Lisa Bluder Q-and-A regarding the 2014-15 season:

**Iowa was ranked preseason No. 12 in the spring. How do the preseason expectations impact this team?**

Someone asked me the other day if I was afraid of expectations and I said, 'Are you kidding? This is what you work for. This is what you try to accomplish and try to get the recognition for your program and we're celebrating it.' At the same time, let's go to work to live up to those expectations. That's our attitude here. We want to embrace that.

**Does this team have the same grit and mindset as it did last year?**

When you talk about grit, you talk about our floor general, Samantha Logic, and she epitomizes grit. She is so strong, focused, and competitive, and that rubs off on a lot of people. That is a great example for our freshmen to have a senior that leads in that manner. Our team has been gritty and will be gritty, and with Sam as our leader, we will always be that way.

**Last year, the team had a high-flying attack, leading the league in assists and scoring. Can we expect to see that style again this year?**

That is us, that is what we want to do, and that is what Iowa women's basketball is supposed to look like. Last year, we put the pieces together to make that happen. Our team bought into that and it's really easy to sell it this year to our team because they know the success and they enjoy playing it. We have recruited players that fit well with that system.

**Theairra Taylor was here for five years, and graduated in the spring. Who will step up into that leadership role?**

We have three captains this year, Sam (Logic), Melissa (Dixon), and Kathryn (Reynolds). By virtue of Bethany (Doolittle) being a senior, she is going to have expectations for her as well. She had a great year last year, she is a senior, and she has come such a long way in her four years here. Sam, in my mind, is our ultimate leader because she is the point guard; she's the most recognized player on our team and she is the one who will hold the entire ship together.

**Have you ever had a more solid returning core than this group?**

This is one of our most solid returning groups we have ever had. Anytime you return four starters, along with the quality of these women and how well we have done the last several years, compounds that. Everybody's expectations should be high for our basketball team, and I certainly want our players to have those same types of expectations.

**Ally Disterhoft was a presence all of last year as a freshman. How does she top that first season?**

It is hard to top that freshman season, but she is not done and she knows that. She knows that she can get better. We're continuing to make her stronger; she's a good rebounder and can be a better rebounder for us. As she plays the game and gets smarter, she improves her basketball I.Q. and that all starts with repetitions on the floor and having that confidence. Ally has always been a competitor since she has been here, and that will enable her to keep getting better each and every year.

**How do you see the back court playing out?**

That's the beauty of our offense; we run a continuity of offense, and we don't need to have the best number one, two, or three out there. In numbers, we have the five best basketball players on the court. That's what I love about our system. We can have three point guards, or we can have three power forwards, and it doesn't matter. It lets players go out there and really contribute and not be pigeon-holed to a specific number.

Although Whitney (Jennings) played point guard all through high school, and she's certainly going to back up Sam in that point guard position this year, there is no reason she cannot come in and play some alongside Sam. There is no reason why Christina Bутtenham and Alexa Kastanek cannot be in that mix. Ally can play the three or the four, and then Kali (Peschel) can come in. Claire (Till) played well for us inside at the end of the year and we'll have her facing the basket this year. There are some other possibilities that can happen in that vacated spot.

**The junior class took a step last year, can they take another one this year?**

I do not think we've seen what they're able to accomplish yet. They have more to give to our program and they've realized that hour glass has now flipped over and now they're starting to wind down to the other side of it. That sense of urgency can really push you into gear a little bit. Claire (Till) has been hampered with some knee pain in the preseason, and I'm hoping that we can get that taken care of. Nicole (Smith) is playing pain free. Kalie Peschel is somebody that I believe we have not even come close to seeing how good of a player she really is. We see it in practice and need to get that transferred into game action and have her show what she's capable of doing. We know that she can do it, we see it in practice.

**How do you see this group of freshmen contributing this season?**

All four of them have the potential to contribute right off the bat. Whitney (Jennings) for sure; she is going to be backing up our point guard, there's no doubt about that. There is no reason why she cannot be part of that starting five. Christina (Buttenham) will be battling to win that wing position. Chase (Coley) will definitely be a part of the action because we have to prepare her for next year when she will be in that starting position at the five for us. We have to prepare her by getting her reps and game experience. Carly (Mohns) provides something for us that was a weakness last year, and that's rebounding. She's an unbelievable rebounder.

**The coaching staff seems to fit and mesh so well...**

We are really like family and that's a great example to our team and how to treat each other and how much more enjoyable it is when everyone gets along. That is kind of a trademark of our team, our chemistry, and how we play. There's not any jealousy or nit-picking about our team, and that's what makes it fun. Our staff lives that and that's a great example for our team.

**How do we prepare for this schedule?**

It's a crazy schedule. Of all years, this is the best time for it to happen. We've challenged ourselves with tough road games, home games, different conferences, and different styles of play. You just hope that, as a coach, you're going to be able to rise to the occasion and be able to handle all of those games, but it is brutal when you look at it. I've always been able to look at it one step at a time and one game at a time and not look down the road because sometimes when you look down the road, it can be overwhelming and intimidating. When you look at the next game and next week and break it down into little chunks, that's how you need to prepare your team for every game and that's what we have to do as a staff.

**It's been a great run... seven-straight NCAA tournaments. How does this team make that eight?**

Like every year, we need to stay healthy because that's something that's out of your control, but is something that has so much impact on your team. We need to stick to our identity and what we do. Understanding that teamwork, running the ball, shooting threes, and having that floor balance is great for us, and not getting ourselves overwhelmed with what lies ahead of us. If we take care of business with our home games, and if we do as well as we think we can do in the Big Ten, even though there are tough teams, I do see an eighth-straight NCAA appearance for us.

**Sally Mason  
President  
University of Iowa**



Sally Mason became the 20th President of the University of Iowa on August 1, 2007. She holds a full professorship with tenure in the Department of Biology in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

At Iowa, President Mason has spearheaded a sustainable university initiative, making sustainability a central priority of all aspects of the University enterprise.

Currently, she is overseeing campus rebuilding in the wake of the historic 2008 flooding, especially the renewal of an arts campus for the 21st century. Under President Mason's leadership, the UI has successfully met the country's recent economic challenges through careful planning, strategic prioritization, and increased efficiency. Other major accomplishments during President Mason's tenure have been a student success initiative that has led to increased enrollment and student retention, and an expansion of partnership agreements with Iowa's community colleges that offer UI degrees to students throughout the state through on-site and distance learning programs.

The daughter of an immigrant family and the first child to attend college, President Mason received her B.A. in zoology from the University of Kentucky in 1972, her M.S. from Purdue University in 1974, and her Ph.D. in cellular, molecular, and developmental biology from the University of Arizona in 1978. She spent two postdoctoral research years at Indiana University before joining the molecular biosciences faculty at the University of Kansas in 1981, where she received awards for outstanding undergraduate advising and teaching and was awarded a prestigious Kemper Teaching Fellowship. After stints as Acting Chair of the Department of Physiology and Cell Biology and Associate Dean in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, in 1995 she was appointed Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the largest academic unit on the KU campus. President Mason served as Provost of Purdue University from 2001-2007, where she was responsible for planning, managing, and reviewing all

academic programs at Purdue's West Lafayette campus and four affiliated branch campuses throughout Indiana.

President Mason is the author of many scientific papers and has obtained a number of research grants from the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the Wesley Research Foundation, and the Lilly Endowment. Her research interests have focused on the developmental biology, genetics, and biochemistry of pigment cells and pigments in the skin of vertebrates, and she served as President of the PanAmerican Society for Pigment Cell Research. Since 2006, President Mason has been appointed by the President of the United States to three terms on the National Medal of Science President's Committee, including a term as chair. She has also served as Chair of the Advisory Committee to the National Science Foundation (NSF) Directorate for Education and Human Resources (EHR) and Chair of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) review panel of the NSF Science and Technology Centers Program.

President Mason has held many leadership positions in higher education and national organizations: President of the Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences; member of the Board of Directors of the American Council on Education (ACE); member of the Executive Committee of the Committee on Institutional Cooperation (CIC); Chair of the Iowa Coordinating Council for Post-High School Education (ICCPHSE); and co-chair of the Task Force on National Energy Policy and Midwestern Competitiveness of the Chicago Council on Global Affairs.

Currently, President Mason serves as Chair-Elect of the Board of Directors Executive Committee of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU); member of the Board of Trustees of the Universities Research Association; member of the Board of Directors of Campus Compact, the national coalition of college and university presidents committed to fulfilling the civic purposes of higher education; member of the Board of Directors of the Big Ten Conference, Inc.; member of the Washington Center Council of Presidents; and member of the Board of Trustees of the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library Association.

President Mason is married to Ken Mason, an educator and textbook author who teaches biology at the University of Iowa.

"Welcome to a new season of Iowa women's basketball! My husband Ken and I are passionate Hawkeye women's basketball fans and we are looking forward to another exciting season. We take great pride in this team and its coaches. These Hawkeyes truly embody the winning spirit on the court, in the classroom and in the community.

We are proud of our rich tradition in women's basketball! The University of Iowa has established itself as one of the most decorated programs in the Big Ten and nation. Coach Bluder has led her team to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the last seven years in a row.

Under Coach Bluder's leadership, Iowa has posted 10 Big Ten first-division finishes and advanced to the postseason 13 times. Bluder exemplifies the type of coach this University is all about. ## Gary Barta

### Director of Athletics

### University of Iowa

Gary Barta is entering his ninth year as director of athletics at the University of Iowa and his 27th year as a university leader.

The 2014-15 athletics season at the UI will build on significant momentum gained a year ago as a result of multiple successes competitively, academically, and in positive community impact displayed by Iowa coaches, student-athletes, and administrators. Last year also included record-setting fundraising support and corporate participation, as well as the completion of facility construction projects critical to the long-term success of the Iowa Hawkeyes.

Progress and success on the fields, courts, tracks, and mats was significant in 2013-14. A return to participation in a postseason bowl game by the Iowa football team, a return to the NCAA Tournament by the UI's men's basketball team, a fourth place national finish in wrestling, the seventh straight NCAA Tournament appearance by Iowa women's basketball, an invitation to the postseason Big Ten Tournament by the Hawkeye baseball team, postseason NCAA competition for Iowa's men's golf team, and the UI's men's and women's track and field teams, and a historic first time invitation to the NCAA Tournament for women's soccer highlighted the 2013-14 year competitively for the UI.

In fact, only six other programs in the country, in addition to the UI, had their football team appear in a New Year's Day bowl, and both their men's and women's basketball teams compete in the NCAA Tournament.

Lisa Bluder's Iowa women's basketball team won a school-record-tying 27 games – including 14 on Mediacom Court in Carver-Hawkeye Arena en route to its seventh straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, a number that only 13 other programs across the country can match. Postseason play was particularly fun for the Hawkeyes: Iowa won three games to advance to the championship game of the 2014 Big Ten Tournament and won its first round game in NCAA Tournament play for the second straight season.

Academic success by the more than 600 student-athletes who participate in 24 sport programs has always been one of the very highest priorities at the University of Iowa and remains so today under Barta's direction. That commitment to the "student" in "student-athlete" resulted in a record-setting NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 88, a mark that was a full seven percentage points better than the national average. The GSR's for Iowa's football (82), men's basketball (89), and women's basketball (100) all bested the national averages for their sport: 70, 68 and 86, respectively.

In addition, the NCAA's 2013 graduation report also revealed that Iowa's federal graduation rate of 72 was seven points better than its peers nationally and two points better than its peers on the UI campus. Paced by all-time high scores in nine sports programs, all of the UI's intercollegiate athletics programs were determined by the NCAA in spring 2014 to be achieving at a rate academically that surpassed the national benchmark.

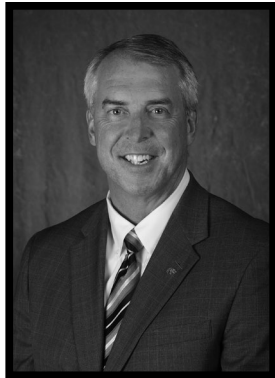
Barta also believes strongly that his staff and student-athletes contribute to the community. That commitment manifests itself in literally thousands of hours of community service annually. The Hawkeyes' efforts in 2013-14 included a leadership role in "Herky on Parade," the largest public art program staged in the state of Iowa which the UI Athletics Department executes in cooperation with the Iowa City Coralville Convention and Visitors Bureau. It is anticipated that the Parade will bring tens of thousands of visitors to the greater UI, Iowa City, Coralville, and North Liberty community, and a six-figure contribution to the United Way of Johnson County and the United Way of Washington County when the project is completed.

The UI Athletics Department also stages an annual "Day of Caring" each April where student-athletes of all 24 of the UI's sports teams provide assistance to a wide variety of not-for-profit organizations. The UI football program also stages annually the Iowa Ladies Football Academy. That effort has generated more than \$1 million of support for the new University of Iowa Children's Hospital.

The Hawkeyes' success academically and in competition also fueled interest in the Hawkeyes to levels matched by less than a handful of Iowa's peers: The UI is one of only four programs in the country to have its football, men's basketball, and women's basketball programs all rank among the nation's Top 25 in attendance.

Iowa also once again led the nation in attendance for wrestling and continues to rank among the leaders in Facebook and Twitter measures, and also traffic to its official World Wide Web site, [hawkeyesports.com](http://hawkeyesports.com). In fact, 2013-14 was the busiest athletics year in the history of [hawkeyesports.com](http://hawkeyesports.com) in terms of unique visitors (4.3 million) and the second busiest in terms of total pages downloaded (22.8 million).

Barta has successfully leveraged the burgeoning interest in the Hawkeyes to drive fundraising and corporate support of the UI Athletics Department to record levels. Private gifts to the National I-Club for annual giving and support of capital projects exceeded \$28 million in 2013-14. Participation in the offerings of Hawkeye Sports Properties, the exclusive multi-media partner of the UI Athletics Department, resulted in a record \$6.1 million of revenue in 2013-14.



These sources of income help Barta to fund an \$85 million annual operations budget, a budget that is 100 percent self-generated – the UI receives no state tax dollars to operate its intercollegiate athletics program – and profitable in spite of scholarship costs that will easily exceed \$10 million in 2014-15. The UI Athletics Department also is responsible for such things as medical expenses for its student-athletes (\$800,000 in 2013-14), the cost of utilities to operate its facilities (\$400,000 last year), and, of course, salaries and benefits for more than 225 full-time employees.

Barta has also used private and corporate support to enhance the infrastructure used by Iowa's sports programs. For example, the Hawkeye football program will move into the \$55 million state-of-the-art Richard O. Jacobson Football Operations Building that includes the Stew and LeNore Hansen Football Performance Center in late fall. To date, more than \$35 million of private support has been generated for this important project.

Completion of the home of the nationally ranked Iowa football program will mean the UI Athletics Department will have invested more than \$220 million in construction and renovation under Barta's leadership. The list of projects completed under Barta's direction includes an investment in technology at historic Kinnick Stadium that includes a new sound system to be installed prior to the 2014 season, construction of the Hoak Family Golf Complex, the revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena, construction of the P. Sue Beckwith, M.D., Boathouse, the UI Athletics Department's contribution to the construction of the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center, replacement of the turf at Grant Field, installation of artificial turf at Duane Banks Field, and resurfacing of the outdoor courts at the Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Complex.

The work is not complete, however. The UI Athletics Department this fall will begin installation of a new video wall, outfield fence, and artificial turf in the outfield of Duane Banks Field. Barta and his team are busy investigating the finalization of a master facilities plan that includes the expansion of "Hawkeye Campus," the current home of the Iowa field hockey and soccer programs, UI Sports Medicine, the UI Athletics Hall of Fame and Museum, a new indoor turf facility that also includes an outdoor surface to be used as the practice field for the Hawkeye Marching Band, and the Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Complex located on the far western edge of the UI's campus adjacent to the UI's Finkbine Golf Course and near the UI's Ashton Cross Country Course.

Barta's involvement in the UI campus and the greater Iowa City communities extends far beyond his position as director of the UI's intercollegiate athletics programs. He is a member of the President's Cabinet, comprised of vice presidents and other campus leaders that provide counsel to UI President Sally Mason. That group was instrumental in the UI's response to record-setting flooding that besieged the campus and the Iowa City and Coralville community in June 2008 and will be directly involved in positioning the UI for growth in the immediate and long-term future as the institution adjusts to a shift in the funding model used by the State of Iowa's Board of Regents.

Barta also represents the UI and the Hawkeyes at the conference and national level. During his tenure at the UI, he has participated in the creation and implementation of the Big Ten Network, the expansion of the Big Ten Conference and realignment of athletics conferences nationally, and the Big Ten's postseason bowl game agreements that were successfully implemented in 2010.

Barta remains active on the Conference and NCAA level. He is involved in committee work with NCAA Football, the Division IA Athletic Directors Association, and is an ongoing participant in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

Barta is also involved in a variety of community groups, including the United Way of Johnson County and the Partnership for Alcohol Safety, a joint effort between UI campus leaders and the city of Iowa City.

Barta often suggests to his staff that "Hope is not a strategy," which is why the Department has just completed a comprehensive review and rewriting of the strategic plan for the UI Athletics Department and continues to work with the UI's leadership on a long-term financial plan.

As the director of athletics at the University of Wyoming for three years, seven different UW coaches were named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He also spearheaded a fund-raising effort that netted the Cowboy athletics program \$11 million in private support and \$11 million in matching state fund.

As the senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington, he directed the "Campaign for the Student-Athlete," was a participant in the design, construction and/or renovation of several UW athletics facilities, including Bank of America Arena and the Dempsey Indoor Practice Facility. In addition to almost doubling the amount of annual private support received by UW, Barta also managed the department's external relations division, a task that included corporate sponsorship and radio contracts.

His responsibilities at Washington expanded over time to include hiring of coaching and administrative staff, and the day-to-day oversight of several Huskie sport teams.

The roots of his development experience extend to his first two positions: director of athletics development and external relations at the University of Northern Iowa and director of development at his alma mater, North Dakota State University.

Barta earned a Bachelor of Science degree in mass communication and broadcast journalism from NDSU in 1987. He was an option quarterback for Bison football squads that won the Division II NCAA National Championship in 1983, 1985 and 1986.

Barta, and his wife, Connie, have a son, Luke (16) and a daughter, Madison (14). He was born Sept. 4, 1963, in Minneapolis.



## **Lisa Bluder**

**Head Coach**

**15th Year**

**Northern Iowa, 1983**



Lisa Bluder, the all-time winningest coach in program history, is in her 15th year as head women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa and her 31st year overall. Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 13 postseason appearances (11 NCAA and two WNIT) in 14 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in each of the last seven seasons. Iowa is the only team in the Big Ten, and one of 14 in NCAA Division I women's basketball, to qualify for the NCAA Tournament in each of the last seven years. There are 343 Division I teams.

The longest-tenured Big Ten Conference coach, Bluder has posted a 278-166 (.626) record at Iowa and her 30-year record stands at 634-308 (.673). Bluder surpassed Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins) as the all-time winningest coach in program history on Feb. 10, 2014, as the Hawkeyes defeated Northwestern, 90-84.

Bluder, one-of-nine active major college coaches with 600 or more wins, is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010) and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year (2001 and 2008). She has guided Iowa to a winning record in 13 of her 14 years at Iowa, including 10 upper-division finishes in the challenging Big Ten Conference. Bluder, who ranks fourth among Big Ten coaches all-time in league victories (138), has led Iowa to eight 20-win seasons in her 14 years, including six of the last seven years.

Bluder has coached numerous players to different awards in her 14 years in Iowa City. She has mentored 19 players to 40 All-Big Ten honors, including 11 first team picks, 11 second, 11 third and seven honorable mention selections. She has also had two Big Ten Freshman of the Year award winners, two Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year recipients, six members of the Big Ten All-Freshman team and three players named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, with Kachine Alexander earning the honor twice.

Five players during Bluder's tenure have earned a total of six Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) all-region team accolades and six players have earned a total of 11 honorable mention All-America honors.

With Bluder on the Iowa sidelines, student-athletes have been named Academic All-Big Ten 67 times, including a program-best eight honorees in 2011 and 2012. The 67 honorees equal the third-highest total in the Big Ten during the last 14 years. Additionally, Lindsey Meder was a two-time Academic All-American (2001 and 2002).

The Hawkeyes finished the 2013-14 campaign with an overall record of 27-9 and a ranking of No. 19 in the postseason AP Top 25 Poll. The Hawkeyes' 27 victories equaled the second-highest total in program history, and the most since 1996. In addition, Iowa's 14 home wins equaled the second-highest single-sea-

son total in school history. The Hawkeyes made their seventh-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Iowa, a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament, defeated 11th-seeded Marist in the First Round, 87-65, marking the fourth-largest margin of victory in an NCAA Tournament win in program history. The Hawkeyes set the school record for scoring offense (78.2), leading the league in scoring while scoring the second-most points in a season in Big Ten history (2,814). Iowa tied for fourth in the league (11-5) and advanced to the Big Ten Tournament title game.

Iowa earned its sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2012-13, finishing with a 21-13 overall record. The Hawkeyes faced 11 ranked teams during the season, marking the most games played against ranked opponents in Iowa history. The Hawkeyes tied the school record for number of wins over ranked opponents with seven, along with setting school records in team assists (534) and rebounds (1,303).

Iowa closed the regular season with eight-straight wins in 2011-12, securing a second place finish in the Big Ten and its fifth-straight NCAA Tournament berth. Iowa's 11 conference wins were the most since 2001-02 and the fourth-most in school history (during a 16-game conference schedule). The Hawkeyes closed the regular season without their leading scorer, Jaime Printy, who suffered a torn ACL.

Bluder had one of her most successful seasons in 2010-11, leading Iowa to a 22-9 overall record and a third place finish in the Big Ten at 10-6. Iowa's overall win/loss record in 2010-11 was the best for an Iowa team since the 1995-96 campaign. The Hawkeyes were nationally ranked for 14 weeks during the season, reaching No. 14 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 13 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Iowa received an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the fourth-straight season.

In 2009-10, Bluder led one of the youngest teams in the country to a third place finish in the Big Ten and a berth in the championship game of the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes received an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, where they knocked off Rutgers in the first round before falling to eventual national runner-up and No. 2 ranked Stanford. Iowa finished the 2009-10 season with a 20-14 record, including a 10-8 mark in Big Ten play.

Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to back-to-back 21-11 overall records during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. Iowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship in 2008 and finished in a three-way tie for second in 2009. The Hawkeyes boasted a 26-5 home record, advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals and appeared in the NCAA Tournament twice during the two-year stretch.

In 2005-06, Bluder guided a young and mostly inexperienced group of Hawkeyes to a 17-12 overall record and a fifth place finish in the Big Ten. Even with a season plagued by knee injuries, the Hawkeyes persevered with strong senior leadership talented play from its freshman class. Iowa received an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.

Bluder mentored Iowa to a 23-10 overall record and advanced to the WNIT Final Four in 2004-05. Iowa started the 2004-05 campaign 13-0 and was the last Division I undefeated team standing. Bluder navigated the Hawkeyes through a difficult schedule and ultimately finished the season ranked 38th in the RPI.

In 2003-04, Bluder and the Hawkeyes finished with a 16-13 record while playing the 14th-most difficult schedule in the nation and tied for fourth in the league with a 10-6 mark. In addition, eight of its 16 victories came on the road, marking the most road wins by a Hawkeye team since the 1993-94 season.

Bluder helped her third Iowa team to another exciting run in the Big Ten Tournament and WNIT in 2002-03. The seventh-seeded Hawkeyes opened the league tournament with a win over Northwestern. In the quarterfinals, Iowa treated its fans to a thrilling upset over 13th-ranked and second-seeded Minnesota. The Hawkeyes opened postseason play with wins over Saint Louis and Marquette before falling the Missouri Valley Conference co-champions Creighton Bluejays in the WNIT.

In 2001-02, Bluder coached the Hawkeyes to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year and a fourth place finish in the Big Ten. Iowa finished with an 18-11 overall record and a 10-6 mark in league play.

In her first season with the Black and Gold, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa received the Big Ten's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament with a victory over Purdue to capture the 2001 Big Ten Tournament. Furthermore, the Hawkeyes advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after receiving a No. 4 seed and finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final Associated Press poll. Competing in one of the most demanding conferences in the country, Bluder directed the Hawkeyes to a 21-10 overall record, a second-place finish in the conference regular season and captured Iowa's second-ever Big Ten Tournament title. Iowa played the 16th toughest schedule in the country and finished the season ranked 18th in the RPI.

"Our success has always been based on playing up-tempo basketball," said Bluder. "We want to put lots of points on the board. The fast break is our number one offense. That type of basketball is exciting for fans and its fun for our players. When we do get into a half court game, everyone has a role. Our goal is to have four or five players averaging in double figures. We want everyone involved. Defensively, we work hard at never letting anything be easy for our opponent. We play tough player-to-player defense hoping to capitalize on steals to set up our break."

Her presence on the Iowa sidelines turned heads across the country. Virginia and USA Basketball Head Coach Debbie Ryan chose Bluder to help coach Team USA as an assistant coach at the 2001 World University Games in Beijing, China. Team USA marched into the gold medal game against host-team China and won 87-69. Team USA finished the games with a 7-1 mark.

"This was a new experience for me," Bluder said after winning the gold medal. "Just to reach the gold medal game was a thrill. It's something I will always remember. What I think is really wonderful about this experience is each game I felt like Team USA improved. I was honored to be chosen to represent the United States and experience international coaching for the first time."

Bluder has reached several coaching milestones while at Iowa. During her first season, she collected her 200th victory at the Division I level when the Hawkeyes defeated Minnesota. She garnered win No. 300 at the Division I level with Iowa's regular

season finale win over Indiana in 2006. During her third season, Bluder captured career No. 400 in Iowa's triumph over Iowa State. Bluder won career game No. 500 vs. Penn State on Feb. 10, 2008 and No. 600 vs. Purdue on Jan. 20, 2013. Bluder surpassed Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins) as the all-time winningest coach in program history on Feb. 10, 2014.

During her tenure at Iowa, five former players have gone on to become coaches at the collegiate level. Cara Consuegra (Charlotte) and Jennie (Lillis) Baranczyk (Drake) are currently Division I head coaches. Randi Peterson is the head coach at Coe College; Kachine Alexander is an assistant at North Dakota State and Wendy Ausdemore served as an assistant at Coe for one season.

Eleven former Hawkeyes under Bluder continued their playing careers professionally after graduation. Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder, Crystal Smith and Kachine Alexander all had stints in the WNBA. Smith, Alexander, Johanna Solverson, Kristi Smith, Megan Skouby, JoAnn Hamlin, Trisha Nesbitt, Morgan Johnson and Theairra Taylor also played professionally in Europe.

Bluder, alongside her husband David and daughter Hannah, was introduced as the Hawkeyes' fifth head coach in front of a packed press room in Carver-Hawkeye Arena on April 7, 2000. The native of Marion, Iowa, came to Iowa after spending 10 successful seasons at Drake University.

Bluder compiled a 187-106 (.638) record at Drake in 10 seasons and a 169-36 (.824) record in six seasons at NAIA St. Ambrose University.

In her 10 years as Drake University women's basketball coach, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus-win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder's 1999-2000 Drake squad registered a 23-7 record. The Bulldogs won both the MVC regular-season and tournament titles and earned the school's fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament under Bluder.

The 1997-98 team finished the season 25-5, Bluder's best record at Drake, and won the MVC regular-season title, recording Drake's best conference finish with a 17-1 record. The Bulldogs also won the MVC Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four years. She was named the MVC Coach of the Year for the second straight year as Drake was ranked No. 22 in the final Associated Press ranking.

In 1998-99, Drake posted a 21-10 record in the MVC. It marked the fourth time in five years the Bulldogs reached the 20-win plateau, while advancing to the semifinals of the WNIT Tournament.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose University, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder re-



corded a 169-36 (.824) mark and guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

While at Drake, she coached two Academic All-America Players of the Year in current Hawkeye associate head coach Jan Jensen (1991) and Tricia Wakely (1996). As a team, the Bulldogs ranked fourth in 1995 graduation rate success among teams ranked in the USA Today/CNN final top-25 Coaches' Poll. While at Iowa, Lindsey Meder became the first Hawkeye women's basketball player to be named a first team Verizon Academic All-American. Wendy Ausdemore, a 2009 graduate, and Morgan Johnson, a 2013 graduate, were two-time Academic All-District honorees.

Student-athletes who have played under Bluder and completed their eligibility have a 100 percent job placement following their career, and all of them have earned their degrees.

Bluder's successful coaching record speaks for itself, however her commitment to her players extends far beyond the records book.

During the summer of 2003, Bluder was elected Division I Midwest Representative of the WBCA Board of Directors. She has also served on the WBCA Kodak All-American selection committee for four terms and the Midwest Regional Advisory Committee for the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championships.

"My players are truly an extension of my family," said Bluder. "I care about them in all aspects of their lives. I want to help them succeed as athletes, but especially as people. I have an open-door relationship with my players. Hopefully, they benefit from my perspective as their coach, as a former athlete and as a mother. They can come to me with anything and get help. Along with that aspect, I consider myself a disciplinarian. I don't have a lot of rules, but I do have a lot of expectations. Those revolve around moral and ethical values that are the foundation of our program."

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, Iowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa, scoring the first ever points in a women's basketball game in Carver-Hawkeye Arena history. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing. On Sept. 4, 2008, Bluder was inducted to the Linn-Mar Athletic Hall of Fame. She has also been inducted to the Northern Iowa and St. Ambrose Hall of Fame.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah and Emma and one son, David.

Jan Jensen is in her 15th season with the Iowa women's basketball staff in 2014-15, her 12th as associate head coach. A nationally known presence on the recruiting scene, Jensen serves as the recruiting coordinator and also works with the post players. Jensen completed her 25th season in women's college basketball as a player and coach in 2014.

The native of Kimballton, Iowa, has helped guide Iowa to 13 postseason appearances, including 11 NCAA Tournament berths. Iowa is 1-of-14 teams nationally -- the only Big Ten team -- to appear in the last seven NCAA Tournaments (there are 343 Division I teams). During her time at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have claimed the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead Iowa to 10 first-division finishes in the Big Ten.

Jensen is integral in developing and maintaining top-level recruiting classes at Iowa. Jensen helped Iowa land the 11th best recruiting class in the country in 2011, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. In 2001, Jensen spearheaded Iowa's efforts in landing the eighth-best recruiting class in the nation according to the Blue Star Index. In 2008, Jensen and the Hawkeyes garnered the 33rd best recruiting class, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, and in 2014, Iowa landed the 28th-best class nationally, according to Blue Star Basketball.

Jensen has recruited three McDonald's All-Americans to Iowa (Samantha Logic, Lindsay Richards and Johanna Solverson).

Under Jensen's tutelage, Hawkeye post players have received numerous honors. She has coached seven players to a total of 14 All-Big Ten honors, including two first team selections. Megan Skouby was named the 2006 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the 2008 Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year, while Jennie Lillis was a 2003 Kodak All-District selection. Skouby, along with Krista Vandeventer, were also invited to the U.S.A. Team Trials during their time at Iowa.

Jensen coached Morgan Johnson to numerous accolades, including two second team All-Big Ten honors. Under Jensen's guidance, Johnson became Iowa's career blocks leader and finished inside the top 10 in career scoring and rebounds at Iowa.

In 2014, Jensen coached Bethany Doolittle to second-team All-Big Ten and All-Defensive team honors, as Doolittle set a new program single-season record for blocks (106) while leading the conference in the category.

In 2009-10, Iowa's post players broke school records for rebounding and blocked shots. Morgan Johnson broke the school mark for single-season blocks, while the team broke the school record for single-season rebounding.

Before becoming a Hawkeye, Jensen also served as Coach Blud-

er's first assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Drake University. Her recruiting efforts were enough to land the Bulldogs two top-13 and two top-40 classes.

As a player, Jensen was one of the best Bluders ever coached at Drake. During her senior year, she led the nation in scoring with 29.6 points per game and was the Gateway Conference Most Valuable Player. That year, she was a Kodak Honorable Mention All-American, a member of the all-Gateway team and the GTE Academic All-American Player of the Year. Jensen was also Sports Illustrated's National Player of the Week.

She ranks fourth on Drake's all-time scoring list (1,996), sixth in field goal percentage (.535) and eighth in rebounds (.750). Jensen is one of only two Drake players to have her number retired in the Knapp Center.

After college, Jensen played professionally in the European Professional Basketball League for BTW-Wuppertal in Germany. She played there from 1992-93 and helped her club win the German Club Championship. She then returned to the United States to begin her coaching career.

In 1993, Jensen was inducted to the Iowa Girls High School Basketball Hall of Fame after leading the nation in scoring, averaging 66 points per contest her senior campaign. Couple that with averaging 29.6 points per game her senior year at Drake, Jensen is one of the few players who can say they led the nation in scoring both in high school and at a Division I university.

Jensen graduated from Drake in 1991 with a degree in Public Relations. She earned her Master's in Higher Education five years later.

In February 2007, Jensen received the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

Off the court, Jensen is a leader in fundraising for the United Way of Johnson County. The 2006 campaign totaled over \$2 million -- with a nine percent increase in donations and a 9.7 percent increase in the number of donations. In 2006, she was a recipient of the Corridor Business Journal Forty Under 40 Award. In March 2007, Jensen was named the United Way of Johnson County Volunteer of the Year for her leadership of the Emerging Philanthropists Society and the Healthy Kids School-based Clinics Initiative. She served as a co-chair for last year's United Way fundraising campaign -- the campaign totaled over \$2.5 million -- and serves on the United Way board and the Shelterhouse board, in addition to working with other groups in the Iowa City community.

In the spring of 2014, Jensen was named a recipient of the 'Women of Influence' Award by the Corridor Business Journal. The 'Women of Influence' awards identify women who have made a difference in the Corridor and who are representative role models as leaders in their fields and community.

Jensen and her partner Julie Fitzpatrick, have a son, Jack, and a daughter, Janie.



## **Jenni Fitzgerald**

**Assistant Coach**

**15th Year**

**Drake, 1990**



Jenni Fitzgerald is in her 15th year as an assistant basketball coach at the University of Iowa. She is in her 28th season in women's college basketball as a player and coach.

The native of Long Grove, Iowa, has helped guide Iowa to 13 postseason appearances, including 11 NCAA Tournament berths. Iowa is the only team in the Big Ten, and one of 14 in NCAA Division I women's basketball, to qualify for the NCAA Tournament in each of the last seven years (there are 343 Division I teams). During her time at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have claimed the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead Iowa to 10 first-division finishes in the Big Ten.

Fitzgerald is responsible for off campus recruiting and coaches the perimeter players for the Hawkeyes. She also handles most of the film breakdown, scouting and directs the summer basketball camps.

Under Fitzgerald's tutelage, Iowa's perimeter players have garnered numerous awards. She has coached 12 players to a total of 27 All-Big Ten honors, including eight first team selections and the 2010 Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Printy). Melissa Dixon was also named Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year in 2013. She has also mentored five players that received all-district honors and four honorable mention All-Americans (Consuegra, Alexander, Printy, and Logic).

The Hawkeyes have broken numerous school records during Fitzgerald's time at Iowa. In 2009-10, Iowa shattered both the single season and Big Ten record for three-pointers made and attempted and tied single season marks for assists, three-pointers made in a single game and free throw percentage. Iowa set the school record for team assists in 2012-13 (534), before shattering the record in 2013-14 (644). The Hawkeyes also set the school record for scoring offense in 2013-14 (78.2), leading the league in scoring while scoring the second-most points in a season in Big Ten history (2,814).

Individually, Wendy Ausdemore broke or tied seven school records in her four years at Iowa while Kristi Smith became the first Hawkeye ever to amass over 400 points and 100 assists in three seasons. In 2009-10, Kachine Alexander set new school records in free throws made and attempted in a single season, Kamille Wahlin tied the school record for three-pointers made and set a new mark for three-pointers attempted and also became the first player in school history to record 400 career assists

and 200 made 3-pointers. Kachine Alexander became the first player in school history, and just the fifth in Big Ten history, to collect 1,000 career points, 800 career rebounds and 300 career assists. Jaime Printy finished her career ranked inside the top 10 in points, 3-pointers made and assists at Iowa, while also setting numerous single-game, season and career free throw marks.

Most recently, All-American Samantha Logic surpassed Cara Consuegra (1997-2001) as Iowa's all-time assists leader and became the 31st 1,000-point scorer in program history during the 2013-14 campaign. Logic, the Big Ten leader in assists, notched three triple-doubles, becoming the first Big Ten player to record three triple-doubles in a single season.

Four former Hawkeye guards that Fitzgerald coached continued their playing careers in the WNBA, including Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder, Crystal Smith and Kachine Alexander.

Fitzgerald is very familiar with both Lisa Bluder and fellow assistant Jan Jensen, both of whom she coached with for eight years at Drake University prior to coming to Iowa.

While at Drake, Fitzgerald worked with the guards, directed summer camps and handled the administrative duties for the Bulldog basketball program from 1993-2000.

From 1986-91, Fitzgerald was the starting point guard for the Drake Bulldogs. She was a teammate of fellow Hawkeye assistant coach Jan Jensen. As a senior, Fitzgerald served as her team's captain and was named to the All-Gateway Conference first team. As a junior, Fitzgerald was her team's Most Valuable Player.

Fitzgerald graduated from Drake in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in business administration with a management major. In January 2009, Fitzgerald was one of three former Drake student-athletes to receive the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

After graduation, Fitzgerald completed her Master of Science degree in Physical Education, with an emphasis in Sport Management, from Southern Illinois University in 1992. While at Southern Illinois, Fitzgerald was a graduate assistant with the Salukis.

In high school, Fitzgerald was Iowa's Female Athlete of the Year in 1986 after being named Miss Basketball and first team all-state in basketball, volleyball and softball. In 1995, she was inducted into the Iowa Girl's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Fitzgerald is the daughter of Bob and Jan Fitzgerald. She has an older sister, Robin, and younger brother, Randy.

**Lacey Goldwire****Assistant Coach****Second Year****Oklahoma State, 2010**

Lacey Goldwire is in her second year as an assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa in 2014-15.

The Hawkeyes finished the 2013-14 campaign with an overall record of 27-9 and a ranking of No. 19 in the post-season AP Top 25 Poll during Goldwire's first year in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes' 27 victories equaled the second-highest total in program history, and the most since 1996. In addition, Iowa's 14 home wins equaled the second-highest single-season total in school history. The Hawkeyes made their seventh-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Iowa, a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament, defeated 11th-seeded Marist in the First Round, 87-65, marking the fourth-largest margin of victory in an NCAA Tournament win in program history.

"We are glad to have Lacey join our women's basketball family," said Bluder after the hire. "She is enthusiastic, professional, and relates well to players and recruits. Her main responsibilities with our team will be developing our wing players, and recruiting. I have no doubt that Lacey will be a great Hawkeye."

"I cannot begin to express how excited I am to join the Hawkeye family," said Goldwire following the hire. "The University of Iowa women's basketball program has proved to be top in the nation and is on the rise. Coach Bluder and the staff at Iowa are an accomplished and outstanding group of women, and I am very privileged to get to work with such an experienced staff. It is great to be a part of a program with such an amazing fan base and support system. The Hawkeye fans love women's basketball and make Carver-Hawkeye Arena a fun place to play."

"I am very appreciative of the opportunity to work at the University of Iowa, and I am thankful for those who have helped me get to this point."

Goldwire spent the 2012-13 season as an assistant coach at Morehead State. Prior to joining the Eagles' staff, Goldwire served on the Oklahoma State staff for four seasons -- two as a student assistant and two as a graduate assistant.

Following Oklahoma State's tragic loss of its head and assistant coach during a plane crash in November of 2011, Goldwire was elevated to interim assistant coach where she took on added recruiting duties. During her time with the program, the Cowgirls won 80 games and advanced to the postseason all four years, winning the 2012 WNIT championship.

Goldwire, an Oklahoma City native, played collegiately at East Central (Okla.) University where she ranks fifth in career scoring with 1,340 points. She averaged 21.1 points and 5.9 rebounds as a senior and was tabbed Lone Star Conference North co-Player of the Year and Second-Team All-South Central Region. She also earned ECU's Athlete of the Year honor in 2007-08. She was named honorable mention All-LSC following her sophomore and junior campaigns.

Goldwire, an all-state and all-city player at Del City (Okla.) High School, graduated from Oklahoma State with a bachelor of science in education and a master's degree in teaching, learning and leadership.

Abby Emmert is in her sixth year as director of basketball operations for the University of Iowa women's basketball program.

The Winterset, Iowa, native works with the Hawkeye basketball staff, helping coordinate and carry out day-to-day activities of the program. Emmert is responsible for arranging team travel and activities, supervising public service opportunities for the team, and coordinating summer camps and training tables.

Emmert is also Iowa's chief scheduler, helping to build one of the most exciting and demanding schedules in the country for the Hawkeye program.

Emmert was a member of the Iowa women's basketball team from 2005-08. She was named team co-captain in 2008, and helped lead the Hawkeyes to the Big Ten regular season championship. Emmert also received the Dr. Christine Grant Leadership Award for women's basketball as a senior.

Emmert played in 123 career games as a Hawkeye, including 22 starts. Her 123 games played are the tied for the fourth-most of any player in Iowa women's basketball history.

She scored 299 career points, collected 144 rebounds and dished out 177 assists. She scored a career-high 17 points against Iowa State as a junior in 2006.

Emmert graduated with a Communications Studies degree from the University of Iowa in 2008, and worked for the United Way of East Central Iowa before taking over as director of basketball operations.

**1986-87 (26-5, 17-1)**

The 1986-87 team won its first Big Ten Championship when the Hawkeyes claimed a share of the title with a 17-1 conference record. The team would go on and advance to the Elite Eight in the NCAA Tournament.

**1987-88 (29-2, 17-1)**

The 1987-88 Hawkeyes won their first outright Big Ten Championship with a 17-1 regular season conference mark. The team finished the season ranked No. 2 in the final Associated Press poll.

**1988-89 (27-5, 16-2)**

In 1988-89, the Hawkeyes claimed a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 15-3 mark. This group of Hawkeyes would extend its home winning streak to 41 games, the second-longest in the nation at the time.

**1989-90 (23-6, 15-3)**

During the 1989-90 season, the Hawkeyes won a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 15-3 conference record. The Hawkeyes finished the season ranked No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll.

**1991-92 (25-4, 16-2)**

The 1991-92 Hawkeyes won the Big Ten Championship outright with a 16-2 conference record. Iowa finished the season ranked No. 7 in the AP poll.

**1992-93 (27-4, 16-2)**

With a 16-2 conference record, Iowa claimed a share of the Big Ten title during the 1992-93 season. This special group of Hawkeyes would go on to become the only Iowa team to advance to the Final Four.

**1995-96 (27-4, 15-1)**

The 1995-96 Hawkeyes finished with a 15-1 mark to win their seventh Big Ten title. This group of Hawkeyes finished the season ranked No. 7 in the AP poll.

**1997 Big Ten Tournament (18-12, 9-7)**

The 1996-97 Hawkeyes finished fourth in the Big Ten during the regular season and needed to win the Big Ten Tournament in order to advance to the NCAA Tournament. Iowa defeated Northwestern, Indiana and Illinois to win its first Big Ten Tournament title.

**1997-98 (18-11, 13-3)**

Iowa's 1997-98 squad finished the regular season with a 13-3 conference mark to secure its eighth Big Ten Championship. The team finished the season ranked No. 24 in the final Associated Press poll.

**2001 Big Ten Tournament (21-10, 12-4)**

In Lisa Bluder's first year at Iowa, the 2000-01 Hawkeyes finished second in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes knocked off Indiana, Illinois and Purdue to win the first Big Ten Tournament crown under Bluder.

**2008-09 (21-11, 13-5)**

In 2008, Iowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship, its ninth in school history. The Hawkeyes won a Big Ten-season-best eight-straight during league play.

**Michelle Edwards (1984-88)**

A native of Boston, and a Class of 2014 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee, Michelle Edwards is one of the most decorated players in Iowa women's basketball history. The 5-foot-9 guard, nicknamed "Ice", amassed a career record of 97-22 from 1984-1988. During her four years, Edwards led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA Tournament appearances and two Big Ten titles. In 1988, she was named the Champion Products National Player of the Year, the highest honor in women's collegiate basketball. Edwards garnered several other honors that year including being named a Kodak All-American, a Naismith All-American, a USBWA All-American, the Big Ten Player of the Year, and the University of Iowa Athlete of the Year. In her senior season, Edwards also led Iowa to its first ever national No. 1 ranking, along with a record of 29-2 overall and 17-1 in the Big Ten. She paced the Hawkeyes, averaging 20 points, 4.8 rebounds, 4.5 assists, and 2.9 steals. The three-time first team All-Big Ten selection is the only Hawkeye to have her jersey retired (No. 30). Edwards ranks high in several Iowa statistical categories, including third in career assists (431), fourth in career scoring (1,821), and third in career steals (235). She also ranks second among single season scoring leaders (621). Edwards -- inducted into the University of Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000 -- played in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and was a member of the U.S. Select Team in 1986. In 1991, she was part of the United States Pan American Team, and she also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988 and 1992. Upon graduation, Edwards played professionally in Italy for nine seasons before joining the WNBA during its inaugural year in 1997. She then spent three seasons with the Cleveland Rockers and two seasons with the Seattle Storm.

**Franthea Price (1986-90)**

Franthea Price -- a 2013 National Iowa Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame inductee -- played for the Hawkeyes from 1986-1990, and in her senior season, she became the second Kodak All-American in school history. The four-year starter from River Rouge, Mich., had an impressive career at Iowa, which began with her being named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1987. Price was named first team All-Big Ten in 1988 and 1990, and second team All-Big Ten in 1989. In her senior year, Price earned the honor of Big Ten Player of the Year and led the conference in scoring at 19.8 points per game. The 5-foot-9 forward led the Hawkeyes in several statistical categories that year including scoring (21.2), rebounding (7.1), steals (2.9), and 3-point field goals (47). A consistent contributor, Price scored in double figures in 34 of her last 35 games. She holds the school record for career steals with 321, and is tied for first for most steals in a single game with nine. Price also ranks sixth in career scoring (1,742), eighth in career assists (387), and 11th in career rebounds (726). Outside of Iowa, Price was a member of the U.S. World Junior National Team in 1986 and competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and 1986. In 1987, Price won a gold medal as part of the United States William R. Jones Cup team, and she was a member of the United States Select team in 1989. Price also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988. After finishing her career at Iowa, Price played professionally in Spain for several years before joining the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs in 1998.

**Toni Foster (1989-93)**

A 6-foot-1 forward from Chicago, Toni Foster was named a Kodak All-American in 1993 and was a finalist for Champion Player of the Year. Foster played for the Hawkeyes from 1989-1993, and led the team in both scoring and rebounding for three consecutive years, a feat accomplished only once previously. A three-time first team All-Big Ten selection, Foster was named the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1993. She was also named the 1993 SportsChannel Player of the Year. During her senior season, Price led Iowa in scoring (15.7), rebounding (8.2), and blocked shots (1.3). She collected 27 double-doubles during her illustrious career, including nine in her senior year. In Iowa's career statistical categories, Foster ranks third in rebounds (887) and fifth in blocks (145). She also ranks seventh in scoring (1,606) and 13th in steals (167). Foster competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1987 and 1991. When the WNBA was formed in 1997, Foster was the seventh overall pick and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury. She spent two seasons with the Mercury before joining the Seattle Storm in 1999 by way of an expansion draft.
