**TICKETS** - - Tickets are \$70 and remain on sale at the UI Athletics Ticket Office in Carver-Hawkeye Arena or by phone or website (1-800-IA-HAWKS or [hawkeyesports.com](http://hawkeyesports.com)).

**TELEVISION** - - The game is televised by ABC. The announcers are Allen Bestwick, Mike Bellotti, and Kris Budden.

**RADIO** - - (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak call the action, with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. KRUI (89.7 FM), the UI student radio station, and on Sirius channel 81 and XM channel 81 on satellite radio. Westwood One Sports will also broadcast the game, with Ted Emrich and Chuck Long calling the action.

**HY-VEE HEROES GAME** - - Iowa and Nebraska are competing for the Hy-Vee Heroes Trophy for the sixth consecutive season. Nebraska holds a 3-2 advantage in the series with the Heroes Trophy on the line.

**THE SERIES** - - Nebraska holds a 29-14-3 advantage in the series that began with a 22-0 Iowa win in 1891 in Omaha. The Hawkeyes snapped Nebraska's five-game winning streak in the series with a 38-17 victory in Lincoln in 2013, and won 28-20 in Lincoln a year

ago to cap a perfect regular season. The visiting team has won the last four meetings.

**THE RECORDS** - - Iowa is 7-4 overall and 5-3 in the Big Ten. In nonconference play, Iowa defeated Miami, Ohio (45-21) and Iowa State (42-3), and lost to North Dakota State (23-21). In conference play, Iowa won 14-7 at Rutgers, dropped a 38-31 home decision to Northwestern, won 14-7 at Minnesota, won 49-35 at Purdue, lost to Wisconsin, 17-9, lost at Penn State, 41-14, defeated Michigan, 14-13, and won 28-0 at Illinois.

Nebraska is 9-2 overall and 6-2 in Big Ten play. The Cornhuskers have defeated Fresno State (43-10), Wyoming (52-17), Oregon (35-32), Northwestern (24-13), Illinois (31-16), Indiana (27-22), Purdue (27-14), Minnesota (24-17), and Maryland (28-7). Nebraska lost at Wisconsin (23-17, OT), and at Ohio State (62-3).

**COACHING RECORDS** - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st year as a college head coach and 18th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 146-112. He is 134-91 at Iowa. He is tied for sixth in the Big Ten in conference victories and seventh in overall victories.

Mike Riley is in his second year at Nebraska and his 16th year as a college head coach. Riley is 15-9 at Nebraska and holds a 108-89 career mark.

**AFTER THIS** - - Both Iowa and Nebraska are bowl eligible.

- Iowa's 2016 senior class has won 34 games since 2013, including 22 Big Ten games, third most by any senior class under Ferentz. The 2005 senior class won 25 Big Ten games, and the 2004 senior class won 24 Big Ten games.
- Iowa is playing its fourth rivalry trophy game this season. Iowa entered the year in possession of all four rivalry trophies and has successfully defended the Cy-Hawk (W 42-3 vs. Iowa St) and Floyd of Rosedale (W 14-7 at Minn). Iowa lost the Heartland Trophy at home to Wisconsin (17-9).
- Iowa's last home win against Nebraska was in 1981 (10-7). That game marked the first game in which Kirk Ferentz served as an Iowa assistant. It is the only time Iowa has defeated a ranked Nebraska team (#7).
- Iowa has outscored its opponents 31-0 over the last 69:34. The Hawkeyes shutout Illinois in Week 11, recording their first Big Ten shutout since 2009 (12-0 vs. Minnesota). Iowa defeated Michigan 14-13 in Week 10, allowing just three points in the second half.
- QB C.J. Beathard's .769 winning percentage (20-6) is No. 1 all-time among Iowa starting QBs with at least 20 career starts. He is 1-of-5 players in program history to win 20 games as starting QB. The others include Chuck Long (34), Ricky Stanzi (26), Matt Rodgers (21), and Drew Date (21).
- DB Desmond King is a Jim Thorpe, Bednarik, and Lott IMPACT Award semifinalist. King is the only BIG player in the last 20 years with 12+ career int. and 1,500+ combined kickoff/punt return yards. King has 13 career int. and 1,749 career KO/P return yards.
- LB Josey Jewell is a Butkus Award finalist and leads the Big Ten with 105 tackles. Jewell matched his career high with 16 stops in Week 8 against Wisconsin. He has 282 career tackles, 19th all-time. He blocked his first career field goal Week 9 at Penn State.
- RB Akrum Wadley (861) and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. (855) are the third set of running backs in program history to have 800-plus rushing yards in the same season, joining Owen Gill (920) and Ronnie Harmon (907) in 1984, and Nick Bell (1,009) and Tony Stewart (844) in 1990.
- DT Jaleel Johnson is tied for fourth in the Big Ten with 7.5 sacks (50 yards). Johnson recorded a safety and a sack against Michigan in Week 10. He entered the year with five career sacks. The last DT to lead the Hawkeyes in sacks was DT Mike Daniels in 2011 (9-53).
- Iowa is bowl eligible for the 15th time in the last 16 seasons. Iowa has won 6 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz. Only Ohio State has more bowl wins (8) than Iowa since 2001.

## HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 18th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is seventh with 134 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 81 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in nine January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 125-70 (.641) overall mark and a 77-49 (.611) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 10 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 134-91 (.596) and an 81-63 (.563) mark in Big Ten games. In his 21st season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 146-112 (.566). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fifth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

### ALL IN THE FAMILY

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2016. Ferentz has had a son on the team in 14 of his 18 seasons at Iowa's head coach. Steven, a redshirt senior offensive lineman, is the youngest of Kirk's five children (Brian, Kelly, Joanne, James and Steven) and is playing his final home game Friday. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fifth season as Iowa's offensive line coach and second year as running-game coordinator. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013.

Kirk and Steven are one of seven father-son head coach-player duos in FBS. The others include Mike and Jay Macintyre (Colorado), Mark and Gunner Hudspeth (UL-Lafayette), Rick and Brent Stockstill (Middle Tennessee), Bobby and Derek Wilder (Old Dominion), Butch and Alex Jones (Tennessee), and Kyle and Alex Whittingham (Utah).

### FERENTZ CATCHES CARR, CLOSES ON WILLIAMS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 81 Big Ten wins, tying Lloyd Carr for sixth place among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz has 134 wins in all games played as a member of the Big Ten Conference, seventh most all-time. He is two victories from equalling Henry Williams of Minnesota, who won 136 games.

Iowa is one of two Big Ten programs (Michigan) with two head coaches among the top seven (Hayden Fry 143 overall wins, 96 conference wins).

### BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

**14 SENIORS PLAY FINAL HOME GAME**

Senior members of the Iowa football program include QB C.J. Beathard, P Ron Coluzzi, OL Cole Croston, RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., DE Faith Ekakitie, OL Steve Ferentz, DB Anthony Gair, DT Jaleel Johnson, OL Mitch Keppy, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle, DB Greg Mabin, WR Riley McCarron, and OL Ryan Ward.

Since the start of the 2013 season the Hawkeyes have won 34 games and qualified for a bowl game every year. The senior class has an overall record of 34-17, including an 18-9 mark at home and a 22-10 record in Big Ten games. The 22 conference wins are the third most by any senior class under Ferentz. The 2005 senior class won 25 Big Ten games, and the 2004 senior class won 24 Big Ten games.

All senior members of the Iowa football program will be recognized during pregame ceremonies.

**20-GAME WINNER**

QB C.J. Beathard has 20-6 career record and is one of five player in program history to win 20 games as starting quarterback. The other include Chuck Long (34), Ricky Stanzi (26), Matt Rodgers (21), and Drew Date (21). Beathard won his 20th game in his 26th career start, matching Long and Stanzi for the program's fastest 20-game winners. Rodgers won his 20th game in his 29th start, and Tate won his 20th in his 33rd career start. Beathard has the highest winning percentage (.769) and is the winning quarterback in program history (minimum 20 starts).

Beathard is 20-6 as a starter, including a 10-3 at Kinnick Stadium, a 10-1 record in true road games, a 13-4 record in Big Ten games, and a 3-4 record against AP to 25 teams. His 37 career touchdown passes tie Chuck Hartlieb for sixth all-time, and his 5,363 career passing yards rank eighth all-time. The Hawkeyes are 4-0 in games Beathard throws for fewer than 100 yards (77 yards at Wisconsin 2015, 97 yards at Nebraska 2015, 66 yards vs. Michigan 2016, 80 at Illinois 2016).

**JEWELL A FINALIST FOR BUTKUS AWARD**

LB Josey Jewell, the Big Ten's leading tackler, is a finalist for the 2016 Butkus Award, presented annually to the nation's best linebacker.

Jewell is one of five finalists for the award. He is joined by Kendall Beckwith (LSU), Zach Cunningham (Vanderbilt), Farrad Davis (Florida), and Reuben Foster (Alabama). The winner will be announced on or before Dec. 6.

Jewell (6-foot-2, 230-pounds) has started every game this season and leads the Big Ten with 105 tackles. Jewell matched his career high with 16 stops in Week 8 against No. 10 Wisconsin. His 282 career tackles rank 19th in program history. In 2015, Jewell garnered second team All-Big Ten honors by league coaches and media, the Associated Press, and Phil Steele.

Former Hawkeye Larry Station was a finalist for the Butkus Award in 1985, while Chad Greenway was a semifinalist in 2005.

**DANIELS, MCCARRON EARN WEEKLY HONORS**

RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. and WR Riley McCarron were recognized as Big Ten Conference Players of the Week for their performances in Iowa's 28-0 win at Illinois. Daniels was named the co-Offensive Player of the Week, while McCarron shared the weekly honor as Special Teams Player of the Week. Daniels was also named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

Daniels led Iowa's offense as the Hawkeyes rushed for 262 yards and gained 342 yards total offense. He matched his career high with 26 rushing attempts, gaining 159 yards. He scored twice, giving Iowa a 14-0 lead with a 1-yard plunge in the third quarter, and then scoring from 50 yards in the final period to move the advantage to 21-0.

McCarron had two punt returns against Illinois for 72 yards, including a 55-yard touchdown in the second quarter that provided the only points in the first half. He later added a 17-yard return. McCarron, who leads the Hawkeyes in receiving for the season (36-398), also had one pass reception for 16 yards as Iowa won its fourth road game of the year.

The Big Ten recognition is the first for both Daniels and McCarron.

**HAWKEYES ARE BOWL ELIGIBLE**

K Keith Duncan kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to help Iowa beat No. 2 Michigan 14-13, and become bowl eligible for the 15th time in the last 16 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa clinched eligibility in Game 10 for the fifth time under Kirk Ferentz (2013 Outback, 2008 Outback, 2005 Outback, 2001 Alamo).

Iowa made its 29th Bowl game appearance (14-14-1) at the 102nd Rose Bowl Game in Pasadena, California, on Jan. 1, 2016. The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (six times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

- Iowa has played 13 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-7), including nine January bowl games (4-5).
- Iowa has been bowl eligible 15 of the last 16 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa's 13 bowl appearances since 2001 tie as the 11th best total in the nation.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 46 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (44), Iowa (29), and Wisconsin (27).

Iowa and Nebraska are playing "The Hy-Vee Heroes Game" Friday, with the winner claiming the Heroes Trophy. The trophy game between the Hawkeyes and Cornhuskers was established in 2011. Iowa gained possession of the trophy for the first time with a 38-17 win at Nebraska in 2013, and reclaimed it last season with a 28-20 win in Lincoln. The Hawkeyes also play trophy games with Iowa State (Cy-Hawk Trophy, W 42-3), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale, W 14-7) and Wisconsin (Heartland Trophy, L 17-9).

THE SERIES

Nebraska holds a 29-14-3 advantage in the series that began with a 22-0 Iowa victory in 1891. The visiting team has won the last four meetings.

Nebraska holds a 10-6 advantage in games played in Iowa City, including the last three meetings. Iowa's last home win against Nebraska was in 1981 (10-7). That game marked the first game in which Kirk Ferentz served as an Iowa assistant, being named Iowa's offensive line coach prior to the season. It is also the only time Iowa has defeated a ranked Nebraska team (#7). The Hawkeyes are 1-9 all-time against Nebraska when the Huskers are ranked.

The 1999 Iowa-Nebraska game in Kinnick Stadium marked Coach Kirk Ferentz's first game as Iowa's head coach.

The first 10 games in the series were played in either Omaha (eight games) or Council Bluffs (two games). The series was even at 4-4-2 in those 10 meetings. Here are the series results:

**LAST MEETING – Nov. 27, 2015 (Lincoln, Nebraska)**

Iowa's defense collected four interceptions and RB Jordan Canzeri rushed for two touchdowns in a 28-20 victory over Nebraska at Memorial Stadium in Lincoln, Nebraska. The win concluded the Hawkeyes' only perfect 12-0 regular season in school history. The win concluded Iowa's clean sweep of four rivalry trophies (Heroes Trophy).

Iowa scored first when QB C.J. Beathard found TE George Kittle in the end zone for a 10-yard score. Following a Nebraska touchdown, DE Parker Hesse intercepted a Tommy Armstrong, Jr. pass and ran four yards for Iowa's fourth pick-six of the season. Hesse, who had six tackles, was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

With Iowa leading 14-10 at halftime, the visiting Hawkeyes scored touchdowns on their first two possessions of the second half. Canzeri, who finished the game with 140 yards on 17 carries, scored his first touchdown on a 29-yard rush down the sidelines. On Iowa's next possession, Canzeri scampered 68 yards on the first play to put the Hawkeyes in front 28-17.

Nebraska kicked a 42-yard field goal with 1:17 remaining, but was unable to recover an onside kick attempt when Henry Krieger-Coble covered the ball.

Iowa's four interceptions were by four different players: Cole Fisher, Josey Jewell, Greg Mabin, and Hesse. Fisher and safety Jordan Lomax each totaled 11 tackles, while Jewell and Mabin each had nine stops.

The Hawkeyes won despite going 0-of-9 on third down and running just 44 offensive plays. Beathard completed 9-of-16 passes for 97 yards and one touchdown, while Armstrong Jr. completed 25-of-45 passes for 296 yards and four interceptions.

**KING LANDS ON AWARDS LIST**

DB Desmond King is one of 16 semifinalists for the 2016 Jim Thorpe Award, (best defensive back in college football), one of 18 semifinalists for the Bednarik Award (most outstanding defensive player), and one of 10 semifinalists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy (Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity).

King has started all 11 games at cornerback in 2016 and has 49 career starts. This season he has recorded 36 solo tackles and 16 assists, leads Iowa with seven pass break-ups, and had a 41-yard interception return for a touchdown in a win at Purdue.

King also leads Iowa's special teams through 11 games. He leads the Big Ten averaging 27.3 yards per kickoff return (minimum seven returns). He is also averaging 8.7 yards on punt returns, No. 2 in the Big Ten (minimum five returns). King had a career-best 77-yard kickoff return in Week 8 against Wisconsin. It is Iowa's longest play of the season.

King is the only Big Ten player in the last 20 years to have 12 or more interceptions and 1,500 or more combined kickoff and return yards. King has 13 career interceptions, tied for

**BEATHARD'S FOURTH-QUARTER GAME-WINNING DRIVES**

QB C.J. Beathard has led Iowa to victories five times when the Hawkeyes have trailed or been tied in the fourth quarter. On fourth-quarter game-winning drives, Beathard is a combined 9-of-11 passing for 73 yards and one touchdown. He has four carries for 29 yards, including three first downs.

King won the Jim Thorpe Award in 2015. Three finalists for the 2016 award will be announced on Monday, Nov. 21, with the winner being announced Dec. 8 at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show airing on ESPN. The Thorpe Award winner will be honored at a banquet in Oklahoma City on Feb. 7, 2017.

The Bednarik Award, in conjunction with the NCFAA, will announce three finalists on Nov. 21. Winners of the prestigious award will also be unveiled during the Home Depot College Football Awards.

The Lott IMPACT Trophy was founded in 2004, and is named after College and Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott. Four finalists will be announced on Wednesday, Nov. 30. Each school of the four finalists will receive \$5,000 for their general scholarship fund, while the school of the winner will receive \$25,000.

**LIGHTS, CAMERA, AKSHUN**

RB Akrum Wadley and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. rank eighth and 9th, respectively, in the Big Ten in rushing yards. Wadley has 861 rushing yards (78.3 ypg) and Daniels has 855 rushing yards (77.7 ypg). They are the third set of running backs in program history to have 800-plus rushing yards in the same season, joining Owen Gill (920) and Ronnie Harmon (907) in 1984, and Nick Bell (1,009) and Tony Stewart (844) in 1990. Wadley has nine rushing touchdowns, Daniels has eight.

Both players topped 100 yards in Week 7 at Purdue, marking the first time since 2008 Iowa had two 100-yard rushers in the same game (Shonn Greene, 115; Jewel Hampton, 114 yards vs. Indiana). It marked the 24th time two players rushed for 100 yards or more in the same game, but the first time two players reached the 150-yard plateau.

Daniels had two rushing touchdowns (1, 4) against the Boilermakers, his fifth career multi-touchdown game. His 67-yard rush in the third quarter was the longest of his career. He finished with 23 carries for 150 yards. He added his second 150-yard, two-touchdown performance of the season Week 11 at Illinois. He has three career games of 150 rushing yards and at least two touchdowns (2015 vs. Minnesota, 195 yards, 3 TDs; 2016 at Purdue,

150 yards, 2 TDs; 2016 at Illinois, 159 yards, 2 TDs). He is the only player in the Ferentz era with three such games. Shonn Greene had two such games in 2008. Daniels was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week vs. Illinois.

Wadley's 75-yard touchdown rush was a career long rush, and Iowa's longest play of the season from scrimmage. He finished with 15 carries for 176 yards, his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, second in a row.

The duo helped Iowa rush for 365 yards against the Boilermakers, tying for the second most rushing yardage total in the Ferentz era (Minnesota, 2002).

Daniels has 1,695 career rushing yards (19th) and Wadley 1,533 (23th). Wadley has scored 126 career points (T-23rd), Daniels has 104 (33). Only 39 players in program history have scored 100 or more points.

**RUN AFTER HANDOFF, RUN AFTER CATCH**

RB Akrum Wadley is Iowa's leading rusher (861 yards) and second leading receiver (30 receptions). Wadley has combined for 19 catches, 159 yards receiving, and two receiving touchdowns the past four weeks. He posted career bests in receptions (7) and receiving yards (72) in Week 8 against Wisconsin, and shared the team lead with five receptions in Week 9 at Penn State (32 yards, TD). He led Iowa with five catches, 52 receiving yards, and scored the team's only touchdown (3-yard reception) against Michigan. Wadley entered the season with seven career receptions (93 yards, TD).

Wadley's 12 touchdowns (9 rush, 3 receiving) tie for fourth in the Big Ten.

**I'LL TAKE THAT**

Iowa is plus-seven in turnover margin, fourth in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes have 16 takeaways (seven interceptions, nine fumble recoveries) and have turned nine of the 15 into touchdowns, including DB Desmond King's interception return for a touchdown Week 7 at Purdue. It was King's third career pick-six. Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last nine seasons, and 14 of the last 16.

Iowa has lost two fumbles this year, tying Nevada and Old Dominion for the NCAA lead.

**MAKING HAY IN THE RED ZONE**

Iowa ranks second in the Big Ten in red zone offense. The Hawkeyes have scored points on 31-of-34 trips to the red zone, including 23 touchdowns (9 pass, 14 rush) and eight field goals. Iowa turned it over on downs at Rutgers, missed a field goal attempt against Wisconsin, and turned it over on downs at Illinois. Its .912 red zone success rate ranks No. 2 in the Big Ten and No. 17 nationally.

Eight different Hawkeyes have scored red zone touchdowns. Iowa's rushing touchdowns include six by RB Akrum Wadley, five by RB LeShun Daniels, two by QB C.J. Beathard, and one by RB Derrick Mitchell. The receiving touchdowns have gone to WR Matt VandeBerg (3), Wadley (2), WR Jerminic Smith (1), WR Riley McCarron (1), TE George Kittle (1), and TE Noah Fant (1).

**HAWKEYES JOIN UPSET PARTY, DEFEAT No. 2 MICHIGAN**

Iowa defeated second-ranked Michigan, 14-13, on Nov. 12 at Kinnick Stadium. It was Iowa's first win over a No. 2 team since it defeated No. 2 Michigan, 12-10, in 1985. In both 2016 and 1985, Iowa upset No. 2 Michigan the same day the third and fourth ranked teams in the nation also lost. It is the only two times in the history of the AP poll that has happened.

In 2016, Iowa defeated No. 2 Michigan, 14-13; Pitt beat No. 3 Clemson, 43-42; and USC beat No. 4 Washington, 26-13. On Saturday, Oct. 19, 1985; Rob Houghtlin kicked a 29-yard field goal as time expired to help No. 1 Iowa defeat No. 2 Michigan, 12-10. Miami defeated No. 3 Oklahoma, 27-14, and Texas defeated No. 4 Arkansas, 15-13.

**LIGHTWEIGHTS DELIVER HEAVYWEIGHT KNOCKOUT**

Freshman PK Keith Duncan, Iowa's lightest player at 165 pounds, and freshman DB Manny Rugamba, the Hawkeyes' lightest position player at 172 pounds, were instrumental in Iowa's 14-13 upset over No. 2 Michigan on Nov. 12. Duncan kicked a 33-yard game-winning field goal as time expired, and Rugamba intercepted a pass and recorded career highs in tackles (4) and pass breakups (3) in his first career start. Both players earned conference recognition following the game. Duncan was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week, and Rugamba shared Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. He was also named B1G Defensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

**FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS**

Iowa has nine players on its 2016 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kliver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), DE Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

**VANDEBERG TO MISS GAMES DUE TO INJURY**

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg is out of action indefinitely, due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. VandeBerg (6-1, 190), played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury.

VandeBerg has 106 career receptions, tying Quinn Early for 19th in program history. He has 1,302 career receiving yards, 27th in program history. Should he miss the entire season, the fourth-year senior could be granted a medical redshirt and return for a fifth season in 2017.

Ten true freshmen have seen action in 2016, including RB Toks Akinribade, K Keith Duncan, TE Noah Fant, DB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DE Cedrick Lattimore, DB Manny Rugamba, QB Nathan Stanley, LB Kristian Welch, and WR Devonte Young.

Fant caught a touchdown pass at Purdue in Week 7, becoming the first true freshman to catch a touchdown pass since Jordan Canzeri in 2011.

Stanley has played in five games. He is the first true freshman to play quarterback since Drew Tate in 2003. Tate appeared in six games (no starts) and was 6-of-11 for 55 yards and one touchdown (no interceptions).

**JOHNSON, DUNCAN, RUGAMBA RECOGNIZED FOLLOWING MICHIGAN UPSET**

University of Iowa senior DT Jaleel Johnson, freshman K Keith Duncan, and freshman DB Manny Rugamba were recognized as Big Ten Conference Players of the Week following Iowa's 14-13 win over second-ranked Michigan on Nov. 12.

Johnson was named Defensive Player of the Week, Duncan was named Special Teams Player of the Week, and Rugamba shared Freshman of the Week honors. Rugamba was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week vs. Michigan by College Sports Madness.

Johnson (6-foot-4, 310-pounds) recorded a career-best nine tackles, including six solo tackles and three assists. His totals included two tackles-for-loss and a sack. Johnson recorded Iowa's first points of the game, collecting a safety when he dropped Michigan's De'Veon Smith in the end zone for a safety to cut Iowa's deficit to 10-2 in the second quarter.

Rugamba (5-11, 185) started for the first time in place of senior Greg Mabin, who missed the game due to injury. Rugamba recorded two solo stops and two assists against the Wolverines. Rugamba also had his second interception of the season in the fourth quarter, and had three pass break-ups as Michigan gained just 103 passing yards. Along with the Big Ten recognition, he was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

Duncan (5-11, 165) provided the winning margin against Michigan with a 33-yard field goal as time expired. Duncan had given the Hawkeyes an 11-10 advantage with a 25-yard field goal in the third period.

**WADLEY NAMED ROSE BOWL GAME BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

RB Akrum Wadley was named Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Player of the Week following Iowa's 14-13 win over No. 2 Michigan at Kinnick Stadium on Nov. 12.

Against the nation's top-ranked defense, Wadley rushed 23 times for 115 yards (5.0 ypc) and led Iowa with five receptions for 52. He scored Iowa's only touchdown on a 3-yard touchdown reception from QB C.J. Beathard. The 100-yard rushing performance was the seventh of Wadley's career.

**NELSON NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

DE Anthony Nelson was named Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Week for his performance in Iowa's 45-21 win over Miami, Ohio in Week 1.

Nelson forced two Miami fumbles in his first career game, with both leading to Iowa touchdowns. He recorded 2.5 sacks for minus 16 yards, and had yet another sack nullified by a Miami delay of game penalty. Nelson was credited with two solo tackles, four assists and one pass breakup.

Nelson's first caused turnover came in the first quarter as Miami had reached the Hawkeye eight-yard line. Matt Nelson recovered the fumble and the Hawkeye offense traveled 81 yards in two plays for a touchdown and a 21-0 advantage.

Nelson's second forced fumble came late in the game and led to Iowa's final touchdown in the closing minutes.

The Big Ten honor is the first for Nelson. Iowa players earned weekly honors from the Big Ten on six occasions in 2015, including DE Parker Hesse, who earned Freshman of the Week honors in the regular season finale at Nebraska, a 28-20 Hawkeye win.

In Iowa's win over Rutgers, Coluzzi averaged 42 yards on seven punts, with a long of 55 yards. Four of his kicks were placed inside the 20, as Rutgers recorded zero yards on just one return. Coluzzi also had recorded touchbacks on all three of his kickoffs, allowing no returns.

**BEATHARD EARNED COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS WEEKLY AWARD**

QB C.J. Beathard was named College Sports Madness Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week following his performance against Iowa State in Week 2. Beathard accounted for four first half touchdowns -- three passing and one rushing -- to lead Iowa to a 42-3 win in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He completed 19-of-28 passes for 235 yards and matched his career best with three touchdown passes.

**BACK ON CAMPUS**

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz has four former players on the 2016 staff. His son, Brian Ferentz, was a three-year letterman from 2003-05 and is in his fifth year as Iowa's offensive line coach. He is also Iowa's run game coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his ninth year on the Iowa staff. He is in his second season coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. He also assists with special teams. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and recently served as director of on-campus recruiting (2012-13) before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

**GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE**

The Hawkeyes opened 2016 with three straight home games against Miami, Ohio (W, 45-21), Iowa State (W, 42-3), and North Dakota State (L, 23-21).

For the first time in program history, Iowa is playing a nine-game conference schedule. Iowa plays five Big Ten road games and hosts four conference schools, including Northwestern (L, 38-31), Wisconsin (L, 17-9), Michigan (W, 14-13) and Nebraska (Nov. 25).

The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, or Ohio State, during the regular season.

Seven of Iowa's 12 opponents played in the postseason. Six Big Ten opponents participated in bowl competition (4-2). North Dakota State has won the FCS national championship five consecutive years.

Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2016. The Hawkeyes defended the Cy-Hawk trophy with a 42-3 win against Iowa State and Floyd of Rosedale with a 14-7 triumph at Minnesota. Iowa lost to Wisconsin 17-9 in a battle for the Heartland Trophy. Iowa defend the Hero trophy Saturday against Nebraska.

For the second straight year, and second time in program history, Iowa played more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa defeated Iowa State, 42-3, on Sept. 10 in a game that kicked off at 6:42 p.m. The Hawkeyes defeated Michigan, 14-13, on Nov. 12 in a game that kicked off at 7:15 p.m.

**IOWA WILL KICKOFF, TWICE IF NECESSARY**

Iowa has deferred to the second half six times this season when winning the coin toss, bucking the "we will receive" philosophy practiced in Kirk Ferentz's first 17 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the toss at Illinois, chose which end zone they wanted to defend (wind 24 mph), and kicked to the Illini to start the first and second halves. Illinois did not kick off in the game.

Iowa is 5-2 this season when starting the game on defense. In 18 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Ferentz and the Hawkeyes have opened on defense in 49-of-225 games (28-21). Iowa has started the game on offense in 176-of-225 games (106-70).

**FIND THE NFL-ER**

Austin Blythe, a seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, became the 15th offensive lineman selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach. In each of Ferentz's 17 complete seasons, the Hawkeyes had a future NFL player start on the offensive line.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

**IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 26 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (39). Nebraska and Penn State have also had 26 players drafted since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last seven NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had 23 players drafted from 2010-16, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a five-time Pro-Bowler (2011-15) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Entering the 2016 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 15 years, 140-of-157 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

**BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001**

Iowa has posted a 6-7 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State has won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. The following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

**IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 15 of the last 16 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 310 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Desmond King became the seventh Hawkeye to earn a national player of the year award under Kirk Ferentz. He won the Jim Thorpe award in 2015, honoring the nation's top defensive back. Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 18th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

**FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY**

Kirk Ferentz is in his 18th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is tied with Oklahoma's Bob Stoops as the longest active FBS head coaches. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998, one day after Stoops was named head coach at Oklahoma. Stoops was a Hawkeye letterman from 1979-82.

**IOWA AT THE HEAD OF CLASS IN COACHING LANDSCAPE**

The University of Iowa has produced four active FBS head coaches, tied with Alabama for most in the country. Bret Bielema (Arkansas), Bob Diaco (UConn), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), and Mark Stoops (Kentucky) all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Bielema, Diaco, Bob Stoops, and Mark Stoops played for former UI head coach Hayden Fry. All four head coaches served as assistants under Fry. Bielema was an assistant coach on Kirk Ferentz's staff from 1999-2001.

**KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW**

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Applebee's in Coralville.

**HAWKEYE HISTORY**

Iowa has played 1,218 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 632-547-39 (.535). That includes a 396-216-16 (.641) record in home games, a 236-331-23 (.418) record in games away from Iowa City, a 319-369-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 279-180-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

**ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!**

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is once again available for fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Iowa Football game days. The Hawkeye Express is in its 13th season.

Adults can ride the train for \$12, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

### GAME RECAP

No. 15/17 Iowa rushed for five touchdowns en route to a 45-21 victory over Miami University at Kinnick Stadium. The 45 points are the most points by a Hawkeye team in a season opener since posting 46 against Maine in 2008.

The Hawkeyes sprinted out to a 21-0 advantage in the first quarter after touchdown runs of 1, 11, and 43 yards by Hawkeye tailbacks.

Akrum Wadley rushed for a game-best 121 yards and two touchdowns, LeShun Daniels carried the ball 10 times for 83 yards and two scores, while Derrick Mitchell had 12 yards and a touchdown on two attempts.

Iowa's offense ran only 50 plays, but totaled 404 yards, averaging 8.1 yards per play. Directing the Hawkeye offense was quarterback C.J. Beathard, who completed 13-of-20 passes for 192 yards and one touchdown. The senior signal caller completed his first eight passes of the contest.

Matt VandeBerg caught a team-best four passes for 99 yards, while Jerminic Smith had three catches for 51 yards, including his first career touchdown reception.

The Hawkeye defense forced and recovered three Miami fumbles -- two of which came in the first period -- while the Iowa offense converted the RedHawk miscues into 21 points.

Linebackers Ben Niemann and Bo Bower led the Hawkeyes in tackles, registering nine and eight, respectively. Middle linebacker Josey Jewell missed a majority of the game after being disqualified for targeting in the first quarter.

Last year's Jim Thorpe Award winner, Desmond King, had five tackles and amassed 85 yards in returns on special teams; 70 yards on two kickoff returns and 15 yards on one punt return.

True freshman Keith Duncan was perfect in his collegiate debut at placekicker for the Hawkeyes, converting all six PAT's and making his only field goal attempt (22 yards).

Daniels and his brother James (center) became the first Hawkeye brothers to start in the same game since Kent (SS) and Kevin (DB) Ellis in 1980.

The win was Iowa's eighth straight home win and 13th consecutive regular season triumph, dating back to 2015.

### GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 14 points in each of the first three quarters to post a convincing 42-3 victory over Iowa State at Kinnick Stadium and retain possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The 39-point victory and Iowa's 42 points are the largest margin of victory and the Hawkeyes' most points scored in the series since a 63-20 Iowa win in 1997.

Five different players scored Iowa's six touchdowns -- Akrum Wadley (2), George Kittle, LeShun Daniels, C.J. Beathard, and Matt VandeBerg.

Iowa jumped out to a 14-0 advantage after Beathard touchdown passes of nine and 26 yards to Kittle and Wadley, respectively.

The Hawkeyes added a pair of second-quarter touchdowns on a VandeBerg 12-yard scoring reception and a Beathard 1-yard plunge.

Iowa's third quarter touchdowns were scored by Wadley (3-yard run) and Daniels (43-yard run). It marked the second consecutive game that Daniels ran for a 43-yard touchdown.

Beathard finished the contest completing 19-of-28 passes for 235 yards and four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing). The signal caller became the 10th Iowa quarterback to surpass 4,000 career passing yards in the second half.

Daniels rushed for a game-best 112 yards and one touchdown on 15 attempts. It marked the third time in his career the senior rushed for over 100 yards.

VandeBerg had a game and career-high 129 yards receiving with one touchdown on seven catches. The senior receiver has topped 100 yards receiving twice in his career with both contests coming against Iowa State.

Defensively, linebacker Josey Jewell led the Hawkeyes with nine tackles. Defensive tackle Jaleel Johnson had seven tackles, including two sacks. Linebacker Ben Niemann had three tackles and intercepted the first pass of his career in the third quarter, which resulted in an Iowa touchdown two plays later.

The Hawkeye defense limited Iowa State to 16 first downs, 291 yards of total offense, and 3-of-15 on third downs.

### GAME RECAP

North Dakota State scored the final nine points, including a game-winning 37-yard field goal as time expired, to upend 11th-ranked Iowa, 23-21, at Kinnick Stadium and snap a nine-game home win streak for the Hawkeyes.

The Bison jumped out to a 7-0 advantage in the first quarter after M.J. Stumpf returned a QB C.J. Beathard interception 21 yards for a touchdown. Beathard was hit as he released the ball and Stumpf plucked the ball out of the air.

Iowa scored a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 14-7 advantage into halftime. WR Riley McCarron caught a career-long 30-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play to even the score. The Hawkeyes grabbed a 14-7 lead on their next possession, going 83 yards in three plays, with Matt VandeBerg capping the drive with a 14-yard scoring reception from Beathard.

North Dakota State, winners of five consecutive FCS championships, tied the contest midway through the third quarter on a 1-yard run by RB King Frazier.

Iowa reclaimed the lead on its next possession with a VandeBerg 9-yard catch, his second scoring reception of the game.

North Dakota State closed the game with a Chase Morlock 7-yard touchdown reception and a Cam Pedersen 37-yard field goal in the fourth period. The Bison limited the Hawkeyes to seven plays for -9 yards over the last 15 minutes of the game.

Beathard, who lost his first regular season game in 16 starts, completed 11-of-22 passes for 152 yards and three touchdowns. NDSU quarterback Easton Stick completed 11-of-19 passes for 124 yards and one touchdown.

TE George Kittle led all receivers with five catches and a career-best 110 yards. RB LeShun Daniels had 14 rushes for 29 yards.

North Dakota State totaled 363 yards of offense, with 239 of those yards coming on the ground. The Bison also had the advantage in time of possession, maintaining possession for 36:40 compared to 23:20 for Iowa.

Defensively, three Hawkeye linebackers registered 11 tackles: Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower. Niemann and Bower's totals were career bests. FS Brandon Snyder intercepted the first pass of his career in the first half.

Wadley, a native of Newark, New Jersey, finished the contest with a team-best 122 all-purpose yards (84 rushing yards; 38 receiving yards).

After 29 minutes of scoreless football, tight end George Kittle caught a 36-yard pass from quarterback C.J. Beathard for a touchdown with 34 seconds left in the first half. The Hawkeyes drove 99 yards in eight plays in 90 seconds to take a 7-0 advantage into the locker room.

The Scarlet Knights evened the contest with 12:45 remaining in the fourth quarter when Andre Patton caught a 14-yard pass from quarterback Chris Laviano.

On Rutgers' next offensive possession, Iowa safety Brandon Snyder forced and recovered a fumble on the Scarlet Knights' 21-yard line. Following a five-yard false start penalty, Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on Iowa's next play from scrimmage.

Beathard completed 12-of-23 passes for 162 yards and a touchdown to win his 10th straight Big Ten regular season game.

Kittle caught two passes for 56 yards -- both on the 99-yard scoring drive in the second period -- to lead Hawkeye receivers.

LeShun Daniels, Jr. complemented Wadley's rushing totals with 77 yards on 13 carries.

In addition to Snyder's forced fumble and recovery, the sophomore safety was credited with a career-high 13 tackles. His lone tackle for loss came on a Rutgers fourth down play with under five minutes to play. Linebacker Josey Jewell totaled 12 stops, while defensive end Parker Hesse collected a personal-best two sacks. The Hawkeye defense held the Scarlet Knights to 27 points below their season average entering the game (34.0 ppg).

Iowa's Ron Coluzzi punted seven times for a 42.0 average, including placing four kicks inside the 20. His efforts earned the senior Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

Laviano completed 13-of-24 passes for 190 yards and a touchdown, while Robert Martin rushed a game-high 106 yards on 21 attempts for the Scarlet Knights.

### GAME RECAP

Northwestern's Austin Carr caught three touchdowns -- two in the second half -- to help the Wildcats spoil Iowa's Homecoming with a 38-31 win over the Hawkeyes in Kinnick Stadium.

With Iowa leading 24-17, Northwestern scored touchdowns on three straight possessions spanning the third and fourth quarters to give the visitors a 38-24 advantage. The Hawkeyes closed the margin to 38-31 after a 1-yard scoring run by LeShun Daniels, Jr. with 8:10 remaining in the contest. However, Northwestern thwarted a potential game-tying drive by the Hawkeyes by intercepting a QB C.J. Beathard pass on its 36-yard line with 58 seconds left.

The Wildcats led 10-7 after the first period, scoring on a Clayton Thorson 4-yard scoring run and 25-yard Jack Mitchell field goal. Iowa's first points came on RB Akrum Wadley's 5-yard touchdown run, which was setup by Desmond King's 32-yard punt return. King finished the contest with a game-best 162 yards in returns (85 kickoffs, 77 punts).

Northwestern took a 17-7 lead early in the second quarter on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Thorson to Carr. The Hawkeyes took a 21-17 lead into half after scoring touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the second period. Wadley scored for the second time -- this time from six yards -- and Riley McCarron caught a 15-yard pass from Beathard.

Iowa extended its lead to 24-17 with a 24-yard PK Keith Duncan field goal on its first possession of the third period. Northwestern scored three second-half touchdowns via a pair of Carr receptions (16, 25) and a Justin Jackson 58-yard run.

Beathard completed 19-of-27 passes for 204 yards, with one touchdown and one interception. Thorson completed 18-of-30 passes for 164 yards and three touchdowns for Northwestern.

Daniels led Iowa's ground attack with 72 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries, while Riley McCarron paced the Hawkeye receivers with a team-best 170 all-purpose yards. McCarron had career highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (78), while also registering 92 yards in returns (54 kickoffs, 38 punts).

Iowa linebacker Josey Jewell led all tacklers with a personal-best 16 tackles, including 1.5 for loss. Lineman Ifeadi Odenigbo had four of Northwestern's six sacks.

### GAME RECAP

Junior RB Akrum Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on a 54-yard run with 5:28 left in the fourth quarter in a 14-7 Iowa victory over Minnesota played at TCF Bank Stadium.

With the win, Iowa retains possession of the Floyd of Rosedale traveling trophy and extended its road win streak to eight games, tying a school record. The Hawkeyes have won seven straight Big Ten road games, its longest streak in school history, and have won six straight trophy games.

Iowa took a 3-0 lead into halftime after a K Keith Duncan 22-yard field goal in the second quarter. The Hawkeyes extended their lead to 6-0 on Duncan's second field goal, this one from 28 yards on their first drive of the third quarter.

Minnesota claimed a 7-6 lead on a 9-yard scoring run by Shannon Brooks on its first offensive possession of the second half. That remained the score until Wadley scored from 54 yards -- Iowa's longest play from scrimmage this season. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., followed the touchdown run with a 2-point conversion rush. The score for Wadley pushed his career scoring total to 102 points.

The Gophers had an opportunity to even the score, driving to Iowa's 13-yard line in the final minute. However, Iowa's defense stood tall, forcing four straight incomplete passes.

Beathard completed 17-of-31 passes for 142 yards, improving to 8-0 in true road games as a starter. The Hawkeye signal caller helped engineer Iowa's fifth fourth-quarter game-winning drive the last two years.

Wadley finished with 107 yards and a TD on 14 attempts. His rushing totals pushed Wadley over the 1,000 rushing yards milestone, becoming the 46th Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

WR Riley McCarron led the team in receiving for the second straight game, catching six passes for 62 yards.

Defensively, Iowa forced eight three-and-outs and collected three takeaways. FS Brandon Snyder was responsible for two of Iowa's three takeaways, recovering a fumble and intercepting a pass. True freshman CB Manny Rugamba intercepted his first career pass to account for the third takeaway.

Iowa won its first two Big Ten road games by identical 14-7 scores (Rutgers, Minnesota). The Hawkeyes have won two road contests, while scoring 14 or fewer points in the same season, for the first time since 1928.

## GAME RECAP

Six different Hawkeyes scored touchdowns en route to a 49-35 Iowa win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium. The win extended Iowa's school-record road win streak to nine games.

Iowa scored touchdowns on all three of its first-quarter possessions to take a commanding 21-0 lead after 15 minutes. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. and QB C.J. Beathard scored on runs of one and 15 yards, respectively. WR Riley McCarron caught a career-long 42-yard pass from Beathard on Iowa's third offensive possession.

Daniels crossed the goal line with a 4-yard run to extend Iowa's advantage to 28-0 in the second quarter. Daniels has posted five multi-touchdown games in his career, two coming against the Boilermakers. After a Purdue touchdown, RB Akrum Wadley scampered a career-long 75 yards for a score to give the Hawkeyes a 35-7 halftime cushion. Iowa scored touchdowns on five-of-six first-half possessions.

Iowa and Purdue traded touchdowns in the third period. The Hawkeyes' sixth touchdown was scored by true freshman TE Noah Fant on a 5-yard pass from Beathard. The scoring reception was the first of Fant's career.

Iowa's final score came via DB Desmond King. The Hawkeye senior returned his first interception of the season 41 yards for a touchdown. It marked the ninth straight season the Hawkeyes have returned at least one interception for a touchdown. It marked the third career pick-six for King.

Iowa rushed for a season-high 365 yards on 53 attempts. The 365 yards equal the second most yards gained on the ground during the Kirk Ferentz era. The 49 points are the most the Hawkeyes have ever scored at Ross-Ade Stadium and are the most scored by Iowa in a Big Ten contest since scoring 55 against Minnesota in 2008.

Wadley (170) and Daniels (156) combined for 326 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. It marked the first time since 2008 that a pair of Hawkeye running backs eclipsed the century mark in the same game.

Beathard completed 10-of-17 passes for 140 yards and accounted for three touchdowns (2 pass, 1 rush), while Purdue's David Blough completed 30-of-60 passes for 458 yards and five touchdowns.

Iowa's defense yielded a season-low 46 yards rushing. In addition to the interception, King had four tackles, while linebacker Bo Bower had a team-high 10 stops.

### GAME RECAP

No. 10 Wisconsin limited Iowa to three field goals and held on for a 17-9 win over the Hawkeyes in Kinnick Stadium. The Badgers snapped Iowa's six-game win streak in rivalry trophy games and regained possession of the Heartland Trophy.

The visitors scored first at the 10:06 mark of the second period on a 17-yard touchdown strike from QB Bart Houston to TE Troy Fumagalli.

The Hawkeyes kicked field goals of 41 and 47 yards by Keith Duncan and Miguel Recinos, respectively, in the second period and trailed 7-6 at halftime. The Recinos field goal was the first of his career.

Prior to the Recinos field goal, Iowa LB Josey Jewell forced a Wisconsin fumble on Iowa's goal line, which CB Desmond King recovered in the end zone to thwart the Badger scoring threat and keep it a one-possession game.

The Badgers increased their lead to 14-6 after a RB Corey Clement 1-yard score with 7:20 remaining in the third quarter.

Desmond King returned the ensuing kickoff 77 yards, which resulted in a 25-yard field goal by Duncan as Iowa trimmed the deficit to 17-9. Iowa attempted an onside kick, but the Hawkeyes were unable to come away with the ball before it bounced out-of-bounds.

Wisconsin totaled 423 yards of offense, converted 8-of-17 on third downs, committed no penalties, and maintained possession for 37:02. The win marked the sixth straight time in the series that the visiting team came away victorious.

### GAME RECAP

Iowa lost its first road game in nearly two years, falling to No. 12 Penn State, 41-14, at Beaver Stadium. Penn State's win snapped Iowa's school-record nine-game road win streak.

Iowa, playing its second straight game against a top-15 opponent, was unable to slow down a Penn State offense that totaled 599 yards and 24 first downs.

The Hawkeyes, who entered the game averaging 168 yards rushing per game, were limited to 30 yards rushing on 26 attempts. RB Akrum Wadley was Iowa's leading rusher with 28 yards on nine carries.

Penn State scored on four of its six first-half possessions. The home team scored the only points of the first quarter on a Saeed Blacknall 19-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Trace McSorley.

The Nittany Lions threatened again on their second offensive possession, but Hawkeye LB Josey Jewell got a hand on Tyler Davis' 30-yard field goal attempt to block the kick. The block was the first of Jewell's career and first by a Hawkeye this season.

Penn State stretched its lead to 21-0 following a Saquon Barkley 57-yard scoring run and a McSorley 1-yard run.

Iowa trimmed the deficit to 21-7 on its final drive of the first half. QB C.J. Beathard connected with Wadley for a 12-yard touchdown on a screen pass, his team-leading 10th score of the season (8 rushing, 2 receiving).

The Nittany Lions drained the final 4:13 of the second quarter, which culminated with a 30-yard field goal as time expired to give the home team a 24-7 halftime advantage.

Penn State scored a field goal in the third quarter and added two touchdowns in the fourth period.

Beathard tossed his second touchdown of the contest with 6:30 remaining, finding Jeminic Smith over the middle for a 36-yard touchdown. The 36-yard catch was the sophomore's second touchdown catch of the season.

Smith matched a career high with five catches for 85 yards and a score, while Beathard completed 16-of-24 for 204 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, FS Brandon Snyder led the Hawkeyes with a game-high 12 tackles, including two for loss. Jewell had 10 stops, his fifth double-digit tackle effort of the season.

### GAME RECAP

For the second time in 31 years, Iowa beat No. 2 Michigan on a last second field goal at Kinnick Stadium. This time it was true freshman Keith Duncan, who converted a 33-yard field goal as time expired to propel the Hawkeyes to a 14-13 victory over the Wolverines. The loss was the first of the season for Michigan, who entered the game a perfect 9-0.

Michigan scored the first 10 points of the first half, scoring on a 26-yard Kenny Allen field goal and a Ty Isaac 7-yard run.

Iowa's defense came up big all night and sparked the Hawkeye offense by scoring the team's first points of the contest. After a 54-yard punt by Iowa's Ron Coluzzi pinned the visitors on their 2-yard line, DT Jaleel Johnson tackled De'Veon Smith in the end zone for a safety.

Later in the second quarter, Iowa scored its only touchdown of the game on a 3-yard scoring strike on fourth down from QB C.J. Beathard to RB Akrum Wadley. Iowa's 2-point conversion attempt failed and Michigan led 10-8 at halftime.

Iowa LB Jack Hockaday forced a Michigan fumble on the opening kickoff of the second half, which resulted in a Duncan 25-yard field goal to give the Hawkeyes an 11-10 advantage.

Michigan reclaimed the lead on a 51-yard field goal by Allen with 9:35 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Late in the game, Iowa's defense forced Michigan into a 3-and-out to get the ball back with 1:23 remaining in the contest. Five plays later Duncan's kick sent Hawkeye fans storming onto the field in jubilation. Duncan's heroics earned the kicker Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week laurels.

Beathard, who led Iowa on fourth-quarter game-winning drive for the sixth time in his career, completed 8-of-19 passes for 66 yards and one touchdown. Wadley totaled 167 all-purpose yards, including a game-best 115 on the ground and 52 yards receiving on five catches.

Johnson's performance of nine tackles, including two for loss, earned the senior Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors. LB Josey Jewell had eight stops, while CB Manny Rugamba earned co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolades after recording four tackles, three pass break-ups and intercepting a pass in his first career start.

Coluzzi had a career night, averaging 47.0 yards on five punts. Five of his kicks were over 50 yards, while three were downed inside the 20. With the victory Iowa is bowl eligible for the 15th time in the past 16 seasons.

## GAME RECAP

Iowa's offense rushed for 262 yards and three touchdowns, while its defense silenced Illinois in a 28-0 road victory at Memorial Stadium. The shutout was Iowa's first against a Big Ten opponent since 2009 (12-0 vs. Minnesota) and first on the road since 2008 (55-0 at Minnesota).

The game, which was played in cold (36 degrees) and windy conditions (WNW 20-25 mph), didn't see its first points until Iowa WR Riley McCarron returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown with 4:33 remaining in the second quarter. It marked Iowa's first punt return for a score since 2014 (Drew Ott returned a Nebraska punt 12 yards). McCarron was recognized by the Big Ten as co-Special Teams Player of the Week.

The Hawkeyes extended their lead to 14-0, after RB LeShun Daniels crossed the goal line on a 1-yard run, capping a 12-play, 77-yard drive midway through the third period.

Daniels, who's efforts earned the senior Big Ten co-Offensive Player of the Week accolades, scored his second touchdown of the game with 7:17 left in the fourth period on a 50-yard run to increase Iowa's lead to 21-0.

Iowa true freshman CB Manny Rugamba forced and recovered a fumble on the ensuing kickoff, which resulted in an Akrum Wadley 2-yard touchdown run five plays later.

Daniels (159) and Wadley (82) combined for 241 of Iowa's 342 total yards of offense. C.J. Beathard improved to 10-1 in true road games as Iowa's starting quarterback, completing 9-of-17 passes for 80 yards in the windy conditions. WR Jermic Smith caught two passes for 33 yards. He has caught a pass in 11 straight games.

Iowa's defense amassed seven tackles for loss, two sacks, and forced two turnovers (fumble, interception). Iowa forced Illinois to punt on its first 10 possessions, a streak that was snapped by a CB Desmond King interception in the third quarter. Illinois' final four drives ended with an interception, turnover on downs, fumble, and turnover on downs.

LB Josey Jewell was credited with a team-best 10 tackles, while Anthony Gair registered a career-best eight stops. In addition to his forced fumble and recovery, Rugamba had seven tackles.

The Hawkeyes have now beaten the Fighting Illini eight of the last nine meetings, including three straight.
