CAMPUS RECREATION AND WELLNESS CENTER





The University of Iowa Athletics Department and the University of Iowa Recreational Services have partnered together to construct a new Campus Recreation and Wellness Center (CRWC). The \$69 million facility, which opened in the summer of 2010, serves as the home for the Hawkeye swimming and diving programs.

The UI swimmers have a state-of-the-art 50-meter competition pool and a separate diving well. The facility houses the team locker rooms, while boasting a swimming and diving specific training room space.

In its first year as a competition venue, the CRWC hosted the 2011 USA Diving Winter Nationals. The venue also hosted both the men's and women's 2012 Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships, the 2011 USA Swimming Speedo Sectionals and the NCAA Zone Diving Qualifier.

The facility has 20,000 square feet of fitness space over three levels, a 52 1/2 foot climbing wall and a leisure pool among other amenities.

The CRWC is located at 309 South Madison Street, on the southwest corner of Burlington and Madison. Parking is available one block to the southeast.

THE HAWKEYE STRENGTH TRAINING PROGRAM

The University of Iowa strength and conditioning department is committed to providing the ultimate training experience for each Hawkeye student-athlete. Our focus is the development of the complete student-athlete through the use of proven scientific methods for reducing the risk of injury, as well as maximizing each student-athlete's athletic potential. Equally as important, our staff will foster a culture of relationship building in which we will seek to enhance the intangible character traits required for each Hawkeye to reach his or her championship potential on and off the playing stage.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING PHILOSOPHY

The philosophy of this program consists of two components. The first is to continually develop a scientifically sound program that will maximize strength, power and explosiveness in order to allow the athlete to get the utmost out of their genetic potential, and to reduce the chance of injury. This will primarily be accomplished through the use of ground based free weight exercises and the progressive incorporation of functional movements and plyometrics. The second is to establish a culture which will develop the discipline, character and mental toughness within each student-athlete and team as a whole so that they are able to make sacrifices in their training, leave their comfort zone and develop a championship ATTITUDE. This will encourage them to make the most out of every situation and opportunity given to them in athletics and academics, so that they might know what it is to be fully committed to something. When these two converge, they are not only able to reach their full potential; they become champions in and out of the pool.

GIANNI SESTO
JUNIOR

The University of Iowa men's swimming and diving team is on the rise.

Following a fifth place showing at the 2012 Big Ten Championships -- the best showing in 16 years -- and a 26th place finish at the 2012 NCAA Championships -- its highest finish since 2005 -- the Hawkeyes are shooting for more during the 2012-13 season.

While UI head coach Marc Long lost three All-Americans -- Paul Gordon, Duncan Partridge and Ryan Phelan -- to graduation, the Hawkeyes have experience returning up and down the roster to the tune of 22 letterwinners. The squad has 15 upperclassmen (six seniors, nine juniors) to go along with six sophomores and a top-ranked recruiting class.

Two of those returnees -- senior Jordan Huff and junior Gianni Sesto -- earned All-America recognition last season, and the Hawkeyes have their top performers back in 11-of-14 events. Iowa supplemented its roster with the 15th-ranked collegeswimming.com recruiting class, highlighted by international signees David Ernstsson and Roman Trussov, both of whom rank in the top-30.

The Hawkeyes look to build on a season where they set school records in four of the five relays and in a total of 11 events. Four student-athletes set individual records in five events and pieces of each of the four relays also are back in the mix. Iowa also had 10 student-athletes qualify for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials in Omaha in 14 events.

FREESTYLE

The Hawkeyes will feature both youth and experience in the freestyle events in 2012-13. Returning All-Americans Jordan Huff and Gianni Sesto will be counted on to lead.

Huff swam the third leg of the 400-freestyle relay that claimed the Big Ten title and finished 11th overall at the NCAA Championships. He also was a part of the 800-free relay that was 15th at the NCAA meet. The Dubuque, Iowa, native is coming off a junior season where he swam collegiate bests in the 100 (44.04) and 200 (1:35.87) freestyle events at the Big Ten Championships.

Sesto returns after earning honorable mention All-America recognition in the 200-free, 400-free and 800-free relays. The first team All-Big Ten selection in the 200-free relay swam collegiate bests in the 100 (51.70), 200 (1:57.94) and 500 free (4:41.24) during his sophomore season.

The Hawkeyes will look for growth from sophomore Brian Donatelli, a 2012 Olympic Trials qualifier. The team will also look to freshmen Jackson Allen, Charles Holliday, Maverick Hovey, Luke Snow and David Ernstsson to step in and provide depth.

Allen, Holliday, Hovey and Snow were each high school All-Americans, while Ernstsson was a Swedish Olympic Trials qualifier.

Junior Manuel Belzer and senior Patrick Wiegand return to lead the Iowa distance events.

Belzer led the team in the 500 (4:21.48), 1,000 (9:12.29) and 1,650 (15:03.20) freestyle events as a sophomore. He swam to 12 first place finishes and finished sixth in both the 500 and 1,650 free at the Big Ten Championships. Wiegand swam collegiate bests in the 500 (4:27.77) and 1,650-free (15:39.99) as a junior and his 1,650 time ranks 10th on Iowa's all-time top performer list.

BACKSTROKE

Iowa will be deep in the backstroke events in 2012-13 with school record holders Dustin Rhoads and Grant Betulius anchoring the group.

Rhoads set the school record in the 200 back (1:43.92) at the 2012 Big Ten Championships, and ranks second in the record books in the 100 back (47.69). Rhoads, who qualified for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials, posted 11 top-three finishes and swam on six winning relays as a sophomore.

Betulius swam to a fifth place showing en route to the UI school record in the 100 back at the 2012 Big Ten Championships, touching the wall in 47.17. The Olympic Trials qualifier also posted the second fastest time in the 200 back (1:44.22) in his true freshman season.

Senior Byron Butler gives the team a third piece to the equation, ranking third in school history in both events. Butler, who finished 15th in the 100-back at the Big Ten Championships, swam collegiate bests in both events -- 100 back (47.93) and 200 back (1:44.83) -- during his junior season.

The Hawkeyes will also look to a group of four returnees -- senior Donny Warren, junior Devon Meeks and sophomores Chris Freeman and Austin Abbas -- and newcomers Matthew Boyd and Andrew Parker for additional depth.

BREASTSTROKE

Iowa returns its top three breaststrokers, including 200 school record holder Andrew Marciniak, but the biggest addition to the group will come from an incoming freshman.

Roman Trussov, a Kazakhstan native, joins the Hawkeyes after being ranked in the top 50 in the world in the 50 and 100 breaststroke. Trussov finished third in both events at the FINA World Juniors in 2011 and was a silver medalist at the Winter Championships of Ukraine.

Marciniak led the Hawkeyes in both events as a sophomore, posting times of 54.89 (100) and 1:57.88 (200) at the Big Ten Championships. He finished eighth in the 200 at the Big Ten Championships en route to his school record performance, and his 100 time is third in the annals.

Fellow incoming freshman Tyler Nichols, a high school All-American and a Junior National qualifier in the 200 IM and 100 breast, will give the Hawkeyes more firepower, while returnees Kyle Noser and Korey Schneider will provide depth.

BUTTERFLY

The Hawkeyes have top-end depth returning in the butterfly event with senior Byron Butler and junior Tyler Lentz at the forefront.

Butler led the team in the 100 fly with an NCAA 'B' qualifying time of 47.49, a time that ranks third in school history, while posting the second best time 1:48.72 in the 200 fly. He finished 10th in the 100 fly at the Big Ten Championships and swam the fly leg of the school record-setting 400 medley relay that placed fourth.

Lentz posted the Hawkeye standard in the 200-fly, finishing with a season-best time of 1:46.60 at the Big Ten Championships. The time is the fifth best in school history.

Four returnees -- senior Mitch Taylor, juniors Devon Meeks and Dustin Rhoads and sophomore Mike Vinyard -- along with freshmen Jackson Allen and David Ernstsson will provide the team depth in the event.

IM

The Hawkeyes have their top four IM specialists returning in 2012 with junior Tyler Lentz headlining the group.

Lentz posted school record times in both the 200 (1:46.82) and 400 IM (3:47.65) as a sophomore, posting collegiate best times in both events. The Reedsburg, Wis., native placed fifth in the 400 IM at the Big Ten Championships.

Junior Kyle Noser had Iowa's second-best times in both IM events last season, touching the wall in 1:47.85 in the 200 and 3:50.59 in the 400. Both times rank third on the all-time top performers list.

A trio of seniors -- Donny Warren, Byron Butler and Patrick Weigand -- will provide the Hawkeyes depth in the IM. Warren specializes in both events, while Butler contributes in the 200 and Weigand in the 400.

The Hawkeyes will also look to freshmen Matthew Boyd and Tyler Nichols to add contribute.

RELAYS

After winning a pair of Big Ten relay titles and earning honorable mention All-America honors in three relays, the Hawkeyes will need to reload in 2012-13.

With relay mainstays Paul Gordon, Duncan Partridge and Ryan Phelan out of the equation, Iowa will need to build around senior Jordan Huff and junior Gianni Sesto in the 200 and 400 freestyle relays. In the 800-free relay, the Hawkeyes return three of the four legs in Manuel Belzer, Patrick Weigand and Huff that paced the team with an NCAA 'B' qualifying time of 6:28.59.

The Hawkeyes also return two legs -- Dustin Rhoads and Korey Schneider -- off the school record-setting 200-medley relay and three legs -- Grant Betulius, Andrew Marciniak and Byron Butler -- of the 400-medley relay.

DIVING

The UI diving team is in rebuilding mode under first-year coach Todd Waikel. The Hawkeyes lone diver on the roster is freshman Addison Boschult, a four-time all-state selection from Nebraska. Boschult holds the third highest point total for diving in Nebraska history, scoring 550 points at the state meet.

Coming off a 37th place finish at the 2012 NCAA Championships and 10 dual meet victories -- the most for the program since the 1985-86 season -- expectations are on the rise for the University of Iowa women's swimming and diving team.

The Hawkeyes broke through with eight school records and posted 12 NCAA 'B' qualifying times a season ago. With 24 returnees and a talented recruiting class joining the roster, the team is poised to continue its rise.

Sophomore Becky Stoughton headlines Iowa's returnees after earning honorable mention All-America honors in the 1,650-free-style as a freshman and setting five school records.

Iowa will feature a youth-filled roster with just two seniors and 14 upperclassmen on the 35 player roster. The Hawkeyes will turn to team captains April Allen, Abby Tuchscherer, Abby Grilli and Elaine Boosalis to lead in 2012-13.

FREESTYLE

When looking at the depth among the freestylers, Becky Stoughton is at the forefront for the Hawkeyes.

The Peoria, Ill., native broke onto the scene as a true freshman, garnering Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors after posting three top-six finishes at the Big Ten Championships. The sophomore posted school records in the 200 (1:47.09), 500 (4:40.82), 1,000 (16:03.42) and 1,650 (16:03.42) freestyle and the 200 IM (2:02.57).

Stoughton, who was tabbed as Iowa's team most valuable player, was the first Hawkeye to swim at the NCAA Championships since 2005, garnering a ninth place finish.

Iowa added impact depth to the roster with the addition Lindsay Seemann from the University of Arizona. Seemann is a former Olympian, competing at the 2008 Beijing games. Last season, she posted NCAA 'B' cuts in the 500 free and 200 back for the Wildcats.

The Hawkeyes have solid depth returning in the distance free events. Senior Lauren Eytalis has the seventh and ninth best times in Iowa's all-time top performers list in the 1,000 and 1,650 free. Juniors Emily Christiansen and Taylor Newgaard and sophomore Hillary Wiegand all rank on the team's all-time top performers lists.

In the sprint events, Iowa welcomes back two of its top competitors in sophomore Heather Arseth and junior Emily Hovren. Arseth, who swam in the 2012 London Olympics for Mauritius, is the team's top returnee in the 50-free (23.49), while Hovren is the top returner in the 100-free (50.51).

Freshman Olivia Kabacinski will be looked upon to step in and contribute immediately to the sprinting corps. Kabacinski was a 10-time individual All-American and three-time state champion in La Porte, Ind., where she was also a four-year Junior National qualifier and a Senior Qualifier.

The Hawkeyes will also look to junior Elise Borja, sophomore Gigi Groya and freshmen Jennifer Weigand and Maddie Bro to provide depth.

BACKSTROKE

With the departure of top backstrokers Daniela Cubelic and Danielle Carty, the Hawkeyes will need both the returnees and newcomers to step up in 2012-13.

Sophomores Gigi Groya and Pamela Breitrack both posted personal bests at the 2012 Big Ten Championships. Groya went 57.86 in the 100, while Breitrack went 2:04.28 in the 200.

Sophomore Heather Arseth has the top returning time in the 100 back, touching the wall in 56.43 at the Hawkeye Invitational, while sophomore Becky Stoughton went 1:58.38 at the Shamrock Invitational to lead the team in the 200 back.

Freshman Maddie Bro will be looked upon to contribute in her first season in the 100 back. Bro was a 12-time USA Swimming Junior National qualifier and a five time high school All-American at Ames High School.

BREASTSTROKE

The Hawkeyes return all of their breast stroke contributors, including junior Karolina Wartalowicz, who led the team in both events as a sophomore.

Wartalowicz posted collegiate best times in the 100 (1:02.91) and 200 (2:16.26) at the 2012 Big Ten Championships. Those marks rank third and second, respectively, in the Iowa record books. The Illinois native also posted an NCAA "B" qualifying time in the 100 breast and tallied 14 top-three finishes.

Sophomore Hannah Maher posted the second best times in both events during her true freshman season, while senior April Allen and sophomore Pamela Breitrack return to add to the Hawkeye depth.

Newcomer Colleen Champa joins the team as a Junior National qualifier and school record holder out of Dundee Crown (Ill.) High School.

Iowa will be deep in the butterfly events in 2012-13 with junior Abbey Tuchscherer at the forefront leading the team.

Tuchscherer was the class of the Hawkeye butterfly athletes as a sophomore, pacing the team in both the 100 (54.67) and 200 (2:01.17) -- times that are second best in school history. Tuchscherer earned Big Ten Co-Swimmer of the Week honors as a sophomore after breaking a 21-year old school record, and she was the recipient of the team's Alison Pennington Haddon Strength of Character award and the Strength and Conditioning Achievement Award.

Sophomore Audrey Kumm and junior Haley Gordon return after posting collegiate bests at the 2012 Big Ten Championships. Kumm went 55.28 in the 100, while Gordon went 2:02.67 in the 200.

Iowa will also look to sophomores Elaine Boosalis and Danielle Klunk, junior Lauren Drennan and freshmen Ashley Horodyski, Allie Orvis and Jennifer Weigand for depth.

IM

The Hawkeyes have their top four IM specialists returning in 2012-13 with junior Emily Hovren and sophomore Becky Stoughton headlining the group.

Hovren posted a collegiate best time in the 200-IM at the 2012 Big Ten Championships, touching in at 2:02.57. The time ranks third in school history. Stoughton set the Hawkeye record in the 400-IM (4:12.34) at the Big Ten Championships en route to a fourth place finish.

Iowa also welcomes back Elaine Boosalis, Haley Gordon, Audrey Kumm, Brianne Richson and Hannah Maher in the IM events. The squad also adds newcomers Colleen Champa, Allie Orvis and Lindsay Seemann. Seemann

was a top-eight finisher in the 400-meter IM at the 2010 Pan Pacific Championships.

RELAYS

After posting school record times in the 200-free and 400-medley relays, the Hawkeyes will need to fill in the missing pieces on the relays in 2012-13. Departed seniors Daniela Cubelic and Danielle Carty were key legs on all five relays a season ago.

Iowa returns two legs in the 200-free relay (Heather Arseth, Emily Hovren), 400-free relay (Hovren, Stoughton), 800-free relay (Becky Stoughton, Hovren) and 400-medley relay (Karolina Wartalowicz, Abbey Tuchscherer). The Hawkeyes have three pieces (Wartalowicz, Haley Gordon and Arseth) back in the 200-medley relay.

DIVING

All-American Veronica Rydze's eligibility has expired, but first-year diving coach Todd Waikel has seven divers on the 2012-13 roster, including four with collegiate experience.

Junior Abby Grilli is the team's top returnee in both the one (288.90) and three (307.80). Both scores rank seventh on Iowa's all-time top performers list.

Junior Lauren Kelba and redshirt sophomores Joelle Christy and Amanda Kocovsky all have collegiate experience. Kelba, who competed at the Canadian Diving Winter Championships, led the team in the platform (256.95) in 2011-12, a score that ranks fourth in the record books.

The Hawkeyes also have three newcomers on the roster in Northern Iowa transfer Morgan Kinney, redshirt freshman Nicolette Freeman and freshman Samantha Wagner. All three will add to the Iowa diving depth.



Head Coach • Ninth Season
University of Iowa, 1991



Marc Long is in his ninth season as head coach for the University of Iowa swimming team and eighth leading both the men and women's squads. He served two seasons as the Iowa women's assistant coach (2003-04) before taking over the helm for the 2004-05 season. He also served as the Hawkeye men's assistant coach from 1998-2001.

During his tenure as head coach of both programs, 54 school records have fallen and 92 Hawkeyes have automatically or provisionally qualified for the NCAA Championships.

During the 2011-12 season, Long led the UI men's team to a fifth place showing at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish since 1996. Two Iowa relays -- the 200 and 400 free relays -- won Big Ten titles, marking the program's first relay crown in 17 years. Five Hawkeyes garnered first team All-Big Ten recognition.

The women's team finished ninth at the 2012 Big Ten Championships with 201 points. Freshman Becky Stoughton became the first Hawkeye to be selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after finishing in the top six in three individual events.

The Iowa men's team posted a 26th place finish at the NCAA Championships, its best showing since 1995, and three Hawkeye relays earned honorable mention All-America honors. Stoughton became the first UI female swimmer to advance to the NCAA Championships

since 2005 and the first freshman since 2002. She earned honorable mention All-America honors after placing ninth in the 1,650 free. The men's team finished the season with a 7-2 dual meet record, running its four-year mark to an impressive 31-5. The team climbed to a program best 10th in the CSCAA dual meet rankings and finished the season ranked 14th. The Hawkeye women posted a 10-6 record, the most dual victories since the 1985-86 season.

Twenty-four Iowa student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors during the 2011-12 season. Four women's swimmers were recognized with the Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award, and nine Hawkeyes earned Scholar All-America recognition by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA). The women's team earned Scholar All-America team honors for the eighth straight year, finishing with the third-best grade point average in the nation.

Iowa set 18 school records during the 2011-12 season (11 men, seven women) and 18 Hawkeyes posted a NCAA qualifying time. In June 2012, 14 Hawkeyes represented the program at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials in Omaha.

In 2010-11, the Hawkeye men set schools records in three individual events and all five relays, while the women's squad set a program record in one individual event and one relay. The men recorded a dual meet record of 7-1 overall and 3-1 in the Big Ten to finish the year ranked 24th in the final TYR/CSCAA rankings. The Hawkeye men sent Paul Gordon, Jordan Huff, Duncan Partridge and Ryan Phelan to the NCAA Championships in the 200 free relay. The quartet earned All-America honors in 400 free relay at the NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in 11 individual events and five relays. The women's team was named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the sixth-straight year, and 20 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2009-10, the Hawkeye men set school records in two individual events and three relays, while the women's squad set a program record in one individual event and established a new pool record. The Iowa men recorded their best dual record in program history with a 10-1 overall record and finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships, the highest finish in 14 years. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fifth-straight year, and 28 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2008-09, the Hawkeye women set school records in four individual events and three relays, while the men's squad set school bests in two individual events. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in seven individual events and five relays. The Iowa men posted their best dual record since 1995 with a 7-1 mark, and went undefeated (4-0) at its own Field House pool. The women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fourth straight year, and 25 Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

The 2007-08 season saw four school records set at the 2008 Big Ten Championships, including two relays. Wil Whaley and Christine Kuczek eclipsed Iowa's records in the 200 backstroke and 100 freestyle, respectively. Long also coached the women's 200 and 400 free relay teams to school records, while Whaley also placed 19th at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials.

In 2006-07, two more school records were broken and nine student-athletes posted NCAA "B" cuts. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by competing at the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast -- two events in which he set new school records.

In his first season with the combined program (2005-06), four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Five-time All-American and U.S. Olympic





diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting Iowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by Underwood and four-year NCAA qualifier and All-American Jennifer Skolaski at the meet. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Field House pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

While great individual and team performances are crucial, Long also places a high priority on academic success. During Long's tenure, Iowa has crowned 17 academic All-Americans and 151 Academic All-Big Ten selections, and the team has earned academic All-America honors eight times.

Long served as the UI's aquatics director for his first six years as head coach, which allowed him to be a part of the core committee involved in designing the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center.

As an assistant coach, Long helped Iowa to its highest placing and point total in school history (20th, 41 points) at the 2003 NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes also posted an 8-4 overall season record, which was the first winning season for the program since 1999-2000.

Before his assistant coaching stints, Long served as head coach of the Iowa City Eels Swim Club (ICE) and the COHO Swim Club (Deer-

field, IL). During his tenure, Long helped produce numerous state champions, record holders, and NCAA and USS national qualifiers.

Long began his collegiate swimming career at the University of Northern Iowa (1986), winning the conference title and setting the 100 butterfly school record before joining the University of Iowa men's squad his sophomore season. As a Hawkeye swimmer (1987-89), Long was a multiple NCAA finalist, six-time All-American and three-time Big Ten champion, winning two conference titles in the 100 fly and one as part of the 400 free relay. Long was voted a team captain in 1989 and helped lead the Hawkeyes to a Big Ten runner-up finish, and their highest team placing (eighth) in modern day history at the NCAA Championships. Long swam on Iowa's Big Ten and NCAA record setting 200 freestyle relay that year. He was also a member of the 1987 U.S. National Champion 400-meter freestyle relay team from San Jose (Calif.) Aquatics, and participated in the 1988 U.S. Olympic Trials. Long is a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America.

A native of Cedar Falls, Iowa, Long earned his bachelor's degree in recreation education from Iowa in 1991. He and his wife, Beth, have two children, Ethan and Rhys, and a dog, PeeKay.

FRANNIE MALONE

Associate Head Coach • Ninth Season
University of Iowa, 2000

Frannie Malone is in her ninth season with the Hawkeyes and was named associate head coach prior to the 2010-11 season. Malone served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator since joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2004.

During the 2011-12 season, Malone led the men's team to a fifth place showing at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish since 1996. Two UI relays -- the 200 and 400 free relays -- won Big Ten titles. It was the first relay crown for the program in 17 years. Five Hawkeyes garnered first team All-Big Ten recognition.

The women's team finished ninth at the 2012 Big Ten Championships with 201 points. Freshman Becky Stoughton became the first Hawkeye to be selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after finishing in the top six in three individual events.

The Iowa men's team finished 26th at the NCAA Championships, its best finish since 1995, and three Hawkeye relays earned honorable mention All-America honors. Stoughton became the first UI female swimmer to advance to the NCAA Championships since 2005 and the first freshman since 2002. She earned honorable mention All-America honors after placing ninth in the 1,650 free.

The men's team finished the season with a 7-2 dual meet record, running its four-year mark to an impressive 31-5. The team climbed to a program best 10th in the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) dual meet rankings and finished the season ranked 14th. The Hawkeye women posted a 10-6 record, the most dual victories since the 1985-86 season.

Twenty-four Iowa student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors during the 2011-12 season. Four women's swimmers were recognized with the Big Ten

Distinguished Scholar Award, and nine Hawkeyes earned Scholar All-America recognition by the CSCAA.

Following the 2011-12 season, 14 Hawkeyes represented the program at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials in Omaha.

In 2010-11, Malone coached four Iowa swimmers to All-America honors at the 2011 NCAA Championships. Ten school records were broken over the course of the season, eight by the men's program and two by the women's team. In the classroom, 20 Hawkeyes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors, and the women's program was named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the sixth straight season.

In 2009-10, the Iowa men posted a 10-1 dual record and finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships, the program's highest finish in 14 years. The Hawkeyes combined to set six school records, and 28 student-athletes were named Academic All-Big Ten. The Hawkeye women were named to the CSCAA All-Academic team for the fifth straight year.

In 2008-09, the Hawkeye women set school records in four individual events and three relays, while the men's squad set school bests in two individual events. The Hawkeyes posted NCAA "B" cuts in seven individual events and five relays. The Iowa men posted their best dual record since 1995 with a 7-1 mark, and went undefeated (4-0) at their own Field House pool. Twenty-five Hawkeyes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2008, Malone coached events that broke four school records at the 2008 Big Ten Championships. Wil Whaley and Christine Kuczek eclipsed Iowa's previous bests in the 200 back and 100 free, respectively, while the women's 200 and 400 free relay teams also set school records. Whaley placed 19th at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials, and Iowa posted NCAA "B" cuts in nine individual events and four relays.

Malone's second season on the Hawkeye staff saw two school records broken and nine student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Championships. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by qualifying for the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast -- the two events in which he set new school records. Agache posted Iowa's highest Big Ten finishes with third in the 100 and sixth in the 200.

In her first season with the combined program, four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Five-time All-America diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting Iowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by Underwood and four-year NCAA swimmer Jennifer Skolaski at the meet. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Field House pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

Prior to returning to Iowa, Malone served as an assistant women's swimming coach at Tulane (2003) and Fresno State (2002). At Tulane, she helped field the first Green Wave swimming team since 1989-90, recruiting a class of 15 student-athletes. The fledgling team posted a 13-3 dual record, won three Conference USA individual titles and recorded 20 top eight finishes at the conference meet. Linda McEachrane won two conference titles to earn Conference USA Freshman of the Year accolades and posted NCAA performances in the 50 and 100 free.

At Fresno State, Malone helped the Bulldogs to a 6-6 record and a fourth-place finish in the Western Athletic Conference with a team comprised of one senior and 18 freshmen.

Malone served as a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University (2001) and student assistant coach at Iowa (1998-2000) after her swimming career was cut short by a shoulder injury. Her club coaching experience includes leading the Willow Knolls Country Club and Ohio Master's Swimming Program, and serving as an age-group assistant with the Central Illinois Aquatics Program.

Malone is a USA Swimming Registered Coach, a Dimension I and II graduate of the NCAA Women's Coaches Academy and a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and the CSCAA.

A native of Peoria, Ill., Malone earned her bachelor's degree from Iowa in 2000 and her master's degree in physical education and sports science from Ohio in 2004. She and her husband, Sean, have a son, Nathan.





TODD WAIKEL

Diving Coach • First Season
Purdue, 1994



Todd Waikel is entering his first season as the diving coach with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program. Waikel, who was the assistant diving coach at Indiana for the past seven seasons, replaces long time UI diving coach Bob Rydze.

Waikel comes to Iowa City with an impressive collegiate and national diving resume. He helped the Hoosiers to five Big Ten Conference titles (four women's, one men's) and three top 10 NCAA finishes in his seven seasons. He also has coached 10 USA Diving National Teams to titles since 2006.

Individually, Waikel has coached one NCAA champion, 47 All-Americans and 14 Big Ten champions during his collegiate coaching career. He also guided seven student-athletes to Big Ten Diver of the Year and Big Ten Diver of the Championship honors.

In his final season at Indiana, Waikel coached six Indiana divers to 11 All-America honors. Darian Schmidt and Zac Nees earned All-America status on all three boards. Schmidt won the individual Big Ten title on the platform and was the Big Ten Diver of the Championship.

In 2010-11, Waikel was key in guiding the Indiana women's squad to its third consecutive Big Ten title and Laura Ryan to her first win on the women's platform.

In 2009-10, Waikel coached Gabby Agostino to her first Big Ten title, while helping IU to the women's team title. Hoosier All-American Christina Loukas won a national title on the 3-meter springboard at the USA Diving Winter Nationals, and Amy Korthauer earned a spot on the U.S. National Team for the FINA World Cup in China.

In 2009, Waikel helped Loukas to Big Ten and NCAA titles on the 3-meter springboard, as well as NCAA Diver of the Year, Big Ten Diver of the Year and Big Ten Diver of the Championships honors. Brittny Feldman also finished third in the 3-meter at the NCAA meet to garner All-America recognition.

In 2008, Waikel's divers captured four Big Ten titles, earning diver of the year, diver of the championship and coach of the year honors on both the men's and women's sides. Feldman captured conference titles in both the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard and went on to earn All-America honors in both events. Landon Marzullo won the same events on the men's side and was an All-American in all three diving events.

In 2007, Loukas turned in one of the most dominant performances in Big Ten diving history, becoming just the fourth diver to win all three diving events at the meet. She earned Big Ten Diver of the Year and Diver of the Championship honors for the third straight season. Loukas went on to earn first team All-America honors after finishing as the runner-up in the 1-meter, while two other divers earned honorable mention recognition.


Loukas, a 2008 Olympian, won her first national title with a win in the 1-meter at the 2007 National Championships, and she defended that title in 2008 and 2009. She was also a silver medalist in the 3-meter and a bronze in the 3-meter synchro at the World University Games. Loukas was a seven-time USA National Champion and six-time Big Ten champion under Waikel's watch.

Waikel helped the Indiana divers post impressive showings on both the Big Ten and NCAA levels during his first season in Bloomington. Brian Mariano and Loukas both earned Big Ten Co-Diver of the Year and Co-Diver of the Championship honors. Two men's divers earned All-America recognition, while Loukas was an All-American on all three boards.

On the national scene, Waikel has been in leadership positions throughout his career. He has been a team leader on the 1997 Italy Dive Tour in Rome, Italy, and the 1999 Alpine Dive Tour in Stroudsburg, France. He also was the 2010 USA Diving team leader/coach at the FINA Grand Prix in Montreal and the 2011 USA Diving Team coach at the 2011 World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

Prior to joining the Hoosiers, Waikel was considered one of the top junior coaches in the country. During his 15 year tenure as a junior coach, Waikel worked with some of the top JO divers from beginner to JO All-American and champions.

Waikel, who is a safety certified, U.S. Diving Grassroots and Dive Safe instructor, graduated from Purdue University in 1994 with a degree in speech communications. He and his wife, Marlene, are the parents of nine children: Damian, Hannah, Nathan, Dominic, Jonah, Paul, Christopher, Clare and Vincent.

Assistant Coach • Fifth Season
University of Tampa, 2001

He and his wife, Erika, have a son, Nolan.





KRISTY BRAGER

Assistant Coach • First Year
University of Wisconsin, 2008

Kristy Brager is in her first season as an assistant coach with the University of Iowa swimming and diving program. Brager joins the Hawkeyes following a two-year stint at George Mason University.

During her two seasons with the Patriots, Brager helped lead the men's team to a pair of runner-up finishes in the Colonial Athletic Association -- its highest showing in school history. The men's and women's teams produced six CAA champions and set 11 school and eight conference records. Two of Brager's student-athletes swam to three individual event titles at the CAA Championships.

Brager tutored All-American and two-time NCAA runner-up Ashley Danner in the breaststroke. Danner became the 10th-fastest American swimmer during her senior year in the 100. Brager also coached Pan-American Games champion and two-time Olympic Trial semifinalist Amanda Kendall during the summer of 2012.

Prior to making the move to Fairfax, Va., Brager served as a senior assistant coach with the Badger Aquatics Swim Club from 2008-10. She coached three Olympic Trial, five Senior National and 12 Junior National meet qualifiers.

She also has coached at the club and high school level, serving as the head swim coach at Seminole Pool and Tennis Club and Edgewood Private High School in Wisconsin.

As a collegian, Brager swam collegiately at the University of Wisconsin, where she posted perfect practice and competition attendance throughout her four year career. She received the "Most Improved Award" in 2006 and the "Hardest Worker" honor in 2007 and 2008.

In the classroom, Brager was a two-time academic All-Big Ten selection for the Badgers, while twice earning the UW Student-Athlete Academic Excellence Award (2007, 2008). She was also the recipient of the 2007 Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.


Brager graduated from Wisconsin with a bachelor's degree in economics in Dec. 2008, while also earning a certificate in environmental studies.

GARY BARTA
ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

Now in his seventh year as director of athletics at the University of Iowa and his 26th year in athletic administration, Gary Barta manages an athletics program that continues to gain momentum in two key areas -- on the playing field and in the classroom -- while enhancing the infrastructure that will serve as the foundation for future successes.

Academically, the UI's federal graduation rate of 74 percent (for student-athletes who enrolled in 2004-05) ties the best ever posted by UI athletics. That mark was a 13-point

increase over the previous year and was nine points above the national average; UI student-athletes will establish another record when the latest figures are released in October. Last fall, the NCAA confirmed that all 24 of Iowa's teams exceeded the Academic Progress Rate (APR) benchmark for the fourth straight year.

In figures released last fall, Iowa's score of 86 percent in the NCAA's "Graduation Success Rate" or GSR, also matched a school record. Five different women's teams at the UI posted perfect 100 GSR scores. Iowa's GSR in football (83), men's (73) and women's (100) basketball all ranked above the national average for their respective sports.

Athletically, Hawkeye teams enjoyed another outstanding year in 2011-12. A significant number of Iowa's 24 programs reached postseason play. The Iowa football team reached bowl eligibility for the 11th straight season and competing in a bowl game for the fourth straight year and 10th time in the last 11 seasons. The women's basketball program participated in the NCAA Tournament for a fifth straight season and men's basketball returned to postseason competition under second-year coach Fran McCaffery, recording an 84-75 win over Dayton in front of 13,190 re-energized fans in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeye wrestling program, led by national champion Matt McDonough, made another run at a national title before placing third. The men's golf team placed 22nd nationally in its third appearance in the NCAA Championships in the last four seasons. Additionally, the UI men's track and field placed 23rd in the nation and the UI's men's swimming and diving program placed 26th at its national championship.

Iowa's field hockey team advanced to the NCAA Tournament and the Hawkeye softball team placed second in the Big Ten. Between the men's and women's track and field teams, 34 student-athletes competed at the NCAA Championships and 14 members of the UI men's and women's swimming and diving teams qualified for the Olympic Trials.

And, while the UI athletics department continues to earn high marks in integrity, academic excellence, and athletic performances. Barta also continues to oversee critical improvements and additions to the facilities used by the UI's talented student-athletes while maintaining a balanced and ever-growing operations budget that continues to be self-sustaining.

In addition to the competitive success the Hawkeyes recorded in 2011-12, the UI once again experienced tremendous success at the turnstiles. Iowa has sold every seat in historic Kinnick Stadium in each of the past two seasons, ranking 21st in national attendance both years. The UI will enter the 2012 home football season with all seven home games sold out once again and boasts waiting lists for not only season tickets, but also the premium seating options available inside the Paul W. Brechler Press Box.

Attendance at home games of the UI's men's basketball team has climbed more than 30 percent the last two seasons. Iowa's attendance of 13,190 for a first round NIT game in Carver-Hawkeye Arena ranked as the highest attended game of the 2012 tournament.

The UI wrestling team set another national attendance record by averaging 9,014 fans per home meet in 2011-12, leading the nation in attendance for the sixth straight year. The economic impact of the 2012 U.S. Olympic Wrestling Team Trials, hosted by the UI in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, exceeded \$5 million, according to survey results released by the Iowa City/Coralville Area Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Attendance at home games of the UI's women's basketball games also remained strong as the program once again ranked among national leaders in 2011-12. The UI also registered increases in attendance at home volleyball, soccer, field hockey, women's gymnastics, men's gymnastics, softball and baseball events.

Since 2006, the Hawkeyes have invested more than \$150 million in new and renovated athletic facilities. Upgrades include the restoration of historic Kinnick Stadium and Carver-Hawkeye Arena, as well as a new state-of-the-art aquatics center, a boathouse facility for the UI rowing program and an indoor and outdoor tennis complex. Another \$60 million worth of improvements are underway in the form of the two phase football training center project and an indoor golf performance facility.

In late summer 2011, the UI completed a \$47 million revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena. That project included the construction of a practice facility for men's and women's basketball and volleyball, a 10,000-square-foot strength training and cardiovascular center, and an expansion to the Dan Gable Wrestling Complex, in addition to new locker room and support facilities for men's and women's basketball, wrestling and volleyball programs, and office space for the majority of Iowa administrative and coaching staffs.

The Carver project included the installation of a statue of Gable at the facility's main entrance. That project was completed in time for the thousands of fans of the sport of wrestling to enjoy while attending the 2012 USA Wrestling Olympic Team Trials.

Phase I of a two-phase project for the UI football program was completed in August, 2012. Phase I includes the new indoor practice facility for Coach Kirk Ferentz' program that has competed on 10 bowl games over the past 11 seasons. Phase II includes construction of the new Iowa Football Operations Center, which will include new team locker rooms, team meeting rooms, athletic medical training space, video operations, and coaches offices and meeting rooms. Funded entirely through private support and revenue generated by the UI Athletics Department, the project is an important next phase of the master facilities plan for Hawkeye football. It will be constructed adjacent to the Ron and Margaret Kenyon Outdoor Practice Facility, immediately west of Kinnick Stadium and will be connected to the new indoor practice facility.

The 2010-11 season marked the first for the men's and women's swimming and diving teams in the UI's \$69 million Campus Recreation and Wellness Center. The Hawkeyes hosted the 2012 Big Ten Championships and the UI men's squad responded by earning its highest Big Ten finish in 15 seasons.

Another of the latest additions to the facilities available to the UI's student-athletes is the Varsity Golf Complex practice facility for the men's and women's golf programs. Located at the southern edge of the UI's award-winning Finkbine Golf Course, the facility is expected to be completed for use this winter. It will provide the Hawkeyes a state-of-the-art facility that offers the opportunity for year-round training and practice.

Barta's involvement in the UI campus community extends beyond intercollegiate athletics. He is a member of the President's Cabinet, comprised of vice presidents and other campus leaders, that provide counsel to UI President Sally Mason. That group was instrumental in the UI's response to record-setting flooding that besieged the campus and the Iowa City and Coralville community in June 2008.

Barta also represents the UI and the Hawkeyes at the conference and national level. During his first six years at the UI, he has participated in the creation and implementation of the Big Ten Network, the expansion of the Big Ten Conference and realignment of athletics conferences nationally, and the Big Ten's postseason bowl game agreements that were successfully implemented in 2010.

Nationally, Barta remains active in the Division IA Athletics Directors Association, the National Association of College Directors of Athletics, and currently serves on the NCAA Football Committee Board of Directors.

Barta often suggests to his staff that "Hope is not a strategy," which is why he is currently overseeing a comprehensive review of the strategic plan for the UI Athletics Department and has worked with the UI's leadership on a long-term financial plan.

Another favorite saying of his is, "Vision without resources is irrelevant." Over the course of his career he has been directly involved in raising hundreds of millions of dollars in support of intercollegiate athletics. This has remained a primary focus during his tenure at Iowa, where private support for the Hawkeyes continues to flourish despite a challenging economy.

Under Barta's leadership — and thanks to a talented athletics development staff — the UI has seen year-over-year improvement in annual giving in spite of the difficult economic environment. In addition, under Barta's direction, the UI generated more than \$20 million of philanthropic and corporate sponsorship support for the revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena and has already surpassed that level of support for the current football projects.

The UI also generated the \$2 million in private support necessary to fully fund the Hawkeyes' new practice facility for its men's and women's golf programs.

As the director of athletics at the University of Wyoming for three years, seven different UW coaches were named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He also spearheaded a fund-raising effort that netted the Cowboy athletics program \$11 million in private support and \$11 million in matching state fund.

As the senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington, he directed the "Campaign for the Student-Athlete," was a participant in the design, construction and/or renovation of several UW athletics facilities, including Bank of America Arena and the Dempsey Indoor Practice Facility. In addition to almost doubling the amount of annual private support received by UW, Barta also managed the department's external relations division, a task that included corporate sponsorship and radio contracts.

His responsibilities at Washington expanded over time to include hiring of coaching and administrative staff, and the day-to-day oversight of several Huskie sport teams.

The roots of his development experience extend to his first two positions: director of athletics development and external relations at the University of Northern Iowa and director of development at his alma mater, North Dakota State University.



Barta, and his wife, Connie, have a son, Luke (14) and a daughter, Madison (12). He was born Sept. 4, 1963, in Minneapolis.








IOWA CONTINUES TO BUILD FOR SUCCESS

The UI Department of Athletics is under the direction of Gary Barta and is regarded as one of the top intercollegiate programs in the nation. Once again, the Hawkeyes enjoyed success both athletically and academically in 2011-12

Academically, the UI's federal graduation rate of 74 percent (for student-athletes who enrolled in 2004-05) ties the best ever posted by UI athletics. That mark was a 13-point increase over the previous year and was nine points above the national average; UI student-athletes will establish another record when the latest figures are released in October. Last fall, the NCAA confirmed that all 24 of Iowa's teams exceeded the Academic Progress Rate (APR) benchmark for the fourth straight year.

Athletically, Hawkeye teams enjoyed another outstanding year in 2011-12. A significant number of Iowa's 24 programs reached postseason play. The Iowa football team reached bowl eligibility for the 11th straight season and competed in a bowl game for the fourth straight year and 10th time in the last 11 seasons. The women's basketball program participated in the NCAA Tournament for a fifth straight season and men's basketball returned to postseason competition under second-year coach Fran McCaffery.

In late summer 2011, the UI completed a \$47 million revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena. That project included the construction of a practice facility for men's and women's basketball and volleyball, a 10,000-square-foot strength training and cardiovascular center, and an expansion to the Dan Gable Wrestling Complex, in addition to new locker room and support facilities for men's and women's basketball, wrestling and volleyball programs, and office space for the majority of Iowa administrative and coaching staffs.


Phase I of a two-phase project for the UI football program was completed in August, 2012. Phase I includes the new indoor practice facility for Coach Kirk Ferentz' program that has competed on 10 bowl games over the past 11 seasons. Phase II includes construction of the new Iowa Football Operations Center, which will include new team locker rooms, team meeting rooms, athletic medical training space, video operations, and coaches offices and meeting rooms. Funded entirely through private support and revenue generated by the UI Athletics Department, the project is an important next phase of the master facilities plan for Hawkeye football.

IOWA WRESTLING

The Hawkeye wrestling team -- the national attendance leader in each of the last six seasons -- continued its dominance on the mat, finishing third at the NCAA Championships. Six Hawkeyes earned All-America accolades in 2012, including two-time national champion Matt McDonough. Iowa has claimed 23 national championships and 34 Big Ten titles in its 102-year history.

IOWA FOOTBALL

Iowa football continued its stellar play, finishing in the upper division of the Big Ten for the 10th time in the last 11 years. The Hawkeyes reached bowl eligibility for the 11th straight season and competed in the postseason for the fourth straight year.



IOWA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The women's basketball team won its final eight games of the regular season to finish tied for second in the Big Ten and earn an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. Head Coach Lisa Bluder has now led Iowa to five-straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

IOWA MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD

The men's track and field team recorded a pair of top 25 finishes at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. The Hawkeyes crowned four Big Ten champions and nine All-Americans, including Erik Sowinski, who placed second in the 800 meters at the NCAA Championships.

IOWA MEN'S GOLF

Head coach Mark Hankins led the Hawkeyes to their third NCAA Championships appearance in the last four years. Iowa collected another top-25 national finish and multiple individuals earned honors throughout the season.

IOWA MEN'S BASKETBALL

Second-year head coach Fran McCaffery led the Hawkeyes to 18 wins and an NIT bid a year ago. Iowa improved by seven wins from 2011 to 2012, as McCaffery continued to demonstrate his ability to rebuild programs and reenergize the fan base -- Iowa's attendance increased for the second straight year and ranked No. 31 nationally.

IOWA SWIMMING AND DIVING

The Iowa men's swimming and diving team posted its best finish in 17 years, placing fifth in the Big Ten and 26th at the NCAA Championships. The Hawkeye won a pair of Big Ten relay titles and five student-athletes went on to garner honorable mention All-America accolades. On the women's team, freshman Becky Stoughton became the first UI swimmer to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors, and she was the first Hawkeye women's swimmer to earn All-America honors since 2005.


Some universities offer the large city atmosphere. Others offer the college town experience. The University of Iowa is uniquely situated to offer student athletes the very best of both of these different worlds.







THE HAWKEYE NICKNAME

The University of Iowa borrowed its athletic nickname from the state of Iowa many years ago. The name Hawkeye was originally the name of the hero in the fictional novel, *The Last of the Mohicans*, written by James Fenimore Cooper. Cooper had the Delaware Indians bestow the name on a white scout who lived with them.

In 1838, 12 years after the book was published, people in the territory of Iowa acquired the nickname, chiefly through the efforts of Judge David Rorer of Burlington and James Edwards of Fort Madison.

Edwards, editor of the Fort Madison Patriot, moved his paper to Burlington in 1843 and renamed it the Burlington Hawkeye. The two men continued their campaign to popularize the name, and territorial officials eventually gave it their formal approval.
Herky The Hawkeye

The Hawkeye nickname gained a tangible symbol in 1948 when a cartoon character, later to be named Herky the Hawkeye was hatched. The creator was Richard Spencer III, instructor of journalism at Iowa.

The impish Hawk was an immediate hit and acquired a name through a statewide contest staged by the athletic department. John Franklin, a Belle Plaine alumnus, was the man who suggested Herky.

Since his birth more than 45 years ago, Herky has symbolized Iowa athletics and epitomized University life. He even donned a military uniform during the Korean War and became the insignia of the 124th Fighter Squadron.

During the mid-1950s, Herky came to life at a football game as the Iowa mascot. Since that time, Herky has been a familiar figure at Iowa athletics events.
