- Iowa finished the regular season 7-5 overall, 4-4 in the Big Ten, and bowl eligible for the 13th time in the last 14 seasons. lowa accepted an invitation to play in the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, dropping a 45-28 decision to Tennessee.
- Since 1999, the Hawkeyes have won seven or more games 11 times, including six of the last seven seasons.
- Twelve Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors, including LT Brandon Scherff, who was named Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten. Second team coach's honors went to OL Austin Blythe, LB Quinton Alston, DT Carl Davis, and DT Louis Trinca-Pasat. Second team media honors went to DT Carl Davis and DL Drew Ott. TE Jake Duzey, SS John Lowdermilk, FS Jordan Lomax, DB Desmond King, WR Tevaun Smith, and RT Andrew Donnal earned honorable mention.
- lowa is the only team with three defensive linemen named to the first or second All-Big Ten teams.
- Iowa scored 30 or more points in five Big Ten games (3-2) for the first time since 2002, when it scored 30 or more points in six Big Ten games. Under head coach Kirk Ferentz, lowa is 62-7 when scoring 30 or more points.
- The Hawkeyes averaged 31.2 points per game in Big Ten play, the highest average since 2002 (37.8), and the third-highest average since 1999 (2001, 32.6).
- Iowa had three road wins this season (3-2) and seven road wins over the last two seasons (4-1 in 2013). It is the first time in the Ferentz era lowa has back-to-back winning seasons on the road. Iowa has five winning road records since 1999 (2002, 5-0; 2004, 3-2; 2009, 4-1; 2013, 4-1; 2014, 3-2).
- lowa's passing offense of 237 yards per game ranks eighth best for a single season in program history.
- In Big Ten games only, lowa's pass offense ranked No. 2 in the league with 248.5 yards per game, its highest average since 2005 (263.5) and the third-highest average under Kirk Ferentz (2004, 263.4).
- In Big Ten games only, the Hawkeyes ranked No. 4 in total offense, averaging 417.2 yards per game, its highest average since 2005 and the second-highest average under Kirk Ferentz.
- In Big Ten games only, the Hawkeyes led the conference in pass defense, allowing 136.9 passing yards per game.
- lowa's defense allowed just 20 red-zone touchdowns, the third fewest in the league.
- Iowa forced 4.383 -and-outs per game, including 57-of-160 drives, 21 st best in the country.
- Nineteen Hawkeyes caught at least one pass this season (eight backs, seven receivers, four tight ends). The Hawkeyes had 10 or more players record at least one catch in four of their seven wins.
- Iowa converted 14 fourth-down attempts, tied for the most in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes scored two touchdowns on fourth down (one pass, one rush).
- The lowa defense forced 553 -and-outs on 161 drives ( 33.7 percent). The Hawkeyes forced 4.2 3-and-outs per game.
- The Hawkeyes were the least penalized team in the Big Ten. Iowa was flagged 46 times for an average of 29.5 yards per game.
- lowa totaled 587 yards of total offense and 304 yards rushing at Illinois. Both numbers were season highs, and both rank No. 4 in the Kirk Ferentz era.
- In four of lowa's seven wins, the Hawkeyes recorded an interception on its opponents' final drive (CB Greg Mabin vs. UNI; FS Anthony Gair at Pitt; SS John Lowdermilk at Purdue; FS Jordan Lomax vs. Indiana).
- Iowa has returned an interception for a touchdown in each of the last seven seasons and 12 of the last 14 seasons. CB Desmond King returned an interception for a touchdown (35 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 11, and SS John Lowdermilk returned an interception (17 yards) against Nebraska on Nov. 28.
- lowa used 17 first-time starters -- eight on offense (QB C.J. ## @HawkeyeFootball MILESTONES

- Senior WR Kevonte Martin-Manley broke the school record for career receptions (174). Martin-Manley had 52 receptions this season to raise his career total to 174, passing Derrell Johnson-Koulianos on the all-time list (173). He had 517 yard receiving this year, raising his career total to 1,799 , No. 13 all-time.
- Senior RB Mark Weisman scored 16 rushing touchdowns this season, raising his career total to 32, No. 3 all-time behind Sedrick Shaw (33) and Tavian Banks (33). Weisman's 32 rushing touchdown are the most in the Kirk Ferentz era. His 16 rushing scores are the third most by a Hawkeye in a single season (Shonn Greene, 20; Tavian Banks, 17). He is one of four players in school history to surpass 2,500 career rushing yards and 25 career rushing touchdowns. He has 2,602 career rushing yards, the sixth most in program history.
- Senior QB Jake Rudock threw for 2,436 yards this season to become the 10 th player in program history to pass for more than 4,000 career yards. Rudock has 4,819 career passing yards, the eighth highest total in school history. He threw for 16 touchdowns, raising his career total to 34 , the eighth most in program history. He had 2,612 yards of total offense, raising his career total to 5,214 career total offense yards, the eighth most in school history.


## @HawkeyeFootball QUICK STRIKES

- Iowa outscored its opponents, 99-48, in the first quarter during the regular season. Tennessee outscored lowa 21-0 in the first quarter at the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- The Hawkeyes outscored their opponents, 78-31, in the first quarter over the final seven regular season games (Indiana, Maryland, Northwestern, Minnesota, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Nebraska). In lowa's first five games, the Hawkeyes scored 21 combined first-quarter points.
- In lowa's 48-7 win over Northwestern, first-quarter total yards favored lowa, 146-12. Firsthalf total yard favored lowa, 298-55.
- Iowa scored 38 points in the first half twice this season (Indiana, Northwestern). The only other season lowa scored 38 -plus points in the first half twice in the same season under Kirk Ferentz was 2005 (Ball State and Minnesota).
- lowa scored four touchdowns in a span of 3:38 against Indiana on Oct. 11 (TE Jake Duzey reception, CB Desmond King interception, WR Damond Powell reception, and RB Jonathan Parker rush).
- Iowa scored on three straight offensive plays in the first quarter against Indiana on Oct. 11. TE Jake Duzey caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from QB Jake Rudock with 4:41 left. On lowa's next play from scrimmage, WR Damond Powell caught a 72 -yard touchdown pass from Rudock. On lowa's next play from scrimmage, RB Jonathan Parker ran for a 60-yard touchdown.
- Against Indiana on Oct. 11, lowa scored two offensive touchdowns of 60 yards or greater (Rudock to Powell, 72 yards; Parker 60-yard rush) for the first time since Oct. 31, 2009, vs. Indiana. (Stanzi to McNutt, 92 yards; Stanzi to Johnson-Koulianos, 66 yards).

- Iowa had three wins when trailing or tied at the half this year (trailed Ball State, 7-3; trailed Pitt, 17-7; tied Purdue, 10-10).
- Iowa trailed in each of its first four wins, and erased 10-point deficits in three wins (Ball State, Pitt, Purdue).
- The Hawkeyes trailed in five wins (Northern Iowa, Ball State, Pitt, Purdue, Illinois).
- Iowa had two fourth-quarter comebacks this season (Ball State and Pitt). Iowa erased a 10-point deficit to defeat Ball State, 17-13, at home, and rallied from down 17-7 to win at Pitt, 24-20.

## FERENTZ AMONG TOP 10

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 115 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, the ninth most in conference history. He has 68 Big Ten wins, also the ninth most in conference history. He is 1 -of- 8 coaches to rank among the top 10 in both categories. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Barry Alvarez (WIS).
Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (9).

## HAWKEYES JOIN 100 CLUB

Iowa has posted 104 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 21st highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (148); Ohio State (143); Oklahoma (137); USC (135); LSU (134); Georgia (128); Alabama (127); Texas (126); TCU (126); Oregon (126); Florida State (124); Virginia Tech (123); Wisconsin (122); Auburn (117); Florida (117); West Virginia (114); Virginia (111); Utah (112); Nebraska (110); Miami, FL (105); Iowa (104); Texas Tech (104); Michigan (102).

## HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 16 th season as head football coach at lowa and is the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.

- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ranks ninth with 115 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 68 Big Ten wins, ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 106-64 (.624) overall mark and a 63-46 (.578) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 115-85 (.575) and a 68-60 (.531) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 127-106 (.545). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.

## \#45 AMONG ALL-TIME GREATS

Senior RB Mark Weisman became the third player in program history to rush for 30 touchdowns in a career when he scored from 1-yard against Minnesota on Nov. 8. He scored 16 rushing touchdowns this year, raising his career total to 32 , one shy of tying the school record shared by Sedrick Shaw and Tavian Banks (33).
Weisman is one of four players in school history to surpass 2,500 career rushing yards and 25 career rushing touchdowns. The other three include Sedrick Shaw, Ladell Betts, and Tavian Banks.

In 36 career games, Weisman has 32 rushing touchdowns and 2,602 yards rushing. After spending the 2010 season at Air Force, Weisman joined the Hawkeyes as a walk-on and redshirted in 2011. He saw his first action as a sophomore in 2012. He was 1-of-3 finalists for the Burlsworth Trophy, awarded to the nation's top former walk-on. Weisman was also named second-team Academic All-America.

## DT LOUIS TRINCA-PASAT (SR., 6-3, 290)

## Career Games Played/Started: 39/38

Senior DT Louis Trinca-Pasat started the final 38 straight games of his career -- all at defensive tackle. The streak dates back to the 2012 season opener.

- Named second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches.
- Academic All-Big Ten.
- His 69 tackles were the most among Big Ten linemen.
- His 69 tackles rank fourth on the team and are a single-season career best. He recorded 40 tackles in 2012 and 38 in 2013.
- Ranked second on the team with 11.5 tackles for loss ( 53 yards).
- Recorded three tackles and one sack, a safety, at Illinois. It was lowa’s first safety since 2010.
- Named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week after recording a career-high three sacks (29 yards) and five tackles against Northwestern. The three sacks nearly doubled his career total (6.5).
- Named honorable mention Defensive Lineman of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following lowa's win over Northwestern.

Trinca-Pasat was 1-of-3 FBS defensive linemen to post 10-plus tackles and three-plus TFL's in Week 1. ## KOEHN No. 1 ON KICKOFFS

Junior K Marshall Koehn led the conference and ranked eighth in the nation in touchback percentage. He recorded a touchback on 43-of-68 kickoffs ( 63.2 percent). His 43 touchbacks rank second in the Big Ten.

- Koehn was perfect on 38 PAT attempts, and connected on 12-of-16 field goal attempts.
- Was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts against Northwestern (24, 48), marking the first time in his career he kicked multiple field goals in the same game. He also kicked two field goals $(22,25)$ against Nebraska, including one in the overtime period.
- Koehn connected on seven consecutive field goal attempts before bouncing a 46-yarder off the right upright at Illinois. It was his first miss in conference play (8-of-9). He finished the season with three straight made field goals, one against Wisconsin (26) and two against Nebraska $(22,25)$.
- Connected on a 52 -yard field goal in the third quarter ( $0: 48$ ) at Pitt. It was a career long and ties for the eighth longest in school history. It was lowa's longest field goal since AllAmerican Nate Kaeding split the uprights from 55 yards against Minnesota in 2003.

## CB DESMOND KING (SO., 5-11, 190)

Sophomore CB Desmond King started all 13 games at right cornerback. He has started 25 consecutive games since entering the starting lineup in Week 2 of his true freshman season.

Junior QB Jake Rudock ranked No. 4 in the Big Ten with a 133.5 pass efficiency rating. He ranked second in the league in completion percentage (61.7) and threw just five interceptions, the fewest among quarterbacks with at least 250 attempts ( 10 quarterbacks). Rudock is 213 -of- 345 for 2,436 yards and 16 touchdowns. He is $14-11$ in his career as a starter, including a 6-3 record on the road, and an 8-6 mark at home (0-2 neutral).

- He has started 25 of lowa's 26 games since the 2013 season opener. He started lowa's last eight games after sitting out the Purdue game due to injury.
- Had three 300-yard passing games this season (Ball State, Maryland, and Wisconsin).
- His career totals include 417-of-691 pass attempts for 4,819 yards and 34 touchdowns.
- Ranks eighth in program history with 34 career passing touchdowns, one shy of tying James Vandenberg (35).
- One of eight players in school history to throw for 30 or more touchdowns and 4,000-plus yards in a career.
- Among lowa's all-time career passing leaders. He has 4,819 career passing yards, the eighth highest total in school history.
- Has 5,214 career total offense yards, the eighth most in school history.
- Matched his career high with 39 rushing yards, including a touchdown run, at Illinois.
- Was 32-of-56 for 317 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception against Maryland. The 56 pass attempts are the second-most ever for a Kirk Ferentz quarterback. The 300-yard passing game was the second of his career (322 vs. Ball State, 2014).
- Led lowa to four road wins in 2013, the highest total for an lowa starting quarterback since Ricky Stanzi won four games in 2009. Iowa was 2-2 on the road this season in Rudock starts.

- On lowa's final two drives against Ball State, Rudock was 9-for-11 for 81 yards passing and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 32 yards on lowa's final two drives. He finished the game with a career-high 322 yards on 33 -of-52 passing. He became lowa's first QB with 30plus completions, 300 -plus passing yards and no interceptions in a game since Jon Beutjer against Indiana in 2000.
- His 322 passing yards against Ball State rank No. 29 in program history for a single-game.
- Streak of 17 consecutive starts was snapped Sept. 27 at Purdue. Rudock was injured in Week 4 at Pitt, and did not return to the game after halftime. He had started 17 straight dating back to the 2013 season opener.
- Completed 31 -for-41 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns against Northern lowa. Rudock distributed the ball to 13 different receivers, the most during the Kirk Ferentz era (1999-2014). It marked only the fourth game by a Big Ten team, since 2000, where at least 13 different players recorded at least one reception.
- 2014 Preseason Watch Lists included the Manning Award and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Trophy.
- Threw for 256 yards in 2013 season opener against Northern IIlinois. Completed 21-of-37 passes, including one touchdown and one interception. The 256 passing yards ties for the fourth-highest
by a Hawkeye quarterback making his first career start.
- Rushed for five touchdowns in 2013, the highest singleseason total by an lowa quarterback since Nathan Chandler rushed for six touchdowns in 2003.
- 2013 Capital One District Academic All-America first team, Academic All-Big Ten.

QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 203) Career Games Played/Starts: 14/1
C.J. Beathard completed 13-of-23 passes for 145 yards and a career-high two touchdowns $(31,18)$ at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. He also rushed for a career-high 82 yards on eight carries. Beathard did not start he contest, but he quarterbacked nine of lowa's 14 offensive possessions. Beathard made his first career start and led lowa to a 2410 win at Purdue on Sept. 27. He became the first lowa quarterback to win his first career start in a road game since Jason Manson won at Syracuse in 2006. Beathard completed 17-of-37 passes for 245 yards and one touchdown against the Boilermakers. The completions, attempts and yardage totals are career highs. He also rushed eight times for 29 yards.

- Beathard played quarterback in eight games this year (Ball State, Purdue, Pitt, Indiana, Northwestern, Minnesota, IIlinois, Tennessee). He started the second half at Pitt and led lowa on three straight scoring drives to start the second half (TD, FG, TD). He was 7 -for-8 for 98 yards on lowa's three scoring drives.
- Completed 3-of-3 passes for 73 yards and a touchdown at Illinois.
- Completed 3-of-7 passes for 32 yards and a touchdown at Minnesota.
- Was 5-of-6 for 23 yards passing against Northwestern. Also rushed three times for 23 yards.
- His 62-yard completion to WR Damond Powell in the third quarter at Pitt was a career long.
- Led Iowa on a seven-play, season-long 94-yard touchdown drive to open the second half at Pitt.
- He was 9-of-27 for 179 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions in five appearances in 2013.


## RB JORDAN CANZERI (JR., 5-9, 192)

Career Games Played/Starts: 29/2
Junior RB Jordan Canzeri ranked second on the team with 752 all-purpose yards, including 494 yards rushing, 123 yards receiving, and 135 yards in kickoff returns. He was the only player on the team with 100 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving.

- Has 1,089 career rushing yards. He rushed for 120 yards against Tennessee to become the 45th player in program history to amass 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Rushed for a team-high 120 yards on 12 carries against Tennessee in the TaxSlayer Bowl. It was the only time this season he was lowa's leading rusher. He had a game-high 148 all-purpose yards in the bowl game, adding two catches for 13 yards and returning one kickoff 15 yards.
- Rushed for 55 yards on a season-high 16 carries against Nebraska. Added a season-high three receptions for 17 yards against the Huskers.
- Returned to the lineup at Illinois after missing games against Northwestern and Minnesota due to injury. Had 12 carries for a then season-high 68 yards against the Illini.

## LEARNING LINEBACKERS

Entering this year, Iowa's linebackers combined for two career starts, one by senior Quinton Alston and one by junior Travis Perry. Alston and redshirt freshman Bo Bower started all 13 games this season. LB Josey Jewell started the last four games in place of LB Travis Perry. Jewell's first career start was at Illinois. He recorded a career-high 14 tackles against Tennessee.

Perry had three career starts to his credit before being injured at Minnesota and missing the final three games. LB Reggie Spearman started lowa's first seven games, the first starts of his career.
Perry recorded five tackles and registered his first career sack in his first start this year against Northwestern. Perry and Jewell recorded career highs in tackles at Minnesota. Perry made six stops, while Jewell was credited with nine tackles.

- Alston ranked second on the team with 94 tackles.
- Iowa's linebackers combined for 17 tackles for loss this season.
- All five linebackers -- Alston, Bower, Jewell, Perry, Spearman -- had at least one sack.
- Alston had two forced fumbles and tied for second on the team with five breakups.
- Bower had two of lowa's 13 interceptions.


## THE NEXT NEXT-MEN-IN

Redshirt freshman LB Josey Jewell started the last four games in place of injured LB Travis Perry. Jewell's start against Illinois was the first of his career. He was the third linebacker this season to record his first career start (Bo Bower, Reggie Spearman). Senior LB Quinton Alston and junior LB Travis Perry each had one career start prior to this season.
Fifth-year senior C Tommy Gaul started lowa's last seven games at center, his first seven career starts. Gaul played the majority of lowa's game against Indiana on Oct. 11, entering the game on lowa's opening drive when RG Jordan Walsh left due to injury. Starting center Austin Blythe slid to right guard, and Gaul handled snaps the rest of the game. Gaul, a Des Moines native, joined Iowa as a walk-on in 2010. He appeared in one game in 2011, and two games in 2013.

## GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

- Iowa played five games following its opponent's bye week (lowa State, Maryland, Northwestern, Minnesota, and Illinois). The Hawkeyes were 2-3 in those contests.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Purdue in their Big Ten opener on Sept. 27. It marked the 12th time in Kirk Ferentz' 16 years at lowa that the Hawkeyes opened the conference season on the road.
- lowa played only two games during the month of October (1-1).
- The Hawkeyes did not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.


## 2 GAMES FOR THE RECORD BOOK

QB Jake Rudock passed for more yards (572) through the first two games of the season than any quarterback in program history. His completions (64) and attempts (93) were also more than any other quarterback through two games.
As a team, lowa's 592 passing yards (66-of-96) were the most through two games since 1985 when Chuck Long and Marc Vlasic threw for a combined 671 yards (44-of-74) against Drake and Northern Illinois.
lowa's 55 passes in Week 2 against Ball State marked the highest number of pass attempts for an lowa team under Kirk Ferentz since the 2006 Outback Bowl ( 55 vs. Florida). Iowa's 35 completions against Ball State were the second most under Kirk Ferentz (36 vs. Indiana in 1999).

## FERENTZ SECOND IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz completed his 16th season as lowa's head football coach and ranks second in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer. Ferentz is tied for second with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

## IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- Including 2014, the Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times

- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O’Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman).
- lowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in lowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 16 seasons. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.


## HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,193 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 613-541-39 (.530). That includes a 386-213-16 (.641) record in home games, a 227-328-23 (.413) record in games away from lowa City, a 306-366-25 (.457) mark in Big Ten games and a 269-177-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

## RECRUITING LANDSCAPE

lowa's 2014 roster included 117 players from 20 states and one foreign country. Among Big Ten schools, only Nebraska (25) and Penn State (21) have a larger footprint in the United States. Of the Hawkeyes' 117 players, 39 are from lowa. The roster includes 18 players from Illinois; 10 from Ohio; seven from Maryland, six from Michigan and Texas; four from Missouri, Minnesota, New Jersey and Florida; three from Nebraska and Wisconsin; two from Canada; one from Arizona, Connecticut, Indiana, New York, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia; and three from Canada. Only four FBS schools - Michigan State (4), UCONN (3), UNLV (3), Wyoming (3) - have more Canadians on their 2014 roster.

## IOWA WILL RECEIVE

lowa received the opening kickoff in 12-of-13 games this season (not Maryland). In 16 seasons as lowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeye received the opening kickoff in 161-of-200 games (95-67). Iowa has started the game on defense in 38-of-200 games under Ferentz (20-18). lowa started the game on defense one time this year (loss at Maryland, 38-31).

## FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

lowa had seven players on its roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. The seven legacy players ties Tennessee for the third most on any one team in the country. California and Idaho each have eight legacy players.
Iowa's seven players included WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1984-86), LB Andrew Cerney (Tim in 1971-73), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), and TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81).

## PODOLAK TOPS 400 GAMES IN BROADCAST BOOTH

Hawkeye radio broadcaster Ed Podolak finished his 33rd season the Hawkeyes' football analyst and called his 400th game (241-159-4) in the Hawkeye booth on Saturday, Nov. 8, in Minneapolis. He joined the broadcast booth in 1982 following a lengthy professional career with the Kansas City Chiefs. He was a three-year letterman for the Hawkeyes as a quarterback and running back from 1966-68.
Podolak replaced former lowa head coach Forest Evashevski in the broadcast booth in 1982 and partnered with the late Jim Zabel until 1996. Since 1997, he has worked with play-by-play voice of the Hawkeyes Gary Dolphin.

## UI MAKES LIST OF MILITARY FRIENDLY SCHOOLS

For the sixth year in a row the University of Iowa made Victory Media's list of Military Friendly Schools. The list honors the top 15 percent of colleges, universities, and trade schools that are doing the most to embrace America's military service members and veterans as students and ensure their success on campus.

## IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- There are 28 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Since 2010, lowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State (23) has more. Iowa has had three first round picks in the last five NFL drafts, only Wisconsin (4) has more among league teams.
- Iowa had 18 players drafted from 2010-12. Six Hawkeyes were drafted in each of those years, including three first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles.
- Former Hawkeyes Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) and Chad Greenway (Minnesota LB) were named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in their respective NFL careers in 2012. Greenway was a repeat selection in 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his second year as lowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Every lowa senior starting tight end (10) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie.
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 12 years, 114-of-128 ( 89 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

lowa posted a 31-23 victory over Northern lowa in Kinnick Stadium in both team's season opener.
The Hawkeyes rushed 36 times for 151 yards and totaled 250 yards passing. QB Jake Rudock completed 31 of his 41 pass attempts to 13 different targets. The 13 different receivers are the most during the Kirk Ferentz era in a single-game. Seven Hawkeyes accounted for the 151 yards rushing, led by WR Tevaun Smith's 35 yards.
Defensively, the Hawkeyes amassed nine tackles for loss, including five sacks, and held the Panthers to 25 yards rushing on 25 carries ( 1.0 average). The 25 yards rushing are the fewest by an lowa opponent since Minnesota had seven yards rushing against the Hawkeyes in 2008.
Iowa scored first on a LeShun Daniels, Jr. 13-yard scoring run to cap a 41-yard drive on its opening possession. The scoring play was the first of Daniels' career. The opening drive was set up by a 50 -yard return on the opening kick by RB Mark Weisman; the first return of his career.
UNI answered with 10 -straight points to take a 10-7 advantage. Michael Schmadeke converted a 36 -yard field goal, followed by a Kevin Vereen 23 -yard TD reception.
Weisman crossed the goal line from 1-yard out to reclaim the lead with 5:03 left in the second quarter.
The teams exchanged field goals before the end of the half, which included lowa junior's Marshall Koehn's first career field goal (40 yards).
lowa stretched its lead to 24-13 on a 6-yard scoring strike from Rudock to Smith with 10:13 left in the third period.
UNI answered with a 70 -yard pass play from QB Sawyer Kollmorgen to RB David Johnson. Schmadeke's third field goal trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to 24-23 with 12:42 left in the fourth quarter.
WR Damond Powell tallied his third career TD on a 12-yard pass from Rudock to give lowa the eight-point victory.
WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught a game-high eight passes for 62 yards, while TE Jake Duzey caught a personalbest seven passes for 34 yards.
DT Louis Trinca-Pasat recorded career bests in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3) and sacks (1.5). DB Jordan Lomax also posted a career high in tackles (9). LB Bo Bower and CB Greg Mabin each had their first career interception.

lowa rallied from a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit to upend Ball State, 17-13, in Kinnick Stadium. The comeback equaled the team's second-largest in the fourth quarter since 1999; lowa posted a 17-point comeback versus Pittsburgh in 2011 and had another 10-point rally against Indiana in 2009.
QB Jake Rudock engineered his third career fourth-quarter comeback (Northwestern and Michigan in 2013). The junior was 9 -of- 11 for 81 yards and two touchdowns on lowa's final two scoring drives. Rudock finished the game posting career highs in completions (33), pass attempts (52), passing yards (322), and rushing yardage (36). Rudock became the first Hawkeye QB with 30 -plus completions, 300 -plus pass yards and zero interceptions in a game since Jon Beutjer against Indiana in 2000.
Ball State scored for the first time in three games against lowa on a 35 -yard fumble return in the second period to give the Cardinals an early 7-0 advantage.
lowa answered with a Marshall Koehn 26 -yard field goal to close within four points on its next possession.
Ball State scored the only points of the third quarter on two Scott Secor field goals ( 27 and 42 yards).
Trailing by 10 points in the fourth quarter, lowa tallied a pair of 12 -yard touchdown passes in the final 2:52 of the game to notch its second victory of the season. Rudock connected with WR Derrick Willies for his first career touchdown reception with 2:52 remaining. After lowa's defense forced a three-and-out, TE Jake Duzey culminated a six-play, 59-yard drive with the game-winning TD reception from Rudock.
For the second-straight game, Kevonte Martin-Manley led the Hawkeye receiving corps, catching eight balls for 70 yards. WR Tevaun Smith caught six passes for 59 yards.
DE Drew Ott recorded a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss, and one sack. He also forced a fumble (recovered by Carl Davis) on Ball State's final offensive play with 25 seconds left. His efforts earned the junior Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors. SS Jordan Lomax matched a personal-best with nine tackles.
After accumulating nine tackles for loss against Northern lowa the previous week, the Hawkeye defense amassed another eight TFL's versus Ball State. DT Carl Davis and LB Quinton Alston each registered 1.5 TFL's.

Iowa State rallied from a 14-3 halftime deficit to edge Iowa, 20-17, in front of a sold-out crowd at Kinnick Stadium.
RB Mark Weisman (one yard) and QB Jake Rudock (five yards) accounted for the Hawkeyes' first-half touchdowns. Weisman's scoring run capped a 16 -play, 55 -yard drive that consumed 7:54 off the play clock in the first quarter. Rudock's 5 -yard run completed a 10 -play drive that saw lowa convert two fourth-down plays.
Iowa thwarted a Cyclone scoring threat late in the second quarter when LB Quinton Alston forced an ISU fumble at the goal line. CB Greg Mabin recovered the fumble in the end zone with 1:28 left in the first half.
Iowa State quarterback Sam Richardson connected with WR EJ Bibbs in the end zone on a fourth-and-one midway through the third period to make the score 14-10. The score was the first red-zone touchdown the Hawkeyes allowed in 2014. Later in the fourth quarter, the Cyclones claimed the lead on a 27 -yard touchdown pass from Richardson to RB DeVondrick Nealy.
lowa tied the game on its ensuing drive, with a 44 -yard field goal from Marshall Koehn. However, the Cyclones generated a 51-yard drive that culminated with Cole Netten's game-winning 42-yard field goal with two seconds remaining. Netten also split the uprights from 47 yards in the first period.
Rudock finished the game completing 16 -of-24 passes for 146 yards and 39 yards rushing on 12 attempts. Richardson completed 25 -of- 37 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns for the Cyclones.
Weisman led the Hawkeye ground attack, rushing 16 times for 49 yards, while Aaron Wimberly led Iowa State's ground game with 33 yards on 11 carries.
Three Hawkeyes recorded career high in tackles, including Alston (game-high 10), LB Reggie Spearman (7) and Mabin (6). Jevohn Miller led the Cyclones in tackles, amassing nine.

The visiting team has won the last three games in the series, dating back to 2011.

The win marks lowa's third straight on the road, dating back to last season.
Each team scored a touchdown in the first period. The Panthers scored first on a Chris James 14 -yard rush. On the next possesion, lowa QB Jake Rudock found TE Henry Krieger Coble, on a fourth down play, in the end zone from 13 yards out for his second career TD to even the score.
Pittsburgh dominated the second quarter, scoring 10 points on a James Connor 1-yard run and a Chris Blewitt 33 -yard field goal. The Hawkeyes had possession for 2:44, running only five plays during the second period, and Pitt went into halftime with a 17-7 lead.
QB C.J. Beathard replaced an injured Rudock at the start of the second half. Beathard led lowa on three-straight scoring drives beginning with a seven-play, season-long 94yard drive resulting in a RB Mark Weisman 10-yard scoring run to cut the deficit to 17-14.
Each team traded field goals before the end of the third quarter, including lowa PK Marshall Koehn connecting from a career-long distance of 52 yards. The 52 -yard field goal equals the eighth-longest field goal in school history.
Weisman tallied his second TD of the game from one yard out with 6:56 remaining in the contest to give the Hawkeyes a 24-20 advantage.
lowa's defense stopped Pittsburgh on the Panthers' final two drives, including Anthony Gair collecting his first career interception as time expired to preserve the victory.
Weisman finished the contest with a season-high 88 yards rushing on 22 attempts. Rudock and Beathard combined to complete 12 -of- 18 passes for 178 yards and a TD. Beathard was 7 -of- 8 for 98 yards, with 62 of the 98 yards coming on a pass to WR Damond Powell, which helped set up lowa's first touchdown of the second half.
After allowing 132 yards rushing the first 30 minutes, the Hawkeye defense yielded only 53 the second half. SS John Lowdermilk led lowa with a career and game-best 11 tackles.

## GAME RECAP

lowa scored the game's final 24 points in a $24-10$ Big Ten-opening triumph over the Boilermakers at Ross-Ade Stadium in West Lafayette. The win was the second in as many years at Purdue.
lowa fell behind 10-0 after a 39-yard interception return and a 42-yard field goal. However, the Hawkeyes answered before halftime with 10 points of their own via a 2-yard RB Mark Weisman rushing score and a 28-yard field goal by K Marshall Koehn.
lowa's offense totaled 420 yards of offense. QB C.J. Beathard completed 17 -of- 37 passes for 245 yards with one touchdown in his first career start, while Weisman led the ground attack with 76 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries. Weisman's totals put him over the 2,000-yard rushing plateau as he became only the seventh Hawkeye to rush for more than 2,000 yards and over 20 touchdowns.
The Hawkeyes dominated the second half, outscoring the Boilermakers 14-0. WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught the game-winning touchdown, his first score of the season, on a 23 -yard pass with 45 seconds left in the third quarter. Weisman tallied his second rushing score of the day, this time from five yards out, to put the game out of reach.

Eight different receivers caught at least one pass, with Martin-Manley leading the way with five receptions for 74 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown. MartinManley's totals moved him into fifth all-time in career receptions with 148.

Beathard became the first lowa QB to win his first career start in a road game since Jason Manson in 2006 at Syracuse.

The Hawkeye defense limited Purdue to nine first downs, 156 total yards -- 72 of which were in the air -- forced two turnovers, six three-and-outs, and recorded six tackles for loss, including four sacks. The 72 yards passing are the sixthfewest by a team during the Kirk Ferentz era. Also, the nine first downs tie for the seventh-fewest by an lowa opponent since 1999.

SS John Lowdermilk picked off Purdue QB Danny Etling twice in the fourth period to go along with a team-best seven tackles.

lowa scored 38 of its season-high 45 points in the first half en route to a 45-29 victory over Indiana at Kinnick Stadium on Homecoming. Six different Hawkeyes accounted for the 45-point outburst.
The Hawkeye offense totaled 426 yards of offense, while the defense collected three interceptions and forced eight three-and-outs. After missing the last game due to injury, QB Jake Rudock returned in a starting role, completing 19-of-27 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns.
lowa scored 28 first-quarter points for the first time since scoring 28 against Ball State in 2005. Rudock connected with TE Jake Duzey (12 yards), and hit WR Damond Powell for a season-long 72 yard scoring play. The Hoosiers closed to within 28-21 on a 13-yard pass play from QB Nate Sudfeld to Nick Stoner and a 45-yard scoring run by Tevin Coleman, his second of the game; he had an 83-yard scoring run in the first period.

Iowa closed the half with a 22-yard Marshall Koehn field goal and a 1-yard touchdown run by Mark Weisman as time expired. The Hawkeyes led 38-21 at halftime.
Weisman crossed the goal line a second time from one yard out to extend lowa's advantage to 45-21 with 13:17 left in the fourth period. Indiana's Coleman added a 69-yard scoring run -- his third touchdown of the game -- to close the scoring.
Iowa totaled 207 rushing yards, led by Weisman's 89 yards and two scores on 25 carries. Parker rushed three times for 58 yards and a score. WR Tevaun Smith led the Iowa receivers with four catches for 69 yards.
Sudfeld completed 4-of-9 passes for 85 yards and one interception before exiting the game due to injury in the second quarter. Coleman rushed for a game-high 219 yards on 15 attempts and three scores to lead the Hoosiers.

Maryland rallied from a 14-point first-half deficit to hand lowa its first road loss of the season, 38-31, at Byrd Stadium in the team's first-ever meeting.
The Hawkeyes sprinted out to a 14-0 advantage in the first quarter after a RB Mark Weisman 2-yard scoring run and a TE Henry Krieger Coble 2-yard touchdown reception from QB Jake Rudock. Maryland extended its lead to 17 in the fourth quarter after Will Likely returned a Rudock interception 45 yards and a Brown 1-yard run.
Iowa made a late push, recording a WR Jacob Hillyer 4-yard TD reception and a 24 -yard Marshall Koehn field goal with 1:19 remaining following an onside kick. The Hawkeyes' attempt to recover a second consecutive onside kick was unsuccessful.

## GAME RECAP

Mark Weisman scored three touchdowns and Jake Rudock threw for another in a 48-7 lowa victory over Northwestern in Kinnick Stadium. The win was lowa's sixth, making the Hawkeyes bowl eligible for the 13th time in 14 seasons.
lowa scored on its first three offensive possessions and returned a blocked punt for a touchdown to jump out to a 24-0 advantage in the first quarter. Weisman started the scoring with an 8-yard run less than two minutes into the game. Following a 48-yard Marshall Koehn field goal, Weisman found the end zone again, this time from 14 yards. Freshman Ben Niemann finished the first-quarter scoring with a 1-yard return after blocking a Northwestern punt.
The Hawkeyes added two more touchdowns in the second quarter after Northwestern's only score of the contest; Tevaun Smith caught a 31-yard touchdown pass, followed by another Weisman 8-yard run -- his third of the half.
After a scoreless third period, Koehn split the uprights from 24 yards -- his seventh straight made field goal -- and redshirt freshman Akrum Wadley scampered five yards for his first career score. Minnesota snapped a two-game losing streak to lowa with a 51-14 win over the Hawkeyes at TCF Bank Stadium in Minneapolis. With the victory, the Gophers take possession of Floyd of Rosedale for the next year.

## GAME RECAP

lowa scored 28 consecutive points, including a season-best 21 second-half points, en route to a 30-14 triumph over IIlinois at Memorial Stadium in Champaign. The win was lowa's sixth in the last seven meetings against the Fighting Illini.

The Hawkeyes amassed season highs in total yards (587) and rushing yards (304); both totals rank as the fourth-highest by an lowa team during the Kirk Ferentz era.

DT Louis Trinca-Pasat forced an Illinois safety and the defensive unit accumulated seven tackles for loss -- lowa's highest total since the season opener against Northern lowa (nine).
lowa quarterbacks combined for 283 yards passing, 39 yards rushing, and four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing). Jake Rudock completed 14 -of-21 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns. Rudock also rushed eight times for 39 yards and a touchdown. The 39 yards rushing equal a career high. C.J. Beathard was $3-0 f-3$ passing for 73 yards and a score.

Mark Weisman rushed 23 times for a season-high 134 yards. It marked the first time this season the senior topped the century mark and the ninth time in his career.

Trailing 7-2, lowa scored 28 consecutive points to grab a 30-7 advantage. TE Ray Hamilton caught touchdown passes of one and six yards; the first scores of his career. Hamilton becomes the first lowa tight end with two receiving touchdowns in a single game since Tony Moeaki in 2009 (Michigan).

Rudock scampered six yards for a score early in the fourth period, and WR Damond Powell caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Beathard to close lowa's scoring.

TE Jake Duzey caught three passes for 110 yards, which is the highest single-game receiving yardage total by a Hawkeye this season.

SS John Lowdermilk and DE Nate Meier led lowa with seven tackles each. LB Josey Jewell made his first career start, collecting five stops.

The Hawkeyes dominated the time of possession, holding the ball for a season-high 35:46, while the Illini maintain possession for only 24:14.
lowa converted 10-of-15 (67 percent) third down attempts, while Illinois was 6-of-16 (38 percent) and was forced to punt eight times.

## GAME RECAP

Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon rushed for 200 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 14 Wisconsin to a 26-24 win over lowa in Kinnick Stadium. With the victory, the Badgers retain possession of the Heartland Trophy for the next year.

Both teams exchanged field goals in the first quarter before Wisconsin reeled-off 16 straight points in the second and third periods.

The Hawkeyes closed to within 19-17 with 11:10 remaining in the contest after a Kevonte Martin-Manley 20-yard touchdown reception and a Jake Rudock 3-yard scoring run. Jordan Canzeri converted a two-point conversion after Martin-Manley's reception, but the Hawkeyes failed to convert a second two-point conversion attempt following the Rudock score.

The Badgers answered with a Gordon 23 -yard touchdown run to increase their advantage to $26-17$ with 7:44 remaining. lowa quickly countered with a 7-play, 86 -yard drive in 2:43 that culminated with a Jake Duzey 9 -yard scoring reception to close within 26-24 with 5:01 remaining. Wisconsin then converted two first downs on its final drive to run out the clock.

Rudock accounted for three touchdowns, throwing for two (20 and nine yards) and rushing for another (three yards). He completed 20 -of- 30 passes for 311 yards, marking the third time in his career that he surpassed 300 yards passing.

Mark Weisman and Jordan Canzeri combined for 76 yards rushing on 20 carries. WR Tevaun Smith caught four passes for a game-high 78 yards, while Duzey had four catches for 72 yards and a score.

Wisconsin kicker Rafael Gaglianone made field goals of 50 and 22 yards, while lowa's Marshall Koehn converted his only attempt (22 yards).
lowa totaled 412 yards of total offense, the most yards Wisconsin's defense yielded through 11 games.

Wisconsin was 7 -of-13 on third downs and maintained possession for 33:24.

Eight different Hawkeye defenders accounted for lowa's seven tackles for loss. SS John Lowdermilk led the Hawkeyes in tackles (12) for the fourth consecutive game. FS Jordan Lomax had 10 stops, while CB Greg Mabin and Bo Bower each registered seven. The seven tackles for Bower are a career high.

## GAME RECAP

Nebraska rallied from a 17-point second-half deficit to upend lowa, 37-34, in overtime at Kinnick Stadium. With the victory, the Huskers reclaim possession of the Heroes Trophy for the next year.
lowa led 10-7 at halftime despite committing four turnovers, including two inside the red zone.

After a scoreless first period, SS John Lowdermilk returned an interception 17 yards for a touchdown and Marshall Koehn kicked a 22 -yard field goal in the second quarter. Nebraska got on the board when Ameer Abdullah caught a 5-yard TD pass from Tommy Armstrong Jr. with 20 seconds remaining in the first half.
lowa's lead grew to 24-7 after a 34-yard scoring strike from Jake Rudock to WR Tevaun Smith and a 12 -yard Drew Ott punt return after a Husker punt was deflected off the back of another Nebraska player midway through the third quarter.

The Huskers answered with three straight touchdowns to claim a 28-24 advantage early in the fourth quarter. Armstrong Jr., connected with Taariq Allen and Kenny Bell for touchdown passes of 34 and 32 yards, respectively, and De'Mornay Pierson-El returned a punt 80 yards.

Iowa's Jordan Canzeri caught a 5 -yard touchdown pass from Rudock with 1:49 left in regulation to put lowa ahead 31-28. However, Nebraska was able to even the score on a Drew Brown 30-yard field goal with eight seconds remaining to send the game into overtime.

Iowa went on offense first and was held to a Koehn 25-yard field goal. Nebraska then won the game on a WR Kenny Bell 9 -yard touchdown reception.

Rudock completed 19-of-38 passes for 230 yards and two touchdowns. Mark Weisman rushed 24 times for a team-high 82 yards, while Kevonte Martin-Manley led the Hawkeye receivers with six catches for 63 yards.

Nebraska's Armstrong Jr., threw four touchdowns and Pierson-El returned three punts for a combined 134 yards and a touchdown.

Iowa maintained possession for 37:36, compared to 22:24 for Nebraska. The Hawkeyes ran 88 total plays, which equaled a season high (Purdue).

DT Carl Davis had two tackles for loss and blocked a field goal in the senior's final home game.

## GAME RECAP

Tennessee scored the game's first 28 points en route to a 45-28 win over lowa at the TaxSlayer Bowl in Jacksonville, Florida.

RB Mark Weisman rushed for two scores, while QB C.J. Beathard threw for two touchdowns to account for lowa's scoring. Weisman scored on runs of three and one yard in the second and fourth quarters, respectively. The Hawkeye senior finished his career with 32 rushing touchdowns, one shy of the school record held by Sedrick Shaw and Tavian Banks.

Beathard connected with TE Ray Hamilton (31 yards) and WR Matt VandeBerg (18 yards) in the fourth period. Beathard finished the game completing 13 -of- 23 passes for 145 yards. The two passing touchdowns were a single-game career best.

WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught three passes for 23 yards. His third reception broke the school record for career catches by a Hawkeye with 174 . He finished his career with 1,799 career receiving yards, No. 13 all-time. The bowl game was the 51st career game for the Hawkeye senior; MartinManley joins five other players to play in 51 career games during the Kirk Ferentz era.

Jordan Canzeri led the Hawkeye ground attack, rushing 12 times for 120 yards -- his second career 100-yard game. His game totals pushed him over the 1,000 yards rushing, becoming the 45th lowa player to accomplish the feat.

LB Josey Jewell led all players with a career-best 14 tackles and was named lowa's TaxSlayer Bowl MVP. Jewell, a redshirt freshman, made his fourth career start. LB Quinton Alson (11) and CB Desmond King (10) also reached double-digits in tackles. CB Maurice Fleming (five) and LB Ben Niemann (four) recorded career bests in tackles.

CB Desmond King recorded his second career interception in the third quarter (37-yard return). lowa's defense has had at least one interception in six straight bowl games.
