- lowa and Nebraska are playing "The Hy-Vee Heroes Game" Friday, with the winner claiming the Heroes Trophy. Iowa has won three straight in the series, and is 12-3 in its last 15 trophy games.
- The Hawkeyes rank second in the Big Ten in scoring defense (16.5), rushing defense (99.5), passing defense (180.1), and total defense (279.5). Iowa's total defense ranks sixth. Its rushing defense ranks eighth in the country. Iowa is ninth in the country in scoring defense.
- QB Nate Stanley has 21 touchdown passes, third most in the Big Ten. He needs six touchdowns to tie Chuck Long (1985) for Iowa's single-season record. He is 15 yards shy of becoming the ninth player in school history to reach 5,000 career passing yards.
- The Hawkeyes have 17 interceptions in 2018, most in the B1G and tied for second in the country. Iowa has 15 thefts since SS Geno Stone entered the starting lineup and Amani Hooker moved from SS to OLB. Iowa led the nation in interceptions (21) in 2017.
- The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten and rank third in the country averaging 28.5 yards per kickoff return. WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette ranks No. 2 in the country, averaging 31.9 yards on 15 returns.
- The Hawkeyes are tied for second in the B1G with 31 sacks. DE A.J. Epensesa leads the team and ties for second in the B1G with 8.5 sacks. DE Anthony Nelson is tied for sixth in the B1G with 7.5 sacks. The 16 combined sacks are the most of any pair of teammates in the B1G.
- Noah Fant has 19 career TD receptions, more than any other tight end in program history and enough for fourth all-time in program history. The 19 touchdown receptions rank third all-time in Big Ten history by a tight end (Dave Young, Purdue, 27; Josiah Price, MSU, 21).
- T.J. Hockenson is one for three finalists for the John Mackey Award. Hockenson leads the team with 663 receiving yards and 41 receptions, both career highs. He has a career-high six receiving TDs, tied for ninth in the B1G. Hockenson's 663 receiving yards are the most by a Hawkeye TE since Dallas Clark caught 43 passes for 742 yards in 2002 (Mackey Award winner).
- Senior center Keegan Render leads an offensive line that has allowed 13 quarterback sacks, fewest in the Big Ten.
- Kirk Ferentz is one of five coaches to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (150).



#### **BATTLE FOR HEROES TROPHY**

lowa and Nebraska are playing "The Hy-Vee Heroes Game" Friday, with the winner claiming the Heroes Trophy. The trophy game between the Hawkeyes and Cornhuskers was established in 2011. Since its inception, lowa leads the series, 4-3. Iowa gained possession of the trophy for the first time with a 38-17 win at Nebraska in 2013. The Hawkeyes reclaimed it in 2015 with a 28-20 win in Lincoln. That was Iowa's first of three straight victories in the series.

#### **TROPHY GAMES**

lowa is 2-1 in trophy games this season. The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 13-3, to retain the Cy-Hawk trophy in Week 2, lost to No. 18 Wisconsin, 28-17, in a battle for the Heartland Trophy in Week 4, and defeated Minnesota, 48-31, to retain Floyd of Rosedale in Week 5.

Iowa is 12-3 in its last 15 trophy games, with all three losses coming to Wisconsin.

#### 14 SENIORS PLAY FINAL HOME GAME

Senior members of the Iowa football program include DL Sam Brincks, WR Nick Easley, OL Dalton Ferguson, FS Jake Gervase, WR Kyle Groeneweg, DE Parker Hesse, LB Jack Hockaday, FB Austin Kelly, LB Aaron Mends, DL Matt Nelson, OL Jake Newborg, K Miguel Recinos, OL Keegan Render, and OL Ross Reynolds.

Since the start of the 2015 season the Hawkeyes have won 35 games and qualified for a bowl game every year. The senior class has an overall record of 35-16, including a 20-7 mark at home and a 22-12 record in Big Ten games. The 22 conference wins are the fourth most by any senior class under Ferentz. The 2005 senior class won 25 Big Ten games, the 2004 senior class won 24, and the 2016 class won 23.

All senior members of the Iowa football program will be recognized during pregame ceremonies.

#### **HAWKEYE HISTORY**

lowa has played 1,244 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 648-557-39 (.537). That includes a 404-221-16 (.643) record in home games, a 244-336-23 (.424) record in games away from lowa City, a 328-378-25 (.465) mark in Big Ten games and a 288-186-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

#### A.J. EPENESA EARNS CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

DE A.J. Epenesa was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week following lowa's 63-0 win at Illinois on Nov. 17. Epenesa recorded 3.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, one pass break-up, forced and recovered one fumble, and added a QB pressure to go with a blocked punt he recovered and returned for a touchdown.

In a two minute span in the second quarter at Illinois, Epenesa forced a fumble, recovered a fumble, scored a touchdown (19 yards, first of his career), recorded a sack, and blocked a punt. Iowa scored on its first play following the blocked punt. The touchdowns were 1 minute, 59 seconds apart.

Epensesa leads the team and ties for second in the Big Ten with 8.5 sacks. His 8.5 sacks is the highest single-season total by a Hawkeye since DL Mike Daniels had nine sacks in 2011. He also leads the team and ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 13.5 tackles-for-loss (61) yards. He has two pass breakups and a team-high seven quarterback hurries.

The honor is the second weekly honor for Epenesa, who was also recognized by the Big Ten for his play in Iowa's win over Iowa State. The native of Glen Carbon, Illinois (Edwardsville HS), recorded a career-best eight tackles at Illinois, including five solo stops and three assists.

#### **POCKET PROTECTION**

Senior center Keegan Render leads an offensive line that has allowed 13 quarterback sacks, fewest in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes start sophomores Alaric Jackson and Tristan Wirfs at tackle. Senior Ross Reynolds has started every game at left guard, and sophomore Cole Banwart and senior Dalton Ferguson have shared starts at right guard.




#### **HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ**

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 20th season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015).
   Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 150 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 90 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 141-80 (.638) overall mark and an 86-58 (.597)
   Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 12 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 150-101 (.598) and an 90-72 (.556) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 150 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 162-122 (.570).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
   Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013.
   Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

Head coach Kirk Ferentz (150-101) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 20th season.

Ferentz's 150 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (150).

Ferentz has 90 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 90 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Both Ferentz (150, 90) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

#### FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 20th seasons on Iowa's staff. Defensive line coach Reese Morgan joined the staff in 1999 and is in his 19th season. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his seventh season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

#### **6 THROUGH THE AIR**

QB Nate Stanley has 21 touchdown passes, third most in the Big Ten. The 21 touchdown passes are the eighth highest single-season total in school history. In 2017, Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for most in a single season in school history. Stanley's 47 touchdown passes over the last two seasons are the second most ever in school history over a two-year span. Long tossed 49 touchdown passes from 1984 (22) to 1985 (27).

Stanley has 47 career touchdowns passes, fourth all-time in program history. He trails Long (74), Drew Tate (61), and Ricky Stanzi (56) on the all-time list.

Stanley ranks ninth in career passing yards (4,985) and 10th in career total offense (4,882). He needs 331 yards of total offense to tie Jake Rudock for ninth all-time.

Stanley set a career high with six touchdown passes Week 6 at Indiana. He threw the six touchdowns to five different players, marking just the second time in program history five different Hawkeyes had a receiving touchdown in the same game. He also had 320 yards passing, the fourth 300-yard passing game of his career. His performance earned him Walter Camp National Player of the Week honors.

Stanley had 14 touchdowns combined from Weeks 3-6. That touchdown total tied for the most ever over a four-game stretch in school history (Chuck Long threw 14 touchdowns over a four-game stretch in 1985). He has five multi-touchdown games this season, and 12 in his career.

Seven of Stanley's 21 touchdown passes this season have gone to TE Noah Fant. He and Fant have connected for touchdowns 18 times over the last 23 games.

#### **DOWN, DOWN, DOWN IN FRONT**

The Hawkeyes are tied for second in the Big Ten with 31 sacks. DE A.J. Epensesa leads the team and ties for second in the Big Ten with 8.5 sacks. DE Anthony Nelson is tied for sixth in the Big Ten with 7.5 sacks. The 16 combined sacks are the most of any pair of teammates in the Big Ten. Epenesa's 8.5 sacks are the highest single-season total by a Hawkeye since DL Mike Daniels had nine sacks in 2011.

Nelson recorded a career-best three sacks Week 5 at Minnesota. Epenesa has recorded at least one sack in seven of 11 games.

Eleven Hawkeyes have contributed to the sack total. DE Parker Hesse has four, DE Chauncey Golston has 3.5, LB Kristian Welch has 1.5, and LB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DT Cedrick Lattimore, DT Brady Reiff, DT Matt Nelson, and LB Nick Niemann each have one.

#### **HOLD IT RIGHT THERE**

The Hawkeyes rank second in the Big Ten in scoring defense (16.5), rushing defense (99.5), passing defense (180.1), and total defense (279.5). Iowa's total defense ranks sixth. Its rushing defense ranks eighth in the country.

Iowa is ninth in the country in scoring defense. The Hawkeyes have held five opponents to a season-low in points (Iowa State, Northern Iowa, Indiana, Maryland, Illinois), and have pitched two shutouts this year (Maryland, Illinois). Iowa has 11 shutouts in the Ferentz

In Week 7 against Maryland, the Hawkeyes held the Terps to 115 yards of total offense, the fewest ever allowed to a Big Ten opponent under Ferentz.

lowa allows 3.1 yards per carry, seventh in the country, and has allowed only seven rushing touchdowns, tied for fifth in the country.

The Hawkeyes limited Iowa State to just 19 yards rushing in Week 2, and held Northern Iowa to six rushing yards in Week 3 - a total that ranks second all-time in the Ferentz era (20 years).

Iowa has allowed 175 first downs, second fewest in the Big Ten and 11th in the country.

#### **RETURN TO SENDER**

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten and rank third in the country averaging 28.5 yards per kickoff return. WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette ranks No. 2 in the country, averaging 31.9 yards on 15 returns. Iowa has returned 20 kickoffs this season. Kyle Groeneweg averages 27.0 yards on two returns. Devonte Young has two returns for 42 yards.

Groeneweg ranks second in the Big Ten and 25th nationally, averaging 10.4 yards per punt return. Groeneweg returned a punt 61 yards for a touchdown against Illinois. It was the 22nd longest punt return in school history, and Iowa's first punt return for a touchdown since 2016 (Riley McCarron, at Illinois). As a team, Iowa averages 11 yards per punt return, second in the Big Ten.

#### THE SERIES

Nebraska holds a 29-16-3 advantage in the series that began with a 22-0 lowa victory in 1891. Iowa has won three straight and four of the last five meetings. The Hawkeyes have outscored the Huskers 96-24 in the last two meetings. The 56 points scored by the Hawkeyes in 2017 were the most in the series' 48-game history.

The Hawkeyes won the last meeting in Iowa City, 40-10, in 2016. Nebraska's last win at Kinnick Stadium was a 37-34 overtime victory in 2014. The Huskers are 10-7 against the Hawkeyes in Iowa City.

The 1999 Iowa-Nebraska game in Kinnick Stadium marked Coach Kirk Ferentz's first game as Iowa's head coach.

The first 10 games in the series were played in either Omaha (eight games) or Council Bluffs (two games). The series was even at 4-4-2 in those 10 meetings. Here are the series results:

#### LAST MEETING: Iowa 56, Nebraska 14 (Memorial Stadium – Lincoln, Nebraska)

Iowa's offense exploded for a season-high 56 points, including 49 unanswered, in a 56-14 rout over Nebraska at Memorial Stadium in Lincoln, Nebraska.

The 56 points are the most scored by Iowa and the 42-point margin is the largest margin of victory by Iowa in series history.

The Hawkeyes totaled 505 yards of total offense, including a season-best 313 yards rushing. The 313 yards rushing are the fifth most in a single-game in the Kirk Ferentz era.

RB Akrum Wadley and TE Noah Fant combined for five of lowa's eight touchdowns. Wadley rushed 19 times for a season-high 159 yards, scoring on runs of one, 20, and 29 yards. Fant caught three passes for 116 yards and touchdown receptions of four and 68 vards.

lowa trailed 14-7 late in the second quarter before closing the first half with a touchdown and scoring on its first three offensive possessions of the second half to grab control of the game.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin rushed for a season-best 90 yards on six carries, while James Butler rushed for 36 yards, including his first career TD as a Hawkeye -- a 12-yard carry

QB Nate Stanley completed 13-of-20 passes for 192 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions.

lowa's defense held the Cornhuskers to 94 yards, including 20 rushing yards, and three first downs in the second half. Hawkeye linebackers collected three interceptions. LB Josey Jewell amassed eight tackles, including one for loss, intercepted a pass, and totaled a game-best three pass break-ups. LB Ben Niemann and LB Kristian Welch collected the other two interceptions.

#### TE NOAH FANT

TE Noah Fant has 19 career touchdown receptions, more than any other tight end in program history and enough for fourth all-time in program history. The 19 touchdown receptions rank third all-time in Big Ten history by a tight end (Dave Young, Purdue, 27; Josiah Price, Michigan State, 21).

Fant has a team-high seven touchdowns receptions in 2018, tied for sixth in the Big Ten. His 38 receptions are a single-season career high, and his 65-yard reception at Purdue is Iowa's longest play this season. He is one of eight semifinalists for the John Mackey Award, presented to the nation's top tight end.

Fant had two touchdown receptions against No. 18 Wisconsin in Week 4. It was the fourth multi-touchdown game of his career. Since 2000, the only Big Ten tight ends with four multi-touchdown games are Fant (4) and former Penn State TE Mike Gesicki (4).

Eighteen of Fant's touchdown receptions have come from QB Nate Stanley. His first career touchdown reception came from QB C.J. Beathard (5 yards, at Purdue on Oct. 15, 2016).

His 19 career touchdowns have come from near and far, listed in chronological order: 5, 2, 27, 23, 7, 45, 25, 3, 6, 4, 69, 8, 1, 5, 20, 1, 5, 28, 9.

Fant had 102 yards receiving at Indiana in Week 6. It was his second career 100-yard receiving game (Nebraska, 2017).

Fant was one of 10 conference players named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. He had 30 receptions last season, including a team-high 11 touchdowns, tied for most in the country among FBS tight ends and the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt caught 12 touchdown passes in 2012. Fant led Iowa and all FBS tight ends with 16.5 yards per catch in 2017.

#### TE T.J. HOCKENSON NAMED MACKEY AWARD FINALIST

TE T.J. Hockenson is one of three finalists for the John Mackey Award, presented annually to the top tight end in the nation. The award winner will be announced Dec. 5. The other finalists include Albert Okwuegbunam of Missouri, and Stanford's Kaden Smith.

Hockenson has a team-high 663 receiving yards on a team-high 41 receptions, both career highs. Hockenson also has a career-high six receiving touchdowns, tied for ninth in the Big Ten. He is one of eight semifinalists for the John Mackey Award, presented to the nation's top tight end.

Hockenson's 663 receiving yards are the fourth-highest single-season total in school history by a tight end, and the most by a Hawkeye tight end in a single season since Dallas Clark caught 43 passes for 742 yards in 2002 (Clark won the John Mackey Award in 2002). The last Hawkeye tight end to lead the team in receptions in a single season was Scott Chandler in 2005 (47). The last Hawkeye tight end to lead the team in single-season receiving yards was Alan Cross in 1992 (600). The single-season school record for receiving yards by a tight end is 803, set by Marv Cook in 1987.

Hockenson added a rushing touchdown to his career stats at Minnesota, taking a direct snap on a fake field goal and rushing four yards for the score. Hockenson has led or shared the team lead in receptions in Weeks 1, 2, 4, 6, and 9. His 16.2 yards per reception rank second on the team (Smith-Marsette 18).

Hockenson and TE Noah Fant have combined for 1,170 receiving yards on 79 catches, including 13 receiving touchdowns.

Iowa's three primary running backs – Ivory Kelly-Martin, Mekhi Sargent, Toren Young – have combined for 333 carries, 1,463 rushing yards and 14 rushing touchdowns (eight by Sargent, four by Young, and two by Kelly-Martin).

The sophomore trio has shared the workload. Sargent has 37.8 percent of the carries (126-575), Young has 34.5 percent of the carries (115-547), and Kelly-Martin has 27.6 percent of the carries (92-341).

In lowa's 63-0 win at Illinois in Week 6, Sargent rushed for a career-high 121 yards, becoming lowa's first 100-yard back since RB Akrum Wadley in Week 12 of 2017. Sargent had a pair of touchdowns against the Illini and leads the team with eight touchdowns. Young also rushed for two scores against the Illini. Kelly-Martin did not play at Illinois.

lowa had a different running back rush for a career high in yards in Weeks 6-8. Sargent set a then-career best in carries (16) and yards (91) Week 8 at Penn State. Kelly-Martin rushed for a career-high 98 yards Week 7 against Maryland, and Young rushed for a career-best 96 yards Week 6 at Indiana.

The Hawkeye do not have a junior or senior among the position group. Running backs coach Derrick Foster is in his first season on lowa's staff in charge of a position group that graduated 75 percent of its rushing yards in 2017, and entered 2018 with one combined career start (Young).

lowa graduated running backs Akrum Wadley (1,109 yards) and James Butler (396 yards) in 2017. The duo combined for 1,505 rushing yards in 2017.

#### A STONE'S THROW AWAY

The Hawkeyes have 17 interceptions in 2018, most in the Big Ten and tied for second in the country. Iowa had two interceptions in the first four games of the season, but has 15 thefts since SS Geno Stone entered the starting lineup and Amani Hooker moved from safety to outside linebacker. Iowa led the nation with 21 interceptions in 2017.

In their last seven games, the Hawkeyes had four interceptions in Week 5 at Minnesota, a pair of picks at Indiana in Week 6, one theft in Week 7 against Maryland, a pick-six at Penn State in Week 8, two interceptions Week 9 at Purdue, two interceptions Week 10 against Northwestern, and three interceptions Week 11 at Illinois.

Stone and Hooker share the team lead with four interceptions (tied for second in the Big Ten). Three of Stone's four thefts have been in the fourth quarter. He intercepted Trace McSorley on the Penn State 24-yard line and returned it for a touchdown in Week 8. He intercepted Minnesota inside the five-yard line on Minnesota's final play of the game, and had a fourth quarter interception against Indiana in the end zone. He has started at strong safety Weeks 5-11, his first career starts.

Hooker had one interception in the season opener, starting at strong safety. He moved to outside linebacker Week 5, and has added three more interceptions. First against

Maryland in Week 7, and nearly grabbing a pick-six Week 9 at Purdue (touchdown called back due to a holding penalty on the return). He returned an interception 39 yards Week 11 at Illinois.

True freshman DB Riley Moss and true freshman DB Julius Brents both recorded interceptions in their first career starts at Minnesota. Moss had two interceptions for 36 yards. Brents intercepted one pass (0 yards).

The Hawkeyes led the nation with 21 interceptions in 2017. The Hawkeyes return nine of the 21 thefts, led by safeties Jake Gervase (3) and Amani Hooker (2). DE Parker Hesse, Stone, LB Kristian Welch, and DL Brady Reiff also recorded interceptions last season. Iowa lost the nation's leader in interceptions, Josh Jackson (8), and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Josey Jewell (2), to the NFL. Both players were consensus All-Americans.

lowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 11 seasons, and 16 of the last 18 seasons.

DE Anthony Nelson recovered a fumble for a touchdown Week 7 against Maryland, marking the 11th straight season lowa has scored a defensive touchdown. Iowa scored its third defensive touchdown Week 11 at Illinois when DE A.J. Epenesa recovered his own forced fumble and returned it for a touchdown.

#### **NEW FACES IN THE CROWD**

The 2018 season is the first in Kirk Ferentz's 20 years that the Hawkeyes opened the season without a linebacker with a single career start. Iowa has used five different starting linebacker combinations this season.

SS Amani Hooker made his first career start at outside linebacker Week 5 at Minnesota, the first of his seven consecutive starts at the position. Hooker is the sixth Hawkeye to start at the linebacker position this season. The others include first-time starters LB Djimon Colbert, LB Jack Hockaday, LB Amani Jones, LB Nick Niemann, and LB Kristian Welch.

The five linebackers (not including Hooker) entered the season with a combined 40 career tackles, 832 fewer career tackles than lowa's three starting linebackers in 2017 (Josey Jewell 437; Bo Bower, 234; Ben Niemann, 201).

The last time Ferentz had this little starting experience at the linebacker position was in 2014. That year, Quinton Alston, Bo Bower, and Reggie Spearman were lowa's starting linebackers in the season opener. Only Alston had a previous career start (2012 at Michigan).

In Ferentz's first season in 1999, the opening day starting linebackers -- LeVar Woods, Aaron Kampman, and Derrick Davison had two career starts combined. Both starts belonged to Kampman, who started the final two games in 1998.

#### **TIGERHAWK ADDED TO WATER TOWER**

#### **BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001**

The Hawkeyes won their sixth game of the season Oct. 20 against Maryland to become bowl eligible for the 17th time in the last 18 seasons. Iowa has posted a 7-8 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz, most recently defeating Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. #### **SPREAD THE WEALTH**

For just the second time in school history, five Hawkeyes had a receiving touchdown in a single game (at Indiana). QB Nate Stanley threw a career-best six touchdowns against the Hoosiers, to five different players (Hockenson x2, Fant, Easley, Young, Kelly).

The only other time five different players had a receiving touchdowns in a single game was the 1984 Freedom Bowl – QB Chuck Long threw six touchdowns to five different players (Hayes x2, Smith, Happel, Helverson, Flagg).

In addition to combining for three receiving touchdowns against the Hoosiers, TE Noah Fant (4-102) and TE T.J. Hockenson (4-107) both had 100-yard receiving games Week 6 at Indiana. It is the first time two Hawkeyes had 100 yards receiving in the same game since 2011 (vs. Pitt: K. Davis 10-129, M. McNutt 8-112).

#### **NELSON EARNS DISTRICT ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS**

DE Anthony Nelson was named to the Google Cloud Academic All-District VI first team. The announcement was made Nov. 15 by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Academic All-America honorees will be announced in early December. Nelson now his name placed on the national ballot for Academic All-America honors. The district honor is the second for Nelson, who earned first-team Academic All-America honors in 2017. He is also a member of Iowa's 2018 Leadership Group.

Nelson is a graduate of Waukee (Iowa) High School. He earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2016 and 2017. He is an accounting major with a 3.86 grade-point average (on a 4.0 scale).

In the last 20 seasons, under Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz, 27 Iowa football student-athletes have combined to earn academic All-District and All-America recognition on 49 occasions.

#### STANLEY EARNS CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL RECOGNITION

QB Nate Stanley earned recognition from five Big Ten and national organizations following lowa's 42-16 win at Indiana on Oct. 13. He was named Big Ten Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week, Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week by collegesportsmadness.com, Walter Camp national Offensive Player of the Week, CFPA National Player of the Week, and national Quarterback of the Week by Davey O'Brien Award and Manning awards.

Stanley completed 21-of-32 pass attempts against Indiana for 320 yards and six touchdowns. The scoring strikes covered 9, 28, 12, 11, 54, and 4 yards, and included five different receivers.

The six touchdowns tie Chuck Long for the second most in single-game history at lowa. Long twice threw six touchdowns in a game, while the school record is seven (Chuck Hartlieb versus Northwestern, 1987).

Stanley threw 14 touchdowns between Weeks 3-6, which tied for the most ever over a four-game stretch in school history (Long, 1985).

#### **NELSON EARNS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS**

DE Anthony Nelson was named Defensive Player of the Week following a three-sack performance in Iowa's 48-31 win at Minnesota on Oct. 6. The honor marks the second time Nelson has been recognized by the Big Ten. He was named Freshman of the Week for his play in a 2016 win over Miami, Ohio.

Nelson matched his career-high with three sacks at Minnesota, all in the first half. He School recorded four solo tackles and one assist in the contest; the Hawkeyes recorded five total sacks and held Minnesota to 86 net rushing yards. He also collected three sacks versus Miami, Ohio, as a redshirt freshman.

Nelson is the second Hawkeye to earn Defensive Player of the Week honors this season, as sophomore defensive end A.J. Epenesa was the co-recipient following Iowa's win over Iowa State.

#### **EPENESA NAMED B1G CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

DE A.J. Epenesa was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 13-3 win over Iowa State in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series on Sept. 8. Epenesa was also named the league's defensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

The Big Ten honor was the first of Epenesa's career. The native of Glen Carbon, Illinois (Edwardsville HS), recorded a career-best two sacks against lowa State, causing a fourth quarter fumble that was recovered by teammate Chauncey Golston. Epenesa had five tackles in the game, and added a pass break-up.

#### MOSS EARNS B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

DB Riley Moss was named Freshman of the Week after recording a pair of interceptions in Iowa's 48-31 win at Minnesota on Oc.t 6. The conference weekly honor is the first of his career.

Moss joined the Hawkeye program as a walk-on from Centennial High School in Ankeny, lowa, and played primarily on special teams in Iowa's first four games. Moss started for the first time at Minnesota and responded with four solo takles and one assist, to go with two interceptions. He collected his first career theft in the end zone late in the second period. His second interception and 36-yard return led to a Hawkeye field goal and a 41-24 advantage in the fourth quarter.

#### KICKING THE TRAVEL BUG

lowa averaged 42.8 points per game in five road contests (3-2). The Hawkeyes scored 40 points or more in all three of their road wins.

lowa scored 63 points at Illinois in Week 11, the most by the Hawkeyes since scoring 63 points at Iowa State in 1997, and the most points against a Big Ten opponent since a 64-0 victory against Northwestern in 1981.

The Hawkeyes put up 48 points at Minnesota Week 5 and 42 points at Indiana Week 6. The 40-plus points scored at Minnesota and Indiana marked the first time in program history lowa has scored 40 points or more in consecutive Big Ten road games in the same season.

lowa scored 24 points at Penn State, though none came from an offensive set. The Hawkeyes recorded two safeties, kicked two field goals, returned one interception for a touchdown, and scored one touchdown via special teams (fake field goal).

lowa scored 36 points in a 38-36 loss at Purdue. The 36 points scored were the most by lowa in a loss since 2011 (44-41 at lowa State, 3OT), and the most ever in a game that ended in regulation.

#### **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes sold out Kinnick Stadium in four of their first six games in 2018 (69,250).
- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 17 of the last 18 seasons.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is in his 20th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa is one of 19 teams to have played in at least 15 bowl games since 2001. Among Big Ten schools, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have appeared in more (16).
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/ USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, lowa has appeared
  in the poll 316 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio
  State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the topranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had nine individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 68-46 (.596) since 2010.

#### **IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- The Hawkeyes have had 170 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (66 draft picks/104 free agents).
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. lowa's streak of 41 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- DB Micah Hyde (Buffalo), DL Mike Daniels (Green Bay), and OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2018 NFL Pro Bowl.
- Over the past 16 years, 143-of-165 (89 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 11 years, Iowa has had 40 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (41), and Michigan (40). Since 2010, Iowa has had 33 players drafted in the NFL, tied for second most in the Big Ten – Ohio State (53), Penn State (33), and Wisconsin (33).
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former lowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.

#### **ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!**

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 15th season in 2018.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

### **GAME RECAP**

lowa scored the game's first 33 points en route to a 33-7 season opening victory over Northern Illinois inside Kinnick Stadium. The win was a historic one for Kirk Ferentz as the head coach, as he surpassed Hayden Fry as the program's all-time winningest coach with 144 career wins.

The Hawkeyes, leading 3-0 at halftime, broke the game open in the second half, scoring touchdowns on four of their six drives while also registering a defensive safety in the fourth quarter.

Three of Iowa's four touchdowns came on the ground, while QB Nate Stanley connected with TE Noah Fant for a 1-yard score for the game's first touchdown midway through the third quarter. Running backs Ivory Kelly-Martin (two yards) and Toren Young (six yards), and QB Peyton Mansell (one yard) accounted for Iowa's rushing touchdowns.

Young (84 yards), Kelly-Martin (62 yards), and Mekhi Sargent (40 yards) combined for 186 rushing yards. Stanley and Mansell combined to complete 13-of-25 passes for 143 yards, with eight of the 13 targets (104 yards) going to tight ends. T.J. Hockenson caught a team-best four balls for 64 yards, Fant had three receptions for 10 yards, while Nate Wieting had one catch for 30 yards.

lowa's defense amassed eight tackles for loss, including five sacks, and two takeaways (one interception and one fumble recovery). Defensive end Parker Hesse equaled a career best with two sacks. All three lowa linebackers started their first game, with each registering career bests in tackles: Kristian Welch (11), Amani Jones (6), and Nick Niemann (4). The Hawkeyes limited the Huskies to 65 second-half yards, with 64 of the yards gained coming on NIU's final drive of the game.

On special teams, punter Colten Rastetter averaged 53.8 yards on four punts, including a personal-best 69-yard punt, and Miguel Recinos made all four PAT's and his only field goal attempt (33 yards).

lowa started an all-lowa native offensive and defensive line (nine players), marking the first time under Ferentz that four lowa natives started on the defensive line and the first time since 2016 (week 3) that five lowa natives started on the offensive line.

### **GAME RECAP**

lowa retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy as a result of a 13-3 win over lowa State at a sold out Kinnick Stadium. The victory was the Hawkeyes' fourth straight in the series, their longest streak over their instate rivals since winning 15 in a row from 1983-87.

After allowing a field goal on Iowa State's opening drive, Iowa's defense yielded only 122 total yards and no points on the Cyclones' remaining 10 possessions.

lowa placekicker Miguel Recinos connected on field goals of 31 and 48 yards in the second and third quarters, respectively, to give the Hawkeyes a narrow 6-3 margin going into the fourth quarter. The 48-yard kick matched a career long for Recinos.

In the Hawkeyes' first possession of the fourth quarter, lowa QB Nate Stanley threw a strike to WR Brandon Smith for 30 yards to the Iowa State 2-yard line, which lead to a Mekhi Sargent 2-yard touchdown on the next play. It was the game's only touchdown. The scoring drive covered 83 yards in 13 plays, with Iowa converting three third downs on the touchdown drive.

lowa allowed only 19 rushing yards on 25 attempts, which ties for the fifth fewest single-game total allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa State's 188 total yards are its fewest in 52 games, since totaling 174 yards versus Baylor in 2013. Iowa's defense totaled four sacks, forced and recovered a fumble, and forced five three-and-outs.

Five Hawkeyes recorded career bests in tackles: DB Matt Hankins (8), LB Jack Hockaday (8), LB Nick Niemann (7), LB Djimon Colbert (5), and DE A.J. Epenesa (5). Two of Epenesa's tackles were sacks. He also forced a fumble and had one pass breakup. Epenesa's efforts earned the sophomore Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades.

Stanley finished the contest completing 16-of-28 passes for 166 yards. RB Toren Young amassed a game-high 68 yards on a career-high 21 carries. TE T.J. Hockenson caught a game and career-best six passes for 33 yards.

lowa State has managed just six points in its last two trips to Kinnick Stadium (one field goal in 2016 and one field goal in 2018).

### **GAME RECAP**

lowa scored the game's first 38 points and cruised to a 38-14 victory over Northern lowa in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 for the eighth time under Kirk Ferentz, including the third time in four years.

Iowa's offense totaled 545 yards while its defense held the Panthers to 228, including six yards rushing.

TE Noah Fant's 5-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter was the 14th of his career. He has more touchdown receptions than any other Hawkeye tight end in program history.

RB Mekhi Sargent scored two second-quarter touchdowns, scoring on two and 10-yard runs to give lowa a 21-0 advantage at halftime.

The Hawkeyes posted 17 points in the third period on their first three possessions. Miguel Recinos converted a 42-yard field goal to become the 40th Hawkeye to score 100 or more points in a career. WR Nick Easley caught a 14-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley and RB Toren Young crossed the goal line on a 15-yard run.

Sargent and Young combined for 154 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Easley led the Hawkeye receiving corps, hauling in 10 catches for 103 yards. Fant had five receptions for 99 yards. Easley's 10 receptions are the most by a Hawkeye since WR Kennan Davis had 10 catches for 129 yards and a touchdown against Pitt in 2011. Stanley finished the contest completing 23-of-28 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns, marking the second time in his career that the junior signal caller has topped 300 yards passing.

The six rushing yards allowed are the second fewest by a Hawkeye defense in the Ferentz era. Iowa's defense collected three sacks, two takeaways (one interception, one fumble). The Hawkeyes held the Panthers to 20 yards on 20 plays in the first half and did not allow Northern Iowa into Iowa territory until 5:53 of the third quarter. LB Kristian Welch led the Iowa defense with eight tackles and a fumble recovery. Michael Ojemudia recorded his first career interception.

Nationally-ranked Wisconsin scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to rally past Iowa in the Big Ten opener, 28-17, inside a sold out Kinnick Stadium to retain possession of the Heartland Trophy.

Each team scored a touchdown in the first half. After a Wisconsin touchdown early in the second quarter, lowa answered with a TE Noah Fant 20-yard touchdown catch, his first of two scores on the night. The Wisconsin score marked the first time in the first four games of the season that lowa's defense surrendered a first-half touchdown.

PK Miguel Recinos converted a 24-yard field goal to give the Hawkeyes a 10-7 advantage with 10:12 remaining in the third quarter. The two teams then traded touchdowns later in the third period. Alex Hornibrook completed a 12-yard TD pass to Danny Davis with 5:12 left in the third quarter, one of three touchdown passes for the Wisconsin quarterback. Fant caught his second touchdown on a 1-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley to give Iowa a narrow 17-14 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

WR A.J. Taylor caught a 17-yard touchdown pass and FB Alec Ingold scored on a 33-yard run in the fourth quarter to seal the win for the Badgers.

Wisconsin capitalized on three lowa turnovers (two fumbles, one interception), scoring 14 points off Hawkeye miscues.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin returned to action after missing the previous two games due to injury. He led the Hawkeye running attack, carrying the ball 14 times for 72 yards.

lowa tight ends combined for six catches and 154 yards receiving. T.J. Hockenson had three receptions for a careerbest 125 yards, while Fant had 29 yards receiving and two touchdowns on three catches. Fant now has 16 career touchdowns and four multi-touchdown games.

Stanley completed 14-of-23 passes for 256 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception.

lowa scored 10 points or more in each quarter in a convincing 48-31 win over Minnesota at TCF Bank Stadium in Minneapolis to retain possession of Floyd of Rosedale.

The Hawkeyes scored touchdowns on their first two possessions of the game. QB Nate Stanley completed touchdown strikes to TE T.J. Hockenson (3 yards) and WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette (60 yards). The 60-yard completion is a career long for Smith-Marsette.

Minnesota's Rashod Bateman caught the first of two touchdowns in the game late in the first quarter to trim lowa's lead to 14-7.

lowa added two more touchdowns in the second period on a Hockenson 4-yard rush on a fake field goal formation on fourth down and a WR Nick Easley 21-yard reception. The Golden Gophers tallied a field goal and one of three touchdown passes from QB Zack Annexstad to make the score 28-17 at halftime.

PK Miguel Recinos connected on field goals of 20 and 40 yards in the second half, while TE Noah Fant (5-yard catch) and RB Mekhi Sargent (2-yard run) became the fourth and fifth different Hawkeyes to score touchdowns. Recinos finished the game with 12 points.

Stanley completed 23-of-39 passes for a season-high 314 yards and four touchdowns, marking the third time in his career that the junior topped 300 yards passing in a game.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin (47 yards) and Sargent (33 yards, 1 TD) combined for 80 yards rushing and one touchdown. Easley led the Hawkeye receiving corps with six catches for 52 yards and one touchdown, while WR Brandon Smith set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (68).

lowa's secondary intercepted Minnesota quarterbacks four times, including three times by a pair of true freshmen cornerbacks earning the first starts of the careers. CB Riley Moss returned two thefts 36 yards and had a career-best five tackles. His efforts earned him Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolades. CB Julius Brents had one theft and three tackles. Iowa's fourth interception was by sophomore safety Geno Stone.

As a unit, Iowa amassed seven tackles for loss, including five sacks. DE Anthony Nelson was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after matching a personal best with three sacks, all coming in the first half. ### **GAME RECAP**

lowa QB Nate Stanley threw a career-best six touchdowns in a 42-16 win over Indiana at Memorial Stadium. lowa's 42 points are the most scored in a game at Bloomington since a 45-9 win in 2008.

The six touchdown passes, three each half, tie Chuck Long for the second most in Iowa single-game history. Stanley, who finished the game completing 21-of-32 passes for 320 yards, completed touchdown passes to five different receivers, marking the second time in school history five different players had a receiving touchdown (1984 Freedom Bowl). Stanley, who was named the Walter Camp Football Foundation national Offensive Player of the Week and co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week, is the second Hawkeye quarterback to throw for five or more touchdowns in three career games (Long).

Tight ends T.J. Hockenson (nine yards) and Noah Fant (28 yards) caught first-quarter touchdowns, while WR Nick Easley (12 yards) caught a second-quarter touchdown from Stanley to give the Hawkeyes a 21-10 advantage at halftime.

It was more of the same in the second half with RB Toren Young (11 yards) and Hockenson (54 yards) registering touchdown receptions in the third period. FB Austin Kelly scored his first career touchdown on a 4-yard catch in the fourth quarter.

lowa had two 100-yard receivers (Hockenson 4-107; Fant 4-102) for the first time since 2011 versus Pittsburgh (Keenan Davis 10-129; M. McNutt 8-112).

In addition to catching his first career touchdown, Young rushed for a game and career-best 96 yards on 19 carries.

lowa's defense held Indiana to 67 rushing yards, its second-lowest total of the season. Iowa has held four of its six opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing. The Hawkeyes amassed six tackles for loss, including two sacks.

FS Jake Gervase had a team-high eight tackles, matching his career high. He also had an interception, his first of the season and fifth of his career. DE Parker Hesse totaled seven tackles, including a team-best two for loss. Sophomore Geno Stone added his second interception in two weeks to go with a forced fumble and five solo tackles.

lowa has won five of its first six games for the eighth time in Kirk Ferentz's 20 seasons.

### **GAME RECAP**

lowa shutout Maryland, 23-0, on Homecoming on a blustery day at Kinnick Stadium to earn its sixth victory of the year and become bowl eligible. The Hawkeyes registered their first shutout since 2016 (Illinois). Maryland is the fourth opponent lowa has held to a season low in points (Iowa State, Northern Iowa, Indiana, and Maryland).

All four of Iowa's offensive scoring drives were 10 plays or more, while Iowa's final score was on a fumble recovery in the end zone.

PK Miguel Recinos scored the game's first six points with field goals of 23 and 25 yards in the first and second quarter, respectively. WR Brandon Smith scored the game's only offensive touchdown – the first of his career – on a 10-yard pass from QB Nate Stanley with eight seconds remaining in the half.

Recinos kicked a third field goal (36 yards) and DE Anthony Nelson recovered the first fumble of his career in the end zone. The fumble recovery in the end zone marked the 11th straight season the Hawkeyes tallied at least one defensive score.

The Hawkeyes dominated the entire game, maintaining the ball on offense for 40:55, which is the second highest time of possession in the Kirk Ferentz era. Maryland ran 39 plays, which is the fewest by an opponent in the Ferentz era. The Hawkeyes held the Terrapins to 115 yards of total offense, the fewest ever allowed to a Big Ten opponent and the fourth fewest all-time in the Ferentz era.

With strong wind gusts throughout the game, Iowa's offense kept the ball on the ground, rushing for a season-high 224 yards. RB Ivory Kelly-Martin posted career bests in attempts (24) and rushing yards (98). RB Mekhi Sargent carried the ball 10 times for 54 yards.

Stanley completed 11-of-22 passes for 86 yards with a touchdown and one interception. lowa's tight ends combined for six catches for 44 yards (T.J. Hockenson 3-30; Noah Fant 3-14).

For the first time in 12 seasons, lowa was not flagged for a penalty. The last time lowa played a contest without being penalized was versus Ohio State on Sept. 30, 2006.

Three defensive linemen accounted for Iowa's five tackles for loss: Parker Hesse (2), A.J. Epenesa (2), and Chauncey Golston. Amani Hooker, making his third consecutive start at outside linebacker, intercepted his second pass of the season.

### **GAME RECAP**

No. 17 Penn State rallied from an early 12-0 deficit to upend the visiting No. 18 Iowa Hawkeyes, 30-24, on a cold and wet afternoon at Beaver Stadium. The loss was Iowa's fifth straight to the Nittany Lions.

The Hawkeyes jumped out to a 12-0 lead on three special teams plays -- a safety off a blocked punt, field goal, and a TD pass in fake field goal formation. The safety was scored after Dominque Dafney blocked a Penn State punt out of the end zone. After a Miguel Recinos' 27-yard field goal, punter Colten Rastetter connected with DT Sam Brinks – his first career score -- for a 10-yard TD in fake field goal formation.

Leading 12-7 after the first period, the Hawkeyes registered their second safety of the first half when Penn State snapped the ball over the punter and out of the end zone. Iowa collected two defensive safeties in the same game for the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era and became the first team to accomplish the feat in a Big Ten game in 10 years (Wisconsin, 2008).

The Nittany Lions evened the score on a QB Tommy Stevens 3-yard run one play after QB Nate Stanley was intercepted inside lowa territory. Both teams exchanged field goals later in the second quarter, including a career-long 49-yarder by Recinos. The score was tied, 17-17, at halftime.

The home team scored the only points of the third quarter on a QB Trace McSorley 51-yard run and a Jake Pinegar 49-yard field goal. Iowa closed to within 27-24 after safety Geno Stone returned an interception 24 yards for a TD with 10 minutes left in the fourth quarter. It marked the 11th straight season that Iowa returned an interception for a touchdown.

Pinegar kicked his third field goal of the game – all over 40 yards -- to put the Nittany Lions in front, 30-24, with 8:24 left remaining in regulation. Later in the quarter, lowa drove to the Penn State 3-yard line, however Penn State intercepted Stanley to prevent the go-ahead touchdown.

RB Mekhi Sargent rushed for a game-best 91 yards on 16 carries, both personal bests. TE Noah Fant caught five passes for 56 yards in the fourth quarter. Stanley completed 18-of-49 passes for 205 yards and had two interceptions.

Defensively, Iowa forced two turnovers (one fumble, one interception) and had five tackles for loss, including three sacks. LB Amani Hooker and DT Matt Nelson paced the Hawkeyes with six tackles each.

Purdue led 14-7 after the first quarter, scoring on a 36-yard TD pass and a 1-yard rush. RB Ivory Kelly-Martin crossed the goal line on a 2-yard run for the Hawkeyes.

Miguel Recinos converted his 10th straight field goal (34 yards) to close within 14-10. Both teams traded touchdowns to give Purdue a 21-17 edge at halftime.

The Boilermakers extended their advantage to 28-17 on their first play from scrimmage in the third quarter, an 82-yard pass to WR Terry Wright. Iowa responded when QB Nate Stanley completed his only TD pass of the game – a 4-yard pass to TE T.J. Hockenson – on a fourth down play.

Purdue answered Iowa's touchdown with Wright's third score of the game, this time from three yards out, to give Purdue a 35-23 cushion.

RB Mekhi Sargent scored back-to-back 1-yard touchdowns early in the fourth quarter, giving the Hawkeyes their first lead of the game with 10:19 left. The teams then traded punts before Purdue drove 43 yards on its final drive for the game-winning field goal.

Stanley completed 21-of-32 passes for 275 yards and one touchdown. His second half totals included 14-of-17 attempts for 172 yards. RB Toren Young rushed nine times for a game-high 45 yards, while Sargent and Kelly-Martin each rushed 10 times for 39 yards and combined for three scores. Hockenson and Sargent combined for eight receptions for 72 yards and one touchdown. TE Noah Fant had three catches for a team-best 85 yards, including a 65-yard catch and run, which is lowa's longest play from scrimmage this year.

lowa's defense forced two turnovers and amassed six tackles-for-loss, but allowed 434 yards of total offense. Purdue QB David Blough completed 23-of-32 passes for 333 yards and four touchdowns. FS Jake Gervase, who notched a game-best 10 tackles, and OLB Amani Hooker were responsible for Blough's two second-half interceptions.

### **GAME RECAP**

Northwestern clinched the Big Ten West Division as a result of a 14-10 victory over 21st-ranked Iowa inside Kinnick Stadium.

Trailing 14-10, lowa had two chances to drive the field late in the fourth quarter, but lost fumbles on its final two rushes of the game. Iowa running backs had gone 490 carries without losing a fumble prior to the two lost fumbles in the final 4:26.

The Hawkeyes took a 3-0 advantage into the locker room at halftime by virtue of a 46-yard field goal by Miguel Recinos. The Hawkeye senior had his consecutive field goals made streak end at 11 when he misfired on a 38-yard attempt in the third quarter.

The Wildcats scored the game's first touchdown on their second possession of the second half on an Isaiah Bowser 32-yard run. Later in the third period, Iowa reclaimed a 10-7 advantage on a WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette 28-yard touchdown pass from QB Nate Stanley. That possession followed safety Jake Gervase's third interception of the season in Northwestern territory.

The visitors scored the final points of the game on their first possession of the fourth quarter, a 32-yard pass from QB Clayton Thorson to WR Bennett Skowronek.

Northwestern rushed 46 times for 184 yards compared to 64 yards on 22 attempts for the Hawkeyes. Bowser totaled a game-best 165 yards rushing on 31 attempts.

Stanley completed 27-of-41 passes for 269 yards and one touchdown. Smith-Marsette paced lowa's offense amassing a team-best 198 all-purpose yards (100 kickoff return; 90 receiving; 8 rushing). WR Nick Easley caught a game-best eight balls for 53 yards.

In addition to the interception, Gervase led the Hawkeye defense with 10 tackles. DB Matt Hankins (8) and LB Djimon Colbert (7) matched career bests in tackles, and safety Geno Stone added his team-leading fourth interception of the season.

### **GAME RECAP**

Iowa exploded for nine touchdowns, winning its fifth straight game against Illinois, in a 63-0 shutout at Memorial Stadium in Champaign, Illinois. The 63-point win is Iowa's largest margin of victory in the series history, ties for the 12th-largest in program history, and matches Illinois' worst defeat in program history.

Iowa, who snapped a three-game losing streak, led 7-0 after the first quarter on a TE Noah Fant 7-yard TD reception from QB Nate Stanley.

The Hawkeyes broke the game open in the second quarter scoring 28 points, including 21 points over a span of 2:07. RB Mekhi Sargent scored his first of two touchdowns on a 3-yard run. DE A.J. Epenesa returned a fumble 19 yards for his first career score on the next play from scrimmage. On the next possession, Epenesa blocked an Illinois punt, which resulted a TE T.J. Hockenson 11-yard TD reception on the next play. Hockenson scored his second touchdown of the game later in the second period on a 37-yard pass play, Stanley's third touchdown pass of the game.

lowa padded its lead in the second half, scoring 14 points in both the third and fourth quarters. WR Kyle Groeneweg returned a punt 61 yards for his first career touchdown, marking lowa's first punt return for a score since Riley McCarron (55 yards) at Illinois in 2016. The 61-yard return is lowa's longest punt or kickoff return of the season.

Iowa's final three TD's were scored on the ground by Sargent (29 yards) and two by RB Toren Young (five and 14 yards).

Sargent rushed for a career-high 121 yards on 17 attempts and became lowa's first 100 yard rusher since Akrum Wadley at Nebraska in 2017. Stanley completed 13-of-21 passes for 178 yards and three touchdowns. The tight end connection of Fant (3-54) and Hockenson (2-48) combined for five catches, 102 yards, and three touchdowns.

lowa's defensive unit amassed 11 tackles for loss, three interceptions, and a forced fumble. Epenesa sparked the Hawkeyes on defense totaling a career-high eight tackles, including 3.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, one pass break-up, one QB Hurry, and one blocked punt. His efforts earned the sophomore Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors.

Kirk Ferentz became the fifth coach in conference history to win 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
