IOWA HISTORY

lowa has played 1,038 games, since beginning basketball in 1974. Iowa's overall record is 632-406 (.609). That includes a 318-158 (.668) mark in regular season Big Ten contests and a 297-87 (.773) mark in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

SCOUTING BRADLEY

The Bradley Braves are 1-0 after defeating Butler, 77-63, Nov. 13 in Peoria. Three players scored double figures, led by Katie Yohn with 16 points. Latasha Hollingshed added 14 points and Raisa Taylor chipped in 13. Bradley outscored Butler, 28-18, in the paint and netted 20 second chance points off 12 offensive rebounds.

Bradley played two exhibition games during the preseason, knocking off Quincy, 90-80, and defending NCAA Division II national champion Washington (MO), 66-53.

Yohn had 23 points to pace Bradley against Quincy. Hollingshed had 13 points and 14 rebounds.

MacKenzie Westcott had 17 points, eight rebounds, two assists and two steals in the win over Washington (MO).

• Bradley junior forward MacKenzie Westcott is from Williamsburg, IA, and prepped at Williamsburg High School.

SERIES HISTORY

Tuesday will be the fifth meeting between the two schools, with lowa holding a 4-0 record in the series. The Hawkeyes won the first meeting, 85-82, at Bradley during the 1982-83 season. lowa then won three-straight games in lowa City. The teams met during the 1983-84 season (W, 70-76), the 1985-86 season (W, 75-39) and the 1999-00 season (W, 92-49).

HAWKEYES TAKE TOURNAMENT TITLE WITH WIN OVER ARKANSAS STATE

The Hawkeyes fought through a tough shooting night to defeat Arkansas State, 50-47, to claim the Islander Tip-Off Tournament title last weekend. Kamille Wahlin led all players with 14 points and Kachine Alexander added 12 points and eight rebounds, including a perfect 10-10 from the charity stripe.

lowa struggled from the field, shooting just .296 (16-54) from the field, including .179 (5-28 from three-point distance.

The Hawkeyes outrebounded Arkansas State, 42-33. Morgan Johnson led lowa with nine boards.

ALEXANDER AND WAHLIN MAKE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Kachine Alexander was named MVP of the Islander Tip-Off Tournament and Kamille Wahlin was picked for the all-tournament team.

Alexander scored 30 points and grabbed 17 rebounds in the two games. Wahlin added 23 points, seven rebounds and seven assists.

IOWA IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today preseason Top 25. Iowa is No. 22 in the AP poll and No. 25 in the ESPN/USA Today poll.

This season marks the first time since the 2000-01 season that lowa has appeared in the AP Top 25 and the first time since 2004-05 the Hawkeyes are in the ESPN/USA Today poll.

Four lowa opponents are also ranked in the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls: Ohio State (7/7), North Carolina (15/18), Iowa State (20/17) and Michigan State (25/24).

In addition, Iowa was tabbed 19th in Lindy's Sports preseason rankings.

BLUDER CLOSING IN ON MILESTONE

lowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder is just nine wins away from becoming only the second coach in school history to reach the 200-win milestone.

Bluder currently has 191 wins in her 11 years at lowa. C. Vivian Stringer is the only other Hawkeye head coach to reach the 200-win plateau at lowa, finishing her time in lowa City with 269 wins.

Ohio State Head Coach Jim Foster is the only other active Big Ten coach to have reached 200 wins at his/her current school. Foster currently has 214 victories.

KREI STARTING OFF HOT

Kelly Krei collected her second career double-double in lowa's season opener against Southern with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Krei's other double-double came at home vs. Indiana Feb. 25 last season when she scored 14 points and 13 rebounds.

Krei had reached the 20-point mark just one other time in her career, netting 20 points against Penn State last season in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament. The lowa City native had only hit the double-digit rebounding mark one previous time as well (13 against Indiana last season).

HAWKEYES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND

The lowa women's basketball team was picked to finish second by both the league coaches and media. Ohio State was chosen as the favorite in both polls.

Senior Kachine Alexander was a preseason all-Big Ten selection by both the league media and coaches. She was a unanimous selection by the coaches.

ALEXANDER ON WATCH LISTS

Senior Kachine Alexander has been named to the watch lists for the Wade Trophy, the Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy. The "Wade Watch" List is made up of the top 25 preseason women's basketball players, the Wooden Award includes 30 student-athletes and the Naismith Trophy watch list is made up of 50 players.

The Wade Trophy, Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy are considered the three most prestigious awards in NCAA women's college basketball.

Alexander is also one of 30 Division I women's basketball players nationally to be selected as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible, the candidates must show excellence in four categories: community, classroom, character and competition.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her 11th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 27th season as a college head coach. She is a three-time Big Ten and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year.

Bluder, 47, has a career record of 547-265 (.674), including a 191-123 (.608) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose.



Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to nine post-season tournaments (7 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and seven upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference, including winning a share of the league championship in 2008 and tying for second place in 2009.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the *Women's Basketball News Service* and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to their first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and was the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

KASH IN THE BANK

- As a 5-9 guard, junior Kachine Alexander ranked second in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally with 10.4 rebounds per game last season.
- Alexander claimed the Big Ten rebounding title, averaging 11.1 boards per game in league games.
- Alexander was the top rebounding guard in the country under 5-10, and was one of only two guards in the entire country to average a double-double (16 points, 10.4 rebounds per game). She was also one of only three Big Ten players to average a double-double, with the other two being post players.
- Alexander had 15 double-doubles this season and has 24 in her career, which ties Amy Herrig for fourth most in school history.
- Alexander scored double figures in 22 of 27 games played, including eight 20-plus point performances. She had 10 or more rebounds in 17 of those games, with an impressive 10 games with 12 or more boards.
- Alexander averaged more rebounds than nine of the 10 players selected to the Division I State Farm Coaches' all-America Team. She averaged the same amount of rebounds (10.4) as Nebraska's Kelsey Griffin.
- Alexander had more double-doubles than seven all-Americans, despite playing between 12 and 14 fewer games than most of the honorees.

EVERYBODY BACK

lowa returns all but one player who logged significant minutes from last year's team that finished in a tie for third place in the Big Ten, earned a berth in the Big Ten Tournament championship game and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after knocking off Rutgers in the first round (Gabby Machado - transfer).

SUCCESS UNDER BLUDER

Last year marked the seventh time in 10 seasons under Head Coach Lisa Bluder that Iowa has been selected for the NCAA Tournament, including each of the last three seasons. The Hawkeyes have participated in postseason play in all but one season under Bluder (two WNIT appearances).

In addition, lowa finished with a winning record for the ninth time in 10 seasons under Bluder. Iowa's third place finish in the Big Ten is also the seventh time under Bluder the Hawkeyes recorded an upper-division finish in the conference.

lowa also tallied its fifth 20-win season under Bluder, including each of the last three seasons.

AWARD WINNERS RETURNING

Several Hawkeyes earned numerous awards during the 2009-10 season.

- Head Coach Lisa Bluder was named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the third time in 10 seasons at lowa.
- Kachine Alexander was named honorable mention All-America by the Associated Press and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA). Alexander was also selected All-Region by the WBCA. She also earned All-America honors by the National Strength and Conditioning Assocation (NSCA). Alexander was named first team all-Big Ten by the coaches, second team all-Big Ten by the media and was one of five players named to the Big Ten all-Defensive Team. She was also selected to the Big Ten Tournament all-tournament team, named the MVP of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge and was a two-time Big Ten Player of the Week.
- Jaime Printy was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year and was a unanimous pick for the Big Ten all-Freshmen team. Printy also earned second team all-conference honors from the media and third team all-league honors by the coaches. Printy was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week four times. She was named second team Freshman all-American by Full Court Press
- Kamille Wahlin was a third team all-Big Ten selection by both the coaches and media. She was also named to the Big Ten Tournament, KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge and Nugget Classic all-tournament teams.
- Kelly Krei was named to the Big Ten Tournament all-tournament team.
- Morgan Johnson earned a Big Ten Freshman of the Week award.

LEADING THE LEAGUE

Several Hawkeyes led the Big Ten in different statistical categories (both overall and league games only) last season.

- Junior Kachine Alexander claimed the Big Ten rebounding crown, averaging 11.1 boards per contest in league games. She also finished first in defensive rebounds (8.12 per game), in Big Ten games only. Alexander led the entire conference in offensive rebounds for all games (3.11).
- Sophomore Kamille Wahlin led the conference in three-pointers made per game for overall games (2.55) and league games only (2.59).
- Freshman Morgan Johnson led the Big Ten in field goal percentage, in conference games (.508).
- As a team, the Hawkeyes led the conference in free throw percentage (.771) and three-pointers made per game (7.91). In Big Ten games only, lowaled the league in three-pointers made per game (7.72).

INJURY UPDATE

lowa sophomores Theairra Taylor and Trisha Nesbitt are both sidelined with injuries.

Taylor suffered her third ACL tear in the last 20 months during preseason practice and will miss the entire season.

Nesbitt partially ruptured the plantar fascia in her right foot and will be out indefinitely. A timetable for Nesbitt's return has not been established.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF FREE THROWS

lowa, under Head Coach Lisa Bluder, is proving to be one of the best free throw shooting teams in the country.

The Hawkeyes have ranked in the top 10 in the nation three of the past four seasons. lowa finished the 2005-06 season ranked 10th (.760), ranked fifth (.788) in 2006-07 and also ranked fifth (.792) last season.


The 2009-10 campaign was no different. lowa ranked sixth in free throw percentage across the NCAA (.771).

WELCOME ABOARD

lowa has two new faces on its roster this year in Jade Rogers and Kalli Hansen.

Rogers is from Cedar Rapids, lowa, and prepped at Cedar Rapids Kennedy High School. She was a four-time all-state selection, including first team honors as a sophomore, junior and senior. She was also a four-time first team all-metro, all-district and all-conference pick. Rogers was a two-time conference Player of the Year and was also the metro Player of the Year as a senior.

Hansen is from Olin, lowa and spent the last two years at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. She helped lead Kirkwood to back-to-back NJCAA national championships. Kirkwood compiled an impressive 75-2 record during her two seasons. She was a first team All-American and all-region selection while at Kirkwood.

Seven of Iowa's 12 non-conference games will be on the road, including two neutral site games at the Islander Tip-Off Tournament (Corpus Christi, TX) and the Caribbean Challenge (Cancun, Mexico). The Hawkeyes will also face South Dakota State, North Carolina and Drake on the road.
