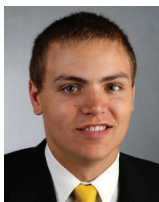

- With one more win, Kirk Ferentz becomes the fifth coach in conference history to win 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (149).
- The last time Iowa and Penn State met with both schools ranked in the AP Top 25 was 2010, when #17 Iowa defeated #20 Penn State, 24-3, in Iowa City. It was Iowa's last win in the series.
- Iowa has scored 40 points or more in its last two B1G road games (Minnesota, Indiana). It is the first time in school history Iowa scored 40-plus points in B1G road games in the same season. Iowa is 12-0 since the start of the 2017 season when scoring 20 points or more.
- Iowa's defense leads the Big Ten and ranks fifth in the country in scoring defense (14.1). The Hawkeyes have held four of their opponents to a season-low in points (Iowa State, Northern Iowa, Indiana, Maryland).
- QB Nate Stanley has 16 touchdown passes this season, second in the Big Ten. He has 42 career touchdown passes, fifth all-time in program history. He is one shy of tying Matt Sherman for fourth all-time.
- TE Noah Fant and TE T.J. Hockenson rank 1-2 on the team in receptions, and have combined for 736 receiving yards on 51 catches, including nine receiving touchdowns. Hockenson leads the team with 424 yards receiving. Fant has six touchdowns, tied for fifth in the Big Ten and tied for the most among all FBS tight ends (Jace Sternberger, Texas A&M).
- The Hawkeyes rank second in the Big Ten and country in rushing defense (79.6). Iowa is second in the Big Ten and third in the country in total defense (258.1).
- Senior C Keegan Render leads an offensive line that has allowed six quarterback sacks, fewest in the Big Ten, tied for ninth nationally. The Hawkeyes start two sophomore offensive tackles (LT Alaric Jackson and RT Tristan Wirfs) and rotate starting guards who have a combined 16 career starts (RG Cole Banwart, RG Dalton Ferguson, and LG Ross Reynolds).
- The Hawkeyes rank fourth in the Big Ten with 22 sacks. DE A.J. Epenesa leads the team and ranks second in the conference with six sacks. DE Anthony Nelson ranks fifth in the Big Ten with five sacks. Nelson recorded a career-best three sacks Week 5 at Minnesota. Epenesa has recorded at least one sack in five of seven games.
- Iowa's defense allows 2.7 yards per carry, sixth in the country. The Hawkeyes are one of three defenses in the country to have allowed only three rushing touchdowns (Alabama, Auburn).

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,240 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 647-554-39 (.537). That includes a 404-220-16 (.643) record in home games, a 243-334-23 (.421) record in games away from Iowa City, a 327-375-25 (.465) mark in Big Ten games and a 288-185-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

6 THROUGH THE AIR

QB Nate Stanley has 16 touchdown passes, second in the Big Ten. He is on pace to throw 29 touchdown passes this season. In 2017, Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for most in a single season in school history.

Stanley has 42 career touchdown passes, fifth most in program history. He is one shy of tying Matt Sherman (43) for fourth all-time.

Stanley set a career high with six touchdown passes Week 6 at Indiana. He threw the six touchdowns to five different players, marking just the second time in program history five different Hawkeyes had a receiving touchdown in the same game. He also had 320 yards passing, the fourth 300-yard passing game of his career (third in the last four weeks). His performance earned him Walter Camp National Player of the Week honors.

Stanley had 14 touchdowns combined from Weeks 3-6. That touchdown total tied for the most ever over a four-game stretch in school history (Chuck Long threw 14 touchdowns over a four-game stretch in 1985). He has four multi-touchdown games this season, and 11 in his career.

Six of Stanley's 16 touchdown passes this season have gone to TE Noah Fant. He and Fant have connected for touchdowns 17 times over the last 20 games.

Stanley threw 26 touchdowns last year, one shy of tying the single-season record held by Chuck Long (27, 1985). Of those 26 touchdown passes, Fant caught a team-high 11 touchdown passes, followed by Nick Easley (4). In total, 20 of Stanley's 26 touchdown targets return in 2018. TE T.J. Hockenson caught three touchdowns from Stanley in 2017, and WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette pulled in two touchdown receptions.

Stanley threw for a season-high 314 yards (third career 300-yard game) and four touchdowns in Week 5's win at Minnesota. His 4,058 career passing yards rank 11th all-time.

DOWN, DOWN, DOWN IN FRONT

The Hawkeyes rank fourth in the Big Ten with 22 sacks. DE A.J. Epenesa leads the team and ranks second in the conference with six sacks. DE Anthony Nelson ranks fifth in the Big Ten with five sacks. Nelson recorded a career-best three sacks Week 5 at Minnesota. Epenesa has recorded at least one sack in five of seven games.

Ten Hawkeyes have contributed to the sack total. DE Parker Hesse has three, DE Chauncey Golston has two, and LB Amani Jones, DT Cedrick Lattimore, DT Brady Reiff, DT Matt Nelson, LB Nick Niemann, and LB Kristian Welch each have one.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 20th season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 149 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 89 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 140-77 (.645) overall mark and an 85-55 (.607) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 12 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 149-98 (.603) and an 89-69 (.563) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 149 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 161-119 (.575).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ BECOMES IOWA'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH, MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz (149-98) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 20th season.

Ferentz's 149 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. Iowa has at least eight wins in three straight seasons and owns a 34-13 mark since 2015.

Ferentz has 89 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 89 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Both Ferentz (149, 89) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 20th seasons on Iowa's staff. Defensive line coach Reese Morgan joined the staff in 1999 and is in his 19th season. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his seventh season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

POCKET PROTECTION

Senior C Keegan Render leads an offensive line that has allowed six quarterback sacks, fewest in the Big Ten. The next closest teams have surrendered 11 sacks.

The Hawkeyes start two sophomore offensive tackles (LT Alaric Jackson and RT Tristan Wirfs) and rotate starting guards who have a combined 16 career starts (RG Cole Banwart, RG Dalton Ferguson, and LG Ross Reynolds). QB Nate Stanley has increased his completion percentage from 55.8 in 2017 to 61.0 in 2018.

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten and rank fifth in the country in scoring defense (14.1). Iowa has held four of its opponents to a season-low in points (Iowa State, Northern Iowa, Indiana, Maryland).

Last week against Maryland, the Hawkeyes recorded the 10th shutout of the Ferentz era, holding the Terps to 115 yards of total offense, the fewest ever allowed to a Big Ten opponent under Ferentz.

The Hawkeyes rank second in the Big Ten in total defense (258.1) and rushing defense (79.6), and third in the conference in passing defense (178.6). Iowa and Michigan are the only schools to rank in the top three in all four defensive categories.

Iowa's rushing defense ranks second in the country. The total defense ranks third, and the scoring defense ranks fifth.

Iowa allows 2.7 yards per carry, sixth in the country, and is one of three defenses in the country to have allowed only three rushing touchdowns (Alabama, Auburn).

The Hawkeyes limited Iowa State to just 19 yards rushing in Week 2, and held Northern Iowa to six rushing yards in Week 3 – a total that ranks second all-time in the Ferentz era (20 years). Iowa has held five of its seven opponents to below 100 yards rushing.

Iowa has allowed 108 first downs, second fewest in the Big Ten and seventh in the country.

NUMBER ONE IN THE LAND

The Hawkeyes lead the country averaging 30.1 yards per kickoff return. WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette has six returns for 200 yards (33.3). Iowa has returned only nine kickoffs this season. Kyle Groeneweg averages 27.0 yards on two returns. Devonte Young has one return for 24 yards.

YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE

TE Noah Fant has 18 career touchdown receptions, more than any other tight end in program history and enough for fourth all-time in program history. He has six touchdowns in 2018, tied for fifth in the Big Ten and tied for the most among all FBS tight ends (Jace Sternberger, Texas A&M). He leads the team with 26 receptions.

Fant's 18 touchdown receptions rank third all-time in Big Ten history by a tight end (Jacob Pedersen, Wisconsin).

Fant had two touchdown receptions against No. 18 Wisconsin in Week 4. It was the fourth multi-touchdown game of his career. Since 2000, the only Big Ten tight ends with four multi-touchdown games are Fant (4) and former Penn State TE Mike Gesicki (4).

Seventeen of Fant's touchdown receptions have come from QB Nate Stanley over the Hawkeyes' last 20 games. His first career touchdown reception came from QB C.J. Beathard (5 yards, at Purdue on Oct. 15, 2016).

His 18 career touchdowns have come from near and far, listed in chronological order: 5, 2, 27, 23, 7, 45, 25, 3, 6, 4, 69, 8, 1, 5, 20, 1, 5, 28.

Fant had 102 yards receiving at Indiana in Week 6. It was his second career 100-yard receiving game (Nebraska, 2017).

Fant was one of 10 conference players named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. He had 30 receptions last season, including a team-high 11 touchdowns, tied for most in the country among FBS tight ends and the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt caught 12 touchdown passes in 2012. Fant led Iowa and all FBS tight ends with 16.5 yards per catch in 2017.

THE OTHER HALF OF THE TWO-HEADED MONSTER

While TE Noah Fant receives national headlines, TE T.J. Hockenson has hauled in a team-high 424 receiving yards on 25 catches, one fewer than Fant. The duo rank 1-2 on the team in receptions, and have combined for 736 receiving yards on 45 catches, including nine receiving touchdowns.

Hockenson added a rushing touchdown to his career stats at Minnesota, taking a direct snap on a fake field goal and rushing four yards for the score. Hockenson has led or shared the team lead in receptions in Weeks 1, 2, 4, and 6. His 17.0 yards per reception rank third on the team.

LAST MEETING – Sept. 23, 2017 (Iowa City, Iowa)

Penn State QB Trace McSorley completed a 7-yard touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson as time expired to lift the Nittany Lions to a narrow 21-19 victory over Iowa at Kinnick Stadium.

Despite being outgained 579 to 273 in total offense and Penn State amassing 99 plays, the Hawkeyes fought the fourth-ranked team to the wire in the conference opener. The game featured four lead changes, including two in the final two minutes of the contest.

Trailing 5-0 in the second quarter, LB Josey Jewell intercepted McSorley and returned the theft 33 yards to the Penn State 21-yard line. Iowa scored on the next play, a 21-yard pass play from QB Nate Stanley to WR Nick Easley. Iowa had one snap inside Penn State territory in the first half and made it count as the Hawkeyes led 7-5 at halftime.

The Nittany Lions scored 10 points in the third quarter on a 21-yard field goal and a Saquon Barkley 8-yard rush.

RB Akrum Wadley scored two fourth quarter touchdowns; first a career-long 70-yard pass play from Stanley, then a 35-yard run with 1:42 remaining.

Penn State drove 80 yards and scored the game-winner on its 12th and final play.

Wadley (80 rush, 75 receiving) totaled 155 yards of Iowa's 273 total offense. Stanley completed 13-of-22 passes for 191 yards and two scores, connecting on 12 of his final 14 attempts.

In addition to the interception, Jewell had a game-high 16 tackles to match his career high. He also had three tackles-for-loss and added two pass break-ups. He was named Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week. DB Amani Hooker had 13 tackles in his first career start.

Barkley paced the Nittany Lions, accumulating a school single-game record 358 all-purpose yards.

PRETTY SPECIAL TEAMS

Iowa leads the country averaging 30.1 yards per kickoff return. WR Ithmir Smith-Marsette averages 33.3 yards on six returns, best in the Big Ten and third in the country. P Colton Rastetter ranks second in the Big Ten, averaging 43.6 yards per punt. K Miguel Recinos connected on a career-best three field goals Week 7 against Maryland. He has made his last seven tries, dating back to Week 3.

KICKING THE TRAVEL BUG

Iowa has scored 40 points or more in its last three conference road games, dating back to last season (56-14 win at Nebraska; 48-31 at Minnesota; 42-16 win at Indiana). The 40-plus points scored at Minnesota and Indiana this season mark the first time in program history Iowa has scored 40 points or more in consecutive road Big Ten games in the same season.

RECEIVERS COME ALIVE AT MINNESOTA

WR Nick Easley, WR Brandon Smith, and WR Ithmir Smith-Marsette combined for 14 catches, 198 yards, and two touchdowns in Iowa's 48-31 win at Minnesota in Week 5. The trio entered the game with a combined 24 catches, 311 yards receiving, and one touchdown).

WR Nick Easley had a team-high six receptions (52 yards, 1 touchdown). Smith-Marsette finished the game with three catches for a career-high 78 yards. His 60-yard touchdown reception was a career-long reception. It is also Iowa's longest play from scrimmage this season. Smith-Marsette added two kickoff returns for 83 yards. Brandon Smith set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (68). He entered the game with five catches for 78 yards.

FOSTER INHERITS FRESH LEGS

Running backs coach Derrick Foster is in his first season on Iowa's staff in charge of a position group that graduated 75 percent of its rushing yards in 2017, and entered 2018 with one combined career start (Toren Young).

RB Toren Young leads the team with 403 yards on a team-best 82 carries. He rushed for a career-high 96 yards at Indiana. He also hauled in his first career touchdown reception.

RB Mekhi Sargent has a team-best four rushing touchdowns. The junior college transfer has 73 carries and 297 rushing yards, second on the team.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin entered the season on top of the depth chart, but missed Weeks 2, 3, and 6 due to injury. He returned to the starting lineup Week 7 against Maryland and set career highs in attempts (24) and yards (98).

The trio of sophomores has combined for 979 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns, four by Sargent, two by Young, and one by Kelly-Martin.

The Hawkeye do not have a junior or senior among the position group. Sophomores Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young are the elder statesmen of the group. Henry Geil is a true freshman (15 carries, 37 yards).

Iowa graduated running backs Akrum Wadley (1,109 yards) and James Butler (396 yards) in 2017. The duo combined for 1,505 rushing yards in 2017.

SPREAD THE WEALTH

For just the second time in school history, five Hawkeyes had a receiving touchdown in a single game (at Indiana). QB Nate Stanley threw a career-best six touchdowns against the Hoosiers, to five different players (Hockenson x2, Fant, Easley, Young, Kelly).

The only other time five different players had a receiving touchdowns in a single game was the 1984 Freedom Bowl – QB Chuck Long threw six touchdowns to five different players (Hayes x2, Smith, Happel, Helverson, Flagg).

In addition to combining for three receiving touchdowns against the Hoosiers, TE Noah Fant (4-102) and TE T.J. Hockenson (4-107) both had 100-yard receiving games Week 6 at Indiana. It is the first time two Hawkeyes had 100 yards receiving in the same game since 2011 (vs. Pitt: K. Davis 10-129, M. McNutt 8-112).

NEW FACES IN THE CROWD

The 2018 season is the first in Kirk Ferentz's 20 years that the Hawkeyes opened the season without a linebacker with a single career start. Iowa has used five different starting linebacker combinations through the first seven weeks.

SS Amani Hooker made his first career start at linebacker Week 5 at Minnesota. He started again Week 6 at Indiana and Week 7 against Maryland. Hooker is the sixth Hawkeye to start at the linebacker position this season. The others include first-time starters LB Djimon Colbert, LB Jack Hockaday, LB Amani Jones, LB Nick Niemann, and LB Kristian Welch.

Week 1 starting linebackers Jones, Welch, and Niemann started for the first time in their careers in Iowa's 33-7 win over Northern Illinois.

Niemann started Week 2 alongside first-time starters Hockaday and Colbert in Iowa's 13-3 win over Iowa State.

Welch returned to the lineup in Week 3, starting alongside Niemann and Hockaday. The same trio started Week 4.

Colbert, Hockaday, and Hooker got the start in Week 5.

Colbert, Welch, and Hooker got the start in Week 6.

Niemann had not missed a start until Week 5. He suffered an injury in the fourth quarter against Wisconsin and did not play at Minnesota or at Indiana. He returned to action Week 7 against Maryland.

Hockaday was the team leader in tackles before exiting Week 5 with an injury. He did not play Week 6 at Indiana. Jones played in Hockaday's absence at Minnesota and led the team in tackles.

Welch ties for the team lead in tackles (40), despite missing Week 2 and seeing limited time in Week 5 due to injury.

The five linebackers (not including Hooker) entered the season with a combined 40 career tackles, 832 fewer career tackles than Iowa's three starting linebackers in 2017 (Josey Jewell 437; Bo Bower, 234; Ben Niemann, 201).

The last time Ferentz had this little starting experience at the linebacker position was in 2014. That year, Quinton Alston, Bo Bower, and Reggie Spearman were Iowa's starting linebackers in the season opener. Only Alston had a previous career start (2012 at Michigan).

In Ferentz's first season in 1999, the opening day starting linebackers -- LeVar Woods, Aaron Kampman, and Derrick Davison had two career starts combined. Both starts belonged to Kampman, who started the final two games in 1998.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl Games.

OL Trey Winters is the son of James Winters, a former All-Big Ten basketball player who led the Hawkeyes in scoring in 1994.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes won their sixth game of the season Oct. 20 against Maryland to become bowl eligible for the 17th time in the last 18 seasons. Iowa has posted a 7-8 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz, most recently defeating Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. FILLING HOLES IN TAKEAWAYS

Iowa has seven interceptions over the last three games. The Hawkeyes had four interceptions in Week 5 at Minnesota, a pair of picks at Indiana in Week 6, and one theft in Week 7 against Maryland.

True freshman DB Riley Moss and true freshman DB Julius Brents both recorded interceptions in their first career starts at Minnesota. Moss had two interceptions for 36 yards. Brents intercepted one pass (0 yards).

Sophomore Geno Stone has started at strong safety Weeks 5-7, his first career starts. He intercepted a pass in each of his first two starts. Stone intercepted Minnesota inside the five-yard line on Minnesota's final play of the game, and had a fourth-quarter interception against Indiana in the endzone.

The Hawkeyes have nine interceptions in 2018, tied for third in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes led the nation with 21 interceptions in 2017. The Hawkeyes return nine of the 21 thefts, led by safeties Jake Gervase (3) and Amani Hooker (2). DE Parker Hesse, Stone, LB Kristian Welch, and DL Brady Reiff also recorded interceptions last season. Iowa lost the nation's leader in interceptions, Josh Jackson (8), and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Josey Jewell (2), to the NFL. Both players were consensus All-Americans.

Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 10 seasons (entering 2018), and 15 of the last 17 seasons.

DE Anthony Nelson recovered a fumble for a touchdown Week 7 against Maryland, marking the 11th straight season Iowa has scored a defensive touchdown.

STANLEY EARNS CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL RECOGNITION

QB Nate Stanley earned recognition from five Big Ten and national organizations following Iowa's 42-16 win at Indiana on Oct. 13. He was named Big Ten Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week, Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week by collegesportsmadness.com, Walter Camp national Offensive Player of the Week, CFP National Player of the Week, and national Quarterback of the Week by Davey O'Brien Award and Manning awards.

Stanley completed 21-of-32 pass attempts against Indiana for 320 yards and six touchdowns. The scoring strikes covered 9, 28, 12, 11, 54, and 4 yards, and included five different receivers.

The six touchdowns tie Chuck Long for the second most in single-game history at Iowa. Long twice threw six touchdowns in a game, while the school record is seven (Chuck Hartlieb versus Northwestern, 1987). Saturday marked Stanley's 11th career multi-touchdown game, and his fourth straight. He had 14 touchdowns between Weeks 3-6, which tied for the most ever over a four-game stretch in school history (Long, 1985).

NELSON EARNS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

DE Anthony Nelson was named Defensive Player of the Week following a three-sack performance in Iowa's 48-31 win at Minnesota on Oct. 6. The honor marks the second time Nelson has been recognized by the Big Ten. He was named Freshman of the Week for his play in a 2016 win over Miami, Ohio.

Nelson matched his career-high with three sacks at Minnesota, all in the first half. He School recorded four solo tackles and one assist in the contest; the Hawkeyes recorded five total sacks and held Minnesota to 86 net rushing yards. He also collected three sacks versus Miami, Ohio, as a redshirt freshman.

Nelson is the second Hawkeye to earn Defensive Player of the Week honors this season, as sophomore defensive end A.J. Epenesa was the co-recipient following Iowa's win over Iowa State. Moss is Iowa's first Freshman of the Week in 2018.

EPENESA NAMED B1G CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DE A.J. Epenesa was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 13-3 win over Iowa State in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series on Sept. 8. Epenesa was also named the league's defensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

The Big Ten honor was the first of Epenesa's career. The native of Glen Carbon, Illinois (Edwardsville HS), recorded a career-best two sacks against Iowa State, causing a fourth quarter fumble that was recovered by teammate Chauncey Golston. Epenesa had five tackles in the game, and added a pass break-up.

MOSS EARNS B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

DB Riley Moss was named Freshman of the Week after recording a pair of interceptions in Iowa's 48-31 win at Minnesota on Oct. 6. The conference weekly honor is the first of his career.

Moss joined the Hawkeye program as a walk-on from Centennial High School in Ankeny, Iowa, and played primarily on special teams in Iowa's first four games. Moss started for the first time at Minnesota and responded with four solo tackles and one assist, to go with two interceptions. He collected his first career theft in the end zone late in the second period. His second interception and 36-yard return led to a Hawkeye field goal and a 41-24 advantage in the fourth quarter.

The group consists of seniors WR Nick Easley, DB Jake Gervase, DE Parker Hesse, LB Aaron Mends, DL Matt Nelson, and OL Keegan Renders, juniors DB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DL Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nate Stanley, and sophomore RB Toren Young.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2018. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his seventh year on staff, his second as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 11th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13, before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

SEEING DOUBLE

Junior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

The last twins to start for the Hawkeyes were SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980.

TROPHY GAMES

Three of Iowa's first five games of the season were trophy games. The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 13-3, to retain the Cy-Hawk trophy in Week 2, lost to No. 18 Wisconsin, 28-17, in a battle for the Heartland Trophy in Week 4, and defeated Minnesota, 48-31, to retain Floyd of Rosedale in Week 5.

Iowa is 12-3 in its last 15 trophy games, with all three losses coming to Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defend the Heroes Trophy, their fourth of four trophy games, on Nov. 23 against Nebraska at Kinnick Stadium.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes sold out Kinnick Stadium in four of their first five games in 2018 (69,250).
- Iowa is 12-0 since the start of the 2017 season when scoring 20 points or more.
- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 16 of the last 17 seasons.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is in his 20th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa is one of 19 teams to have played in at least 15 bowl games since 2001. Among Big Ten schools, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have appeared in more (16).
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 315 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had nine individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 65-43 (.607) since 2010.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 170 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (66 draft picks/104 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak of 41 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- DB Micah Hyde (Buffalo), DL Mike Daniels (Green Bay), and OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2018 NFL Pro Bowl.
- Over the past 16 years, 143-of-165 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 11 years, Iowa has had 40 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (41), and Michigan (40). Since 2010, Iowa has had 33 players drafted in the NFL, tied for second most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (53), Penn State (33), and Wisconsin (33).
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Entering the 2018 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team. The NFL has employed 14 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (9 drafted/5 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 33 points en route to a 33-7 season opening victory over Northern Illinois inside Kinnick Stadium. The win was a historic one for Kirk Ferentz as the head coach, as he surpassed Hayden Fry as the program's all-time winningest coach with 144 career wins.

The Hawkeyes, leading 3-0 at halftime, broke the game open in the second half, scoring touchdowns on four of their six drives while also registering a defensive safety in the fourth quarter.

Three of Iowa's four touchdowns came on the ground, while QB Nate Stanley connected with TE Noah Fant for a 1-yard score for the game's first touchdown midway through the third quarter. Running backs Ivory Kelly-Martin (two yards) and Toren Young (six yards), and QB Peyton Mansell (one yard) accounted for Iowa's rushing touchdowns.

Young (84 yards), Kelly-Martin (62 yards), and Mekhi Sargent (40 yards) combined for 186 rushing yards. Stanley and Mansell combined to complete 13-of-25 passes for 143 yards, with eight of the 13 targets (104 yards) going to tight ends. T.J. Hockenson caught a team-best four balls for 64 yards, Fant had three receptions for 10 yards, while Nate Wieting had one catch for 30 yards.

Iowa's defense amassed eight tackles for loss, including five sacks, and two takeaways (one interception and one fumble recovery). Defensive end Parker Hesse equaled a career best with two sacks. All three Iowa linebackers started their first game, with each registering career bests in tackles: Kristian Welch (11), Amani Jones (6), and Nick Niemann (4). The Hawkeyes limited the Huskies to 65 second-half yards, with 64 of the yards gained coming on NIU's final drive of the game.

On special teams, punter Colten Rastetter averaged 53.8 yards on four punts, including a personal-best 69-yard punt, and Miguel Recinos made all four PAT's and his only field goal attempt (33 yards).

Iowa started an all-Iowa native offensive and defensive line (nine players), marking the first time under Ferentz that four Iowa natives started on the defensive line and the first time since 2016 (week 3) that five Iowa natives started on the offensive line.

Iowa retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy as a result of a 13-3 win over Iowa State at a sold out Kinnick Stadium. The victory was the Hawkeyes' fourth straight in the series, their longest streak over their in-state rivals since winning 15 in a row from 1983-87.

After allowing a field goal on Iowa State's opening drive, Iowa's defense yielded only 122 total yards and no points on the Cyclones' remaining 10 possessions.

Iowa placekicker Miguel Recinos connected on field goals of 31 and 48 yards in the second and third quarters, respectively, to give the Hawkeyes a narrow 6-3 margin going into the fourth quarter. The 48-yard kick matched a career long for Recinos.

In the Hawkeyes' first possession of the fourth quarter, Iowa QB Nate Stanley threw a strike to WR Brandon Smith for 30 yards to the Iowa State 2-yard line, which led to a Mekhi Sargent 2-yard touchdown on the next play. It was the game's only touchdown. The scoring drive covered 83 yards in 13 plays, with Iowa converting three third downs on the touchdown drive.

Iowa allowed only 19 rushing yards on 25 attempts, which ties for the fifth fewest single-game total allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa State's 188 total yards are its fewest in 52 games, since totaling 174 yards versus Baylor in 2013. Iowa's defense totaled four sacks, forced and recovered a fumble, and forced five three-and-outs.

Five Hawkeyes recorded career bests in tackles: DB Matt Hankins (8), LB Jack Hockaday (8), LB Nick Niemann (7), LB Djimon Colbert (5), and DE A.J. Epenesa (5). Two of Epenesa's tackles were sacks. He also forced a fumble and had one pass breakup. Epenesa's efforts earned the sophomore Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades.

Stanley finished the contest completing 16-of-28 passes for 166 yards. RB Toren Young amassed a game-high 68 yards on a career-high 21 carries. TE T.J. Hockenson caught a game and career-best six passes for 33 yards.

Iowa State has managed just six points in its last two trips to Kinnick Stadium (one field goal in 2016 and one field goal in 2018).

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 38 points and cruised to a 38-14 victory over Northern Iowa in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 for the eighth time under Kirk Ferentz, including the third time in four years.

Iowa's offense totaled 545 yards while its defense held the Panthers to 228, including six yards rushing.

TE Noah Fant's 5-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter was the 14th of his career. He has more touchdown receptions than any other Hawkeye tight end in program history.

RB Mekhi Sargent scored two second-quarter touchdowns, scoring on two and 10-yard runs to give Iowa a 21-0 advantage at halftime.

The Hawkeyes posted 17 points in the third period on their first three possessions. Miguel Recinos converted a 42-yard field goal to become the 40th Hawkeye to score 100 or more points in a career. WR Nick Easley caught a 14-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley and RB Toren Young crossed the goal line on a 15-yard run.

Sargent and Young combined for 154 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Easley led the Hawkeye receiving corps, hauling in 10 catches for 103 yards. Fant had five receptions for 99 yards. Easley's 10 receptions are the most by a Hawkeye since WR Kennan Davis had 10 catches for 129 yards and a touchdown against Pitt in 2011. Stanley finished the contest completing 23-of-28 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns, marking the second time in his career that the junior signal caller has topped 300 yards passing.

The six rushing yards allowed are the second fewest by a Hawkeye defense in the Ferentz era. Iowa's defense collected three sacks, two takeaways (one interception, one fumble). The Hawkeyes held the Panthers to 20 yards on 20 plays in the first half and did not allow Northern Iowa into Iowa territory until 5:53 of the third quarter. LB Kristian Welch led the Iowa defense with eight tackles and a fumble recovery. Michael Ojemudia recorded his first career interception.

Northern Iowa scored two passing touchdowns in the fourth quarter. Its first score with 11:12 remaining was the first touchdown allowed by Iowa's defense in 111:00 of game time, dating back to the season opener against Northern Illinois.

The win was Iowa's 17th straight over Northern Iowa.

Nationally-ranked Wisconsin scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to rally past Iowa in the Big Ten opener, 28-17, inside a sold out Kinnick Stadium to retain possession of the Heartland Trophy.

Each team scored a touchdown in the first half. After a Wisconsin touchdown early in the second quarter, Iowa answered with a TE Noah Fant 20-yard touchdown catch, his first of two scores on the night. The Wisconsin score marked the first time in the first four games of the season that Iowa's defense surrendered a first-half touchdown.

K Miguel Recinos converted a 24-yard field goal to give the Hawkeyes a 10-7 advantage with 10:12 remaining in the third quarter. The two teams then traded touchdowns later in the third period. Alex Hornibrook completed a 12-yard TD pass to Danny Davis with 5:12 left in the third quarter, one of three touchdown passes for the Wisconsin quarterback. Fant caught his second touchdown on a 1-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley to give Iowa a narrow 17-14 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

WR A.J. Taylor caught a 17-yard touchdown pass and FB Alec Ingold scored on a 33-yard run in the fourth quarter to seal the win for the Badgers.

Wisconsin capitalized on three Iowa turnovers (two fumbles, one interception), scoring 14 points off Hawkeye miscues.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin returned to action after missing the previous two games due to injury. He led the Hawkeye running attack, carrying the ball 14 times for 72 yards.

Iowa tight ends combined for six catches and 154 yards receiving. T.J. Hockenson had three receptions for a career-best 125 yards, while Fant had 29 yards receiving and two touchdowns on three catches. Fant now has 16 career touchdowns and four multi-touchdown games.

Stanley completed 14-of-23 passes for 256 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception.

Defensively, safety Amani Hooker had a game-high 11 tackles. LB Nick Niemann (10), LB Jack Hockaday (9), and DE Anthony Nelson (7) had personal bests in tackles.

Iowa scored 10 points or more in each quarter in a convincing 48-31 win over Minnesota at TCF Bank Stadium in Minneapolis to retain possession of Floyd of Rosedale.

The Hawkeyes scored touchdowns on their first two possessions of the game. QB Nate Stanley completed touchdown strikes to TE T.J. Hockenson (3 yards) and WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette (60 yards). The 60-yard completion is a career long for Smith-Marsette.

Minnesota's Rashod Bateman caught the first of two touchdowns in the game late in the first quarter to trim Iowa's lead to 14-7.

Iowa added two more touchdowns in the second period on a Hockenson 4-yard rush on a fake field goal formation on fourth down and a WR Nick Easley 21-yard reception. The Golden Gophers tallied a field goal and one of three touchdown passes from QB Zack Annexstad to make the score 28-17 at halftime.

K Miguel Recinos connected on field goals of 20 and 40 yards in the second half, while TE Noah Fant (5-yard catch) and RB Mekhi Sargent (2-yard run) became the fourth and fifth different Hawkeyes to score touchdowns. Recinos finished the game with 12 points.

Stanley completed 23-of-39 passes for a season-high 314 yards and four touchdowns, marking the third time in his career that the junior topped 300 yards passing in a game.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin (47 yards) and Sargent (33 yards, 1 TD) combined for 80 yards rushing and one touchdown. Easley led the Hawkeye receiving corps with six catches for 52 yards and one touchdown, while WR Brandon Smith set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (68).

Iowa's secondary intercepted Minnesota quarterbacks four times, including three times by a pair of true freshmen cornerbacks earning the first starts of the careers. CB Riley Moss returned two thefts 36 yards and had a career-best five tackles. His efforts earned him Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolades. CB Julius Brents had one theft and three tackles. Iowa's fourth interception was by sophomore safety Geno Stone.

As a unit, Iowa amassed seven tackles for loss, including five sacks. DE Anthony Nelson was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after matching a personal best with three sacks, all coming in the first half. LB Amani Jones, who led the team with nine tackles, and DE Chauncey Golston registered the other two sacks for the Hawkeyes.

GAME RECAP

Iowa QB Nate Stanley threw a career-best six touchdowns in a 42-16 win over Indiana at Memorial Stadium. Iowa's 42 points are the most scored in a game at Bloomington since a 45-9 win in 2008.

The six touchdown passes, three each half, tie Chuck Long for the second most in Iowa single-game history. Stanley, who finished the game completing 21-of-32 passes for 320 yards, completed touchdown passes to five different receivers, marking the second time in school history five different players had a receiving touchdown (1984 Freedom Bowl). Stanley, who was named the Walter Camp Football Foundation national Offensive Player of the Week and co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week, is the second Hawkeye quarterback to throw for five or more touchdowns in three career games (Long).

Tight ends T.J. Hockenson (nine yards) and Noah Fant (28 yards) caught first-quarter touchdowns, while WR Nick Easley (12 yards) caught a second-quarter touchdown from Stanley to give the Hawkeyes a 21-10 advantage at halftime.

It was more of the same in the second half with RB Toren Young (11 yards) and Hockenson (54 yards) registering touchdown receptions in the third period. FB Austin Kelly scored his first career touchdown on a 4-yard catch in the fourth quarter.

Iowa had two 100-yard receivers (Hockenson 4-107; Fant 4-102) for the first time since 2011 versus Pittsburgh (Keenan Davis 10-129; M. McNutt 8-112).

In addition to catching his first career touchdown, Young rushed for a game and career-best 96 yards on 19 carries.

Iowa's defense held Indiana to 67 rushing yards, its second-lowest total of the season. Iowa has held four of its six opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing. The Hawkeyes amassed six tackles for loss, including two sacks.

FS Jake Gervase had a team-high eight tackles, matching his career high. He also had an interception, his first of the season and fifth of his career. DE Parker Hesse totaled seven tackles, including a team-best two for loss. Sophomore Geno Stone added his second interception in two weeks to go with a forced fumble and five solo tackles.

Iowa has won five of its first six games for the eighth time in Kirk Ferentz's 20 seasons.

GAME RECAP

Iowa shutout Maryland, 23-0, on Homecoming on a blustery day at Kinnick Stadium to earn its sixth victory of the year and become bowl eligible. The Hawkeyes registered their first shutout since 2016 (Illinois). Maryland is the fourth opponent Iowa has held to a season low in points (Iowa State, Northern Iowa, Indiana, and Maryland).

All four of Iowa's offensive scoring drives were 10 plays or more, while Iowa's final score was on a fumble recovery in the end zone.

Miguel Recinos scored the game's first six points with field goals of 23 and 25 yards in the first and second quarter, respectively. WR Brandon Smith scored the game's only offensive touchdown – the first of his career – on a 10-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley with eight seconds remaining in the half.

Recinos kicked a third field goal (36 yards) and DE Anthony Nelson recovered the first fumble of his career in the end zone. The fumble recovery in the end zone marked the 11th straight season the Hawkeyes tallied at least one defensive score.

The Hawkeyes dominated the entire game, maintaining the ball on offense for 40:55, which is the second highest time of possession in the Kirk Ferentz era. Maryland ran 39 plays, which is the fewest by an opponent in the Ferentz era. The Hawkeyes held the Terrapins to 115 yards of total offense, the fewest ever allowed to a Big Ten opponent and the fourth fewest all-time in the Ferentz era.

With strong wind gusts throughout the game, Iowa's offense kept the ball on the ground, rushing for a season-high 224 yards. RB Ivory Kelly-Martin posted career bests in attempts (24) and rushing yards (98). RB Mekhi Sargent carried the ball 10 times for 54 yards.

Stanley completed 11-of-22 passes for 86 yards with a touchdown and one interception. Iowa's tight ends combined for six catches for 44 yards (T.J. Hockenson 3-30; Noah Fant 3-14).

For the first time in 12 seasons, Iowa was not flagged for a penalty. The last time Iowa played a contest without being penalized was versus Ohio State on Sept. 30, 2006.

Three defensive linemen accounted for Iowa's five tackles for loss: Parker Hesse (2), A.J. Epenesa (2), and Chauncey Golston. Amani Hooker, making his third consecutive start at outside linebacker, intercepted his second pass of the season.
