### **QUICK HITS**

- Iowa has made 10 consecutive postseason appearances (8 NCAA, 2 WNIT).
- The Hawkeyes have made a postseason tournament appearance in 16 of head coach Lisa Bluder's 17 seasons at the helm of the program, receiving 12 NCAA Tournament and four WNIT (2003, 2005, 2016, 2017) opportunities.
- Bluder is one of 10 Division I head coaches to win 699 games or more in her career. She has been a head coach for 33 seasons, including 17 at Iowa.
- Megan Gustafson and Kathleen Doyle earned All-Big Ten accolades last season. Gustafson garnered first team recognition from the league coaches and media, and Doyle was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- Iowa returns nine letterwinners, including starters Megan Gustafson, Tania Davis, Kathleen Doyle, and Makenzie Meyer.
- Junior Megan Gustafson was named Preseason All-Big Ten by league coaches and media, the conference office announced Oct. 23. The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native was a first team All-Big Ten selection (league coaches and media) in 2016. She was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2015.
- Seven of Iowa's nonconference opponents made the 2017 NCAA Tournament, including Quinnipiac, Missouri/Western Kentucky (Hawkeye Challenge), Elon, Florida State, Iowa State, Northern Iowa, and Drake.
- Iowa's sophomore class of Kathleen Doyle, Makenzie Meyer, and Amanda Ollinger combined for 89 games played and 52 starts last season. The class accounted for a combined 38 percent of Iowa's total steals (88/231), 37 percent of Iowa's assists (221/600), and 22 percent of Iowa's total points (565/2588).
- Bluder owns a 343-202 (.629) overall record and a 168-114 conference mark at Iowa. In her 33 seasons as a head coach, Bluder is 699-344 (.670).

- Bluder is 1-of-10 active Division I head coaches with 699 or more victories.
- Bluder is in her 33rd season as a head coach and her 18th at the helm of the Hawkeyes.
- In her 17 seasons in Iowa City, Bluder Iowa's all-time winningest coach has accumulated 343 wins.
- Bluder has collected 10 20-win seasons as a Hawkeye.

#### **GUSTAFSON NEARS 1,000 POINTS**

- Junior Megan Gustafson has 980 career points and is just 20 shy of reaching the 1,000 points milestone.
- Gustafson looks to become the 35th Hawkeye in program history to surpass 1,000 career points.

#### STATISTICALLY SPEAKING

- Iowa's 2016-17 field goal percentage of 47.1 ranked eighth nationally.
- The Hawkeyes also ranked 13th in assists (17.6), 21st in points per game (76.1), and 22nd in defensive rebounds per game (28).

#### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Seven of Iowa's nonconference opponents made the 2017 NCAA Tournament, including Quinnipiac, Missouri or Western Kentucky (Hawkeye Challenge), Elon, Florida State, Iowa State, Northern Iowa, and Drake.
- Five of Iowa's nonconference opponents are ranked or receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches Preseason Poll (Oct. 26). They include: No. 14 Florida State, No. 16 Missouri, Quinnipiac (27 votes), Drake (18 votes), and Elon (1 vote).

#### **OUICK FACTS**

- Iowa finished the 2016-17 season with a 20-14 overall record and an 8-8 mark in conference action.
- The Hawkeyes made their 10th consecutive postseason appearance last season (8 NCAA, 2 WNIT), earning an at-large bid to the WNIT.
- Iowa has made a postseason tournament appearance in 16 of head coach Lisa Bluder's 17 season at the helm of the program, receiving 12 NCAA Tournament and four WNIT (2003, 2005, 2016, 2017) bids.
- The Hawkeyes recorded their 10th 20-win season under head coach Lisa Bluder last season.
- Iowa returns nine letterwinners, including starters Megan Gustafson, Tania Davis, Kathleen Doyle, and Makenzie Meyer.

#### HAWKEYE CHALLENGE HISTORY

- The Hawkeye Challenge began in 1985 and Iowa has included the event in all but two seasons (1996, 2012).
- Iowa is 52-8 all-time in the Hawkeye Challenge.

#### **SEASON OPENERS**

- The Hawkeves are 33-10 all-time in season openers.
- Iowa is 17-0 in season openers under head coach Lisa Bluder.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Oral Roberts, 96-76, in their season opener at Carver-Hawkeye Arena last season.

#### **SCOUTING OUINNIPIAC**

- Quinnipiac played to a 29-7 overall record and a 17-3 mark in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.
- The Bobcats advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen last season with wins over Marquette and Miami. Quinnipiac fell to eventual champion South Carolina.
- Quinnipiac is receiving 27 votes in the USA Today Preseason Coaches Poll
- The Bobcats are the three-time defending MAAC Regular Season Champions and two-time MAAC Tournament Champions. They were picked as the MAAC Conference favorite.
- Junior wing Aryn McClure was named the MAAC's Preseason Player of the Year.
- Iowa leads the all-time series, 1-0. The Hawkeyes won the lone meeting between the two teams, 93-77, in Carver-Hawkeye Arena in 2006.

#### SCOUTING #16 MISSOURI

- Missouri played to a 22-11 overall record and an 11-5 mark in the SEC last season
- The Tigers are ranked No. 16 in both major polls.
- Mizzou was selected to finish third in the SEC, trailing South Carolina and Mississippi State.
- Juniors Sophie Cunningham and Cierra Porter, and redshirt senior Jordan Frericks earned Preseason All-SEC recognition from the league's coaches.
- Missouri head coach Robin Pingeton played for head coach Lisa Bluder at St. Ambrose. She stands as the school's all-time leading scorer (2,502 points) and was an All-American in basketball and softball.
- Iowa leads the all-time series, 5-1. The teams last met in 2004. Iowa defeated Missouri, 75-54, in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

### **HEAD COACH LISA BLUDER**

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir), the all-time winningest coach in program history, enters her 18th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 34th season as a college head coach in 2017.

Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 16 postseason appearances (12 NCAA and four WNIT) in 17 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in eight of the last 10 seasons.

Bluder, the 2015 Carol Eckman Award winner, has posted a 343-202 (.629) record at Iowa and her career



record stands at 699-344 (.670). Bluder surpassed Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins) as the all-time winningest coach in program history on Feb. 10, 2014, as the Hawkeyes defeated Northwestern, 90-84.

Bluder, 1-of-10 active Division I coaches with 699 or more wins, is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010) and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year (2001 and 2008). She has guided Iowa to a winning record in 16 of her 17 years, including 11 upper-division finishes in the challenging Big Ten Conference. Bluder, who ranks second among Big Ten coaches all-time in league victories (168), has led Iowa to 10 20-win seasons in her 17 years, including eight of the last 10 years.

Bluder has coached numerous players to different awards in her 17 years in Iowa City. She has mentored 20 players to 49 All-Big Ten honors, including 14 first team picks, 16 second, 11 third and eight honorable mention selections. She has also had two Big Ten Freshman of the Year award winners, two Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year recipients, nine members of the Big Ten All-Freshman team, and three players named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, with Kachine Alexander earning the honor twice.

Five players during Bluder's tenure have earned a total of seven Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) all-region team accolades and six players have earned a total of 11 honorable mention All-America honors. Bluder coached her first consensus All-American in Samantha Logic, who earned the honor after being named a WBCA Division I Coaches All-American, USBWA All-American, ESPN Second Team All-American, and Third Team Associated Press All-American.

With Bluder on the Iowa sidelines, student-athletes have been named Academic All-Big Ten 86 times, including a program-best eight honorees in 2011 and 2012. Bluder has also mentored three Academic All-Americans in Ally Disterhoft (2015, 2016, 2017), Logic (2015), and Lindsey Meder (2001, 2002). Disterhoft was also named Academic All-America of the Year in 2015 and 2016.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five postseason appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, Iowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

#### SCOUTING WESTERN KENTUCKY

- Western Kentucky finished the 2016-17 season with a 27-7 overall record and a 16-2 mark in Conference USA action.
- The Lady Topper's were picked to finish second in the annual Preseason C-USA Coaches' Poll, behind Middle Tennessee.
- Western Kentucky won the C-USA Tournament in 2017 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. WKU fell to Ohio State. 70-63. in the first round.
- Head Coach Michelle Clark-Heard was an assistant coach on Lisa Bluder's 2015 U.S. Pan American Women's Basketball Team.
- The all-time series is tied, 3-3. Western Kentucky won the last meeting, 68-65, in 1999 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

#### HAWKEYES ROLL TO EXHIBITION WIN

- Iowa defeated Minnesota State-Moorhead, 85-56, in an exhibition contest on Sunday evening in Carver-Hawkeve Arena.
- $\cdot$  Junior Megan Gustafson led the team with 22 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field.
- Junior Tania Davis scored 12 points, sophomore Kathleen Doyle had 10, and senior Chase Coley, sophomore Makenzie Meyer, redshirt freshman Alexis Sevillian, and junior Hannah Stewart scored eight.
- Coley and sophomore Amanda Ollinger each registered a team-high 10 rebounds.

#### **GUSTAFSON EARNS PRESEASON HONOR**

Junior Megan Gustafson was named Preseason All-Big Ten by league coaches and media, the conference office announced Oct. 23. The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native was a first team All-Big Ten selection (league coaches and media) in 2016. She was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2015.

#### **600-POINT CLUB**

- Gustafson became just the fourth Hawkeye in program history to score over 600 points in a single season and the first to do so since 1990. She netted 628 points in her sophomore campaign.
- Gustafson joins Cindy Haugejorde (672; 79-80), Michelle Edwards (621; 87-88), and Franthea Price (614; 89-90) as the only Hawkeyes to break the 600-point mark in a single season.

#### SINGLE-SEASON RECORD HOLDER

- Sophomore Megan Gustafson became Iowa's single-season rebounding record holder with 10 boards against Missouri State on March 16.
- The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native surpassed former Hawkeye Amy Herrig's record of 306 (1998-99).

  Gustafson recorded 343 rebounds on the season.
- Gustafson tallied a team-high 628 points on the year the most points by a sophomore in program history.

#### TANIA DAVIS -- THE RETURN

- Junior point guard Tania Davis will make her return to the Iowa lineup after suffering a seasonending knee injury at Michigan on Feb. 5, 2017.
- In 23 games last season, Davis averaged 10.9 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 4.3 assists.

#### **EXPERIENCED SOPHOMORES**

- Iowa's sophomore class of Kathleen Doyle, Makenzie Meyer, and Amanda Ollinger combined for 89 games played and 52 starts last season.
- The class accounted for a combined 38 percent of Iowa's total steals (88/231), 37 percent of Iowa's assists (221/600), and 22 percent of Iowa's total points (565/2588).

#### DOYLE SUCCESSFUL FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

- Kathleen Doyle was named to the Big Ten All-Freshmen Team last season.
- The LaGrange Park, Illinois, native averaged 9.2 points, 2.6 rebounds, 4.4 assists, and 2.1 steals per game in her freshman campaign.
- Doyle's 148 assists on the season broke a program record for assists in a freshman campaign. She bested Sam Logic's previous record of 136 set in 2012.
- Doyle broke the record for steals in a freshman season, tallying 71 to best the previous record of 57 set by Johanna Solverson in 2003.
- Doyle's 70.1 free throw percentage and 2.1 steals per game led all Big Ten freshmen last season.



#### **ALL-BIG TEN RECOGNITION**

- Megan Gustafson and Kathleen Doyle earned All-Big Ten accolades last season.
- Gustafson garnered first team recognition from the league coaches and media, and Doyle was named to the Big Ten All-Freshmen Team.
- Doyle was the fourth Hawkeye in the last four years to be named to the All-Freshmen Team. Ally Disterhoft earned the honor in 2014, while Gustafson and sophomore Tania Davis were both named to the team in 2016.
- Gustafson led the team in scoring (18.5), rebounding (10.1), and field goal percentage (.647). She scored in double figures in every game last season. Guatafson paced the team in rebounds in 30-of-34 games and led the Hawkeyes in scoring 18 times.
- Doyle averaged 9.2 points, 4.3 assists, 2.6 rebounds, and 2.0 steals per game. She scored in double figures in 15 games, including nine times in conference action. Doyle led all league freshmen, averaging 2.0 steals per game.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

- Iowa was 17-4 in games played in Carver-Hawkeye Arena last season. The Hawkeyes were 14-3 in games played in the regular season and 7-1 in nonconference action on their home court.
- Two of Iowa's four losses at home came to top-five teams (No. 1 Notre Dame and No. 3 Maryland).
- Iowa shot .486 from the field and .338 from 3-point range in Carver. In true road contests, Iowa shot .440 from the field and .254 from distance.

#### OFFSEASON STORYLINES

- Sophomore Kathleen Doyle was invited to the U19 United States Women's Basketball National Team Trials. Doyle competed in the United States Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado, from May 18-21.
- Head coach Lisa Bluder participated in "Over the Edge" on Sept. 14. Bluder faced a fear by rappelling down a 13-story, Iowa City building to raise money for Iowa City's Ronald McDonald House.
- On Sept. 27, the Hawkeyes participated in Habitat for Humanity, assisting in building a house for a local family in need.

#### **DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE**

- Sophomore Megan Gustafson has 27 double-doubles in her Hawkeye career.
- Last season, Gustafson broke a program record with 18 double doubles on the season.
- Gustafson finished 2016-17 ranked fifth nationally in field goal percentage (64.7), 10th in double-doubles (18), 11th in field goals made (260) and rebounds (343), 25th in rebounds per game (10.1), 26th in defensive rebounds per game (7), and 28th in final points (628).
- Gustafson led Iowa in rebounds in 30-of-34 games last season.
- Gustafson netted 20 or more points 15 times in her sophomore campaign.
