# 2006 Season Outlook

Head Coach Gayle Blevins is expecting big things from her 2006 squad. With seven starters and 11 returning letterwinners from the 2005 team that ended the season with a 50-14 record, Blevins and the Hawkeyes have their sights set on Oklahoma City.

"We have improved in many aspects of the game since last season," Blevins said. "We have greater depth, we are better defensively and we have the potential to be a very good hitting team."

Blevins is excited about many different possibilities both on the field and in the batting order. The Hawkeyes have seven freshmen who could all make an impact.

"I'm really excited about the makeup of our team," Blevins said. "We have a lot of young players who gained experience last season along with a solid group of both freshmen and upperclassmen."

#### **PITCHERS**

The Hawkeyes will have to replace Lisa Birocci, Iowa's all-time career strikeout leader, inside the circle. Ali Arnold returns for her senior season and is making her mark on the record books as well. She currently ranks sixth on

the all-time strikeout list after compiling a 21-5 record with 209 K's last season. Arnold recorded her first career no-hitter against Rhode Island last season and is ready to lead the team inside the circle in 2006.

Freshman Brittany Weil will also see action for the Hawkeyes this season. Weil, from Garden Grove, CA, was the Orange County Player of Year and L.A. Times Pitcher of the Year. She also led her ASA team to back-to-back top 10 finishes at the ASA National Tournament.

"When you look at our graduating players from last season, we definitely took a hit in the pitching department," Blevins said. "The good thing is Ali returns as a seasoned pitcher. Ali and Brittany are a good combination and will be a great 1-2 punch."

#### **CATCHERS**

Iowa returns both catchers from the 2005 team. Junior Sami Baugh and sophomore Emily Nichols split time behind the plate last season and the plan is to do the same in 2006. Baugh batted .271 with 21 RBI while Nichols enjoyed a breakout freshman campaign. She set the single-season home run record, blasting 16 home runs and tallied a team best 49 RBI. Nichols only needs 13 more home runs to become Iowa's all-time home run leader.

"It's nice to have options behind the plate," Blevins said. "Both Sami and Emily are solid both defensively and offensively. It's great to know we have the opportunity to use each one in different situations."

#### **INFIELD**

The Hawkeye infield will see some changes along with

some regulars in 2006. Iowa returns three players who all started at first base last year. Sophomore Steph Ackerson, senior Brandi Sargent and Nichols all saw time at first base in 2005.

"Steph, Brandi or Emily could start at first on any given day," Blevins said. "Steph has made tremendous strides since last season and both Brandi



and Emily are very solid players. Once again, it's nice to have options."

Freshman Erin Riemersma is the leading candidate at second base. Riemersma is a natve of Orland Park, IL and was a Chicago-Sun Times all-area selection. Coach Blevins is excited about Riemersma's potential at second base.

"Erin is a very instinctive player," Blevins said. "She gives 100 percent all the time and has the ability to really spark our infield. She has the potential to be something special."

Hawkeye fans will see a familiar face at shortstop in 2006. Senior **Stacy May** returns as Iowa's leading offensive player from last season. May led the team with a .367 batting average, 73 hits and 48 runs scored. May is also the anchor of the Iowa infield and has started every game of her career.

"Stacy is definitely a leader for us," Blevins said. "She is a very smart hitter and a great defensive player. She really

solidifies our infield."

Third base will see a couple new faces this year. Sophomore Summer Downs will make the move to third after starting the majority of 2005 at second base. Downs, who played third base in high school, batted .269 and led the team with 13 sacrifice hits. Freshman Colleen McGlaughlin could also see action at third base.

"We are very confident in what Summer can do at third," Blevins said. "She has a solid glove and has good field awareness. Between her and Colleen, we should be strong at the corner."

#### **OUTFIELD**

The Hawkeye outfield is nearly limitless in potential. A total of 10 players could play outfield for Iowa in 2006.

Three players are competing for time in left field. Junior Jenna Spratt started 35 games last season in left field and finished the year with a .225 batting average. Junior **Emily Gerlick** returns after sitting out the 2005 season with a torn ACL. Gerlick moved to the outfield last season after being named third team all-Big Ten as an infielder in 2004. McGlaughlin could also see time in left field as

"We have three very capable players competing for playing time in left field," Blevins said. "All three players have good instincts and we can utilize each one in different situations throughout the season."

Mindy Heidgerken returns as Iowa's starting centerfielder after a unanimous first team all-Big Ten selection in 2005. The junior led the team with a .421 batting average in conference play and stole 22 bases. Coach Blevins is looking forward to see how she has improved this season.

"Mindy is a very savvy player who knows and understands the game," Blevins said. "She is a natural on the basepaths and has a great feel of what we are trying to accomplish. She puts tremendous pressure on the defense."

Kylie Murray made a smooth transition from infield to outfield in 2005 and Blevins plans on keeping her in right field for her senior season. Murray ranked second in team batting average (.333) RBI (42). Freshman **Quinn More**lock, who was Iowa's Class 3A Player of the Year as a senior

in high school, could also see action in right field.

"Kylie and Quinn are both good outfielders," Blevins said. "Kylie has really improved from last season and it will be nice that she has a year of outfield under her belt."

Three other players, Callie Adreon, Rachel West and **Lindsey Emery**, are also candidates for the outfield. Coach Blevins is excited to have Adreon and West as pinch-running options. Both have great speed which is a Blevins

"Callie and Rachel have the potential to create things for us," Blevins said.



#### **SCHEDULE**

This could possibly be the toughest schedule Blevins has seen in her 19 years at Iowa. The Hawkeyes are scheduled to compete in seven nonconference tournaments and could possibly face ranked opponents in each one.

Iowa opens its season at the Diamond Fun and Sun Classic in Miami against reigning SEC champion Georgia. The Hawkeyes will compete in the Littlewood Classic, hosted by Arizona State and play the Sun Devils three times at their home park.

The NFCA Leadoff Classic is a new addition for the Hawkeyes this season, held in Columbus, GA. Three teams that qualified for the 2005 College World Series, including national champion Michigan, will join the Hawkeyes in Georgia. Iowa will face one of those College World Series teams in Tennessee along with Loui-

siana-Lafayette, who are the defending Sun Belt Conference champions.

Iowa will face California at the National Invitational Softball Tournament in San Jose and could face a number of other talented teams in the later rounds of the tournament.

The Big Ten race will be difficult as always. Michigan won the conference in 2005 en route to a national championship. Northwestern advanced to the super regional round of the NCAA Tournament as well.

"Our schedule is extremely difficult," Blevins said. "We are playing some tough tournaments with high-level talent across the board. Playing tournaments like these will only help our team prepare for an even tougher Big Ten schedule."

Head Coach Gayle Blevins is in her 19th season at Iowa and her 26th season as a collegiate head coach. Blevins enters the 2006 season as the third winningest coach in Division I history with a record of 1,060-486-5.

As a head coach, Blevins has led her teams to seven Women's College World Series appearances (four at Iowa), won eight Big Ten titles (five at Iowa) been named both the Biq Ten and National Coach of the Year, and has been inducted into both the Indiana University and NFCA Hall of Fame. Blevins enters the 2006 season as the Big Ten's winningest coach with 457 conference wins.

Blevins became Iowa's head coach in 1987 and immediately produced success. Just two years after Blevins took over a struggling program at Iowa, the Hawkeyes secured their first-ever Big Ten Title and their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. The 1989 Hawkeyes finished the season ranked ninth in the nation, the first time an Iowa team had ever been nationally ranked.

Blevins built on that success and in 1990, the Hawkeyes won another Big Ten title and produced the school's first All-American in Diane Pohl.

The 1995 season proved to be an extraordinary one for Blevins and her Hawkeve squad. After receiving an at-large big to the NCAA Tournament, the Hawkeyes became the nation's Cinderella story. Iowa advanced to its first NCAA Women's College World Series after defeating No. 8 Cal State Sacramento, 3-0, and twice beating No. 5 Fresno State (1-0 and 2-1 in nine innings). At the World Series, the Hawkeyes lost to No. 2 UCLA but rallied back to beat No. 9 Michigan, 9-7 in 14 innings and No. 3 Cal State Fullerton, 6-5 in nine innings.

Unfortunately, the Hawkeyes fell short in their quest for a national championship, losing to UCLA in the national semifinals.

The 1996 Hawkeyes paved their way to a second-consecutive appearance in the Women's College World Series by winning the Mideast Regional held in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes finished third in the nation after losing to eventual national champion Arizona.

After a 52-9 record and a No. 5 national ranking, the 1997 Hawkeyes made its third-consecutive appearance at the Women's College World Series. During the regular season, Iowa marched through the Big Ten schedule with a perfect 22-0 record, marking the first and only time in conference history that a Big Ten team has completed the conference schedule undefeated.

Iowa returned to Oklahoma City and the Women's College World Series for the fourth time in school history in 2001. Blevins guided the Hawkeyes to a 49-14 record and a Big Ten Tournament Championship.

The 2002 season marked another milestone for Coach Blevins. While competing in the National Invitational Softball Tournament, Iowa defeated eventual NCAA Champion California to give Blevins her 900th career NCAA Division I victory. She was just the fourth coach to reach that mark in NCAA Division I history.

In 2003, Blevins coached the Hawkeyes to both the Big Ten Regular Season and Tournament Championships, the first time an Iowa team had captured both in the same season. She also took the Hawkeyes to the Lincoln, NE Regional Championship game.

Blevins eclipsed the 1,000 win mark during the 2004 season with a 9-1, six-inning victory over Coe College. With the historic win, Blevins became only the third Division I coach to reach 1,000 wins. The win was also her 700th at Iowa.


Last season, Blevins led the Hawkeyes to their third 50-win season in school history and their sixth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, where they advanced to the Lincoln, NE NCAA Regional Championship game.

Under her direction, Iowa has finished in the top three in the Big Ten Conference every year but one from 1989-2006 and in 1989, 1990, 1997, 2000 and 2003 her squads captured the Big Ten Conference title. A Blevins coached team has never finished lower than fifth in the conference.

Blevins was one of the first coaches in the country to effectively use the "slap style" hitting as an exciting offensive weapon. One of her student-athletes was the first-ever slapper chosen as a first team All-American in 1983. Blevins is one of the nations best at using the speed game.

Blevins came to the University of Iowa after a successful career at Indiana University, where she led the Hoosiers from 1980-87 and compiled an impressive 301-146 (.670) record. She led Indiana to the Women's College World Series three times where they finished third in 1986, fifth in 1983 and second in 1980, when the series was a part of the AIAW.

Blevins, a native of Dayton, Ohio, is a 1973 graduate of the University of Dayton. After graduating cum laude with a degree in health and physical education, she taught and coached at Dayton's Stebbins High School. Five years later she went on to Indiana University where she earned her master's degree in administration while serving as IU's assistant softball coach. She was named Indiana's head coach during the 1979-80 season. She moved to Iowa during the 1986-87 season and is only the third head softball coach in Hawkeye school history.




# Assoc. Head Coach Michelle Venturella

Michelle Venturella Associate Head Coach Fourth Year Indiana University, 1996



During the summer of 2004, Venturella was promoted and became the first associate head coach in Iowa softball history. Venturella serves as the Hawkeye recruiting coordinator, hitting coach and also coaches Iowa's catchers.

In her first year with the Hawkeyes, Venturella helped the Hawkeyes to a 44-15 record and Big Ten regular season and tournament championships. As the primary hitting coach, she also helped the Hawkeves set a team record for home runs in a season (41).

Along with Head Coach Gayle Blevins and former assistant Holly Van Vlymen, the Iowa staff was named the 2003 NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 2005, Venturella help guide the Hawkeyes to a 50-14 record while setting school records in team home runs (61) and total bases (36) along with individual records in home runs in a game (3), RBI in a game (8) and total bases in a game (12).

As a player, Venturella was one of the best catchers in the country and earned a spot on the United States National Team from 1995-2000.

Throughout her career with USA Softball, she earned four gold medals, including one at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games. She also helped the United States to Gold at the 1998 World Championships and was a



member of the first-ever United States Olympic Softball Team in 1996.

Venturella came to Iowa after working as a private softball instructor in Indianapolis at Softball Ltd. She also worked for Louisville Slugger as a technical representative, designer and motivational speaker.

Prior to her work with Lousiville Slugger, Venturella served as an assistant coach at Northern Illinois University during the 1996-97 season. She helped the Huskies to a runner-up finish in the Mid-Continent Conference in 1997.

A 1996 graduate from Indiana University, Venturella is no stranger to Big Ten softball. She was a twotime NFCA All-American while with the Hoosiers and a recipient of the 1995 Big Ten Medal of Honor. Her junior year, Venturella was a unanimous selection as Big Ten Player of the Year. She still ranks in the top five of eight offensive categories at Indiana and is still its all-time leader in RBI and walks.



# Pitching Coach Amanda Scott







**Amanda Scott** Pitching Coach First Year Fresno State University, 2001

Amanda Scott is in her first season as pitching coach for the Hawkeyes.

Scott played at Fresno State and graduated as one of the school's most decorated athletes. She was named Fresno State's No. 2 greatest athlete of the 20th century and led the Bulldogs to their first NCAA Championship in 1998. While at Fresno State, she compiled a 106-18 (.855) record with a 0.55 ERA and 851 strikeouts. She threw 68 shutouts in 871 innings pitched and was a four-time first team all-American. Scott was also named to the College World Series all-tournament team twice and was M.V.P. in 1998. She was the Western Athletic Conference Pitcher of the Year three times and finished her career with a .303 batting average along with 31 home runs and 212 RBI.

While at Fresno State, Scott received the NCAA Top VIII Award in 2001, which singles out eight NCAA student-athletes each year who demonstrate athletic success, academic achievement and community service. She was also a two-time academic all-American.

Scott was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1997-2000 and earned a gold medal at the 1998 World Championships. She was also an alternate on the 2000 Olympic Team.

Scott began her coaching career at Michigan State University where she served as pitching coach from 2002-04. She then pitched professionally for the New York Juggernauts and led them to a National Pro Fastpitch championship in 2004 while earning league



M.V.P. honors. She finished the 2004 season with 15 wins and an ERA of 0.88. Scott served as the Juggernauts pitching coach during the 2005 season before moving to Iowa.

# Dr. David Skorton University President

David J. Skorton was appointed the 19th president of The University of Iowa on March 1, 2003. He has been a faculty member at the University since 1980. He holds joint appointments at the rank of professor in the Departments of Internal Medicine, Electrical and Computer Engineering, and Biomedical Engineering. President Skorton was appointed vice president for research in 1992 and, additionally, interim vice president for external

relations in 2000. He served as vice president for research and external relations from March 2002 until he assumed the presidency. He also continued his role as a physician, caring for adolescents and adults with inborn heart disease.

Co-founder and co-director of the UI Adolescent and Adult Congenital Heart Disease Clinic at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, President Skorton has focused his research on congenital heart disease in adolescents and adults, cardiac imaging, and computer image processing. His research was supported by the National Institutes of Health, the Department of Veteran Affairs, the American Heart Association and by private industry. He has published numerous articles, reviews, book chapters, and two major texts in the areas of cardiac imaging and image processing. He has served in a variety of administrative positions at The University of Iowa, including director of the Cardiovascular Image Processing Laboratory (1982-1996), director of the Division of General Internal Medicine (1985-1989), and associate chair for clinical programs in the Department of Internal Medicine (1989-1992).

A national leader in research ethics, President Skorton is charter past-president of the Association for the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs, Inc., the first entity organized specifically to accredit human research protection programs. He has served on the boards and committees of many national organizations, including the American College of Cardiology, the American Heart Association, the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine, the American Society of Echocardiography, the Association for the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs, the Association of American Universities, the Council on Competitiveness, and the Korea America Friendship Society.

President Skorton is actively engaged in service to the community and to the state of Iowa, particularly in regional and state economic development. He served on and chaired the Iowa City Area Development Group, served on the Cedar Rapids Chamber of Commerce Priority One Advisory Committee and the Technology Corridor Committee, and currently serves on the Cedar Rapids Symphony Orchestra Board of Directors. He is also a member of the Iowa Business Council and had served on the Iowa Department of Economic Development Board, the Governor's Life Sciences Advisory Committee, and the Iowa Research Council, of which he was president from 1999-2001.

President Skorton earned his bachelor's degree in psychology in 1970 and an M.D. in 1974, both from Northwestern University. Following a medical residency and cardiology fellowship at The University of California, Los Angeles, he came to The University of Iowa in 1980 as an instructor. He was named assistant professor of internal medicine in 1981 and assistant professor of electrical and computer engineering in 1982. He was promoted to associate professor in 1984 and to professor in 1988.

As a musician, Dr. Skorton worked as a professional jazz and R&B musician in the Chicago area. He has continued to study saxophone and flute in Iowa City and hosts a weekly program, "As Night Falls-Latin Jazz," on KSUI, the University's public FM radio station.



# Robert Bowlsby Director of Athletics

Director of Athletics Bob Bowlsby is in his 15th year as the head of the University of Iowa intercollegiate athletics program.

As the chief administrator for Iowa's athletic department, Bowlsby has earned a reputation as one of the most respected, energetic and ambitious athletic administrators in the nation. Over the past five years, Bowlsby has guided and supervised the merger of the women and men's athletics departments. The

combined entity encompasses 24 varsity sports and an annual budget in excess of \$50 million.

As the head of Iowa athletics, Bowlsby has been involved in the hiring of new head coaches in football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, swimming and wrestling, enabling Iowa to maintain its standing as one of the most visible, successful and progressive departments in college athletics.

A Waterloo native, Bowlsby became Iowa's 10th Athletic Director in June, 1991, after serving in the same role at the University of Northern Iowa since 1984. He previously served as Assistant Athletic Director for Facilities at Northern Iowa.

Bowlsby earned his bachelor's degree from Moorhead State University (Minnesota) in 1975 and his master's degree from the University of Iowa in 1978.

The National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) named Bowlsby in 2001-02 as Central Region Athletic Director of the Year and Sports Business Journal selected him from the four regional award winners as the National Athletics Director of the Year. The award highlights the efforts of the athletic directors for their commitment and positive contributions to campuses and their surrounding communities. Bowlsby was part of a 15-member commission on Opportunities in Athletics headed by US Secretary of Education, Rod Paige.

Bowlsby served as chair of the NCAA Wrestling Committee and has served on NCAA committees on Financial Aid and Amateurism, the Special Committee to Review Amateurism Issues and the Special Committee to Review Financial Conditions in Athletics. Bowlsby just ended a five-year term on the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament Committee, serving as committee chairman two years (2004 & 2005). The committee selects, seeds, brackets and manages all rounds of the NCAA Basketball Tournament, including the Final Four.

Bob has served as an Executive Committee member with both the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association and served in 2002-03 as President of the I-A Directors group.

Bowlsby was also elected chair of the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee and represented the NCAA as one of two voting members on the United States Olympic Committee. Bowlsby also was appointed by former United States Olympic Committee President LeRoy Walker to the NCAA/USOC Liaison Committee, chaired by George Steinbrenner and former NCAA President Cedric Dempsey. Bob has also served as a member of the Board of Governors for the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Bowlsby is a charter member of the Iowa Olympics Committee and a current member of the Board of Directors of the Iowa Games. Bob is a board member of the Iowa Scholarship Fund, Inc. and a Board member on the Honda Awards program, which recognizes our nation's top female collegiate athletes each year.

He and his wife, Candice, have four children, Lisa, Matt, Rachel and Kyle. Bowlsby was born Jan. 10, 1952.

# HAWKEYE ATHLETICS

The University of Iowa Athletic Department, under the direction of Athletic Director Bob Bowlsby for the past 14 years, is regarded as one of the top intercollegiate programs in the nation.

The men's and women's departments, operating separately for over 25 years, merged in 2001 under Bowlsby's direction. It combined nationally recognized programs for both genders into one successful and progressive athletic unit.

Combining their successes on the playing fields with continued success and recognition in the classroom, UI student-athletes practice and perform in some of the best facilities in the nation, while knowing the support of their efforts and attendance by Hawkeye fans ranks among the best in the country.

While the Hawkeyes continue to compete with the best in the nation in a variety of sports, Iowa continues to boast some of the most impressive athletic facilities in the nation, operated by one of the most respected departments.

Several new projects are underway on the Iowa campus. Some of the latest additions to the UI campus are the Roy G. Karro Athletics Hall of Fame and Visitors Center and the Russell and Ann Gerdin Athletic Learning Center.

Kinnick Stadium is getting a major up-grading and renovation that will be completed just prior to the 2006 season. The \$90 million project includes the replacing of the south end zone stands and building a four-level press box that will house 47 guest suites, along with new scoreboards, video walls, cocession stands and restrooms.

Additional priorities for the Iowa program include the establishment and development of endowments for all sports programs, the

continued enhancement of graduation rates, and the implementation of a long-range plan to ensure Iowa's financial, academic and competitive future. As an example, all of Iowa's 13 scholarships for men's basketball are fully endowed.

The graduation rate of Iowa's studentathletes has improved in each of the past 10 years and has consistently ranked above the graduation rate of all UI students. Hawkeye athletes have garnered more than 60 academic All-America honors since 1992. The 2004-05 school-year saw the University of Iowa produce 130 academic all-Big Ten athletes.

Iowa athletes have been recognized as all-Americans in their sport on more than 195 occasions during the past 14 years.

Iowa's athletic teams during the 2004-05 athletic year continued its trend of success, on the playing fields and in academic pursuits.

The Hawkeye football team followed its 11-2 mark of 2002 with a 10-3 record in 2003 and a 10-2 mark in 2004, including a 30-25

win over LSU in the Capital One Bowl in Orlando, FL. Iowa has played in January bowl games in each of the last three years and has finished each of those seasons ranked eighth nationally.

Iowa's men's and women's basketball teams have advanced to post-season play in each of the last five seasons. The men's squad earned a berth in the 2005 NCAA tournament while the women made it to the semi-finals of the 2005 National Invitation Tournament.

The Iowa wrestling squad earned the 2004 Big Ten title and went on to place second in the nation at the NCAA Tournament. Coach Jim Zalesky was named Big Ten Coach of the Year. Iowa has won six of the last 11 NCAA wrestling titles and nine of the last 15 championships. They continue to be one of the top programs in the nation.

Iowa's men's and women's and gymnastics teams continue to rank among the best in the nation. The men's team again advanced to the NCAA Championships and the women's gymnastics squad has been in the NCAA meet two of the last three years.

Iowa's women's softball team advanced to NCAA regional action for the 10th time in 12 seasons. Iowa has advanced to the softball World Series on four occasions over the past 11 seasons and Coach Gayle Blevins is one of three coaches to reach 1,000 career victories.

From the rankings on the courts and playing fields, to the rankings in the class-room, to the rankings in fan and community support, to the ranking as a program that boasts some of the best athletic facilities in the nation, it's easy to understand why Iowa fans everywhere truly believe, "It's great to be a Hawkeye."

# **ACADEMIC STUDENT SERVICES**

Since its inception in 1979, Athletics Student Services has evolved from a two-person, academic support service to a broad-based, nationally prominent student support services operation. Its purpose is to assist student athletes to become tomorrow's leaders by offering academic and personal support services to assist them in making timely and satisfactory progress toward their degrees.

Athletic Student Services focuses on four important areas — academic counseling and monitoring, educational and support programs, retention programs and compli-

ance services — when working with studentathletes. Following are descriptions of some of the programs, services and opportunities available to student-athletes in those areas.

### **Athletics Learning** Center

The \$4.6 million Russell A. and Ann Gerdin Athletics Learning Center opened in 2003 and gives all Iowa student-athletes a state of the art facility to help them with their educations.

The Athletics Learning Center is a multilevel, 20,000 square foot facility which will provide a computer center, study areas, classes and meeting places for all Hawkeye student-athletes. It features an auditorium that converts into two classrooms, separate study rooms for under and upper-class student-athletes that feature 28 study carrels, a computer lab, five tutorial rooms, the book loan repository, office space for Iowa's Student Services staff and a display area to recognize the academic accomplishments of Iowa's student-athletes.

### **Academic Counseling & Monitoring**

Athletics coordinators work closely with student-athletes and their university-assigned advisors from the time they arrive on campus until the time they leave the University. Along with focusing on academic planning matters such as goal-setting, plans of study, choosing majors and degree reguirements, athletics coordinators also help student-athletes understand NCAA, Big Ten and University academic policies. They also solicit feedback from instructors on academic progress made by student-athletes.

### Retention

A full-time staff member directs the retention program, which identifies student-athletes who may need tailored academic assistance and structure, and implements individualized learning plans to help them succeed. Such plans may include daily and weekly planning sessions with athletics coordinators and retention staff, tutoring, study groups, mainstreaming into on-campus services like the writing center, math labs and services for students with learning disabilities.

### **Transition Seminar**

All new student-athletes attend an eightweek transition seminar during the fall semester that is geared toward helping them make the transition from high school to college successfully. Seminar topics include time management skills, learning and study strategies, the culture and rules of the university, and life skills concerning alcohol and other substances, relationships and intimacy, diversity, tolerance, values and character.



### **Tutoring**

Tutoring is available free of charge to all student-athletes. Tutors, who are post-graduates and teachers, help with course content as well as study strategies and are available in virtually all general education program subjects.

# **CHAMPS/Life Skills**

Life skills programs are conducted throughout the year with and for student athletes on quality of life issues critical to personal growth, such as personal accountability, responsible use and nonuse of alcohol, diversity and gambling.

# **Minority Enrichment Program**

This program offers a culturally supportive environment in which minority studentathletes have the opportunity to develop friendships and a support network in the university. A core focus group of students and staff coordinate programs such as guest speakers, holiday celebrations, community service activities with the local neighborhood centers, events with Cultural Centers and networking with minority faculty, staff, professional and business leaders.

# **Career Guidance & Development**

Planning a meaningful career and a fulfilling life is an ongoing process of expanding and narrowing choices, beginning when student-athletes arrive on campus and continuing throughout their college career and lifetime. The professional staff works with other career development professionals on campus to offer individual consultation, career development seminars, workshops, referrals to other campus offices and special events like the Senior Recognition Banquet for graduating student-athletes.

### **Compare the Numbers**

Iowa's student-athletes have outperformed the University's entire student population each year since the NCAA started requiring a report of student-athlete graduation rates.



# **SPORTS MEDICINE**

### **Sports Medicine**

Continuing to set the standard in Sports Medicine Service, the University of Iowa provides each student-athlete with the most up-todate and highest quality medical care available. The 10 full-time certified and licensed athletic trainers of the Athletic Training Services department are committed to a multidisciplinary approach to sports medicine.

By providing quality health care, injury rehabilitation programs, and prevention programs, the University of Iowa swimming and diving student-athlete is guaranteed to receive timely and adequate medical care whenever necessary. A well-equipped athletic training room in the Fieldhouse is available for use by the men and women's swimming and diving teams. The Fieldhouse training room is conveniently located near the natatorium and is staffed by Mike Lawler, ATC, LAT, a full-time athletic trainer certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association and licensed in the state of Iowa, one certified graduate assistant athletic trainer, and athletic training students from the athletic training curriculum program. A senior athletic training student is assigned to the swimming and diving teams for the entire year and, along with the certified athletic trainers, provide individualized care on a daily, 24-hour basis. The athletic training staff utilize current and traditional rehabilitation and treatment technology, including whirlpools, hot hydrocollator units, ultrasound, electrical stimulation, ice, rehabilitation weights, Physio-gymnic balls, Stairmaster, Cybex isokinetic exercise, and Life Fitness exercise cycles.

Services from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, among the world's largest university-owned teaching hospitals, support the efforts of the athletic training staff. The new University of Iowa Sports Medicine Center, located in the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics employs a staff of team physicians, orthopaedic surgeons, physician assistants, and physical therapists. A team physician and orthopaedic surgeon are assigned to the men and women's swimming and diving teams. In the event it is necessary for a swimming or diving student-athlete to receive advanced medical care, the athletic training staff makes referrals to the staff of the Sports Medicine Center where the student-athlete is assured of being seen by a physician within 24 hours.

### **Carver-Hawkeye Arena Training Room**

The recently remodeled Carver-Hawkeye Arena (CHA) training room is one of the most modern, respected facilities in the nation. Traditional therapies include whirlpools, hot and cold units, rehabilitation weights, pulleys, and machines. Other therapeutic equipment available for athletes include ultrasound, electrical stimulation, traction, and external compression units. Also available are such unique optional equipment as the CYBEX 6000 (isokinetic exercise and testing device). Preparation activities, medical care and rehabilitation are provided for the basketball, softball, field hockey, volleyball, golf, and wrestling teams.

# **Jacobson Training Room**

Jacobson training room is used primarily by the football team for rehabilitation, treatment and team preparation. The facility features a lap pool, treadmill, CYBEX weight equipment, Biodex isokinetic machine, Fastex, slide board, surface floors, two stairmasters, five bikes and six whirlpools.

# The Fieldhouse Training Room

The Fieldhouse training room is used by the Hawkeye swimming and diving, gymnastics and rowing teams, along with the cheer squad. It supports medical care with ultrasound, whirlpools, hot and cold packs, high-voltage galvanic stimulation, electrical stimulation, and T.E.N.S.

# THE COLLEGES

Freshmen who enroll at The University of Iowa are admitted to either the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences or the College of Engineering. The General Education Program allows students to sample courses in more than 100 areas of study. At Iowa, students are required to take electives, major courses, and general education course work.

### **LIBERAL ARTS & SCIENCES**

Undergraduate Degrees Offered - Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Science (B.S.) in 58 major fields; Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A) in Music (B.M.) and of Liberal Studies

Admission - Freshmen and transfer students are to meet the college's admissions requirements.

### **ENGINEERING**

**Undergraduate Degrees Offered** - Bachelor of Science in Engineering (B.S.E.) in six majors - biomedical, chemical, civil, electrical, industrial, and mechanical.

**Admission -** Students must meet the college's high admissions requirements.

### **BUSINESS**

**Undergraduate Degrees Offered** - Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) in six majors: accounting; economics; finance; management and organizations; management science; and marketing.

Undergraduate Degrees Offered - Six-year Pharm.D. degree

Admission - Students must successfully complete pre-pharmacy course work in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. As well, students must take the PCAT (Pharmacy College Admission Test) during October of their freshman year.

# **GRADUATE & PROFESSIONAL DEGREES**

Many student-athletes who have attended The University of Iowa and completed their undergraduate degrees continue their education at the University.

Student-athletes who attend graduate or professional school must first complete course work toward a bachelor's degree in their field of study. The University also offers undergraduates the opportunity to participate in research and overseas study programs, as well as internships that will help prepare them for graduate school.

### **RESIDENCE**

Ninety percent of freshmen choose to live in one of the University's 10 residence halls. Each team has its own rules regarding residence of incoming freshmen. Most student-athletes live at least two years on campus.

The University residence halls provide students full-service dining rooms, study lounges, laundry facilities, recreational facilities, as well as vending and bank machines. Residence hall rooms currently have high-speed ethernet connections that give you e-mail and Internet access in your room.

### **SAFETY**

### **LIBRARIES**

The University of Iowa's library system is the largest in the state and has over 4 million volumes. Students also have access to the collections of other libraries throughout the Big Ten Conference via computer network. Besides the Main Library, The University has 12 departmental libraries: Art Library, Biological Sciences Library, Business Library, Chemistry-Botany Library, Engineering Library, Geology Library, Hardin Library for the Health Sciences, Mathematical Sciences Library, Rita Benton Music Library, Physics Library, Psychology Library and Law Library.

# **COMPUTERS**

There are 26 Instructional Technology Centers all over the campus which are filled with thousands of computers. These facilities are open at least 50 hours a week. Some are open 24 hours. Also, the Information Arcade in the Main Library provides a variety of specialized computing tools. The Computer Demo Center provides information for students who want to purchase computers and software.

# **CAREER DECISIONS**



### **HEALTH SERVICES**

The University of Iowa provides the student-athlete with the most up-to-date and highest-quality medical care available. Students at Iowa can go to Student Health Services, which is open six days a week. Student Health Services is supported by a fee paid by all full-time students. It offers students unlimited free office visits (there is a charge for other procedures done in the office such as blood tests).

# **CULTURAL CENTERS**

There are three houses on campus that offer students from different ethnic backgrounds a place to congregate, the Latino and Native American Cultural Center, the Afro American Cultural Center and the Asian Pacific American Cultural Center.

### **CAMBUS**

There are six bus routes throughout the Iowa campus. The University Cambus provides over four million free rides to class and to the dorms for students each year. Some routes run seven days a week, and some run until 2:30 a.m. Cambus also operates a specialized transportation service for persons with disabilities.



# THE IOWA CITY COMMUNITY

Iowa City is a diverse, highly cosmopolitan community of 60,000 set in the natural scenic beauty of Iowa's rolling hills and woods along the tree-lined banks of the Iowa River. 

Economically, businesses such as Rockwell Collins, American College Testing and Procter & Gamble help keep the city booming. In Coralville, a branch office of Geico Auto Insurance has provided many residents with employment opportunities.

Culturally, Iowa City is alive with concerts, art exhibits, readings, plays and art events of all kinds. Located on the University of Iowa campus, Hancher Auditorium is a nationally-known performance center that brings in the best of Broadway, classical and jazz music, dance and other performances. The University of Iowa Theater Arts department also produces a full schedule of plays each year, featuring the work of student performers and directors. So whether you enjoy the arts as a spectator or as an outlet for your own creativity, Iowa City has the opportunities.

Residents of Iowa City are not only economically and culturally enriched, they also take advantage of the numerous recreational facilities offered around town. The area's more than 30 parks provide opportunities for year-round activities including boating, hiking, swimming, fishing and skiing.

The city's greatest charm, however, remains the sincere friendliness of its citizens, the cosmopolitan atmosphere and the successful partnership built between the community and the University.



Iowa City is located in eastern Iowa and is an easy trip to such cities as Des Moines (the capital of Iowa), Chicago, St. Louis, Kansas City, and Minneapolis. Also, Cedar Rapids, a city of more than 150,000, is just a short drive north of Iowa City. The Eastern Iowa Airport, which links residents to every major airport in the Midwest, nation and world, is only 20 minutes away.

# **OLD CAPITOL**

One of the most recognizable sites in Iowa City is the gold dome of the Old Capitol which is situated in the heart of downtown. Built in 1840, it is Iowa City's most historic building. The Old Capitol was the site of the first governor inauguration as well as the first six Iowa General Assemblies. It is also where the state's Constitution was drafted. When the capital was moved to Des Moines in 1857, the Old Capitol was dedicated to The University of Iowa, becoming the first building owned by the University.

### **CORALVILLE LAKE**

Just north of Iowa City is Coralville Lake, an outdoor recreational area that offers a variety of opportunities for the public. Coralville Lake offers picnic shelters, biking, hiking, fishing, boating, swimming, hunting, camping, snowmobiling, cross country skiing, golf and disc golf.

### PEDESTRIAN MALL

Located downtown and in walking distance of many of the University's dormitories is the Pedestrian Mall. It is a perfect place to sit outside and study or hang out with friends. During the fall, spring and summer months there are concerts and art festivals in the Pedestrian Mall.

# **CORAL RIDGE MALL**

The Coral Ridge Mall is a 1.2-million-square-foot shopping center located just minutes from the UI campus. The center combines a mix of over 120 specialty shops and strong department stores including Dillards, JC Penney, Sears, Target and Younkers. Coral Ridge also offers entertainment features such as an NHL-regulation-sized indoor ice arena, state-of-the-art 10-screen movie theatre and a large carousel along with a 1,000-seat food court with sit-down restaurants. THE HAWKEYE NICKNAME

The University of Iowa borrowed its athletic nickname from the state of Iowa many years ago.

The name Hawkeye was originally the name of the hero in the fictional novel, *The Last of the Mohicans*, written by James Fenimore Cooper. Cooper had the Delaware Indians bestow the name on a white scout who lived with them.

In 1838, 12 years after the book was published, people in the territory of Iowa acquired the nickname, chiefly through the efforts of Judge David Rorer of Burlington and James Edwards of Fort Madison.

Edwards, editor of the *Fort Madison Patriot*, moved his paper to Burlington in 1843 and renamed it the *Burlington Hawkeye*. The two men continued their campaign to popularize the name, and territorial officials eventually gave it their formal approval.

### **HERKY THE HAWKEYE**

The Hawkeye nickname gained a tangible symbol in 1948 when a cartoon character, later to be named Herky the Hawkeye was hatched. The creator was Richard Spencer III, instructor of journalism at Iowa.

The impish Hawk was an immediate hit and acquired a name through a statewide contest staged by the athletic department. John Franklin, a Belle Plaine alumnus, was the man who suggested Herky.

Since his birth more than 45 years ago, Herky has symbolized Iowa athletics and epitomized University life. He even donned a military uniform during the Korean War and became the insignia of the 124th Fighter Squadron.

During the mid-1950s, Herky came to life at a football game as the Iowa mascot. Since that time, Herky has been a familiar figure at Iowa athletics events.

# **SCHOOL COLORS**

For 40 years Iowa was without school colors, but in 1887 a group of 50 seniors met on the steps of the Old Capitol to decide what are now the school official colors. They chose Old Gold, the color of Iowa's vast corn fields and Black, the color of the rich soil.

# **SCHOOL FIGHT SONG**

The Iowa Fight Song was written in 1950 by Mason City, Iowa, native Meredith Willson. Best known as the creator of Broadway's "The Music Man," Willson was awarded a 1963 University of Iowa Alumni Association Distinguished Service Award for "setting the spirit of Iowa to music." The lively cheer is sung hundreds of times during Iowa athletics events the year around.
