QUICK HITTERS

- Eleven different Hawkeyes have scored at least one goal in 2016. Iowa had eight players score during the 2015 campaign.
- lowa has started at least five freshmen in every game this season.
- Seven players Karly Stuenkel, Natalie Winters, Rachele Armand, Morgan Kemerling, Amanda Lulek, Hannah Drkulec, and Claire Graves — have been in the starting lineup in each of the first eight matches.
- Eight players Rose Ripslinger, Devin Burns, Natalie Winters, Isabella Blackman, Kaleigh Haus, Rachele Armand, Morgan Kemerling, and Olivia Fiegel — have scored the first goals of their career this season.
- lowa had a six-game winning streak from Aug. 21-Sept. 9. It was the longest streak fro the program since 2013.







Dave Dilanni is entering his third season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 242-35-20 (.843) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .843 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his second season in Iowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 7-10-1 overall record. Senior Hannah Clark led the Big Ten in saves (105), saves per game (5.83), and tied for sixth in shutouts (six). Clark ended her career as the winningest goalkeeper in program history (36 victories) and was tops in the record books in career shutouts (26) and third in career saves (321).

Dilanni's squad earned the NSCAA Ethics and Sportsmanship Award and six student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

On the recruiting front, Dilanni's 2016 class garnered national recognition, being ranked 28th by BigSoccer.com.

In his first season in Iowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, lowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

- Michigan brings a 4-1-1 record into Friday's game after posting a pair of shutout victories over Ole Miss and UC Riverside.
- Michigan has scored 15 goals in six matches with eight different players finding the back of the net. Junior Ani Sarkisian leads the Wolverines with four goals and three assists.
- Goalkeeper Sarah Jackson has made 18 saves in 450 minutes, producing a 0.60 goals against average.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE

- The Spartans bring a 3-3-1 record to Sunday's match, dropping a 2-1 match against Oregon State in overtime last week, before downing Detroit at home, 2-0, on Sept. 11 for their second shutout of the season.
- Four players are responsible for the Spartans seven goals with Marisa Oleksiak leading the team with three strikes.
- Kaitlyn Collin is the lone goalie for MSU, she has made 47 saves, with a 1.10 goals against average.

THE SERIES

- Michigan leads the all-time series over lowa, 3-16-2. The Hawkeyes fell 0-1 last season against the Wolverines. lowa's last victory over Michigan came in the 2013 Big Ten Tournament, the Hawkeyes defeated a seventh ranked Michigan team, 1-0.
- lowa trails Michigan State, 6-9-5 in the all-time series.
- The Hawkeyes defeated MSU in double overtime during the 2013 season and again posting a 1-0 victory over the Spartans in the 2014 regular season, during head coach Dave Dilanni's first season at Iowa.

FAB FIVE

Five freshmen have scored their first career goals for the Hawkeyes this season. Devin Burns and Olivia Fiegel are leading the class, finding the back of the net twice each. Natalie Winters, Isabella Blackman, and Kaleigh Haus have all scored once.

TOELLE PACES TEAM

Senior Bri Toelle leads the team with five goals and 12 points this season. The Virginia native tied her career best five goals from last season. She led the team with 15 points and five assists in 2015.

FIEGEL EARNS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Olivia Fiegel earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after scoring two goals on three shots this past weekend. Her first career goal came against lowa State, scoring the game winner, the second was the team's lone goal against Colorado.

OFFENSIVE BARRAGE

- Through the first eight games of the season, the Hawkeyes are one of the top offensive teams in the nation. Iowa ranks in the top 20 in the country in four different offensive categories — tied for 13th in goals (21), tied for 14th in points (61), tied for 14th in assists (19), and tied for 19th in scoring offense (2.63).
- lowa is also atop the Big Ten statistical rankings in goals, points, and assists.
- The Hawkeyes have scored two or more goals in six of eight games, including 5 strikes in a victory over SIUE. They were the most goals since 2012.
- lowa's five goal output is tied for the high water mark in the Big Ten this season.
- lowa had seven assists and 17 points against SIUE the most in a Big Ten game this season.

IN GOAL

Freshman Claire Graves has started every game for the Hawkeyes, making 28 saves -- the fifth-most in the Big Ten — and posting a 1.85 goals against average. The Indiana native made seven saves en route to her first career victory at Missouri and she posted her first career shutout in a 1-0 victory over Eastern Michigan. Sophomore Emma Rigby has appeared in three contests, making five saves without allowing a goal in 89:57 minutes in goal.

STUENKEL X 2

Junior Karly Stuenkel tallied the second two-goal game of her career in lowa's 4-1 victory over Colorado State on Sept. 2. The St. Charles, Illinois, native is one of two Hawkeyes (Bri Toelle) to tally a two-goal game this season. Toelle had her first career multi-goal game in lowa's 3-2 win over Wyoming.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS

- lowa's nine player freshmen class was ranked as the 28th-best recruiting class in the nation by BigSoccer.com.
- Two freshmen -- Natalie Winters and Hannah Drkulec -- have national team experience. Winters has competed in six U18 Women's National Team camps, while Drkulec played on the Croatian Women's National Team in 2015.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Juniors Rachele Armand and sophomore Aubree Larson are lowa's team captains for the 2016 season. Larson will miss the entire season because of injury.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

The Hawkeyes have two new additions to the coaching staff for the 2016 season in interim assistant coach Nate Castillo and volunteer assistant Chris Early. Both are UI alums. Castillo joins the program after serving as a high school assistant coach at City High in Iowa City, while Early was an assistant coach at Northwestern State last season.

The Hawkeyes will travel east for a pair of road matches beginning with Penn State on Sept. 23 and Ohio State on Sept. 25.
