MEN'S GYMNASTICS WEEKLY RELEASE

HEAD COACH JD REIVE

Head coach JD Reive enters his seventh season at the helm of the University of Iowa men's gymnastics program in 2016-17.

The Hawkeyes made strides in 2016 despite finishing eighth in the nation. For the first time in program history lowa recorded a team score of 430+ in January, tallying scores of 430.850 on Jan. 23 against Illinois and 431.800 the following day at UIC.

During session II at the NCAA Championships, lowa placed fourth in the NCAA Qualifier with a score of 423.250, missing the cut for team finals. Senior Jack Boyle was nominated for the Nissen-Emery award given to the country's most outstanding senior gymnast, lowa's first nomination since Jonathan Buese in 2010.

Reive's squad qualified five gymnasts for day two of the NCAA Championships led by seniors Matt Loochtan and Jack Boyle. The aduo competed all-around for the Hawkeyes, placing 10th (84.150) and 14th (83.600), respectively. Sophomore Dylan Ellsworth tied for 26th on vault (14.700) and 8th on parallel bars (14.300). Junior Cory Paterson tied for 37th on ahigh bar (13.750) while sophomore Austin Hodges tied for 25th a(14.350).

During the Big Ten Championships, Loochtan led the way for lowa, earning his first All-Big Ten recognition of his career with a runner-up result of 15.100 on rings. Senior Doug Sullivan placed fifth on pommel horse (14.875), sophomore Austin Hodges placed seventh on pommel horse (14.725), and sophomore Dylan Ellsworth placed fifth on vault (14.400). Sullivan was awarded awith lowa's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award following the meet.

On Senior Night, senior Jack Boyle bested his own lowa school record of 86.800 with an 87.600 effort in the all-around to lead the Hawkeyes to an upset over Minnesota.

Senior Matt Loochtan earned Big Ten Gymnast of the Week following his performance in a win against Nebraska and Penn State on Feb. 27. Loochtan claimed five event titles on floor (15.350), rings (15.150), vault (14.450), parallel bars (14.850), and high bar (14.450) and set a career-high in all-around at the time with a score of 86.400.

A POWERHOUSE CONFERENCE

The Big Ten Conference has been dominant this season. Of the top 10 teams listed on roadtonationals.com, seven are from the Big Ten, including No. 3 Ohio State, No. 4 Illinois, No. 5 Minnesota, No. 6 Penn State, No. 7 Nebraska, No. 8 Iowa and No. 9 Michigan.

TWO HAWKEYES NAMED TO WATCH LIST

Juniors Dylan Ellsworth and Austin Hodges were named to the 2017 Big Ten Men's Gymnasts to Watch list, the conference office announced Dec. 15.

- Ellsworth placed fifth overall during event finals at the Big Ten Championships last season. He went on to tie for 26th on vault and 18th on parallel bars during the second day of the 2016 NCAA championships.
- Hodges recorded a career-best score of 14.725 on pommel horse to finish seventh at the Big Ten Championships and ended the 2016 season with a 25th place finish on high bar during day two of the NCAA Championships.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The 2017 men's gymnastics team breaks down into six freshmen, four sophomores, three juniors and four seniors.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTORS

- Five freshmen have found their way into the lowa lineup this season.
- Andrew Herrador has competed in every meet for the Hawkeyes this season, making the lineup on floor, pommel horse, vault, and high bar. He won the event title and tallied a season-high 14.400 on floor against Penn State on March 25. He notched a season-high on 14.400 on vault against Nebraska March 20. He recorded a season-high 14.150 and won the event title on high bar at Nebraska March 4.
- Mitch Mandozzi has competed in six meets for the Hawkeyes this season, making the lineup on vault
 and parallel bars. He posted a season-high 13.500 on parallel bars against Minnesota and Oklahoma on
 Feb. 10
- Nick Merryman has competed in every meet for the Hawkeyes this season, making the lineup on pommel horse, rings, parallel bars and high bar. He posted a season-high 14.100 on pommel horse against Penn State on March 25.
- Brandon Wong has competed twice for lowa on rings. He recorded a season-best 12.300 at California on
- Josh Zeal has competed in eight events this season on floor and vault. He notched a season-high 14.600
 on vault at Minnesota on March 11.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

Seven University of Iowa men's gymnasts were named to the 2017 Big Ten Winter Academic All-Conference team. To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten, student-athletes must be letterwinners and be in at least their second academic year at the institution. They must also carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better. Seniors Andrew Botto, Cory Paterson, David Spanier and Mark Springett, junior Austin Hodges, and sophomores Todd Beyer and Jake Brodarzon were named to the Academic All-Conference Team.

SCORING CHANGES

A new scoring system has been implemented this year. The new system eliminates an element category in five of the six events, which means that each gymnast will do one less skill in their routine. The old scoring system was based off of five element groups. The result of the change is that each gymnast's score will be .500 points lower than before and team scores will be 15 points lower.

NEW FACE

Former University of Iowa Gymnast Thomas Buese was named the University of Iowa men's gymnastics assistant coach in August. Buese competed for the Hawkeyes from 2005-08. He was a four-time letter winner and was team captain in 2008.
