THIS WEEK

The No. 25 University of Iowa soccer team opens a three-game home stand Thursday, hosting Illinois at 8 p.m. (CT) at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The Hawkeyes will then host Northwestern on Sunday at 1 p.m. Admission is free.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

• Iowa tied a school record, winning its first nine games of the 2019 season. The Hawkeyes also started 9-0-0 in 2013.

• The Hawkeyes fell 1-0 at Purdue on Sept. 22, despite out-shooting the Boilermakers, 10-3. It was Iowa's first loss since last November.

• The Hawkeyes are ranked 25th by TopDrawerSoccer and receiving votes (sitting 26th) in the United Soccer Coaches poll. Iowa had the highest ranking in school history, coming in at No. 19 by United Soccer Coaches on Sept. 17 and 21st by TopDrawerSoccer on Sept. 16.

• Iowa is also ranked fourth in the United Soccer Coaches North Region rankings.

• The Hawkeyes have scored a Big Ten-best 27 goals through the first 10 games of the 2019 season. The figure is fifth nationally.

• lowa has already suprassed its 2018 win total (8-7-3).

• lowa is 2-0-0 this season against ACC foes, defeating No. 14 NC State, 1-0, on Sept. 6 and Notre Dame, 3-2, on Sept. 15. The victory over the Wolfpack was the team's third-highest rated opponent lowa has defeated in school history.

DRKULEC DOES IT ALL

Senior Hannah Drkulec was named a Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 17 following her first career two-goal game in the road win at Notre Dame. One of the two strikes was Drkulec's first career game-winner.

• Drkulec became the third Big Ten student-athlete all-time to garner Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season (Lisa Grubb, Ohio State, 2001; Izzy Rodriguez, Ohio State, 2018). She was named Defensive Player of the Week on Aug. 27 and Sept. 10.







Dave Dilanni is in his sixth season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 276-62-25 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In five seasons at Iowa, Dilanni has 54-41-5 record.

In 2019, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to an 8-7-3 overall record and a 4-5-2 mark in Big Ten play. Iowa was in Big Ten Tournament contention until the final game, but fell short after battling Northwestern to a 1-1 draw. Junior Natalie Winters was a third-team allregion and third-team All-Big Ten selection -- Iowa's first all-region honoree since 2014.

In the classroom, Iowa earned the United Soccer Team Academic Award for a 12th straight season and the Hawkeyes had two Google Cloud Academic All-Americans -- the first two in program history. Kaleigh Haus was a first-team selection; Hannah Drkulec earned second-team honors. Iowa also had 10 players earn Academic All-Big Ten honors, 25 players with a 3.0 GPA or better, 14 Dean's List, and 4 President's List honorees during the spring semester.

In May, 2019, Dilanni led the Iowa soccer program on its first foreign tour in its history. The Hawkeyes traveled to Germany, Sweden, and Denmark for a 10-day tour.

• Drkulec is Iowa's first Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honoree since Devin Burns in Sept. 2017.

A PROGRAM FIRST

The Hawkeyes debuted in the United Soccer Coaches poll on Sept. 17, coming in at No. 19. It was lowa's highest ranking in school history and the first time the program has been in the United Soccer Coaches poll (previously NSCAA).

• Iowa also joined TopDrawerSoccer's Top 25 for the first time since 2014, when the Hawkeyes were ranked 25th.

ADDITIONAL HAWKEYE HONOREES

• Senior Claire Graves was named the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week on Sept. 10 after posting back-to-back shutouts of No. 14 NC State and UNC Greensboro. She was also named honorable mention on TopDrawerSoccer's National Team of the Week on Sept. 10.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

The Hawkeyes rank among the top 15 in the nation in four categories. Iowa is first in penalty kicks (1.000), seventh in goals (27), eighth in points (75), and 14th in scoring (2.70).

• Senior Natalie Winters is 12th nationally with three game-winning goals and first in penalty kicks (1.000, 3-for-3).

• Senior Claire Graves is eighth nationally and tied for the Big Ten lead with six shutouts.

B1G LEADERS

• The Hawkeyes are leading the Big Ten in all six offensive categories -- goals (27), points (75), shots (166), goals per game (2.70), assists (21), and assists per game (2.10).

• Seniors Devin Burns, Hannah Drkulec, and Natalie Winters are tied for seventh in the Big Ten with four goals.

• Freshman Melina Hegelheimer and senior Devin Burns are tied for sixth in the league with three assists and ninth in assists per game (.30).

• Devin Burns is fifth in the conference with 30 shots and sixth in shots per game (3.00). Burns is also tied for sixth in points (11).

• Senior Natalie Winters is tied for second in game-winning goals with three.

IOWA'S DEFENSE HAS...

 allowed seven or fewer shots in seven of its 10 games. Iowa allowed just two shots in three games -- wins over Western Michigan, Northern Iowa, and Northern Colorado -and three shots in the road loss at Purdue.

• posted five shutouts, including back-to-back-to-back against No. 14 NC State, UNC Greensboro, and Northern Colorado.

OFFENSIVELY SPEAKING

• Iowa is out-shooting its opposition, 165-57, and the Hawkeyes have a 63-29 advantage in corner kicks. The Hawkeyes have 20 or more shots in four games.

• Seven different Hawkeyes have scored a game-winning goal this season, including career firsts from: Hannah Drkulec, Samantha Tawharu, Emma Tokuyama, and Sara Wheaton.

• The Hawkeyes have scored three or more goals in five games this season, including three in four straight contests for the first time since the 2016 season.

• Senior Devin Burns registered a point in straight games -- goals against UNC Greensboro and Northern Colorado and assists at Notre Dame and at Indiana.

I SCORE, YOU SCORE, WE ALL SCORE

The Hawkeyes have scored 27 goals in 10 games (Iowa scored 20 total goals in 2018) and 13 different players have found the back of the net. Fifteen different players have tallied a

point this season.

• Freshmen Gianna Gourley, Sara Wheaton, and Samantha Cary, sophomores Samantha Tawharu, Skylar Alward, and Jenny Cape, and senior Emma Tokuyama have scored their first career goals this season.

• Iowa scored six goals in its 6-1 victory over Northern Iowa on Aug. 25 -- the most for the program since 2017. The six goals (and six assists in the game) are tied for the most in a single game in the Big Ten this season.

DOWN GOES NO. 14

• The Hawkeyes' 1-0 victory at No. 14 NC State was the program's third-highest ranked victory in its history and the highest ranked opponent since 2013.

• Iowa defeated No. 7 Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament guarterfinals in 2013. The program also knocked off 12th-ranked Wisconsin in 1999.

PERFECT PK

Senior Natalie Winters has scored four goals -- with three coming on penalty kicks. She is a perfect 7-for-7 in her career in penalty kicks.

HOME COOKIN' AT THE ISC

The Hawkeyes are undefeated in five games at home this season and unbeaten in their last 15 games at the Iowa Soccer Complex, posting a 12-0-3 record. Iowa won seven games at home in 2018 -- the most since 2013.

HAWKEYE TIDBITS

• The Hawkeyes are 4-1 on the road this season, a year after going 1-7-0 away from lowa City.

• Iowa posted a 1-0 road win at Indiana in its Big Ten Conference opener. It was the Hawkeyes first victory in a league opener since 2014 and the first on the road in school history.

90-MINUTE CLUB

lowa has five position players that are a part of the 90-minute club. The club includes: Riley Whitaker (7 games), Hannah Drkulec (4), Sara Wheaton (4), Samantha Cary (4), and Isabella Blackman (3).

QUICK ATTACK

• The Hawkeyes' offense has come out fast, scoring in the game's first seven minutes in four contests -- (UNI (6:58), Illinois State (0:47), UNC Greensboro (3:52), Northern Colorado (6:09).

• Iowa has scored first in eight of 10 games this season. The Hawkeyes fell behind in the road win at Notre Dame, but responded by scoring three times in a 10-minute stretch in the 3-2 victory.

EXPERIENCE GALORE

• The Hawkeyes boast a roster featuring 12 seniors and 14 total upperclassmen. The 12 seniors are believed to be the most by a team in the nation.

• The 12 seniors have combined to start 386 games in their collegiate careers.

 Midfielder Natalie Winters has started 67 of 68 games as a Hawkeye, Claire Graves has started 60 contests, and Isabella Blackman has started 58 games.

GRAVES CLIMBING IOWA RECORD BOOKS

Senior Claire Graves currently ranks in the top-five in three career categories in Iowa history. The Indiana native is second in career shutouts (22), third in career victories (32), and fifth in career saves (210).

BURNS AMONG CAREER LEADERS

• Senior Devin Burns has scored four goals during the 2019 season, giving her 18 career goals, which are tied for sixth-most in school history with Bri Toelle. Linzy Wolman is fifth with 21 goals.

• Burns is also tied for third all-time with nine career game-winning goals.

• She currently has 47 career points -- five points shy of tying Toelle (52) for sixth place all-time.

HAWKEYE TIDBITS

The Hawkeyes were picked to finish 10th in the Big Ten preseason poll.
Seniors Hannah Drkulec and Isabella Blackman were voted the Hawkeyes' team captains for the 2019 season.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS

• The Illini bring a four-game winning streak into Thursday's game in Iowa City with victories over Illinois State (3-2), Butler (2-1), Colorado College (2-0), and Northwestern (3-1).

• Illinois, who is receiving votes in the United Soccer Coaches poll, coming in at No. 29, is 7-1-0 overall and 1-0-0 in Big Ten play this season. The Illini's only loss came on a neutral field against San Francisco by the score of 3-0 on Sept. 1.

Hope Breslin, Makena Silber, and Maggie Hillman each have four strikes.

• Goalkeeper Jaelyn Cunningham has surrendered 12 goals in eight games, where she has a 1.50 goals against average. Cunningham has made 31 saves and posted one shutout.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN

• The Wildcats have lost three straight games heading into Thursday's road game at Nebraska. Northwestern is 2-5-1 overall, 0-1-0 in Big Ten play, with victories over William & Mary and at Cincinnati.

• Northwestern and Iowa have both played one common opponent in Notre Dame. Iowa was victorious in South Bend, 3-2, while the Wildcats fell, 4-0.

• Northwestern has scored six goals in eight contests, tying for last in the Big Ten with Minnesota and Nebraska. The goals have come from six different Wildcat players, including lowa City native Regan Steigleder.

• Mackenzie Wood has played all but 11 minutes in goal for Northwestern, where she has posted a 1.60 goals against average, allowing 13 goals and making 24 saves.

SERIES RECORDS

• Iowa is 8-14-1 all-time against Illinois and 7-13-2 all-time against Northwestern.

• The Hawkeyes have won three of the last four meetings over the Fighting Illini, including a 1-0 road win in 2017.

• Iowa is 2-2-1 against Northwestern under head coach Dave Dilanni. Last season the two teams battled to a 1-1 draw in Iowa City, a result that kept both teams out of the Big Ten Tournament.
