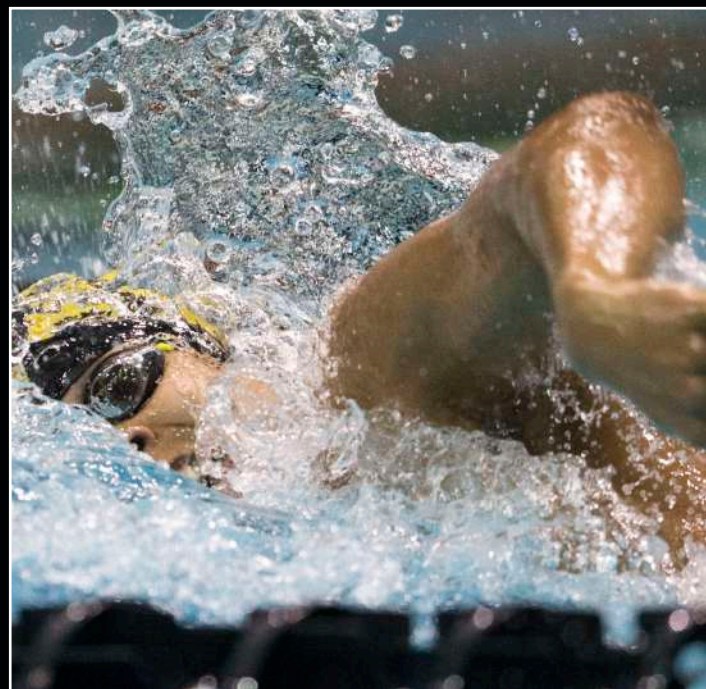

Head Coach • 12th Season
University of Iowa, 1991



Marc Long is entering his 12th season as head coach for the University of Iowa swimming and diving team and 11th leading both the men and women's programs.

During his tenure as head coach of both teams, 106 school records have fallen and 175 Hawkeyes have automatically or provisionally qualified for the NCAA Championships. Iowa has posted nine top 38 NCAA finishes (four men, five women) since 2004.

Academically, the Hawkeyes have had prolonged academic success under Long's tutelage. Iowa has crowned 17 academic All-Americans, 234 Academic All-Big Ten selections, and the team has earned academic All-America honors nine times.

Iowa enjoyed success across the board during the 2014-15 season -- a year where the UI was in the national spotlight, hosting the 2015 NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships at the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center Natatorium. It was the first championship in Iowa City since 1927.

The Hawkeyes swam to 19 school records and had 31 student-athletes post NCAA qualifying standards. The Iowa men had five NCAA qualifiers en route to a 35th place finish (eight points) at the NCAA Championships, while the women had four NCAA qualifiers -- the most since 1993 -- to place 38th nationally with 10 points.

Senior Becky Stoughton earned honorable mention All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyle events, while also becoming Iowa's first women's Big Ten champion since 2001. Junior Addison Boschult dove to honorable mention All-America honors on the platform with a 10th place overall finish.

Both teams tallied eighth-place finishes at the 2015 Big Ten Championships. The Hawkeye women finished with 223 points, while the men's squad had 230.5 points in a championship event held in Iowa City.

The Hawkeyes garnered national rankings during the course of the season with the men's squad climbing as high as No. 19 in the CSCAA rankings and SwimSwam Power rankings. The Hawkeye women were 21st in the CSCAA poll Jan. 21.

Academically, Iowa had 27 student-athletes earn Academic All-Big Ten honors with the 12 men's honorees tying the school record. The Hawkeye women earned the CSCAA Fall and Spring Scholar All-America honors for the seventh straight year and the program has received at least one team accolade dating back to 2005.

In 2013-14, Long guided the women's team to a 9-5 dual record with the nine victories being the second-highest total for the program in his tenure. The Hawkeyes went 4-3 in Big Ten duals, which led to a No. 20 ranking in the collegeswimming.com poll on Dec. 29. The team posted school records in four individual and four relays throughout the course of the season.

The UI men's squad was ranked as high as No. 21 in the CSCAA poll for three weeks and three school records went down in 2013-14. Long coached senior Dustin Rhoads to the NCAA Championships in the 100 and 200-yard backstroke events, marking the fourth-straight year the Hawkeyes have been represented at the championship.





Both the men's and women's squads posted eighth place finishes at the 2014 Big Ten Championships. The UI women finished with 199 points, while the men tallied 188 points. At season's end, 31 Hawkeyes were named Academic All-Big Ten honorees -- the 19 women's selections were a school record, while the men tied a record with 12 receiving the accolade.

In 2012-13, Long guided the Hawkeyes to a 32nd place finish at the NCAA Championships, marking the program's second-straight finish among the top-32 teams nationally. Six men's student-athletes competed at the championships, and Iowa earned honorable mention All-America honors in three events -- 200-medley relay, 400-medley relay and 100 backstroke.

Twenty-one school records went down during the course of the season and 20 Iowa student-athletes posted NCAA automatic or provisional times. The men's team finished seventh at the Big Ten Championships with 245 points, while the women's squad was 10th with 113 points.

The men's team finished the 2013 season ranked 20th in the Collegewimming.com/CSCAA Coaches Poll after posting a 7-3 dual record; the women's squad received votes in the rankings during the season and finished the year with an 8-2 record. Academically, 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

During the 2011-12 season, Long led the UI men's team to a fifth-place showing at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish since 1996. Two Iowa relays -- the 200 and 400 free relays -- won Big Ten titles, marking the program's first relay crown in 17 years. Five Hawkeyes garnered first-team All-Big Ten recognition.

The women's team finished ninth at the 2012 Big Ten Championships with 201 points. Freshman Becky Stoughton became the

first Hawkeye to be selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after finishing in the top six in three individual events.

The Iowa men's team posted a 26th place finish at the NCAA Championships, its best showing since 1995, and three Hawkeye relays earned honorable mention All-America honors. Stoughton became the first UI female swimmer to advance to the NCAA Championships since 2005 and the first freshman since 2002. She earned honorable mention All-America honors after placing ninth in the 1,650 free.

The men's team finished the season with a 7-2 dual meet record, running its four-year mark to an impressive 31-5. The team climbed to a program-best 10th in the CSCAA dual meet rankings and finished the season ranked 14th overall. The Hawkeye women posted a 10-6 record, the most dual victories since the 1985-86 season.

Twenty-four Iowa student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors during the 2011-12 season. Four women's swimmers were recognized with the Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award, and nine Hawkeyes earned Scholar All-America recognition by the CSCAA. The women's team earned Scholar All-America team honors, finishing with the third-best grade point average in the nation.

Iowa set 18 school records during the 2011-12 season (11 men, seven women) and 18 Hawkeyes posted a NCAA qualifying time. In June 2012, 14 Hawkeyes represented the program at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials in Omaha.

In 2010-11, the Hawkeye men set schools records in three individual events and all five relays, while the women's squad set a program record in one individual event and one relay. The men recorded a dual meet record of 7-1 overall and 3-1 in the Big Ten to finish the year ranked 24th in the final TYR/CSCAA rankings.

The Hawkeye men sent Paul Gordon, Jordan Huff, Duncan Partridge, and Ryan Phelan to the NCAA Championships in the 200 free relay and the quartet earned All-America honors in the 400-free relay. The team posted NCAA "B" cuts in 11 individual events and five relays. The women's team was named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the sixth-straight year, and 20 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2009-10, the Hawkeye men set school records in two individual events and three relays, while the women's squad set a program record in one individual event and established a new pool record. The Iowa men recorded their best dual record in program history with a 10-1 overall record and finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships, the highest finish in 14 years. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fifth-straight year, and 28 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2008-09, the Hawkeye women set school records in four individual events and three relays, while the men's squad set school bests in two individual events. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in seven individual events and five relays. The Iowa men posted their best dual record since 1995 with a 7-1 mark, and went undefeated (4-0) at its own Field House pool. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fourth straight year, and 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

The 2007-08 season saw four school records set at the 2008 Big Ten Championships, including two relays. Wil Whaley and Christine Kuczek eclipsed Iowa's records in the 200 backstroke and 100 freestyle, respectively, and the 200 and 400 free relays swam to school records. Whaley also placed 19th at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials.

In 2006-07, two school records were broken and nine student-athletes posted NCAA "B" cuts. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by

competing at the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast -- two events in which he set school records.

In his first season with the combined program (2005-06), four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Five-time All-American and U.S. Olympic diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breast-stroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting Iowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by Underwood and four-year NCAA qualifier and All-American Jennifer Skolaski. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Field House pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

Before focusing solely on his head-coaching duties, Long served as the UI's aquatics director for his first six years as head coach. In his dual role, Long was a part of the core committee involved in designing the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center -- one of the best facilities in the country.

As an assistant coach, Long helped Iowa to its highest placing and point total in school history (20th, 41 points) at the 2003 NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes also posted an 8-4 overall season record, which was the first winning season for the program since 1999-2000.

Long has also served as head coach of the Iowa City Eels Swim Club (ICE) and the COHO Swim Club (Deerfield, Illinois). During his tenure,

Long helped produce numerous state champions, record holders, and NCAA and USS national qualifiers.

The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native began his collegiate swimming career at the University of Northern Iowa (1986), winning the conference title and setting the 100 butterfly school record before joining the UI men's squad for his sophomore season.

As a Hawkeye swimmer (1987-89), Long was a multiple NCAA finalist, six-time All-American and three-time Big Ten champion, winning two conference titles in the 100 fly and one as part of the 400 free relay. He was voted a team captain in 1989 and helped lead the Hawkeyes to a Big Ten runner-up finish, and their highest team placing (eighth) in modern day history at the NCAA Championships. He swam on Iowa's Big Ten and NCAA record setting 200 freestyle relay in 1989.

Long was also a member of the 1987 U.S. National Champion 400-meter freestyle relay team from San Jose (Calif.) Aquatics, and participated in the 1988 U.S. Olympic Trials. Long is a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America.

Long earned his bachelor's degree in recreation education from Iowa in 1991. He and his wife, Beth, have two children, Ethan and Rhys, and a dog, Torre.

Ten school records were broken over the course of the season, eight by the men's program and two by the women's team. In the classroom, 20 Hawkeyes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors, and the women's program was named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the sixth straight season.

In 2009-10, the Iowa men posted a 10-1 dual record and finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish in 14 years. The Hawkeyes combined to set six school records, and 28 student-athletes were named Academic All-Big Ten. The Hawkeye women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fifth straight year.

In 2008-09, the Hawkeye women set school records in four individual events and three relays, while the men's squad set school bests in two individual events. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in seven individual events and five relays. The Iowa men posted their

best dual record since 1995 with a 7-1 mark, and went undefeated (4-0) at their own Field House pool. Twenty-five Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2008, Malone coached events that broke four school records at the 2008 Big Ten Championships. Wil Whaley and Christine Kuczek eclipsed Iowa's previous bests in the 200 back and 100 free, respectively, while the women's 200 and 400 free relay teams also set school records. Whaley placed 19th at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials, and Iowa posted NCAA "B" cuts in nine individual events and four relays.

Malone's second season on the Hawkeye staff saw two school records broken and nine student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Championships. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by qualifying for the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast -- the two events in which he set new school records. Agache posted Iowa's highest Big Ten finishes with third in the 100 and sixth in the 200.

In her first season with the combined program, four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Five-time All-America diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting Iowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by Underwood and four-year NCAA swimmer Jennifer Skolaski at the meet. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Field House pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

Prior to returning to Iowa, Malone served as an assistant women's swimming coach at Tulane (2003) and Fresno State (2002). At Tulane, she helped field the first Green Wave swimming team since 1989-90, recruiting a class of 15 student-athletes. The fledgling team posted a 13-3 dual record, won three Conference USA individual titles and recorded 20 top eight finishes at the conference meet. Linda McEachrane won two conference titles to earn Conference USA Freshman of the Year accolades and posted NCAA performances in the 50 and 100 free.

At Fresno State, Malone helped the Bulldogs to a 6-6 record and a fourth-place finish in the Western Athletic Conference with a team comprised of one senior and 18 freshmen.

Diving Coach • Fourth Season
Purdue, 1994



Todd Waikel is entering his fourth season as the diving coach with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program.

During the 2014-15 season, Waikel had three divers advance to the NCAA Championships and eight divers post NCAA Zone Diving Standards. Junior Addison Boschult earned honorable mention All-America honors on the platform after finishing 10th at the NCAA Championships, while Calli Head (platform) and Joelle Christy (1-meter) qualified for the NCAAs.

Two school records were broken during the season on the platform. Boschult dove to the men's record at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships with a score of 409.20, while sophomore Lydia Lehnert took down the women's record with a 312.20.

During the 2013-14 season, seven UI divers qualified for the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships. The Hawkeyes got a pair of top-five finishes and school records on the platform at the zones by Boschult and Head.

Waikel coached divers to three of the top seven scores in the 3-meter in school history throughout the course of the season. One of the divers -- Abby Grilli -- posted the fourth-best score (354.10) and was a three-time Big Ten Diver of the Week honoree.

Under Waikel's watch, Iowa diving has turned into a major player on the national diving scene as USA Diving recognized Hawkeye diving as "Center of Excellence" for 2014. Much of the attention can be attributed to former All-American Deidre Freeman, who has excelled under Waikel's coaching.

Freeman won the 3-meter synchronized diving event at the USA Diving Winter Nationals, claimed the 3-meter and 3-meter synchro events at the AT&T Diving Championships and placed 11th on the 1-meter at the FINA World Championships in Spain.

In 2014, Freeman was named to the U.S. Olympic Performance Squad, finished eighth at the FINA Diving World Series in China, and earned the bronze at the Canada Cup and 2014 Malaysia Grand Prix. She also earned a bronze at the 2015 Pan Am Games with Waikel serving as a Team Leader for Team USA.

Waikel joined the Hawkeyes after putting together an impressive collegiate and national diving resume during his seven-year stint as assistant diving coach at Indiana University. He helped the Hoosiers to five Big Ten Conference titles (four women's, one men's) and three top 10 NCAA finishes in his seven seasons. He also has coached 10 USA Diving National Teams to titles since 2006.

In his final season at Indiana, Waikel coached six Indiana divers to 11 All-America honors. Darian Schmidt and Zac Nees earned All-America status on all three boards. Schmidt won the individual Big Ten title on the platform and was the Big Ten Diver of the Championship.





In 2010-11, Waikel was key in guiding the Indiana women's squad to its third consecutive Big Ten title and Laura Ryan to her first win on the women's platform. He also coached Amy Korthauer and Amy Cozad at the World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

In 2009-10, Waikel coached Gabby Agostino to her first Big Ten title, while helping IU to the women's team title. Hoosier All-American Christina Loukas won a national title on the 3-meter springboard at the USA Diving Winter Nationals, and Amy Korthauer earned a spot on the U.S. National Team for the FINA World Cup in China.

In 2009, Waikel helped Loukas to Big Ten and NCAA titles on the 3-meter springboard, as well as NCAA Diver of the Year, Big Ten Diver of the Year, and Big Ten Diver of the Championships honors. Brittney Feldman also finished third in the 3-meter at the NCAA meet to garner All-America recognition.

In 2008, Waikel's divers captured four Big Ten titles, earning diver of the year, diver of the championship and coach of the year honors on both the men's and women's sides. Feldman captured conference titles in both the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard and went on to earn All-America honors in both events. Landon Marzullo won the same events on the men's side and was an All-American in all three diving events.

In 2007, Loukas turned in one of the most dominant performances in Big Ten diving history, becoming just the fourth diver to win all three diving events at the meet. She earned Big Ten Diver of the Year and Diver of the Championship honors for the third straight season. Loukas went on to earn first-team All-America honors after finishing as the runner-up in the 1-meter, while two other divers earned honorable mention recognition.

Loukas, a 2008 Olympian, won her first national title with a win in the 1-meter at the 2007 NCAA Championships, and she defended that title in 2008 and 2009. She was also a silver medalist in the 3-meter and a bronze in the 3-meter synchro at the World University Games. Loukas was a seven-time USA National Champion and six-time Big Ten champion under Waikel's watch. Loukas earned All-America honors on all three boards in 2006.

Waikel served as a USA Diving team leader/coach at the FINA Grand Prix in Montreal and the 2011 USA Diving Team coach at the 2011 World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

The 1994 Purdue University graduate with a degree in speech communications is a safety certified, U.S. Diving Grassroots and Dive Safe instructor. He and his wife, Marlene, are the parents of nine children: Damian, Hannah, Nathan, Dominic, Jonah, Paul, Christopher, Clare and Vincent.

Assistant Coach • Eighth Season
University of Tampa, 2001



Nathan Mundt is entering his eighth season as assistant coach and international recruiting coordinator for the University of Iowa swimming and diving team.

Iowa enjoyed success across the board during the 2014-15 season -- a year where the UI was in the national spotlight, hosting the 2015 NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships at the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center Natatorium. It was the first championship in Iowa City since 1927.

Under Mundt's guidance, the Hawkeyes swam to 19 school records and had 31 student-athletes post NCAA qualifying standards. The Iowa men had five NCAA qualifiers en route to a 35th place finish (eight points) at the NCAA Championships, while the women had four NCAA qualifiers -- the most since 1993 -- to place 38th nationally with 10 points.

Senior Becky Stoughton earned honorable mention All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyle events, while also becoming Iowa's first women's Big Ten champion since 2001. Junior Addison Boschult dove to honorable mention All-America honors on the platform with a 10th place overall finish.

Both teams tallied eighth-place finishes at the 2015 Big Ten Championships. The Hawkeye women finished with 223 points, while the men's squad had 230.5 points in a championship event held in Iowa City.

The Hawkeyes garnered national rankings during the course of the season with the men's squad climbing as high as No. 19 in the CSCAA rankings and SwimSwam Power rankings. The Hawkeye women were 21st in the CSCAA poll Jan. 21.

Academically, Iowa had 27 student-athletes earn Academic All-Big Ten honors with the 12 men's honorees tying the school record. The Hawkeye women earned the CSCAA Fall and Spring Scholar All-America honors for the seventh straight year and the program has received at least one team accolade dating back to 2005.

In 2013-14, Mundt assisted in guiding the women's team to a 9-5 dual record with the nine victories being the second-highest total for the program in the last decade. The Hawkeyes went 4-3 in Big Ten duals, which led to a No. 20 ranking in the collegeswimming.com poll on Dec. 29. The team posted school records in four individual and four relays throughout the course of the season.

The UI men's squad was ranked as high as No. 21 in the CSCAA poll for three weeks and three school records went down in 2013-14. Mundt coached senior Dustin Rhoads to the NCAA Championships in the 100 and 200-yard backstroke events, marking the fourth-straight year the Hawkeyes have been represented at the championship.

Both the men's and women's squads posted eighth place finishes at the 2014 Big Ten Championships. The UI women finished with 199 points, while the men tallied 188 points. At season's end, 31 Hawkeyes were named Academic All-Big Ten honorees -- the 19 women's selections were a school record, while the men tied a record with 12 receiving the accolade.





In 2012-13, Mundt assisted in guiding the Hawkeye men's team to a 32nd place finish at the NCAA Championships, marking the program's second-straight finish among the top-32 teams nationally. Six men's student-athletes competed at the championships, and Iowa earned honorable mention All-America honors in three events -- 200-medley relay, 400-medley relay and 100 backstroke.

Twenty-one school records went down during the course of the season and 20 Iowa student-athletes posted NCAA automatic or provisional times. The men's team finished seventh at the Big Ten Championships with 245 points, while the women's squad was 10th with 113 points.

The men's team finished the 2013 season ranked 20th in the Collegewimming.com/CSCAA Coaches Poll after posting a 7-3 dual record; the women's squad received votes in the rankings during the season and finished the year with an 8-2 record. Academically, 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

During the 2011-12 season, Mundt led the men's team to a fifth place showing at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish since 1996. Two UI relays -- the 200 and 400 free relays -- won Big Ten titles. It was the first relay crown for the program in 17 years. Five Hawkeyes garnered first team All-Big Ten recognition.

The women's team finished ninth at the 2012 Big Ten Championships with 201 points. Freshman Becky Stoughton became the first Hawkeye to be selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after finishing in the top six in three individual events.

The Iowa men's team finished 26th at the NCAA Championships, its best finish since 1995, and three Hawkeye relays earned honorable

mention All-America honors. Stoughton became the first UI female swimmer to advance to the NCAA Championships since 2005 and the first freshman since 2002. She earned honorable mention All-America honors after placing ninth in the 1,650 free.

The men's team finished the season with a 7-2 dual meet record, running its four-year mark to an impressive 31-5. The team climbed to a program best 10th in the CSCAA dual meet rankings and finished the season ranked 14th. The Hawkeye women posted a 10-6 record, the most dual victories since the 1985-86 season.

Twenty-four Iowa student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors during the 2011-12 season. Four women's swimmers were recognized with the Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award, and nine Hawkeyes earned Scholar All-America recognition by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA).

Following the 2011-12 season, 14 Hawkeyes represented the program at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials in Omaha.

In 2010-11, the Hawkeye men recorded a seventh place finish at the Big Ten Championships. The men's squad set eight school records and sent four swimmers to the NCAA Championships, all of which earned All-America honors. The women's team set two school records and was named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the sixth straight year. A total of 20 Hawkeyes were recognized as Academic All-Big Ten selections.

In his second season, Mundt helped the Hawkeyes establish six new program records. The Hawkeye men recorded a sixth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, Iowa's highest finish in 14 years. The men posted a 10-1 dual record on the year, the best dual mark in school

history. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fifth straight year, and 28 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In his first season at Iowa, the Hawkeye women set school records in four individual events and three relays, while the men's squad set school bests in two individual events. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in seven individual events and five relays. The Iowa men posted its best dual record since 1995 with a 7-1 mark, and went undefeated (4-0) at their own Field House pool. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fourth straight year, and 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Mundt joined the Iowa staff after serving as the head men's and women's swimming coach at Western Illinois University. He was named the 2006-07 Mid-Continent Conference Women's Coach of the Year. He coached swimmers to 13 school record-setting marks and six athletes to 12 Summit League individual event championships.

A native of Portage, Ind., Mundt was a four-year letterwinner and academic all-conference honoree at the University of Tampa while earning a bachelor's degree in sports management in 2001.

Mundt served as a graduate assistant coach at Valparaiso University from 2003-2005 and was named interim head coach for the 2003-04 season. Mundt also added a master's degree in sports administration while at Valparaiso.

He and his wife, Erika, have two sons, Nolan and Maclin.

Brager joined the Hawkeyes in 2012 following a two-year stint at George Mason University, where she helped lead the men's team to a pair of runner-up finishes in the Colonial Athletic Association -- its highest showing in school history. The men's and women's teams produced six CAA champions and set 11 school and eight conference records. Two of Brager's student-athletes swam to three individual event titles at the CAA Championships.

Brager tutored All-American and two-time NCAA runner-up Ashley Danner in the breaststroke. Danner became the 10th-fastest American swimmer during her senior year in the 100. Brager also coached Pan-American Games champion and two-time Olympic Trial semifinalist Amanda Kendall during the summer of 2012.

Prior to making the move to Fairfax, Virginia., Brager served as a senior assistant coach with the Badger Aquatics Swim Club from 2008-10. She coached three Olympic Trial, five Senior National, and 12 Junior National meet qualifiers.

She also has coached at the club and high school level, serving as the head swim coach at Seminole Pool and Tennis Club and Edgewood Private High School in Wisconsin.

As a collegian, Brager swam collegiately at the University of Wisconsin, where she posted perfect practice and competition attendance throughout her four year career. She received the "Most Improved Award" in 2006 and the "Hardest Worker" honor in 2007 and 2008.

King swam collegiately at Hope College in Holland, Michigan, where he was a four-year letter winner and school record holder. He was an NCAA All-American and All-Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) selection in 2009-10. He also was named to the MIAA Honor Roll of Athletes in 2009-10 and was a Dean's List honoree.

King earned his bachelor's degree in physical education with a health minor from Hope College in 2010.





DEIDRE FREEMAN

Volunteer Assistant Coach • Second Year
University of Iowa, 2011



Former University of Iowa All-American Deidre Freeman is in her second season as a volunteer assistant coach with the UI swimming and diving program. Freeman previously served as an assistant coach at Grinnell College and Grinnell High School from 2011-14.

In her first season on the Hawkeyes' coaching staff, Freeman coached three divers that advanced to the NCAA Championships and eight divers posted NCAA Zone Diving Standards. Addison Boschult earned honorable mention All-America honors on the platform after finishing 10th at the NCAA Championships, while Calli Head (platform) and Joelle Christy (1-meter) qualified for NAAs.

Two school records were broken during the season on the platform. Boschult dove to the men's record at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships with a score of 409.20, while sophomore Lydia Lehnert took down the women's record with a 312.20.

Freeman, who dove for the Hawkeyes from 2006-11, is an accomplished diver and is a major player on the national diving scene. In the summer of 2014, she was 1-of-14 women named to the 2014 AT&T Olympic Performance Squad. The group includes divers who most exhibit the skill and determination to become 2016 Olympic Team members.

The Grinnell, Iowa, native finished eighth at the FINA Diving World Series in China in 2014 and earned bronze medals at the Canada Cup and 2014 Malaysia Grand Prix. Freeman also earned a bronze at the 2015 Pan Am Games in Toronto.

Freeman was a gold medalist at the 2013 AT&T National Diving Championships and 2013 USA Diving Winter National Championships in the 3-meter synchronized competition.

She also finished as the runner-up at the AT&T Nationals in 2014 and at the World Cup Synchronized Trials.

Individually, Freeman claimed the 3-meter title and finished as runner-up on the 1-meter at the AT&T National Diving Championships in 2013. She also won the 3-meter and was second on the 1-meter at the World Championship Trials.

As a collegian, Freeman earned All-America honors on both the 1-meter and 3-meter events as a senior, and she was the Big Ten runner-up on the 3-meter and placed third on the 1-meter. She finished her career as the Iowa record holder in both events with scores of 338.55 (1-meter) and 407.40 (3-meter). Both records still stand.

Freeman, who earned academic All-Big Ten honors as a senior, graduated with a degree in Spanish and religious studies in 2011. She married Iowa swimmer Jordan Huff in the summer of 2015.

Gary Barta enters his 10th year as the director of athletics at the University of Iowa riding momentum of record-setting performances in every leg of the three-legged stool by which the Iowa Hawkeyes approach each day: Win. Graduate. Do it Right.

A big picture view of the UI's success in the "Win" category is provided by a review of the Hawkeyes' performance

in the annual Learfield Sports Directors' Cup competition. The Hawkeyes completed the 2014-15 season with 535.50 points – the most points the UI has ever accumulated in the history of the competition. That point total resulted in a 44th place finish, the third-best recorded by the UI and its best since the 2004-05 athletics year.

UI student-athletes continued to attack their work in the classroom – the "Graduate" leg of the Hawkeyes' three-legged stool – with the same intensity as they pursue their opponents in competition: Iowa established a record for its NCAA Graduation Success Rate in 2014-15 while again achieving a perfect score in the NCAA's Annual Progress Report.

The "Do it Right" column was filled with successes as well. Under Barta's leadership, the Hawkeyes continued their significant service and contribution to the greater Iowa City area community, took a leadership position in matters related to student-athlete welfare, and remained among the handful of intercollegiate athletics programs nationally that successfully operate in the black while also maintaining its status as 100 percent self-supporting.

Iowa's success in competition was highlighted by another postseason appearance by the UI football program and deep postseason runs by the UI's wrestling, women's basketball, and men's gymnastics programs. The highlights include the following:

- The Iowa football team advanced to its 12th postseason bowl game under the leadership of Kirk Ferentz. Thirteen Hawkeyes were named All-Big Ten, including Brandon Scherff, who was named the Big Ten's Offensive Lineman of the Year, became Iowa's 22nd consensus All-American, and fourth Outland Trophy winner.
- Lisa Bluder's women's basketball team advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time under its longtime head coach during a brilliant 26-win season – a mark that included an 18-0 record in games played on Mediacom Court in Carver-Hawkeye Arena – and its highest national ranking (11th) since the 1995-96 season. Iowa is one of 10 teams nationally that has appeared in the last eight NCAA Tournaments. Four Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors, seven earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition, two garnered Academic All-America honors, and senior consensus All-American Samantha Logic became the second player in program history to be drafted in the first round of the WNBA Draft (10th selection, Atlanta Dream) and was the 12th to be drafted overall.
- Tom Brands' Iowa wrestling squad finished second at this year's NCAA Tournament after sharing the Big Ten Conference tournament title and claiming another dual meet championship with a 9-0 record against conference opponents. The Hawkeyes had six wrestlers earn All-American status.
- Fran McCaffery's men's basketball team registered the program's first NCAA Tournament victory since 2001. The season also included a big road win at North Carolina during the nonconference portion of the schedule, in addition to a third-place finish in the Big Ten Conference. Three Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors, including first-team selection Aaron White, who also became the second Hawkeye in two years to be selected in the annual NBA Draft.
- Rick Heller's baseball program burst onto the national stage when it raced to its first appearance in a top 25 since 1990 – the program was 20th in the final rankings, the first appearance in the final poll in school history. The Hawkeyes won 41 games – the second-most all-time -- en route to the program's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 25 years. Six Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors, two Hawkeyes earned three All-America honors, and five players were selected in the 2015 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.
- Under first-year head coach Tyler Stith, sophomore Carson Schaake became the third Big Ten individual champion in program history and the first since 1992.

Stith guided Iowa to its seventh straight NCAA Tournament appearance where the Hawkeyes finished a single stroke shy of advancing to the national championship. Two Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors and three were named to the Division I PING All-Midwest Regional Team.

- Including Schaake of the UI's men's golf team, Iowa crowned eight Big Ten champions during the 2014-15 year: Dominic Patrick and Matt Hagan (men's tennis, indoor doubles), Babatunde Amosu (track and field, indoor, triple jump), Becky Stoughton (swimming and diving, 1,650-yard freestyle), Aaron Mallett (track and field, outdoor 110-meter hurdles), Elexis Guster (track and field, outdoor, 400-meters), and Amosu (track and field, outdoor, triple jump).

- Larissa Libby's GymHawks used a season-high score at the 2015 Big Ten Conference Women's Gymnastics Championship to help secure the program's seventh NCAA Regional berth in the last eight seasons. The team's score of 196.500 is the highest achieved by Iowa in conference championship action since 2004, and its fifth place team result is the program's best finish since 2010. A school record four gymnasts were named to the Big Ten All-Championship Team, four earned Academic All-Big Ten distinction, and senior Sydney Hoerr was named second team All-Big Ten.

- JD Reive's UI men's gymnastics squad made its second appearance in the NCAA championship in the last three seasons a grand one by upsetting fifth-ranked Illinois en route to a sixth-place national finish. The Hawkeyes were paced by junior Jack Boyle, who earned All-America honors on still rings, and season-high performances on the high bar and floor exercise. Eight Hawkeyes were named Academic All-Big Ten, and junior Doug Sullivan earned second team All-Big Ten honors.

- Joey Woody's debut season as head coach of the UI's men's and women's track and field teams resulted in four Big Ten titles and 11 All-America honors.

- Paced by a Big Ten champion and bolstered by eight record-setting performances at their conference championship meets, Marc Long's men's and women's swimming and diving teams closed their season by scoring points at their respective national championships.

- The 2014-15 year also marked the second straight season the Iowa's women's soccer team advanced to the championship game of the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes finished with 14 wins in 2014, including seven in conference play, tying the most in a single season in program history.

Iowa's "Wins" also occurred at the turnstiles, where the UI continued to lead the nation in attendance for home events of the Hawkeye wrestling program and be one of only eight programs in the country to rank in the Top 25 in attendance for football, women's basketball, and men's basketball. The UI also experienced sharp increases in spectator interest in baseball and volleyball in 2014-15.

The 2014-15 year opened with affirmation of Iowa's long-time commitment to the "Graduate" leg of Iowa's three-legged stool and the student-athlete experience at the UI: In October, the NCAA reported that Iowa's student-athletes had set a record by posting a score of 89 percent "Graduation Success Rate" or "GSR." That mark was one point better than the previous year and seven points better than the national average.

The NCAA also noted the UI had posted a federal graduation rate of 78 percent, which was also a record and in addition was 12 points better than the national average and tops among the three State of Iowa Board of Regents' institutions.

Last May, the NCAA reported that all 24 of Iowa's sports programs were comfortably above Academic Progress Rate (APR) threshold. The NCAA also singled out the UI's volleyball, soccer, women's swimming and diving, and men's golf teams for APR scores that ranked in the top 10 percent of their peer group. Of those four, volleyball, women's swimming and diving, and men's golf registered perfect scores of 1,000.

The 2014-15 college basketball season ended not only with the UI being one of a handful of institutions nationally which had both of its program participate in their national championship, but also with the UI being the only school in the country with multiple academic All-Americans: Samantha Logic and Ally Disterhoft in women's basketball and Mike Gesell in men's basketball. The Hawkeyes also boasted an academic

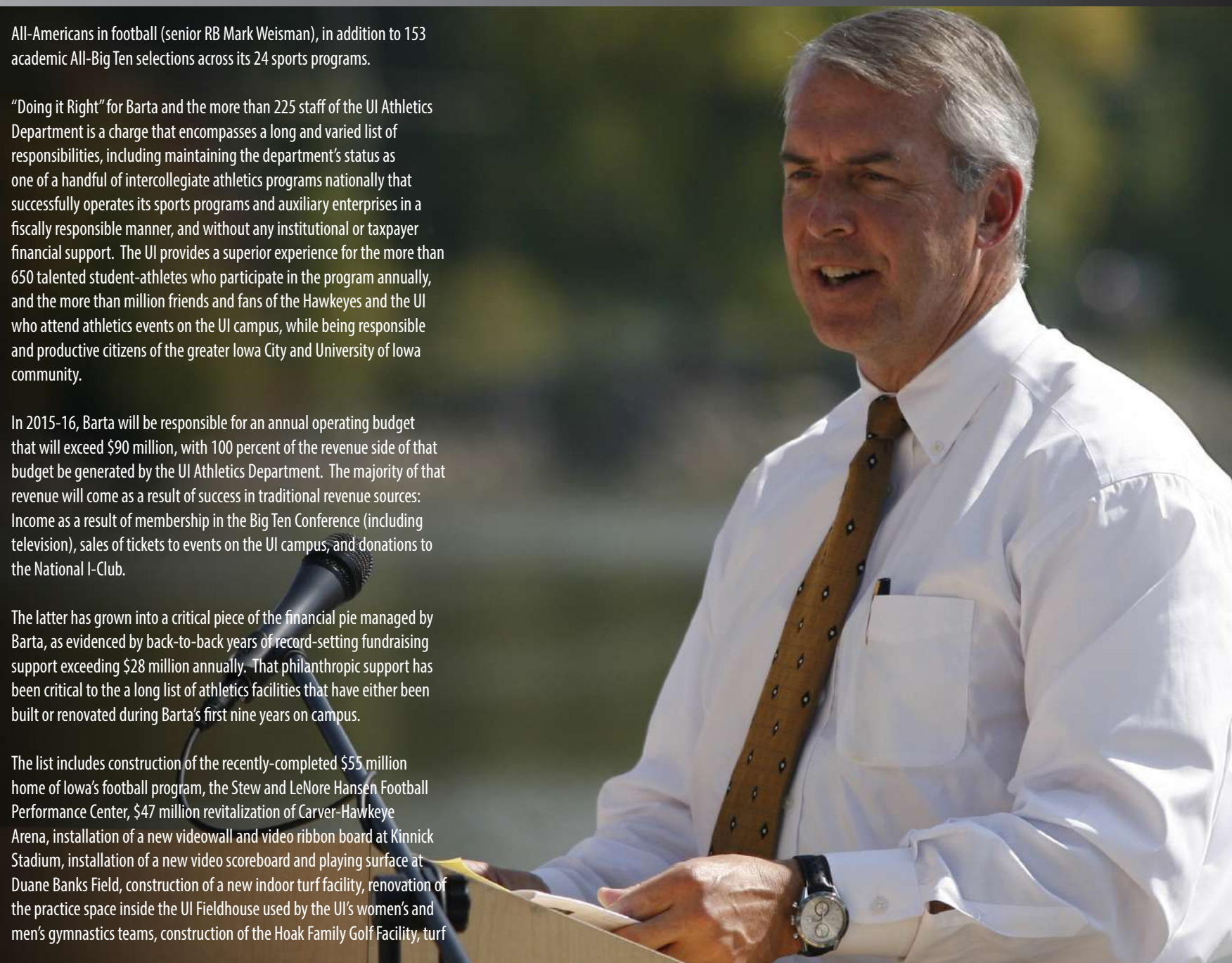
All-Americans in football (senior RB Mark Weisman), in addition to 153 academic All-Big Ten selections across its 24 sports programs.

"Doing it Right" for Barta and the more than 225 staff of the UI Athletics Department is a charge that encompasses a long and varied list of responsibilities, including maintaining the department's status as one of a handful of intercollegiate athletics programs nationally that successfully operates its sports programs and auxiliary enterprises in a fiscally responsible manner, and without any institutional or taxpayer financial support. The UI provides a superior experience for the more than 650 talented student-athletes who participate in the program annually, and the more than million friends and fans of the Hawkeyes and the UI who attend athletics events on the UI campus, while being responsible and productive citizens of the greater Iowa City and University of Iowa community.

In 2015-16, Barta will be responsible for an annual operating budget that will exceed \$90 million, with 100 percent of the revenue side of that budget be generated by the UI Athletics Department. The majority of that revenue will come as a result of success in traditional revenue sources: Income as a result of membership in the Big Ten Conference (including television), sales of tickets to events on the UI campus, and donations to the National I-Club.

The latter has grown into a critical piece of the financial pie managed by Barta, as evidenced by back-to-back years of record-setting fundraising support exceeding \$28 million annually. That philanthropic support has been critical to the a long list of athletics facilities that have either been built or renovated during Barta's first nine years on campus.

The list includes construction of the recently-completed \$55 million home of Iowa's football program, the Stew and LeNore Hansen Football Performance Center, \$47 million revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena, installation of a new videowall and video ribbon board at Kinnick Stadium, installation of a new video scoreboard and playing surface at Duane Banks Field, construction of a new indoor turf facility, renovation of the practice space inside the UI Fieldhouse used by the UI's women's and men's gymnastics teams, construction of the Hoak Family Golf Facility, turf





replacement at Grant Field, the home of Iowa's nationally ranked field hockey program, and resurfacing of the Klotz Tennis Center, to name a few.

Iowa's contributions to the greater Iowa City community go far beyond the multi-million dollars of economic impact generated as a result of the staging of hundreds of regular season, postseason and special events annually. Barta and UI student-athletes, coaches, and staff are also active citizens, logging thousands of hours of community service and also spearheading efforts to support a wide variety of causes ranging from construction of the UI's new Children's Hospital to the UI's extremely successful Dance Marathon to Coaches vs. Cancer.

Iowa's annual "Day of Caring" serves as the foundation upon which all these outreach activities rest. Now in its 20th year of existence, the Day of Caring happens each April and typically involves representatives of most, if not all, of Iowa's sports programs who provide a wide variety of assistance to an equally wide variety of not-for-profit organizations that service the greater Iowa City community.

"Doing it Right" also encompasses efforts aimed at improving the student-athlete experience. The UI Athletics Department invested more than \$1.7 million directly into food cost for its student-athletes in 2014-15 in response to NCAA legislation aimed at providing a higher quality student-athlete experience. In 2015-16, that commitment will continue and will be complemented by increases to the value of the scholarships awarded the UI's student-athletes as part of the NCAA's effort to fully address cost of attendance.

Providing the resources for the UI's student-athletes and coaches to be successful is a priority for Barta and his senior management team. That process includes state-of-the-art facilities, which is why Barta enters the 2015-16 year working closely with institutional leadership on the finalization of a comprehensive master plan for the facilities available to the Hawkeyes.

The plan will include a comprehensive review of the north grandstand of historic Kinnick Stadium; study of the feasibility of a student-athlete dormitory and dining facility of the west side of the UI campus; a

comprehensive review of Carver-Hawkeye Arena including, specifically, the scoreboards and videowalls, the creation of a main entrance and "Wall of Honor" and other enhancements to the fan experience; Phase III of the revitalization of Duane Banks Field; a comprehensive review of Finkbine Golf Course and, specifically, the clubhouse; a comprehensive review of the Gerdin Athletics Learning Center; and, development of the "Hawkeye Campus" on the western edge of the UI campus, a project that could include new or renovated facilities for indoor and outdoor track and field, softball, volleyball, gymnastics, soccer, field hockey, and tennis.

Barta's involvement in the UI campus and the greater Iowa City communities extends beyond his position as director of the UI's intercollegiate athletics programs. He is a member of the President's Cabinet, comprised of vice presidents and other campus leaders that provide counsel to the UI's president. That group was instrumental in the UI's response to record-setting flooding that besieged the campus and the Iowa City and Coralville community in June 2008 and will be directly involved in positioning the UI for growth in the immediate and long-term future as the institution responds to the expectations of the residents of the state, members of the state legislature, and the State of Iowa Board of Regents.

Barta also represents the UI and the Hawkeyes at the conference and national level as a member of the Rose Bowl Management Committee and the College Football Playoff Advisory Committee. During his tenure at the UI, he has participated in the creation and implementation of the Big Ten Network, the expansion of the Big Ten Conference and realignment of athletics conferences nationally, and the Big Ten's postseason bowl game agreements that were successfully implemented in 2010.

Barta remains active on the conference and NCAA level. He is involved in committee work with NCAA Football, the Division IA Athletic Directors Association, and is an ongoing participant in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

Barta is also involved in a variety of community groups, including the United Way of Johnson and Washington Counties and the Partnership for

Alcohol Safety, a joint effort between UI campus leaders and the city of Iowa City.

Barta often suggests to his staff that "Hope is not a strategy," which is why the department has completed a comprehensive review and rewriting of the strategic plan for the UI Athletics Department and continues to work with the UI's leadership on a long-term financial plan. As the director of athletics at the University of Wyoming for three years, seven different Wyoming coaches were named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He also spearheaded a fund-raising effort that netted the Cowboy athletics program \$11 million in private support and \$11 million in matching state funds.

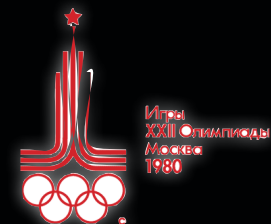
As the senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington, he directed the "Campaign for the Student-Athlete," was a participant in the design, construction and/or renovation of several Washington athletics facilities, including Bank of America Arena and the Dempsey Indoor Practice Facility. In addition to almost doubling the amount of annual private support received by Washington, Barta also managed the department's external relations division, a task that included corporate sponsorship and radio contracts.

His responsibilities at Washington expanded over time to include hiring of coaching and administrative staff, and the day-to-day oversight of several Huskie sport teams.

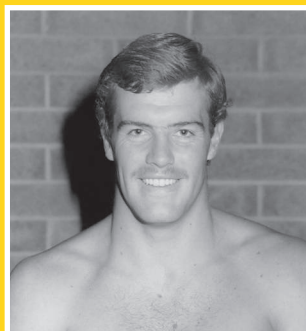
The roots of his development experience extend to his first two positions: director of development at his alma mater, North Dakota State University, and director of athletics development and external relations at the University of Northern Iowa.

Barta earned a bachelor of science degree in mass communication and broadcast journalism from North Dakota State in 1987. He was an option quarterback for Bison football squads that won the Division II NCAA National Championship in 1983, 1985, and 1986.

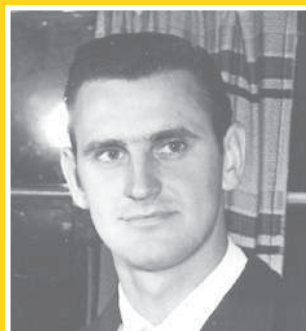
Barta, and his wife, Connie, have a son, Luke (17) and a daughter, Madison (15). He was born Sept. 4, 1963, in Minneapolis.

IOWA CONTINUES TO BUILD FOR SUCCESS

The UI Department of Athletics is under the direction of Gary Barta and is regarded as one of the top intercollegiate programs in the nation. Once again, the Hawkeyes enjoyed success both athletically and academically in 2014-15

Academically, the UI's federal graduation rate of 78 percent (for student-athletes who enrolled in the fall of 2007), meaning UI student-athletes have graduated at a rate of 70 percent or better in five of the last six years. That mark was eight points better than the UI student body and 12 points better than achieved by student-athletes nationally. For the sixth consecutive year, all 24 of Iowa's teams exceeded the Academic Progress Rate (APR) benchmark and the program posted a record 89 percent in the NCAA's "Graduation Success Rate." That mark was one point better than last year's record-setting mark of 88 percent. It is the 10th time in 11 years of the GSR's existence that Iowa's student-athletes scored 80 percent or better.

Seven UI teams scored a perfect 100 on their GSR: Men's basketball, field hockey, men's golf, women's golf, softball, men's tennis, women's tennis, and volleyball. All counted, the GSR for 18 of Iowa's 24 teams was better than the national average among its peer sport group.

Athletically, Hawkeye teams enjoyed another outstanding year in 2014-15, as a significant number of Iowa's 24 programs reached postseason play. Iowa finished in 44th place in the 2014-15 Learfield Cup. The Iowa football team played in the 2015 Tax Slayer Bowl, the UI men's basketball team advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second year in a row, the women's basketball team competed in the NCAA Tournament for the eighth straight season and advanced to the Sweet 16, the wrestling team finished second at the NCAA Championships, the baseball team advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1990, and the men's golf team advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the seventh consecutive year.

The second phase of the Duane Banks Field renovation was completed in 2015 when AstroTurf replaced the outfield grass and warning track. The infield was changed to the surface prior to the 2014 season meaning there is now zero dirt or natural grass at the Hawkeyes' home venue. Phase II renovations also included the installation of a state-of-the-art videoboard in left center field and a new padded wall on the outfield fence and down the foul lines. With the first two phases complete, Phase III calls for brand new stadium seating and a new press box to be constructed surrounding the existing playing field.

After completing phase I of the project for the UI football program in August, 2012 -- a new indoor practice facility -- the second phase was finished last fall. Phase II includes construction of the new Iowa Football Operations Center, which includes new team locker rooms, team meeting rooms, athletic medical training space, video operations, and coaches offices and meeting rooms. Funded entirely through private support and revenue generated by the UI Athletics Department, the project is an important phase of the master facilities plan for Hawkeye football.

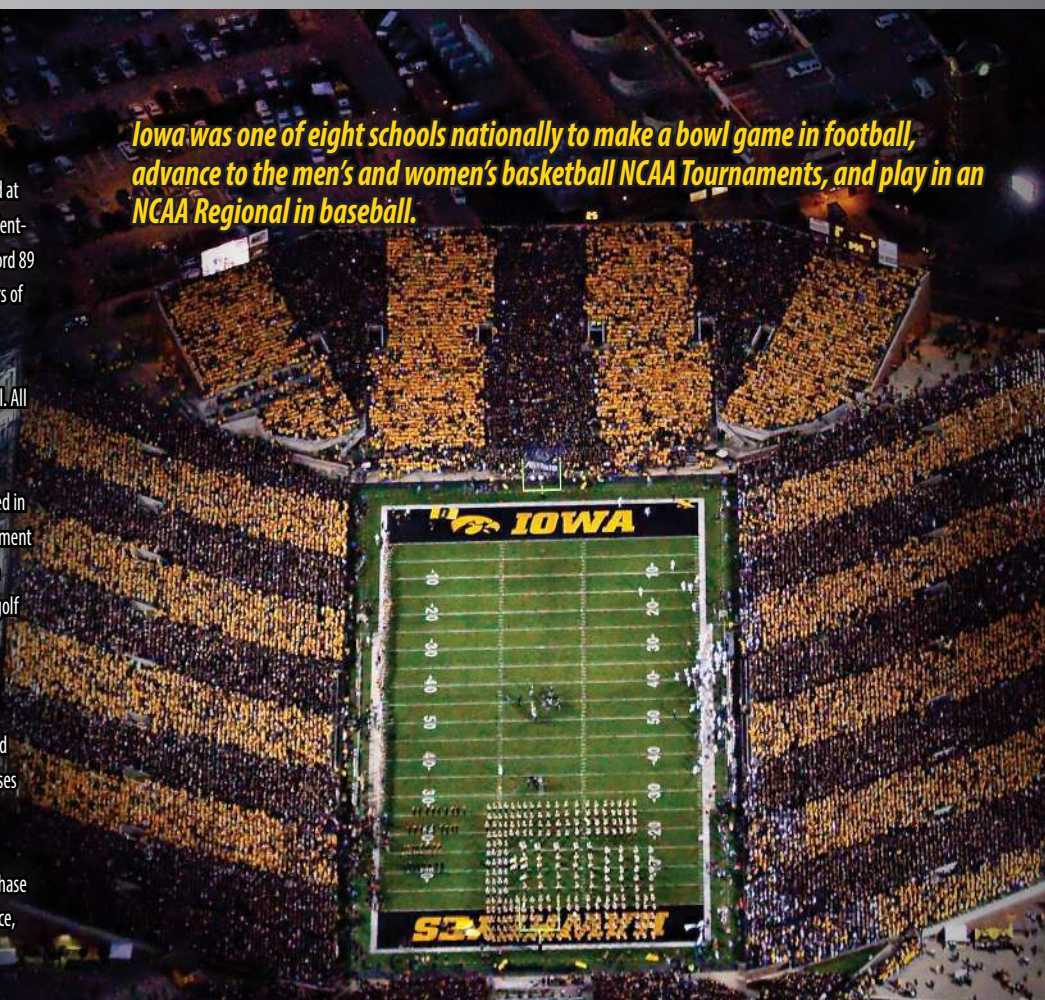
IOWA FOOTBALL

The Iowa football team posted a 7-6 record in 2014, which included a berth in the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten's Legends Division.

IOWA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

UI head coach Lisa Bluder guided the Hawkeye women's basketball team to their eighth-straight NCAA Tournament in 2014-15. The Hawkeyes advanced to the Sweet 16 following opening-round victories over American and Miami (Florida) in Iowa City, giving them a perfect 18-0 record at home. The Hawkeyes fell to Baylor in the Sweet 16 and finished 26-8 overall. Iowa is the only Big Ten team to appear in eight consecutive NCAA tournaments and one of 10 schools nationally. Guard Samantha Logic became the second Hawkeye in program history to be drafted in the first round of the WNBA Draft.

Iowa was one of eight schools nationally to make a bowl game in football, advance to the men's and women's basketball NCAA Tournaments, and play in an NCAA Regional in baseball.



IOWA WRESTLING

The Hawkeyes finished the 2014-15 season with a Big Ten regular season title, a co-Big Ten championship, six All-Americans, and nine academic All-Big Ten honorees. The Hawkeyes owned an overall record of 17-1, won at least a share of the Big Ten regular season title for the seventh time in the last eight seasons, and took home an NCAA team trophy for the eighth straight season, the longest active streak in the country.

IOWA WOMEN'S SOCCER

In Dave Dilanni's first season as head coach of the Iowa soccer team, the Hawkeyes won 14 contests, their third and fourth postseason games in program history, while earning an appearance in the B1G Tournament Championship Game for a second consecutive season. Seniors Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert became the first pair of Hawkeyes in program history to be named first-team All-Big Ten in the same season, and just the second and third Hawkeyes all-time to garner first-team recognition.

IOWA MEN'S BASKETBALL

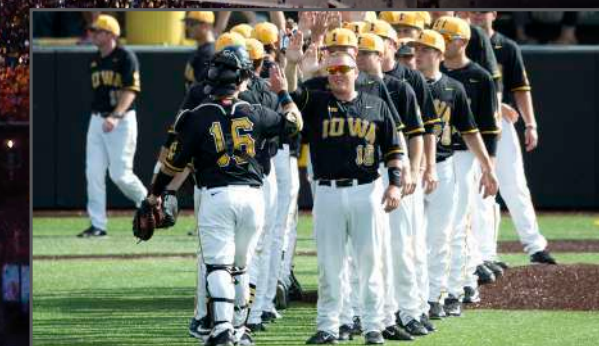
Fifth-year head coach Fran McCaffery led Iowa to its third-straight 20-win season and guided the team to the NCAA Tournament for the second year in a row. Iowa picked up its first NCAA Tournament victory since 2001 after defeating Davidson in the round of 64. Senior Aaron White earned first-team All-Big Ten recognition and became the second Hawkeye since 2007 to have his name called in the NBA Draft when he was selected by the Washington Wizards in the second round.

IOWA MEN'S GOLF

First-year head coach Tyler Stith led the Hawkeyes to their seventh-straight NCAA Regional appearance in 2015. Three student-athletes garnered all-region honors, including sophomores Carson Schaaake and Raymond Knoll who were also named first and second-team All-Big Ten honorees. Schaaake was crowned co-champion at the Big Ten Tournament, becoming just the third Hawkeye all-time and first since 1992 to accomplish the feat.

IOWA BASEBALL

Iowa finished the 2015 season with a 41-18 overall record -- the second most wins in a single season in program history. The Hawkeyes advanced to their fourth NCAA Tournament (first since 1990), going 2-2 to post Iowa's first NCAA Tournament win since 1972. Iowa had a pair of student-athletes garner three All-America distinctions in addition to having a school-record six student-athletes earn All-Big Ten recognition in 2015. Iowa had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft.

THE HAWKEYE NICKNAME

The University of Iowa borrowed its athletic nickname from the state of Iowa many years ago. The name Hawkeye was originally the name of the hero in the fictional novel, *The Last of the Mohicans*, written by James Fenimore Cooper. Cooper had the Delaware Indians bestow the name on a white scout who lived with them.

In 1838, 12 years after the book was published, people in the territory of Iowa acquired the nickname, chiefly through the efforts of Judge David Rorer of Burlington and James Edwards of Fort Madison.

Edwards, editor of the *Fort Madison Patriot*, moved his paper to Burlington in 1843 and renamed it the *Burlington Hawkeye*. The two men continued their campaign to popularize the name, and territorial officials eventually gave it their formal approval.

HERKY THE HAWKEYE

The Hawkeye nickname gained a tangible symbol in 1948 when a cartoon character, later to be named Herky the Hawkeye was hatched. The creator was Richard Spencer III, instructor of journalism at Iowa.

The impish Hawk was an immediate hit and acquired a name through a statewide contest staged by the athletic department. John Franklin, a Belle Plaine alumnus, was the man who suggested Herky.

Since his birth more than 45 years ago, Herky has symbolized Iowa athletics and epitomized University life. He even donned a military uniform during the Korean War and became the insignia of the 124th Fighter Squadron.

During the mid-1950s, Herky came to life at a football game as the Iowa mascot. Since that time, Herky has been a familiar figure at Iowa athletics events.
