QUICK HITTERS

- Twelve different Hawkeyes have scored at least one goal in 2016. Iowa had eight players score during the 2015 campaign.
- Of Iowa's 21 goals, 14 have come in the second half or later, with one goal in overtime and 13 in the second half.
- Goalkeeper Claire Graves is third in the Big Ten in saves with 46. She has started every match this season.
- Eight players -- Rose Ripslinger, Devin Burns, Natalie Winters, Isabella Blackman, Kaleigh Haus, Rachele Armand, Morgan Kemerling, and Olivia Fiegel -- have scored the first goals of their careers this season.
- Junior Karly Stuenkel is second on the team with four goals and three assists for 11 points this season.
- Iowa had a six-game winning streak from Aug. 21-Sept. 9. It was the longest streak for the program since 2013.
- Iowa is outshooting opponents by a margin of 191-149.





Dave Dilanni is entering his third season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 242-35-20 (.843) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .843 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his second season in Iowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 7-10-1 overall record. Senior Hannah Clark led the Big Ten in saves (105), saves per game (5.83), and tied for sixth in shutouts (six). Clark ended her career as the winningest goalkeeper in program history (36 victories) and was tops in the record books in career shutouts (26) and third in career saves (321).

Dilanni's squad earned the NSCAA Ethics and Sportsmanship Award and six student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

On the recruiting front, Dilanni's 2016 class garnered national recognition, being ranked 28th by BigSoccer.com.

In his first season in Iowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, Iowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

SCOUTING PURDUE

- Purdue brings a 3-7-0 record into Friday's match, with a 1-4-0 record on the road.
- Hannah Leinert, Andrea Petrina, and Mikayla Lasky lead the Boilermakers with two goals each.
- Purdue has one Big Ten victory, defeating Illinois, 2-0, on the road in its Big Ten opener.
- The Boilermakers returns six starters from last season, three seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore. Senior Maddy Williams scored eight goals for Purdue last year, leading the team in goals, assists, and points for the third year in a row.
- Purdue has found the back of the net nine times this season, with its only shutout coming against Illinois.
- Goalkeepers Erika Yohn and Jordan Ginther have split time between the posts, with 450 minutes apiece. Yohn has made 28 saves, while Ginther has tallied 27. Purdue returned all three of its goalkeepers from last season.

PURDUE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- Iowa owns a 7-6-3 all-time record against Purdue. The Hawkeyes most recent victory over the Boilermakers came in 2014 when Iowa won, 3-1, in Iowa City.

FAB FIVE

Five freshmen have scored their first career goals for the Hawkeyes this season. Devin Burns and Olivia Fiegel are leading the class, finding the back of the net twice each. Natalie Winters, Isabella Blackman, and Kaleigh Haus have all scored once.

TOELLE PACES TEAM

Senior Bri Toelle leads the team with five goals and 12 points this season. The Virginia native has matched her career best five goals from last season. She led the team with 15 points and five assists in 2015.

OFFENSIVE BARRAGE

- Through the first 12 games of the season, the Hawkeyes are one of the top offensive teams in the Big Ten. Iowa ranks in the top five in four different offensive categories -- second in goals (21), second in points (61), tied for 3rd in assists (19), and third in shots (191).
- Iowa ranks in the top 50 in the country for assists, with 19 total assists, they are ranked 44th.
- The Hawkeyes have scored two or more goals in six games, including five strikes in a victory over SIUE. They were the most goals since 2012.
- Iowa's five goal output is tied for the high water mark in the Big Ten this season and the team's seven assists are the most in the conference in a game this season.

IN GOAL

Freshman Claire Graves has started every game for the Hawkeyes, making 46 saves -- the third-most in the Big Ten -- and posting a 1.86 goals against average.

- The Indiana native made seven saves en route to her first career victory at Missouri and she posted her first career shutout in a 1-0 victory over Eastern Michigan.
- Graves made a career-high nine saves in the 1-0 loss to Michigan on Sept. 16.

STUENKEL X 2

Junior Karly Stuenkel tallied the second two-goal game of her career in Iowa's 4-1 victory over Colorado State on Sept. 2. The St. Charles, Illinois, native is one of two Hawkeyes (Bri Toelle) to tally a two-goal game this season. Toelle had her first career multi-goal game in Iowa's 3-2 win over Wyoming.

B1G HONORS

Iowa has earned weekly Big Ten Conference recognition twice during the 2016 season.

- Junior Karly Stuenkel was the Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 after scoring three goals and adding an assist in Iowa wins over Colorado State and SIU Edwardsville.
- Forward Olivia Fiegel was the Freshman of the Week on Sept. 13 after scoring goals in road games at Iowa State and Colorado. The goal against the Cyclones was her first career game-winner.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS

- Iowa's nine player freshmen class was ranked as the 28th-best recruiting class in the nation by BigSoccer.com.
- Two freshmen -- Natalie Winters and Hannah Drkulec -- have national team experience. Winters has competed in six U18 Women's National Team camps, while Drkulec played on the Croatian Women's National Team in 2015.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Juniors Rachele Armand and sophomore Aubree Larson are Iowa's team captains for the 2016 season. Larson will miss the entire season because of injury.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

The Hawkeyes have two new additions to the coaching staff for the 2016 season in interim assistant coach Nate Castillo and volunteer assistant Chris Early. Both are UI alums. Castillo joins the program after serving as a high school assistant coach at City High in Iowa City, while Early was an assistant coach at Northwestern State last season.

ON THE HORIZON

After hosting Purdue, the Hawkeyes will hit the road for a pair of Big Ten contests beginning with Minnesota on Oct. 6 at 7 p.m. (CT). Iowa faces Wisconsin in Madison on Oct. 9.
