THE SERIES -- Michigan holds a 41-14-4 advantage in the series that began with a 28-5 lowa win in 1900. lowa is 7-16-1 all-time in games played in lowa City. lowa has won the last three meetings inside Kinnick Stadium (2009, 2011, 2013). The Wolverines' last win in lowa City snapped lowa's school-record 22-game home winning streak (23-20 in overtime on Oct. 22, 2005).

THE RECORDS - - Iowa is 5-4 overall and 3-3 in the Big Ten. In nonconference play, Iowa defeated Miami, Ohio (45-21) and Iowa State (42-3), and lost to North Dakota State (23-21). In conference play, Iowa won 14-7 at Rutgers, dropped a 38-31 home decision to Northwestern, won 14-7 at Minnesota, won 49-35 at Purdue, lost to Wisconsin, 17-9, and lost at Penn State, 41-14.

Michigan (9-0, 6-0) has defeated Hawai'i (63-3), Central Florida (51-14), Colorado (45-28), Penn State (49-10), Wisconsin (14-7), Rutgers (78-0), Illinois (41-8), Michigan State (32-23), and Maryland (59-3).

<u>COACHING RECORDS</u> - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st year as a college head coach and 18th year as lowa's head coach. His career record is 144-112. He is 132-91 at lowa. He ranks seventh in the Big Ten Conference in overall coaching victories and in conference victories.

Jim Harbaugh is in his second season at Michigan, where he has posted a 19-3 record. Overall Harbaugh is in his ninth season as a college head coach with a record of 77-30.

<u>AFTER THIS</u> - - Iowa travels to Illinois (TBA, BTN). Michigan returns home to host Indiana (3:30 p.m. ET, ABC/ESPN/ESPN2).

- lowa is playing under the lights at Kinnick Stadium for the 14th time. The Hawkeyes have won their last three home night games and are 9-4 all-time under the lights at Kinnick, including a 30-28 win over Michigan in 2009.
- lowa has won the last three home meetings against Michigan (24-21 in 2013; 24-16 in 2011, 30-28 in 2009). Michigan's last win at Kinnick (23-20 OT in 2005) snapped Iowa's 22-game home winning streak.
- lowa defeated No. 13 Michigan, 24-16, on Nov. 5, 2011, at Kinnick Stadium. It was Iowa's last home win over a ranked opponent.
- Kirk Ferentz is two wins shy of tying Lloyd Carr for sixth place in all-time conference wins. Ferentz has won 79 Big Ten games since 1999, seventh among the conference's all-time winningest coaches. Carr won 81 Big Ten games coaching at Michigan from 1995-2007.
- Desmond King is a Jim Thorpe and Bednarik Award semifinalist, and Lott IMPACT Award quarterfinalist. King in the only B1G player in the last 20 years with 12+ career interceptions and 1,500+ combined kickoff/punt return yards. King has 12 career interceptions and 1,658 career KO/P return yards.
- LB Josey Jewell is a Butkus Award Semifinalist and leads the Big Ten with 87 tackles.

 Jewell matched his career high with 16 stops in Week 8 against Wisconsin. He has 264 career tackles, 25th all-time. He blocked his first career field goal Week 9 at Penn State.
- RB Akrum Wadley is Iowa's leading rusher (664 yards) and second leading receiver (23 receptions). Wadley has combined for 12 catches, 104 yards receiving, and a receiving touchdown the past two weeks. His 10 touchdowns (8 rushing, 2 receiving) tie for third in the Big Ten.
- DT Jaleel Johnson is tied for fourth in the Big Ten with 5.5 sacks (36 yards). Johnson recorded a career-high two sacks against Wisconsin in Week 8, raising his season total to a career-best 5.5. He entered the year with five career sacks.
- lowa is 5-4 overall, one win from securing bowl eligibility for the 15th time in the last 16 seasons. The Hawkeyes have had a 5-4 record four times under Kirk Ferentz and each time they advanced to a bowl game (2013 Outback, 2008 Outback, 2005 Outback, 2001 Alamo).
- lowa's .929 red zone success rate ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 9 nationally. The Hawkeyes have scored points on 26-of-28 trips to the red zone, including 20 touchdowns (8 pass, 12 rush) and seven field goals.

He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and recently served as director of on-campus recruiting (2012-13) before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

THE SERIES

Michigan holds a 41-14-4 advantage in the series that began with a 28-5 lowa win in 1900. The first meeting between the two teams was played in Detroit and the second in Chicago. Iowa is 7-16-1 all-time in games played in Iowa City. Saturday will mark the third time the teams have met with Michigan ranked No. 2 in the nation. Iowa, ranked first at the time, defeated Michigan on a last-second field goal to win 12-10 in 1985 in Iowa City. Michigan won 20-6 in 2006 in Ann Arbor when the Wolverines were ranked second and Iowa was unranked.

LAST MEETING: Nov. 23, 2013 - Iowa City, Iowa

Trailing by 14 points at halftime, Iowa scored 17 unanswered points in the second half to post a 24-21 come-from-behind victory over Michigan in Kinnick Stadium. The win was Iowa's third straight over the Wolverines in Iowa City, a first for the Hawkeyes in the series.

The game was played in frigid conditions, with an opening kickoff temperature of 18 degrees and the wind chill hovering around zero to make it one of the coldest games ever played in Iowa City.

Each team scored a first-quarter touchdown -- Michigan via a 7-yard interception return and lowa by way of a TE C.J. Fiedorowicz 5-yard scoring strike from QB Jake Rudock.

The Wolverines grabbed a 14-7 advantage after a second Rudock interception in the second quarter and went into halftime leading 21-7 after Michigan QB Devin Gardner threw his second touchdown pass. The Iowa defense was outstanding in the second half, allowing no points, three first downs, forcing four 3-and-outs, forcing and recovering a fumble, and limiting Michigan to 45 total yards (nine rushing yards) the final 30 minutes.

On the third play from scrimmage to start the second half, Rudock connected with WR Tevaun Smith for a 55-yard touchdown pass. The Hawkeyes

evened the score early in the fourth period on a RB Mark Weisman 9-yard scoring run. The junior finished the game with 88 yards on the ground.

PK Mike Meyer split the uprights from 34 yards away, into the wind, to give lowa its first lead of the contest (24-21) with 6:02 remaining.

With less than three minutes left and Michigan in Iowa territory, LB Anthony Hitchens forced and recovered a Gardner fumble to help preserve the victory on "Senior Day".

Rudock completed 19-of-30 passes for 239 yards and two scores, while Smith caught five passes for a career-high 97 yards and touchdown.

Hitchens, fellow senior LB James Morris and junior DT Carl Davis led lowa with eight tackles each. Hitchens collected three tackles-for-loss to go with his caused and recovered fumble. The lowa defense collected 11 tackles-for-loss and seven pass break-ups.

HARBAUGH HOMECOMING

Michigan head coach Jim Harbaugh lived in Iowa City when his father, Jack Harbaugh, was an assistant coach at Iowa from 1971-73. His father left Iowa after the 1973 season to take an assistant coaching position at Michigan.

Jim Harbaugh returned to Iowa City as the quarterback for No. 2 Michigan in 1985. The top-ranked Hawkeyes beat the Wolverines, 12-10, on Rob Houghtlin's 29-yard field goal as time expired. Harbaugh was 8-of-13 passing for 55 yards and a touchdown. He was sacked one time and rushed three times for two yards.

KING LANDS ON AWARDS LIST

DB Desmond King is one of 16 semifinalists for the 2016 Jim Thorpe Award, (best defensive back in college football), one of 18 semifinalists for the Bednarik Award (most outstanding defensive player), and one of 19 quarterfinalists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy (Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity).

King has started all nine games at cornerback in 2016 and has 47 career starts. This season he has recorded 30 solo tackles and 15 assists, leads lowa with six pass break-ups, and had a 41-yard interception return for a touchdown in a win at Purdue.

King also leads lowa's special teams through nine games. He is averaging 29.2 yards per kickoff return to rank 10th in the nation. He is also averaging 9.2 yards on punt returns. King had a career-best 77-yard kickoff return in Week 8 against Wisconsin. It is lowa's longest play of the season.

King is the only Big Ten player in the last 20 years to have 12 or more interceptions and 1,500 or more combined kickoff and return yards. King has 12 career interceptions, tied for sixth most in program history, and 1,658 combined return yards on kickoff and punt returns.

King won the Jim Thorpe Award in 2015. Three finalists for the 2016 award will be announced on Monday, Nov. 21, with the winner being announced Dec. 8 at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show airing on ESPN. The Thorpe Award winner will be honored at a banquet in Oklahoma City on Feb. 7, 2017.

The Bednarik award, in conjunction with the NCFAA, will announce three finalists on Nov. 21. Winners of the prestigious award will be unveiled during the Home Depot College Football Awards show on Dec. 8, which will be broadcast live on ESPN.

The Lott IMPACT Trophy was founded in 2004, and is named after College and Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott. The semifinal list will be announced on Wednesday, Nov. 9, with four finalists being announced on Wednesday, Nov. 30. Each school of the four finalists will receive \$5,000 for their general scholarship fund, while the school of the winner will receive \$25,000.

BEATHARD'S FOURTH-QUARTER GAME-WINNING DRIVES

QB C.J. Beathard has led lowa to victories five times when the Hawkeyes have trailed or been tied in the fourth quarter. On fourth-quarter game-winning drives, Beathard is a combined 9-of-11 passing for 73 yards and one touchdown. He has four carries for 29 yards, including three first downs.

JEWELL A FINALIST FOR BUTKUS AWARD

LB Josey Jewell, the Big Ten's leading tackler, is a semifinalist for the 2016 Butkus Award, presented annually to the nation's best linebacker.

This year's watch list includes a dozen collegiate linebackers from 10 universities. Jewell is among four Big Ten student-athletes up for the award, joining Jerome Baker and Raekwon McMillan of Ohio State and Wisconsin's Jack Cichy. Finalists for the award will be announced on Nov. 21, with the winner being announced on or before Dec. 6.

Jewell (6-foot-2, 230-pounds) has started every game this season and leads the Big Ten with 87 tackles. Jewell matched his career high with 16 stops in Week 8 against No. 10 Wisconsin. His 264 career tackles ties Rod Barnhart for 25th in program history. In 2015, Jewell garnered second team All-Big Ten honors by league coaches and media, the Associated Press, and Phil Steele.

Former Hawkeye Larry Station was a finalist for the Butkus Award in 1985, while Chad Greenway was a semifinalist in 2005.

RUN AFTER HANDOFF, RUN AFTER CATCH

RB Akrum Wadley is lowa's leading rusher (664 yards) and second leading receiver (23 receptions). Wadley has combined for 12 catches, 104 yards receiving, and a receiving touchdown the past two weeks. He posted career bests in receptions (7) and receiving yards (72) in Week 8 against Wisconsin, and shared the team lead with five receptions in Week 9 at Penn State (32 yards, TD). Wadley entered the season with seven career receptions (93 yards, TD). His 23 receptions (220 yards) rank third among Big Ten running backs.

Wadley's 10 touchdowns (8 rush, 2 receiving) tie for third in the Big Ten.

RB Akrum Wadley and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. rank seventh and ninth, respectively, in the Big Ten in rushing yards. The Hawkeyes are the only team in the Big Ten with two players in the top 10. Twenty-two yards separate lowa's leading rushers. Wadley has 664 rushing yards (73.8 ypg) and Daniels has 642 rushing yards (71.3 ypg). Wadley's eight rushing touchdowns ties for fourth in the league. Daniel's six rushing scores ties for 11th.

Both players topped 100 yards in Week 7 at Purdue, marking the first time since 2008 lowa had two 100-yard rushers in the same game (Shonn Greene, 115; Jewel Hampton, 114 yards vs. Indiana). It marked the 24th time two players rushed for 100 yards or more in the same game, but the first time two players reached the 150-yard plateau.

Daniels had two rushing touchdowns (1, 4) against the Boilermakers, his fifth career multi-touchdown game. His 67-yard rush in the third quarter was the longest of his career. He finished with 23 carries for 150 yards.

Wadley's 75-yard touchdown rush was a career long rush, and lowa's longest play of the season from scrimmage. He finished with 15 carries for 176 yards, his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, second in a row.

The duo helped lowa rush for 365 yards against the Boilermakers, tying for the second most rushing yardage total in the Ferentz era (Minnesota, 2002).

Daniels has 1,482 career rushing yards (25th) and Wadley 1,336 (29th). Wadley has scored 114 career points (26th), Daniels has 92.

I'LL TAKE THAT

lowa is plus-six in turnover margin, fourth in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes have 12 takeaways (five interceptions, seven fumble recoveries) and have turned eight of the 12 into touchdowns, including DB Desmond King's interception return for a touchdown Week 7 at Purdue. It was King's third career pick-six. Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last nine seasons, and 14 of the last 16.

FS Brandon Snyder has four of Iowa's 12 takeaways. He recorded his first career interception in Week 3 vs. NDSU, caused and recovered a fumble that led to the winning touchdown at Rutgers in Week 4, and had two takeaways at Minnesota in Week 6 (one interception, one fumble recovery). He also forced a fumble against Northwestern in Week 5 that led to an Iowa touchdown.

lowa has lost just one fumble this year, tying Nevada for the NCAA lead.

VANDEBERG TO MISS GAMES DUE TO INJURY

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg is out of action indefinitely, due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. VandeBerg (6-1, 190), played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury.

VandeBerg has 106 career receptions, tying Quinn Early for 19th in program history. He has 1,302 career receiving yards, 27th in program history. Should he miss the entire season, the fourth-year senior could be granted a medical redshirt and return for a fifth season in 2017.

lowa leads the Big Ten in redzone offense. The Hawkeyes have scored points on 26-of-28 trips to the red zone, including 20 touchdowns (8 pass, 12 rush) and seven field goals. lowa turned it over on downs in its only failed red zone appearance at Rutgers, and missed a field goal after reaching the red zone against Wisconsin. Its .929 red zone success rate ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 9 nationally.

Eight different Hawkeyes have scored red zone touchdowns. Iowa's rushing touchdowns include five by RB Akrum Wadley, four by RB LeShun Daniels, two by QB C.J. Beathard, and one by RB Derrick Mitchell. The receiving touchdowns have gone to WR Matt VandeBerg (3), WR Jerminic Smith (1), WR Riley McCarron (1), TE George Kittle (1), TE Noah Fant (1), and Wadley (1).

lowa made its 29th Bowl game appearance (14-14-1) at the 102nd Rose Bowl Game in Pasadena, California. The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (six times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

- lowa has played 13 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-7), including nine January bowl games (4-5).
- lowa has been bowl eligible 14 of the last 15 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz. lowa's 13 bowl appearances since 2001 tie as the 11th best total in the nation.
- lowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 46 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (44), Iowa (29), and Wisconsin (27).

The others include Mike and Jay Macintyre (Colorado), Mark and Gunner Hudspeth (UL-Lafayette), Rick and Brent Stockstill (Middle Tennessee), Bobby and Derek Wilder (Old Dominion), Butch and Alex Jones (Tennessee), and Kyle and Alex Whittingham (Utah).

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

lowa has nine players on its 2016 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), DE Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Ten true freshmen have seen action in 2016, including RB Toks Akinribade, K Keith Duncan, TE Noah Fant, DB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DE Cedrick Lattimore, DB Manny Rugamba, QB Nathan Stanley, LB Kristian Welch, and WR Devonte Young.

Fant caught a touchdown pass at Purdue in Week 7, becoming the first true freshman to catch a touchdown pass since Jordan Canzeri in 2011.

Stanley has played in five games. He is the first true freshman to play quarterback since Drew Tate in 2003. Tate appeared in six games (no starts) and was 6-of-11 for 55 yards and one touchdown (no interceptions).

NELSON NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

DE Anthony Nelson was named Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Week for his performance in Iowa's 45-21 win over Miami, Ohio in Week 1.

Nelson forced two Miami fumbles in his first career game, with both leading to Iowa touchdowns. He recorded 2.5 sacks for minus 16 yards, and had yet another sack nullified by a Miami delay of game penalty. Nelson was credited with two solo tackles, four assists and one pass breakup.

Nelson's first caused turnover came in the first quarter as Miami had reached the Hawkeye eight-yard line. Matt Nelson recovered the fumble and the Hawkeye offense traveled 81 yards in two plays for a touchdown and a 21-0 advantage.

Nelson's second forced fumble came late in the game and led to lowa's final touchdown in the closing minutes.

The Big Ten honor is the first for Nelson. Iowa players earned weekly honors from the Big Ten on six occasions in 2015, including DE Parker Hesse, who earned Freshman of The Week honors in the regular season finale at Nebraska, a 28-20 Hawkeye win.

COLUZZI EARNED BIG TEN HONOR

Senior Ron Coluzzi was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his play in Iowa's 14-7 win at Rutgers. The weekly honor is the first for the graduate transfer who is in his first season with the Hawkeyes. Coluzzi (5-11, 182-pounds) is a native of Naperville, Illinois, who previously played at Central Michigan.

In Iowa's win over Rutgers, Coluzzi averaged 42 yards on seven punts, with a long of 55 yards. Four of his kicks were placed inside the 20, as Rutgers recorded zero yards on just one return. Coluzzi also had recorded touchbacks on all three of his kickoffs, allowing no returns.

BEATHARD EARNED COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS WEEKLY AWARD

QB C.J. Beathard was named College Sports Madness Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week following his performance against Iowa State in Week 2. Beathard accounted for four first half touchdowns -- three passing and one rushing -- to lead Iowa to a 42-3 win in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He completed 19-of-28 passes for 235 yards and matched his career best with three touchdown passes.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

lowa's roster of 117 players includes 53 players from Iowa. The roster includes 18 players from Illinois; seven from Michigan, six from Maryland, five from Missouri and Texas, four from Wisconsin, three from Ohio and South Dakota, two from Florida, Minnesota, Nebraska, and New Jersey, and one from Canada, Indiana, North Carolina, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.

BAND OF BROTHERS

The Hawkeyes have five sets of brothers on the 2016 roster. In the season opener against Miami (Ohio), C James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels became the first Hawkeye brothers to start in the same game since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980.

No other school in the country has more sets of brothers than lowa. OL Ryan Ward and younger brother OLB Kevin return for their fourth and final season together. Twins OL Landan and Levi Paulsen are back after redshirting their freshman year in 2015. They are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. LB Ben Niemann welcomes younger brother LB Nick Niemann to the team this year, as does SS Miles Taylor, whose younger brother LB Kyle is in his first year on campus.

MORE THAN ONE

Seventeen high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; East English Village HS in Detroit, Michigan; and Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois all graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include Davenport Assumption (Davenport, Iowa), Cedar Falls HS (Cedar Falls, Iowa), Gonzaga College HS (Silver Spring, Maryland), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Kennedy HS (Cedar Rapids, Iowa), Naperville Central HS (Naperville, Iowa), Pella HS (Pella, Iowa), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Solon HS (Solon, Iowa), Sycamore HS (Sycamore, Iowa), Waukee HS (Waukee, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), and Woodbury Central HS (Moville, Iowa).

THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE

Freshman PK Keith Duncan is the lightest Hawkeyes player at 165 pounds. Freshman DB Manny Rugamba is the lightest position player at 172 pounds. Senior DL Jaleel Johnson and sophomore OL Dalton Ferguson are the heaviest Hawkeyes at 310 pounds. A total of 10 Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more. The tallest player, at 6-8, is sophomore DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is junior WR Jonathan Parker.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players in its 2016 Leadership Group, including nine seniors and seven juniors. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle, DB Greg Mabin, WR Riley McCarron, and WR Matt VandeBerg. The junior class is represented by DL Nathan Bazata, OL Ike Boettger, LB Bo Bower, LB Josey Jewell, OL Boone Myers, LB Ben Niemann, and OL Sean Welsh.

GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

The Hawkeyes opened 2016 with three straight home games against Miami, Ohio (W, 45-21), Iowa State (W, 42-3), and North Dakota State (L, 23-21).

For the first time in program history, Iowa is playing a nine-game conference schedule. Iowa plays five Big Ten road games and hosts four conference schools, including Northwestern (L, 38-31), Wisconsin (L, 17-9), Michigan (Nov. 12) and Nebraska (Nov. 25).

The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, or Ohio State, during the regular season.

Seven of Iowa's 12 opponents played in the postseason. Six Big Ten opponents participated in bowl competition (4-2). North Dakota State has won the FCS national championship five consecutive years.

lowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2016. The Hawkeyes defended the Cy-Hawk trophy with a 42-3 win against lowa State and Floyd of Rosedale with a 14-7 triumph at Minnesota. Iowa lost to Wisconsin 17-9 in a battle for the Heartland Trophy. Iowa will defend one more rivalry trophy this season, Nov. 25 against Nebraska.

For the second straight year, and second time in program history, lowa will play more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa defeated Iowa State, 42-3, on Sept. 10 in a game that kicked off at 6:42 p.m. The Hawkeyes host Michigan Saturday at 7 p.m.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Austin Blythe, a seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, became the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach. In each of Ferentz's 17 complete seasons, the Hawkeyes had a future NFL player start on the offensive line.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 22 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 24 Hawkeyes are on active NFL rosters.

- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.

FERENTZ CAPTURES NATIONAL AWARDS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz returns to the lowa sideline for an 18th season as the reigning national coach of the year. Ferentz was named Woody Hayes Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year by the FWAA, and winner of the 2015 Dodd Trophy, presented annually by the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. He was named American Football Coaches Association Region 3 Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year and George Munger Coach of the Year awards.

Ferentz was also named Dave McClain and Hayes-Schembechler Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015), being recognized by both league coaches and media. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.

Ferentz led Iowa to a school record 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won the Big Ten West Division title (8-0) and advanced to the Big Ten title game for the first time in the game's five-year history. The Hawkeyes reclaimed all four of their rivalry trophies in 2015, and reached as high as third in the Associated Press poll (Nov. 22).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 18th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is tied with Oklahoma's Bob Stoops as the longest active FBS head coaches. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998, one day after Stoops was named head coach at Oklahoma. Stoops was a Hawkeye letterman from 1979-82.

IOWA AT THE HEAD OF CLASS IN COACHING LANDSCAPE

The University of Iowa has produced four active FBS head coaches, tied with Alabama for most in the country. Bret Bielema (Arkansas), Bob Diaco (UCONN), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), and Mark Stoops (Kentucky) all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Bielema, Diaco, Bob Stoops, and Mark Stoops played for former UI head coach Hayden Fry. All four head coaches served as assistants under Fry. Bielema was an assistant coach on Kirk Ferentz's staff from 1999-2001.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Applebee's in Coralville.

lowa has deferred to the second half each time it has won the coin toss this season, bucking the "we will receive" philosophy practiced in Kirk Ferentz's first 17 seasons. Iowa is 4-2 this season when starting the game on defense. In 18 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Ferentz and the Hawkeyes have opened on defense in 48-of-223 games (27-21). Iowa has started the game on offense in 175-of-223 games (105-70).

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is once again available for fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Iowa Football game days. The Hawkeye Express is in its 13th season.

Adults can ride the train for \$12, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 14 of the last 15 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 310 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Desmond King became the seventh Hawkeye to earn a national player of the year award under Kirk Ferentz. He won the Jim Thorpe award in 2015, honoring the nation's top defensive back. Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- lowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in lowa football history, based on total wins. lowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979.
 Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 18th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

GAME RECAP

No. 15/17 lowa rushed for five touchdowns en route to a 45-21 victory over Miami University at Kinnick Stadium. The 45 points are the most points by a Hawkeye team in a season opener since posting 46 against Maine in 2008.

The Hawkeyes sprinted out to a 21-0 advantage in the first quarter after touchdown runs of 1, 11, and 43 yards by Hawkeye tailbacks.

Akrum Wadley rushed for a game-best 121 yards and two touchdowns, LeShun Daniels carried the ball 10 times for 83 yards and two scores, while Derrick Mitchell had 12 yards and a touchdown on two attempts.

lowa's offense ran only 50 plays, but totaled 404 yards, averaging 8.1 yards per play. Directing the Hawkeye offense was quarterback C.J. Beathard, who completed 13-of-20 passes for 192 yards and one touchdown. The senior signal caller completed his first eight passes of the contest.

Matt VandeBerg caught a team-best four passes for 99 yards, while Jerminic Smith had three catches for 51 yards, including his first career touchdown reception.

The Hawkeye defense forced and recovered three Miami fumbles -- two of which came in the first period -- while the lowa offense converted the RedHawk miscues into 21 points.

Linebackers Ben Niemann and Bo Bower led the Hawkeyes in tackles, registering nine and eight, respectively. Middle linebacker Josey Jewell missed a majority of the game after being disqualified for targeting in the first quarter.

Last year's Jim Thorpe Award winner, Desmond King, had five tackles and amassed 85 yards in returns on special teams; 70 yards on two kickoff returns and 15 yards on one punt return.

True freshman Keith Duncan was perfect in his collegiate debut at placekicker for the Hawkeyes, converting all six PAT's and making his only field goal attempt (22 yards).

Daniels and his brother James (center) became the first Hawkeye brothers to start in the same game since Kent (SS) and Kevin (DB) Ellis in 1980.

The win was Iowa's eighth straight home win and 13th consecutive regular season triumph, dating back to 2015.

GAME RECAP

lowa scored 14 points in each of the first three quarters to post a convincing 42-3 victory over lowa State at Kinnick Stadium and retain possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The 39-point victory and lowa's 42 points are the largest margin of victory and the Hawkeyes' most points scored in the series since a 63-20 lowa win in 1997.

Five different players scored lowa's six touchdowns -- Akrum Wadley (2), George Kittle, LeShun Daniels, C.J. Beathard, and Matt VandeBerg.

lowa jumped out to a 14-0 advantage after Beathard touchdown passes of nine and 26 yards to Kittle and Wadley, respectively.

The Hawkeyes added a pair of second-quarter touchdowns on a VandeBerg 12-yard scoring reception and a Beathard 1-yard plunge.

lowa's third quarter touchdowns were scored by Wadley (3-yard run) and Daniels (43-yard run). It marked the second consecutive game that Daniels ran for a 43-yard touchdown.

Beathard finished the contest completing 19-of-28 passes for 235 yards and four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing). The signal caller became the 10th lowa quarterback to surpass 4,000 career passing yards in the second half.

Daniels rushed for a game-best 112 yards and one touchdown on 15 attempts. It marked the third time in his career the senior rushed for over 100 yards.

VandeBerg had a game and career-high 129 yards receiving with one touchdown on seven catches. The senior receiver has topped 100 yards receiving twice in his career with both contests coming against lowa State.

Defensively, linebacker Josey Jewell led the Hawkeyes with nine tackles. Defensive tackle Jaleel Johnson had seven tackles, including two sacks. Linebacker Ben Niemann had three tackles and intercepted the first pass of his career in the third quarter, which resulted in an lowa touchdown two plays later.

The Hawkeye defense limited lowa State to 16 first downs, 291 yards of total offense, and 3-of-15 on third downs.

GAME RECAP

North Dakota State scored the final nine points, including a game-winning 37-yard field goal as time expired, to upend 11th-ranked lowa, 23-21, at Kinnick Stadium and snap a nine-game home win streak for the Hawkeyes.

The Bison jumped out to a 7-0 advantage in the first quarter after M.J. Stumpf returned a QB C.J. Beathard interception 21 yards for a touchdown. Beathard was hit as he released the ball and Stumpf plucked the ball out of the air.

lowa scored a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 14-7 advantage into halftime. WR Riley McCarron caught a career-long 30-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play to even the score. The Hawkeyes grabbed a 14-7 lead on their next possession, going 83 yards in three plays, with Matt VandeBerg capping the drive with a 14-yard scoring reception from Beathard.

North Dakota State, winners of five consecutive FCS championships, tied the contest midway through the third quarter on a 1-yard run by RB King Frazier.

lowa reclaimed the lead on its next possession with a VandeBerg 9-yard catch, his second scoring reception of the game.

North Dakota State closed the game with a Chase Morlock 7-yard touchdown reception and a Cam Pedersen 37-yard field goal in the fourth period. The Bison limited the Hawkeyes to seven plays for -9 yards over the last 15 minutes of the game.

Beathard, who lost his first regular season game in 16 starts, completed 11-of-22 passes for 152 yards and three touchdowns. NDSU quarterback Easton Stick completed 11-of-19 passes for 124 yards and one touchdown.

TE George Kittle led all receivers with five catches and a career-best 110 yards. RB LeShun Daniels had 14 rushes for 29 yards.

North Dakota State totaled 363 yards of offense, with 239 of those yards coming on the ground. The Bison also had the advantage in time of possession, maintaining possession for 36:40 compared to 23:20 for lowa.

Defensively, three Hawkeye linebackers registered 11 tackles: Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower. Niemann and Bower's totals were career bests. FS Brandon Snyder intercepted the first pass of his career in the first half.

Akrum Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on a 26-yard run in the fourth quarter to lift lowa to a 14-7 victory over Rutgers in the Big Ten opener for both teams at High Point Solutions Stadium. The contest was the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

Wadley, a native of Newark, New Jersey, finished the contest with a team-best 122 all-purpose yards (84 rushing yards; 38 receiving yards).

After 29 minutes of scoreless football, tight end George Kittle caught a 36-yard pass from quarterback C.J. Beathard for a touchdown with 34 seconds left in the first half. The Hawkeyes drove 99 yards in eight plays in 90 seconds to take a 7-0 advantage into the locker room.

The Scarlet Knights evened the contest with 12:45 remaining in the fourth quarter when Andre Patton caught a 14-yard pass from quarterback Chris Laviano.

On Rutgers' next offensive possession, lowa safety Brandon Snyder forced and recovered a fumble on the Scarlet Knights' 21-yard line. Following a five-yard false start penalty, Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on lowa's next play from scrimmage.

Beathard completed 12-of-23 passes for 162 yards and a touchdown to win his 10th straight Big Ten regular season game. Kittle caught two passes for 56 yards -- both on the 99-yard scoring drive in the second period -- to lead Hawkeye receivers. LeShun Daniels, Jr. complemented Wadley's rushing totals with 77 yards on 13 carries.

In addition to Snyder's forced fumble and recovery, the sophomore safety was credited with a career-high 13 tackles. His lone tackle for loss came on a Rutgers fourth down play with under five minutes to play. Linebacker Josey Jewell totaled 12 stops, while defensive end Parker Hesse collected a personal-best two sacks. The Hawkeye defense held the Scarlet Knights to 27 points below their season average entering the game (34.0 ppg).

lowa's Ron Coluzzi punted seven times for a 42.0 average, including placing four kicks inside the 20. His efforts earned the senior Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors. Laviano completed 13-of-24 passes for 190 yards and a touchdown, while Robert Martin rushed a game-high 106 yards on 21 attempts for the Scarlet Knights.

Northwestern's Austin Carr caught three touchdowns -- two in the second half -- to help the Wildcats spoil lowa's Homecoming with a 38-31 win over the Hawkeyes in Kinnick Stadium.

With lowa leading 24-17, Northwestern scored touchdowns on three straight possessions spanning the third and fourth quarters to give the visitors a 38-24 advantage. The Hawkeyes closed the margin to 38-31 after a 1-yard scoring run by LeShun Daniels, Jr. with 8:10 remaining in the contest. However, Northwestern thwarted a potential game-tying drive by the Hawkeyes by intercepting a QB C.J. Beathard pass on its 36-yard line with 58 seconds left.

The Wildcats led 10-7 after the first period, scoring on a Clayton Thorson 4-yard scoring run and 25-yard Jack Mitchell field goal. Iowa's first points came on RB Akrum Wadley's 5-yard touchdown run, which was setup by Desmond King's 32-yard punt return. King finished the contest with a gamebest 162 yards in returns (85 kickoffs, 77 punts).

Northwestern took a 17-7 lead early in the second quarter on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Thorson to Carr. The Hawkeyes took a 21-17 lead into half after scoring touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the second period. Wadley scored for the second time -- this time from six yards -- and Riley McCarron caught a 15-yard pass from Beathard.

lowa extended its lead to 24-17 with a 24-yard PK Keith Duncan field goal on its first possession of the third period. Northwestern scored three second-half touchdowns via a pair of Carr receptions (16, 25) and a Justin Jackson 58-yard run.

Beathard completed 19-of-27 passes for 204 yards, with one touchdown and one interception. Thorson completed 18-of-30 passes for 164 yards and three touchdowns for Northwestern.

Daniels led lowa's ground attack with 72 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries, while Riley McCarron paced the Hawkeye receivers with a team-best 170 all-purpose yards. McCarron had career highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (78), while also registering 92 yards in returns (54 kickoffs, 38 punts).

lowa linebacker Josey Jewell led all tacklers with a personal-best 16 tackles, including 1.5 for loss. Lineman Ifeadi Odenigbo had four of Northwestern's six sacks.

Junior RB Akrum Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on a 54-yard run with 5:28 left in the fourth quarter in a 14-7 lowa victory over Minnesota played at TCF Bank Stadium.

With the win, Iowa retains possession of the Floyd of Rosedale traveling trophy and extended its road win streak to eight games, tying a school record. The Hawkeyes have won seven straight Big Ten road games, its longest streak in school history, and have won six straight trophy games.

lowa took a 3-0 lead into halftime after a K Keith Duncan 22-yard field goal in the second quarter. The Hawkeyes extended their lead to 6-0 on Duncan's second field goal, this one from 28 yards on their first drive of the third quarter.

Minnesota claimed a 7-6 lead on a 9-yard scoring run by Shannon Brooks on its first offensive possession of the second half. That remained the score until Wadley scored from 54 yards -- lowa's longest play from scrimmage this season. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., followed the touchdown run with a 2-point conversion rush. The score for Wadley pushed his career scoring total to 102 points.

The Gophers had an opportunity to even the score, driving to lowa's 13-yard line in the final minute. However, lowa's defense stood tall, forcing four straight incomplete passes.

Beathard completed 17-of-31 passes for 142 yards, improving to 8-0 in true road games as a starter. The Hawkeye signal caller helped engineer lowa's fifth fourth-quarter game-winning drive the last two years.

Wadley finished with 107 yards and a TD on 14 attempts. His rushing totals pushed Wadley over the 1,000 rushing yards milestone, becoming the 46th Hawkeye to accomplish the feat. WR Riley McCarron led the team in receiving for the

second straight game, catching six passes for 62 yards.

Defensively, Iowa forced eight three-and-outs and collected three takeaways. FS Brandon Snyder was responsible for two of Iowa's three takeaways, recovering a fumble and intercepting a pass. True freshman CB Manny Rugamba intercepted his first career pass to account for the third takeaway.

lowa won its first two Big Ten road games by identical 14-7 scores (Rutgers, Minnesota). The Hawkeyes have won two road contests, while scoring 14 or fewer points in the same season, for the first time since 1928.

GAME RECAP

Six different Hawkeyes scored touchdowns en route to a 49-35 lowa win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium. The win extended lowa's school-record road win streak to nine games.

lowa scored touchdowns on all three of its first-quarter possessions to take a commanding 21-0 lead after 15 minutes. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. and QB C.J. Beathard scored on runs of one and 15 yards, respectively. WR Riley McCarron caught a career-long 42-yard pass from Beathard on lowa's third offensive possession.

Daniels crossed the goal line with a 4-yard run to extend lowa's advantage to 28-0 in the second quarter. Daniels has posted five multi-touchdown games in his career, two coming against the Boilermakers. After a Purdue touchdown, RB Akrum Wadley scampered a career-long 75 yards for a score to give the Hawkeyes a 35-7 halftime cushion. Iowa scored touchdowns on five-of-six first-half possessions.

lowa and Purdue traded touchdowns in the third period. The Hawkeyes' sixth touchdown was scored by true freshman TE Noah Fant on a 5-yard pass from Beathard. The scoring reception was the first of Fant's career.

lowa's final score came via DB Desmond King. The Hawkeye senior returned his first interception of the season 41 yards for a touchdown. It marked the ninth straight season the Hawkeyes have returned at least one interception for a touchdown. It marked the third career pick-six for King.

lowa rushed for a season-high 365 yards on 53 attempts. The 365 yards equal the second most yards gained on the ground during the Kirk Ferentz era. The 49 points are the most the Hawkeyes have ever scored at Ross-Ade Stadium and are the most scored by Iowa in a Big Ten contest since scoring 55 against Minnesota in 2008.

Wadley (170) and Daniels (156) combined for 326 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. It marked the first time since 2008 that a pair of Hawkeye running backs eclipsed the century mark in the same game.

Beathard completed 10-of-17 passes for 140 yards and accounted for three touchdowns (2 pass, 1 rush), while Purdue's David Blough completed 30-of-60 passes for 458 yards and five touchdowns.

lowa's defense yielded a season-low 46 yards rushing. In addition to the interception, King had four tackles, while linebacker Bo Bower had a team-high 10 stops.

GAME RECAP

No. 10 Wisconsin limited lowa to three field goals and held on for a 17-9 win over the Hawkeyes in Kinnick Stadium. The Badgers snapped lowa's six-game win streak in rivalry trophy games and regained possession of the Heartland Trophy.

The visitors scored first at the 10:06 mark of the second period on a 17-yard touchdown strike from QB Bart Houston to TE Troy Fumagalli.

The Hawkeyes kicked field goals of 41 and 47 yards by Keith Duncan and Miguel Recinos, respectively, in the second period and trailed 7-6 at halftime. The Recinos field goal was the first of his career.

Prior to the Recinos field goal, Iowa LB Josey Jewell forced a Wisconsin fumble on Iowa's goal line, which CB Desmond King recovered in the end zone to thwart the Badger scoring threat and keep it a one-possession game.

The Badgers increased their lead to 14-6 after a RB Corey Clement 1-yard score with 7:20 remaining in the third quarter.

After missing his first two field goal attempts, K Andrew Endicott split the uprights from 36 yards with 1:24 left in the fourth quarter to extend Wisconsin's advantage to 17-6.

Desmond King returned the ensuing kickoff 77 yards, which resulted in a 25-yard field goal by Duncan as Iowa trimmed the deficit to 17-9. Iowa attempted an onside kick, but the Hawkeyes were unable to come away with the ball before it bounced out-of-bounds.

Wisconsin totaled 423 yards of offense, converted 8-of-17 on third downs, committed no penalties, and maintained possession for 37:02. The win marked the sixth straight time in the series that the visiting team came away victorious.

Wisconsin's Alex Hornibrook completed 11-of-19 passes for 197 yards, while Clement rushed for a game-high 134 yards and one touchdown on 35 attempts.

lowa QB C.J. Beathard completed 17-of-33 passes for 153 yards. RB Akrum Wadley led the team with 116 all-purpose yards; 72 yards coming on a game and career-high seven receptions. WR Riley McCarron had six catches for 47 yards.

Defensively, Jewell (16) and King (12) each equaled career highs in tackles. DT Jaleel Johnson was credited with a personal-high two sacks.

GAME RECAP

lowa lost its first road game in nearly two years, falling to No. 12 Penn State, 41-14, at Beaver Stadium. Penn State's win snapped lowa's school-record nine-game road win streak.

lowa, playing its second straight game against a top-15 opponent, was unable to slow down a Penn State offense that totaled 599 yards and 24 first downs.

The Hawkeyes, who entered the game averaging 168 yards rushing per game, were limited to 30 yards rushing on 26 attempts. RB Akrum Wadley was lowa's leading rusher with 28 yards on nine carries.

Penn State scored on four of its six first-half possessions. The home team scored the only points of the first quarter on a Saeed Blacknall 19-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Trace McSorley.

The Nittany Lions threatened again on their second offensive possession, but Hawkeye LB Josey Jewell got a hand on Tyler Davis' 30-yard field goal attempt to block the kick. The block was the first of Jewell's career and first by a Hawkeye this season.

Penn State stretched its lead to 21-0 following a Saquon Barkley 57-yard scoring run and a McSorley 1-yard run.

lowa trimmed the deficit to 21-7 on its final drive of the first half. QB C.J. Beathard connected with Wadley for a 12-yard touchdown on a screen pass, his team-leading 10th score of the season (8 rushing, 2 receiving).

The Nittany Lions drained the final 4:13 of the second quarter, which culminated with a 30-yard field goal as time expired to give the home team a 24-7 halftime advantage.

Penn State scored a field goal in the third quarter and added two touchdowns in the fourth period.

Beathard tossed his second touchdown of the contest with 6:30 remaining, finding Jeminic Smith over the middle for a 36-yard touchdown. The 36-yard catch was the sophomore's second touchdown catch of the season.

Smith matched a career high with five catches for 85 yards and a score, while Beathard completed 16-of-24 for 204 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, FS Brandon Snyder led the Hawkeyes with a game-high 12 tackles, including two for loss. Jewell had 10 stops, his fifth double-digit tackle effort of the season.
