- 1** Iowa has won the Heroes Trophy the last two seasons, and has won two straight games played in Lincoln. Iowa is 2-1 in trophy games this season, and 9-2 in trophy games since the start of the 2015 season.
- 2** DB Josh Jackson leads the country in INTs (7) and passes defended (24), and ranks third in PBU (17) and INT return yards (163). His 7 interceptions are one shy of Iowa's single-season record - Desmond King (8, 2015), Lou King (8, 1981), and Nile Kinnick (8, 1939)
- 3** QB Nate Stanley needs four touchdown passes to tie Chuck Long for Iowa's single-season record. Long threw 27 touchdowns in 1985. Stanley has 23 touchdown passes, third in the Big Ten and tied for 19th in the nation.
- 4** LB Josey Jewell, one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, leads the Big Ten and ranks third in the nation with 11.7 tackles per game. He has 117 tackles this season, tops in the Big Ten, fourth nationally, and nine shy of matching his single-season career high.
- 5** RB Akrum Wadley needs 138 rushing yards to reach 1,000 yards this season. He could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264).
- 6** TE Noah Fant has 25 receptions, including a team-high eight touchdowns. The eight touchdowns are a single-season record for an Iowa tight end. Fant's eight touchdowns are the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt caught 12 touchdown passes in 2012.
- 7** Injuries to SR RT Ike Boettger and SR LT Boone Myers have cleared the depth chart for r-FR LT Alaric Jackson and FR RT Tristan Wirfs. Jackson has started every game at LT. Wirfs has started the last 6 games at RT. He is the 1st true freshman in Ferentz's 19 seasons to start at offensive tackle.
- 8** WR Matt Vandenberg has played in 52 career games, one shy of tying Desmond King for most games played in program history. Vandenberg has a reception in 30 consecutive games played. He has 131 career receptions, 10th most in program history
- 9** Iowa's first 11 opponents in 2017 have a combined record of 79-42 (.653). Iowa's three nonconference opponents (Wyoming, Iowa State, North Texas) are a combined 22-11. TeamRankings.com lists the Hawkeyes at No. 8 in strength of schedule in the country.
- 10** Kirk Ferentz has 141 overall wins and 85 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 85 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games. Ferentz is two wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.

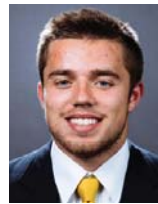

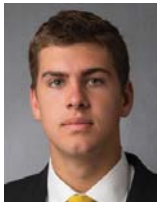

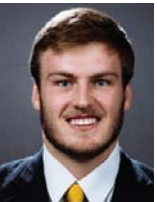

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,231 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 639-553-39 (.535). That includes a 400-219-16 (.643) record in home games, a 239-334-23 (.420) record in games away from Iowa City, a 323-374-25 (.465) mark in Big Ten games and a 284-184-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

BATTLE FOR HEROES TROPHY

Iowa and Nebraska are playing "The Hy-Vee Heroes Game" Friday, with the winner claiming the Heroes Trophy. The trophy game between the Hawkeyes and Cornhuskers was established in 2011. Iowa gained possession of the trophy for the first time with a 38-17 win at Nebraska in 2013, reclaimed it in 2015 with a 28-20 win in Lincoln, and defended it with a 40-10 win at Kinnick Stadium in 2016.

Iowa is 2-1 in trophy games this season. Iowa successfully defended two rivalry trophies, winning at Iowa State, 44-41 (OT) to retain the Cy-Hawk trophy, and topping Minnesota, 17-10, to retain Floyd of Rosedale. Iowa lost its bid to regain the Heartland Trophy, falling 38-14, at Wisconsin. Iowa is 9-2 in trophy games since the start of the 2015 season.

BLACK FRIDAY

Iowa and Nebraska will meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the seventh consecutive season (3 p.m., FOX). The teams have split the last six meetings on Black Friday. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference. This season, for the first time since the rivalry was resumed, the game will kickoff at 3 p.m. (CT) and be televised on FS1.

The two teams are scheduled to meet on Black Friday in 2018 and 2019, but the Big Ten Conference announced Sept. 12 that the teams will move off of their Black Friday date in 2020 and 2021. Iowa will close both seasons against Wisconsin, while Nebraska will close the regular season against Minnesota.

2 HAWKEYES EARN ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

DE Parker Hesse and DE Anthony Nelson were named to the Academic All-District 6 first team. The announcement was made Thursday by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Hesse and Nelson will now have their names placed on the national ballot for Academic All-America honors. The district honor is the first for both Hesse and Nelson. Both are members of Iowa's 2017 Leadership Group.

Hesse is a junior from Waukon, Iowa (Waukon). He carries a 3.72 GPA and has earned his degree in Interdepartmental Studies. He was named Academic All-Big Ten in both 2015 and 2016. Hesse earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors in 2016 and was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman team by BTN.com in 2015.

Nelson (6-foot-7, 260 pounds) is a sophomore from Urbandale, Iowa (Waukee). He earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2016. Nelson holds a 3.89 GPA and is an accounting major.

IN THE RANKINGS / STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Iowa's first 11 opponents in 2017 have a combined record of 79-42 (.653). Iowa's three nonconference opponents (Wyoming, Iowa State, North Texas) are a combined 22-11. Nebraska, Iowa's final regular season opponent, is 4-7 overall. TeamRankings.com lists the Hawkeyes at No. 8 in strength of schedule in the country, third among Big Ten teams (No. 3 Penn State, No. 7 Ohio State).

The 2017 schedule includes five schools currently ranked in the AP top 2 – No. 6 Wisconsin, No. 8 Ohio State, No. 12 Penn State, No. 21 Michigan State, and No. 23 Northwestern.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 19th season as head football coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan’s Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul “Bear” Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is sixth with 141 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 85 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 132-76 (.635) overall mark and a 81-54 (.600) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 11 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 141-97 (.592) and an 85-68 (.556) mark in Big Ten games. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 153-118 (.565). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa’s first-year offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG B1G LEADERS, CLOSING ON FRY

Kirk Ferentz has 141 overall wins and 85 Big Ten wins as Iowa’s head coach. The 85 conference wins rank sixth among the conference’s all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz’s 141 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank sixth in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is two wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes’ all-time winningest football coach.

Both Ferentz (141, 85) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th season as Iowa’s head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson’s first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED

Junior DB Josh Jackson leads the country in interceptions (7) and passes defended (24), and ranks third in passes broken up (17) and interception return yards (163). His seven interceptions tie for fourth among Iowa's single-season leaders. Desmond King (2015), Lou King (1981), and Nile Kinnick (1939) share the single-season Iowa record with eight.

Jackson returned two interceptions for touchdowns against Wisconsin (43, 52). He is the first Hawkeye to have two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the same game since B.J. Lowery (35, 13) did it in 2013. Jackson is the first Hawkeye to do it in a Big Ten game. Lowery and Jackson share Iowa's single game record. Iowa returned two interceptions for touchdowns against North Texas in 2015 (Jewell 34, Bower 88).

Iowa has four pick-sixes this season (Snyder 89 vs. Illinois; Hooker 30 vs. Ohio State; Jackson 43 vs. Wisconsin; Jackson 52 vs. Wisconsin). The four pick-sixes ties a team single-season record (1995, 2010, 2015, 2017).

Jackson tied a school record with three interceptions against No. 3 Ohio State on Nov. 4. He is a Bednarik Award semifinalist and was named the Walter Camp national defensive Player of the Week for his play against the Buckeyes.

Jackson has started all 11 games this season after entering the year with one career start at defensive back. He was a wide receiver in Iowa's 2015 spring camp.

Jackson and S Amani Hooker have stepped up to lead a secondary that lost two members to the NFL (Desmond King, Chargers; Greg Mabin, Bills/49ers).

Hooker returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown on the first play of the game against No. 3 Ohio State. It was Hooker's second career interception and first touchdown. He made his first career start Week 4 against No. 4 Penn State and recorded a career-high 13 tackles. Hooker has missed the last two weeks due to injury. He has 44 tackles this season, sixth on the team.

JACKSON NAMED BIG CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DB Josh Jackson was named Big Ten Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 38-14 loss at No. 6 Wisconsin on Nov. 11. Jackson recorded two pass interception touchdowns at Wisconsin, covering 43 and 52 yards. He also had a forced fumble that was recovered by teammate Manny Rugamba, three tackles, and one pass break-up.

The honor marked the second straight week Jackson was recognized by the Big Ten. He is the second Hawkeye ever to earn conference Player of the Week honors in consecutive weeks. Tim Dwight was named special teams Player of the Week on consecutive weeks in 1997.

Jackson tied a school record with the two interception returns for scores (B.J. Lowery, 2013), and he is the first Hawkeye to do it in a Big Ten game. His first theft came on Wisconsin's opening drive and gave the Hawkeyes a 7-0 advantage. The second interception and return cut Iowa's deficit to 17-14 in the third quarter.

JACKSON EARNS NATIONAL AND BIG TEN HONORS

DB Josh Jackson was named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 55-24 win over No. 3 Ohio State on Nov. 4. Jackson was also named the national defensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness.

Jackson tied a school record with three pass interceptions (Tyler Sash and Grant Steen), and also added three solo tackles. His first theft led to a touchdown that gave Iowa a 31-17 halftime advantage. His second interception led to a field goal, and his third stopped an Ohio State scoring threat in the fourth quarter. His final interception was also recognized by ESPN as Saturday's Play of the Day in college football.

Jackson and the Hawkeye defense allowed just seven points in the second half while holding Ohio State 200 yards total offense and 22 points below its season averages. He is the second Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp weekly defensive honor this season, as senior linebacker Josey Jewell was recognized following Iowa's victory over Wyoming in the season opener.

STANLEY MAKING AND CHASING HISTORY

QB Nate Stanley needs four touchdown passes to tie Chuck Long for Iowa's single-season record. Long threw 27 touchdowns in 1985. Stanley has 23 touchdown passes, third in the Big Ten and tied for 19th in the nation. He is the first Hawkeye to throw 20-plus touchdowns in a season since James Vandenberg threw 25 touchdowns in 2001.

Stanley has thrown five touchdown passes in a game twice this season (at Iowa State, vs. Ohio State), becoming the first Hawkeye to have two five-touchdown passing games in the same season. Stanley's five TD passes against Ohio State tied a Kinnick Stadium record (Chuck Long in 1985, Fred Riddle in 1963).

In program history, only Stanley and Chuck Long have two career games with five or more touchdowns. Long threw six TDs against Texas in 1984 and six against Northwestern in 1985.

Stanley threw 12 touchdowns in the first four games of the season, becoming the first quarterback in program history to throw 12 touchdown passes in their first four starts. The four-game stretch was Iowa's best since Chuck Hartlieb threw 12 touchdowns over a four-game stretch in 1987. Chuck Long threw 14 touchdowns in the first four games in 1985.

Stanley threw three touchdowns in his first career start Week 1. The last quarterback to do that was Ricky Stanzi (3, vs. Florida Atlantic in 2008). Since, 1999, the only other quarterback to throw three or more touchdowns in his first career start under Ferentz was Jon Beutjer (4, at Indiana in 2000).

Stanley threw for five touchdowns and 333 yards against Iowa State in Week 2, becoming the first Iowa quarterback with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus touchdown passes since Chuck Hartlieb vs. Northwestern in 1987.

TACKLE BY JOSEY JEWELL

LB Josey Jewell, one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, leads the Big Ten and ranks third in the nation with 11.7 tackles per game. Jewell missed the Northwestern game due to injury. The DNP snapped a streak of 37 consecutive starts. He has 117 tackles this season, tops in the Big Ten and fourth nationally. He is a finalist for the NCAA Senior CLASS Award, and a semifinalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, Bednarik Award, and Butkus Award.

Jewell has 117 tackles this season, nine shy of matching his single-season career high. He is the third Hawkeye in program history to have three seasons with at least 115 tackles (Larry Station 83, 84, 85; Abdul Hodge 03, 04, 05). Jewell has led the team in tackles in each of the last two seasons (126 in 2015, 124 in 2016).

Jewell has 418 career tackles, fifth all-time in program history. He needs 17 stops to tie Brad Quast for fourth all-time (435). He has 21 career games with double digit tackles, including eight this season. He matched his career high with 16 tackles vs. Penn State and at Michigan State.

Jewell was named Walter Camp, Lott IMPACT, and Bednarik Award national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 24-3 win over Wyoming on Sept. 2. He led Iowa with 14 tackles, including seven solo stops.

Jewell was named Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week, Bronko Nagurski Defensive Player of the Week, Bednarik Award, and College Sports Madness Defensive Player of the Week following his performance vs. No. 4 Penn State. He matched his career best with 16 tackles, including 11 solo stops. He added three tackles for loss, two pass break-ups, and a recovered fumble. His fifth career interception and 33-yard return in the second quarter led to Iowa's first touchdown of the game.

Jewell was named midseason first team All-American by five media outlets, including Associated Press, ESPN.com, CBSSports.com, Sporting News, and The All-American.

FINISH STRONG

Iowa has outscored its opponents 99-57 in the fourth quarter. QB Nate Stanley has a 140.0 passing efficiency in the fourth quarter and overtime (132.6 overall). The numbers include 44 completions in 79 attempts for 565 yards, seven touchdowns and two interceptions. Iowa scored points in the final two minutes to tie the game or take the lead against Iowa State, Penn State and Northwestern.

THE SERIES

Nebraska holds a 29-15-3 advantage in the series that began with a 22-0 Iowa victory in 1891. Iowa has won two straight and three of the last four meetings. The visiting team had won four straight prior to Iowa's 40-10 win at Kinnick Stadium in 2016. The 40 points scored were the most by the Hawkeyes in the series' 47-game history.

The Hawkeyes have won the last two meetings in Lincoln. Iowa's 38-17 win in 2013 was its first win at Nebraska since 1943. Nebraska holds a 15-4-1 advantage in games played in Lincoln.

The 1999 Iowa-Nebraska game in Kinnick Stadium marked Coach Kirk Ferentz's first game as Iowa's head coach.

The first 10 games in the series were played in either Omaha (eight games) or Council Bluffs (two games). The series was even at 4-4-2 in those 10 meetings. Here are the series results:

LAST MEETING: IOWA 40, NEBRASKA 10 (Nov. 25, 2016 – Kinnick Stadium)

Iowa cruised to a 40-10 win over No. 15 Nebraska at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa retained possession of the Heroes Trophy as a result of its second consecutive victory over the Cornhuskers. The win was Iowa's first over Nebraska at home since 1981.

Iowa combined to rush for 264 yards and three touchdowns on 47 attempts, while quarterback C.J. Beathard completed 10-of-15 passes for 144 yards and three scores.

The Hawkeyes scored two first-quarter touchdowns via an Akrum Wadley 75-yard run (PAT blocked) and a 77-yard scoring strike from Beathard to WR Riley McCarron.

Iowa built to a 20-3 cushion heading into half after LeShun Daniels, Jr. scored from four yards out in the second period.

Iowa extended its advantage to 26-3 on a TE George Kittle 1-yard scoring catch on its first possession of the second half. That score was set up by Desmond King's 44-yard punt return. Nebraska scored its only touchdown of the game on a fourth-down play in the third quarter, a 13-yard touchdown pass from QB Tommy Armstrong, Jr. to WR Stanley Morgan, Jr.

The Hawkeyes added a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter to put a punctuation mark on their eighth overall victory of the season and sixth win in Big Ten play. Kittle scored his second touchdown of the game on a 6-yard pass, while Daniels rushed for his second touchdown of the game, this time a 1-yard score.

Daniels finished the contest with 158 yards and two scores on a career-high 29 carries, while Wadley had 105 yards on 11 attempts and one TD. McCarron led all receivers with a career-high 108 yards and one score on five receptions.

Iowa's defense held Nebraska to 217 yards total offense, forced six three-and-outs, had two tackles for loss, and eight pass break-ups. Linebackers Bo Bower and Josey Jewell led the home team with nine tackles each.

POCKET PRESSURE

The Hawkeyes have three players that rank in the top 20 in the Big Ten in sacks. Sophomore DE Anthony Nelson is tied for seventh with six sacks (27 yards). Nelson had six sacks as a freshman last season, second best on the team. Senior LB Josey Jewell and true freshman DE A.J. Epenesa are tied for 18th in the Big Ten with 4.5 sacks. Among league freshmen, only Northwestern's Samdup Miller (5.0) has more sacks than Epenesa, who leads Iowa with eight quarterback hurries. Jewell's 4.5 sacks are a single-season career high.

TIGHT ENDS MOVE THE CHAINS

Second-year tight ends Noah Fant (So.) and T.J. Hockenson (redshirt freshman) have combined for 48 receptions this season. Among those 48 receptions, all but seven have resulted in a touchdown (11) or first down (30).

Fant has 25 receptions, including a team-high eight touchdowns. The eight touchdowns are a single-season record for an Iowa tight end. He has 14 more catches that resulted in a first down. Fant's eight touchdowns are the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt caught 12 touchdown passes in 2012.

Hockenson has 23 receptions, including three touchdowns and 16 catches that resulted in a first down.

WADLEY PURSUES RARE FEAT

Senior RB Akrum Wadley has 862 yards rushing in 2017. He rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, and with another 1,000-yard campaign he could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264). The other Hawkeyes with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons include Sedrick Shaw (1,002 in 1994, 1,477 in 1995, 1,116 in 1996) and Ladell Betts (1,090 in 2000 and 1,060 in 2001).

WADLEY MOVING UP THE CHARTS

RB Akrum Wadley is one of 15 players in program history to rush for 2,000 career yards. He has 495 career carries for 2,625 rushing yards, sixth all-time. He needs 135 yards to tie Fred Russell for fifth all-time.

Wadley has 24 career rushing touchdowns, tying for fourth all-time, 31 career touchdowns, sixth all-time, and 186 career points, 12th all-time.

Wadley has 3,454 career all-purpose yards, ninth most in program history (2,625 rush, 729 receiving, 100 KO returns). He is averaging 116.6 all-purpose yards per game, sixth best in the Big Ten.

VANDEBERG STREAKING UP THE RANKINGS

Senior WR Matt Vandenberg has a reception in 30 consecutive games played. He has 131 career receptions, 10th most in program history. He has 1,652 career receiving yards, 16th in program history. He is 33 yards from passing Bill Happel in career receiving yards, and four catches from tying Ed Hinkel in receptions.

Vandenberg has played in 52 career games, one shy of tying Desmond King for most games played in program history.

Vandenberg missed Iowa's final nine games of 2016 due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. He played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving

yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury. On Dec. 21, 2016, the Big Ten Conference granted the University of Iowa's medical hardship waiver request on behalf of VandeBerg and granted the wide receiver a fifth year of eligibility.

A NEW LOOK TO NATION'S TOP OFFENSIVE LINE UNIT

The Hawkeyes entered the season with seven players returning on what was the top offensive line in the country in 2016, but season-ending injuries to senior tackles Ike Boettger and Boone Myers have cleared the depth chart for redshirt freshman Alaric Jackson and true freshman Tristan Wirfs.

Jackson has started every game this season at left tackle, a position Myers has occupied 17 times, including the last five games of 2016.

Wirfs has started the last six games at right tackle. He is the first true freshman in Ferentz's 19 seasons to start at offensive tackle, and only the fourth true freshman under Ferentz to ever start on the offensive line. Center James Daniels, a junior in 2017, made two starts at left guard in 2015. The other two true freshman include Byran Bulaga in 2007 (5 games at LG) and Mike Jones in 2003 (seven games at left guard).

Boettger (LT, LG, RT), Myers (LT, LG), and Sean Welsh (RG, RT); Daniels (C), Lucas LeGrand (C), and Keegan Render (LG, RG); and Levi Paulsen (RG) all started at least one game for an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award in 2016.

The Joe Moore Award honors offensive line units that display a high level of toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique, and "finishing". It is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

The Hawkeyes were selected over national runner-up Alabama and third-ranked Ohio State. Iowa was selected by a voting committee comprised solely of people who played or coached the offensive line position, including all of the current offensive line coaches at the Division I/FBS level as well as former players, coaches and colleagues of Coach Moore, and select media. Iowa's offense averaged 171.8 rushing yards per game -- averaging 4.5 yards per carry, and more than two yards before contact -- and 325 yards total offense per game.

MYERS JOINS BOETTGER ON INJURED LIST

Senior offensive lineman Boone Myers underwent ankle surgery during the week prior to Iowa's win over Minnesota and is out indefinitely. Myers joins fellow senior Ike Boettger on the injured list, as Boettger suffered an Achilles injury in Week 2 at Iowa State and is out for the season. Myers had 25 career starts, while Boettger started 21 times in his career.

BRANDON SNYDER CAMEO APPEARANCE

Six months after suffering an ACL injury during spring camp, FS Brandon Snyder returned the lineup on Oct. 7 to help Iowa defeat Illinois, 45-16. Snyder started the contest and contributed with three tackles, two pass breakups, and one interception, an 89-yard pick six that halted Illinois' go-ahead touchdown drive.

The 89-yard interception return for a touchdown ties for the sixth longest in school history and is Iowa's longest play this season. Iowa has had at least one pick-six every year since 2009.

The game was Snyder's only appearance this season. He was sidelined again against Northwestern, Minnesota, and Ohio State due to injury, and head coach Kirk Ferentz announced on Nov. 7 he would miss the rest of the season due to the same injury suffered in spring camp.

RUSH THE BUCKEYES

RB Akrum Wadley and RB James Butler combined for 192 rushing yards on 30 attempts in Iowa's 55-24 win against No. 3 Ohio State. The duo averaged 6.4 yard per attempt. RB Toren Young added 47 yards rushing on five attempts, including a six-yard touchdown rush in the fourth quarter.

Wadley added 40 yards on three receptions to total 158 all-purpose yards on the day.

NEW JERSEY PREPS LEAVE MARK ON CY-HAWK SERIES

Senior RB Akrum Wadley and true freshman WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette, both graduates of Weequahic (WEEK-way) High School in Newark, New Jersey, combined for four touchdowns in Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. Wadley turned a short crossing route into a 46-yard touchdown reception in the final minutes of the fourth quarter to tie the game, 38-38, and Smith-Marsette caught a five-yard touchdown pass in the first overtime to win the game, 44-41.

Wadley completed the game with 118 rushing yards on a career-high 28 attempts, four receptions for 72 yards and three KO returns for 70 yards. Smith-Marsette finished his first career start with four receptions, 36 yards, and two touchdowns, including a 15-yard diving score in the fourth quarter, and one rushing attempt for seven yards.

FRESH LEGS

Running backs Toren Young and Ivory Kelly-Martin carried the ball for the first time in their careers Week 3 when RB Akrum Wadley and RB James Butler each left the North Texas game with injuries.

Young, a redshirt freshman, finished the game with a team-high 19 carries for a team-best 78 yards. Kelly-Martin, a true freshman, finished with 74 yards on 11 carries and two touchdowns (2, 6). Kelly-Martin is the first Iowa true freshman with two or more rushing touchdowns in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (vs Missouri).

The rookies combined for 152 yards on 30 carries and two rushing touchdowns. Iowa's seniors, Wadley and Butler, had 98 yards rushing on 24 carries.

GRADUATE NEWCOMERS

Graduate transfers RB James Butler and WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes in fall training camp after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.

Butler has 72 carries for 328 yards in 2017. He missed weeks 4-7 after suffering an injury Week 3 vs. North Texas. He rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior at Nevada in 2016, and was a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection. He is a native of Bloomingdale, Illinois.

Quarells has not seen action in 2017. He played in 13 games in 2016, catching 11 balls for 180 yards and one touchdown in the Lobos' triple option offense. The junior has two years of eligibility remaining. He is a native of St. Louis.

BRIAN FERENTZ NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye football team captain and three-year letterman for the University of Iowa football team, was named Iowa's offensive coordinator on Jan. 9, 2017. He also coaches Iowa's running backs.

Ferentz, the eldest son of UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, was an Iowa offensive lineman from 2001-05. He joined the Iowa coaching staff in 2012, serving as offensive line coach and adding the title of run-game coordinator in 2015.

In 2016, Iowa's offensive line was the recipient of the Joe Moore Award, which goes to the best offensive line in college football. Due to injuries, Iowa was forced to use seven starting combinations on the offensive line, but the Hawkeyes were able to produce two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes were also a finalist for the Joe Moore Award in 2015.

Under Ferentz's direction, left tackle Brandon Scherff won the 2014 Outland Trophy, was the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten; and earned unanimous consensus All-America honors. Scherff was the fifth player selected in the 2015 NFL Draft (Washington Redskins), while right tackle Andrew Donnal was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the fourth round. Center Austin Blythe was selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (Indianapolis).

Ferentz joined the Hawkeye staff after spending four years with the NFL's New England Patriots. He has been recognized by ESPN.com as one of the top assistant coaches in the Big Ten Conference under the age of 40. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes staff, Ferentz worked under Patriots head coach Bill Belichick and current Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien, serving as New England's tight ends coach in 2011, helping the Patriots win the AFC championship and a spot in the 2012 Super Bowl. He was an offensive assistant coach in 2010, working exclusively with the tight ends.

WALLACE, WOODS ADD COORDINATOR TITLES

Tight ends coach LeVar Woods added the title of special teams coordinator in 2017. Woods had assisted with special teams since joining the coaching staff in 2012.

Linebackers coach Seth Wallace added the title of assistant defensive coordinator in 2017. Wallace was defensive coordinator at Valdosta State before joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2014. He was recruiting coordinator his first two seasons. He coached defensive backs in 2015 and has coached linebackers since 2016.

COPELAND, O'KEEFE, POLASEK JOIN COACHING STAFF

Iowa has three new faces on the 2017 coaching staff. Kelton Copeland coaches the Hawkeye receivers after spending the past four years at Northern Illinois. Ken O'Keefe is back on staff as quarterbacks coach. O'Keefe was Iowa's offensive coordinator from 1999-2011 and Iowa's quarterbacks coach from 2000-11. Tim Polasek, Iowa's offensive line coach, spent the past three seasons as North Dakota State's offensive coordinator.

WADLEY NAMED TO PAUL HORNUNG AWARD HONOR ROLL

RB Akrum Wadley was named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. Wadley was one of five players nationally to earn the recognition. The Hornung Award is presented annually by the Louisville Sports Commission to the most versatile player in major college football.

Wadley accounted for 260 all-purpose yards against the Cyclones. Wadley rushed for 118 yards and one touchdown on a career-best 28 attempts, and had four receptions for 72 yards and one touchdown. He also added three kickoff returns for 70 yards. Wadley scored on a one-yard run to give Iowa a 21-10 advantage in the third quarter. He later hauled in a short pass from quarterback Nate Stanley and turned the play into a 46-yard scoring play that tied the game in the final two minutes of the fourth quarter.

STANLEY EARNS NATIONAL HONORS

QB Nathan Stanley was named the Manning Award National Quarterback of the Week and a College Football Performance Award honorable mention honoree following Iowa's 55-24 win over No. 3 Ohio State on Nov. 4.

Stanley tied a Kinnick Stadium record with five touchdown passes and completed 20-of-31 pass attempts for 226 yards, with touchdown passes of 10, 25, 3, 2, and 2 yards. He directed the Iowa offense that had no turnovers and 487 yards total offense. Ohio State entered the game allowing 18.2 points and 302.5 yards total offense in its previous eight games. Iowa's offense gained 243 rushing yards and 244 passing yards in the contest.

Stanley led Iowa to its fourth home win in its last five meetings against AP top five opponents. He is the only player in the last 20 years to throw for five touchdowns and zero interceptions against the Buckeyes.

STANLEY NAMED BIG CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

QB Nate Stanley was named Big Ten Conference co-Offensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. He was also one of eight quarterbacks nationally named the Manning Award "Star of the Week."

Stanley completed 27-of-41 pass attempts for 333 yards and five touchdowns, with no interceptions. His scoring passes covered 10, 17, 15, 46 and 5 yards, as nine Hawkeyes had at least one reception.

Stanley led the Iowa offense on four scoring drives of at least 89 yards. Iowa's final scoring drive in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter covered 89 yards in just seven plays as the Hawkeyes tied the game with 1:52 remaining. Stanley then completed 2-of-3 passes for 15 yards in overtime, including the game-winning touchdown after Iowa State had scored a field goal on its overtime possession.

Stanley established career highs in completions (27), attempts (41), yards (333), and touchdowns (5). He had eight touchdown passes in his first two career starts (12 in four games), more than any other quarterback in the Kirk Ferentz era.

Stanley became only the second Big Ten quarterback in the last 20 years with 300-plus passing yards, five-plus touchdown passes and no interceptions in a road game. The Big Ten honor was the first career honor for Stanley.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 17 players in its 2017 Leadership Group. The group includes five seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and two true freshmen. The Leadership Group will vote on the weekly gameday captains, be involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provide feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors DL Nathan Bazata, LB Josey Jewell, LB Ben Niemann, WR Matt VandeBerg, OL Sean Welsh, juniors OL James Daniels, DE Parker Hesse, DB Brandon Snyder, and QB Tyler Wieggers, sophomores LB Amani Jones, DE Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nathan Stanley, redshirt freshmen LB Nick Niemann and RB Toren Young, and first-year freshmen DE A.J. Epenesa and OL Tristan Wirfs.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2017. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his sixth year on staff and first as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 10th year on the Iowa staff, his third coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13 before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has nine players on its 2017 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: DL Will Anthony (Jason in 1991), WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), TE Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), DL A.J. Epenesa (Epenesa in 1997), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), WR Henry Marchese (John in 1985), DE Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

Iowa has four sets of the brothers on the team: DL Jack Kallenberger and OL Mark Kallenberger, LB Ben Niemann and LB Nick Niemann, OL Landan Paulsen and OL Levi Paulsen, LB Kyle Taylor and SS Miles Taylor.

Iowa has four players whose brothers played at Iowa: LS Marshall Coluzzi (Ron in 2016), OL James Daniels (LeShun in 2013-16), DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11), OL Kevin Ward (Ryan in 2012-16).

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl Games.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- Five former Hawkeyes are playing offensive tackle in the NFL in 2017, tying for the most of any school at that position (Florida).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak of 40 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- Over the past 15 years, 137-of-154 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 10 years, Iowa has had 33 NFL Draft picks, second only to Ohio State (49) and tied with Penn State and Wisconsin.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 30 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (46). Michigan has also had 30 players selected in the NFL draft since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last eight NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Entering the 2017 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Six senior members of Iowa's 2016 team were on NFL opening day rosters in 2017, including, QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle and DB Greg Mabin. In addition, free agent WR Riley McCarron is with the New England Patriots.

GRADUATE STUDENT-ATHLETES

Eight Hawkeyes completed their undergraduate degrees prior to the 2017 season. Seniors OL Ike Boettger, DL Daniel Gaffey, FB Drake Kulick, WR Matt VandeBerg, and TE Jon Wisnieski, and junior DL Parker Hesse all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Senior RB James Butler and junior WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.



IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 16 of the last 17 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 313 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had eight individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 57-38 (.600) since 2010.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is leading the program for the 19th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Cole Croston, a free agent signed by the New England Patriots following the 2017 NFL draft, made the team's 53-man roster, meaning the Hawkeyes have had an NFL player on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz' 18 completed seasons. Croston split time at both tackles positions for the Hawkeyes in 2016.

Austin Blythe, a four-year Iowa starter and seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, was the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's 2017 roster of 120 players includes 57 players from the state of Iowa. The roster includes 20 players from Illinois; nine from Wisconsin; six from Michigan; four from Maryland; three from Florida, New Jersey, South Dakota, and Texas; two from Missouri, Nebraska, and Ohio; and one from Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, and Pennsylvania.

DEFENDING THE DEAN'S LIST

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the final 24 points in a 24-3 season-opening victory over Wyoming in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 all-time against the Cowboys.

Wyoming scored the first points of the game on a Cooper Rothe 49-yard field goal. The Cowboys forced four Hawkeye turnovers, however the field goal was the only points of the day the Iowa defense surrendered.

Iowa closed the half with touchdown passes of two and 27 yards from QB Nate Stanley to TE Noah Fant.

Stanley threw his third touchdown in the third period, connecting with WR Nick Easley on a 45-yard strike to extend Iowa's advantage to 21-3. Easley finished the game with a game-best 77 catches on four receptions.

Miguel Recinos split the uprights from 44 yards in the fourth quarter.

Stanley's three touchdown passes are the most by a Hawkeye in a season opener since Drew Tate had six against Montana in 2006. The sophomore signal caller finished the contest completing 8-of-15 passes for 125 yards.

RB Akrum Wadley rushed 24 times for a game-high 116 yards. The senior tailback topped the 100-yard rushing plateau for the 10th time in his career. Wadley is the second player in the Kirk Ferentz era to rush for 100-plus yards in back-to-back season openers (Fred Russell, 2002-03).

Iowa's defense held Wyoming to 233 total yards, including 59 yards rushing, sacked quarterback Josh Allen seven times, and intercepted him twice. CB Josh Jackson and DL Brady Reiff each recorded their first career interceptions in the fourth quarter. Wyoming did not run a single play in the red zone and was just six of 20 on third and fourth down conversion attempts.

Iowa's linebacking trio of Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower combined for 38 tackles. Niemann's 13 stops are a career high, while Jewell had a game-best 14 tackles, including two sacks, and Bower had 11. Jewell was named Walter Camp national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

Iowa used nine first-time starters in the season opener, six on offense and three on defense.

GAME RECAP

Iowa rallied from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to edge in-state rival Iowa State 44-41 (OT) for the third straight time at Jack Trice Stadium. The Hawkeyes retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

Trailing 38-31, QB Nate Stanley drove the Hawkeyes 89 yards in seven plays for the game-tying score with 1:09 remaining in the fourth quarter. Stanley connected with RB Akrum Wadley, who dodged five defenders before reaching the end zone from 46 yards to even the score, 38-38.

Iowa's defense held the Cyclones to a 30-yard field goal on the first possession of overtime before Stanley threw a dart to WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette for a 5-yard TD and the win.

Stanley completed 27-of-41 passes to nine different targets for 333 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions. He is the first Iowa QB with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus TD passes since Chuck Hartlieb versus Northwestern in 1987. Stanley engineered four touchdown drives over 89 yards, three of which covered 91 yards or more. His efforts earned the sophomore signal caller Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors.

Wadley amassed a game-best 260 yards of total offense, rushing the ball 28 times for 118 yards and a score and catching four passes for 72 yards and a touchdown. He added 70 yards on three kickoff returns.

In his first career start, Smith-Marsette had four receptions for 36 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner. He also had one rush for seven yards. WR Nick Easley is the first player under Kirk Ferentz to have a TD reception in each of his first two career games. He had a career and team-high seven receptions for 48 yards and one touchdown. WR Matt VandeBerg had three receptions for 42 yards and one touchdown. He is the only player in the Ferentz era to have a receiving TD in three different games against the Cyclones.

Five Hawkeyes set career highs in tackles: DE Parker Hesse (7), FS Jake Gervase (6), DB Josh Jackson (6), DB Michael Ojemudia (4), and DE Sam Brincks (3). Josey Jewell shared the team lead in tackles with seven. In addition to his seven tackles, Hesse intercepted his second career pass at the line of scrimmage, which led to a field goal to tie the game, 31-31, with 5:16 left in the fourth period.

The game featured three ties and three lead changes. A combined 31 points were scored in the fourth quarter (17 by Iowa; 14 by Iowa State).

Iowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points in registering a 31-14 victory over North Texas inside Kinnick Stadium to remain unbeaten. The Hawkeyes begin the season 3-0 for the seventh time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

The Hawkeyes' ground attack stifled the Mean Green; Iowa rushed 59 times for 238 yards. Iowa maintained possession for 40:45, the second most under Ferentz (Kent State, 2004).

North Texas capitalized on two Iowa personal foul penalties on its final drive of the first half, resulting in a 13-yard TD pass to take a 14-10 advantage over the home team at half.

It was all Hawkeyes in the second half as Iowa scored touchdowns on its first three possessions, while its fourth possession ended with the Hawkeyes in victory formation at the 2-yard line. All four of Iowa's touchdown drives were 10 plays or more, with its third score covering 87 yards in 8:50.

QB Nate Stanley completed 16-of-27 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns. The sophomore signal caller has thrown 10 touchdowns over the first three games, the best three-game stretch in the Ferentz era. It is Iowa's best three-game stretch since Chuck Hartlieb threw 11 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1987.

Iowa had three players rush for 70 yards or more: Toren Young (19 carries, 78 yards), Ivory Kelly-Martin (11 attempts, 74 yards, 2 TDs), and James Butler (16 carries, 74 yards). Kelly-Martin and Young each carried the ball for the first time in their careers. Kelly-Martin is the first true freshman with two rushing touchdowns in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (Missouri).

RB Akrum Wadley had two catches for a team-best 80 yards and rushed eight times for 24 yards. His 3-yard rush in the first quarter pushed the senior tailback over 2,000 career yards. Wadley left the game in the second period and did not return due to injury.

Tight ends T.J. Hockensen (8 yards) and Noah Fant (23 yards) caught Iowa's first two touchdowns.

Defensively, Josh Jackson blocked a field goal, intercepted his second pass of the season, had two pass break-ups and was credited with three tackles.

Penn State QB Trace McSorley completed a 7-yard touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson as time expired to lift the Nittany Lions to a narrow 21-19 victory over Iowa at Kinnick Stadium in primetime.

Despite being outgained 579 to 273 in total offense and Penn State amassing 99 plays, the Hawkeyes fought the fourth-ranked team to the wire in both team's conference opener. The game featured four lead changes, including two in the final two minutes of the contest.

Trailing 5-0 in the second quarter, LB Josey Jewell intercepted McSorley and returned the theft 33 yards to the Penn State 21-yard line. Iowa scored on the next play, a 21-yard pass play from QB Nate Stanley to WR Nick Easley. Iowa had one snap inside Penn State territory in the first half and made it count as the Hawkeyes led 7-5 at halftime.

The Nittany Lions scored 10 points in the third quarter on a 21-yard field goal and a Saquon Barkley 8-yard rush.

RB Akrum Wadley scored two fourth quarter touchdowns; first a career-long 70-yard pass play from Stanley, then a 35-yard run with 1:42 remaining.

Penn State drove 80 yards and scored the game-winner on its 12th and final play.

Wadley (80 rush, 75 receiving) totaled 155 yards of Iowa's 273 total offense. Stanley completed 13-of-22 passes for 191 yards and two scores, connecting on 12 of his final 14 attempts.

In addition to the interception, Jewell had a game-high 16 tackles to match his career high. He also had a personal-best three tackles for loss and added two pass break-ups. He was named Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week. DB Amani Hooker had 13 tackles in his first career start, while DB Manny Rugamba had a career-high nine stops.

Barkley paced the Nittany Lions, accumulating a school single-game record 358 all-purpose yards.

The loss snaps Iowa's Big Ten opener winning streak at five. Iowa's last conference opening loss was in 2011 at Penn State.

Michigan State scored 14 first-quarter points and held on for a 17-10 victory over Iowa inside Spartan Stadium. The win snapped a two-game losing streak to the Hawkeyes in East Lansing, Michigan.

WR Felton Davis caught touchdown passes of six and 22 yards in the first quarter to give the Spartans an early 14-point cushion. Davis finished the contest with a game-best nine catches for 114 yards and two scores.

Iowa's Akrum Wadley crossed the goal line from nine yards away with 12:15 remaining in the second quarter for the Hawkeyes' only touchdown of the game. The senior tailback finished the game with 47 all-purpose yards (30 rushing, 17 receiving).

The Spartans led 17-7 at half after Matt Coghlin split the uprights on a 38-yard field goal with 43 seconds left in the second quarter. Iowa's Miguel Recinos converted a 43-yard field goal with 9:08 left in the fourth period for the only scoring in the second half.

Both teams passed for 212 yards, while Michigan State outgained Iowa 88-19 on the ground. Iowa's average starting position was its own 22-yard line, starting four drives inside its own 10-yard line. Michigan State benefited from a shorter field most of the game, with its average field position being its 39-yard line. The Spartans also recovered two Hawkeye fumbles on their side of the field, one of those in the red zone.

LB Josey Jewell led the Hawkeye defense again, equaling a career high with 16 tackles (10 solo), including three for loss and 0.5 sacks. He also forced a fumble. CB Michael Ojemudia, who started for the injured Manny Rugamba, totaled a personal-best eight stops.

Nine different Hawkeyes caught a pass, including DE A.J. Epenesa, who caught a 15-yard pass from punter Colten Rastetter. QB Nate Stanley completed 16-of-31 passes for 197 yards. TE T.J. Hockenson posted career highs in receptions (3) and receiving yards (46).

Iowa's last four trips to Michigan State have resulted in one-possession games (2-2).

Iowa scored 35 of the game's final 38 points in a 45-16 rout over Illinois on Homecoming inside Kinnick Stadium. The 45 points are the most by the Hawkeyes against Illinois since 1985 (59 points).

QB Nate Stanley threw three touchdowns, while RB Akrum Wadley scored two touchdowns (one rush, one receiving) to spark the Hawkeye offense.

Illinois led 13-10 after Chase McLaughlin's second of three field goals with 2:49 left in the second quarter. A fake punt on Iowa's ensuing offensive possession ultimately ended with a Wadley 2-yard scoring reception with eight seconds remaining in the first half.

Midway through the third period, a Fighting Illini scoring threat was thwarted when FS Brandon Snyder returned an interception 89 yards for a touchdown. Snyder's return tied Shaun Prater for the sixth longest interception return in school history. Snyder, who was playing in his first game of the season after returning from an ACL injury, also had three tackles and two pass break-ups.

Iowa, who has beaten Illinois nine of the last 10 games and four straight, reached the end zone three more times in the fourth quarter. WR Matt VandeBerg caught a 39-yard touchdown pass, Ivory Kelly-Martin had a 3-yard score, and Wadley crossed the goal line from 18 yards away.

Wadley finished the contest with a game-best 129 all-purpose yards, including 115 rushing yards, moving the tailback into 10th all-time in Iowa career rushing. Stanley completed 17-of-32 passes for 247 yards. The Hawkeye signal caller was intercepted on his 15th pass attempt, breaking a streak of 147 attempts without an interception. WR Nick Easley equaled a personal best with seven receptions for 59 yards and a touchdown.

Iowa's defense collected four takeaways; interceptions by Geno Stone, Amani Hooker and Snyder, and a Ben Niemann fumble recovery. Linebacker Josey Jewell and Bo Bower tied for the team lead with 10 tackles each.

A 1-yard touchdown run in overtime by Northwestern QB Clayton Thorson was the difference in a 17-10 Iowa loss at Ryan Field in Evanston, Illinois.

Just before halftime, the Hawkeyes broke a scoreless tie when QB Nate Stanley connected with TE Noah Fant on a 7-yard TD reception. A Stanley to WR Matt VandeBerg career-long 61-yard reception on the first play of the drive set the table for the only scoring of the first half. The Fant touchdown marked the first time in seven games that Iowa scored the first points of the game.

The home team evened the score when Jeremy Larkin crossed the goal line from six yards away midway through the third quarter. The Wildcats took a 10-7 advantage with 8:07 left in the fourth period on a Charlie Kuhbender 30-yard field goal.

Iowa PK Miguel Recinos split the uprights on a career-long 48-yard field goal with 90 seconds remaining in regulation to tie the game.

After Northwestern scored the go-ahead touchdown on the first possession of overtime, Iowa's offensive possession stalled on the 18-yard line to end the game.

Stanley completed 19-of-33 passes for 223 yards and one touchdown. RB Akrum Wadley rushed 26 times for a team-high 90 yards. VandeBerg had three catches for a season-best 90 yards receiving. The 90 yards are the most by a Hawkeye receiver this season. WR Nick Easley had a team-high four receptions for 45 yards.

Defensive starters Brandon Snyder and Josey Jewell did not play due to injury. Jewell's absence was the first in 38 games. He had started the previous 37 contests. Replacing Snyder and Jewell in the starting lineup were Jake Gervase and Kevin Ward, respectively.

LB Bo Bower (11) and LB Kevin Ward (4) set career highs in tackles, while LB Ben Niemann moved to Jewell's position and recorded 11 tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a career-high 1.5 sacks. DL Matt Nelson started for the first time this season and for the first time in his career at defensive tackle.

Punter Ryan Gersonde punted a career-high five times. He had a career long 61-yard punt and averaged 52.6 yards per punt. Four punts were 50-plus yards, and one was downed inside the 20-yard line.

GAME RECAP

Iowa led start to finish and retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 17-10 victory over Minnesota inside Kinnick Stadium. The win marked Iowa's eighth straight over the Golden Gophers in Iowa City since 2001.

It did not take the Hawkeyes long to strike first, driving 80 yards in five plays on the opening possession of the game. RB Akrum Wadley rushed 12 yards for the game's first score. The senior tailback finished the contest with a team-best 70 rushing yards.

After a scoreless second period, Iowa extended its advantage to 14-0 on a TE Noah Fant career-long 45-yard touchdown reception from QB Nate Stanley.

Minnesota cut the deficit in half with a RB Kobe McCrary 1-yard scoring run. Iowa and Minnesota traded field goals later in the fourth quarter. The Golden Gophers had a final opportunity to even the score, but only gained three yards deep inside their own territory and turned the ball over on downs with under one minute to play. DE Anthony Nelson ended Minnesota's final drive with a sack, Iowa's fourth of the night.

Stanley completed 15-of-27 passes for 190 yards and one touchdown, while WR Nick Easley had a team-best five receptions for 49 yards for the Hawkeyes.

Minnesota QB Demry Croft completed 9-of-29 passes for 139 yards. WR Tyler Johnson had a game-high 92 receiving yards on four catches for the visitors.

Defensively, Iowa held Minnesota to a season low in points. Iowa's defense pitched a first-half shutout for the second straight week. It was the first time this year that the Golden Gophers were shutout in the first half.

LB Josey Jewell returned to the starting lineup after missing the previous week due to injury. Jewell led the team with 11 tackles. FS Jake Gervase recorded a career-high eight stops, and recorded his first career interception. DB Josh Jackson, the Big Ten leader in pass break-ups, had a career-high four against the Golden Gophers.

Four of Iowa's first five Big Ten games this season have been decided by seven points or fewer.

Iowa improved to 2-0 this season in rivalry trophy games, also retaining possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy (Iowa State).

GAME RECAP

Iowa safety Amani Hooker returned an interception 30 yards on the first play from scrimmage to ignite an offensive explosion by the Hawkeyes in a 55-24 rout over third-ranked Ohio State in Kinnick Stadium. The win garnered the Hawkeyes FWA National Team of the Week honors.

The 55 points and 31-point margin of victory are the most ever by Iowa in the 65-game series against Ohio State, and largest margin of victory over an AP-Top 5 opponent in school history. The win also made Iowa bowl eligible for the 16th time in the last 17 seasons.

Nate Stanley tied a Kinnick Stadium single-game record with five touchdown passes, tying Chuck Long (1985) and Fred Riddle (1963). Stanley also became the first quarterback in the country to throw for five touchdowns and no interceptions against the Buckeyes over the last 20 years. The sophomore signal caller completed 20-of-31 passes for 226 yards. Four of Stanley's touchdown throws went to tight ends and the fifth to a fullback covering 2, 2, 3, 10, and 25 yards. Stanley was named the Manning Award national Quarterback of the Week.

TE Noah Fant caught four passes for 54 yards and two scores, while TE T.J. Hockensen had a team-high five receptions for 71 yards and two touchdowns. FB Drake Kulick caught Iowa's fifth touchdown pass, the first of his career, in the fourth quarter.

Iowa's defense was stout, limiting the Buckeyes to 371 yards of total offense (200 yards below their season average), 24 points (22 points below their season average), and collecting four interceptions. CB Josh Jackson accounted for three of the four picks, tying Grant Steen and Tyler Sash for the most in Iowa single-game history. Jackson's efforts earned the junior Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades.

LB Josey Jewell led the team with 11 tackles and one pass breakup in the end zone.

RB Akrum Wadley rushed a game-high 20 times for 118 yards, marking his 13th career 100-yard rushing game. He added 40 yards receiving on three catches. RB James Butler tied his season high with 74 yards rushing on 10 carries.

PK Miguel Recinos was perfect on the day totaling 13 points (7 PAT, 2 FG).

GAME RECAP

No. 6 Wisconsin posted a 38-14 victory over No. 25 Iowa to remain unbeaten and retain possession of the Heartland Trophy on a cold afternoon at Camp Randall Stadium.

The Badgers outgained the Hawkeyes 382 to 66 yards in total offense en route to clinching the Big Ten West Division. Iowa's offense was only able to move the chains five times and rushed for a season-low 25 yards. The game featured seven turnovers; four by Wisconsin and three by Iowa.

For the second consecutive week, Iowa scored the game's first points on a pick-six, this one by DB Josh Jackson. The junior, who was tabbed Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, intercepted Wisconsin QB Alex Hornibrook and returned the theft 43 yards on the fourth play from scrimmage.

Wisconsin answered with 17 straight points on a Rafael Gaglianone 23-yard field goal and back-to-back WR Kendrick Pryor touchdowns (25-yard rush, 12-yard reception).

Jackson collected his second pick-six on Wisconsin's first possession of the second half. Jackson returned his second interception of the game 52 yards to cut the Iowa deficit to 17-14 with 11:18 remaining in the third quarter. The Badgers closed out the game by adding three touchdowns.

Iowa's defense collected four takeaways (three interceptions, one fumble) with Jackson being involved in three of the four. In addition to the two interceptions, Jackson forced his first career fumble. Jackson is the first Hawkeye to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a Big Ten game. The interceptions were Jackson's sixth and seventh of the season, tying for fourth among the program's single-season leaders. FS Jake Gervase was responsible for the third interception, collecting his second interception of the season in the first period.

LB Josey Jewell had a game-high 12 tackles, marking his 20th career game with double-digit tackles. Jewell's 12 stops helped the senior surpass 400 tackles in his career.

QB Nate Stanley completed 8-of-24 passes for 41 yards, while RB James Butler had a team-best 30 rushing yards on eight attempts.

The loss to Wisconsin marked the first game this season that Iowa lost a traveling trophy game; won at Iowa State (Cy-Hawk) and at home versus Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale).

Purdue scored two touchdowns in the opening four minutes of the third quarter to record a 24-15 win over Iowa on Senior Day in Kinnick Stadium.

The Purdue victory stopped a four-game losing streak in the series. The game was played in cold and windy conditions, with wind gusts of 20-25 mph.

Purdue scored the only points in the first quarter on its opening drive, capping a 67-yard drive with a five-yard scoring strike from Elijah Sindelar to D.J. Knox. The scoring drive was aided by a roughing the punter penalty on the Hawkeyes.

Iowa scored its first points in the second quarter, as senior defensive tackle Nathan Bazata sacked Sindelar in the end zone for a safety, Iowa's first of the season.

Iowa took over on at the 50 following the safety, and promptly drove to the end zone to take a 9-7 advantage that would carry into halftime.

Senior RB Akrum Wadley scored on a two-yard run, as he gained 28 of the 50 yards on the drive. A key play for the Hawkeyes was an 18-yard completion from QB Nate Stanley to WR Matt Vandenberg on a fourth down conversion.

Purdue took control early in the third quarter, scoring on a 42-yard strike from Sindelar to Anthony Mahoungou less than one minute into the period. Following an Iowa three-and-out, the Sindelar to Mahoungou combination struck for a 16-yard touchdown to give the Boilers a 21-9 advantage.

Iowa's offense drove to the Purdue 42 early in the fourth period, but an interception off a tipped pass stopped the drive.

Purdue scored its final points on a J.D. Dellinger field goal after the Boilermakers recovered an Iowa fumble on a punt return at the Iowa 16 yard line.

Freshman Ihmir Smith-Marsette gave Iowa a lift with a 53-yard kickoff return, and the Hawkeyes concluded the drive with a fourth down conversion as Stanley completed a six-yard scoring strike to TE Noah Fant.

Purdue covered Iowa's onside kick with 1:04 remaining and ran out the clock to secure the win.

Senior LB Josey Jewell led the Hawkeye defense with 13 tackles, three tackles-for-loss and three pass break-ups.

Wadley led the Iowa offense with 78 yards on 22 carries, while Stanley completed 16-of-33 attempts for 176 yards.
