

HEAD COACH MARC LONG

Marc Long is entering his 16th season as head coach for the University of Iowa swimming and diving team and 15th leading both the men's and women's programs.

During his tenure as head coach of both teams, 149 school records have fallen and 360 Hawkeyes have automatically or provisionally qualified for the NCAA Championships. Iowa has posted 13 top 40 NCAA finishes (six men, seven women) since 2004.

Academically, the Hawkeyes have had prolonged academic success under Long's tutelage. Iowa has crowned 24 academic All-Americans, 340 Academic All-Big Ten selections, and the team has consistently earned CSCAA Scholar All-America honors.

The women's team has been recognized with NCAA Public Recognition in 2015 and 2017 for a perfect Academic Progress Report (APR) as a team -- a highly selective award given to the top 10 percent of teams across the country.

On campus, Long was one of the founders of the Hawkeye Health C.A.R.E. program -- a unique shadowing and mentoring program for UI student-athletes. He also started the Hawkeye Business Social, a professional development and networking event for Hawkeye swimming and diving student-athletes.

During the 2018-19 season, the Hawkeyes had five student-athletes -- two men and three women -- qualify for the NCAA Championships. The team swam to five school records and posted 64 top-10 times in program history.

Iowa's men's team posted a 6-2 dual meet record, while the women's team swam to six victories. The Hawkeyes finished the season with five Big Ten weekly honors and the program had 11 top-eight finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In the classroom, 24 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, 11 were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and seven were honorable mention CSCAA Scholar Athletes. Senior Ben Colin also became the first Hawkeye to be the Jim McKay Scholarship recipient.

In 2017-18, the program recognized 100 years of Iowa swimming and diving throughout the season. Hundreds of former Hawkeyes returned to campus to say farewell to the Field House Pool and celebrate the century mark.



Iowa had seven NCAA qualifiers -- four men and three women -- in 2017-18 and set 11 school records. The Hawkeyes' 200-free relay -- Will Scott, Jack Smith, Matt Kamin, and Joe Myhre -- earned honorable-mention All-America honors at the NCAA Championships, leading Iowa to a 38th place team finish.

The Hawkeye men went 5-1 in dual competition, including posting back-to-back victories over No. 21 Minnesota and at No. 23 Purdue. The Iowa women went 6-3 and the program swam to 69 NCAA qualifying marks with 10 Hawkeyes being honored with weekly Big Ten weekly recognition during the course of the season.

Academically, the Hawkeyes had 24 Academic All-Big Ten selections, nine Big Ten Distinguished Scholars and 12 student-athletes were named CSCAA honorable mention Scholar All-Americans.

In 2016-17, the Iowa women's team recorded its highest finish in 12 years, placing 26th at the NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes had a pair of first-team All-Americans in breast stroker Emma Sougstad and platform diver Calli Head. Sougstad's performance at the NCAA meet was one of the best swims in Big Ten Conference history.

The Hawkeyes swam to 15 school records during the season and posted 56 NCAA qualifying marks. Academically, Iowa had seven Scholar All-Americans, 23 Academic All-Big Ten selections, and five Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.

The 2015-16 season saw the Hawkeyes finish in the top-40 nationally at the NCAA Championships. The women's team had three NCAA qualifiers and finished 38th, courtesy of an honorable-mention All-America performance from junior Emma Sougstad. Sougstad won the "B" heat, finishing ninth overall in the 100 breaststroke. Sougstad was honored as the CollegeSwimming.com National Swimmer of the Week in December.

The UI men had five NCAA qualifiers and tallied a 40th-place finish nationally, highlighted by two honorable-mention All-America performances from senior Roman Trussov. The breastroker earned All-America distinctions in both the 100-and-200-yard breaststroke events. Trussov was also a second-team All-Big Ten honoree after finishing as the 100-breast runner-up at the 2016 Big Ten Championships.

Over the course of the season, the Hawkeyes swam to 12 school records and had 28 UI student-athletes posted NCAA qualifying standards. Academically, Iowa had 35 Academic All-Big Ten honorees and the program received both the spring and fall CSCAA Scholar All-America Award distinction.



Senior Charles Holliday was a semifinalist for the Arthur Ashe, Jr., Scholar Award, and he and Maddie Bro were recipients of the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Holliday was also a Big Ten Postgraduate Scholarship honoree.

Iowa enjoyed success across the board during the 2014-15 season -- a year where the UI was in the national spotlight, hosting the 2015 NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships at the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center Natatorium. It was the first championship in Iowa City since 1927.

The Hawkeyes swam to 19 school records and had 31 student-athletes post NCAA qualifying standards. The Iowa men had five NCAA qualifiers en route to a 35th place finish (eight points) at the NCAA Championships, while the women had four NCAA qualifiers -- the most since 1993 -- to place 38th nationally with 10 points.

Senior Becky Stoughton earned honorable mention All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyle events, while also becoming Iowa's first women's Big Ten champion since 2001. Junior Addison Boschult dove to honorable mention All-America honors on the platform with a 10th place overall finish.

Both teams tallied eighth-place finishes at the 2015 Big Ten Championships. The Hawkeye women finished with 223 points, while the men's squad had 230.5 points in a championship event held in Iowa City.

The Hawkeyes garnered national rankings during the course of the season with the men's squad climbing as high as No. 19 in the CSCAA rankings and SwimSwam Power rankings. The Hawkeye women were 21st in the CSCAA poll Jan. 21.

Academically, Iowa had 27 student-athletes earn Academic All-Big Ten honors with the 12 men's honorees tying the school record. The Hawkeye women earned the CSCAA Fall and Spring Scholar All-America honors for the seventh straight year and the program has received at least one team accolade dating back to 2005.

In 2013-14, Long guided the women's team to a 9-5 dual record with the nine victories being the second-highest total for the program in his tenure. The Hawkeyes went 4-3 in Big Ten duals, which led to a No. 20 ranking in the collegeswimming.com poll on Dec. 29. The team posted school records in four individual and four relays throughout the course of the season.

The UI men's squad was ranked as high as No. 21 in the CSCAA poll for three weeks and three school records went down in 2013-14. Long coached senior Dustin Rhoads to the NCAA Championships in the 100 and 200-yard backstroke events, marking the fourth-straight year the Hawkeyes have been represented at the championship.

Both the men's and women's squads posted eighth place finishes at the 2014 Big Ten Championships. The UI women finished with 199 points, while the men tallied 188 points. At season's end, 31 Hawkeyes were named Academic All-Big Ten honorees -- the 19 women's selections

were a school record, while the men tied a record with 12 receiving the accolade.

In 2012-13, Long guided the Hawkeyes to a 32nd place finish at the NCAA Championships, marking the program's second-straight finish among the top-32 teams nationally. Six men's student-athletes competed at the championships, and Iowa earned honorable mention All-America honors in three events -- 200-medley relay, 400-medley relay and 100 backstroke.

Twenty-one school records went down during the course of the season and 20 Iowa student-athletes posted NCAA automatic or provisional times. The men's team finished seventh at the Big Ten Championships with 245 points, while the women's squad was 10th with 113 points.

The men's team finished the 2013 season ranked 20th in the Collegeswimming.com/CSCAA Coaches Poll after posting a 7-3 dual record; the women's squad received votes in the rankings during the season and finished the year with an 8-2 record. Academically, 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

During the 2011-12 season, Long led the UI men's team to a fifth-place showing at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish since 1996. Two Iowa relays -- the 200 and 400 free relays -- won Big Ten titles, marking the program's first relay crown in 17 years. Five Hawkeyes garnered first-team All-Big Ten recognition.

The women's team finished ninth at the 2012 Big Ten Championships with 201 points. Freshman Becky Stoughton became the first Hawkeye to be selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after finishing in the top six in three individual events.

The Iowa men's team posted a 26th place finish at the NCAA Championships, its best showing since 1995, and three Hawkeye relays earned honorable mention All-America honors. Stoughton became the first UI female swimmer to advance to the NCAA Championships since 2005 and the first freshman since 2002. She earned honorable mention All-America honors after placing ninth in the 1,650 free.

The men's team finished the season with a 7-2 dual meet record, running its four-year mark to an impressive 31-5. The team climbed to a program-best 10th in the CSCAA dual meet rankings and finished the season ranked 14th overall. The Hawkeye women posted a 10-6 record, the most dual victories since the 1985-86 season.

Twenty-four Iowa student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors during the 2011-12 season. Four women's swimmers were recognized with the Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award, and nine

Hawkeyes earned Scholar All-America recognition by the CSCAA. The women's team earned Scholar All-America team honors, finishing with the third-best grade point average in the nation.

Iowa set 18 school records during the 2011-12 season (11 men, seven women) and 18 Hawkeyes posted a NCAA qualifying time. In June 2012, 14 Hawkeyes represented the program at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials in Omaha.

In 2010-11, the Hawkeye men set schools records in three individual events and all five relays, while the women's squad set a program record in one individual event and one relay. The men recorded a dual meet record of 7-1 overall and 3-1 in the Big Ten to finish the year ranked 24th in the final TYR/CSCAA rankings.

The Hawkeye men sent Paul Gordon, Jordan Huff, Duncan Partridge, and Ryan Phelan to the NCAA Championships in the 200 free relay and the quartet earned All-America honors in the 400-free relay. The team posted NCAA "B" cuts in 11 individual events and five relays. The women's team was named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the sixth-straight year, and 20 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2009-10, the Hawkeye men set school records in two individual events and three relays, while the women's squad set a program





record in one individual event and established a new pool record. The Iowa men recorded their best dual record in program history with a 10-1 overall record and finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships, the highest finish in 14 years. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fifth-straight year, and 28 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2008-09, the Hawkeye women set school records in four individual events and three relays, while the men's squad set school bests in two individual events. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in seven individual events and five relays. The Iowa men posted their best dual record since 1995 with a 7-1 mark, and went undefeated (4-0) at its own Field House pool. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fourth straight year, and 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

The 2007-08 season saw four school records set at the 2008 Big Ten Championships, including two relays. Wil Whaley and Christine Kuczek eclipsed Iowa's records in the 200 backstroke and 100 freestyle, respectively, and the 200 and 400 free relays swam to school records. Whaley also placed 19th at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials.

In 2006-07, two school records were broken and nine student-athletes posted NCAA "B" cuts. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by competing at the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast -- two events in which he set school records.

In his first season with the combined program (2005-06), four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Five-time All-American and U.S. Olympic diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting Iowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by Underwood and four-year NCAA qualifier and All-American Jennifer Skolaski. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Field House pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

Before focusing solely on his head-coaching duties, Long served as the UI's aquatics director for his first six years as head coach. In his dual role, Long was a part of the core committee involved in designing the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center -- one of the best facilities in the country.

As an assistant coach, Long helped Iowa to its highest placing and point total in school history (20th, 41 points) at the 2003 NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes also posted an 8-4 overall season record, which was the first winning season for the program since 1999-2000.

Long has also served as head coach of the Iowa City Eels Swim Club (ICE) and the COHO Swim Club (Deerfield, Illinois). During his tenure, Long helped produce numerous state champions, record holders, and NCAA and USS national qualifiers.

The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native began his collegiate swimming career at the University of Northern Iowa (1986), winning the conference title and setting the 100 butterfly school record before joining the UI men's squad for his sophomore season.

As a Hawkeye swimmer (1987-89), Long was a multiple NCAA finalist, six-time All-American and three-time Big Ten champion, winning two conference titles in the 100 fly and one as part of the 400 free relay. He was voted a team captain in 1989 and helped lead the Hawkeyes to a Big Ten runner-up finish, and their highest team placing (eighth) in modern day history at the NCAA Championships. He swam on Iowa's Big Ten and NCAA record setting 200 freestyle relay in 1989.

Long was also a member of the 1987 U.S. National Champion 400-meter freestyle relay team from San Jose (Calif.) Aquatics, and participated in the 1988 U.S. Olympic Trials. He was inducted into the National Iowa Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019.

Long, a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America, earned his bachelor's degree in recreation education from Iowa in 1991. He and his wife, Beth, have two children, Ethan and Rhys, and a dog, Torre.

DIVING COACH TODD WAIKEL

Todd Waikel is entering his eighth season as the diving coach with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program.

In his seven seasons in Iowa City, Waikel has coached two All-Americans, 13 NCAA Championships qualifiers, and he was instrumental in helping the UI diving program become a USA Diving "Center of Excellence."



During the 2018-19 season, Waikel coached four Hawkeyes -- Will Brenner, Anton Hoherz, Jayah Mathews, and Sam Tamborski -- to the NCAA Championships. Mathews (fourth, 3-meter) and Hoherz (eighth, 1-meter) were top-eight finishers at the Big Ten Championships.

During the course of the season, Hawkeye divers earned four Big Ten weekly honors. Mathews was a three-time Big Ten Diver of the Week, while Tamborski earned Freshman of the Week honors.

In 2017-18, Waikel coached two Hawkeyes -- sophomore Thelma Strandberg and freshman Jayah Mathews -- to the NCAA Championships and eight Iowa student-athletes were NCAA Zone qualifiers.

Waikel also coached student-athletes to six Big Ten Diver or Big Ten Freshman of the Week during the course of the season and freshman Anton Hoherz broke the school record off the platform at the Big Ten Championships.

During the 2016-17 season, Waikel had two student-athletes -- senior Calli Head and freshman Thelma Strandberg -- qualify for the NCAA Championships off the platform. Head concluded her career as a first-team All-American -- Iowa's first off the platform since 1999 -- after tallying a sixth place finish.

The Hawkeyes had three divers garner Big Ten Diver of the Week honors during the course of the season, and sophomore Will Brenner broke the school record off the 1-meter (368.00).

In 2015-16, Waikel had three divers -- Addison Boschult, Calli Head, and Lydia Lehnert -- qualify for the NCAA Championships on the platform, eight divers post NCAA Zone Diving Standards, and had two divers garner three Big Ten Conference weekly accolades. Boschult narrowly missed earning All-America honors for a second-straight season after placing 18th -- two points shy of a top-16 finish.

The Hawkeyes dove to school records in two events on the year. Freshman Will Brenner, a two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week honoree, set the 1-meter springboard (365.00) school record at the Hawkeye Invitational, while junior Calli Head tied the women's platform record (312.20) at the 2016 Big Ten Championships, where she earned a bronze medal.

Sophomore Morgan Rafferty also earned a weekly accolade, earning Big Ten Diver of the Week honors Dec. 16 after winning a pair of events in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series dual victory over Iowa State.

Waikel coached two athletes at the 2016 USA Diving Olympic Trials. Boschult qualified on the platform, while former Hawkeye All-American Deidre Freeman-Huff competed in the 3-meter springboard.

During the 2014-15 season, Waikel had three divers advance to the NCAA Championships and eight divers post NCAA Zone Diving Standards. Boschult earned honorable mention All-America honors on the platform after finishing 10th at the NCAA Championships, while Head (platform) and Joelle Christy (1-meter) qualified for the NCAAs.

Two school records were broken during the season on the platform. Boschult dove to the men's record at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships with a score of 409.20, while sophomore Lydia Lehnert took down the women's record with a 312.20.

In 2013-14, seven UI divers qualified for the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships. The Hawkeyes got a pair of top-five finishes and school records on the platform at the zones by Boschult and Head.

Waikel coached divers to three of the top seven scores in the 3-meter in school history throughout the course of the season. One of the divers -- Abby Grilli -- posted the fourth-best score (354.10) and was a three-time Big Ten Diver of the Week honoree.

Under Waikel's watch, Iowa diving has turned into a major player on the national diving scene as USA Diving recognized Hawkeye diving as "Center of Excellence" for 2014. Much of the attention can be attributed to Freeman-Huff, who has excelled under Waikel's tutelage.

Freeman-Huff was bronze medalist at the 2015 Pan American Games and placed fourth at FINA Grand Prix Meet. She also won the 3-meter synchronized diving event at the USA Diving Winter Nationals, claimed the 3-meter and 3-meter synchro events at the AT&T Diving Championships and placed 11th on the 1-meter at the FINA World Championships in Spain.



In 2014, Freeman-Huff was named to the U.S. Olympic Performance Squad, finished eighth at the FINA Diving World Series in China, and earned the bronze at the Canada Cup and 2014 Malaysia Grand Prix. She also earned a bronze at the 2015 Pan Am Games with Waikel serving as a Team Leader for Team USA.

Waikel joined the Hawkeyes after putting together an impressive collegiate and national diving resume during his seven-year stint as assistant diving coach at Indiana University. He helped the Hoosiers to five Big Ten Conference titles (four women's, one men's) and three top 10 NCAA finishes in his seven seasons. He also has coached 10 USA Diving National Teams to titles since 2006.

In his final season at Indiana, Waikel coached six Indiana divers to 11 All-America honors. Darian Schmidt and Zac Nees earned All-America status on all three boards. Schmidt won the individual Big Ten title on the platform and was the Big Ten Diver of the Championship.

In 2010-11, Waikel was key in guiding the Indiana women's squad to its third consecutive Big Ten title and Laura Ryan to her first win on the women's platform. He also coached Amy Korthauer and Amy Cozad at the World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

In 2009-10, Waikel coached Gabby Agostino to her first Big Ten title, while helping IU to the women's team title. Hoosier All-American Christina Loukas won a national title on the 3-meter springboard at the USA Diving Winter Nationals, and Amy Korthauer earned a spot on the U.S. National Team for the FINA World Cup in China.

In 2009, Waikel helped Loukas to Big Ten and NCAA titles on the 3-meter springboard, as well as NCAA Diver of the Year, Big Ten Diver of the Year, and Big Ten Diver of the Championships honors. Brittney Feldman also finished third in the 3-meter at the NCAA meet to garner All-America recognition.

In 2008, Waikel's divers captured four Big Ten titles, earning diver of the year, diver of the championship and coach of the year honors on both the men's and women's sides. Feldman captured conference titles in both the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard and went on to earn All-America honors in both events. Landon Marzullo won the same events on the men's side and was an All-American in all three diving events.

In 2007, Loukas turned in one of the most dominant performances in Big Ten diving history, becoming just the fourth diver to win all three diving events at the meet. She earned Big Ten Diver of the Year and Diver of the Championship honors for the third straight season. Loukas went on to earn first-team All-America honors after finishing as the runner-up in the 1-meter, while two other divers earned honorable mention recognition.

Loukas, a 2008 Olympian, won her first national title with a win in the 1-meter at the 2007 NCAA Championships, and she defended that title in 2008 and 2009. She was also a silver medalist in the 3-meter and a bronze in the 3-meter synchro at the World University Games. Loukas was a seven-time USA National Champion and six-time Big Ten champion under Waikel's watch. Loukas earned All-America honors on all three boards in 2006.

Waikel served as a USA Diving team leader/coach at the FINA Grand Prix in Montreal and the 2011 USA Diving Team coach at the 2011 World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

The 1994 Purdue University graduate with a degree in speech communications is a safety certified, U.S. Diving Grassroots and Dive Safe instructor. He and his wife, Marlene, are the parents of nine children: Damian, Hannah, Nathan, Dominic, Jonah, Paul, Christopher, Clare and Vincent.

ASSISTANT COACH SARAH STOCKWELL-GREGSON

Sarah Stockwell-Gregson is in her second season as an assistant coach and the women's recruiting coordinator with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program.

During her first season in Iowa City, the Hawkeyes had five student-athletes -- two men and three women -- qualify for the NCAA Championships. The team swam to five school records and posted 64 top-10 times in program history.

Iowa's men's team posted a 6-2 dual meet record, while the women's team swam to six victories. The Hawkeyes finished the season with five Big Ten weekly honors and the program had 11 top-eight finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In the classroom, 24 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, 11 were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and seven were honorable mention CSCAA Scholar Athletes. Senior Ben Colin also became the first Hawkeye to be the Jim McKay Scholarship recipient.

Stockwell-Gregson joined the program following a seven-year stint at Virginia Tech, where she was the program's top assistant from 2015-18 and interim head coach in 2018. She joined the Hokies in 2011 as an assistant coach.

While in Blacksburg, Stockwell-Gregson helped the men's and women's programs post 11 top-five team finishes at the ACC Championships and nine top-25 showings at the NCAA Championships. She coached 46 All-America or honorable mention All-America honorees, 16 ACC champions, and an ACC Swimmer of the Meet.



In 2013, Virginia Tech claimed its first ACC championship, taking home the men's team title. It came on the heels of back-to-back ACC runner-up finishes in 2011 and 2012. The Hokie women earned conference runner-up honors in 2012 after winning five titles at the championships. In 2016, Stockwell-Gregson coached 16 Olympic Trials qualifiers, including one U.S. National Team member.

Stockwell-Gregson began her career as a graduate assistant in Indiana's strength and conditioning program, where she helped the Hoosiers swimming and diving team claim a 2010 Big Ten title. The following season, Stockwell-Gregson made the move to the Indiana coaching staff as a volunteer assistant, helping the team to a Big Ten title and top 15 finish at the NCAA Championships.

As a student-athlete, Stockwell-Gregson was an eight-time All-American at Indiana from 2007-09, helping the Hoosiers to two Big Ten Championships (2007, 2009). She finished her career as the school record holder in the 100 and 200 breast and as part of the 200 and 400-medley relays.

Stockwell-Gregson was a two-time team captain and a 2008 Olympic Trials qualifier.

Stockwell-Gregson graduated from Indiana with a degree in recreation sports management in 2009 and she earned her master's degree in kinesiology in 2011. She is a member of USA Swimming (coaches) and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America.



ASSISTANT COACH BRIAN SCHRADER

Fourteen-time conference Coach of the Year Brian Schrader is in his first season as an assistant coach with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program.

Schrader joined the program following a 13-year stint as head coach at the University of Denver where he was recognized six times by the American Swimming Coaches Award for having an athlete finish in the top eight at the NCAA Championships. Denver qualified athletes for the NCAA Championships in 10 of his 13 seasons with 24 athletes earning All-America honors.

Schrader led the Pioneers to 17 conference championships (nine men's and eight women's in The Summit League and Sun Belt Conference) and the men's team posted a 22nd place finish at the 2018 NCAA Championships. The Denver women's program was named Collegieswimming.com's No. 1 Mid-Major program from 2016-18.

Denver student-athletes won a total of 21 Conference Championship Swimmer of the Year honors (10 women, 11 men) and the program had 12 Swimmer of the Year honors in The Summit League in the past six years, nine Newcomer of the Year Awards and seven Conference Championship Diver of the Year honors.

From 2016-19, Denver won all but one swimming event at The Summit League Championships.



Under his tutelage, Denver was represented on the international stage at the Olympics, World Championships, Pan American Games, and World University Games. The program also excelled academically, earning the CSCAA Academic All-American Team in each of his 13 seasons, more than 80 athletes earned Academic All-American honors, and four student-athletes earned the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

Schrader's coaching career started as a graduate assistant at Texas in 1991 and 1992, helping the Longhorns to the 1991 National Championship. He also was USA Swimming's National Team Coordinator from 1995-99 and served as a U.S. team staff member at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, 1998 World Championships in Australia, 2001 World Championships in Japan, and the 2013 Pan-American Games in the Dominican Republic.

During the 1999-00 season, Schrader was a women's assistant coach at Iowa, he also spent one season at Florida -- coaching six All-Americans and an SEC 100-freesytle champion -- and five seasons as an assistant coach at Georgia, helping the women's program to a 2005 NCAA title and four NCAA runner-up finishes. The men's program had four top-10 NCAA showings.

Schrader earned his undergraduate and master's degree in kinesiology from the University of Texas at Austin. He also has completed the High Performance Leadership Program in the Daniels College of Business at Denver University.

ASSISTANT COACH ROMAN TRUSSOV

University of Iowa All-American Roman Trussov is in his fourth season as an assistant coach with the swimming and diving program.

During the 2018-19 season -- Trussov's third as an assistant coach -- the Hawkeyes had five student-athletes -- two men and three women -- qualify for the NCAA Championships. The team swam to five school records and posted 64 top-10 times in program history.

Iowa's men's team posted a 6-2 dual meet record, while the women's team swam to six victories. The Hawkeyes finished the season with five Big Ten weekly honors and the program had 11 top-eight finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In the classroom, 24 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, 11 were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and seven were honorable mention CSCAA Scholar Athletes. Senior Ben Colin also became the first Hawkeye to be the Jim McKay Scholarship recipient.

During Trussov's second season on the coaching staff, Iowa had seven NCAA qualifiers -- four men and three women -- in 2017-18 and set 11 school records. The Hawkeyes' 200-free relay -- Will Scott, Jack Smith, Matt Kamin, and Joe Myhre -- earned honorable-mention All-America honors at the NCAA Championships, leading Iowa to a 38th place team finish.

The Hawkeye men went 5-1 in dual competition, including posting back-to-back victories over No. 21 Minnesota and at No. 23 Purdue. The Iowa women went 6-3 and the program swam to 69 NCAA qualifying marks with 10 Hawkeyes being honored with weekly Big Ten weekly recognition during the course of the season.

Academically, the Hawkeyes had 24 Academic All-Big Ten selections, nine Big Ten Distinguished Scholars and 12 student-athletes were named CSCAA honorable mention Scholar All-Americans.

During the 2016-17 season, the Hawkeyes broke 15 school records and tallied a top-26 finish at the NCAA Women's Swimming & Diving Championships. Fueled by first-team All-America performances from breast stroker Emma Sougstad and platform diver Calli Head, Iowa accumulated 26 team points to post its highest finish since 2005.



The Hawkeyes went a combined 13-5 in dual competition -- 7-2 for the women, 6-3 for the men -- with a roster comprised mainly of underclassmen. Iowa had 56 automatic or provisional NCAA qualifying standards during the season.

Iowa student-athletes shined academically as seven Hawkeyes earned CSCAA Scholar All-America distinction, 23 were Academic All-Big Ten selections, and five were Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.

As a collegian, Trussov was a two-time honorable-mention All-American as a senior, placing 13th in the 200-yard breaststroke and 15th in the 100 breast at the 2016 NCAA Championships. He was an NCAA qualifier in four events in his final Hawkeye go-round. Trussov also was a second-team All-Big Ten selection in 2016 after finishing as the runner-up in the 100 breast at the Big Ten Championships.

The Kazakhstan native finished his career as a three-time NCAA qualifier and is the school record holder in the 100 breast (52.17), 200 breast (1:54.57) and as a member of the 200-medley (1:25.53) and 400-medley (3:07.83) relays.

Academically, Trussov was a three-time CSCAA Scholar All-American and was twice named Academic All-Big Ten and as a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar.

Prior to joining the Hawkeyes, Trussov ranked in the top 50 in the world in the 50 and 100-meter breaststroke. He claimed gold medals at the RSF International Swimming Competition and the Grand Prix of Greece and was a silver medalist at the Winter Championships of Ukraine.

Trussov graduated from the University of Iowa with a bachelor's degree in management in 2016.



ASSISTANT COACH EMMA SOUGSTAD

Former Hawkeye All-American Emma Sougstad is in her first season as an assistant coach with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program.

The Forest City, Iowa, native rejoins the program after spending the past two seasons as the communications director for the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA), where she managed the annual coaching convention, featuring more than 300 coaches.

Sougstad joined the coaching ranks after concluding her Iowa career in 2017. She was an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) during the 2017-18 season, where she coordinated team travel and managed social media accounts to target potential recruits.

As a Hawkeye, Sougstad was a three-time NCAA qualifier and a two-time All-American in 2016 and 2017. She earned first-team All-America honors in 2017 after placing sixth in the nation in the 100 breast with a school-record time of 58.78 -- the fifth-fastest time in Big Ten history. The time propelled her to compete in the 2016 Olympic Trials.



Sougstad still holds individual school records in seven events -- 100 breast (58.76), 200 breast (2:10.47), and 200 IM (1:57.55) and as part of the 200-free (1:30.96), 400-free (3:18.83), 200-medley (1:38.99), and 400 medley (3:36.71) relays. She also has the second-best time in school history in the 50 free (22.63) and 100 fly (53.30).

Iowa's two-time team Most Valuable Swimmer, Sougstad was a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award recipient in 2016 and a five-time Big Ten Swimmer of the Week. She was also inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Girls Athletic Union in 2018.

Sougstad was a CSCAA Scholar All-American, a three-time Academic All-Big Ten, and Dean's List honoree during her Iowa career. She graduated from the University of Iowa in 2017 with a degree in elementary education.
