THE HEARTLAND TROPHY - - Iowa and Wisconsin have battled for the Heartland Trophy since 2004. The teams have split eight games with the Heartland Trophy at stake. Wisconsin has possession of the trophy following its 28-9 win a year ago in Iowa City.

RADIO -- (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak will call the action, along with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. The game can also be heard on UI student radio KRUI (89.7 FM), and Sirius channel 135 and XM channel 195 on satellite radio. Compass Media Networks will also broadcast the contest.

Wisconsin (8-2, 5-1) has defeated Western Illinois (37-3), Bowling Green (68-17), South Florida (27-10), Illinois (38-28), Maryland (52-7), Rutgers (37-0), Purdue (36-14) and Nebraska (59-24). Wisconsin lost to LSU (28-24) and at Northwestern (20-14)

THE SERIES - - Wisconsin holds a 43-42-2 advantage in the series that began with a 44-0 Badger win in 1894. Wisconsin has won the last two meetings to take the series lead, winning 28-9 in Kinnick Stadium a year ago. The teams have split the last four and last eight games. Iowa holds a 24-17-1 advantage in Iowa City.

COACHING RECORDS - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th year as a college head coach and his 16th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 127-103 and he is 115-82 at Iowa. He is the 12th Big Ten Conference coach to win 100 games. His Big Ten record is 68-58. Ferentz ranks ninth in Big Ten history in total wins and conference victories.

Gary Anderson is in his second season at Wisconsin and his seventh season as a college head coach. Anderson holds a career mark of 47-37, including a 17-6 mark with the Badgers. Anderson previously was the head coach at Southern Utah (2003) and Utah State (2009-12).

NEXT GAME - - lowa closes the regular season Friday, Nov. 28, hosting Nebraska (11 a.m., ABC) in the annual Hy-Vee Heroes Game. Wisconsin hosts Minnesota Saturday (2:30 p.m., BTN).

- lowa is 7-3 overall and bowl eligible for the 13th time in the last 14 seasons. lowa is 4-2 in Big Ten play. Since 1999, the Hawkeyes have won seven or more games 11 times, including six of the last seven seasons.
- lowa has scored 30 or more points in four Big Ten games for the first time since 2005

 (4). The last time lowa scored 30 or more points in five Big Ten games was 2002
 (6). Under head coach Kirk Ferentz, lowa is 62-6 when scoring 30 or more points.
- lowa has three road wins this season (3-2) and seven road wins over the last two seasons (4-1 in 2013). It is the first time in the Ferentz era lowa has back-to-back winning seasons on the road. lowa has five winning road records since 1999 (2002, 5-0; 2004, 3-2; 2009, 4-1; 2013, 4-1; 2014, 3-2).
- In Big Ten games only, the Hawkeyes lead the conference in pass defense, allowing 125.7 passing yards per game. Iowa's pass offense ranks No. 2 in the league with 241.0 yard per game.
- In six conference games, the Hawkeyes rank No. 4 in total offense averaging 425.2 yards per game.
- In Big Ten games only, Iowa leads the Big Ten averaging 25.5 yards in kickoff returns. In all games, RB Jonathan Parker averages 24.7 yards per return, No. 2 in the conference.
- Nineteen Hawkeyes have caught at least one pass this season (eight backs, seven receivers, four tight ends). The Hawkeyes have had 10 or more players record at least one catch in four of their seven wins.
- Eight Hawkeyes have combined for 10 interceptions. Iowa is one of 10 schools in the country to have eight or more players with at least one interception.
- Iowa has converted 11 fourth-down attempts, the most in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes have scored two touchdowns on fourth down (one pass, one rush).
- lowa totaled 587 yards of total offense and 304 yards rushing at Illinois. Both numbers are season highs, and both rank No. 4 in the Kirk Ferentz era.
- In four of Iowa's seven wins, the Hawkeyes recorded an interception on its opponents' final drive (CB Greg Mabin vs. UNI; FS Anthony Gair at Pitt; SS John Lowdermilk at Purdue; FS Jordan Lomax vs. Indiana).
- lowa has returned an interception for a touchdown in each of the last seven seasons and 12 of the last 14 seasons. CB Desmond King returned an interception for a touchdown (35 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 11.
- Iowa has used 16 first-time starters -- seven on offense (QB C.J. Beathard, C Tommy Gaul, FB John Kenny, WR Jacob Hillyer, RB Jonathan Parker, FB Macon Plewa, OL Sean Welsh) seven on defense (DE Nate Meier, LB Bo Bower, CB Maurice Fleming, FS Anthony Gair, LB Josey Jewell, CB Greg Mabin, LB Reggie Spearman), and two on special teams (P Dillon Kidd and K Marshall Koehn).

HOW THE WEST WAS WON

Wisconsin (5-1) enters Saturday's game with a one-game lead over Iowa (4-2), Minnesota (4-2), and Nebraska (4-2) in the Big Ten West. All four teams play each other in the final two weeks of the season. Iowa hosts Wisconsin and Nebraska, while Minnesota travels to Nebraska and Wisconsin.

In order for the Hawkeyes to represent the West in the Big Ten title game, the Hawkeyes must win their final two games and Minnesota must lose one game. Tiebreaker procedures are available at http://www.bigten.org/sports/m-footbl/archive/081011aaa.html.

@HawkeyeFootball QUICK STRIKES

- Iowa has outscored its opponents, 96-45, in the first quarter.
- · lowa scored a touchdown on its opening drive in three straight games (Maryland, Northwestern, Minnesota). The Hawkeyes looked to extend the streak to four against Illinois, but their 74-yard drive stalled at the 1-yard line.
- Iowa led Illinois 9-7 at halftime, and outgained the Illini 294-108 in the first half.
- Iowa outscored Northwestern 24-0 in the first quarter. The Hawkeyes have outscored their opponents 75-28 in the first quarter over the last five games (Indiana, Maryland, Northwestern, Minnesota, Illinois). In Iowa's first five games, the Hawkeyes scored 21 combined first-quarter points.
- In Iowa's 48-7 win over Northwestern, first-quarter total yards favored Iowa, 146-12. Firsthalf total yard favored Iowa, 298-55.
- Iowa scored 38 points in the first half twice this season (Indiana, Northwestern). The only other season Iowa scored 38-plus points in the first half twice in the same season under Kirk Ferentz was 2005 (Ball State and Minnesota).
- lowa scored four touchdowns in a span of 3:38 against Indiana on Oct. 11 (TE Jake Duzey reception, CB Desmond King interception, WR Damond Powell reception, RB Jonathan Parker rush).
- lowa scored on three straight offensive plays in the first quarter against Indiana on Oct. 11. TE Jake Duzey caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from QB Jake Rudock with 4:41 left. On Iowa's next play from scrimmage, WR Damond Powell caught a 72-yard touchdown pass from Rudock. On Iowa's next play from scrimmage, RB Jonathan Parker ran for a 60-yard touchdown.
- Against Indiana on Oct. 11, Iowa scored two offensive touchdowns of 60 yards or greater (Rudock to Powell, 72 yards; Parker 60-yard rush) for the first time since Oct. 31, 2009 vs. Indiana. (Stanzi to McNutt, 92 yards; Stanzi to Johnson-Koulianos, 66 yards).

- lowa has three wins when trailing or tied at the half this year (trailed Ball State, 7-3; trailed Pitt, 17-7; tied Purdue, 10-10).
- lowa trailed in each of its first four wins, and erased 10-point deficits in three wins (Ball State, Pitt, Purdue).
- The Hawkeyes have trailed in five wins (Northern Iowa, Ball State, Pitt, Purdue, Illinois).
- Iowa has two fourth-guarter comebacks this season (Ball State and Pitt). Iowa erased a 10-point deficit to defeat Ball State, 17-13, at home, and rallied from down 17-7 to win at
- lowa's win at Pitt was its first road win after trailing by 10 or more points in the second half during the Ferentz era.

@HawkeyeFootball MILESTONES

- RB Mark Weisman has 30 career rushing touchdowns, the third most in program history (Shaw, 33; Banks, 33), and the most in the Kirk Ferentz era. He is one of eight players in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards and 20 career rushing touchdowns. He has 2,466 career rushing yards, the eighth most in program history.
- QB Jake Rudock is the ninth player in program history to pass for 30 or more career touchdowns. He has 30 career touchdown passes, tying Brad Banks for ninth all time. Rudock has 4,246 career passing yards, the ninth highest total in school history. He is the 10th player in program history to pass for 4,000 career yards.
- WR Kevonte Martin-Manley leads lowa with 39 receptions. He ranks No. 3 in school history with 161 career receptions. He needs 13 catches to break lowa's all-time receptions record (Derrell Johnson-Koulianos, 173). Martin-Manley ranks No. 15 with 1,680 receiving yards.

- Wisconsin has a one-game series advantage in both football and men's basketball. The Badgers lead the football series, 43-42-2, and the men's basketball series, 80-79.
- lowa averages 236.3 passing yards per game, No. 5 in the conference. Wisconsin allows the fewest passing yards per game in the conference (147.3).
- Iowa ranks No. 2 in the Big Ten in pass defense, Wisconsin ranks No. 14 in pass offense.
- No Big Ten team has allowed fewer sacks than Wisconsin (8). The Badgers' 32 sacks rank No. 2 in the conference.
- Iowa has converted 45.6-percent of its third-down attempts, third best in the Big Ten. Wisconsin ranks No. 1 in opponent third-down conversion percentage (26.8).

HEARTLAND TROPHY

Iowa and Wisconsin have split the series, 4-4, since the two teams began playing for the Heartland Trophy in 2004.

The trophy was designed and crafted by artist and former lowa football player Frank Strub. The trophy, which is a bull mounted on a walnut base (native to both Wisconsin and lowa), has the scores of all previous games between the two schools inscribed on it. The Heartland Trophy became the 16th Big Ten football traveling trophy.

The Iowa-Wisconsin series has been the closest and most competitive of all Big Ten series, with Wisconsin holding a slim edge, 43-42-2.

THE SERIES

Saturday will be the 88th meeting between Iowa and Wisconsin. The teams had met 16 consecutive years from 1995-2010 before the series was disrupted by conference realignment in 2011. Through 87 games, Wisconsin leads 43-42-2. Iowa has won six of the last 10 and 23 of the last 33, but Wisconsin has won the last two, both in Iowa City.

Iowa is 24-17-1 against Wisconsin at Iowa City. The Hawkeyes defeated the Badgers 30-7 in 2004, in Kinnick Stadium, in the regular-season finale to win a share of the Big Ten championship, while keeping the Badgers from sharing the title.

LAST MEETING: Wisconsin 28, Iowa 9 (Nov. 2, 2013 at Kinnick Stadium)

The 24th-ranked Wisconsin Badgers rallied from a 6-0 deficit to upend the Iowa Hawkeyes, 28-9, and retain possession of the Heartland Trophy.

The Iowa defense forced four three-and-outs, collected one interception and allowed 42 yards total offense on Wisconsin's first five drives, but the Hawkeyes were only able to generate six points on their first five drives, via 28 and 22-yard field goals by Mike Meyer. lowa's average starting field position on its first five drives was its 49-yard line.

The Badgers claimed the lead on a 44-yard pass play from QB Joel Stave to WR Jacob Petersen to take a 7-6 lead into halftime.

Stave connected on a 20-yard touchdown to WR Jared Abbrederis midway through the third quarter before Meyer pulled Iowa within, 14-9, on a 29-yard field goal.

The Badgers maintained possession for most of the fourth quarter and added a pair of James White scoring runs (11 and 2 yards) to close the scoring.

Iowa QB C.J. Beathard relieved starting QB Jake Rudock in the third quarter after Rudock suffered a lower body injury. Before coming out of the game, Rudock completed 12-of-24 passes for 109 yards, while Beathard completed 4-of-15 passes for 70 yards.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 16th season as head football coach at lowa and is the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.

- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.



- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 106-61 (.635) overall mark and a 63-44 (.589)
 Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 115-82 (.584) and a 68-58 (.540) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 127-103 (.552). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- Believed to be the only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his third season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his third season.

TE Jake Duzey and TE Ray Hamilton were honored with College Football Performance Awards following their efforts at Illinois on Nov. 15. The pair combined for seven cataches for 130 yards and two touchdowns in Iowa's 30-14 victory. Duzey caught three passes for 110 yards, and Hamilton had a career-high four receptions for 20 yards and two touchdowns, the first touchdowns of his career. Both players received CFPA honorable mention.

THE NEXT NEXT-MEN-IN

Redshirt freshman LB Josey Jewell made his first career start at Illinois in place of injured LB Travis Perry. Jewell is the third linebacker this season to record his first career start (Bo Bower, Reggie Spearman).

Fifth-year senior C Tommy Gaul has started lowa's last four games at center, his first four career starts. Gaul played the majority of lowa's game against Indiana on Oct. 11, entering the game on lowa's opening drive when RG Jordan Walsh left due to injury. Starting center Austin Blythe slid to right guard, and Gaul handled snaps the rest of the game. Gaul, a Des Moines native, joined lowa as a walk-on in 2010. He appeared in one game in 2011, and two games in 2013.

#45 AMONG ALL-TIME GREATS

Senior RB Mark Weisman became the third player in program history to rush for 30 touchdowns in a career when he scored from 1-yard against Minnesota on Nov. 8. He is three rushing scores from tying Sedrick Shaw and Tavian Banks for the school record (33).

Weisman is one of six players in school history to surpass 2,400 career rushing yards and 22 career rushing touchdowns. The other seven include Sedrick Shaw, Ladell Betts, Albert Young, Tavian Banks, Owen Gill, Ronnie Harmon, and Shonn Greene.

In 33 career games, Weisman has 30 rushing touchdowns and 2,466 yards rushing. After spending the 2010 season at Air Force, Weisman joined the Hawkeyes as a walk-on and redshirted in 2011. He saw his first action as a sophomore in 2012.

FERENTZ AMONG TOP 10

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz has 115 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, the ninth most in conference history. He has 68 Big Ten wins, also the ninth most in conference history. He is one of eight coaches to rank among the top 10 in both categories. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Barry Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (8).

HAWKEYES JOIN 100 CLUB

lowa has posted 104 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 21st highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (144); Ohio State (138); Oklahoma (136); LSU (133); USC (133); Georgia (126); Texas (126); Alabama (124); TCU (123); Oregon (122); Virginia Tech (121); Florida State (121); Wisconsin (119); Auburn (116); Florida (115); West Virginia (112); Virginia (110); Utah (110); Nebraska (109); Miami, FL (105); Iowa (104); Texas Tech (103); Michigan (102); Boston College (98).

KOEHN No. 1 ON KICKOFFS

Junior K Marshall Koehn leads the conference and ranks sixth in the nation in touchback percentage. He has recorded a touchback on 34 of his 52 kickoffs (65.4 percent). His 34 touchbacks rank second in the Big Ten.

- Koehn is perfect on 29 PAT attempts, and has connected on 9-of-13 field goal attempts.
- Was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts against Northwestern (24, 48), marking the first time in his career he kicked multiple field goals in the same game.
- Koehn connected on seven consecutive field goal attempts before bouncing a 46-yarder off the right upright at Illinois. It was his first miss in conference play (5-of-6).
- Connected on a 52-yard field goal in the third quarter (0:48) at Pitt. It was a career long and ties for the eighth longest in school history. It was lowa's longest field goal since All-American Nate Kaeding split the uprights from 55 yards against Minnesota in 2003.
- Hit a game-tying 44-yard field goal in the fourth quarter (4:08) against Iowa State.

QB JAKE RUDOCK (JR., 6-3, 208) Career Games Played/Starts: 22/22

Junior QB Jake Rudock ranks No. 4 in the Big Ten with a 133.9 pass efficiency rating. He is tied for the league lead in completion percentage (63.9%) and has thrown just four interceptions, the fewest among Big Ten starters. Rudock is 172-of-269 for 1,863 yards and 12 touchdowns. He is 14-8 in his career as a starter, including a 6-3 record on the road, and an 8-4 mark at home (0-1 neutral).

- He has started 22 of Iowa's 23 games since the 2013 season opener. He has started Iowa's last five games after sitting out the Purdue game due to injury.
- His career totals include 376-of-615 pass attempts for 4,246 yards and 30 touchdowns.
- Matched his career high with 39 rushing yards, including a touchdown run, at Illinois.
- Ties Brad Banks for ninth on career touchdown passes (30).
- He is the eighth player in school history to throw for 30 or more touchdowns and 4,000plus yards.
- Among lowa's all-time career passing leaders. He has 4,246 career passing yards, the ninth highest total in school history.
- Has 4,505 career total offense yards, the eighth most in school history.
- Was 32-of-56 for 317 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception against Maryland. The 56 pass attempts are the second most ever for a Kirk Ferentz quarterback. The 300-yard passing game was the second of his career (322 vs. Ball State, 2014).
- Led lowa to four road wins in 2013, the highest total for an lowa starting quarterback since Ricky Stanzi won four games in 2009. Iowa was 2-2 on the road this season in Rudock starts.
- Set a career high in passing yards (322) and completions (33) in lowa's come-frombehind win against Ball State.
- First Big Ten quarterback with 570-plus yards and 60-plus completions through a team's first two games since Northwestern's Brett Basanez in 2004.
- He has three career game-winning drives in the fourth quarter or overtime (Michigan and Northwestern in 2013, Ball State in 2014).
- On lowa's final two drives against Ball State, Rudock was 9-for-11 for 81 yards passing

The University of Iowa played it's first intercollegiate game in 1889, a 24-0 loss to Grinnell on Nov.

and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 32 yards on Iowa's final two drives. He finished the game with a career-high 322 yards on 33-of-52 passing. He became Iowa's first QB with 30-plus completions, 300-plus passing yards and no interceptions in a game since Jon Beutjer against Indiana in 2000.

- His 322 passing yards against Ball State rank No. 29 in program history for a single-game.
- Streak of 17 consecutive starts was snapped Sept. 27 at Purdue. Rudock was injured in Week 4 at Pitt, and did not return to the game after halftime. He had started 17 straight dating back to the 2013 season opener.
- Completed 31-for-41 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns against Northern Iowa. Rudock distributed the ball to 13 different receivers, the most during the Kirk Ferentz era (1999-2014). It marked only the fourth game by a Big Ten team, since 2000, where at least 13 different players recorded at least one reception.

QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 203) Career Games Played/Starts: 13/1

Sophomore QB C.J. Beathard made his first career start and led Iowa to a 24-10 win at Purdue on Sept. 27. He became the first Iowa quarterback to win his first career start in a road game since Jason Manson won at Syracuse in 2006. Beathard completed 17-of-37 passes for 245 yards and one touchdown. The completions, attempts and yardage totals are career highs. He also rushed eight times for 29 yards, both career highs.

- Beathard has appeared in seven games this year (Ball State, Purdue, Pitt, Indiana, Northwestern, Minnesota, Illinois). He started the second half at Pitt and led Iowa on three straight scoring drives to start the second half (TD, FG, TD). He was 7-for-8 for 98 yards on Iowa's three scoring drives.
- Has a touchdown pass in each of the last two games.
- Completed 3-of-3 passes for 73 yards and a touchdown at Illinois.
- Completed 3-of-7 passes for 32 yards and a touchdown at Minnesota.
- Was 5-of-6 for 23 yards passing against Northwestern. Also carried three times for 23 yards.
- His 62-yard completion to WR Damond Powell in the third quarter at Pitt was a career long.
- Led Iowa on a seven-play, season-long 94-yard touchdown drive to open the second half at Pitt.
- He was 9-of-27 for 179 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions in five appearances in 2013.

LB QUINTON ALSTON (SR., 6-1, 232) Career Games Played/Starts: 43/11

Senior LB Quinton Alston has started all 10 games this season and ranks second on the team with 69 tackles. He entered the year with one career start (at Michigan, 2012).

- Recorded two catches, both first downs, for 56 yards at Illinois.
- Recorded three catches, all first downs, for 66 yards against Northwestern.
- Needs 13 catches to break lowa's all-time receptions record (Derrell Johnson-Koulianos, 173).
- Caught team-high five passes for 74 yards and a touchdown at Purdue. Four of his five grabs resulted in a first down, the other was a touchdown. The touchdown was his first of the season and 11th of his career.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- There are 28 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State (23) has more. Iowa has had three first round picks in the last five NFL drafts, only Wisconsin (4) has more among league teams.
- lowa had 18 players drafted from 2010-12. Six Hawkeyes were drafted in each of those
 years, including three first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn,
 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- lowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles.
- Former Hawkeyes Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) and Chad Greenway (Minnesota LB)
 were named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in their respective NFL careers in 2012.
 Greenway was a repeat selection in 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his second year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (10) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie.
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 12 years, 114-of-128 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

RB AKRUM WADLEY (R-FR., 5-11, 180) Career Games Played/Starts: 5/0

Redshirt freshman RB Akrum Wadley was Iowa's leading rusher against Northwestern and Minnesota. He carried nine times for 68 yards against Minnesota, and recorded his first career carry against Northwestern, finishing the game with 106 yards on 15 carries.

- First Hawkeye with 100-plus rushing yards in a player's first game with a carry since Brandon Wegher in 2009 (vs. Iowa State).
- Named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following his 106-yard rushing game against Northwestern.
- Rushed for 106 yards to become 1-of-4 different Hawkeyes to lead team in rushing in any single game this season (Weisman, 6; Wadley, 2; Rudock, 1; T. Smith, 1).

RB MARK WEISMAN (SR., 6-0, 240) Career Games Played/Starts: 32/30

Senior RB Mark Weisman has 30 career rushing touchdowns, third most in program history. Only Sedrick Shaw (33) and Tavian Banks (33) have more career rushing touchdowns.

Spearman started Iowa's first seven games, the first starts of his career. He missed the Northwestern and Minnesota games, but returned to action against Illinois.

LB Quinton Alston and LB Bo Bower have started every game this season. Entering this year, Iowa's linebackers combined for two career starts, one by Alston and one by Perry.

Perry recorded five tackles and registered his first career sack in his first start this year against Northwestern. Perry and Jewell recorded career highs in tackles at Minnesota. Perry made six stops, while Jewell was credited with nine tackles.

- Alston ranks second on the team with 69 tackles.
- lowa's linebackers have combined for 14.5 tackles for loss this season.
- All five linebackers -- Alston, Bower, Jewell, Perry, Spearman

2 HAWKEYES EARN ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Senior running back Mark Weisman and junior defensive back Jordan Lomax have been named to the Capital One Academic All-District 6 first team. Both are now candidates for Academic All-America honors.

Weisman holds a 3.32 grade point average and is majoring in health and human physiology. He earned academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2012 and 2013. He is a three-time honoree on the UI Dean's List.

Lomax earned academic All-Big Ten honors in 2013. He is an economics major and carries a 3.52 grade point average. Lomax has also earned Dean's List recognition in three semesters.

In the last 16 seasons, under UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, 24 lowa football student-athletes have combined to earn academic All-District and All-America recognition on 43 occasions.

53 AND COUNTING

The Hawkeyes have played 53 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation. Iowa has converted on 159 consecutive PATs during the streak.

GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

- Wisconsin is making its third consecutive trip to lowa City. The Badgers have won the last two meetings.
- The Heartland Trophy is the third of lowa's four trophy games this year. lowa lost possession of the Cy-Hawk and Floyd of Rosedale. The Hawkeyes will try to win back the Heartland Trophy from Wisconsin on Saturday, and maintain possession of the Heroes trophy Nov. 28 against Nebraska.
- Iowa has played five games following its opponent's bye week (Iowa State, Maryland, Northwestern, Minnesota, and Illinois). The Hawkeyes were 2-3 in those contests.

2 GAMES FOR THE RECORD BOOK

QB Jake Rudock passed for more yards (572) through the first two games of the season than any quarterback in program history. His completions (64) and attempts (93) were also more than any other quarterback through two games.

As a team, Iowa's 592 passing yards (66-of-96) were the most through two games since 1985 when Chuck Long and Marc Vlasic threw for a combined 671 yards (44-of-74) against Drake and Northern Illinois.

lowa's 55 passes in Week 2 against Ball State marked the highest number of pass attempts for an lowa team under Kirk Ferentz since the 2006 Outback Bowl (55 vs. Florida). lowa's 35 completions against Ball State were the second most under Kirk Ferentz (36 vs. Indiana in 1999).

The Hawkeye Express, the engine and club cars that transport fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is available for those fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Saturday. The Hawkeye Express is in its 11th season. Adults can ride the train for \$12, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot. Media credentials are accepted as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train in Coralville four hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company.

FERENTZ THIRD IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 16th season as lowa's head football coach and ranks third in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer and Larry Blakeney of Troy. Blakeny will retire at the end of the season. Ferentz is tied for third with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,190 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 613-538-39 (.530). That includes a 386-211-16 (.642) record in home games, a 227-327-23 (.412) record in games away from lowa City, a 306-364-25 (.455) mark in Big Ten games and a 269-175-15 (.601) record in Kinnick Stadium.

RECRUITING LANDSCAPE

lowa's roster includes 118 players from 20 states and one foreign country. Among Big Ten schools, only Nebraska (25) and Penn State (21) have a larger footprint in the United States. Of the Hawkeyes' 118 players, 40 are from lowa. The roster includes 18 players from Illinois; 10 from Ohio; seven from Maryland, six from Michigan and Texas; four from Missouri, Minnesota, New Jersey and Florida; three from Nebraska and Wisconsin; two from Canada; one from Arizona, Connecticut, Indiana, New York, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia; and three from Canada. Only four FBS schools – Michigan State (4), UCONN (3), UNLV (3), Wyoming (3) – have more Canadians on their 2014 roster.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- lowa has 104 wins since 2002. Only 23 programs across the country have 100 or more wins since the start of the 2002 season.
- Including 2014, the Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four of the past 11 seasons, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.
- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003
 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top
 Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year);
 Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002
 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back).
- Iowa has appeared in the final Associated Press poll 22 times in program history, a total that ranks 25th-best in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. lowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the last 15-plus seasons. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa fans are known for their support of Hawkeye athletics, and the attendance figures from 2012-13 support that claim. Iowa was one of four programs in the nation to rank among the top 25 in attendance for football, men's basketball and women's basketball events in 2013-14. In addition, Iowa was the only program in the nation to rank among the top 25 in attendance a year ago in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, and wrestling. Iowa sold an estimated 11,000 tickets to the 2014 Outback Bowl, with more than 15,000 Hawkeye fans attending the game in Tampa. Iowa sold 95 percent of it bowl game ticket allotment, the highest percentage of any bowl team.

IOWA WILL RECEIVE

lowa has received the opening kickoff in 9-of-10 game this season (not Maryland). In 16 seasons as lowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeye received the opening kickoff in 159-of-197 games (95-64). Iowa has started the game on defense in 38-of-197 games under Ferentz (20-18). Iowa started the game on defense one time this year (loss at Maryland, 38-31).

IOWA BOWL NOTES

lowa has appeared in 27 bowl games with a record of 14-12-1 (.537). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), and the Capital One, Gator and Freedom bowls once.

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 13 of the last 14 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State and Michigan have received a conference-best 42 bowl bids, followed by the Hawkeyes (27) and Wisconsin (24). All four schools were bowl-eligible in 2013.
- The Hawkeyes have appeared in 11 bowl games since 2001.
- Iowa (14-12-1, .537), Penn State (27-15-2, .636) and Purdue (9-8, .529) are the only Big Ten teams with a positive winning percentage in bowl games.
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including two appearances by lowa (1-1).

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

lowa has seven players on its roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. The seven legacy players ties Tennessee for the third most on any one team in the country. California and Idaho each have eight legacy players.

lowa's seven players include WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1984-86), LB Andrew Cerney (Tim in 1971-73), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), and TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81).

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

lowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each Wednesday night. The 90-minute radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the lowa Hawkeyes. The show airs each Wednesday evening at 7 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

Tickets to Iowa's remaining Big Ten Conference home games against Wisconsin and Nebraska can be ordered online at hawkeyesports.com, by calling 1-800-IA-HAWKS, or in person at the UI athletics ticket office located in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

 Capacity at Kinnick Stadium is 70,585. Iowa has sold out 63 of its last 77 games.

The Hawkeyes close the regular season at home on Friday, Nov. 28, hosting Nebraska in the Hy-Vee Heroes Game (11 a.m., ABC).

PODOLAK TOPS 400 GAMES IN BROADCAST BOOTH

Hawkeye radio broadcaster Ed Podolak called his 400th game (241-154-6) in the Hawkeye booth on Saturday, Nov. 8, in Minneapolis. Podolak is in his 33rd season the Hawkeyes' football analyst. He joined the broadcast booth in 1982 following a lengthy professional career with the Kansas City Chiefs. He was a three-year letterman for the Hawkeyes as a quarterback and running back from 1966-68.

Podolak replaced former Iowa head coach Forest Evashevski in the broadcast booth in 1982 and partnered with the late Jim Zabel until 1996. Since 1997, he has worked with play-by-play voice of the Hawkeyes Gary Dolphin.

UI MAKES LIST OF MILITARY FRIENDLY SCHOOLS

GAME RECAP

Iowa posted a 31-23 victory over Northern Iowa in Kinnick Stadium in both team's season opener.

The Hawkeyes rushed 36 times for 151 yards and totaled 250 yards passing. QB Jake Rudock completed 31 of his 41 pass attempts to 13 different targets. The 13 different receivers are the most during the Kirk Ferentz era in a single-game. Seven Hawkeyes accounted for the 151 yards rushing, led by WR Tevaun Smith's 35 yards.

Defensively, the Hawkeyes amassed nine tackles for loss, including five sacks, and held the Panthers to 25 yards rushing on 25 carries (1.0 average). The 25 yards rushing are the fewest by an Iowa opponent since Minnesota had seven yards rushing against the Hawkeyes in 2008.

lowa scored first on a LeShun Daniels, Jr. 13-yard scoring run to cap a 41-yard drive on its opening possession. The scoring play was the first of Daniels' career. The opening drive was set up by a 50-yard return on the opening kick by RB Mark Weisman; the first return of his career.

UNI answered with 10-straight points to take a 10-7 advantage. Michael Schmadeke converted a 36-yard field goal, followed by a Kevin Vereen 23-yard TD reception.

Weisman crossed the goal line from 1-yard out to reclaim the lead with 5:03 left in the second quarter.

The teams exchanged field goals before the end of the half, which included Iowa junior's Marshall Koehn's first career field goal (40 yards).

Iowa stretched its lead to 24-13 on a 6-yard scoring strike from Rudock to Smith with 10:13 left in the third period.

UNI answered with a 70-yard pass play from QB Sawyer Kollmorgen to RB David Johnson. Schmadeke's third field goal trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to 24-23 with 12:42 left in the fourth quarter.

WR Damond Powell tallied his third career TD on a 12-yard pass from Rudock to give Iowa the eight-point victory.

WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught a game-high eight passes for 62 yards, while TE Jake Duzey caught a personal-best seven passes for 34 yards.

DT Louis Trinca-Pasat recorded career bests in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3) and sacks (1.5). DB Jordan Lomax also posted a career high in tackles (9). LB Bo Bower and CB Greg Mabin each had their first career interception.

lowa rallied from a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit to upend Ball State, 17-13, in Kinnick Stadium. The comeback equaled the team's second-largest in the fourth quarter since 1999; lowa posted a 17-point comeback versus Pittsburgh in 2011 and had another 10-point rally against Indiana in 2009.

QB Jake Rudock engineered his third career fourth-quarter comeback (Northwestern and Michigan in 2013). The junior was 9-of-11 for 81 yards and two touchdowns on Iowa's final two scoring drives. Rudock finished the game posting career highs in completions (33), pass attempts (52), passing yards (322), and rushing yardage (36). Rudock became the first Hawkeye QB with 30-plus completions, 300-plus pass yards and zero interceptions in a game since Jon Beutjer against Indiana in 2000.

Ball State scored for the first time in three games against lowa on a 35-yard fumble return in the second period to give the Cardinals an early 7-0 advantage.

Iowa answered with a Marshall Koehn 26-yard field goal to close within four points on its next possession.

Ball State scored the only points of the third quarter on two Scott Secor field goals (27 and 42 yards).

Trailing by 10 points in the fourth quarter, lowa tallied a pair of 12-yard touchdown passes in the final 2:52 of the game to notch its second victory of the season. Rudock connected with WR Derrick Willies for his first career touchdown reception with 2:52 remaining. After lowa's defense forced a three-and-out, TE Jake Duzey culminated a six-play, 59-yard drive with the game-winning TD reception from Rudock.

For the second-straight game, Kevonte Martin-Manley led the Hawkeye receiving corps, catching eight balls for 70 yards. WR Tevaun Smith caught six passes for 59 yards.

DE Drew Ott recorded a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss, and one sack. He also forced a fumble (recovered by Carl Davis) on Ball State's final offensive play with 25 seconds left. His efforts earned the junior Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors. SS Jordan Lomax matched a personal-best with nine tackles.

After accumulating nine tackles for loss against Northern lowa the previous week, the Hawkeye defense amassed another eight TFL's versus Ball State. DT Carl Davis and LB Quinton Alston each registered 1.5 TFL's.

Iowa State rallied from a 14-3 halftime deficit to edge Iowa, 20-17, in front of a sold-out crowd at Kinnick Stadium. RB Mark Weisman (one yard) and QB Jake Rudock (five yards) accounted for the Hawkeyes' first-half touchdowns. Weisman's scoring run capped a 16-play, 55-yard drive that consumed 7:54 off the play clock in the first quarter. Rudock's 5-yard run completed a 10-play drive that saw

lowa thwarted a Cyclone scoring threat late in the second quarter when LB Quinton Alston forced an ISU fumble at the goal line. CB Greg Mabin recovered the fumble in the end zone with 1:28 left in the first half.

Iowa convert two fourth-down plays.

Iowa State quarterback Sam Richardson connected with WR EJ Bibbs in the end zone on a fourth-and-one midway through the third period to make the score 14-10. The score was the first red-zone touchdown the Hawkeyes allowed in 2014. Later in the fourth quarter, the Cyclones claimed the lead on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Richardson to RB DeVondrick Nealy.

lowa tied the game on its ensuing drive, with a 44-yard field goal from Marshall Koehn. However, the Cyclones generated a 51-yard drive that culminated with Cole Netten's game-winning 42-yard field goal with two seconds remaining. Netten also split the uprights from 47 yards in the first period.

Rudock finished the game completing 16-of-24 passes for 146 yards and 39 yards rushing on 12 attempts. Richardson completed 25-of-37 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns for the Cyclones.

Weisman led the Hawkeye ground attack, rushing 16 times for 49 yards, while Aaron Wimberly led Iowa State's ground game with 33 yards on 11 carries.

Three Hawkeyes recorded career high in tackles, including Alston (game-high 10), LB Reggie Spearman (7) and Mabin (6). Jevohn Miller led the Cyclones in tackles, amassing nine.

The visiting team has won the last three games in the series, dating back to 2011.

GAME RECAP

For the second time in as many meetings, lowa rallied past Pittsburgh in the fourth quarter for victory. Trailing 20-17 at the start of the fourth quarter, lowa engineered a 13-play, 52-yard touchdown drive that proved to be the gamewinning score in a 24-20 win. The win marks lowa's third straight on the road, dating back to last season.

Each team scored a touchdown in the first period. The Panthers scored first on a Chris James 14-yard rush. On the next possesion, Iowa QB Jake Rudock found TE Henry Krieger Coble, on a fourth down play, in the end zone from 13 yards out for his second career TD to even the score.

Pittsburgh dominated the second quarter, scoring 10 points on a James Connor 1-yard run and a Chris Blewitt 33-yard field goal. The Hawkeyes had possession for 2:44, running only five plays during the second period, and Pitt went into halftime with a 17-7 lead.

QB C.J. Beathard replaced an injured Rudock at the start of the second half. Beathard led Iowa on three-straight scoring drives beginning with a seven-play, season-long 94-yard drive resulting in a RB Mark Weisman 10-yard scoring run to cut the deficit to 17-14.

Each team traded field goals before the end of the third quarter, including Iowa PK Marshall Koehn connecting from a career-long distance of 52 yards. The 52-yard field goal equals the eighth-longest field goal in school history.

Weisman tallied his second TD of the game from one yard out with 6:56 remaining in the contest to give the Hawkeyes a 24-20 advantage.

lowa's defense stopped Pittsburgh on the Panthers' final two drives, including Anthony Gair collecting his first career interception as time expired to preserve the victory.

Weisman finished the contest with a season-high 88 yards rushing on 22 attempts. Rudock and Beathard combined to complete 12-of-18 passes for 178 yards and a TD. Beathard was 7-of-8 for 98 yards, with 62 of the 98 yards coming on a pass to WR Damond Powell, which helped set up Iowa's first touchdown of the second half.

After allowing 132 yards rushing the first 30 minutes, the Hawkeye defense yielded only 53 the second half. SS John Lowdermilk led Iowa with a career and game-best 11 tackles.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's final 24 points in a 24-10 Big Ten-opening triumph over the Boilermakers at Ross-Ade Stadium in West Lafayette. The win was the second in as many years at Purdue.

lowa fell behind 10-0 after a 39-yard interception return and a 42-yard field goal. However, the Hawkeyes answered before halftime with 10 points of their own via a 2-yard RB Mark Weisman rushing score and a 28-yard field goal by K Marshall Koehn.

lowa's offense totaled 420 yards of offense. QB C.J. Beathard completed 17-of-37 passes for 245 yards with one touchdown in his first career start, while Weisman led the ground attack with 76 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries. Weisman's totals put him over the 2,000-yard rushing plateau as he became only the seventh Hawkeye to rush for more than 2,000 yards and over 20 touchdowns.

The Hawkeyes dominated the second half, outscoring the Boilermakers 14-0. WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught the game-winning touchdown, his first score of the season, on a 23-yard pass with 45 seconds left in the third quarter. Weisman tallied his second rushing score of the day, this time from five yards out, to put the game out of reach.

Eight different receivers caught at least one pass, with Martin-Manley leading the way with five receptions for 74 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown. Martin-Manley's totals moved him into fifth all-time in career receptions with 148.

Beathard became the first Iowa QB to win his first career start in a road game since Jason Manson in 2006 at Syracuse.

The Hawkeye defense limited Purdue to nine first downs, 156 total yards -- 72 of which were in the air -- forced two turnovers, six three-and-outs, and recorded six tackles for loss, including four sacks. The 72 yards passing are the sixth-fewest by a team during the Kirk Ferentz era. Also, the nine first downs tie for the seventh-fewest by an lowa opponent since 1999.

SS John Lowdermilk picked off Purdue QB Danny Etling twice in the fourth period to go along with a team-best seven tackles.

lowa scored 38 of its season-high 45 points in the first half en route to a 45-29 victory over Indiana at Kinnick Stadium on Homecoming. Six different Hawkeyes accounted for the 45-point outburst.

The Hawkeye offense totaled 426 yards of offense, while the defense collected three interceptions and forced eight three-and-outs. After missing the last game due to injury, QB Jake Rudock returned in a starting role, completing 19-of-27 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns.

lowa scored 28 first-quarter points for the first time since scoring 28 against Ball State in 2005. Rudock connected with TE Jake Duzey (12 yards), and hit WR Damond Powell for a season-long 72 yard scoring play. Jonathan Parker scored on a 60-yard rush, and CB Desmond King returned an interception 35 yards. Iowa has recorded a defensive score in each of the last seven years.

The Hoosiers closed to within 28-21 on a 13-yard pass play from QB Nate Sudfeld to Nick Stoner and a 45-yard scoring run by Tevin Coleman, his second of the game; he had an 83-yard scoring run in the first period.

Iowa closed the half with a 22-yard Marshall Koehn field goal and a 1-yard touchdown run by Mark Weisman as time expired. The Hawkeyes led 38-21 at halftime.

Weisman crossed the goal line a second time from one yard out to extend lowa's advantage to 45-21 with 13:17 left in the fourth period. Indiana's Coleman added a 69-yard scoring run -- his third touchdown of the game -- to close the scoring.

lowa totaled 207 rushing yards, led by Weisman's 89 yards and two scores on 25 carries. Parker rushed three times for 58 yards and a score. WR Tevaun Smith led the lowa receivers with four catches for 69 yards.

Sudfeld completed 4-of-9 passes for 85 yards and one interception before exiting the game due to injury in the second quarter. Coleman rushed for a game-high 219 yards on 15 attempts and three scores to lead the Hoosiers.

Nate Meier amassed a career-high 10 tackles, while Quinton Alston had eight stops and Reggie Spearman equaled a personal best with seven tackles. Bo Bower and Jordan Lomax had Iowa's other two interceptions.

GAME RECAP

Maryland rallied from a 14-point first-half deficit to hand lowa its first road loss of the season, 38-31, at Byrd Stadium in the team's first-ever meeting.

The Hawkeyes sprinted out to a 14-0 advantage in the first quarter after a RB Mark Weisman 2-yard scoring run and a TE Henry Krieger Coble 2-yard touchdown reception from QB Jake Rudock. Weisman's score came five plays after DE Drew Ott intercepted Maryland QB C.J. Brown on the first play from scrimmage -- the first theft of his career.

The Terrapins answered with 24-straight points spanning the first, second and third quarters. Jacquille Veii ran for a 23-yard touchdown, Wes Brown scored on a 1-yard rush, Stefon Diggs tallied a 53-yard TD reception and Brad Craddock kicked a 41-yard field goal to give Maryland a 24-14 lead with 4:18 remaining in the third period.

lowa closed the gap to 24-21 late in the third quarter after Weisman's second 2-yard scoring run of the game. It marked the Hawkeye senior's fourth-straight multiple TD game and eighth of his career.

Maryland extended its lead to 17 in the fourth quarter after Will Likely returned a Rudock interception 45 yards and a Brown 1-yard run.

Iowa made a late push, recording a WR Jacob Hillyer 4-yard TD reception and a 24-yard Marshall Koehn field goal with 1:19 remaining following an onside kick. The Hawkeyes' attempt to recover a second consecutive onside kick was unsuccessful.

Rudock completed 32-of-56 passes for 317 yards and two touchdowns, while Maryland starter C.J. Brown completed 12-of-23 passes for 120 yards.

Weisman rushed for a team-high 78 yards on 10 carries, while C.J. Brown led the Terrapins with 99 yards rushing on 21 attempts.

RB Damon Bullock and TE Jake Duzey each caught eight balls -- the most by a Hawkeye this season. Bullock's eight receptions covered a career-high 100 yards, while Duzey's totaled 80 yards.

Defensively, LB Quinton Alston (12) and FS Jordan Lomax (11) each registered career highs in tackles. In addition to his interception, Ott collected a game-high 2.5 sacks.

GAME RECAP

Mark Weisman scored three touchdowns and Jake Rudock threw for another in a 48-7 lowa victory over Northwestern in Kinnick Stadium. The win was lowa's sixth, making the Hawkeyes bowl eligible for the 13th time in 14 seasons.

lowa scored on its first three offensive possessions and returned a blocked punt for a touchdown to jump out to a 24-0 advantage in the first quarter. Weisman started the scoring with an 8-yard run less than two minutes into the game. Following a 48-yard Marshall Koehn field goal, Weisman found the end zone again, this time from 14 yards. Freshman Ben Niemann finished the first-quarter scoring with a 1-yard return after blocking a Northwestern punt.

The Hawkeyes added two more touchdowns in the second quarter after Northwestern's only score of the contest; Tevaun Smith caught a 31-yard touchdown pass, followed by another Weisman 8-yard run -- his third of the half.

After a scoreless third period, Koehn split the uprights from 24 yards -- his seventh straight made field goal -- and redshirt freshman Akrum Wadley scampered five yards for his first career score. Wadley, who was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week, finished the contest with 106 yards rushing on 15 carries. It marked the first time since Jordan Canzeri at Purdue (165 yards) in 2013 that a Hawkeye topped the century mark on the ground.

Rudock completed 12-of-19 passes for 239 yards and one touchdown, while C.J. Beathard completed 5-of-6 passes for 23 yards. Weisman finished with 94 yards and three scores on 20 carries. The Hawkeye senior scored multiple rushing touchdowns for the fifth-straight game. Matt VandeBerg led the Hawkeye receivers with career bests in receptions (5) and receiving yards (90).

lowa's defense was stellar, allowing only 180 total yards, including 75 yards passing. The Hawkeyes registered eight tackles for loss, including five sacks, forced and recovered a fumble. Louis Trinca-Pasat, who was tabbed Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week, amassed a game and careerhigh three sacks -- all in the first half.

Northwestern QB Trevor Siemian completed only 8-of-18 passes for 68 yards. Mike McHugh was the Wildcats' leading receiver with 24 yards on one catch.

Minnesota snapped a two-game losing streak to Iowa with a 51-14 win over the Hawkeyes at TCF Bank Stadium in Minneapolis. With the victory, the Gophers take possession of Floyd of Rosedale for the next year.

Minnesota, who has hosted the Hawkeyes four of the last five years, controlled the contest following Iowa's touchdown on its opening possession. The Hawkeyes drove 76 yards in 12 plays, with running back Mark Weisman scoring a 1-yard touchdown. It marked the seventh consecutive game that Weisman scored a rushing touchdown and the 30th of his career. Only Sedrick Shaw (33) and Tavian Banks (33) have more.

The Gophers scored touchdowns on five of their first six possessions and took a 35-7 lead into halftime. Minnesota added two more touchdowns and a field goal in the second half. Iowa senior WR Andrew Stone caught a 24-yard pass from QB C.J Beathard on Iowa's final drive of the game. The score was the first of Stone's career.

Minnesota outgained Iowa 429-205 in total yards, forcing three Hawkeye turnovers and blocked a punt, all in the first half.

QB Jake Rudock completed 10-of-19 passes for 89 yards and an interception, while Beathard was 3-of-7 for 32 yards and a score. Minnesota QB Mitch Leidner completed 10-of-13 passes for 138 yards and four touchdowns, and rushed for a game-high 77 yards on 11 carries.

Redshirt freshman RB Akrum Wadley led Iowa's ground attack for the second-straight game, rushing for 68 yards on nine attempts. Running back Damon Bullock had four catches for 41 yards.

S John Lowdermilk (13), LB Josey Jewell (9) and Travis Perry (6) each recorded career highs in tackles.

lowa scored 28 consecutive points, including a season-best 21 second-half points, en route to a 30-14 triumph over Illinois at Memorial Stadium in Champaign. The win was Iowa's sixth in the last seven meetings against the Fighting Illini.

The Hawkeyes amassed season highs in total yards (587) and rushing yards (304); both totals rank as the fourth-highest by an lowa team during the Kirk Ferentz era.

DT Louis Trinca-Pasat forced an Illinois safety and the defensive unit accumulated seven tackles for loss -- Iowa's highest total since the season opener against Northern Iowa (nine).

lowa quarterbacks combined for 283 yards passing, 39 yards rushing, and four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing). Jake Rudock completed 14-of-21 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns. Rudock also rushed eight times for 39 yards and a touchdown. The 39 yards rushing equal a career high. C.J. Beathard was 3-of-3 passing for 73 yards and a score.

Mark Weisman rushed 23 times for a season-high 134 yards. It marked the first time this season the senior topped the century mark and the ninth time in his career.

Trailing 7-2, Iowa scored 28 consecutive points to grab a 30-7 advantage. TE Ray Hamilton caught touchdown passes of one and six yards; the first scores of his career. Hamilton becomes the first Iowa tight end with two receiving touchdowns in a single game since Tony Moeaki in 2009 (Michigan).

Rudock scampered six yards for a score early in the fourth period, and WR Damond Powell caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Beathard to close Iowa's scoring.

TE Jake Duzey caught three passes for 110 yards, which is the highest single-game receiving yardage total by a Hawkeye this season.

SS John Lowdermilk and DE Nate Meier led Iowa with seven tackles each. LB Josey Jewell made his first career start, collecting five stops.

The Hawkeyes dominated the time of possession, holding the ball for a season-high 35:46, while the Illini maintain possession for only 24:14.

Iowa converted 10-of-15 (67 percent) third down attempts, while Illinois was 6-of-16 (38 percent) and was forced to punt eight times.
