BIG TEN CO-CHAMPS

Solverson's 31 lead Hawks past Badgers for share of title

MADISON, Wis. — Two years of painstaking rehabilitation was all worth it for Iowa sixth-year senior Johanna "Grandma" Solverson.

Solverson saved her best game as a Hawkeye for her last regular-season contest, scoring a career-high 31 points — 23 in the first half — as Iowa captured its first Big Ten regular-season title in a decade with an 87-78 victory over Wisconsin on Sunday afternoon before a crowd of 13,320 at the Kohl Center.

Iowa (20-9 overall), which won its last regular-season championship in 1998 and was picked to finish seventh by the coaches and fifth by the media in the preseason, tied Ohio State for the championship with a 13-5 record.

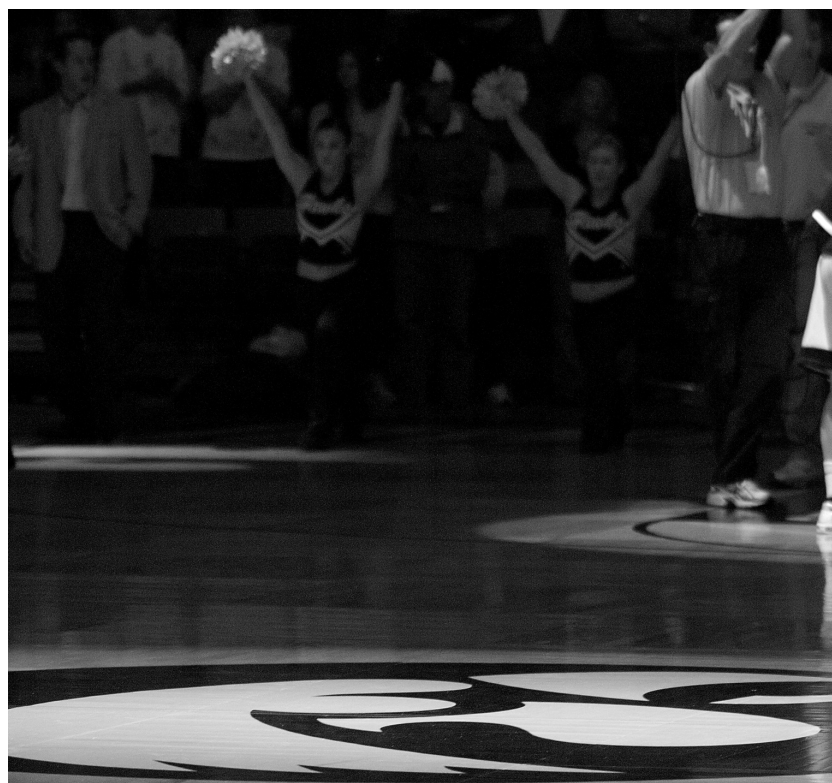

- Kristi Smith made 53 three-pointers, which is the third-most ever by an Iowa junior
- Kristi Smith amassed over 400 points and 100 assists the last two seasons; she had 425 points and 103 assists her junior campaign and 402 points and 124 assists her sophomore season
- Kristi Smith's 425 points is a single-season best and ranks 31st-best in Iowa single-season history
- JoAnn Hamlin blocked 23 shots, which is the fourth-most ever by an Iowa sophomore
- Three players (Megan Skouby, Kristi Smith and Johanna Solverson) amassed over 1,000 career points during the year, marking the first time in school history three players reached the 1,000-point plateau in the same season.
- Johanna Solverson scored the second-most points by an Iowa women's basketball player in a half when she poured in 23 during the first 20 minutes at Wisconsin
- Kristi Smith netted 15 points, or more, a team-best 14 times and topped the 20-point plateau a team-best four times
- Kristi Smith finished her junior year ranked sixth in Iowa career three-pointers, ninth in assists and 24th in scoring
- Johanna Solverson finished her career ranked third in assists, fifth in three-pointers, seventh in steals, 13th in rebounding and 18th in scoring at Iowa
- Krista VandeVenter finished her career ranked sixth in Iowa career rebounding, 15th in steals and 16th in assists
- Megan Skouby finished her junior year ranked fourth in Iowa career rebounding and 21st in scoring

Individual Accomplishments

- Junior Wendy Ausdemore ranked third nationally in three-point field goal percentage (78-171, .456); she attempted 23 more triples than the top-ranked player
- Wendy Ausdemore's three-point field goal percentage (.456, 78-171) ranks third-best in Iowa single-season history, but ranks first among former Hawkeyes who had 100 attempts or more
- Wendy Ausdemore made 78 three-pointers, which are the second-most in a single-season at Iowa and the most ever by an Iowa junior
- Wendy Ausdemore tied her own Carver-Hawkeye Arena record (by an Iowa player), draining six three-pointers vs. Purdue
- Wendy Ausdemore finished her junior season ranked second in career three-pointers at Iowa with 160; she is 101 away from career-leader Lindsey Meder (261)
- Senior Johanna Solverson is only the second Iowa player ever to amass over 1,000 points, 550 rebounds, 350 assists and 175 steals (Franthea Price)
- Megan Skouby blocked 23 shots, which is the fifth-most ever by an Iowa junior





Team Accomplishments

- Won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship, Iowa's first regular season title since 1998. Iowa has nine Big Ten regular season titles, the second-most in the conference.
- Iowa made 116 triples during conference play, the most ever by a Big Ten team.
- Iowa was 13-3 in home games, including 8-1 during league play.
- Iowa defeated every Big Ten team at least once, except Ohio State
- After starting the season 9-7, Iowa concluded the regular season 11-2, including winning eight straight games during conference play. The eight-game winning streak was the longest by any Big Ten team. The last time Iowa won eight straight conference games was during the 1995-96 season.
- Iowa won 21 games, marking the 14th time in 34 seasons a Hawkeye team eclipsed 20 wins, including the third time during Coach Bluder's eight-year tenure.
- Broke the school record for field goal percentage in a half (17-23, .739) at Wisconsin.
- Broke the school record for consecutive three-pointers made in a single-game (7) vs. Minnesota.
- Broke the school's NCAA Tournament record for most three-point attempts in a single-game (22) vs. Georgia.
- Tied the school's NCAA Tournament record for most three-pointers made in a single-game (9) vs. Georgia.
- Ranked seventh in the country in three-point accuracy (197-506, .389), 29th in assists (15.7) and 39th in assist/turnover ratio (0.93)
- Iowa's three-point field goal percentage (.389, 197-506) ranks third-best in Iowa single-season history, but ranks first among past seasons that had 400 attempts or more.

- Iowa's free throw percentage (.733, 373-509) ranks sixth-best in Iowa single-season history.
- Iowa was 5-0 in league games decided by five points or fewer.
- Iowa held Michigan to only 37 points, which is the fewest scored in Big Ten Tournament history.
- Iowa made 197 three-pointers, the second-most in school history (199 during the 2001-02 season).
- Last year, Iowa ranked last in Big Ten scoring defense (71.7), field goal percentage defense (.447) and three-point field goal percentage defense (.347). The 2008 Hawkeyes ranked first in three-point field goal percentage defense (.292), second in field goal percentage defense (.441) and fifth in scoring defense (60.2).
- The Hawkeyes ranked in the top three in 11 Big Ten statistical categories.
- Iowa won five Big Ten Conference road games this season, the most by any league team.
- Iowa received an at-large berth to its 17th NCAA Tournament. Iowa has advanced to post-season play seven of the eight years during Coach Bluder's tenure, including five NCAA Tournament appearances. Bluder has guided the Black and Gold to five Big Ten first division finishes.
- Iowa had seven different players lead the team in scoring at least once.
- Iowa's 44-point win over Northern Illinois tied the program's 17th-largest margin of victory.
- Iowa reached the Big Ten Tournament semifinals for the sixth time since the tournament began in 1995.
- Iowa received votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches poll the six weeks of the season.

Game 1

Iowa 61, Dartmouth 43

Nov. 11, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- Three University of Iowa players scored in double figures and all 13 Hawkeyes played at least two minutes during a season-opening 61-43 victory against Dartmouth at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

With just over 10 minutes to play, Iowa senior Johanna Solverson did her best to point Dartmouth back home to New Hampshire with a loss. Solverson used an assist by Abby Emmert and sank a 3-pointer to give Iowa a 46-35 lead. On the next trip down the court (and following one of 18 Big Green turnovers), Solverson hit another trey, with an assist from Kristi Smith. Solverson then played a major role in forcing another turnover before feeding Krista VandeVenter with an assist at the 8:54 mark giving the Black and Gold their largest lead to that point at 51-35.

All 13 first-half field goals by Iowa were assisted and for the game the Hawkeyes made 25 field goals with 22 assists.

Juniors Wendy Ausdemore and Smith led the Hawkeyes in scoring with 12 points and VandeVenter added 11. Ausdemore was 4-7 from 3-point range and Smith handed out seven assists.

Dartmouth took a 15-9 lead with 13:02 left in the first half before Iowa went on a 14-0 run over the next 6:10. The closest the Big Green got in the second half was six points at 39-33.

Bluder was disappointed with the final rebounding figures that showed Dartmouth with an edge, 40-37, including 20 offensive boards. Bluder noted that the Big Green scored just nine points off those 20 rebounds. Meanwhile, the Hawkeyes posted 28 points off turnovers and held huge advantages with 28 points in the paint (to Dartmouth's 10) and bench points (22-9).

Kachine Alexander was the leading rebounder for Iowa with six in 13 minutes. Jenée Graham and VandeVenter both had five. Graham, Smith and Ausdemore all had two steals.

Game 2

Iowa 62, Drake 50

Nov. 13, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- Scoring runs and droughts told the story as the University of Iowa women's basketball team defeated Drake 62-50 at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The game began with a 9-2 Hawkeye run engineered by Megan Skouby, who scored six points in the first five minutes. Drake quickly responded with a run of its own by turning up the defense and holding Iowa scoreless for a five-minute span in the first half. Jordann Plummer led the charge for the Bulldogs, making two steals and converting them into two layups giving Drake a 17-16 lead.

The Bulldogs then fell victim to a three-minute drought of their own, resulting in a quick 8-0 run for the Hawkeyes to give Iowa a 24-17 advantage. After Drake's Ashleigh Brady made four straight points to cut the lead to 24-21, Iowa brought Skouby back from the bench to spark a late first-half run. Skouby scored her 10th point of the game and blocked a shot during the last two minutes of the half, resulting in a 28-21 lead for Iowa.

Iowa's Wendy Ausdemore started the second half with a three-pointer that put the Hawkeyes up, 31-21. She finished the game with 11 points and four assists.

Skouby continued to dominate in the second half, completing a three point play with 15:18 remaining to give the Hawkeyes a 41-29 lead. Drake was successful in slicing the margin to single digits with 2:15 left in the game when Jill Martin hit a three-pointer, making it 57-49. But it was Skouby down the stretch shooting 9-of-15 from the floor and scoring 19 points to lead Iowa to victory. She also had a game-high four blocked shots.

The Hawkeye defense held the Bulldogs to 26 percent shooting from the floor on the evening (16-61).

Leading rebounders for Iowa were Jenée Graham with eight and Krista VandeVenter with seven.

Game 3

Iowa 77, Northern Iowa 67

Nov. 18, 2007, McLeod Center

CEDAR FALLS, IA - Nothing good in life comes easy. Neither do victories on the basketball court over intrastate rivals. Just ask Lisa Bluder, head coach of the Iowa Hawkeyes, whose team scratched and clawed their way to a hard-fought 77-67 victory over Northern Iowa in the McLeod Center.

With 14:32 left to play, Iowa's lead over the Panthers reached double-digits for the first time at 53-42. Not so fast my friend! The home team went on a 24-12 run giving UNI a brief 66-65 lead with 6:30 remaining.

Iowa reclaimed the lead for keeps less than a minute later when Wendy Ausdemore sank a pair of free-throws. From there, Iowa's defense took over, forcing the Panthers into 11 straight missed field goal opportunities.

Johanna Solverson led Iowa with 17 points. Three other Hawkeyes - Megan Skouby (13 points), Stacy Schlapkohl (12) and Kristi Smith (11) - also scored in double digits for an Iowa team that shot better than 51 percent from the field while limiting the home team to just 37 percent success.

Iowa also blistered the nets from the free throw line, knocking down 27 of 31 attempts - a success rate of better than 87 percent.

Solverson also paced the Hawkeyes on the boards, grabbing nine. And, she was the difference for the visiting team in the first 30 minutes. She led Iowa with 11 points - nine coming from behind the arc - as the Hawkeyes rode her hot hand to a 44-38 lead heading into intermission. Skouby chipped in eight points and Smith seven during the first 20 minutes.

Iowa used a 16-10 advantage on the boards to scored eight second-chance points during the first stanza. That success helped to overcome nine turnovers. Iowa's defense was solid, however, forcing eight UNI turnovers and limiting the home team to just six of 15 shooting from behind the arc.

Iowa's victory avenged an 83-62 route Northern Iowa handed the Hawkeyes last December in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa 60, Mississippi State 54

Nov. 22, 2007, Moon Palace Resort

CANCUN, MEXICO - A strong rebounding and free throw performance helped propel the Iowa women's basketball team to a 60-54 victory over Mississippi State at the Caribbean Challenge.

The Lady Bulldogs entered the game boasting a +9.8 rebounding advantage and averaging 75.5 points through its first four game games. The Hawkeyes' stingy defense held Mississippi State to 54 points and out-rebounded the Lady Bulldogs by a staggering 18 (39-21).

Iowa took a 25-21 halftime advantage, leading for most of the first 20 minutes. The Hawkeyes made all 10 free throw attempts in the first stanza. Iowa would finish the contest 14-17 (.824) from the foul line.

The Hawkeyes built a 12-point (43-31) lead with 11:30 left in regulation, but the Lady Bulldogs went on a 13-2 run to cut Iowa's advantage to only one (45-44) at the eight-minute media timeout.

Leading by one, Iowa made three 3-pointers and a layup on four consecutive trips down the floor to go on an 11-2 run, reestablishing a nine-point lead (56-47) with 4:30 left.

Ausdemore finished the contest with her second career double-double, 17 points and 10 rebounds. The junior was 6-11 from the field, including 5-8 from behind the arc.

Mississippi State missed its last three field goal attempts as Iowa held on for the win. The Lady Bulldogs were plagued by poor shooting, making only 36 percent from the field (21-58), including 16 percent (3-19) from 3-point range, and a dismal 45 percent (9-20) from the charity stripe.

Junior Kristi Smith shared game-high scoring honors with Ausdemore, netting 17 points. Smith also dished out a game-best seven assists.

Ausdemore and Smith were the only Hawkeye sharp-shooters to attempt a triple, but the duo combined for 8-13 shooting for a team-season-best 62 percent behind the arc.

With the game tied (58-58), Arizona State inbounded the ball with nine seconds left. The Sun Devils found center Kirsten Thompson alone in the low post, who made the go-ahead lay-up with three seconds on the clock. Iowa had one last chance to tie the game. Johanna Solverson lobbed a perfect three-quarter court pass from under Iowa's basket to Wendy Ausdemore, who handed the ball to Kristi Smith, but lost control of the ball on the way to the basket and was unable to get a shot attempt as time expired.

Smith was the only Hawkeye in double figures, as the junior scored 12 of her team-high 18 points in the first half. Megan Skouby tallied nine points and senior Johanna Solverson added seven.

Iowa led for a majority of the second half and led by as many as seven with nine minutes remaining. The Hawkeyes led by five at the six-minute mark, but the Sun Devils went on a 10-run, bolstered by back-to-back 3-point field goals, to grab a five-point (58-53) margin with two minutes left.

Down by four with one minute remaining, Iowa rallied to even the contest (58-58) on a pair of Krista VandeVenter free throws and a Smith spinning fast break lay-up around a Sun Devil defender with 29 seconds left.

Arizona State's Lauren Lacey led all scorers with 19 points. Sybil Dosty contributed 12 points off the bench, while Briann January had 11 for the Sun Devils.

The Sun Devils shot 55.8 percent (24-43) from the field, including 50 percent (5-10) from behind the arc. Iowa shot 50 percent (23-46) from the field, but only made 2-5 (.400) from 3-point range.

The Hawkeyes closed the half on a 13-0 surge, capped by a Smith 12-foot fall-away jumper at the buzzer to give Iowa a one-point (28-27) halftime edge.

Georgia Tech 76, Iowa 57

Nov. 28, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- It took more than a special performance to outduel University of Iowa's Wendy Ausdemore. In fact, it took two spectacular efforts by Chioma Nnamaka and Janie Mitchell to carry Georgia Tech to a deceptively lopsided 76-57 women's basketball victory inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The game was part of the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

Ausdemore made all seven of her second-half field goal attempts, including all three three-point attempts, to score 18 points over the final 20 minutes. Ausdemore scored nine consecutive points from the 16:37 mark to the 14:24 mark. Her 10-foot jumper off a drive to through the middle of the lane tied the game at 40. Following a technical foul on Georgia Tech Coach MaChelle Joseph, Iowa's Megan Skouby made both free throws, giving the Hawkeyes their first lead (42-40) since 9:19 remained in the first half.

Krista VandeVenter had eight rebounds and two assists for the Hawkeyes. Skouby added seven points with a blocked shot.

AMES, IA -- It took the University of Iowa women's basketball team a half to warm up, but by the time the Hawkeyes got in a groove, it was too little, too late during a 58-44 loss to Iowa State in front of 12,931 inside Hilton Coliseum.

Iowa "won" the final 20 minutes, 31-30, but it was little consolation after digging a 15-point hole in the first half. It is the sixth consecutive win in the series for the Cyclones in Ames.

Wendy Ausdemore led the Hawkeyes with 16 points and she also contributed five rebounds. Kristi Smith scored all of her 14 points in the second half. Megan Skouby was also in double figures with 10 points and a team-high seven rebounds.

Iowa 87, Northern Illinois 43

Dec. 8, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY – The University of Iowa women's basketball team defeated Northern Illinois, 87-43, in the first round of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

The Hawkeyes had five players score in double figures, led by Lindsey Nyenhuis with 14. All 13 players saw nine minutes or more of playing time and Abby Emmert was the lone Iowa player to exceed 20 court minutes (23). Twelve Hawkeyes scored and 12 had at least one assist.

The point total for Iowa is the most in 10 games, dating back to a 103-93 win against Wisconsin, Feb. 25, 2007.

The slow start that plagued Iowa during a 58-44 loss at Iowa State three days earlier faded into the distance as the Hawkeyes scored the first 10 points against Northern Illinois and led 41-17 at halftime. Megan Skouby's field goal with 6-minutes, 22-seconds remaining gave Iowa its largest advantage of the game at 46 points (79-33).

The Iowa bench outscored all of the Huskies combined, 49-43. Twenty-three of the UI's 35 field goals were assisted (Emmert had a team-high 5). The Hawkeyes forced 23 turnovers and shot an eye-popping 58.3 percent from the field (35-60) and an even more impressive 62.5 percent from three-point range (10-16).

Graham, who missed the last three games with a broken bone in her hand, played 12 minutes with four points, three rebounds and two assists.

Iowa won the turnover battle 23-12 and out-scored Northern Illinois 29-4 on points off turnovers.

#21 Wyoming 54, Iowa 50

Dec. 9, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- The Iowa Hawkeyes stormed back in the second half and held a 47-45 lead with 2:30 minutes remaining before losing to No. 21 Wyoming 54-50 in the championship of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes trailed 28-18 at halftime after Wyoming went on a 15-2 run over the final six minutes before intermission. Iowa scored the first six points of the game and was ahead 16-13 with 6-minutes, 11-seconds left before halftime.

After clawing to a 47-43 lead with 4:03 left in the game, Iowa again watched as the Cowgirls rallied to outscore the Hawkeyes 11-3 the rest of the way and hold on for a four-point victory.

Iowa's Megan Skouby scored a game-high 15 points off the bench on 7 of 11 shooting from the field. She was the lone Hawkeye in double figures. Kristi Smith scored nine points and Wendy Ausdemore added eight -- all which came in the second half. Skouby and Ausdemore both scored eight points over the final 20 minutes and Smith added seven. That accounted for 23 of Iowa's 32 points in the second half.

JoAnn Hamlin led the Hawkeyes with six rebounds. Iowa, which made 10 treys during a win against Northern Illinois the previous day, was 3-10 from behind the arc. Wyoming shot the same percentage from long range, but the Cowgirls attempted twice as many three's (6-20).

The Hawkeyes made 21-53 field goals (39.6 percent). Both teams committed 13 turnovers, but the Cowgirls scored 15 points off turnovers (compared to nine for Iowa) and outscored the Hawkeyes 4-0 on fast break points.

Wyoming won two games at Big Ten arenas this season. The Cowgirls defeated Wisconsin 67-66 in overtime on Nov. 20.

IOWA CITY – There was freezing rain outside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, but inside it was raining three's -- most of them from the hand of Wendy Ausdemore -- as the Hawkeyes defeated Western Illinois 70-49 in non-conference women's basketball.

Ausdemore made 5-8 from long distance in the game and finished with a game-high 19 points, with all of her scoring coming in the first half.

Bluder said earlier in the week that she wasn't too concerned about her team's lack of offense thus far this season. The first half was evidence of that confidence. The home team enjoyed its most productive 20 minutes of the 2007-08 campaign.

The Hawkeyes carried a 41-29 lead into the locker room thanks to white-hot shooting from the field paced by Ausdemore. Iowa was good on 14 of its 28 field goal attempts, a total that included six three pointers. Ausdemore made 5-6 from behind the arc and 7-8 field goals to lead all scorers with 19 points. Stacy Schlapkohl was perfect on all three of her field goal attempts and added eight points to the Hawkeyes' total while Smith chipped in five and a team-high six assists.

Iowa outscored the Westerwinds 16-4 in the stanza's final 4:27 to break open a game that had see-sawed through the first 15 minutes with neither team opening up anything more than a four-point margin. Six points by Schlapkohl and 3-point buckets by Ausdemore and Johanna Solverson - hers with two seconds left to play - provided Iowa its cushion.

Western Illinois pushed Iowa in the first half, but the Hawkeyes moved the ball well during the final 20 minutes, taking better care of the ball (five turnovers) and doing a more dominate job on the glass (22 rebounds in the second half, including seven on the offensive end).

Hawkeye reserves scored 20 points compared to just 10 bench points by the Westerwinds. Iowa also scored 14 fast-break points and 10 second-half points.

Game 12

Iowa 67, Penn State 58

Dec. 28, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY – Two huge second-half plays by Krista VandeVenter helped the Hawkeyes to a conference-opening 67-58 victory over Penn State in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

With 17:25 left and the shot clock ticking toward zero, VandeVenter calmly lofted a 25-footer that found nothing but net and gave the Hawkeyes a 41-27 lead. Then, with 4:45 remaining and the Lady Lions within eight points (55-47), Penn State's Brianne O'Rourke raced up court with an apparent fast break, but VandeVenter held her ground defensively and drew a charging foul.

Although VandeVenter's heroics came at opportune moments, this was far from a one-player performance by the Hawkeyes. Kristi Smith poured in a game-high 19 points and Johanna Solverson added 16. Smith (3-7) and Solverson (2-7) combined to make 5-14 from 3-point range. VandeVenter chipped in with eight points, 12 rebounds and three steals. JoAnn Hamlin also added eight points for Iowa.

The Hawkeye defense played well, holding Penn State to 33.3 percent shooting from the field (18-54).

Iowa grabbed 23 rebounds in the second half -- 11 on the offensive end. For the game the Hawkeyes shot 36.9 percent (24-65) from the field.

Iowa forced 17 first-half turnovers and sprinted to a 34-24 halftime advantage. VandeVenter and Solverson benefitted most from the Lady Lion miscues, swiping three steals apiece. Smith added two steals.

Iowa attempted 12 more field goals than Penn State during the first 20 minutes (39-27) and had a 10-point cushion despite being out-rebounded 26-19. But the most telling statistic in the early going was in the turnover category, where the Hawkeyes were plus-11.

Michigan 63, Iowa 46

ANN ARBOR, MI – A two-point Iowa halftime lead disappeared and Michigan heated up from the field during the final 20 minutes as the Wolverines posted a 63-46 victory inside Crisler Arena, Dec. 30, 2007.

Wendy Ausdemore gave Iowa a 2-0 lead off an assist from Kristi Smith just 12 seconds into the game. The Hawkeyes were then forced into come-back mode and overcame two five-point deficits. Iowa drew even at 11-11 with 11:09 left in the half when Krista VandeVenter sank a field goal.

With 7:40 left in the half, Ausdemore made a 3-pointer, pulling the Black and Gold within one point (15-14). Prior to that field goal, Ausdemore had uncharacteristically misfired on her previous eight attempts from long distance.

Stacy Schlapkohl gave the Hawkeyes their first lead since the early-going with a traditional 3-point play at the 7:01 mark, making it 17-16. Another field goal by Schlapkohl tied the game (19-19) before Iowa went on its most consistent run of the game. A jumper by VandeVenter and a triple by Solverson gave the Hawkeyes a five-point edge (24-19) with 3:50 left before halftime.

Iowa took a two-point advantage (26-24) into halftime. The Hawkeye interior defense was strong, forcing the Wolverines to take 15 of their 27 shots from 3-point range. Iowa shot 47.8 percent from the field (11-23), led by Schlapkohl with seven points (3-5 FG, 1-1 FT).

The Black and Gold were haunted by a 6:23 scoring drought in the second half. Ausdemore drained a trey with 11:01 remaining, which cut Michigan's lead to four. The Hawkeyes would not score again until VandeVenter made a field goal with 4:38 left, but by that time Iowa was in a 14-point hole (56-42).

It was a solid performance by Hawkeye posts VandeVenter (14 points, nine rebounds) and Schlapkohl (11 points, four rebounds). Michigan shot 58.3 percent from the field in the second half (14-24), while Iowa made just 8-38 field goal attempts (21.1 percent) over the final 20 minutes.

Iowa 68, Minnesota 66 (OT)

Jan 3, 2008, Williams Arena

MINNEAPOLIS, MN – Krista VandeVenter was successful on a field goal attempt from 15 feet with 13 seconds remaining in overtime to give Iowa a 68-66 win over Minnesota inside Williams Arena.

VandeVenter's game-winner came off an assist by Kristi Smith (her seventh of the game). It was a sloppy extra five-minute frame, with the Hawkeyes out-scoring the Golden Gophers 4-2. Smith made two free throws with 58 seconds remaining for the first points for either team in the extra stanza. Minnesota couldn't convert on a final field goal attempt by Brittany McCoy as the buzzer sounded.

Iowa's Wendy Ausdemore appears to have broken out of a mini shooting slump, making 6-8 field goals (4-6 behind the arc) for 16 points. She also grabbed a team-high five rebounds. Johanna Solverson, who scored 12 first-half points, matched Ausdemore with 16 points. She was 6-10 from the field with three three-point goals and four rebounds. Three other Hawkeyes scored in double figures -- Smith with 13 and VandeVenter and Stacy Schlapkohl with 10 points apiece.

Iowa attempted 12 fewer field goals than the Gophers (65-53), but the Hawkeyes converted 27 times (50.9 percent).

Solverson's hot hand allowed the Hawkeyes to grab a 36-33 lead at halftime. She made all four of her field goal attempts, including 3-3 from beyond the 3-point arc. As a team Iowa made 15-28 field goals (53.6 percent) and grabbed six steals.

The Hawkeyes had two leads of nine points in the early going. The first came at the 9:23 mark when VandeVenter converted a conventional 3-point play that gave Iowa a 22-13 advantage. Ausdemore, who was attracting substantial defensive pressure, made it 24-15 with a turn-around jumper off a VandeVenter assist with 8:43 to play in the half.

Minnesota clawed back and went on an 11-2 run during a 2:25 span late in the half and the Gophers took a 31-30 lead with 2:57 remaining before the break. VandeVenter then completed her second conventional three-point play to put the Hawkeyes in front 33-31. The third three-pointer by Solverson with 1:13 left broke a 33-33 tie and gave Iowa an edge heading into the break.

#20 Ohio State 73, Iowa 65

Jan. 6, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY – The Ohio State Buckeyes used inside scoring and full-court pressure to sneak out of Carver-Hawkeye Arena with a 73-65 victory.

Kristi Smith had a strong performance scoring 20 points on 7-14 shooting, including 3-6 behind the arc. But it was the Buckeye's Ashlee Trebilcock who had a career-high 25 points coming on 9-14 shooting.

Ohio State came out firing using inside scoring and layups to take a 15-4 lead during the first five minutes of play. Smith single-handedly brought the Hawkeyes back scoring 10 straight points, including three free throws and a three-point basket to cut the Buckeye lead to 22-16. Smith finished the half with 17 of Iowa's 29 points and shot 6-of-8 from the field.

Jenee Graham then made two free-throws to trim the lead to 22-18, the narrowest of the first half. But Ohio State continued its pressure and hot shooting to increase the lead. The Buckeyes shot 61.3-percent for the half making 19-31 from the field, ending the first half on a 24-11 run increasing their lead 46-29.

Iowa used a 10-2 run during the first four minutes of the second half fueled by a 3-point basket by Smith to cut the Buckeye lead to 50-39. The Hawkeyes and the Buckeyes then traded baskets until Iowa's Wendy Ausdemore and Johanna Solverson began to heat up. Ausdemore scored all of her 10 points in the second half, including two three-pointers while Solverson chipped in six points on three lay-ins to cut the Ohio State lead to four with 3:18 to go in the game.

Ohio State then stiffened up its defense and started feeding the ball inside, resulting in Iowa fouls and made free throws for the Buckeyes as they maintained their lead.

Iowa's Megan Skouby added four-straight points and Ausdemore added two more to cut the Ohio State lead to 69-65 but four-straight free-throws by Ohio State's Marscilla Packer sealed the game for the Buckeyes 73-65.

Michigan State 73, Iowa 65

EAST LANSING, MI – A tale of two halves was the story as the University of Iowa fell to Michigan State 73-65. Leading scorer Kristi Smith had a strong performance leading all players with 23 points on 7-11 shooting, including 4-8 from behind the arc, but couldn't save a 13-point lead.

Iowa's Johanna Solverson had a double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds. She also added five assists before fouling out late in the second half.

Michigan State took a 9-4 lead behind a strong inside hook shot by Allyssa DeHaan. DeHaan later picked up her second foul and was taken out of the game at the 12:08 mark of the first half.

Iowa then went on a 14-4 run fueled by Smith with two 3-pointers to lead 18-13. Smith shot a perfect 5-5 from the field including 3-3 from behind the 3-point line to score 13 first-half points.

It was Iowa's offensive efficiency and hot shooting by Smith, Solverson and Schlapkohl that resulted in a 13-point lead 35-22 at the half.

Michigan State began the second half with an 11-4 run to cut Iowa's lead to 39-33 during the first four minutes of play. Iowa's first four points of the half came from Schlapkohl, who finished with 12 points making 6-7 field goals.

DeHaan continued her foul trouble in the second half and scored only eight points and grabbed six rebounds in the game, Michigan State got a huge performance from Brittney Thomas who scored a career-high 18 points, 16 of which came in the second half. IOWA CITY – In a thrilling overtime victory the Iowa Hawkeyes defeated Wisconsin, 78-74.

Badger guard Jolene Anderson came into the contest averaging 17.9 points and 7.6 rebounds and was well on her way by the end of the first half. Anderson had 17 points in the first half on 6-14 shooting, including 2-4 from behind the arc. She finished with a game high 42 points on 13-27 shooting including 13-13 on free throws. Anderson tied an arena record with her 42 points and set the record for free throw percentage.

A couple of Anderson free throws with 46 seconds left trimmed Iowa's lead to 65-64. A few possessions later, Anderson fumbled the ball into the Hawkeyes hands with 12.9 seconds remaining. Wisconsin's Teah Gant fouled Alexander who made 1-2. Wisconsin rebounded the ball and gave it to Anderson, who made the layup and knotted the game at 66-66.

In overtime, the Badgers took a quick four-point lead before Solverson converted on a conventional three-point play closing the Wisconsin lead to 70-69. The lead went back and forth until Schlapkohl and Alexander hit a few key foul shots to seal the deal as Iowa won 78-74.

In addition to Smith, Megan Skouby and Wendy Ausdemore reached double figures in points with 10 points each.

Game 19

Iowa 69, Purdue 53

Jan. 24, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY – Iowa took an early lead and never looked back as the Hawkeyes downed Purdue 69-53 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win snapped a three-game losing skid to the Boilermakers and was Iowa's largest margin of victory over Purdue since a 17-point win (80-63) March 8, 1986, at West Lafayette.

The Hawkeyes once again had an overall team effort and a huge lift from the bench. Smith paced all scorers with 19 points to go along with her six assists. Iowa's bench had 25 points to Purdue's seven, led by Skouby with 17 points. Ausdemore had 11 points and forward Krista VandeVenter added another eight.

The Hawkeyes steamed the Boilermakers early as they enjoyed a 14-7 lead with 14:45 remaining. Iowa's stellar 3-point and free throw shooting helped provide a 35-24 first-half advantage. Iowa shot 12-29 (41 percent) from the floor and 4-7 (57 percent) from downtown to go along with its perfect 7-7 free throw shooting. Purdue was 8-21 (38 percent) inside the arc and 2-7 (29 percent) outside, while the Boilermakers were 6-8 (75 percent) from the charity stripe.

The Hawkeyes also took advantage of 12 Purdue mistakes to their eight. Second-chance points helped Iowa forge the 11-point halftime lead as the Hawkeyes pulled down seven offensive boards and 18 total to Purdue's 14. Graham's aggressive play helped her to six first-half rebounds as she had eight on the game.

Iowa enjoyed a double-digit lead until 3:37 left in the game when Purdue's Danielle Campbell hit a layup before getting fouled by Solverson, who picked up her fifth on the game, and had to make a premature exit. Purdue trailed by nine at 57-48. France rained in a triple and inched even closer, 61-53, as the Hawkeyes continued to struggle with the full-court press.

Iowa finished shooting 22-52 (42 percent) from the field and 6-13 (46 percent) from 3-point range. The Hawkeyes took advantage of the charity stripe as they went 19-21 (91 percent), which included several key free throws down the stretch, to put Purdue away. Purdue finished 18-51 (35 percent) from the floor, 5-20 (25 percent) from downtown and 12-18 (67 percent) at the free throw line. Neither team controlled the ball well as Iowa had 18 turnovers and Purdue had 23.

Megan Skouby led all players with 23 points and seven rebounds. Kristi Smith and Wendy Ausdemore scored 15 points apiece. Johanna Solverson scored nine points and added seven rebounds, seven assists and three steals. The Hawkeyes won the rebounding battle, 49-34, and made 16-21 free throws (76.2 percent).

Both teams opened the game without a point for the first 3:18. Northwestern's Jenny Eckhart sank the first field goal before the Hawkeyes scored the next 15 points and never looked back. Iowa was in command at halftime, 34-14.

Balance was the key for the Hawkeyes. Skouby scored 12 points in just eight minutes and she was followed in the scoring column by Ausdemore with eight and Solverson with five. Iowa pulled down 25 rebounds during the first 20 minutes, including nine offensive boards. The Hawkeyes also forced nine turnovers.

Iowa made 13-6 field goals (36.1 percent) and had 11 assists. The Hawkeyes had only four turnovers at the break. Iowa's defense forced Northwestern to miss 21 of its first 24 shots (.125) from the field.

IOWA CITY – The Hawkeyes recorded a convincing 81-65 victory over the Indiana Hoosiers on Super Bowl Sunday afternoon in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The victory was Iowa's 11th straight against the Hoosiers in Iowa City and, more importantly, meant the Hawkeyes would end the day in no worse than a tie for first place in the Big Ten Conference.

The Hawkeyes took a 36-33 lead into halftime thanks to an 11-point effort by Smith and 7-13 shooting from behind the arc. The margin could have been greater, but Iowa committed nine turnovers that resulted in 12 Hoosier points. Iowa did control the boards, however, claiming an 18-13 margin.

Iowa used five points from Wendy Ausdemore and a lay-in from Krista VandeVenter to grab a 43-33 lead less than two minutes into the second half. And, after letting the lead get trimmed to seven three times, Megan Skouby capped an 8-0 Iowa run with a pair of free throws to give the home team a 67-53 margin with just more than six minutes to play.

The Hoosiers got the score below 10 at 72-63 when Jamie Braun nailed a jumper with 2:32 remaining, but the Black and Gold countered with two free throws from Jenee Graham and three from Kristi Smith to put the game out of reach.

Smith paced a group of four Hawkeyes who scored in double-digits with a team-high 17 points. Ausdemore and Skouby added 16 and JoAnn Hamlin 12 for the UI. Braun paced the Hoosiers with a game-high 26 points.

Iowa dominated the glass, ripping 44 rebounds down compared to only 26 for the Hoosiers. Skouby had a game-high 10 while Johanna Solverson added seven. The boards resulted in 17 second-chance points and 18 points from the paint.

Iowa also shot at a 50 percent clip from behind the arc, nailing 10-20 tries. Smith and Ausdemore each dropped in four 3-pointers.

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA – It wasn't easy for the University of Iowa women's basketball team, but the Hawkeyes pulled away from Penn State for their eighth consecutive victory, 73-65, for UI head coach Lisa Bluder's 500th career win.

Purdue 59, Iowa 46

Feb. 14, 2008, Mackey Arena

WEST LAFAYETTE, IN – Purdue weathered numerous second-half surges by the University of Iowa and held on for a 59-46 victory in women's basketball over the hot Hawkeyes on Thursday inside Mackey Arena.

Iowa (17-8 overall, 10-4 Big Ten) had its eight-game league winning streak halted. It is the first loss for the Hawkeyes in 34 days. Purdue improved to 14-11, 10-4 and the Boilermakers have now elevated themselves into a tie with Iowa for first in the conference.

The Hawkeyes had their lowest point total in a game since losing 63-46 at Michigan on Dec. 30.

Iowa shot 34.6 points from the field (18 of 52). Leading the way offensively for Iowa was Wendy Ausdemore with 13 points and Megan Skouby with 11. Ausdemore, Skouby and Johanna Solverson all had five rebounds. Iowa made just seven of 24 field goals in the final 20 minutes (29.2 percent).

Iowa was out-rebounded for the game, 38-33, and committed five more turnovers than the Boilermakers (16-11).

With 4-minutes, 29-seconds remaining, Iowa's JoAnn Hamlin sank a three-point field goal (off an assist from Ausdemore), cutting Purdue's lead to 50-46. The Boilermakers closed the game by scoring the final nine points as Iowa missed its final seven field goals.

Solverson handed out six of Iowa's 14 assists. She opened the game with an assist to Kristi Smith, who gave the Hawkeyes its only lead at 2-0, some 21 seconds into the game.

Purdue dominated the boards in the first half and pulled out to a 36-27 lead at the break. The Boilermakers pulled down 21 rebounds during the first 20 minutes, including eight on the offensive glass. Iowa had 12 total rebounds (including three offensive) in the first half. Purdue made 16 of 35 field goals (45.7 percent) and the Hawkeyes were 11 of 28 from the floor (39.3).

IOWA CITY – The University of Iowa women's basketball team sent its five seniors out with a win on 'Senior Night', downing Northwestern 68-42. With the win, Iowa finished the season 13-3 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena while moving its record to 19-9 overall and 12-5 in Big Ten play. Northwestern fell to 5-24, 1-16.

The Hawkeyes remain in a tie for first place in the Big Ten with Ohio State, adding importance for their upcoming road game at Wisconsin on March 2.

Ausdemore led the way for the Hawkeyes with 16 points and five rebounds, while Megan Skouby added 14 points. Solverson scored 13 points, grabbed four rebounds and added six assists. Iowa had a season-high 14 steals and 21 assists along with out-rebounding Northwestern 41-35.

Iowa shot 48.3 percent for the half (14-29) while holding Northwestern to 25 percent (8-32). Iowa's lead grew to as many as 21 (35-14) before Northwestern's Meshia Reed hit a 3-pointer to cut the Iowa lead to 35-17 at halftime.

The Hawkeyes were led by Ausdemore with seven points and five rebounds in the half. Solverson added nine points while Skouby added eight. Jaeschke led the Wildcats with eight points and five rebounds and Northwestern would only get point contributions from three other players in the half.

Throughout much of the late minutes of the second half, Bluder played all five seniors on the court at the same time. After three straight baskets by VandeVenter, Graham and Emmert, Iowa had its largest lead of the night (28) 62-34 with 4:36 left in the game.

During the last three minutes of the game, Bluder took each senior out one-by-one leading to a continuous standing ovation from the home crowd. Iowa maintained its lead by shooting 48.2 percent (27-56) for the game while continuing to hold Northwestern to poor shot selection, leading to 29 percent (18-62) for the evening, resulting in a 68-42 win.

MADISON, WI – Johanna Solverson took matters into her own hands at the Kohl Center, scoring a career-high 31 points to lead the University of Iowa women's basketball team to a 87-78 victory over Wisconsin and a share of the 2008 Big Ten Conference regular season crown.

Solverson sank nine of her first 10 field goal attempts en route to 21 points in the game's first 15 minutes of play. That start helped to propel to a 27-7 lead at the 10:28 mark and a 41-30 lead at intermission.

And, while the Badgers pulled to within two twice down the stretch - thanks in good measure to 17 second-half free throws, the Hawkeyes weren't going to be denied their first regular season conference championship in a decade.

Iowa blistered the nets at a 74 percent clip during the game's first 20 minutes, hitting 17-23 field goal attempts. When the game's final buzzer sound, the Hawkeyes also held a commanding 17-rebound margin in the battle of the boards. Wisconsin, a team that leads the league in rebounding margin, has only been out-rebounded four times in 2007-08, two of those times came against the Black and Gold by double digits.

They also held UW's Jolene Anderson to just 10 points - half of her season average. The game was Wisconsin's "Senior Day".

Kristi Smith added 10 points and Jenee Graham 10 rebounds for Iowa, who will be the No. 2 seed in the 2008 Big Ten Conference Tournament.

Megan Skouby came off the bench to score 15 points and grab four rebounds. Jenee Graham also came off the bench and retrieved a game-high 10 rebounds. Krista VandeVenter matched a season high with three blocks and also corralled eight rebounds.

The win was Iowa's fifth in six games at the Kohl Center.

INDIANAPOLIS, IN – Bluder's Bunch advanced to the semifinal round of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament with a 58-37 victory over Michigan.

The Hawkeyes turned the tables on the league's top defensive team during the regular season. The Wolverines shot just 27 percent from the field, hitting only 13 of their 48 attempts -- and just three of 15 tries from behind the arc -- en route to the lowest offensive total in Big Ten Tournament history.

Iowa also dominated the boards, racking up a 46-24 advantage on the glass. Only five of Michigan's rebounds came on the offensive side of the court.

Megan Skouby and Johanna Solverson paced Iowa with 10 points each. They were among eight different players to score for Iowa, a group that included senior guard Abby Emmert, who came off the bench to contribute eight points, four assists and two rebounds in 15 minutes of action - a line on the box score that is easily the best of the season for the native of Winterset, Iowa. Stacy Schlapkohl and Kristi Smith both added nine points.

Iowa was led in rebounding by Solverson and JoAnn Hamlin, who had nine and seven rebounds, respectively.

The game's outcome was never in doubt, particularly when Skouby pushed the margin to 18 at 51-33 when she sank a short jumper with 4:04 left to play.

Iowa raced to a 30-19 halftime lead thanks to a balanced offense and domination on the glass. Eight different Hawkeyes scored during the first 20 minutes.

Iowa owned the glass, building a 22-12 margin in rebounds while limiting Michigan to just one offensive rebound. The Hawkeye defense was also stifling, holding Michigan to just nine field goals in 26 attempts.

Michigan scored the game's first bucket, but, from that point forward, it was all Iowa.

Purdue 80, Iowa 73

INDIANAPOLIS, IN – The University of Iowa women's basketball team was edged by Purdue 80-73 in the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament.

Stepping up for Iowa was Kristi Smith with 19 points and seven assists, and Johanna Solverson with 16 points and nine rebounds. Also having big games for the Hawkeyes were Stacy Schlapkohl with 15 points and six rebounds and Wendy Ausdemore adding 10 points.

The story of the game may have been the points in the paint, won 42-30 by Purdue, and points off turnovers, also won 25-4 by the Boilermakers.

The Hawkeyes opened the game on a 15-4 run during the first five minutes sparked by two three-point baskets by Smith. After three straight buckets from Purdue, Iowa went on an 11-0 run behind inside scoring from both Ausdemore and Schlapkohl, to take its largest lead of the half, 26-9. Smith had three 3-pointers and finished the half with 11 points.

Purdue used the next three minutes to work the ball inside to Keshia Mosley and Kalika France, resulting in a 13-2 run cutting Iowa's lead to 28-22 with 5:49 remaining in the half. Mosely and France each scored 11 points in the half for the Boilermakers.

After seeing the lead cut to two, 31-29, Solverson hit a big 3-pointer, Smith hit two free throws and Schlapkohl made a jump shot in the lane to help Iowa to a 38-35 lead at halftime.

Purdue continued to feed the ball inside to Mosley in the second half and found another scoring option inside in Danielle Campbell, each scoring four quick points to help the Boilermakers take their first lead of the game, 52-51 at the 13 minute mark. Mosely finished with a career-high 18 points. France scored a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds while Campbell added 18 points and five rebounds.

For the next five minutes, the lead went back and forth with the teams trading shots until Schlapkohl hit back-to-back buckets to help Iowa grab a 62-59 lead with just over eight minutes left in the game.

Iowa became cold from the field, missing its next 11 shots, leading to a 14-1 run from Purdue, its first double-digit lead of the night 73-63.

Two 3-point baskets by Ausdemore inside the final minute would not be enough.

NORFOLK, VA – The Georgia Bulldogs slipped passed the University of Iowa 67-61 in the opening round of the NCAA tournament.

Rebounding and Georgia's free-throw shooting late tell the story in a match-up of the No. 8 seed Georgia and No. 9 seeded Iowa Hawkeyes. Georgia out-rebounded the Hawkeyes 35-28, including 11 offensive rebounds leading to 13 second chance points. Georgia also made 12 of 16 free-throws.

Leading the way for Iowa was Kristi Smith with 17 points, five rebounds and four assists. Wendy Ausdemore scored 16 points for Iowa, Megan Skouby poured in nine from the bench and Johanna Solverson scored six points, grabbed eight rebounds and passed for five assists.

After falling behind 8-0 in the first three minutes, the Hawkeyes hit three straight three-point baskets to pull them within four, 13-9. Hitting the triples for Iowa was Solverson, Ausdemore and Skouby.

Georgia found inside presence early, getting eight points from Angel Robinson and seven points from leading scorer Tasha Humphrey. Iowa then implemented a 2-3 zone defense, limiting Georgia's touches inside.

Following the defensive switch, the Hawkeyes climbed their way to a 20-17 lead after Ausdemore hit her second three-pointer of the half.

Robinson gave the Bulldogs the lead back 25-24 after making an inside bucket but the lead was short-lived as Kristi Smith scored five quick points for Iowa to take the lead with under two minutes to play in the half. Krista VandeVenter would add a lay-up at the buzzer to increase Iowa's lead to six (31-25) at the half.

Georgia began the second half going inside to Robinson for six fast points. Megan Darrah would also heat up for the Bulldogs, hitting a three-pointer to cut the Iowa lead to 34-33.

After Humphrey tied the game at 44-44, the teams would trade baskets including a big three-point basket by Smith, tying the game at 57. After a timeout, Humphrey hit a jumper with 58 seconds left giving Georgia a 59-57 lead. Iowa then spent the last minute fouling Georgia guard Ashley Houts and sending her to the free-throw line. Houts made eight free-throws down the stretch, sealing the victory for Georgia.
