ON THE MAT

The University of Iowa wrestling team wrestles at Indiana on Friday and at No. 18 Purdue on Sunday. The Hawkeyes and Hoosiers meet at 6 p.m. (CT) at Wilkinson Hall. Iowa visits Purdue on Sunday at 3 p.m. inside Holloway Gymnasium.

THE SERIES -- INDIANA

Iowa leads the all-time series against Indiana, 39-4-3. The Hawkeyes have won the last 24 meetings, including a 32-7 win the last time Iowa visited Bloomington in 2017.

The Hawkeyes are 18-1-2 all-time in Bloomington, Indiana, against the Hoosiers. Indiana's last win in the series was in 1968, a 19-13 win at Indiana. That is their only home win the history of the series that started in 1918.

IOWA VS. PURDUE

Iowa leads the all-time series 42-4-3 and has won the last 30 meetings. The teams battled to a 14-14 tie in 1966, the last time Iowa walked away without a win. That dual was in Iowa City. Purdue's last win in the series was a 23-9 victory in 1961 in Iowa City.

The Hawkeyes are 19-3-1 all-time against the Boilermakers in West Lafayette, Indiana. Purdue has not won a home dual against Iowa since Feb. 27, 1954 (16-10).

IOWA COACHING TREE

Purdue head coach Tony Ersland is one of four Big Ten coaches to graduate from Iowa (Tom Brands, Iowa; Tony Ersland, Purdue; Jim Heffernan, Illinois; Tom Ryan, Ohio State). Ersland was part of three NCAA championship teams from 1995-97.

LUGO CLIMBS TO NO. 1

Senior Pat Lugo climbed to the top spot of the 149-pound rankings following the Midlands Championships on Dec. 29-30.

Lugo won the 149-pound title, going 6-0 and using one pin, one technical fall, and two major decisions to reach the

semifinals. He defeated No. 7 Max Thomson, 3-2, in the semis, and defeated top-ranked Austin O'Conner, 8-4, in the finals.

Lugo is 10-0 this season with five wins over ranked opponents, including three in the top seven. He is 17-9 all-time against ranked opponents.

The No. 1 billing is the first of Lugo's career. He has spent all season in the top 5 after finishing the 2019 season with an eighth-place All-America finish. Prior to the 2019 national tournament, Lugo had not been ranked higher than 10th.

FORCEFUL-LEE

Junior Spencer Lee enters the weekend ranked No. 1 at 125 with a 6-0 record. Lee has scored bonus points in each match, winning once by major decision, twice by fall, and three times by technical fall.

Only three times this season has Lee wrestled into the second period. His two pins are both in under a minute, 0:54 and 0:52. One technical fall occurred in the first period, and the other two were in 3:13 and 3:32.

BIG TEN & 0

Junior Spencer Lee (14-0), junior Austin DeSanto (8-0), junior Alex Marinelli (18-0), and freshman Tony Cassioppi (1-0) are all undefeated in their careers in Big Ten duals.

Among Lee's 14 wins are seven falls, five in the first period, three technical falls, and one major decision.

Junior Michael Kemerer has a career mark of 17-1 in Big Ten duals, and senior Pat Lugo is 8-1 in his career in Big Ten duals.

MARINELLI EARNS B1G WEEKLY HONOR

Junior Alex Marinelli was named Big Ten Co-Wrestler of the Week on Jan. 3

Marinelli won the 165-pound Midlands championship on Dec. 30. He ran through the bracket, recording four falls and three wins over ranked opponents. He was named the Midlands Champion of Champions, and earned tournament awards for most falls (4) and highest point scorer (29).

He shared the weekly conference honor with Wisconsin's Seth Gross.

The Big Ten honor was the fourth of Marinelli's career, and the second for Iowa this season. Austin DeSanto earned the award Dec. 3.

DESANTO EARNS B1G WEEKLY HONOR

Junior Austin DeSanto was named Big Ten Conference Wrestler of the Week on Jan. 3.

In a matchup of one versus two, DeSanto defeated Wisconsin's Seth Gross, 6-2, in Iowa's Big Ten opener on Dec. 1.

DeSanto scored one takedown in the first period and two more in the second to hand Gross his first loss at 133 pounds since the 2017 NCAA finals.

The Big Ten Conference honor was the first for Iowa this season and the second of DeSanto's career. He was named co-Wrestler of the week on January 22, 2019.

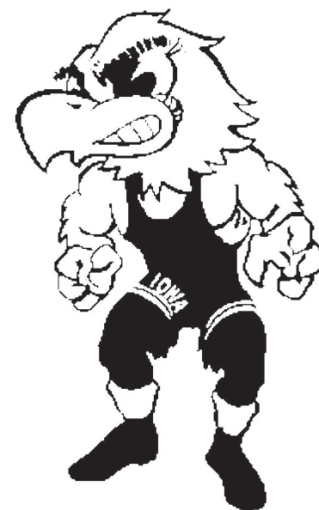

Tom Brands Head Coach University of Iowa, 1992

Three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Tom Brands is in his 14th season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa in 2019-20. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time All-American and

three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 222-23-1 (.903) overall and 100-10 (.909) Big Ten coaching record at Iowa. He has a 239-43-1 (.844) career mark.

In 13 complete seasons as Iowa's head coach, Brands has led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA and four Big Ten team titles, crowning 12 NCAA champions, 16 Big Ten champions and 72 All-Americans. Iowa has had 112 Academic All-Big Ten recipients, including a school-record 13 in 2018-19. The Hawkeyes have qualified 118 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships in the last 13 years, sending the entire 10-man lineup in 2009, 2010, 2014, and 2015. Iowa has also won or shared nine of the last 12 Big Ten regular season titles.

Iowa set the national collegiate dual meet attendance record of 42,287 when Iowa defeated top-ranked Oklahoma State, 18-16, on Nov. 14, 2015 at the Grapple on the Gridiron at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa has led the nation in attendance in each of Brands' 13 seasons, setting an NCAA all-time attendance average of 12,166 in 2015-16.

Brands was named 2008 NWCA Coach of the Year after leading the Hawkeyes to their first NCAA team title since 2000 and their first Big Ten team title since 2004. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009 and 2010, becoming the first coach in conference history to earn the honor in three consecutive seasons.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies,

Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. During his tenure, Virginia Tech crowned five ACC champions and had two All-Americans. Senior heavy-weight Mike Faust was named 2006 ACC Wrestler of the Year.

Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at Iowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten team titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 All-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in Athens, and in 2016 he was named a volunteer coach of the United States Olympic team in Rio. Brands also served as assistant coach for the U.S. Freestyle World Teams in 2001, 2002, 2003, 2013, 2014, and 2015. He was named Freestyle Coach of the Year by USA Wrestling in 2002 and 2003. He has coached a number of other U.S. teams in international competition.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, Georgia. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler, and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001.

Brands was a four-time All-American at Iowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three-time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at Iowa. His career mark of 158-7-2 includes an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

The Sheldon, Iowa, native was born April 9, 1968. He earned his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1992. He and his wife, Jeni, have three adult children, Madigan, Kinsee and Tommy.
