Although the 2006-07 season did not yield post season play, there were a number of team and individual highlights the Hawkeyes can build on. Below is a list of bright spots from last season...

- Iowa captured the WBCA Classic and KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge tournaments.

- Iowa was the only Big Ten team with two underclassmen recognized on all-conference teams. Wendy Ausdemore and Kristi Smith were honored on the third team. Additionally, Megan Skouby earned honorable mention laurels.

- The Hawkeyes played the 24th-most difficult schedule in the country, including one of the toughest conference schedules having to play the top three teams in the league each twice. Iowa finished only one game from fifth place in the Big Ten standings. Iowa's 24th-rated strength of schedule is its highest since playing the 12th toughest in 2003-04.

- Iowa recorded seven road victories in 2006-07; the Hawkeyes tallied six in 2005-06.

- Iowa rallied from a 17-point second-half deficit and ultimately won at Minnesota (58-56) on Dec. 28. The 17-point rally is the second-largest in school history. The win was Iowa's first at Williams Arena under Coach Lisa Bluder.

- Iowa broke the school record for free throw and 3-point field goal accuracy. The Hawkeyes' 78.8 percent free throw percentage and 40.2 percent 3-point field goal percentage ranks first and third in Big Ten single-season history, respectively.

- Iowa finished the season ranked second in the country in 3-point accuracy and fifth in free throw percentage. Individually, Wendy Ausdemore ranked 14th nationally in 3-point field goal percentage, while Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby ranked 21st and 27th, respectively, in free throw percentage.

- Iowa broke the school record and Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for free throws made in a single-game when it sank 33 vs. Indiana State on Nov. 15. The Hawkeyes' 43 attempts against the Sycamores is an arena record for foul shot attempts. Iowa also converted 31-38 from the charity stripe against Wisconsin at Carver-Hawkeye Arena on Feb. 25. The 31 free throws made and 38 attempts are new arena records for a Big Ten game. Not to be outdone, Iowa converted 14-15 (.933) from the free throw line against Illinois on Feb. 18, which matches the Iowa arena and school conference single-game record for accuracy.

- Kristi Smith finished the season converting (45-91, .495) from behind the 3-point arc, a percentage that ranks second-best in Iowa single-season annals. Wendy Ausdemore's 41.6 percentage (62-149) ranks seventh-best.

- Iowa poured in 56 second-half points against the Badgers on Feb. 25 at Carver-Hawkeye Arena, which is an arena record for second half points.

- Iowa converted 14-15 (.933) from the foul line against Illinois on Feb. 15. The 93.3 percent free throw percentage tied a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record by an Iowa team. The Hawkeyes also made 14-15 (.933) against the Fighting Illini on Dec. 28, 1998.

- Wendy Ausdemore tied the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for 3-pointers made by an Iowa player when she drained five vs. Quinnipiac on Nov. 17. She bested that performance by sinking six vs. Wisconsin on Feb. 25 to establish a new arena record. The six triples was one shy of Lindsey Meder's school-record of seven treys set on Dec. 31, 2000, also against the Badgers.

- Iowa's five-member sophomore class was responsible for 69 percent of its offense (1,408 of 2,034 points).

- Iowa was 7-8 (.875) from 3-point territory in its 79-72 triumph over Penn State on Feb. 18. The 87.5 percent shooting behind the arc broke the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record and tied the Big Ten single-game mark for percentage.
- Wendy Ausdemore was named to the Academic All-District second team. The pre-business major, who boasts a 3.83 GPA, was the only sophomore named to either the first or second District team.
- Kristi Smith finished the season with 402 points and 124 assists. The sophomore became the first Iowa underclassman to amass over 400 points and 100 assists in a single-season. In fact, the feat has been accomplished only four other times by two other players (Jollette Law and Michelle Edwards) in Hawkeye history.
- In her first start since recovering from a dislocated right shoulder, Krista VandeVenter netted a career-high 23 points on 8-8 shooting from the field and 7-9 from the free throw line at Drake on Dec. 22. The perfect shooting was one field goal made and attempt from equalling Jamie Cavey's (9-9, 1.000) school record, which was set on March 23, 2003 against Marquette.
- Iowa's 103-point outburst vs. Wisconsin was a season high by a Big Ten team in 2006-07 and marked only the fifth time in school history the Hawkeyes netted over 100 points. The 103 points is the second-highest scoring output in school annals and is a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record.
- Wendy Ausdemore missed only one free throw attempt (39-40, .975) during the 16-game conference season; her 97.5 percent shooting from the charity stripe is a school record and ranks second in Big Ten history during league play. Additionally, she converted 55-61 (.902) from the foul line, a school record for single-season free throw accuracy.
- Iowa was the only Big Ten team with two players, both sophomores, ranked in the top-seven in scoring during conference play. Wendy Ausdemore, who averaged 10.6 points in non-conference action, improved to 15.2 per contest in Big Ten play and finished ranked fifth. Kristi Smith was only three points behind Ausdemore and was seventh, averaging 15 points per Big Ten game.
- Iowa was the only league team with three players who made 39 triples or more in 2006-07. Wendy Ausdemore led the Hawkeyes with 62, followed by Kristi Smith (45) and Lindsey Nyenhuis (39). Ausdemore's 62 triples broke Lindsey Meder's (60) mark for 3-pointers in a single-season by a sophomore. Smith's 45 treys rank third by an Iowa sophomore, while Nyenhuis' 39 rank fourth.
- Last year, after starting center Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending knee injury, Megan Skouby filled the role successfully. This year, after Megan Skouby was sidelined with an injury, Nicole VanderPol stepped in and made the most of her increased role. VanderPol averaged 3.5 points, in a limited role, in the first 24 games, but averaged 11.5 points the last six. She also posted team highs in rebounding twice and scoring once.
- With Iowa's leading rebounder (Krista VandeVenter) sidelined for the first seven games of the season, Jenee Graham stepped up and filled the rebounding void. Graham pulled down double-digit rebounds 11 times and was the Hawkeyes leading rebounder 15 times. Graham finished the season ranked fourth in Big Ten rebounding (7.8).
- Kristi Smith averaged 34 minutes per contest in 2006-07, which is the highest playing average by a Hawkeye since point guard Cara Consuegra averaged 35.1 minutes during the 2000-01 season.

Ausdemore was a third team all-Big Ten selection and was the Iowa women's basketball nominee for the Big Ten Sportsmanship award last year. The 6-2 forward was also named Academic all-Big Ten and was the only sophomore named to the Academic All-District VII team in 2007. Ausdemore established four school records her sophomore campaign.

Despite missing action and being hampered with a broken bone in her non-shooting hand the last month of 2007, Skouby was recognized on the honorable mention all-Big Ten squad. Skouby was also a second team all-Big Ten honoree and named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2006.

Smith was a third team all-Big Ten selection in 2007. The 5-6 point guard contributed 402 points and 124 assists as the Hawkeye floor general. Smith became the first Iowa underclassman and third player overall to amass over 400 points and 124 assists in a single-season.

KANSAS CITY, MO -- Iowa started its season with a win for the seventh time under seventh-year Head Coach Lisa Bluder with a 79-70 victory over Missouri State in the first round of the WBCA Classic.

Iowa had three sophomores score double figures to lead the Hawkeyes to victory. Kristi Smith had a great game directing the Hawkeye offense. The point guard netted a team-high 20 points and collected six assists and two steals. Smith was 11-12 from the foul line, including sinking all eight of her free throw attempts in the final three minutes of the contest. Iowa shot a blistering 90.5 percent (19-21) from the free throw line, including making 11-12 the final three minutes to seal the victory. The Hawkeyes also did an excellent job distributing and possessing the ball; Iowa had 20 assists and only 13 turnovers.

Defensively, Iowa held Missouri State's leading scorer Tiff Terwelp to five points and two turnovers. Busby, who knocked down five straight treys in the first half, was held scoreless and had two turnovers in the second stanza by the Hawkeyes.

Junior Jenee Graham was a spark defensively for the Hawkeyes, collecting career highs in rebounds (10), blocks (2) and steals (3). She also chipped in with seven points.

Jenee Graham pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds for the second consecutive game.

Iowa shot 47.6 percent (20-42) from the field, bolstered by 57.1 percent (4-7) shooting from behind the 3-point arc. The Hawkeye defense held the Jayhawks to only 7.7 percent (1-13) from 3-point range.

IOWA CITY -- Four Hawkeyes scored in double figures en route to a 93-77 victory over Quinnipiac in the first round of the 21st annual KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The 93 points is Iowa's highest output since scoring 93 vs. Saint Louis in March 2003.

The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 55.6 percent (35-63) from the field, bolstered by 69.2 percent (9-13) from behind the 3-point arc. Posting career highs in assists were Jenee Graham (7), Nyenhuis (3) and Nicole VanderPol (2). Ausdemore tied a career high with five dimes.

With Iowa trailing 18-14 in the first half last night, Wendy Ausdemore delivered her own 10-0 run with two 3-pointers, a base-line jumper and a pair of free throws. Iowa concluded the half on a 15-6 run to claim a 44-41 halftime advantage.

Graham snagged a game-high 10 rebounds in only 23 minutes of action after being whistled for two quick fouls in the first minute of the contest. Graham has posted double-digit rebounds in Iowa's first four games.

Iowa out-scored the Bobcats 19-4 in fast break points and out-rebounded Quinnipiac 39-22 in victory.

IOWA CITY -- Iowa rebounded from its loss to Iowa State with a 66-60 triumph over Samford at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa led from start-to-finish en route to its seventh win of the year.

For the second consecutive contest, Iowa sprinted out to a double-digit advantage in the first four minutes, scoring the first 10 points of the game. PISCATAWAY, NJ - Rutgers topped Iowa, 70-53, at the Louis Brown Athletic Center. The Scarlet Knights shot 51 percent (27-53) from the field en route to victory.

Rutgers jumped out to a 24-6 advantage in the first 11 minutes and never looked back. Iowa went on an 11-2 run to trim its deficit to eight (30-22) with three minutes left in the first stanza, but that was as close as the Hawkeyes would get.

Rutgers' defensive pressure hurt the Hawkeyes, as the Scarlet Knights forced an Iowa season-high 22 turnovers, which they converted into 29 points, 10 of which came in transition. Rutgers was also able to score in the post, outscoring Iowa 32-10 in the paint.

The Hawkeyes were led by Megan Skouby and Wendy Ausdemore. Skouby, whose family made the trip from Ohio to watch their daughter, scored nine of her game-high 19 points from the free throw line. Ausdemore, who made her first three 3-point attempts, tallied 15 points and collected a team-high six rebounds.

Iowa's Krista VandeVenter posted season highs at Rutgers. The junior, who was playing in only her fourth game after returning from a shoulder injury, posted highs in minutes (31), points (7) and assists (2).

After going to the free throw line only once in the first half, the Hawkeyes were able to attempt 16 in the second half and finished the game 15-17 (.882). Rutgers, a team that averaged 62 percent from the foul line entering the contest made 11-13 (.846).

Both teams shot the ball extremely well from behind the 3-point arc. The Scarlet Knights made 5-9 (.556), while the Hawkeyes drained 6-15 (.400).

The contest was Iowa's first in nine days, coming off of final exams.

IOWA CITY - Northern Iowa sank a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record 14 triples en route to an 83-62 victory over Iowa.

The victory was only the second win in 12 games all-time in the series for UNI and the first in school history in Iowa City.

The Panthers were in command from start-to-finish in good measure as a result of their hot shooting. The visitors drained 28-51 from the field, including a school-record 14-25 (.560) from behind the arc. UNI's previous record for triples in a game was 11. The previous record for treys by a team in Carver-Hawkeye Arena was 11. Iowa nailed 11 against Colorado during the 2000-01 season.

The Hawkeyes committed 20 turnovers in the game, but 12 came in the first half alone when the visitors were racing to leads that often reached the mid-20s. Iowa managed to trim the margin to 42-27 at intermission.

However, the Panthers went right back to the well in the second stanza, taking a 47-27 lead at the 18:22 mark of the second half when Tara King knocked down a three. The Panthers' lead surpassed 30 five minutes later when King followed a 3-pointer by Megan Keefe with one of her own to put UNI ahead 66-35.

Keefe paced a group of four Panthers who scored double figures with 19 points. Sarah Larsen added 15, Jessie Biggs 12 and Traci Ollendieck 12.

Ollendieck, who was a perfect 4-4 from behind the arc, was one of seven different Panthers who made 3-point baskets: King, Larsen, Biggs and Nicole Clausen each had two.

Iowa was led in scoring by Jenee Graham's career-high 14 points. The small forward also grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds to register her second double-double as a Hawkeye. Megan Skouby, Kristi Smith, Krista VandeVenter and Nicole VanderPol each scored 10 points for the Hawkeyes.

DES MOINES, IA - Krista VandeVenter sparked the Iowa Hawkeyes scoring a game and career-high 23 points en route to a 77-70 win at Drake, snapping a three-game losing skid.

VandeVenter, who returned to the starting lineup for the first time season, made all eight of her field goal attempts and was 7-9 from the foul line in leading the Hawkeyes to their fifth consecutive win over the Bulldogs. In addition to her offensive production, VandeVenter grabbed seven rebounds and collected a steal.

Iowa, who led start-to-finish, started the game on an 18-9 run in the first nine minutes to gain control of the contest. Iowa had good balanced scoring as eight Hawkeyes scored four points or more in its non-conference finale.

Iowa led by as much as 15 (31-16) in the first half, but Drake rallied with a 12-3 run to trim the deficit to six (34-28) with just over a minute remaining. However, the Hawkeyes scored the last five points of the half and reestablished an 11-point advantage (39-28) at intermission.

Drake opened the second stanza on a 10-4 run in the first three minutes to cut Iowa's lead to five (43-38). Iowa withstood the Bulldog early push and rebuilt a 10-point lead (60-50) midway through the half.

Drake was plagued by horrendous free throw shooting, making only 39 percent (9-23) from the charity stripe. Iowa, the nation's fourth-best free throw shooting squad, drained 71 percent (20-28) of its attempts.

Megan Skouby contributed 16 points, eight of which came in the first even minutes of the game. Abby Emmert netted nine points and sophomore Lindsey Nyenhuis added eight. Jenee Graham continued her dominance on the glass, pulling down a game-high 11 rebounds.

The Bulldogs were led by its two leading scorers, Brandy Dahir and Lindsay Whorton. Dahir scored 22 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Whorton netted 17 points.

Iowa shot 51 percent (27-53) from the field and had only 10 turnovers.

MINNEAPOLIS, MN - Iowa erased a 17-point second half deficit and held on to a thrilling 58-56 triumph over Minnesota in the Big Ten opener in front of 6,028 fans at Williams Arena. The win is Iowa's first in four tries at Williams Arena under Coach Bluder.

The 17-point rally marked Iowa's second largest second-half comeback under Coach Bluder. The Hawkeyes previously expunged a 19-point deficit vs. Indiana in the 2001 Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals.

Iowa was led by Wendy Ausdemore, who had a tremendous game sparking the Hawkeyes. Ausdemore scored 15 of her game-high 23 points in the second half. The 23 points matched a career high. Ausdemore was 7-9 from the field, including 4-5 from 3-point range, and 5-5 from the foul line.

In addition to Ausdemore's heroics, Kristi Smith collected a career-high 10 assists to go along with her seven points, all scored in the second half, and Krista VandeVenter added 10 points.

After a sluggish first half, Iowa stormed back in the second half. The Hawkeyes opened the second stanza on a 22-6 run to reclaim a one-point advantage (40-39) with 11:00 left and never looked back. Iowa out-scored Minnesota 40-23 in the second half to rally for the win.

Iowa started the game making three of its first four shots from the field, but closed the half making only four of 17. A Kelly Roysland fade-away 3-pointer at the buzzer gave Minnesota a 33-18 halftime cushion. The Gophers limited Iowa to only three points the last seven minutes of the half.

Minnesota was led by Roysland, who scored a team-high 16 points. Brittany McCoy and Korinne Campbell each contributed 10 points in defeat. The Gophers shot only 32 percent (22-69) from the field for the game.

The Hawkeyes got within three when Smith curled around the right baseline and made a long jumper to bring the home fans to their feet. But Packer responded again with a deep shot of her own with less than two minutes remaining.

Smith sank a 3-pointer from near the top of the key with just 90 seconds to go, but Davenport caught a lob pass and put in a layup to answer. Iowa didn't score again.

Davenport, the senior center, who came up just two points shy of tying a season high, led the Buckeyes in their first game back from an 11-day layoff after topping then-No. 3 Oklahoma on Dec. 20.

Iowa had four players in double-figures, led by Smith with 21, and Megan Skouby with a season-high 19. In addition to her 21 points, Smith had seven assists and a career-high five steals.

Purdue's lead swelled to as many as 14, but Iowa's sophomore class fought back. Lead by point guard Kristi Smith and small forward Wendy Ausdemore, the Hawkeyes clawed back to within five points (61-56) after four straight points by Smith with 2:36 remaining in the game. But, the Boilermakers answered with seven consecutive points to rebuild their lead and hold on for the victory.

Smith posted career highs in points (24), field goals made (9) and attempted (14) and 3-pointers made (4). She also grabbed five rebounds and dished out a game-high seven assists and had only one turnover.

Ausdemore netted 12 points and corralled six rebounds, while sophomore Megan Skouby added 10 points in defeat.

Purdue's half-court trap appeared to give the Hawkeyes problems as it forced 21 Hawkeye turnovers, including 14 in the first half. The Boilermakers scored 18 points off Iowa's miscues, including 14 in the first stanza.

Iowa did record its second-largest rebounding of the season, outrebounding Purdue by 10 (36-26). The Hawkeyes pulled down 14 offensive boards, while limiting the Boilermakers to only five.

BLOOMINGTON, IN - Iowa's Kristi Smith and Wendy Ausdemore combined to make all six of their free throw attempts in the final seconds to propel the Hawkeyes to another come-from-behind road victory in the Big Ten, 71-67 at Indiana. After a timeout, Smith stole the inbounds pass and then drained another pair of free throws to give the Hawkeyes a five-point lead (69-64) with 17 seconds left. Ausdemore made two additional foul shots in the final seconds. Indiana made an insignificant 3-pointer at the buzzer to make the final score, 71-67.

Iowa missed 10 straight field goal attempts, failing to score for 8:30 minutes spanning halves. Indiana took advantage of the Hawkeyes' scoring drought, opening the first half on a 16-3 run to claim an eight-point halftime advantage (34-26).

The Hoosiers also had four players in double figures, led by Sarah McKay. The senior posted a double-double (17 points, 10 rebounds) and blocked a game-high five shots. Jamie Braun contributed 12 points, Kim Roberson tallied 11 points and Nikki Smith added 10.

Iowa shot 83 percent (19-23) at the foul line, compared to Indiana's 59 percent (13-22). Additionally, the Hawkeyes outrebounded the Hoosiers by nine (46-37). Helping Iowa clear a season-high 46 rebounds was junior Krista VandeVenter and Skouby. VandeVenter pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds, while Skouby equaled a career best with nine boards.

Iowa was without 6-6 Megan Skouby, who broke her hand in practice a day before the game.

The win was the Buckeyes' 26th in a row at home to tie a school record. It was also Ohio State's 14th straight win since falling 75-51 at No. 9 LSU on Dec. 10, and 27th in a row against Big Ten teams.

Jessica Davenport, the conference's top scorer and rebounder, also became only the second Big Ten player with 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds.

Wendy Ausdemore had 12 points and Lindsey Nyenhuis 11 for the Hawkeyes.

Skouby is one of the few post players in the Big Ten who can match up with Davenport. She was replaced in the starting lineup by 6-3 Stacy Schlapkohl, who started her 22nd career contest.

The Hawkeyes scored first but the Buckeyes then ran off the next 16 points -- Davenport scoring seven points on the inside.

Iowa recovered from that early drought of nearly six minutes to pull to 25-18 before Stephanie Blanton hit a triple from the right corner and Allen made a short shot off an assist from Maria Moeller.

Up 45-32 at the half, Ohio State went on a 14-0 run to start the second half.

The Buckeyes converted Iowa's 23 turnovers into 41 points and held a 38-4 upper hand in scoring in the paint.

With Iowa trailing 26-10 midway through the first half, the Hawkeyes went on a 17-6 run in 6:34 to cut the 16-point deficit to five (32-27) at the 3:46 mark. Purdue took a 38-29 lead into halftime.

Iowa sophomore Kristi Smith scored all of her team-high 11 points in the first 12:30 of the contest. She made three of her first four 3-point field goal attempts and both free throw attempts. Smith also finished the contest with a game-high five assists and a team-high three steals.

Gearlds put her team on her back and went on her own 10-2 run to stretch Purdue's lead to 15 (53-38) midway through the second period.

The Boilermakers were able to work their offense and find high-percentage shots, as 20 of their 30 field goals came in the paint.

Purdue forced 27 Hawkeye turnovers and converted the Hawkeye errors to 36 points. The Boilermakers collected a Big Ten-season-high 20 steals en route to victory.

Iowa junior Krista VandeVenter contributed nine points. Four other Hawkeyes added six points each (Jenee Graham, Nicole VanderPol, Lindsey Nyenhuis and Megan Skouby).

IOWA CITY - - Five Hawkeyes scored in double figures as Iowa outlasted Wisconsin, 103-93 at Carver-Hawkeye Arena last Sunday.

The 103-point outburst by Iowa is the second-highest scoring output in school history and is an arena record. The Hawkeyes reached the century mark for the first time in 18 years and only the fifth time in school history.

Sophomores Wendy Ausdemore, Kristi Smith and Nicole VanderPol combined for 65 of the 103 points. Ausdemore and Smith shared team high honors with 24 points, while VanderPol netted a career-high 17 points and hauled in a career-high eight rebounds in only her fourth start of the year.

Ausdemore drained four consecutive 3-pointers the first 5:07 of the second half to fuel the Hawkeye offense. In fact, the sophomore finished the contest 6-8 from behind the arc. The six treys is an arena record by an Iowa player.

Smith tallied 11 of her 24 points from the foul line.

The Black and Gold led by as many as 18 points and led by double digits for most of the second half. The Badgers were able to cut the deficit to seven (90-83) with 4:25 left, but Iowa was able to hold on for the victory.

Wisconsin was led by Jolene Anderson and Mariah Dunham. Anderson led all scorers with 26 points, while Dunham chipped in with 25. Both shared team high honors with seven rebounds.

Iowa and Wisconsin combined for 72 free throw attempts and both made the most of their attempts. The Hawkeyes made their first 17 attempts and concluded the game shooting 81.6 percent (31-38). The Badgers shot at a 85.3 percent clip (29-34). Fifty-two fouls were called in the contest, 35 of which came in the second period.

INDIANAPOLIS, IN - - The eighth-seeded Iowa Hawkeyes fell 67-53 to the ninth-seeded Indiana Hoosiers in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament. Iowa fell to 12-11 in Big Ten Tournament contests.

Iowa was plagued by cold shooting, as it shot just 35 percent from the field and made only four of 19 three-point attempts in its season-ending loss to the Hoosiers. The Hawkeyes, who missed their first 11 three-point attempts, entered the contest as the second-best 3-point shooting team in the nation.

After scoring 103 points in its regular season finale vs. Wisconsin, Iowa stumbled out of the gate, falling to score in the game's first six minutes. The Hawkeyes fell behind 18-6 midway through the first half and 40-25 early in the second stanza. Indiana's biggest advantage was 16 (48-32) with eight minutes left to play.

Nicole VanderPol, who started only her fifth game of the season, was the only Hawkeye to reach double digits. The sophomore netted 12 points to go along with a game and career-high nine rebounds. Kristi Smith added nine points and Abby Emmert and Krista VandeVenter tallied eight each. Wendy Ausdemore, Iowa's second-leading scorer, was held scoreless, going 0-9 from the floor.

Seven of Smith's nine points came in the first half. Her seventh point was her 400th of the season, becoming only the 22nd Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

The Hoosiers were led by Kim Roberson and Sarah McKay. Roberson came off the bench to lead all scorers with 21 points, while McKay contributed 19 points and six rebounds.

Indiana shot 80 percent (12-15) from the foul line and 44 percent from the field (26-59).

The Hawkeyes did out-rebound the Hoosiers by three (39-36).
