#### **SCOUTING UNLV**

The UNLV Rebels opened their season with a 62-39 win over Butler in the first game of the Hawkeye Challenge. Butler limited the Rebels to just .370 (20-54) from the field, but UNLV held the Bulldogs to just a .283 (17-60) shooting percentage.

Sandrine Nzeukou led UNLV with 21 points and 15 rebounds. Kelli Thompson netted 16 points, while Mia Bell added 10.

The Rebels were picked to finish fifth in the Mountain West Conference and Jamie Smith was named a preseason All-Mountain West selection.

UNLV returns all five starters from last year's team that went 11-20 overall and 4-12 in league play.

Thompson led the team in scoring a year ago with 14.1 points per game. Next was Lenita Sanford at eight points per contest, followed by Smith at 7.6 per game.

#### HAWKEYES OPEN SEASON WITH WIN OVER HARVARD

lowa used a 53-point second half to race past Harvard, 90-81, Saturday night in the Hawkeye Challenge. Iowa shot .586 (17-29) from the field in the second half, including .455 (5-11) from three-point distance.

Three Hawkeyes scored in double figures, led by Jaime Printy. The junior netted a teamhigh 24 points, along with six rebounds and four assists. On her 21st birthday, Morgan Johnson added 18 points, eight rebounds and three blocks. Senior Kelly Krei chipped in 16 points (4-6 3Pt. FGs) and five rebounds.

#### SEASON OPENER NOTES

- lowa's 90 points Saturday night vs. Harvard are the most for a Hawkeye team in a season opener since scoring 90 against Howard in the 1989-90 season opener (Nov. 25, 1989...also in the Hawkeye Classic). The most points in a season opener came on Nov. 15, 1978 vs. Simpson (101).
- Saturday is only the third time in school history lowa has scored 90 or more points in a season opener.
- lowa is a perfect 12-0 in season openers under Head Coach Lisa Bluder. Saturday marked the ninth time in Bluder's 12 years that the Hawkeyes will open the season at home.
- Saturday was the fifth time since 2000, and the first since 2009, that the Hawkeye Challenge served as Iowa's season opener.

#### HAWKEYE CHALLENGE NOTE

lowa has won 20 of the previous 25 tournaments it has hosted, and holds an impressive 46-5 record in Hawkeye Challenge contests.

#### **IOWA IN THE RANKINGS**

The Hawkeyes are receiving votes in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today preseason Top 25.

Three Iowa opponents are also ranked in the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls: Penn State (12/14), Purdue (17/21) and St. John's (25/RV). Iowa could potentially face defending NCAA champion Texas A&M in the Junkanoo Jam over Thanksgiving. The Aggies are ranked sixth in both polls.

In addition, Ohio State, MIchigan State, Iowa State and Kansas State are receiving votes.

#### LAST YEAR IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes spent 14 weeks ranked in the Associated Press poll and 13 weeks in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll last season. The last time lowa appeared in either poll for 13 or more weeks was 1995-96 (18 weeks in both polls). Iowa finished the season ranked No. 25 in the AP poll and receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

lowa's No. 14 ranking in the Associated Press poll was the highest ranking for a Hawkeye team under Head Coach Lisa Bluder and the highest since Nov. 17, 1997 (11th). Bluder led lowa to a No. 16 ranking in the AP poll in 2001.

The No. 13 ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll ranking was also the highest under Bluder (previous high was No. 17 in 2005). The No. 13 ranking was the highest lowa has been ranked in the coaches poll since a No. 12 preseason ranking in 1997.

#### HAWKEYES PICKED TO FINISH THIRD

The lowa women's basketball team was picked to finish third by both the league coaches and media. Penn State was chosen as the favorite in both polls.

Junior Jaime Printy was a preseason all-Big Ten selection by both the league media and coaches.

#### **PRINTY NAMED TO WATCH LISTS**

Junior Jaime Printy has been named to both the "Wade Watch" and Wooden Award Watch Lists. The "Wade Watch" List is made up of the top 25 preseason women's basketball players while the Wooden Award includes 30 student-athletes.

The Wade Trophy and Wooden Award are considered the two most prestigious awards in NCAA women's college basketball.

#### **PRINTY NOTES FROM LAST SEASON**

- Became the youngest player in school history to earn All-America honors, taking home Associated Press honorable mention accolades as a sophomore. She is the only returning All-American in the Big Ten this season.
- Became the first player in school history to reach the 1,000 career point milestone as a sophomore.
- Earned second team All-Big Ten honors by the coaches and was a third team pick by the media.
- One of eight Hawkeyes named Academic All-Big Ten.
- Named Big Ten Player of the Week once.
- Started all 31 games and led the Hawkeyes with 16.8 points per game.
- Tied school record for free throw percentage in a single game (10-10, 1.000 vs. Indiana), three-pointers attempted in a single game (15 vs. Michigan) and three-pointers made in an NCAA Tournament game (5 vs. Gonzaga).

## Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her 12th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 28th season as a college head coach. She is a three-time Big Ten and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year.

Bluder, 48, has a career record of 568-274 (.675), including a 212-132 (.616) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose.



Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to 10 post-season tournaments (8 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and eight upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference, including winning a share of the league championship in 2008 and tying for second place in 2009.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the *Women's Basketball News Service* and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to their first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and was the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

#### **AWARD WINNERS RETURNING**

- Jaime Printy was named honorable mention All-America by the Associated Press. She was also a second team All-Big Ten selection by the coaches and a third team pick by the media. She was also named Big Ten Player of the Week once.
- Kamille Wahlin was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the league coaches and media. Wahlin was named a National Strength and Conditioning Association All-American. She also earned all-tournament honors at the Islander Tip-Off Tournament and the Caribbean Challenge.
- Morgan Johnson was named the KCRG-TV9 All-Tournament team.

#### SUCCESS UNDER BLUDER

Last season marked the eighth time in 11 seasons under head coach Lisa Bluder that lowa has been selected for the NCAA Tournament, including each of the last four seasons. The Hawkeyes have participated in postseason play in all but one season under Bluder (two WNIT appearances).

In addition, lowa finished with a winning record for the 10th time in 11 seasons under Bluder. lowa's tie for third place in the Big Ten is also the eighth time, under Bluder, the Hawkeyes recorded an upper-division finish in the conference.

Iowa also tallied its sixth 20-win season under Bluder, including each of the last four seasons.

#### JUMP IN ATTENDANCE LAST SEASON

The University of Iowa had the second-largest increase in attendance from the previous season among Division I women's basketball programs, according to data released by the NCAA. Lisa Bluder's squad also finished the 2010-11 season ranked 13th nationally in average attendance, the highest ranking since the 1997-98 season when the UI ranked ninth.

lowa jumped from an average of 3,488 fans during the 2009-10 season to 5,823 fans for the 2010-11 season, a boost of 2,335 fans. Louisville was the only other school to see a larger increase, adding 4,462 fans.

lowa's total attendance figure of 81,528 is the third-highest in school history, while the average of 5,823 is the fourth best in school history.

lowa's top crowd of the season came on Jan. 8 vs. Ohio State, when 9,865 fans saw the Hawkeyes knock off the 20th-ranked Buckeyes. That crowd was the 11th-largest single-game crowd in women's basketball history.

#### **MOVING UP CAREER CHARTS**

Four Hawkeyes are currently working their way up the career records lists at Iowa.

- Kamille Wahlin ranks fourth in career three-pointers made (169), 11th in career assists (310) and 25th in career scoring (1,093). She needs 17 more three-pointers to move past Kristi Smith into third place, 13 more assists to move past Lisa Anderson for 10th place and eight more points to move into 23rd place.
- Morgan Johnson ranks second in career blocks (158) and needs 78 more to move past Tangela Smith for first place.
- Jaime Printy ranks sixth in career three-pointers made (154) and 28th in career scoring (1,045). She needs three more three-pointers to move past Leah Magner for fifth place and four more points to move into 26th place.
- Kelly Krei ranks ninth in career three-pointers made (120) and needs six more to move past Johanna Solverson into eighth place.

#### **NEW HAWKEYES RANK HIGH**

lowa's freshmen class was tabbed as the 11th best recruiting class of 2011 by ESPNHoop-Gurlz.com. The class includes five players, one at each position.

Included in the class is guard Samantha Logic, who is the third McDonald's High School All-American to commit to the University of Iowa under Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

#### **TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 11-12**

The Hawkeyes are scheduled to face 14 teams who advanced to postseason play a year ago, including 10 NCAA Tournament teams.

lowa will play six non-conference games on the road, with two of those matchups coming in the Bahamas at the Junkanoo Jam. lowa will face St. John's in the first round and could potentially play the defending NCAA national champions in Texas A&M in the final game.

#### **WELCOME TO THE BIG TEN**

Nebraska, the newest member of the Big Ten Conference, and Iowa have played 11 times since 1977. Iowa leads the all-time series, 7-4.

The Hawkeyes won the last meeting, 71-67 in Lincoln March 21, 2005 in WNIT second round action.

#### TWO PLAYERS OUT FOR THE SEASON

Senior Megan Considine and sophomore Jade Rogers will both miss the entire 2011-12 season.

Considine suffered a torn Achillies tendon during preseason workouts. Rogers had surgery to repair an injured knee.

#### **PLENTY OF NATIONAL EXPOSURE**

The Hawkeyes will make a total of 25 appearances on ESPN2, BTN, FSN, Mediacom or BTN. com.

lowa will appear in HD on BTN six times during the conference season, will make one appearance on ESPN2 (at Penn State) and will have one game on FSN Kansas City (at Kansas State).

Six games (four home contests) will be televised on Mediacom, while 13 games are slated for BTN.com webstreams. All four Mediacom games at home will also be streamed via BTN.com.

lowa's final two games of the season will either be televised on BTN or streamed at BTN. com. Those decisions will be made at a later date.

#### **PERFECT 3-0 ON FOREIGN TOUR**

The Hawkeyes spent 12 days (Aug. 8-20) on a foreign tour, visiting Prague, Bratislava, Vienna and Paris. Iowa played three exhibition games against European club teams and left with a perfect 3-0 mark.

lowa's first game came against BC Strakonice in the Czech Republic. The game was tied with 20 seconds left, but Samantha Logic hit a pull-up jumper in the lane with five seconds remaining for the win. Logic finished with 11 points and 14 rebounds.

Next was a game against BKZ Levice in Slovakia. Morgan Johnson led Iowa with 25 points in a 90-53 victory.

The third and final game was played in France against BC Franconville. Six players scored double figures en route to a 109-63 win.

Morgan Johnson led the team in scoring during the European tour with 15 points per game on 19-36 (.528) shooting. Jaime Printy averaged 13 points and Kelly Krei had 11.3 points per game. Krei shot 12-20 (.600) from the field and .615 (8-13) from three-point distance. As a team, the Hawkeye averaged 91.3 points per game.

Logic averaged a double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds per contest and Kamille Wahlin registered 17 assists with just two turnovers.
