TICKETS -- A limited number of tickets remain on sale at the UI Athletics Ticket Office in Carver-Hawkeye Arena or by phone or website (1-800-IA-HAWKS or hawkeyesports.com).

TELEVISION -- The game is televised by ESPN. The announcers are Steve Levy, Brian Griese and Todd McShay.

RADIO -- (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak call the action, with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. KRUI (89.7 FM), the UI student radio station, and on Sirius channel 81 and XM channel 81 on satellite radio.

THE HEARTLAND TROPHY -- Iowa and Wisconsin have battled for the Heartland Trophy since 2004. The series is tied 5-5 with the Heartland Trophy at stake. The Hawkeyes have possession of the trophy following their 10-6 win last season in Madison.

THE SERIES -- Wisconsin holds a 44-43-2 advantage in the series that began with a 44-0 Badger win in 1894. Iowa won 10-6 in Madison last season to stop a three-game Wisconsin win streak. Iowa holds a 24-18-1 advantage in Kinnick Stadium, but Wisconsin has won the last three meetings in Iowa City.

THE RECORDS -- Iowa is 5-2 overall and 3-1 in the Big Ten. In nonconference play, Iowa defeated Miami, Ohio (45-21) and Iowa State (42-3), and lost to North Dakota State (23-21). In conference play, Iowa won 14-7 at Rutgers, dropped a 38-31 home decision to Northwestern, won 14-7 at Minnesota, and won 49-35 at Purdue.

Wisconsin is 4-2 overall and 1-2 in conference play. The Badgers have defeated LSU (16-14), Akron (54-10), Georgia State (23-17) and Michigan State (30-6), with losses to Michigan (14-7) and Ohio State (30-23, OT).

COACHING RECORDS -- Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st year as a college head coach and 18th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 144-110. He is 132-89 at Iowa. He ranks seventh in the Big Ten Conference in overall coaching victories and in conference victories.

Paul Chryst is in his second year as the Wisconsin head coach and his fifth year as a college head coach. His mark is 14-5 at Wisconsin and 33-24 overall. Chryst was the head coach at Pitt for three seasons before returning to Wisconsin, where he was a Badger quarterback (1985-87) during his playing career. Chryst was previously a Wisconsin assistant for eight seasons.

AFTER THIS -- Iowa is open on Oct. 29, returning to action Nov. 5 at Penn State (6:30 p.m. CT, BTN). Wisconsin hosts Nebraska next Saturday (6 p.m., ESPN/ESPN2).

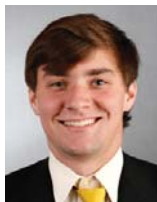

- QB C.J. Beathard's .818 winning percentage (18-4) is the second best among Hawkeye starting quarterbacks since 1954. Only Brad Banks (11-2, .846), the 2002 Heisman Trophy runner-up, has a better career winning percentage than Beathard.
- DB Desmond King recorded his first interception in the 28th quarter of the season (Week 7 at Purdue). The reigning Jim Thorpe Award winner returned the interception 41 yards for a touchdown. King has 12 career interceptions, three have been returned for touchdowns, tying Tom Knight for school record.
- Three yards separate Iowa's leading rushers. Akrum Wadley has 592 rushing yards (84.6 ypg) and LeShun Daniels, Jr. has 589 rushing yards (84.1 ypg). Wadley ranks third in the Big Ten, Daniels ranks fifth. No other school has two players in the top 10. Iowa is one of seven schools with two 500-yard rushers.
- LB Josey Jewell ranks sixth in the Big Ten averaging 8.7 tackles per game. Jewell has 238 career tackles, 37th all-time.
- WR Riley McCarron leads the Hawkeyes in receptions (24), receiving yards (289), and receiving touchdowns (3), all career highs. He has been Iowa's leading receiver in each of the last three games.
- FS Brandon Snyder has been active in the turnover game, recording four of Iowa's 11 takeaways over the last five weeks: INT vs. NDSU; FF and FR vs. Rutgers; FF vs. NW; FR and INT vs. MIINN.
- The Hawkeyes have won six consecutive rivalry trophy games, claiming the Cy-Hawk Trophy (Iowa State), Floyd of Rosedale (Minnesota), Heartland Trophy (Wisconsin), and Heroes (Nebraska) in 2015. Iowa successfully defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy against Iowa State (W, 42-3) and Floyd of Rosedale at Minnesota (W, 14-7) in 2016.
- The Hawkeyes have scored points on 23-of-24 trips in the red zone, including 19 touchdowns (7 pass, 12 rush) and four field goals. Iowa turned it over on downs in its only failed red zone appearance (at Rutgers). Its .958 red zone success rate ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 5 nationally.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 79 Big Ten wins, seventh among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games. Lloyd Carr is sixth with 81 Big Ten victories.
- The Hawkeyes are +6 in turnover margin -- third best in the Big Ten. Iowa has 11 takeaways -- five interceptions, six fumble recoveries -- and has turned seven of the 11 takeaways into touchdowns.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 18th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is seventh with 132 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 79 Big Ten wins, which ranks seventh all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in nine January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 123-68 (.644) overall mark and a 75-47 (.615) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 10 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 132-89 (.597) and a 79-61 (.564) mark in Big Ten games. In his 21st season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 144-110 (.567). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fifth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

FERENTZ CLOSES ON CARR, WILLIAMS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 79 Big Ten wins, seventh among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games. Lloyd Carr is sixth with 81 Big Ten victories.

Ferentz has 132 wins in all games played as a member of the Big Ten Conference, seventh most all-time. He is four victories from equalling Henry Williams of Minnesota, who won 136 games.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz has four former players on the 2016 staff. His son, Brian Ferentz, was a three-year letterman from 2003-05 and is in his fifth year as Iowa's offensive line coach. He is also Iowa's run game coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his ninth year on the Iowa staff. He is in his second season coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. He also assists with special teams. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and recently served as director of on-campus recruiting (2012-13) before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,214 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 630-545-39 (.535). That includes a 395-215-16 (.641) record in home games, a 235-330-23 (.418) record in games away from Iowa City, a 317-367-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 278-179-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, AKSHUN

RB Akrum Wadley and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. rank third and fifth, respectively, in the Big Ten in rushing yards. No other school has two players in the top 10. Three yards separate Iowa's leading rushers. Wadley has 592 rushing yards (84.6 ypg) and Daniels has 589 rushing yards (84.1 ypg). Wadley's eight rushing touchdowns ties for the league lead (Barkley, PSU). Daniel's six rushing scores ties for fifth.

Both players topped 100 yards in Week 7 at Purdue, marking the first time since 2008 Iowa had two 100-yard rushers in the same game (Shonn Greene, 115; Jewel Hampton, 114 yards vs. Indiana).

Daniels had two rushing touchdowns (1, 4) against the Boilermakers, his fifth career multi-touchdown game. His 67-yard rush in the third quarter was the longest of his career. He finished with 23 carries for 150 yards.

Wadley's 75-yard touchdown rush was a career long rush, and Iowa's longest play of the season. He finished with 15 carries for 176 yards, his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, second in a row.

The duo helped Iowa rush for 365 yards against the Boilermakers, tying for the second most rushing yardage total in the Ferentz era (Minnesota, 2002).

Daniels has 1,419 career rushing yards (27th) and Wadley 1,274 (31st). Wadley has scored 108 career points, Daniels has 92.

THE LONELY ISLAND

It took 28 quarters, but reigning Jim Thorpe Award winner DB Desmond King recorded his first interception in Week 7 at Purdue. Leading 42-28, King stepped in front of Purdue QB David Blough's throw and picked off his 12th career pass, tying Brett Greenwood and Steve Wilson for sixth all-time. King returned the interception 41 yards for a touchdown, the third of his career. Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last nine seasons, and 14 of the last 16.

Through seven games, opposing quarterbacks have attempted 230 passes. King has been targeted 32 times, allowing 13 receptions for 132 yards. He has allowed 24 yards after catch (1.8 yards after catch per reception). The average depth of route ran against King is 4.1 yards.

King has recorded 19 solo tackles and 10 assists, along with six pass breakups, a forced fumble, and one interception (returned for a touchdown). He averages 85.1 all-purpose yards per game, third among Hawkeyes and most among Big Ten defensive players. He has 184 yards in punt returns, 371 yards in kickoff returns, and 41 yards in interception returns. He averages 28.5 yards per kickoff return, third in the Big Ten (minimum eight returns), and 9.7 yards per punt return, third in the Big Ten among players with at least 10 returns.

King, the Jim Thorpe Award winner and unanimous consensus All-American in 2015, announced on Jan. 4 he would return to Iowa for his senior season. King is the only Thorpe winner ever to play a college season after winning the award. He led the Big Ten and ranked second in the country with eight interceptions in 2015, tying a school record. He was named the Tatum-Woodson Big Ten Conference Defensive Back of the Year and a finalist for Walter Camp Player of the Year.

The last time Iowa took the field with a national award winner was 2003, when senior PK Nate Kaeding was the reigning Lou Groza Award winner, presented to the nation's top kicker.

I'LL TAKE THAT

Iowa is plus-six in turnover margin, tying Michigan and Minnesota for third in the league. The Hawkeyes have 11 takeaways (five interceptions, six fumble recoveries) and have turned seven of the 11 into touchdowns, including DB Desmond King's interception return for a touchdown Week 7 at Purdue. It was King's third career pick-six. Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last nine seasons, and 14 of the last 16.

FS Brandon Snyder has four of Iowa's 11 takeaways. He recorded his first career interception in Week 3 vs. NDSU, caused and recovered a fumble that led to the winning touchdown at Rutgers in Week 4, and had two takeaways at Minnesota in Week 6 (one interception, one fumble recovery). He also forced a fumble against Northwestern in Week 5 that led to an Iowa touchdown.

Iowa has lost just one fumble this year, tying eight other schools for the NCAA lead.

MAKING HAY IN THE RED ZONE

The Hawkeyes have scored points on 23-of-24 trips in the red zone, including 19 touchdowns (7 pass, 12 rush) and four field goals. Iowa turned it over on downs in its only failed red zone appearance (at Rutgers). Its .958 red zone success rate ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 5 nationally.

Eight different Hawkeyes have scored red zone touchdowns. Iowa's rushing touchdowns include five by RB Akrum Wadley, four by RB LeShun Daniels, two by QB C.J. Beathard, and one by RB Derrick Mitchell. The receiving touchdowns have gone to WR Matt VandeBerg (3), WR Jerminic Smith (1), WR Riley McCarron (1), TE George Kittle (1), and TE Noah Fant (1).

HEARTLAND TROPHY

Iowa and Wisconsin have split 10 games since the Heartland Trophy was introduced to the series in 2004.

The trophy was designed and crafted by artist and former Iowa football player Frank Strub. The trophy, which is a bull mounted on a walnut base (native to both Wisconsin and Iowa), has the scores of all previous games between the two schools inscribed on it. It is one of 17 trophy games played annually in the Big Ten Conference.

The Iowa-Wisconsin series has been the closest and most competitive of all Big Ten series, with Wisconsin holding a slim edge, 44-43-2. Iowa won 10-6 in Madison a year ago.

THE BEST DEFENSE IS A RIVALRY TROPHY DEFENSE

The Hawkeyes have won six consecutive rivalry trophy games, claiming the Cy-Hawk Trophy (Iowa State), Floyd of Rosedale (Minnesota), Heartland Trophy (Wisconsin), and Heroes (Nebraska) in 2015. Iowa successfully defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy against Iowa State (W, 42-3) and Floyd of Rosedale at Minnesota (W, 14-7) in 2016. By sweeping the series in 2015, Iowa owned all four trophies for the first time in program history (the Heroes Trophy was introduced in 2011).

LAST MEETING: Iowa 10, Wisconsin 6 (Oct. 3, 2015 – Madison, Wisconsin)

Iowa forced four turnovers and held No. 18/19 Wisconsin without a touchdown in a 10-6 win at Camp Randall Stadium.

It marked Iowa's first road win over a ranked opponent since a 38-28 win over No. 24 Michigan in 2010.

Thirteen of the 16 points in the contest, including the final 13 points, were scored following turnovers. Wisconsin scored its only first-half points on its opening possession when PK Rafael Gaglianone converted a 46-yard field goal.

Iowa stopped two Badger drives in the second quarter with a CB Desmond King interception and a DE Nate Meier fumble recovery -- both in Wisconsin territory that resulted in points.

TE George Kittle scored on a 1-yard touchdown reception from QB C.J. Beathard following the first of King's two interceptions. PK Marshall Koehn connected from 33 yards after Meier recovered a fumble forced by DE Drew Ott.

The only points of the second half came on Gaglianone's second field goal (46 yards) following a Beathard interception in Iowa territory.

Iowa's defense held Wisconsin out of the red zone until its final two possessions of the game. With Wisconsin trailing 10-6 and on Iowa's 1-yard line, Badger QB Joel Stave fumbled and Iowa DT Faith Ekakitie recovered on the 4-yard line to maintain the four-point advantage.

The Badgers drove to Iowa's 16-yard line on their final possession before failing to convert fourth down with 36 seconds remaining.

Jordan Canzeri rushed a career-high 26 times for 125 yards. Beathard completed 9-of-21 passes for 77 yards, with Matt Vandenberg catching six of the nine targets for 61 yards.

Linebackers Cole Fisher (14) and Josey Jewell (10) were credited with double-digit tackles. King, in addition to the two thefts, had nine tackles and two pass break-ups and was recognized as Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week.

SPECIAL TEAMS HAVE BEEN SPECIAL

The Hawkeyes rank third in the Big Ten averaging 25.8 yards per kickoff return. DB Desmond King is third in the league, averaging 28.5 yards per kickoff return (minimum eight returns).

King had 162 combined return yards against Northwestern in Week 5 (77 punt, 85 kick). It marked the first time since 1998 a Hawkeye had 75-plus return yards on both punt and kickoffs (Khalil Hill). King totaled 107 yards in returns in Week 6 at Minnesota (48 kickoffs, 59 punts).

In addition, senior WR Riley McCarron had a 54-yard kickoff return and a 38-yard punt return versus Northwestern, both career longs.

P Ron Coluzzi leads the Big Ten in touchbacks. Coluzzi has recorded a touchback on 31-of-40 kickoffs. No other Big Ten kicker has more than 22 touchbacks.

Freshman K Keith Duncan has been perfect on all 28 PAT attempts, and all four field goal tries (22, 24, 22, 28).

In its continuing effort to help educate fans on how important the offensive line is to winning football, the Joe Moore Award will feature games on a weekly basis that feature O-Line units that have shown potential to win the award in the Joe Moore Award "Big Ugly Spotlight". DALLAS CLARK IS ANF HONOREE

The Iowa Farm Bureau and University of Iowa are teaming up to celebrate Iowa's farmers for the sixth annual America Needs Farmers (ANF) Game Day Saturday when Iowa hosts Wisconsin.

Former Iowa tight end Dallas Clark is the fifth recipient of the ANF Wall of Honor, which salutes former University of Iowa football players who exemplify the tenacity, work ethic, and character of the Iowa farmer. Previous recipients include Casey Wiegmann (2012), Jared DeVries (2013), Bruce Nelson (2014), and Robert Gallery (2015).

Clark joined the Iowa program as a walk-on linebacker; he left as an All-American tight end. He was selected by Indianapolis with the 24th pick of the first round in the 2003 NFL Draft. He played 11 seasons as a professional - nine with the Colts - catching 505 passes for 5,665 yards and 53 touchdowns. An All-Pro, Clark was a starter in the Colts' Super Bowl victory over Chicago in 2007.

ANF was launched during the Hawkeyes' 1985 Rose Bowl season by head coach Hayden Fry, when the Farm Crisis of the 1980's was hitting the Heartland exceptionally hard. A gold ANF decal on the Hawkeye helmets is the effort's signature. This year marks the 31st anniversary of ANF, a longstanding tribute to America's farmers. STREAKING ON THE ROAD

The Hawkeyes have won a school-record nine consecutive road games (the final road game at Illinois in 2014, all five road games in 2015, and three road games in 2016).

Eight of Iowa's nine consecutive road victories have come against Big Ten competition. The eight-game Big Ten road win streak is the longest in program history. Iowa's current road winning streak is the third longest active streak in the nation (Ohio State, 20; Alabama, 10; Iowa, 9; Clemson, 8; Oklahoma 8).

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2016. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fifth season as Iowa's offensive line coach and second year as running-game coordinator. Steven is an offensive lineman who is in his fifth season as a redshirt senior. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013.

Kirk and Steven are one of seven father-son head coach-player duos in FBS. The others include Mike and Jay Macintyre (Colorado), Mark and Gunner Hudspeth (UL-Lafayette), Rick and Brent Stockstill (Middle Tennessee), Bobby and Derek Wilder (Old Dominion), Butch and Alex Jones (Tennessee), and Kyle and Alex Whittingham (Utah).

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

Iowa has nine players on its 2016 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppey (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), DE Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

VANDEBERG TO MISS GAMES DUE TO INJURY

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg is out of action indefinitely, due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. VandeBerg (6-1, 190), played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs).

VandeBerg has 106 career receptions, tying Quinn Early for 19th in program history. He has 1,302 career receiving yards, 27th in program history. Should he miss the entire season, the fourth-year senior could be granted a medical redshirt and return for a fifth season in 2017.

COLUZZI EARNED BIG TEN HONOR

Senior Ron Coluzzi was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his play in Iowa's 14-7 win at Rutgers. The weekly honor is the first for the graduate transfer who is in his first season with the Hawkeyes. Coluzzi (5-11, 182-pounds) is a native of Naperville, Illinois, who previously played at Central Michigan.

In Iowa's win over Rutgers, Coluzzi averaged 42 yards on seven punts, with a long of 55 yards. Four of his kicks were placed inside the 20, as Rutgers recorded zero yards on just one return. Coluzzi also had recorded touchbacks on all three of his kickoffs, allowing no returns.

Through seven games, Coluzzi is averaging 40.7 yards on 38 punts, with Hawkeye opponents recording just three returns for 47 yards. Coluzzi has also recorded a Big Ten-best 31 touchbacks on 40 kickoffs.

Coluzzi is the second Hawkeye to be honored in 2016, as redshirt freshman Anthony Nelson was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following Iowa's opening win over Miami, Ohio.

IOWA BOWL NOTES

Iowa made its 29th Bowl game appearance (14-14-1) at the 102nd Rose Bowl Game in Pasadena, California. The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (six times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once.

- Iowa has played 13 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-7), including nine January bowl games (4-5).
- Iowa has been bowl eligible 14 of the last 15 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa's 13 bowl appearances since 2001 tie as the 11th best total in the nation.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 46 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (44), Iowa (29), and Wisconsin (27).

BEATHARD EARNED COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS WEEKLY AWARD

QB C.J. Beathard was named College Sports Madness Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week following his performance against Iowa State in Week 2. Beathard accounted for four first half touchdowns -- three passing and one rushing -- to lead Iowa to a 42-3 win in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He completed 19-of-28 passes for 235 yards and matched his career best with three touchdown passes.

REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Ten true freshmen have seen action in 2016, including RB Toks Akinribade, K Keith Duncan, TE Noah Fant, DB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DE Cedrick Lattimore, DB Manny Rugamba, QB Nathan Stanley, LB Kristian Welch, and WR Devonte Young.

Fant caught a touchdown pass at Purdue in Week 7, becoming the first true freshman to catch a touchdown pass since Jordan Canzeri in 2011.

Stanley has played in five games. He is the first true freshman to play quarterback since Drew Tate in 2003. Tate appeared in six games (no starts) and was 6-of-11 for 55 yards and one touchdown (no interceptions).

NELSON NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

DE Anthony Nelson was named Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Week for his performance in Iowa's 45-21 win over Miami, Ohio in Week 1.

Nelson forced two Miami fumbles in his first career game, with both leading to Iowa touchdowns. He recorded 2.5 sacks for minus 16 yards, and had yet another sack nullified by a Miami delay of game penalty. Nelson was credited with two solo tackles, four assists and one pass breakup.

Nelson's first caused turnover came in the first quarter as Miami had reached the Hawkeye eight-yard line. Matt Nelson recovered the fumble and the Hawkeye offense traveled 81 yards in two plays for a touchdown and a 21-0 advantage.

Nelson's second forced fumble came late in the game and led to Iowa's final touchdown in the closing minutes.

The Big Ten honor is the first for Nelson and the first for the Hawkeyes this year. Iowa players earned weekly honors from the Big Ten on six occasions in 2015, including DE Parker Hesse, who earned Freshman of The Week honors in the regular season finale at Nebraska, a 28-20 Hawkeye win.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster of 117 players includes 53 players from Iowa. The roster includes 18 players from Illinois; seven from Michigan, six from Maryland, five from Missouri and Texas, four from Wisconsin, three from Ohio and South Dakota, two from Florida, Minnesota, Nebraska, and New Jersey, and one from Canada, Indiana, North Carolina, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.

BAND OF BROTHERS

The Hawkeyes have five sets of brothers on the 2016 roster. In the season opener against Miami (Ohio), C James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels became the first Hawkeye brothers to start in the same game since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980.

No other school in the country has more sets of brothers than Iowa. OL Ryan Ward and younger brother OLB Kevin return for their fourth and final season together. Twins OL Landan and Levi Paulsen are back after redshirting their freshman year in 2015. They are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. LB Ben Niemann welcomes younger brother LB Nick Niemann to the team this year, as does SS Miles Taylor, whose younger brother LB Kyle is in his first year on campus.

MORE THAN ONE

Seventeen high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; East English Village HS in Detroit, Michigan; and Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois all graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include Davenport Assumption (Davenport, Iowa), Cedar Falls HS (Cedar Falls, Iowa), Gonzaga College HS (Silver Spring, Maryland), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Kennedy HS (Cedar Rapids, Iowa), Naperville Central HS (Naperville, Iowa), Pella HS (Pella, Iowa), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Solon HS (Solon, Iowa), Sycamore HS (Sycamore, Iowa), Waukegan HS (Waukegan, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), and Woodbury Central HS (Moline, Iowa).

THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE

Freshman PK Keith Duncan is the lightest Hawkeyes player at 165 pounds. Freshman DB Manny Rugamba is the lightest position player at 172 pounds. Senior DL Jaleel Johnson and sophomore OL Dalton Ferguson are the heaviest Hawkeyes at 310 pounds. A total of 10 Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more. The tallest player, at 6-8, is sophomore DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is junior WR Jonathan Parker.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 14 of the last 15 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 310 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Desmond King became the seventh Hawkeye to earn a national player of the year award under Kirk Ferentz. He won the Jim Thorpe award in 2015, honoring the nation's top defensive back. Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 18th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.



HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 22 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 24 Hawkeyes are on active NFL rosters.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 26 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (39). Nebraska and Penn State have also had 26 players drafted since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last seven NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had 23 players drafted from 2010-16, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a five-time Pro-Bowler (2011-15) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Entering the 2016 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 15 years, 140-of-157 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

The Hawkeyes opened 2016 with three straight home games against Miami, Ohio (W, 45-21), Iowa State (W, 42-3), and North Dakota State (L, 23-21).

For the first time in program history, Iowa will play a nine-game conference schedule. Iowa plays five Big Ten road games and hosts four conference schools, including Northwestern (L, 38-31), Wisconsin (Oct. 22), Michigan (Nov. 12) and Nebraska (Nov. 25).

The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, or Ohio State, during the regular season.

Seven of Iowa's 12 opponents played in the postseason. Six Big Ten opponents participated in bowl competition (4-2). North Dakota State has won the FCS national championship five consecutive years.

Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2016. The Hawkeyes defended the Cy-Hawk trophy with a 42-3 win against Iowa State and Floyd of Rosedale with a 14-7 triumph at Minnesota; Iowa will defend two more rivalry trophies against Wisconsin (Heartland) and Nebraska (Heroes) this season.

For the second straight year, and second time in program history, Iowa will play more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa defeated Iowa State, 42-3, on Sept. 10 in a game that kicked off at 6:42 p.m. The Hawkeyes host Michigan Nov. 12 at 7 p.m., and also play under the lights at Penn State on Nov. 5 (6:30 p.m.).



IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players in its 2016 Leadership Group, including nine seniors and seven juniors. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle, DB Greg Mabin, WR Riley McCarron, and WR Matt Vandenberg. The junior class is represented by DL Nathan Bazata, OL Ike Boettger, LB Bo Bower, LB Josey Jewell, OL Boone Myers, LB Ben Niemann, and OL Sean Welsh.

WE'LL GO FIRST

In 18 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes received the opening kickoff in 174-of-221 games (105-69). Iowa has started the game on defense in 46-of-221 games under Ferentz (26-20). Iowa has won the toss four times this season (3-1), and contrary to its previous history, has elected to defer to the second half and start the game on defense each time.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Austin Blythe, a seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, became the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach. In each of Ferentz's 17 complete seasons, the Hawkeyes had a future NFL player start on the offensive line. This week's depth chart includes offensive linemen Sean Welsh, Boone Myers, James Daniels, Keegan Render, and Ike Boettger.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

FERENTZ CAPTURES NATIONAL AWARDS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz returns to the Iowa sideline for an 18th season as the reigning national coach of the year. Ferentz was named Woody Hayes Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year by the FWAA, and winner of the 2015 Dodd Trophy, presented annually by the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. He was named American Football Coaches Association Region 3 Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year and George Munger Coach of the Year awards.

Ferentz was also named Dave McClain and Hayes-Schembechler Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015), being recognized by both league coaches and media. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.

Ferentz led Iowa to a school record 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won the Big Ten West Division title (8-0) and advanced to the Big Ten title game for the first time in the game's five-year history. The Hawkeyes reclaimed all four of their rivalry trophies in 2015, and reached as high as third in the Associated Press poll (Nov. 22).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 18th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is tied with Oklahoma's Bob Stoops as the longest active FBS head coaches. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998, one day after Stoops was named head coach at Oklahoma. Stoops was a Hawkeye letterman from 1979-82.

IOWA AT THE HEAD OF CLASS IN COACHING LANDSCAPE

The University of Iowa has produced four active FBS head coaches, tied with Alabama for most in the country. Bret Bielema (Arkansas), Bob Diaco (UConn), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), and Mark Stoops (Kentucky) all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Bielema, Diaco, Bob Stoops, and Mark Stoops played for former UI head coach Hayden Fry. All four head coaches served as assistants under Fry. Bielema was an assistant coach on Kirk Ferentz's staff from 1999-2001.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Applebee's in Coralville.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is once again available for fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Iowa Football game days. The Hawkeye Express is in its 13th season.

Adults can ride the train for \$12, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

No. 15/17 Iowa rushed for five touchdowns en route to a 45-21 victory over Miami University at Kinnick Stadium. The 45 points are the most points by a Hawkeye team in a season opener since posting 46 against Maine in 2008.

The Hawkeyes sprinted out to a 21-0 advantage in the first quarter after touchdown runs of 1, 11, and 43 yards by Hawkeye tailbacks.

Akrum Wadley rushed for a game-best 121 yards and two touchdowns, LeShun Daniels carried the ball 10 times for 83 yards and two scores, while Derrick Mitchell had 12 yards and a touchdown on two attempts.

Iowa's offense ran only 50 plays, but totaled 404 yards, averaging 8.1 yards per play. Directing the Hawkeye offense was quarterback C.J. Beathard, who completed 13-of-20 passes for 192 yards and one touchdown. The senior signal caller completed his first eight passes of the contest.

Matt VandeBerg caught a team-best four passes for 99 yards, while Jerminic Smith had three catches for 51 yards, including his first career touchdown reception.

The Hawkeye defense forced and recovered three Miami fumbles -- two of which came in the first period -- while the Iowa offense converted the RedHawk miscues into 21 points.

Linebackers Ben Niemann and Bo Bower led the Hawkeyes in tackles, registering nine and eight, respectively. Middle linebacker Josey Jewell missed a majority of the game after being disqualified for targeting in the first quarter.

Last year's Jim Thorpe Award winner, Desmond King, had five tackles and amassed 85 yards in returns on special teams; 70 yards on two kickoff returns and 15 yards on one punt return.

True freshman Keith Duncan was perfect in his collegiate debut at placekicker for the Hawkeyes, converting all six PAT's and making his only field goal attempt (22 yards).

Daniels and his brother James (center) became the first Hawkeye brothers to start in the same game since Kent (SS) and Kevin (DB) Ellis in 1980.

The win was Iowa's eighth straight home win and 13th consecutive regular season triumph, dating back to 2015.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 14 points in each of the first three quarters to post a convincing 42-3 victory over Iowa State at Kinnick Stadium and retain possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The 39-point victory and Iowa's 42 points are the largest margin of victory and the Hawkeyes' most points scored in the series since a 63-20 Iowa win in 1997.

Five different players scored Iowa's six touchdowns -- Akrum Wadley (2), George Kittle, LeShun Daniels, C.J. Beathard, and Matt Vandenberg.

Iowa jumped out to a 14-0 advantage after Beathard touchdown passes of nine and 26 yards to Kittle and Wadley, respectively.

The Hawkeyes added a pair of second-quarter touchdowns on a Vandenberg 12-yard scoring reception and a Beathard 1-yard plunge.

Iowa's third quarter touchdowns were scored by Wadley (3-yard run) and Daniels (43-yard run). It marked the second consecutive game that Daniels ran for a 43-yard touchdown.

Beathard finished the contest completing 19-of-28 passes for 235 yards and four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing). The signal caller became the 10th Iowa quarterback to surpass 4,000 career passing yards in the second half.

Daniels rushed for a game-best 112 yards and one touchdown on 15 attempts. It marked the third time in his career the senior rushed for over 100 yards.

Vandenberg had a game and career-high 129 yards receiving with one touchdown on seven catches. The senior receiver has topped 100 yards receiving twice in his career with both contests coming against Iowa State.

Defensively, linebacker Josey Jewell led the Hawkeyes with nine tackles. Defensive tackle Jaleel Johnson had seven tackles, including two sacks. Linebacker Ben Niemann had three tackles and intercepted the first pass of his career in the third quarter, which resulted in an Iowa touchdown two plays later.

The Hawkeye defense limited Iowa State to 16 first downs, 291 yards of total offense, and 3-of-15 on third downs.

North Dakota State scored the final nine points, including a game-winning 37-yard field goal as time expired, to upend 11th-ranked Iowa, 23-21, at Kinnick Stadium and snap a nine-game home win streak for the Hawkeyes.

The Bison jumped out to a 7-0 advantage in the first quarter after M.J. Stumpf returned a QB C.J. Beathard interception 21 yards for a touchdown. Beathard was hit as he released the ball and Stumpf plucked the ball out of the air.

Iowa scored a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 14-7 advantage into halftime. WR Riley McCarron caught a career-long 30-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play to even the score. The Hawkeyes grabbed a 14-7 lead on their next possession, going 83 yards in three plays, with Matt VandeBerg capping the drive with a 14-yard scoring reception from Beathard.

North Dakota State, winners of five consecutive FCS championships, tied the contest midway through the third quarter on a 1-yard run by RB King Frazier.

Iowa reclaimed the lead on its next possession with a VandeBerg 9-yard catch, his second scoring reception of the game.

North Dakota State closed the game with a Chase Morlock 7-yard touchdown reception and a Cam Pedersen 37-yard field goal in the fourth period. The Bison limited the Hawkeyes to seven plays for -9 yards over the last 15 minutes of the game.

Beathard, who lost his first regular season game in 16 starts, completed 11-of-22 passes for 152 yards and three touchdowns. NDSU quarterback Easton Stick completed 11-of-19 passes for 124 yards and one touchdown.

TE George Kittle led all receivers with five catches and a career-best 110 yards. RB LeShun Daniels had 14 rushes for 29 yards.

North Dakota State totaled 363 yards of offense, with 239 of those yards coming on the ground. The Bison also had the advantage in time of possession, maintaining possession for 36:40 compared to 23:20 for Iowa.

Defensively, three Hawkeye linebackers registered 11 tackles: Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower. Niemann and Bower's totals were career bests. FS Brandon Snyder intercepted the first pass of his career in the first half.

Akrum Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on a 26-yard run in the fourth quarter to lift Iowa to a 14-7 victory over Rutgers in the Big Ten opener for both teams at High Point Solutions Stadium. The contest was the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

Wadley, a native of Newark, New Jersey, finished the contest with a team-best 122 all-purpose yards (84 rushing yards; 38 receiving yards).

After 29 minutes of scoreless football, tight end George Kittle caught a 36-yard pass from quarterback C.J. Beathard for a touchdown with 34 seconds left in the first half. The Hawkeyes drove 99 yards in eight plays in 90 seconds to take a 7-0 advantage into the locker room.

The Scarlet Knights evened the contest with 12:45 remaining in the fourth quarter when Andre Patton caught a 14-yard pass from quarterback Chris Laviano.

On Rutgers' next offensive possession, Iowa safety Brandon Snyder forced and recovered a fumble on the Scarlet Knights' 21-yard line. Following a five-yard false start penalty, Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on Iowa's next play from scrimmage.

Beathard completed 12-of-23 passes for 162 yards and a touchdown to win his 10th straight Big Ten regular season game.

Kittle caught two passes for 56 yards -- both on the 99-yard scoring drive in the second period -- to lead Hawkeye receivers.

LeShun Daniels, Jr. complemented Wadley's rushing totals with 77 yards on 13 carries.

In addition to Snyder's forced fumble and recovery, the sophomore safety was credited with a career-high 13 tackles. His lone tackle for loss came on a Rutgers fourth down play with under five minutes to play. Linebacker Josey Jewell totaled 12 stops, while defensive end Parker Hesse collected a personal-best two sacks. The Hawkeye defense held the Scarlet Knights to 27 points below their season average entering the game (34.0 ppg).

Iowa's Ron Coluzzi punted seven times for a 42.0 average, including placing four kicks inside the 20. His efforts earned the senior Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

Laviano completed 13-of-24 passes for 190 yards and a touchdown, while Robert Martin rushed a game-high 106 yards on 21 attempts for the Scarlet Knights.

Northwestern's Austin Carr caught three touchdowns -- two in the second half -- to help the Wildcats spoil Iowa's Homecoming with a 38-31 win over the Hawkeyes in Kinnick Stadium.

With Iowa leading 24-17, Northwestern scored touchdowns on three straight possessions spanning the third and fourth quarters to give the visitors a 38-24 advantage. The Hawkeyes closed the margin to 38-31 after a 1-yard scoring run by LeShun Daniels, Jr. with 8:10 remaining in the contest. However, Northwestern thwarted a potential game-tying drive by the Hawkeyes by intercepting a QB C.J. Beathard pass on its 36-yard line with 58 seconds left.

The Wildcats led 10-7 after the first period, scoring on a Clayton Thorson 4-yard scoring run and 25-yard Jack Mitchell field goal. Iowa's first points came on RB Akrum Wadley's 5-yard touchdown run, which was setup by Desmond King's 32-yard punt return. King finished the contest with a game-best 162 yards in returns (85 kickoffs, 77 punts).

Northwestern took a 17-7 lead early in the second quarter on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Thorson to Carr. The Hawkeyes took a 21-17 lead into half after scoring touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the second period. Wadley scored for the second time -- this time from six yards -- and Riley McCarron caught a 15-yard pass from Beathard.

Iowa extended its lead to 24-17 with a 24-yard PK Keith Duncan field goal on its first possession of the third period. Northwestern scored three second-half touchdowns via a pair of Carr receptions (16, 25) and a Justin Jackson 58-yard run.

Beathard completed 19-of-27 passes for 204 yards, with one touchdown and one interception. Thorson completed 18-of-30 passes for 164 yards and three touchdowns for Northwestern.

Daniels led Iowa's ground attack with 72 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries, while Riley McCarron paced the Hawkeye receivers with a team-best 170 all-purpose yards. McCarron had career highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (78), while also registering 92 yards in returns (54 kickoffs, 38 punts).

Iowa linebacker Josey Jewell led all tacklers with a personal-best 16 tackles, including 1.5 for loss. Lineman Ifeadi Odenigbo had four of Northwestern's six sacks.

GAME RECAP

Junior RB Akrum Wadley scored the game-winning touchdown on a 54-yard run with 5:28 left in the fourth quarter in a 14-7 Iowa victory over Minnesota played at TCF Bank Stadium.

With the win, Iowa retains possession of the Floyd of Rosedale traveling trophy and extended its road win streak to eight games, tying a school record. The Hawkeyes have won seven straight Big Ten road games, its longest streak in school history, and have won six straight trophy games.

Iowa took a 3-0 lead into halftime after a K Keith Duncan 22-yard field goal in the second quarter. The Hawkeyes extended their lead to 6-0 on Duncan's second field goal, this one from 28 yards on their first drive of the third quarter.

Minnesota claimed a 7-6 lead on a 9-yard scoring run by Shannon Brooks on its first offensive possession of the second half. That remained the score until Wadley scored from 54 yards -- Iowa's longest play from scrimmage this season. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., followed the touchdown run with a 2-point conversion rush. The score for Wadley pushed his career scoring total to 102 points.

The Gophers had an opportunity to even the score, driving to Iowa's 13-yard line in the final minute. However, Iowa's defense stood tall, forcing four straight incomplete passes.

Beathard completed 17-of-31 passes for 142 yards, improving to 8-0 in true road games as a starter. The Hawkeye signal caller helped engineer Iowa's fifth fourth-quarter game-winning drive the last two years.

Wadley finished with 107 yards and a TD on 14 attempts. His rushing totals pushed Wadley over the 1,000 rushing yards milestone, becoming the 46th Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

WR Riley McCarron led the team in receiving for the second straight game, catching six passes for 62 yards.

Defensively, Iowa forced eight three-and-outs and collected three takeaways. FS Brandon Snyder was responsible for two of Iowa's three takeaways, recovering a fumble and intercepting a pass. True freshman CB Manny Rugamba intercepted his first career pass to account for the third takeaway.

Iowa won its first two Big Ten road games by identical 14-7 scores (Rutgers, Minnesota). The Hawkeyes have won two road contests, while scoring 14 or fewer points in the same season, for the first time since 1928.

GAME RECAP

Six different Hawkeyes scored touchdowns en route to a 49-35 Iowa win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium. The win extended Iowa's school-record road win streak to nine games.

Iowa scored touchdowns on all three of its first-quarter possessions to take a commanding 21-0 lead after 15 minutes. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr. and QB C.J. Beathard scored on runs of one and 15 yards, respectively. WR Riley McCarron caught a career-long 42-yard pass from Beathard on Iowa's third offensive possession.

Daniels crossed the goal line with a 4-yard run to extend Iowa's advantage to 28-0 in the second quarter. Daniels has posted five multi-touchdown games in his career, two coming against the Boilermakers. After a Purdue touchdown, RB Akrum Wadley scampered a career-long 75 yards for a score to give the Hawkeyes a 35-7 halftime cushion. Iowa scored touchdowns on five-of-six first-half possessions.

Iowa and Purdue traded touchdowns in the third period. The Hawkeyes' sixth touchdown was scored by true freshman TE Noah Fant on a 5-yard pass from Beathard. The scoring reception was the first of Fant's career.

Iowa's final score came via DB Desmond King. The Hawkeye senior returned his first interception of the season 41 yards for a touchdown. It marked the ninth straight season the Hawkeyes have returned at least one interception for a touchdown. It marked the third career pick-six for King.

Iowa rushed for a season-high 365 yards on 53 attempts. The 365 yards equal the second most yards gained on the ground during the Kirk Ferentz era. The 49 points are the most the Hawkeyes have ever scored at Ross-Ade Stadium and are the most scored by Iowa in a Big Ten contest since scoring 55 against Minnesota in 2008.

Wadley (170) and Daniels (156) combined for 326 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. It marked the first time since 2008 that a pair of Hawkeye running backs eclipsed the century mark in the same game.

Beathard completed 10-of-17 passes for 140 yards and accounted for three touchdowns (2 pass, 1 rush), while Purdue's David Blough completed 30-of-60 passes for 458 yards and five touchdowns.

Iowa's defense yielded a season-low 46 yards rushing. In addition to the interception, King had four tackles, while linebacker Bo Bower had a team-high 10 stops.
