TICKETS - - Tickets remain on sale at the UI Athletics Ticket Office in Carver-Hawkeye Arena or by phone or website (1-800-IA-HAWKS or hawkeyesports.com). Tickets are \$65 for adults and there is a youth ticket price of \$25.

RADIO - - (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak call the action, with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. KRUI (89.7 FM), the UI student radio station, and on Sirius channel 135 and XM channel 196 on satellite radio.

TELEVISION - - The game will be televised by BTN. The announcers are Joe Beninati and Chuck Long.

THE RECORDS - - Iowa is 2-0 after opening the season with a 31-14 home win over Illinois State and a 31-17 win at Iowa State. The Hawkeyes were 7-6 last season, earning a trip to the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. Iowa was 4-4 in Big Ten play and 3-2 in nonconference games last season.

Pittsburgh (2-0) opened the season with a 45-37 home win over Youngstown State, before winning 24-7 at Akron last weekend. The Panthers were 6-7 last season, including an appearance in the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.

THE SERIES - - The series is tied at 3-3 following Iowa's 24-20 victory at Pitt last season. Iowa also defeated the Panthers in 1951 (34-17) and 2011 (31-27), both in Iowa City. The Panthers won in 1931 (20-0) in the first-ever meeting in Iowa City. Pitt also claimed home wins in 1952 (26-14) and 2008 (21-20).

COACHING RECORDS - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th year as a college head coach and his 17th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 129-106 and he is 117-85 at Iowa. He is the 12th Big Ten Conference coach to win 100 games.

Pat Narduzzi is in his first year as a college head coach, with a record of 2-0. He most recently was the defensive coordinator at Michigan State for eight seasons (2007-14), and has also been an assistant coach at Rhode Island, Northern Illinois, Miami, Ohio, and Cincinnati.

NEXT GAME - - Iowa remains home for its final nonconference game, hosting North Texas at 2:30 p.m. (CT) on ESPNU. Pitt travels for its third straight road game, visiting Virginia Tech.

- The Hawkeyes are trying to improve to 3-0 for the first time since 2009. Iowa has advanced to a bowl game every season it has started 3-0 (2001, 2003, 2006, 2008, 2009). Iowa has opened the season with a 2-0 record in 11 of the past 15 seasons.
- Junior QB C.J. Beathard is 3-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback, a record that includes a 2-0 mark on the road and a 1-0 mark at home.
- Senior WR Tevaun Smith needs 16 yards to become the 37th player in program history to accumulate 1,000 yards receiving in a career.
- Junior WR Matt Vandenberg has scored a touchdown in three straight games and leads the Big Ten with 15 receptions.
- QB C.J. Beathard replaced injured QB Jake Rudock to start the second half against Pitt last season. Beathard led Iowa to three straight scoring drives, finishing the game 7-of-8 for 98 yards and rallying Iowa to a 24-20 win.
- Pitt is one of two Power Five schools on Iowa's nonconference schedule (Iowa State: W, 31-17). Only four other Big Ten teams (Iowa, Michigan, Northwestern, and Rutgers) have two Power Five schools on their nonconference schedule.
- Pitt was victim to Iowa's largest comeback in school history when the teams last met in Kinnick Stadium in 2011. The Hawkeyes trailed 24-3 with 3:11 left in the third quarter, but rallied to score 28 points the last 16:16 to win 31-27.
- Iowa is one of only five schools in the country yet to allow a rushing touchdown or 100 rushing yards.
- Iowa is 6-4 all-time in night games in Kinnick Stadium.
- The Hawkeyes have played 58 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation.

BEATHARD EARNS WEEKLY HONORS

Junior quarterback C.J. Beathard has been named co-Offensive Player of the Week by the Big Ten and one of eight “Stars of the Week” by the Manning Award. Beathard led Iowa to a 31-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 15, completing 15-of-25 attempts for 215 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. He also rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including runs of 44 and 57 yards. His scoring strikes covered three, 14, and 25 yards, with the 25-yard score giving Iowa the lead with 2:14 remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Big Ten weekly honor is the first for Beathard, who becomes the first Hawkeyes to win the offensive honor since former WR Marvin McNutt, Jr., following a win over Indiana in 2011.

IOWA/PITT

- Iowa ranks second in the Big Ten with nine sacks. Six different Hawkeyes have at least one sack. Pitt has allowed seven sacks through two games.
- Saturday is Pitt’s first visit to Kinnick Stadium as a member of the ACC. Pitt was playing at Kinnick Stadium on Sept. 17, 2011, the day the news broke of the Panthers moving from the Big East to the ACC.
- Pitt was victim to Iowa’s largest comeback in school history when the teams last met in Kinnick Stadium in 2011. The Hawkeyes trailed 24-3 with 3:11 left in the third quarter, but rallied to score 28 points the last 16:16 to win 31-27.
- Iowa and Pitt both have one Heisman Trophy award winner in school history. Iowa halfback Nile Kinnick won the award in 1939, and Pitt running back Tony Dorsett won the award in 1976.
- Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz attended Upper St. Clair High School in Pittsburgh (He was born in Royal Oak, Mich.). Ferentz served as a graduate assistant offensive line coach at Pittsburgh during the 1980 season. That Pitt team (coached by Jackie Sherrill) finished with an 11-1 record and a No. 2 national ranking.
- Pitt Coach Pat Narduzzi was Michigan State’s defensive coordinator from 2007-14. Iowa was 4-3 against Michigan State from 2007-14, averaging 21.9 points per game.

THE SERIES

Saturday’s game will be the seventh meeting between Iowa and Pittsburgh. The series is tied, 3-3, with Iowa having won the last two meetings. The Hawkeyes scored the final 28 points to win, 31-27, in Iowa City in 2011. It was the largest comeback in school history. Iowa won at Pitt for the first time in 2014. The Hawkeyes outscored the Panthers 17-3 after half to erase a 17-10 halftime deficit. Iowa is 2-1 all-time against Pitt in games played in Iowa City. Iowa won the last two meetings. Pitt won the series opener, 20-0, in 1931.

IOWA VS. ACC

Iowa holds an all-time record of 7-11 (.389) against current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Three of Iowa's seven wins are against Pitt (3-3), three are against Syracuse (3-1), and one was against Georgia Tech (1-0) in the 2010 Orange Bowl. Iowa is winless in four games against Miami (Fla.), and three games against NC State.

LAST MEETING

For the second time in as many meetings, Iowa rallied past Pittsburgh in the fourth quarter for victory. Trailing 20-17 at the start of the fourth quarter, Iowa engineered a 13-play, 52-yard touchdown drive that proved to be the game-winning score in a 24-20 win.

Each team scored a touchdown in the first period. The Panthers scored first on a Chris James 14-yard rush. On the next possession, Iowa QB Jake Rudock found TE Henry Krieger-Coble, on a fourth down play, in the end zone from 13 yards out to even the score.

Pittsburgh dominated the second quarter, scoring 10 points on a James Connor 1-yard run and a Chris Blewitt 33-yard field goal. The Hawkeyes had possession for 2:44, running only five plays during the second period, and Pitt went into halftime with a 17-7 lead.

QB C.J. Beathard replaced an injured Rudock at the start of the second half. Beathard led Iowa on three straight scoring drives beginning with a seven-play, season-long 94-yard drive that resulted in a RB Mark Weisman 10-yard scoring run to cut the deficit to 17-14.

Each team traded field goals before the end of the third quarter, including Iowa PK Marshall Koehn connecting from a career-long distance of 52 yards. The 52-yard field goal equals the eighth-longest field goal in school history.

Weisman tallied his second TD of the game with 6:56 remaining in the contest to give the Hawkeyes a 24-20 advantage.

Iowa's defense stopped Pittsburgh on the Panthers' final two drives, including Anthony Gair collecting his first career interception as time expired to preserve the victory.

Weisman finished the contest with 88 yards rushing on 22 attempts. Rudock and Beathard combined to complete 12-of-18 passes for 178 yards and a TD. Beathard was 7-of-8 for 98 yards, with 62 of the 98 yards coming on a pass to WR Diamond Powell, which helped set up Iowa's first touchdown of the second half.

After allowing 132 yards rushing the first 30 minutes, the Hawkeye defense yielded only 53 the second half. SS John Lowdermilk led Iowa with a career and game-best 11 tackles.

ANF WALL OF HONOR

University of Iowa All-American and Outland Trophy winner Robert Gallery will be honored at Saturday's football game as this year's inductee into the America Needs Farmers Wall of Honor. Gallery, who grew up on an 800-acre farm near Masonville, Iowa, will be introduced on the field prior to kickoff.

The ANF Wall of Honor recognizes student-athletes in the sport of football at the UI who exemplify the tenacity, work ethic, and character of the Iowa farmer, qualities that have helped Iowa remain one of the leading agricultural states in the nation. The ANF Plaza is located in the northwest corner of the Kinnick Stadium concourse. Previous honorees include Casey Wiegmann (2012), Jared DeVries (2013), and Bruce Nelson (2014).

THE POWER OF THREE

The Hawkeyes are trying to improve to 3-0 for the first time since 2009, and the sixth time under Kirk Ferentz. Iowa finished 11-2 the last time it started the season 3-0. The 2009 Hawkeyes won their first nine games, finished 11-2 overall, and won the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.

Iowa has advanced to a bowl game every season it has started 3-0 (2001, 2003, 2006, 2008, 2009).

NO YARDS, NO TOUCHDOWNS FOR YOU

The Hawkeyes have allowed 98 yards rushing and zero touchdowns through two games. Iowa is one of only five schools in the country to perform the feat (Boston College, Rutgers, Duke, and Kansas State). The Hawkeyes are allowing just 1.78 yard per carry (10th nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten). Iowa also leads the Big Ten and ranks eighth nationally in rushing defense (49 ypg).

Iowa did not allow a rushing touchdown in the first three games in 2014 before Pitt recorded two rushing touchdowns in the fourth game of the season.

FLIRTING WITH 100

Junior QB C.J. Beathard gained 111 yards but lost 34 yards rushing against Iowa State on Sept. 12. His net gain of 77 yards threatened his career-high of 82 set at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. The last Iowa quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a single game was Butch Caldwell, who ran for 109 yards on 12 attempts against Michigan State on Nov. 24, 1973 in Iowa City.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

The Hawkeyes have used eight first time starters. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., LT Boone Myers, DT Nathan Bazata, DT Jaleel Johnson, LB Cole Fisher, LB Ben Niemann, and SS Miles Taylor all started the season opener. TE Jameer Outsey made his first career start against Iowa State.

REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Three true freshmen played in the 2015 season opener: OL James Daniels, WR Jerminic Smith, and WR Adrian Falconer. Daniels is the first true freshman to play offensive line since Bryan Bulaga in 2007. Daniels joined the Iowa program last spring and participated in spring practice.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 17th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.



- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ranks ninth with 117 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 68 Big Ten wins, ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 108-64 (.628) overall mark and a 63-46 (.578) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 117-85 (.579) and a 68-60 (.531) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 129-106 (.549). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his fourth season.

QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 209)

Career Games Played/Starts: 16/3

Junior QB C.J. Beathard is 3-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback, a record that includes a 2-0 mark on the road and a 1-0 mark at home. Beathard made his first career start at Kinnick Stadium in the 2015 season opener. He was 15-of-24 for 211 yards passing and one touchdown. He rushed eight times for 26 yards and two touchdowns.

In three career starts, Beathard is 47-of-86 (54.7) for 671 yards passing, five touchdowns, and one interception. He has also rushed for 132 yards and two touchdowns in three career starts.

In his last three games, dating back to the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, Beathard has thrown six touchdowns and rushed for two more. He has 185 yards rushing on 26 carries, and 671 yards on 43-of-72 passing.

Beathard earned Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors after helping lead Iowa to a 14-point triumph at Iowa State last week. Beathard totaled 292 yards (215 passing and 77 rushing) against the Cyclones. Beathard is the first QB in the Kirk Ferentz era (1999-2015) to amass more than 400 yards passing (426) and 100 yards rushing (103) through the first two games of a season.

Trailing 17-7, Beathard replaced injured QB Jake Rudock to start the second half against Pitt last season. He led Iowa to three straight scoring drives, finishing the game 7-of-8 for 98 yards and rallying Iowa to a 24-20 win.

Beathard in 3-2-1:

- His 103 rushing yards rank second among Big Ten quarterbacks (Perry Hills, 119). Rushed a career-high 10 times (77 yards) against Iowa State last time out. He is the only Big Ten player with two carries of 40-plus yards (44 and 57).
- Ranks third in Big Ten in passing efficiency (161.2) and fourth in total offense (264 ypg).
- Accounted for six touchdowns (4 passing, 2 rushing) in two games, tying Purdue QB Austin Appleby (5/1) for the Big Ten lead.

OL AUSTIN BLYTHE (SR., 6-3, 290)

Career Games Played/Started: 38/37

Senior C Austin Blythe is the veteran on an offensive line that includes three sophomores. He has started 38 games for Iowa, more than any other active Hawkeye, since debuting as Iowa's starting RG as a redshirt freshman in the 2012 season opener.

Blythe in 3-2-1:

- 33 consecutive starts on the offensive line.
- Iowa's opening day starting center for three straight years.
- Rimington and Outland Trophy Watch Lists.

RB LeSHUN DANIELS, JR. (JR., 6-0, 225)

Career Games Played/Starts: 14/2

Junior RB LeShun Daniels rushed for 56 yards on eight carries before leaving the Iowa State game in the second quarter. Daniels was Iowa's starting running back in both games this season. He leads Iowa with 179 yards rushing. He set career highs in carries (26), rushing yards (123), and longest rush (27) in his first career start against Illinois State on Sept. 5. He was Iowa's eighth different opening day starting running back since 2007. He did not see game action against Pitt last season.

Daniels in 3-2-1:

- His 179 rushing yards ranks eighth in the Big Ten.
- Recorded his first career 100-yard game (123) in the 2015 season opener.
- Missed the final five regular season games in 2014 due to injury and saw limited action in the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, rushing one time for seven yards.

RB JORDAN CANZERI (SR., 5-9, 192)

Career Games Played/Starts: 31/2

Senior RB Jordan Canzeri ranks sixth in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards (130.5 ypg). He had 118 all-purpose yards (28 rushing, 90 receiving) in the season opener, and 143 all-purpose yards against Iowa State, including a career-high 124 rushing yards. His 90 receiving yards in the season opener were a career high and the second most by a Hawkeye running back under Kirk Ferentz (100 by Damon Bullock at Maryland in 2014). Canzeri ranked second on the team with 752 all-purpose yards in 2014, including 494 yards rushing, 123 yards receiving, and 135 yards in kickoff returns. He was the only player on the team with 100 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving.

Canzeri in 3-2-1:

- Has 409 all-purpose yards in his last three games (272 rushing yards, 122 yards receiving, 15 return).
- Has 1,241 career rushing yards to rank 29th in career rushing. His 124 yards rushing at Iowa State on Sept. 12, moved him past five Hawkeyes on the school's all-time rushing chart (Bill Green, Jermelle Lewis, Kevin Harmon, Jon Lazar, and Jerry Faske).
- 212 yards on 41 carries (5.2 ypc) in three postseason games (2011 Insight, 2014 Outback, 2015 TaxSlayer).

WR MATT VANDEBERG (JR., 6-1, 185)

Career Games Played/Starts: 25/5

Junior WR Matt VandeBerg has scored a touchdown in three straight games. He caught touchdowns against Tennessee and Illinois State, and advanced a fumble by teammate Henry Krieger-Coble three yards against Iowa State for a touchdown. VandeBerg played 22 career games before catching his first touchdown.

VandeBerg in 3-2-1:

- Leads the Big Ten with 15 receptions and ranks fifth in receiving yards per game (86.5).
- Set a career high in receptions in both games this season. Had a then-career and team-high six receptions in Iowa's season opener against Illinois State, and caught a team and career-high nine passes against Iowa State.
- Had a career high 114 yards receiving against Iowa State, including a career long 48-yard reception on third-and-21 in the fourth quarter. VandeBerg is the first Hawkeye since Tim Dwight in 1997 to have more than 100 yards receiving against Iowa State.

- Jake Duzey -- out (knee)

WR TEVAUN SMITH (SR., 6-2, 205)

Career Games Played/Starts: 37/16

Senior WR Tevaun Smith caught a 14-yard touchdown pass for Iowa's first touchdown last week against Iowa State. It was his fifth career touchdown. Smith led Iowa with 596 yards receiving and ranked second on the team with 43 receptions in 2014. He has 984 career receiving yards.

Smith in 3-2-1:

- Needs 16 yards to become the 37th player in program history to accumulate 1,000 yards receiving in a career.
- Had a team-high eight plays of 30-plus yards from scrimmage in 2014, including two touchdowns (37, 31) and a 35-yard rush.
- Shared the team lead with three touchdown receptions in 2014 (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Jake Duzey).

CB DESMOND KING (JR., 5-11, 190)

Career Games Played/Starts: 28/27

Junior CB Desmond King returned a punt 37 yards (career long) to set up Iowa's go-ahead touchdown drive against Iowa State on Sept. 12. On the Cyclones' ensuing possession, King intercepted a pass (first this season, fourth of career) to set up another Hawkeye touchdown. Against Pitt last season, King had four tackles, including one tackle-for-loss (2 yards).

King in 3-2-1:

- Has started 27 consecutive games since entering the starting lineup in Week 2 of his true freshman season.
- Started all 13 games in 2014, sharing the team lead with three interceptions.
- Led all Big Ten freshmen in tackles (69) in 2013.

FS JORDAN LOMAX (SR., 5-10, 205)

Career Games Played/Starts: 35/15

Senior FS Jordan Lomax has nine tackles and one pass break up in 2015. Lomax had three tackles against Pitt in 2014, all in the second half. Lomax was disqualified from playing in the first half against the Panthers after being flagged for targeting in the fourth quarter of the previous week. He has started 14 of Iowa's last 15 games.

Lomax in 3-2-1:

- Moved from cornerback to safety during 2014 spring practice.
- 92 tackles in 2014 ranked third on the team.
- Saw action in 11 games as a true freshman before redshirting in 2012 with shoulder injury.

DE DREW OTT (SR., 6-4, 272)

Career Games Played/Started: 43/27

Senior DE Drew Ott left the Iowa State game with three minutes left in the first quarter and did not return. He has made 15 consecutive starts at defensive end. Ott recorded two sacks for a loss of 20 yards and forced one fumble in Iowa's season opener. His two sacks against Illinois State are the first time a Hawkeye collected multiple sacks in a season-opener since Mitch King had a pair in 2007. Ott led the team and tied for third in the Big Ten with 8.0 sacks in 2014. He had two tackles, one sack (7 yards), and two quarterback hurries against Pitt in 2014.

Ott in 3-2-1:

- Has started 27 of the last 28 games at defensive end.
- One of 11 players on Big Ten Players to Watch List.
- Picked up a deflected punt against Nebraska in 2014 and returned it 12 yards for his first career touchdown.

LB BEN NIEMANN (SO., 6-3, 225, 190)**Career Games Played/Starts: 15/2**

Sophomore LB Ben Niemann ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 4.5 tackles-for-loss. Niemann has started each of Iowa's first two games (his first two career starts) and has had at least two TFL in each game. He is one of three Hawkeyes sharing the team lead with two sacks (DE Nate Meier and DE Drew Ott).

Niemann in 3-2-1:

- 4.5 of his seven tackles have been behind the line of scrimmage.
- Blocked a punt and returned it for a touchdown against Northwestern in 2014.
- One of three true freshman to see action in 2014.

TE JAKE DUZEY (SR., 6-4, 248)**Career Games Played/Starts: 37/13**

Senior TE Jake Duzey suffered a knee injury in the final week of spring practice and is currently not available for game action.

Duzey in 3-2-1:

- Three touchdown receptions in 2014 tied for the team lead (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Tevaun Smith).
- Had 36 receptions in 2014, a single-season career high and tied for the second most by a Big Ten tight end this season.
- 85-yard TD reception at Ohio State in 2013 is ninth longest scoring reception in school history.

K MARSHALL KOEHN (SR., 6-0, 200)

Senior K Marshall Koehn became Iowa's primary place kicker prior to the 2014 season. He led the Big Ten and ranked eighth nationally in touchback percentage (63.2) last season, winning Iowa's Reggie Roby Special Teams Award. He is 5-of-6 all-time on field goals of 40-plus yards, including 1-for-1 on attempts 50 yards and beyond.

Koehn in 3-2-1:

- Hit a career-long 52 yard field goal at Pitt in 2014, tying for the eighth longest field goal in school history.
- Has 89 career points. Need 11 points to become the 36th player in program history with 100 career points.
- Has made five consecutive field goal tries and 47 consecutive PAT attempts (47/47 in his career).

ROOKIE TACKLES MAKING THE GRADE

Iowa starting tackles LT Boone Myers and RT Ike Boettger entered 2015 with one combined career start (Boettger started as a second tight end against Wisconsin in 2014). The sophomores replace a pair of NFL lineman -- 2014 Outland Trophy winner LT Brandon Scherff (Washington Redskins) and RT Andrew Donnal (St. Louis Rams).

Iowa rushed for 210 yards in its season opener and 260 yards in Week 2 against Iowa State. The offensive line has allowed

three sacks through two games.

Myers joined the program as a walk-on and was put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season. He saw action in four games last season. Boettger joined the team as a tight end but was moved to offensive line in 2013. He saw action in seven games as a redshirt freshman in 2014.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach, the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player start on the offensive line in every season.

In each of the last eight years, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Both players were second round draft picks in 2003.

PAULSENS ARE A FAMILIAR FACE

Freshmen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The Paulsens are one of three sets of brothers on Iowa's 2015 roster, joining DB Kevin Ward and OL Ryan Ward, and OL James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels.

TURN ON THE LIGHTS

Iowa hosts Pitt on Saturday at 7 p.m. (CT). It is the first of two night games on Iowa's 2015 home schedule, marking the first time in program history Iowa plays two night games at Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes host Minnesota on Saturday, Nov. 14, at 7 p.m. Both games are televised on BTN (BTN2GO).

Iowa has not played a night game at Kinnick Stadium since entertaining Penn State in October, 2012. Iowa has hosted 10 evening games in Kinnick Stadium, with five of those starting after 7 p.m.

Iowa is 6-4 in night games in Kinnick Stadium. Iowa has wins over Northwestern (2011), Penn State (2010), Michigan (2009), Syracuse (2007), Arizona State (2003), and Northern Illinois (1999), and losses to Penn State (2012), Ohio State (2006), Iowa State (2002), and Miami, Florida (1992).

GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

- The Hawkeyes open Big Ten play at Wisconsin on Oct. 3. This marks the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz’s 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes open the conference season on the road.
- For the first time in program history Iowa plays more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Home games against Pitt (Sept. 19) and Minnesota (Nov. 14) kickoff at 7 p.m. (CT). Both games are televised on BTN.
- Iowa is one of four Big Ten teams (Iowa, Michigan, NW, Rutgers) with two power five schools on its nonconference schedule (Iowa State, Pitt). The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 31-17, on Sept. 12.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Illinois State, 31-14, in the season opener. The Redbirds lost to North Dakota State in the 2014 FCS title game. Iowa opens the 2016 season hosting North Dakota State.
- Iowa will face Maryland on Oct. 31 in Iowa City. It marks Maryland’s first football game in Iowa City. It also marks the 16th time in Iowa program history the Hawkeyes play on Halloween (6-8-1).
- The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- Iowa’s Homecoming game is Oct. 10 against Illinois at 11 a.m. Iowa is 56-42-5 all-time in Homecoming contests, and has won five of its last Homecoming games. Illinois is visiting Kinnick Stadium for the first time since 2007.
- Three of Iowa’s nonconference opponents are led by coaches who have been assistants in the Big Ten, including Illinois State’s Brock Spack (Purdue), Pitt’s Pat Narduzzi (Michigan State), and North Texas’ Dan McCarney (Iowa, Wisconsin). Iowa State’s Paul Rhoads was a graduate assistant under John Cooper at Ohio State.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney and North Texas quarterback Andrew McNulty are Iowa City, Iowa, natives. McNulty was North Texas’ leading passer in 2014.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney is the second Iowa City native in the last three seasons to coach in Kinnick Stadium (Terry Allen, Missouri State, 2013). McCarney, a Hawkeye assistant from 1977-89, will make his seventh appearance on the opposing sideline at Kinnick. He was 3-3 as a visitor as Iowa State’s head coach.
- Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2015: Iowa State (Cy-Hawk: W, 31-17), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), Wisconsin (Heartland), and Nebraska (Heroes).

HAWKEYES AT THE HEAD OF CLASS IN COACHING LANDSCAPE

The University of Iowa has produced more active FBS head coaches than any other school. Bret Bielema (Arkansas), Bob Diaco (UCONN), Dan McCarney (North Texas), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), and Mark Stoops (Kentucky) all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Bielema, Diaco, Bob Stoops, and Mark Stoops played for former UI head coach Hayden Fry. McCarney played on teams coached by Frank Lauterbur and Bob Commings. All five head coaches served as assistants under Fry.

Bielema played on the defensive line from 1989-92. He was team captain his senior season, played in the 1991 Rose Bowl, and served as an assistant coach on the Iowa staff from 1993-2001.

Diaco played linebacker from 1992-95 and was a graduate assistant on the staff from 1996-97. The Hawkeyes advanced to the Alamo Bowl in 1996 and the Sun Bowl in 1997.

Bob Stoops was a defensive back from 1979-82. He was named team MVP in 1982, and played in the 1982 Rose Bowl and 1982 Peach Bowl. He served on the Iowa staff from 1983-87.

Mark Stoops was a defensive back from 1987-89. He played in the 1987 Holiday Bowl and 1988 Peach Bowl, and served as a graduate assistant coach from 1989-91.

McCarney played on the offensive line from 1972-74. He was named team captain his senior season, and eventually joined Fry's staff in 1977. He was an assistant coach at Iowa from 1977-89.

FERENTZ SECOND IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz enters his 17th season as Iowa's head football coach and ranks second in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (28). Ferentz is tied for second with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

FERENTZ AMONG TOP 10

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 117 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, the ninth most in conference history. He has 68 Big Ten wins, also the ninth most in conference history. He is 1-of-8 coaches to rank among the top 10 in both categories. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zupke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Barry Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (9).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of four Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared the poll 297 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three

times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.

- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 17th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

AMONG THE BEST IN THE BIG TEN

Iowa has posted a 6-6 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State has won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. Following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

The Hawkeyes have played 58 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation. Iowa has converted on 176 consecutive PATs during the streak.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,195 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 615-541-39 (.530). That includes a 387-213-16 (.641) record in home games, a 228-328-23 (.413) record in games away from Iowa City, a 306-366-25 (.457) mark in Big Ten games and a 270-177-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster of 115 players includes 50 players from Iowa. The roster includes 14 players from Illinois; nine from Texas; seven from Maryland; six from Missouri, five from Ohio; four from Michigan; three from Florida, Nebraska, and New Jersey; two from South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Canada; one from Alabama, Minnesota, New York, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.



HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 22 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 29 Hawkeyes are on active NFL rosters.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- There are 29 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Kirk Ferentz has produced seven first-round draft picks, tied for ninth most among active college coaches.
- Since 2011, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State matches Iowa's NFL total. Iowa has had five first round picks in the last six NFL drafts, tying Wisconsin (5) for the league lead.
- Iowa had 22 players drafted from 2010-15, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a four-time Pro-Bowler (2011-14) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, and 2014.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie (including 2015 rookie Ray Hamilton).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 13 years, 123-of-137 (90 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

IOWA AMONG TOP 25 IN WINS, 2002-15

Iowa has posted 105 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 21st highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (149); Ohio State (144); Oklahoma (139); USC (137); LSU (135); Georgia (130); Alabama (129); TCU (128); Oregon (127); Texas (127); Florida State (126); Virginia Tech (124); Wisconsin (123); Auburn (119); Florida (119); West Virginia (116); Utah (114); Virginia (111); Nebraska (111); Miami, FL (107); Iowa (106); Texas Tech (106); Michigan (103).

IOWA WILL RECEIVE

Iowa received the opening kickoff in both games this season. In 17 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes received the opening kickoff in 164-of-202 games (97-67). Iowa has started the game on defense in 38-of-202 games under Ferentz (20-18).



IOWA BOWL NOTES

Iowa has appeared in 28 bowl games with a record of 14-13-1 (.518). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

Iowa has played 12 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-6).

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 13 of the last 14 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 45 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (43), Iowa (28) and Wisconsin (26).
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including two appearances by Iowa (1-1).
- For just the second time in league history, 10 Big Ten Conference teams competed in bowl games in 2014 (2011). Ohio State won the inaugural College Football Playoff, while Michigan State won the Cotton Bowl, another College Football Playoff bowl.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week beginning Wednesday, Sept. 2. The 90-minute radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players on its 2015 Leadership Group, including 13 seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are OL Austin Blythe, RB Jordan Canzeri, DL Darian Cooper, FB Adam Cox, TE Jake Duzey, WR Jacob Hillyer, PK Marshall Koehn, DB Jordan Lomax, DE Nate Meier, DE Drew Ott, LB Travis Perry, FB Macon Plewa and WR Tevaun Smith. The junior class is represented by QB C.J. Beathard and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., and LB Josey Jewell represents the sophomore class.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2015. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach. Steven is an offensive lineman who is in his fourth season as a redshirt junior. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain

before graduating in May 2013. Ferentz is the only FBS coach ever to coach three sons at the same school.

MORE THAN ONE

Eleven high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois; and Solon HS in Solon, Iowa, all graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include DeMatha Catholic HS (Washington, D.C.), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Waukee HS (Waukee, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), Williamsburg HS (Williamsburg, Iowa), Woodbury Central HS (Menville, Iowa).

THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE

Redshirt freshman WR Brandon Bishop and freshman WR Emmanuel Ogwo are the lightest Hawkeye players at 170 pounds. Junior DL Jaleel Johnson is the heaviest at 310 pounds. A total of seven Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more.

The tallest player at 6-8 is redshirt freshman DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is sophomore WR Jonathan Parker.

The average Hawkeye player is 6-2 and weighs 232 pounds. That is the one inch taller and two pounds heavier than the average Iowa player in 2013.

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

Iowa has nine players on its 2015 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), WR Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is once again available for fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Iowa Football game days. The Hawkeye Express enters its 12th season. Adults can ride the train for \$12, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 31 points en route to a 31-14 season-opening victory over Illinois State at Kinnick Stadium.

In his second career start, first at home, QB C.J. Beathard accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing and one passing), while throwing for 211 yards (15-of-24). Beathard scored on runs of six and one yard, while completing a 9-yard score to WR Matt VandeBerg. Beathard became the first Hawkeye quarterback to rush for two TD's and pass for another in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes dominated the game in the trenches, rushing 44 times for 210 yards offensively, and collecting 10 tackles for loss, including five first-half sacks, defensively.

RB LeShun Daniels and RB Jordan Canzeri led the Hawkeyes offensively, combining for 241 all-purpose yards. Daniels led the Hawkeye ground attack rushing for 123 yards on 26 attempts. Canzeri had a game-best 90 yards receiving on four catches, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries.

Iowa took a 17-0 lead into halftime after PK Marshall Koehn split the uprights from 40 yards as time expired in the second quarter. The field goal followed rushing scores from Beathard (six yards) and Canzeri (five yards) earlier in the half. Canzeri's score capped off a 12-play, 99-yard drive -- Iowa's first 99-yard TD drive since its game at Miami (OH) in 2002.

The only scoring in the third quarter was VandeBerg's 9-yard reception. Beathard closed out the Hawkeye scoring with a one-yard plunge midway through the fourth quarter. Illinois State added two late touchdowns against the Hawkeyes' second unit.

The Hawkeye defense was in the Illinois State backfield applying pressure most of the afternoon. DE Drew Ott had two sacks for a combined loss of 20 yards. DE Nate Meier had two tackles for loss, including a sack, while LB Ben Niemann had 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. LB Cole Fisher led the team with eight total tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a sack and blocked Illinois State's 50-yard field goal attempt.

As a unit, the Hawkeyes held the Redbirds to 35 yards rushing on 28 attempts, including zero yards on 15 carries in the first half.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points to record a 31-17 come-from-behind road victory over Iowa State at Jack Trice Stadium and reclaim possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The Hawkeyes were led offensively by QB C.J. Beathard, RB Jordan Canzeri, and WR Matt VandeBerg. Canzeri rushed a career-high 24 times for 124 yards and a TD. VandeBerg posted career highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (114), while also scoring a TD. Beathard rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including a career-long rush of 57 yards, while also completing 15-of-25 passes for 215 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. Beathard's efforts earned the junior signal caller Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.

After each team posted a field goal in the first quarter, the Cyclones grabbed a 10-3 advantage with an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Sam Richardson to Quenton Bundrage. The Hawkeyes evened the score two possessions later with a 14-yard WR Tevaun Smith scoring reception to culminate a 93-yard drive.

Iowa State took a 17-10 lead into halftime after a 29-yard scoring reception by Jauan Wesley.

The Hawkeyes controlled the second half, scoring three touchdowns and allowing Iowa State only 66 total yards on 31 plays.

VandeBerg recovered a TE Henry Krieger-Coble fumble on Iowa State's 3-yard line and crossed the goal line to tie the game in the third period. Riley McCarron then scored the game-winning TD, the first score of his career, on a 25-yard pass from Beathard in the back corner of the end zone with 2:14 remaining in the contest. Canzeri tallied Iowa's final score on an 8-yard scamper following Desmond King's first interception of the season.

Iowa's defense collected six tackles for loss, including four sacks by four different players. The Hawkeyes limited the Cyclones to 63 yards rushing on 27 attempts (2.3 avg.). DE Nate Meier and LB Josey Jewell each registered seven tackles. In addition to the interception, King had five tackles.

Iowa's DE Drew Ott and RB LeShun Daniels left the game in the first and second quarters, respectively, and did not return due to injury.
