IOWA NOTES

Kirk Ferentz has 95 Big Ten Conference wins, tying Joe Paterno for No. 5 all-time in conference history. Hayden Fry ranks fourth in conference history with 96 wins.

LB Kristian Welch returned to the lineup for the first time since Week 6 and led Iowa with a game-high 11 tackles, matching his career best. SS Geno Stone also matched his career-high with eight tackles.

DE A.J. Epenesa had 2.5 of Iowa's season-high six sacks. It is the most sacks by a Hawkeye defense since 2013 (Northwestern).

K Keith Duncan connected on one field goal today (27). He has 23 made field goals this season, a single-season school record. Duncan is 23-26 on field attempts this season, and 12-14 on field goal tries of 40-yards. Duncan has 32 career made field goals, tying Daniel Murray for seventh all-time.

QB Nate Stanley threw two touchdowns today (21, 5). He has 66 career touchdown passes in his career, No. 2 all-time in program history (Chuck Long, 74). Stanley has 19 career multi-touchdown games, including five this season. Stanley made his 36th consecutive start, the second longest streak by a Hawkeye QB in program history (Long, 47).

RB Tyler Goodson made his first career start. He is the fourth true freshman to start this season, and the 28th true freshman to start under Ferentz. He is the fifth true freshman running back to start in the Ferentz era, and the first since Greg Garmon in 2012 (Goodson 2015, Garmon 2012, Canzeri 2011, Coker 2010, Wegher (2009).

RB Tyler Goodson's 10-yard touchdown rush in the first quarter was his first career touchdown.

WR Tyrone Tracy had a career-high six receptions for 77 yards. He has 16 receptions for 323 yards the last four games. He had 12 receptions for 190 yards in the first six games.

Iowa's defense held Minnesota to a season-low 19 points. The Gophers had scored at least 31 points in eight straight games.

The Hawkeyes played their third trophy game of the season (2-1). Iowa defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy with an 18-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 14, lost at Wisconsin 24-22 on Nov. 9, and defeated Minnesota, 23-19, today. The Hawkeyes are 15-4 in their last 19 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all four losses coming to Wisconsin.

Nov. 16, 2019 marks the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell. Iowa has played 1,256 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 657-560-39 (.539).
