RADIO -- (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak call the action, with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. KRUI (89.7 FM), the UI student radio station, will broadcast the game as well.

Compass Media Networks will also broadcast the contest, with Gregg Daniels and Tony Hill calling the action.

TELEVISION -- The game will be televised by ESPN. The announcers are Steve Levy, Brock Huard and Shannon Spake.

THE RECORDS -- Iowa is 4-0, with wins over Illinois State (31-14), at Iowa State (31-17), Pittsburgh (27-24) and North Texas (62-16). The Hawkeyes were 7-6 last season, earning a trip to the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. Iowa was 4-4 in Big Ten play and 3-2 in nonconference games last season.

Wisconsin is 3-1, having won home games against Miami, Ohio (58-0), Troy (28-3) and Hawaii (28-0). The Badgers dropped a 35-17 neutral site contest to Alabama. Wisconsin was 11-3 a year ago, winning the Big Ten West Division with a 7-1 record.

THE SERIES -- Wisconsin holds a 44-42-2 advantage in the series that began with a 44-0 Badger win in 1894. Wisconsin has won the last three meetings to take the series lead, winning 26-24 in Kinnick Stadium a year ago. Iowa is making its first appearance in Camp Randall Stadium since a 20-10 victory in 2009. Wisconsin holds a 26-18-1 advantage in games played in Madison.

THE HEARTLAND TROPHY -- Iowa and Wisconsin have battled for the Heartland Trophy since 2004. Wisconsin holds a 5-4 advantage with the Heartland Trophy at stake. The Badgers have possession of the trophy following their 26-24 win last November in Kinnick Stadium.

COACHING RECORDS -- Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th year as a college head coach and his 17th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 131-106 and he is 119-85 at Iowa. He is the 12th Big Ten Conference coach to win 100 games.

Paul Chryst is in his first year as the Wisconsin head coach and his fourth year as a college head coach. His mark is 3-1 at Wisconsin and 22-20 overall. Chryst was the head coach at Pitt the last three seasons. Chryst was previously a Wisconsin assistant for eight seasons and also played quarterback (1985-87) for the Badgers.

NEXT GAME -- Iowa returns home for Homecoming, hosting Illinois (11 a.m., TBA). Wisconsin travels to Nebraska.

- The Hawkeyes are trying to improve to 5-0 for the first time since 2009, and the fourth time under Kirk Ferentz.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 119 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, tying Barry Alvarez (119) for ninth in conference history. Alvarez won 119 games in parts of 18 seasons at Wisconsin.
- Saturday marks the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz's 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes open the conference season on the road. Iowa has won its last two Big Ten openers (24-10 at Purdue in 2014; 23-7 at Minnesota in 2013).
- Junior QB C.J. Beathard is undefeated in five career starts. He is 3-0 at home, 2-0 on the road, and 1-0 in the Big Ten. The last Iowa quarterback to win his first six career starts was Matt Sherman, who won seven from 1994-95.
- Junior QB C.J. Beathard started Iowa's conference opener in 2014. The Hawkeyes won, 24-10, at Purdue in his first career start.
- Senior RB Jordan Canzeri leads the Big Ten and is tied for fourth nationally with eight rushing touchdowns. He entered his senior season with two career rushing touchdowns in 29 career games.
- The Hawkeyes average 37.8 points per game, No. 2 in the conference and their highest average since 2011, when they also scored 151 points (34, 41, 31, 45) in their first four games.
- Iowa leads the Big Ten in red zone offense. Wisconsin leads the Big Ten in red zone defense.
- Iowa is one of two schools yet to allow a rushing touchdown (Navy). The Hawkeyes yield an average of 84.0 rushing yards per game, fourth best in the Big Ten and 12th nationally.
- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach, the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player start on the offensive line in every season. Five Iowa graduates are active offensive tackles in the NFL, more than any other school (Virginia also has five).

THE SERIES

Saturday will be the 89th meeting between Iowa and Wisconsin. The teams had met 16 consecutive years from 1995-2010 before the series was disrupted by conference realignment in 2011. Through 88 games, Wisconsin leads 44-42-2.

The Badgers have won three straight in the series.

The Hawkeyes are making their first trip to Madison since 2009, a 20-10 Iowa win. The Hawkeyes are 18-26-1 all-time at Wisconsin.

IOWA/WISCONSIN NOTES

- Iowa opens Big Ten play at Wisconsin on Saturday. This marks the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz's 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes open the conference season on the road.
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is 8-8 in Big Ten openers, including 5-7 on the road and 3-1 at home.
- The Hawkeyes have won their last two conference-season openers, both on the road (24-10 at Purdue in 2014; 23-7 at Minnesota in 2013).
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has 119 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, tying Barry Alvarez (119) for ninth in conference history. Alvarez won 119 games in parts of 18 seasons at Wisconsin. He is the current Wisconsin athletic director and previously served as an assistant coach under Hayden Fry at Iowa.
- Iowa averages 37.8 points per game, No. 2 in the conference. Wisconsin allows 9.5 ppg, also No. 2 in the conference.
- Iowa leads the Big Ten and ranks eighth in the country in third-down conversions. Iowa has converted on 26-of-50 third down attempts (52-percent). Wisconsin's defense ranks fifth in the conference allowing just 31.5-percent third-down conversions.
- Iowa leads the Big Ten in red zone offense. Wisconsin leads the Big Ten in red zone defense. Iowa has scored on 15-of-16 trips to the red zone (14 TDs, 1 FG). Wisconsin opponents have made just five trips to the red zone, scoring two touchdowns and one field goal.

HEARTLAND TROPHY

Wisconsin has a 5-4 advantage in the series since the two teams began playing for the Heartland Trophy in 2004.

The trophy was designed and crafted by artist and former Iowa football player Frank Strub. The trophy, which is a bull mounted on a walnut base (native to both Wisconsin and Iowa), has the scores of all previous games between the two schools inscribed on it. The Heartland Trophy became the 16th Big Ten football traveling trophy.

The Iowa-Wisconsin series has been the closest and most competitive of all Big Ten series, with Wisconsin holding a slim edge, 44-42-2 after claiming the most recent three meetings.

LAST MEETING: Wisconsin 26, Iowa 24 (Nov. 22, 2014 at Kinnick Stadium)

Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon rushed for 200 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 14 Wisconsin to a 26-24 win over Iowa in Kinnick Stadium.

The teams exchanged field goals in the first quarter before Wisconsin reeled-off 16 straight points in the second and third periods.

The Hawkeyes closed to within 19-17 with 11:10 remaining in the contest with a Kevonte Martin-Manley 20-yard touchdown reception and a Jake Rudock 3-yard scoring run. Jordan Canzeri converted a two-point conversion after Martin-Manley's reception, but the Hawkeyes failed to convert a second two-point conversion attempt following the Rudock score.

The Badgers answered with Gordon's 23-yard touchdown run to increase their advantage to 26-17 with 7:44 remaining. Iowa quickly countered with a 7-play, 86-yard drive in 2:43 that culminated with a Jake Duzey 9-yard scoring reception to close within 26-24 with 5:01 remaining. Wisconsin then converted two first downs on its final drive to run out the clock.

Rudock accounted for three touchdowns, throwing for two (20 and nine yards) and rushing for another (three yards). He completed 20-of-30 passes for 311 yards, marking the third time in his career that he surpassed 300 yards passing.

Mark Weisman and Canzeri combined for 76 yards rushing on 20 carries. Tevaun Smith caught four passes for a game-high 78 yards, while Duzey had four catches for 72 yards and a score.

Wisconsin kicker Rafael Gaglianone made field goals of 50 and 22 yards, while Iowa's Marshall Koehn converted his only attempt (22 yards).

Iowa totaled 412 yards of total offense. Eight different Hawkeye defenders accounted for Iowa's seven tackles for loss. SS John Lowdermilk led the Hawkeyes in tackles (12) for the fourth consecutive game. FS Jordan Lomax had 10 stops, while CB Greg Mabin and LB Bo Bower each registered seven.

TAKING 151 TO 151

When the Hawkeyes travel north on Highway 151 this weekend, they'll do so with an offense that has totaled 151 points through four games, the second highest total in the conference (Indiana, 153).

The 151 points scored (37.8 ppg) through four games is Iowa's highest total since 2011, when it also scored 151 points (34, 41, 31, 45). The most points scored through four games in the Kirk Ferentz era is 165 by the 2002 team that finished 11-2 overall and set a school record for scoring in a season (484 points).

WE'LL GO FIRST

Iowa received the opening kickoff in all four games this season. The Hawkeyes have scored touchdowns on two of four opening drives and has outscored its opponents 27-3 in the first quarter.

In 17 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes received the opening kickoff in 166-of-204 games (99-67). Iowa has started the game on defense in 38-of-204 games under Ferentz (20-18).



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 17th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.



- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ranks ninth with 119 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 68 Big Ten wins, ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 110-64 (.632) overall mark and a 63-46 (.578) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 119-85 (.583) and a 68-60 (.531) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 131-106 (.553). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his fourth season.

FERENTZ TIES ALVAREZ

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 119 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, tying Barry Alvarez (119) for ninth in conference history. Alvarez won 119 games in parts of 18 seasons at Wisconsin. Ferentz is three wins shy of tying Lloyd Carr for eighth all-time (122).

Ferentz has 68 Big Ten wins, the 10th most in conference history. He trails John Cooper (Ohio State) by two wins for ninth all-time.

Only eight coaches rank in the top 10 in both categories: overall wins as a member of the Big Ten, and conference wins. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (nine).

STARTING 5

The Hawkeyes are 4-0 for the fourth time under Kirk Ferentz. A win Saturday would be Iowa's second 5-0 start in the Ferentz era (2000). The 2009 Hawkeyes won their first nine games, finished 11-2 overall, and won the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.

Iowa enters the conference portion of its schedule undefeated for the fourth time since 1999. The Hawkeyes were 3-0 in 2009 and 2006, and 4-0 in 2003.

FERENTZ SECOND IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 17th season as Iowa's head football coach and ranks second in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (28). Ferentz is tied for second with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

THE FOURTH QUARTER

QB C.J. Beathard and the Hawkeyes' rush defense have dominated the fourth quarter in 2015. Iowa's rush defense, the No. 4 defense in the conference, has yielded 59 total rushing yards in the fourth quarter this season. That includes a 55-yard effort from North Texas against Iowa reserves.

Beathard is 14-of-17 passing for 206 yards and one touchdown. His 142.6 quarterback rating in the fourth quarter leads the conference. He has also rushed six times for 35 yards and one touchdown in the fourth quarter this season. He has engineered game-winning drives in the fourth quarter two times this season (Iowa State, Pitt). He was 4-of-4 for 46 yards and a touchdown against Iowa State, and he rushed for 27 yards on three carries to set up K Marshall Koehn's 57-yard game winning field goal against Pitt.

In Iowa's last five games, including the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, Beathard's fourth quarter numbers include 21-of-24 passing for 301 yards and three touchdowns, and eight carries for 73 yards and one touchdown. Beathard did not play in the fourth quarter against North Texas.

RUSH DEFENSE... NO TOUCHDOWNS FOR YOU

Iowa is one of two schools yet to allow a rushing touchdown (Navy). The Hawkeyes yield an average of 84.0 rushing yards per game, fourth best in the Big Ten and 12th nationally.

Iowa limits its opponents to 2.65 yards per carry (82 attempts, 153 yards), 12th best in the country.

2-FOR-2 AGAINST POWER 5

Iowa recorded two wins against Power 5 schools in its nonconference schedule: Iowa State, 31-17, and Pitt, 27-24. The Hawkeyes were one of only two Big Ten schools with two wins against teams from a Power 5 league. The other was Northwestern (Stanford, Duke).

6 THE OTHER WAY

Iowa returned two interceptions for touchdowns in Week 4 against North Texas. LB Josey Jewell recorded the first interception of his career, returning it 34 yards for a touchdown. LB Bo Bower returned an interception 88 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It is the seventh longest interception return in school history.

Iowa has at least one interception returned for a touchdown in each of the last eight seasons, and 12 of the last 14 seasons. The last time Iowa returned two interceptions for touchdown was 2013 against Western Michigan (both by B.J. Lowery).

QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 209)**Career Games Played/Starts: 18/5**

Junior QB C.J. Beathard leads the Big Ten in pass efficiency (157.8). His 68.2 completion percentage ranks second in the league, his 962 yards rank third, and his 151 rushing yards are more than any other conference quarterback. He also has accounted for nine touchdowns (six passing, three rushing).

Beathard has set career highs in passing yardage in each of the last two weeks. He threw for a then career-high 258 yards against Pitt in Week 3, and topped that with 278 yards on 18-of-21 passing against North Texas in Week 4. He completed his first 15 passes against North Texas -- the best start to a game by a Big Ten QB since Wisconsin's Russell Wilson in 2011 (16-of-16), including an 81-yard scoring strike to WR Tevaun Smith. It was the longest pass of Beathard's career.

Beathard earned Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors after helping lead Iowa to a 14-point triumph at Iowa State. Beathard totaled 292 yards (215 passing and 77 rushing) against the Cyclones. Beathard was the first quarterback in the Kirk Ferentz era (1999-2015) to amass more than 400 yards passing (426) and 100 yards rushing (103) through the first two games of a season.

He joined Nathan Chandler (2003) as the only quarterbacks to win each of their first four career starts under Kirk Ferentz.

Beathard in 3-2-1:

- Undefeated in five career starts. Numbers include 92-of-147 (62.6) passing for 1,207 yards, seven touchdowns, and two interceptions, and 180 yards rushing with three rushing touchdowns.
- Won his first five career starts. The last Iowa quarterback to win his first six career starts was Matt Sherman. Sherman won his first seven starts, including the final two games of 1994 and the first five games in 1995.
- Only the second Big Ten quarterback in the last 20 seasons (Dan Persa, NW, 2010) with 900-plus passing yards, 150-plus rushing yards, and 68-percent completion percentage through the first four games.

HAWKEYE INJURY UPDATES**OL AUSTIN BLYTHE (SR., 6-3, 290)****Career Games Played/Started: 40/39**

Senior C Austin Blythe is the veteran on an offensive line that includes three sophomores. He has started 39 games for Iowa, more than any other active Hawkeye, since debuting as Iowa's starting RG as a redshirt freshman in the 2012 season opener.

Blythe in 3-2-1:

- 34 consecutive starts on the offensive line.
- Iowa's opening day starting center for three straight years.
- Rimington and Outland Trophy Watch Lists.

RB LeSHUN DANIELS, JR. (JR., 6-0, 225)**Career Games Played/Starts: 16/2**

Junior RB LeShun Daniels started the first two weeks of the season, but has seen limited action since leaving the Iowa State game due to injury. Daniels rushed for 179 yards through the first five-plus quarters of the season, but has been limited to 38 yards rushing over the last two games.

Daniels in 3-2-1:

- Set career highs in carries (26), rushing yards (123), and longest rush (27) in his first career start against Illinois State on Sept. 5. It was his first career 100-yard game.
- Entered the season with 184 rushing yards in 12 games. Has 217 yards through four games in 2015.
- He was Iowa's eighth different opening day starting running back since 2007.

RB JORDAN CANZERI (SR., 5-9, 192)**Career Games Played/Starts: 33/4**

Senior RB Jordan Canzeri tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns in Week 4 against North Texas. He has named Big Ten Conference and College Sports Madness Offensive Player of the Week. It was the sixth time in program history a player rushed for four touchdowns, and the first time since Shonn Greene scored four times against Wisconsin in 2008. Canzeri has eight rushing touchdowns through four games, the highest total by a Hawkeye player since Tavian Banks rushed for 12 touchdowns through the first four games in 1997.

Canzeri leads Iowa in rushing yards (316) and ranks third in receiving yards (145). His 461 all-purpose yards rank seventh in the conference. Since 2010, the only Big Ten players with 800-plus scrimmage yards and eight-plus touchdowns through four games are Monte Ball, Jordan Hall, Melvin Gordon, and Jordan Canzeri.

Canzeri in 3-2-1:

- Leads the Big Ten and ties for fourth nationally with eight rushing touchdowns. He entered his senior season with two career rushing touchdowns in 29 career games.
- Scored six rushing touchdowns over the last two weeks, his first two starts of the season, and has a rushing score in each of Iowa's four games this season.
- Second on the team with 13 receptions. Seven straight games with at least one reception.

CB DESMOND KING (JR., 5-11, 190)

Career Games Played/Starts: 30/29

Junior CB Desmond King, regarded as one of the top corners in the conference, has made a habit of making big plays on returns this season. King returned a punt 37 yards (career long) to set up Iowa's go-ahead touchdown drive against Iowa State on Sept. 12, and picked up a muffed squib kick and returned it 27 yards to set up K Marshall Koehn's 57-yard game winning field goal against Pitt on Sept. 19. He totaled 180 return yards against North Texas, setting up five touchdowns on six returns.

King in 3-2-1:

- Tied for the Big Ten lead with three interceptions. The last Hawkeye to lead the league in interceptions was Tyler Sash in 2009 (6).
- Had interceptions on Pitt's first two possessions. They were his second and third interceptions of the season, and the fifth and sixth of his career. He is the first Hawkeye with two interceptions in a game since John Lowdermilk in the fourth period at Purdue in 2014.
- Totaled 180 return yards against North Texas (71 punt and 109 kickoff). He became the fourth Big Ten player in the last 20 seasons with 100-plus kickoff return yards and 70-plus punt return yards in a single game.

DE DREW OTT (SR., 6-4, 272)

Career Games Played/Started: 45/28

Senior DE Drew Ott returned to the starting lineup against North Texas in Week 4, recording two tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. Ott saw limited action against Pitt in Week 3, one week after leaving the Iowa State game with three minutes left in the first quarter. He did not start against Pitt, snapping his streak of 15 consecutive starts at defensive end, but did play.

Ott recorded two sacks for a loss of 20 yards and forced one fumble in Iowa's season opener. His two sacks against Illinois State are the first time a Hawkeye collected multiple sacks in a season-opener since Mitch King had a pair in 2007. Ott led the team and tied for third in the Big Ten with 8.0 sacks in 2014. He had two tackles, one sack (7 yards), and two quarterback hurries against Pitt in 2014.

Ott in 3-2-1:

- Has started 28 of the last 30 games at defensive end.
- One of 11 players on Big Ten Players to Watch List.
- Picked up a deflected punt against Nebraska in 2014 and returned it 12 yards for his first career touchdown.

WR TEVAUN SMITH (SR., 6-2, 205)

Senior WR Tevaun Smith recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game in Week 4 against North Texas. Smith had four

Smith in 3-2-1:

- Ranks third in the Big Ten averaging 19.6 yards per catch (12 for 235).
- Nine of his 12 catches have resulted in a first down, including two touchdowns (51, 81).
- Has at least one reception in 17 straight games.

WR MATT VANDEBERG (JR., 6-1, 185)

Career Games Played/Starts: 27/6

Junior WR Matt Vandenberg had more catches through the first three games of the season (22) than any player in the Kirk Ferentz era (since 1999). Kevin Kasper had 21 receptions through the first three games of 2000, and Kevonte Martin-Manley, the school's all-time leader in receptions, had 19 catches through three games in 2013 and 2014.

Vandenberg in 3-2-1:

LB COLE FISHER (SR., 6-2, 236)**Career Games Played/Starts: 35/4**

Senior LB Cole Fisher leads Iowa and ranks 10th in the Big Ten with 33 tackles. He has started each of Iowa's first four games (his first four career starts).

Fisher in 3-2-1:

- Has been Iowa's leading tackler in three of four games (Illinois State, Pitt, North Texas).
- Recorded a career-high 12 tackles against Pitt in Week 3.
- Has two sacks, 3.5 tackles-for-loss, and one pass break-up. Entered senior season with zero sacks, TFL, or break-ups.

TE JAKE DUZEY (SR., 6-4, 248)**Career Games Played/Starts: 38/13**

Senior TE Jake Duzey made his first appearance of the season in Week 4 against North Texas. Duzey suffered a knee injury in the final week of spring practice and missed the first three games of his senior season.

Duzey in 3-2-1:

- Three touchdown receptions in 2014 tied for the team lead (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Tevaun Smith).
- Had 36 receptions in 2014, a single-season career high and tied for the second most by a Big Ten tight end this season.
- 85-yard TD reception at Ohio State in 2013 is ninth longest scoring reception in school history.

K MARSHALL KOEHN (SR., 6-0, 200)

Senior K Marshall Koehn has made seven consecutive field goal attempts, 15 of his last 16 attempts, and is 4-for-4 this season, all 40-plus yard attempts (40, 49, 43, 57).

He has 18 touchbacks, the second highest total in the conference, on 24 kickoffs (75 percent).

Koehn also dabbles in the punt game, rugby-style. He has two punts for an average of 56.5 yard per punt. Both punts have been downed inside the opponent's 10-yard line.

He was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following his game-winning field goal against Pitt on Sept. 19.

Koehn in 3-2-1:

- Has made seven consecutive field goal attempts, 15 of his last 16 attempts, and is 4-for-4 this season, all 40-plus yard attempts (40, 49, 43, 57).
- Hit a career-long 57 yard field goal as time expired to defeat Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19. It is the second longest field goal in school history (Tim Douglas, 1998) and ties a Kinnick Stadium record (Lee Pistor, Arizona, 1977). He has kicked two of Iowa's nine longest field goals in school history -- both coming against Pitt (52 at Pitt in 2014 and 57 vs. Pitt in 2015).
- Has 104 career points. He is the 36th player in program history with 100 career points. He ranks 31st in career scoring.

P DILLON KIDD (SR., 6-2, 215)

Senior P Dillon Kidd shared punting duties in 2014, averaging 38.5 yards per punt. In near full-time duty in 2015 (Marshall Koehn has two of Iowa's 15 punts) Kidd is averaging 47.9 yards on 12 punts.

BAPTISM BY FIRE

Iowa starting offensive tackles LT Boone Myers and RT Ike Boettger entered 2015 with one combined career start (Boettger started as a second tight end against Wisconsin in 2014). The sophomores replace a pair of NFL lineman -- 2014 Outland Trophy winner LT Brandon Scherff (Washington Redskins) and RT Andrew Donnal (St. Louis Rams).

Myers joined the program as a walk-on and was put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season. He saw action in four games last season. Boettger joined the team as a tight end but was moved to offensive line in 2013. He saw action in seven games as a redshirt freshman in 2014.

Iowa has allowed only five sacks and leads the Big Ten with 12 rushing touchdowns through four games in 2015.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach, the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player start on the offensive line in every season.

In each of the last eight years, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Both players were second round draft picks in 2003.

THE KICK

Marshall Koehn kicked a 57-yard field goal as time expired to defeat Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19. The game-winning field goal was the second longest in school history and tied the Kinnick Stadium record (Arizona's Lee Pistor in 1977).

After Pitt tied the game, 24-24, with 0:52 left in the fourth quarter, Iowa DB Desmond King picked up a squib kick at the 3-yard line and returned it 27 yards to the Iowa 30. QB C.J. Beathard picked up two rushing first downs to move the ball into Pitt territory, and after a pair of sideline routes to WR Tevaun Smith

fell incomplete, Beathard scrambled for eight yards to the Pitt 39-yard line. Iowa then used its final timeout to stop the clock with two seconds left.

On fourth-and-2, Pitt called a timeout to freeze Koehn. Koehn let a kick sail anyway, but it landed far short of the goal post. On the ensuing attempt, Dillon Kidd placed a snap from Tyler Kluver on the Pitt 47-yard line, and Koehn split the uprights, giving Iowa its first walk-off field goal since 1986 (Holiday Bowl).

THE DRIVE

Iowa put together a 99-yard scoring drive on its second possession of the season. It was the Hawkeyes' first 99-yard touchdown drive since 2002. Iowa passed six times and rushed six times while converting five first downs on the drive. QB C.J. Beathard was 4-of-6 passing for 63 yards. He also carried once for two yards. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., carried four times for 18 yards, and RB Jordan Canzeri took his first carry of the season five yards into the end zone. Canzeri also had a 21-yard reception.

FLIRTING WITH 100

Junior QB C.J. Beathard gained 111 yards but lost 34 yards rushing against Iowa State on Sept. 12. His net gain of 77 yards threatened his career-high of 82 set at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. The last Iowa quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a single game was Butch Caldwell, who ran for 109 yards on 12 attempts against Michigan State on Nov. 24, 1973 in Iowa City.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

The Hawkeyes have used 10 first time starters. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., LT Boone Myers, DT Nathan Bazata, DT Jaleel Johnson, LB Cole Fisher, LB Ben Niemann, and SS Miles Taylor all started the season opener. TE Jameer Outsey made his first career start against Iowa State, DE Parker Hesse started for the first time in the win over Pitt, and WR Riley McCarron had a career-high three catches against North Texas in his first career start.

REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Three true freshmen have played in 2015, and all saw their college first action in the season opener: OL James Daniels, WR Jerminic Smith, and WR Adrian Falconer. Daniels is the first true freshman to play offensive line since Bryan Bulaga in 2007. Daniels joined the Iowa program last spring and participated in spring practice.

AMONG THE BEST IN THE BIG TEN

Iowa has posted a 6-6 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State has won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. Following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- There are 30 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- Five Iowa graduates are active offensive tackles in the NFL, more than any other school (Virginia also has five).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Kirk Ferentz has produced seven first-round draft picks, tied for ninth most among active college coaches.
- Since 2011, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State matches Iowa's NFL total. Iowa has had five first round picks in the last six NFL drafts, tying Wisconsin (5) for the league lead.
- Iowa had 22 players drafted from 2010-15, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a four-time Pro-Bowler (2011-14) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, and 2014.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie (including 2015 rookie Ray Hamilton).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 13 years, 123-of-137 (90 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

IOWA AMONG TOP 25 IN WINS, 2002-15

Iowa has posted 108 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 20th highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (151); Ohio State (146); Oklahoma (140); USC (138); LSU (137); Georgia (132); Alabama (130); TCU (130); Oregon (128); Texas (127); Florida State (127); Virginia Tech (125); Wisconsin (125); Florida (121); Auburn (119); West Virginia (117); Utah (116); Virginia (112); Nebraska (112); Iowa (108); Miami, FL (108); Texas Tech (107); Michigan (105).



GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

- The Hawkeyes open Big Ten play at Wisconsin on Saturday. This marks the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz's 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes open the conference season on the road.
- For the first time in program history Iowa plays more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa defeated Pitt, 27-24, in a BTN primetime game Sept. 19. The Hawkeyes host Minnesota on Nov. 14 at 7 p.m. (CT) on BTN.
- Iowa is one of four Big Ten teams (Iowa, Michigan, NW, Rutgers) with two power five schools on its nonconference schedule (Iowa State, Pitt). The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 31-17, on Sept. 12, and Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Illinois State, 31-14, in the season opener. The Redbirds lost to North Dakota State in the 2014 FCS title game. Iowa opens the 2016 season hosting North Dakota State.
- Iowa will face Maryland on Oct. 31 in Iowa City. It marks Maryland's first football game in Iowa City. It also marks the 16th time in Iowa program history the Hawkeyes play on Halloween (6-8-1).
- The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- Iowa's Homecoming game is Oct. 10 against Illinois at 11 a.m. Iowa is 56-42-5 all-time in Homecoming contests, and has won five of its last six Homecoming games. Illinois is visiting Kinnick Stadium for the first time since 2007.
- Three of Iowa's nonconference opponents are led by coaches who have been assistants in the Big Ten, including Illinois State's Brock Spack (Purdue), Pitt's Pat Narduzzi (Michigan State), and North Texas' Dan McCarney (Iowa, Wisconsin). Iowa State's Paul Rhoads was a graduate assistant under John Cooper at Ohio State.
- Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2015: Iowa State (Cy-Hawk: W, 31-17), Wisconsin (Heartland), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), and Nebraska (Heroes).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of four Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared the poll 297 times, the fifth highest total in the

Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.

- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.
- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 17th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

PAULSENS ARE A FAMILIAR FACE

Freshmen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The Paulsens are one of three sets of brothers on Iowa's 2015 roster, joining DB Kevin Ward and OL Ryan Ward, and OL James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week. The 90-minute radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.



HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,197 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 617-541-39 (.530). That includes a 389-213-16 (.641) record in home games, a 228-328-23 (.413) record in games away from Iowa City, a 306-366-25 (.457) mark in Big Ten games and a 272-177-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster of 114 players includes 49 players from Iowa. The roster includes 14 players from Illinois; nine from Texas; seven from Maryland; six from Missouri, five from Ohio; four from Michigan; three from Florida, Nebraska, and New Jersey; two from South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Canada; one from Alabama, Minnesota, New York, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.

IOWA BOWL NOTES

Iowa has appeared in 28 bowl games with a record of 14-13-1 (.518). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

Iowa has played 12 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-6).

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 13 of the last 14 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 45 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (43), Iowa (28) and Wisconsin (26).
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including two appearances by Iowa (1-1).
- For just the second time in league history, 10 Big Ten Conference teams competed in bowl games in 2014 (2011). Ohio State won the inaugural College Football Playoff, while Michigan State won the Cotton Bowl, another College Football Playoff bowl.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players on its 2015 Leadership Group, including 13 seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are OL Austin Blythe, RB Jordan Canzeri, DL Darian Cooper, FB Adam Cox, TE Jake Duzey, WR Jacob Hillyer, PK Marshall Koehn, DB Jordan Lomax, DE Nate Meier, DE Drew Ott, LB Travis Perry, FB Macon Plewa and WR Tevaun Smith. The junior class is represented by QB C.J. Beathard

and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., and LB Josey Jewell represents the sophomore class.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2015. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach. Steven is an offensive lineman who is in his fourth season as a redshirt junior. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in May 2013. He is currently playing for the NFL's Denver Broncos. Ferentz is the only FBS coach ever to coach three sons at the same school.

MORE THAN ONE

Eleven high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; and Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois each graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include DeMatha Catholic HS (Washington, D.C.), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Solon HS (Solon, Iowa), Waukee HS (Waukee, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), Williamsburg HS (Williamsburg, Iowa), and Woodbury Central HS (Menville, Iowa).

THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE

Redshirt freshman WR Brandon Bishop and freshman WR Emmanuel Ogwo are the lightest Hawkeye players at 170 pounds. Junior DL Jaleel Johnson is the heaviest at 310 pounds. A total of seven Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more.

The tallest player at 6-8 is redshirt freshman DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is sophomore WR Jonathan Parker.

The average Hawkeye player is 6-2 and weighs 232 pounds. That is the one inch taller and two pounds heavier than the average Iowa player in 2013.

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

Iowa has nine players on its 2015 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppey (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), WR Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 31 points en route to a 31-14 season-opening victory over Illinois State at Kinnick Stadium.

In his second career start, first at home, QB C.J. Beathard accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing and one passing), while throwing for 211 yards (15-of-24). Beathard scored on runs of six and one yard, while completing a 9-yard score to WR Matt VandeBerg. Beathard became the first Hawkeye quarterback to rush for two TD's and pass for another in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes dominated the game in the trenches, rushing 44 times for 210 yards offensively, and collecting 10 tackles for loss, including five first-half sacks, defensively.

RB LeShun Daniels and RB Jordan Canzeri led the Hawkeyes offensively, combining for 241 all-purpose yards. Daniels led the Hawkeye ground attack rushing for 123 yards on 26 attempts. Canzeri had a game-best 90 yards receiving on four catches, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries.

Iowa took a 17-0 lead into halftime after PK Marshall Koehn split the uprights from 40 yards as time expired in the second quarter. The field goal followed rushing scores from Beathard (six yards) and Canzeri (five yards) earlier in the half. Canzeri's score capped off a 12-play, 99-yard drive -- Iowa's first 99-yard TD drive since its game at Miami (OH) in 2002.

The only scoring in the third quarter was VandeBerg's 9-yard reception. Beathard closed out the Hawkeye scoring with a one-yard plunge midway through the fourth quarter. Illinois State added two late touchdowns against the Hawkeyes' second unit.

The Hawkeye defense was in the Illinois State backfield applying pressure most of the afternoon. DE Drew Ott had two sacks for a combined loss of 20 yards. DE Nate Meier had two tackles for loss, including a sack, while LB Ben Niemann had 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. LB Cole Fisher led the team with eight total tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a sack and blocked Illinois State's 50-yard field goal attempt.

As a unit, the Hawkeyes held the Redbirds to 35 yards rushing on 28 attempts, including zero yards on 15 carries in the first half.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points to record a 31-17 come-from-behind road victory over Iowa State at Jack Trice Stadium and reclaim possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The Hawkeyes were led offensively by QB C.J. Beathard, RB Jordan Canzeri, and WR Matt Vandenberg. Canzeri rushed a career-high 24 times for 124 yards and a TD. Vandenberg posted career highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (114), while also scoring a TD. Beathard rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including a career-long rush of 57 yards, while also completing 15-of-25 passes for 215 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. Beathard's efforts earned the junior signal caller Manning Quarterback of the Week and Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.

After each team posted a field goal in the first quarter, the Cyclones grabbed a 10-3 advantage with an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Sam Richardson to Quenton Bundrage. The Hawkeyes evened the score two possessions later with a 14-yard WR Tevaun Smith scoring reception to culminate a 93-yard drive.

Iowa State took a 17-10 lead into halftime after a 29-yard scoring reception by Jauan Wesley.

The Hawkeyes controlled the second half, scoring three touchdowns and allowing Iowa State only 66 total yards on 31 plays.

Vandenberg recovered a TE Henry Krieger-Coble fumble on Iowa State's 3-yard line and crossed the goal line to tie the game in the third period. Riley McCarron then scored the game-winning TD, the first score of his career, on a 25-yard pass from Beathard in the back corner of the end zone with 2:14 remaining in the contest. Canzeri tallied Iowa's final score on an 8-yard scamper following Desmond King's first interception of the season.

Iowa's defense collected six tackles for loss, including four sacks by four different players. The Hawkeyes limited the Cyclones to 63 yards rushing on 27 attempts (2.3 avg.). DE Nate Meier and LB Josey Jewell each registered seven tackles. In addition to the interception, King had five tackles.

Iowa's DE Drew Ott and RB LeShun Daniels left the game in the first and second quarters, respectively, and did not return due to injury.

GAME RECAP

Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yard field goal as time expired to lift Iowa to a 27-24 triumph over Pittsburgh in Kinnick Stadium. The 57-yard field goal is the second longest in school history and tied a Kinnick Stadium record.

Koehn's kick marked the first time the Hawkeyes won a game with a field goal as time expired since Rob Houghtlin made a 41-yard game-winning kick in the 1986 Holiday Bowl to beat San Diego State, 39-38.

The victory marked the Hawkeyes' first 3-0 start in six seasons (2009).

C.J. Beathard improved to 4-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback after posting career bests in completions (27), pass attempts (40), and passing yards (258). He also rushed for a 9-yard score in the second quarter.

With Iowa leading 10-0 after a Koehn 43-yard field goal and Beathard's score, Pittsburgh cut the deficit to 10-7 after Scott Orndorff caught a 15-yard scoring reception one play after an Iowa turnover. Iowa extended its advantage to 17-7 with 44 seconds remaining before halftime with a Jordan Canzeri 4-yard run -- his first of two scores of the night.

The visitors evened the score with 10 special-teams points in the third period, via a Chris Blewitt 48-yard field goal and a 28-yard return by Pat Amara following a blocked punt.

Canzeri (1-yard run) and Pittsburgh's Tyler Boyd (8-yard reception) exchanged touchdowns in the fourth period before Koehn's heroics. The winning field goal was set up after the Hawkeyes drove 31 yards in the final 52 seconds after the Panthers had tied the score. It marked the second straight week that Beathard engineered a fourth quarter game-winning drive.

WR Matt VandeBerg (45 yards) and Canzeri (30 yards) each caught seven balls, while Canzeri also rushed for a game-high 49 yards on 12 carries.

Defensively, CB Desmond King had a career-best two interceptions, both in the first quarter, to go along with eight tackles. One of King's thefts came in the end zone to thwart a Panther scoring threat. LB Cole Fisher (12) and DB Jordan Lomax (11) posted double-digit tackles.

Koehn's two field goals, along with his first career punt of 64-yards, earned the senior placekicker Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

GAME RECAP

Jordan Canzeri tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns to lead Iowa to a convincing 62-16 victory over North Texas at Kinnick Stadium. The 62 points scored were the most by a Hawkeye team in 13 seasons.

Canzeri scored on runs of one, three, 10 and 16 yards to become the sixth Hawkeye running back to score four rushing touchdowns in a single game. The senior finished the game with 115 rushing yards on 22 carries.

Quarterback C.J. Beathard also had a stellar performance directing the offense, completing 18-of-21 passes for a career-high 278 yards and two touchdowns. Beathard connected on his first 15 pass attempts, becoming the first Big Ten quarterback to complete his first 15 pass attempts in a game since Wisconsin's Russell Wilson in 2011 (16-of-16).

Canzeri scored three of his four touchdowns in the first half, while Iowa's other two scores came via receptions of 43 and 81 yards by George Kittle and Tevaun Smith, respectively. Smith's 81-yard strike was Iowa's longest from scrimmage since an 85-yard score for Jake Duzey from Jake Rudock in 2013 at Ohio State. Smith finished the contest with a career-high 115 yards receiving on four catches.

Iowa scored 13 points or more in each quarter and tallied a season-high 35 points in the first half.

After yielding a field goal on the opening drive of the second half, the Hawkeyes put an exclamation mark on the win with four unanswered touchdowns. Two of the final four touchdowns came via interception returns of 34 yards (Josey Jewell) and 88 yards (Bo Bower). It marked the first time Iowa recorded two pick-sixes in a game since 2013 against Western Michigan (B.J. Lowery). Bower's 88-yard return is the seventh longest return in school history.

Desmond King had a career day on special teams, returning a total of six kicks for 180 yards. King returned four kickoffs for 109 yards and two punts for 71 yards.

Linebackers Cole Fisher and Jewell led the squad, each totaling nine tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a career-high four tackles to go along with his first career fumble recovery.

Iowa closed the nonconference portion of its schedule 4-0, marking the fourth time under Kirk Ferentz that the Hawkeyes have started a season 4-0.
