- Monday's game against North Carolina A&T is the second of three Dale Howard Classic preliminary games. The Hawkeyes will also face Campbell (Nov. 23).
- Monday will be the first ever meeting between the two teams.
- North Carolina A&T is located in Greensboro, N.C. The Aggies are a member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). The Hawkeyes are a perfect 9-0 all-time against current members of the MEAC.
- Coach McCaffery has coached against North Carolina A&T three previous times (2000, 2001, 2002), all while he was head coach at UNC Greensboro. The Spartans won two of the three games against North Carolina A&T.
- Iowa is 5-1 all-time in games played on Nov. 14.
- Iowa will be gunning for its 350th win in Carver-Hawkeye Arena Monday. The Hawkeyes are 349-111 (.759) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena since January 1983.

## HAWKEYES OVERWHELM CHICAGO STATE IN OPENER

Iowa won its first season opener in three years with an impressive 96-53 triumph over Chicago State Friday on Mediacom Court at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa started the game on a 10-0 run and ended the half scoring the final 11 points to build a comfortable 43-20 halftime cushion. The Hawkeyes expanded on their lead in the second half, outscoring the Cougars 53-33 in the final 20 minutes.

Four Hawkeyes scored in double figures: Aaron White (19), Melsahn Basabe (14), Zach McCabe (13) and Eric May (12). White also grabbed 10 rebounds to become the first Hawkeye to post a double-double this season (Iowa had four players collect double-doubles a year ago).

Iowa shot the ball well the charity stripe, sinking 27-32 (.844) shots. Basabe (8-8) and White (5-5) combined to go a perfect 13-13 from the foul line.

## SEASON OPENER TIP-INS

- Friday's announced attendance of 12,897 was Iowa's best attendance for a home opener since 2001 (15,500).
- Eric May dished out a game-high five assists, which is a new personal best.
- Roy Devyn Marble collected a career-high three steals. Marble had four steals in four contests a year ago. The native of Southfield, Mich., also grabbed seven rebounds and dished out four assists, both matching personal bests.
- Iowa's 27 free throws made tied its season high of free throws made last season (27-39 vs. Indiana). Also, the 84.4 percent bested its season high from 2010-11 (minimum 15 attempts).
- Iowa's defense held Chicago State to only 10 percent (1-10) shooting from long distance. The Hawkeyes forced 27 turnovers and converted those miscues into 25 points.
- Friday was a team win, as the Hawkeye bench contributed 57 points.

## Head Coach Fran McCaffery

Fran McCaffery is in his second season as the head basketball coach at the University of Iowa and his 16th year overall as a college head coach. McCaffery spent five seasons (2005-10) as the head coach at Siena, six years at UNC-Greensboro (1999-2005) and three seasons at Lehigh (1985-88) before joining the Hawkeyes.



McCaffery has nearly three decades of Division I coaching experience. He completed his 29th season as a collegiate coach in 2011, which includes 15 years as a head coach and 14 as an assistant.

McCaffery, 50, holds a career mark of 263-197 (.572) and guided his teams to six postseason appearances (five NCAA, one NIT). He is 12-20 (.375) at Iowa.

McCaffery's five years at Siena were the best in its 70-year history. He led the Saints on an incredible run that ended with three straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championships and NCAA Tournament appearances. In so doing, Siena became the only program in the country to win its regular season and postseason title the last three years.

McCaffery's Saints owned a 112-51 (.687) record in his five years with the program. He guided the Saints to four consecutive 20-win seasons, something that has never been accomplished before at the Siena.

The 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year and 2010 District I Coach of the Year is the third winningest coach, by percentage, in league history (68-22, .756). He is the only coach to guide a MAAC program to two NCAA Tournament wins. McCaffery led his 2008 and 2009 teams to first round NCAA Tournament victories over Vanderbilt and Ohio State, respectively.

In his final two seasons at Siena, he coached the Saints to back-to-back 27-win campaigns and boasted a combined 39-3 (.929) record against MAAC opponents, which included MAAC Tournament contests.

McCaffery began his coaching career as an assistant at Penn (1982-83) and Lehigh (1983-85). Then at age 26, he became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when hired by Lehigh in 1985. After three seasons as head coach at Lehigh, he spent 11 seasons as an assistant at Notre Dame (1988-99).

McCaffery played basketball at Wake Forest his freshman year (1977-78) and then concluded his collegiate playing career at Penn his final three seasons (1979-82).

He earned his B.S. degree in Economics from The Wharton School (Penn) in 1982. McCaffery also earned a Master of Education from Lehigh in 1985.

## SCOUTING NORTH CAROLINA A&T

- North Carolina A&T is led by ninth-year head coach Jerry Eaves.
- North Carolina A&T lost its season opener 97-65 Friday night at Creighton in a Dale Howard Classic preliminary contest. No Aggie reached double figures in scoring. Forward Adam Witter was their leading scorer, netting nine points on 4-6 shooting from the field.
- North Carolina A&T was outrebounded 50-34 and outscored 16-2 in fastbreak points Friday.
- The Aggies posted a 15-17 overall record and a 9-7 conference mark a year ago.
- North Carolina A&T has appeared in nine NCAA Tournaments, including seven straight appearances (1982-88).
- The Aggies return nine lettermen, including four starters, from a year ago and also welcome seven newcomers. Eleven of the Aggies' 17-player roster are upperclassmen. Nic Simpson is the team's top returning scorer, who averaged 13.3 points, bolstered by a team-best 58 triples made. Thomas Coleman led the Aggies in scoring (17.0), rebounding (10.5), blocks (83) and steals (36) last season, but is the one starter not back.
- Twelve of North Carolina A&T's first 15 games will be on the road. The Aggies will play in nine different states (Nebraska, Iowa, Indiana, North Carolina, Texas, Ohio, Florida, California and Hawaii) during that stretch.

## WHITE SHINES IN DEBUT

Freshman Aaron White had a solid debut in Iowa's 96-53 victory over Chicago State. White led all scorers with 19 points on 6-12 shooting from the field, including 2-3 from 3-point range, and a perfect 5-5 at the foul line. He also snagged a game-high 10 boards and registered two steals in only 18 minutes of game action.

The 19 points is believed to be the most by a Hawkeye freshman in a season opener. Ricky Davis had 18 points against Chicago State in 1997, while Dick Ives netted 17 versus Western Illinois in 1944. Furthermore, White's performance marked the first time a Hawkeye posted a double-double, in his debut since Dean Oliver posted 10 points and 12 assists in a victory over Chicago State in 1997. It marked the first time a Hawkeye had a double-double, points and rebounds, since Jess Settles had 13 points and 11 rebounds versus Drake in 1993.

## McCABE HAS ANOTHER SOLID SEASON OPENER

For the second straight year, Zach McCabe had a good stat line on his season opener. McCabe totaled 13 points and five rebounds against Chicago State Friday. Last season, the native of Sioux City had 11 points and seven boards versus South Dakota State.

## EXPERIENCED BACKCOURT

Iowa has the most experienced starting backcourt duo in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes are the only league team with two starting senior guards, Bryce Cartwright and Matt Gatens.

## GATENS RANKS AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST FT SHOOTERS

Senior Matt Gatens has converted 86.8% (237-273) of his free throw attempts. He currently is tied with Penn State's Pete Lisicky (.868, 223-257) and Ohio State's Jamar Butler (.868, 231-266) for fourth in Big Ten career free throw percentage (minimum 200 made) behind Indiana's Steve Alford (.898, 535-596), Penn State's Joe Crispin (.885, 448-506) and Wisconsin's Rick Olson (.870, 260-299).

## BASABE RANKS HIGH ON HAWKEYE ROOKIE CHARTS

Melsahn Basabe had a stellar rookie campaign in 2011 and ranks among some of the best Iowa freshmen of all-time in a number of statistical categories. Basabe scored 342 points (11.0 avg.), pulled down 210 rebounds (6.8 avg.) and blocked 41 shots (1.3 avg.). Also, he was 131-229 (.572) from the field and 80-112 (.714) from the foul line. ## BASABE ETCHED HIS NAME IN HAWKEYE RECORD BOOKS

Melsahn Basabe is the only Hawkeye rookie to ever amass over 340 points, 200 rebounds and 40 blocks. The native of Glen Cove, NY, finished his rookie campaign with 342 points, 210 rebounds and 41 blocks.

In fact, he is the first Iowa player -- regardless of class -- to accomplish the feat since Ryan Bowen totaled 447 points, 271 rebounds and 41 blocks his senior season in 1997-98.

## HAWKEYE FAST BREAKS

- Seven of Iowa's first eight contests will be played at home, with the non-home game during the stretch being played on a neutral floor in Des Moines versus Creighton.

- Matt Gatens is only two points from equaling Kenny Arnold (1979-82) for 29th place and eight from matching Michael Payne (1982-95) and Chris Kingsbury (1994-96) for 27th on Iowa's career scoring chart.

- Iowa saw an increase in its attendance numbers in 2010-11. Compared to 2009-10, last year's Hawkeyes averaged 2,085 more fans than the previous season, an increase of 20%. Iowa averaged 9,550 fans two years ago, compared to 11,635 last year.

- Bryce Cartwright ranked first in Big Ten assists (6.83) and 18th nationally a year ago. He became the first Hawkeye since Dean Oliver (5.2 avg.) in 2001 to lead the Big Ten in assists, in conference play.

- Iowa's five freshmen, in 2011, averaged a combined 22.9 points per game, an average that ranked third in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (34.0) and Michigan (31.7). Two of Michigan's freshmen are redshirts.

## COACHING EXPERIENCE

Fran McCaffery has assembled one of the most experienced coaching staffs in the country. Assistant coaches Kirk Speraw, Sherman Dillard and Andrew Francis have over six decades of combined coaching experience. Furthermore, the entire coaching staff combines for 47 years of head coaching experience.

Director of Basketball Operations Jerry Strom is in his 31st season as a member of the Iowa basketball staff. Also, former Hawkeye standout and professional basketball player Ryan Bowen is the video coordinator. Bowen was on four NBA rosters (Denver, Houston, New Orleans and Oklahoma City).

## HAWKEYES ARE TOUGH AT HOME

Iowa has won 73 of its 103 games (.709) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500) over the last eight seasons, including win streaks of 21 straight overall and 12 straight Big Ten Conference wins. Iowa has won 10 of its last 20 home games against ranked opponents. Iowa was a perfect 17-0 at home in 2006, 14-2 in 2007, 10-8 in 2008, 13-4 in 2009, 9-9 in 2010 and 8-8 this season.

## IOWA IN CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

Iowa has compiled a 349-111 (.759) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena since the facility opened in January, 1983. Iowa is 162-89 (.645) in Big Ten games and 187-22 (.895) in non-Big Ten contests.

### CARTWRIGHT JOINS SELECT GROUP

Point guard Bryce Cartwright dished out 123 assists, during Big Ten play, becoming only the sixth Hawkeye since 1975 to lead the league in assists. Cartwright finished with 10 more assists than second place Darius Morris of Michigan (113).

Cartwright's 6.83 assists average is the highest by an Iowa player since Cal Wulfsberg's 7.7 average in 1975.

Cartwright, who averaged 10.9 points and 5.8 assists in 2011, is one of only two Iowa players to ever average better than 10.5 points and 5.8 assists in a single-season. Andre Woolridge is the other Hawkeye to accomplish the feat. Woolridge averaged 20.2 points and six assists in 1997; 13.1 points and six assists in 1996 and 14 points and 5.8 assists in 1995.

## Iowa's 2012 Recruiting Class

Anthony Clemmons, Mike Gesell, Patrick Ingram, Kyle Meyer and Adam Woodbury have signed national letter of intents to attend the University of Iowa.

"I'm very excited about this class," said McCaffery. "We started working immediately upon arrival, in particular, on this group. I want to give particular recognition to how hard each and every one of my assistant coaches has worked. I believe we've addressed specific needs and attracted not only quality, but student-athletes who will fit with what we already have here to ultimately make us a better team."

Iowa's five-member 2012 recruiting class is ranked 19th by ESPN.com and Scout.com.

Paul Biancardi, who is ESPN's national recruiting director, had nothing but praise to say about Iowa's recruiting class and coach McCaffery.

"I'm very impressed, but not surprised, with the class coach McCaffery signed," said Biancardi. "This is a national statement class. Coach McCaffery and his staff have sold the vision and the plan for Iowa basketball in a big time way. It should get the fans of Iowa very excited not only right now but in the future. To be successful in this business you have to be able to recruit, and Fran's a proven recruiter. This is a class, that as it grows and develops together, will be the foundation for Iowa basketball. It will propel the Hawkeyes to the next step, which is the upper half of the Big Ten and NCAA Tournament."

### ADAM WOODBURY (7-1, 230)

Woodbury is an All-State center from Sioux City, Iowa. The 7-foot-1, 230-pound was named the Most Valuable Player at the 2011 NBA Players Association Top 100 Camp. Woodbury is the No. 41 ranked player in the Class of 2012 by ESPN.com, No. 42 by Rivals.com and No. 47 by Scout.com. He enters his senior season ranked fourth in career scoring and first in rebounding at East High School. He led the Black Raiders to a combined 59-16 record the last three seasons, including back-to-back conference championships and three consecutive state tournament appearances. Woodbury is a two-time first team All-State, All-Missouri River Conference, All-Northwest Iowa and All-City honoree. As a junior, Woodbury averaged a double-double (18.5 points and 12 rebounds). He averaged 17.4 points and grabbed a school single-season record 315 rebounds (12.1 avg.) his sophomore campaign. Woodbury also participated in the Nike LeBron James Skills Academy and Amare Stoudemire Skills Academy in 2011. He played AAU for Martin Brothers and All-Iowa Attack from seventh through 11th grade. Fellow recruit Mike Gesell was an AAU teammate of Woodbury. Woodbury becomes Iowa's first seven-footer since Seth Gorney (2005-08) and is the tallest Hawkeye since Antonio Ramos (1999), who stood 7-foot-2.

### MIKE GESELL (6-1, 180)

Gesell is a three-time first team All-State, All-Conference and All-Metro honoree for South Sioux City High School. Gesell is the No. 73 ranked player in the Class of 2012 by ESPN.com, No. 89 by Scout.com and No. 96 by Rivals.com. As a junior, he averaged 25.2 points, 8.2 assists, 5.5 rebounds and 2.9 steals while being honored as the Nebraska Gatorade Basketball Player of the Year. As a sophomore, Gesell averaged 19.9 points, 6.4 assists, 7.7 rebounds and 3.3 steals. He made 82 percent (158-193) of his free throw attempts as a junior and 79 percent (125-158) as a sophomore. The 6-foot-1, 180-pound guard was a Basketball Super State and All-State Class B Team Captain recipient his sophomore and junior seasons. He holds single season school records for scoring (655), assists (212) and steals (79), career scoring (1,446) and single-game steals (8) and assists (13). Gesell, who is a Wendy's High School Heisman state finalist and will be the team's captain this year, also excels in the classroom, ranking in the top five percent of his class while earning Gold Honor Roll distinction all four years. He also is a three-time Academic All-Conference and NSAA Academic All-State honoree. Fellow recruit Adam Woodbury was a teammate of Gesell on Martin Brothers and the All-Iowa Attack AAU squads.

### ANTHONY CLEMMONS (6-1, 185)

Clemmons is a native of Lansing, Mich., and has started the last two years for Sexton High School. The 6-foot-1, 185-pound point guard helped his team to back-to-back conference championships and a Class B state title a year ago. Sexton finished as state runner-up his sophomore season. Clemmons is a two-time All-Conference honoree and was an All-State and All-Area selection in 2011. Clemmons averaged 12.3 points, 4.6 rebounds, 4.1 assists and 3.2 steals his junior year. He will serve as a team co-captain his senior campaign. Clemmons played AAU basketball the last two years with the Michigan Mustangs. He also played football his freshman through junior years at Sexton, earning all-conference honors in 2010, playing fullback, linebacker and safety.

### PATRICK INGRAM (6-2, 190)

Ingram is a 6-foot-2, 190-pound guard from Indianapolis. He is a two-year starter and helped North Central High School win back-to-back conference championships and the Class 4A state championship in 2010. His high school team boasted a combined 70-8 record his first three seasons. Ingram averaged 10.4 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists his junior campaign. He shot 55.5 percent from the field and 33-percent from beyond the arc. A captain on this year's team, Ingram also played on the AAU circuit for the Eric Gordon All-Stars. His team won the Walt Disney World tournament, Eric Gordon Shootout and the IndyBall Tournament. Ingram was tabbed MVP of the Walt Disney World tournament.

### KYLE MEYER (6-10, 220)

Meyer is a 6-foot-10, 220-pound forward from Alpharetta, Ga. Meyer averaged 15 points, 11 rebounds, 3.5 blocks and 2.6 assists for Northview High School as a junior. He earned All-Region and co-MVP accolades as a junior, and was also recognized on the 2010 Pickens All-Tournament team. Meyer, who attends the same high school as Minnesota senior Ralph Sampson III, is a three-year starter. He averaged 10 points, 9.5 rebounds and 2.2 blocks, and earned the team's Coaches Award his sophomore campaign. Meyer garnered all-tournament laurels at the Chattahoochee Tournament as a freshman. Meyer also played AAU basketball for the Atlanta Celtics.

## *Carver-Hawkeye Arena and Dale and Marilyn Howard Family Pavilion*



In September 2011, the University of Iowa completed a \$47 million revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena. That project includes the construction of a practice facility for men's and women's basketball and volleyball, a 10,000-square-foot strength training and cardiovascular center, and an expansion to the Dan Gable Wrestling Complex, in addition to new locker room and support facilities for men's and women's basketball, wrestling and volleyball programs, and office space for the majority of Iowa administrative and coaching staffs.

Carver-Hawkeye Arena's four-story, 75,000-square foot addition has been named the Dale and Marilyn Howard Family Pavilion, named after the Howard's gave a multi-million dollar contribution to the athletic department.

"The Howard's have done so much for our program and the UI Athletics Department," said Iowa head coach Fran McCaffery. "Their generosity has helped pave the way for this beautiful state-of-the-art facility that our program desperately needed. Everything from the offices, locker room, practice gym to the weight room, is first class. We are extremely thankful for the Howard's contribution and are so proud to name the new addition after Dale and Marilyn Howard."

Matt Gatens is in his final season with the Hawkeyes and is ecstatic for the new additions and amenities to Carver-Hawkeye Arena.



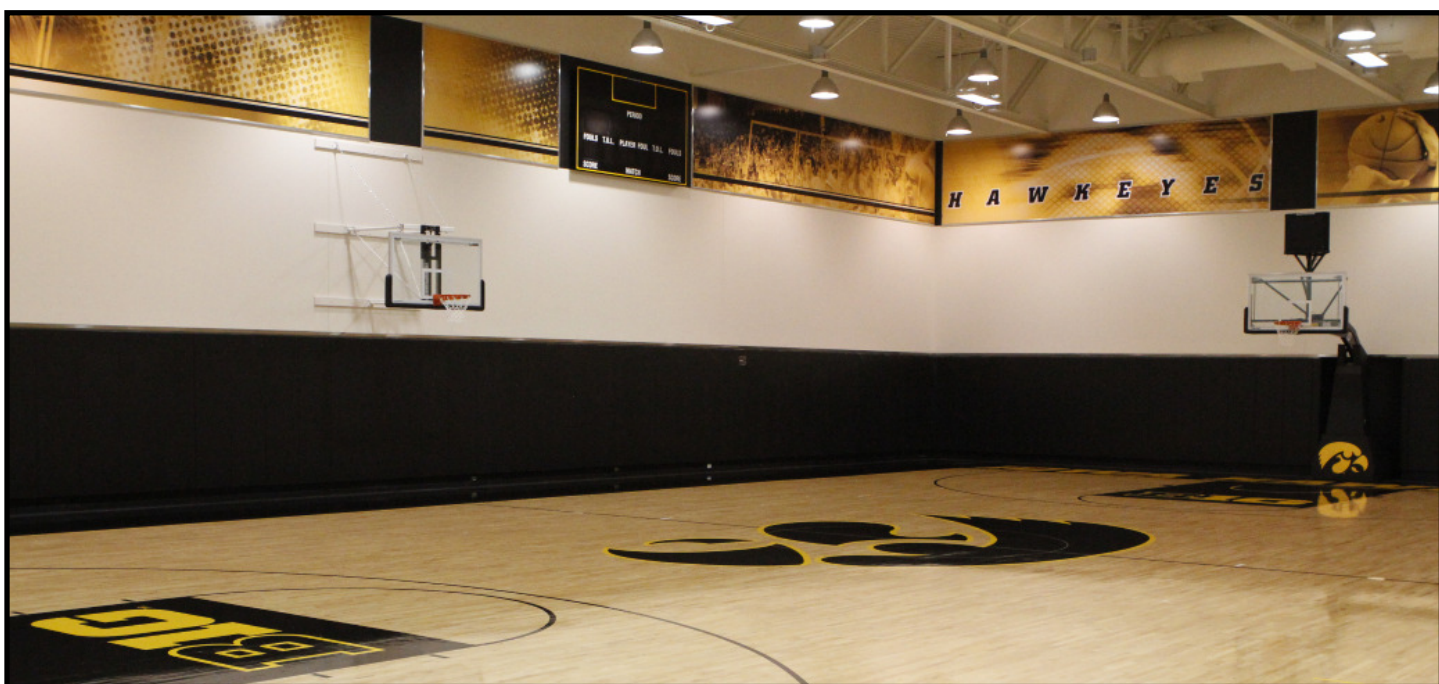




“The new facilities are first class,” said Gatens. “After two years of construction, it’s good to finally be able to use the facility in our training efforts. It’s nice to be able to have a practice gym where we can come over and get extra shots up at our leisure. It’s great to be a Hawkeye!”

The addition of the practice facility eliminates the need to have student-athletes in the sports of men’s basketball, women’s basketball and volleyball practice and train at unusual or irregular times of day or at times which are typically reserved for classes. The flexibility created by the practice space also positively impacts the potential for use of the arena for other University and community-related events such as concerts.

The revitalization of the arena also extends into spaces used by the general public on game days and nights, including renovation of select concessions and restroom facilities, and the creation of hospitality and meeting spaces combined with club facilities for fans of the Hawkeyes who choose to participate in a variety of premium seating options similar to that which are available in the Paul W. Brechler Press Box at Kinnick Stadium.
