PROGRAM QUICK HITS

- Iowa has made 12 consecutive postseason appearances (10 NCAA, 2 WNIT).
- The Hawkeyes have made a postseason tournament appearance in 18 of head coach Lisa Bluder's 19 seasons at the helm of the program, receiving 14 NCAA Tournament and four WNIT (2003, 2005, 2016, 2017) bids.
- Bluder is one of 10 Division I head coaches to win 700 games or more in her career. She enters her 36th season as a head coach and 20th at Iowa in 2019-20.
- Iowa will face 10 2019 NCAA Tournament teams this season, including nonconference opponents Princeton, Towson, Clemson, Iowa State, and Drake, and conference opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, and Rutgers.
- Senior Kathleen Doyle was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team.
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2018-19 season ranked first nationally in field goal percentage (51.5), second in assists per game (21.5), third in total assists (775), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.55), 12th in free throw percentage (77.3), 13th in fewest fouls per game (13.6), and 14th in scoring offense (78.4).
- Bluder owns a 396-217 (.646) record and a 193-123 (.611) conference mark at Iowa. In her 35 seasons as a head coach, Bluder is 752-359 (.677).

SCOUTING FLORIDA ATLANTIC

- Florida Atlantic finished the 2018-19 season with a 5-25 overall record with eight true freshmen, tying the most in the nation.
- The Owls return statistical leaders and sophomores Juliette Gauthier. Abby Voss, and Glenisha Harkless. Gauthier was the leading scorer last season, averaging 11.2 points per game, Voss led the team in rebounds per game (5.9), and Harkless totaled 56 assists.
- In their exhibition against Nova Southeastern, three Owls scored in double digits, including graduate transfer Crystal Primm (23), freshman Lotta Vehka-Aho (21), and Juliette Gauthier (18).
- Head coach Jim Jabir is in his third season at the helm with his 2019-20 squad being comprised of six returners and 11 newcomers.

FLORIDA ATLANTIC -- THE SERIES

- Iowa owns a 1-0 advantage in the all-time series.
- The teams last met at a neutral cite during the 1994-95 season. Iowa won 67-42.

SEASON OPENERS

- Iowa is 35-10 all-time in season openers.
- The Hawkeyes are 19-0 in season openers under head coach Lisa Bluder.
- Iowa defeated Oral Roberts, 90-77, in its season opener at Carver-Hawkeve Arena last season.

HAWKEYE CRUTSE TO EXHIBITION WIN

- Iowa defeated Winona State, 98-53, in an exhibition on Sunday afternoon in Carver-Hawkeve Arena.
- Three Hawkeves scored in double figures. They include: Monika Czinano (27), Kathleen Doyle (20), and Gabbie Marshall (10).
- Sophomore Monika Czinano went 13 for 13 from the field.
- The Hawkeyes tallied 23 assists on 39 field goals. Makenzie Meyer led the team with eight, while Kathleen Doyle added five.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

- Senior Kathleen Doyle earned unanimous preseason All-Big Ten recognition, the conference office announced Oct. 21.
- Doyle, a 2018-19 first team All-Big Ten selection (coaches), earns the second preseason honor of her career. The LaGrange Park, Illinois, native finished last season ranked 15th nationally in assists per game (5.9) and tied for 31st in total assists (170). The senior led the Big Ten with 6.3 assists per game in conference action last season. She scored in double figures 20 times in 29 games, and dished out five or more assists on 21 occasions.

2018-19 RECAP

- The Hawkeyes won their first Big Ten Tournament Title since 2001 and advanced to their first Elite Eight since 1993.
- Iowa tied the highest win total in program history (29 wins, 1987-88).
- The Hawkeyes went undefeated in Carver-Hawkeye Arena for the first time since 2014-15 (18-0).
- Last season, Iowa registered seven wins over ranked opponents (No. 20 West Virginia, No. 20 Minnesota, No. 14 Rutgers, No. 21 Michigan State, No. 7 Maryland, No. 8 Maryland, and No. 10 NC State).
- The Hawkeyes set the Big Ten record for assists in a single-season with 775 assists, crushing the previous record of 694 set by Maryland in 2016-17.
- Iowa set a Big Ten record with 392 assists in conference play, topping Ohio State's mark of 356 set in 1984-85.
- The Hawkeyes averaged 21.8 assists per game during Big Ten contests, passing Iowa's own Big Ten record of 20.8 assists per game during the
- Iowa set new school assists records in back-to-back games, dishing out 34 assists against Western Kentucky (Nov. 13), before besting that mark with 36 against N.C. Central (Nov. 17).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2018-19 season with a 29-7 overall record.
- Iowa registered its 13th upper division finish in conference, placing sec-

HEAD COACH LISA BLUDER

Lisa Bluder, the all-time winningest coach in program history, is in her 20th year as head women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa and her 36th year overall. Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 18 postseason appearances (14 NCAA and four WNIT) in 19 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in 10 of the last 12 seasons. Iowa has advanced to the postseason in 12 consecutive seasons (10 NCAA and two WNIT).

- Iowa has advanced to the postseason in 12 consecutive seasons (10 NCAA and two WNIT).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2018-19 season ranked first nationally in field goal percentage (51.5), second in assists per game (21.5), third in total assists (775), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.55), 12th in free throw percentage (77.3), 13th in fewest fouls per game (13.6), and 14th in scoring offense (78.4).

ROSTER AT A GLANCE

- The Hawkeyes return nine letterwinners, including two starters in All-Big Ten selection Kathleen Doyle and Makenzie Meyer. Alexis Sevillian made 12 starts last season.
- Doyle led the team last season in assists, averaging 5.9 per game a mark that led the Big Ten and ranked 15th nationally. She also led in steals, averaging 2.3 per contest the second-best mark in the Big Ten. She ranked third on the team in scoring, averaging 12.0 points per game.
- Meyer led the team with 62 3-pointers made and recorded 143 assists.
- Guard Megan Meyer enters her freshman season after averaging 24.9 points per game, 4.6 rebounds, and 4.5 assists as a senior. Meyer is a four-time all-state honoree and two-time Globe Gazette Player of the Year (2017, 2018).
- Guard/forward McKenna Warnock joins the squad from Monona Grove where she was the all-time leading scorer (boys and girls) and all-time leading rebounder.
- Guard Gabbie Marshall enters her first year after leading Mount Notre Dame to a 2019 Ohio State Championship title, recording 73 steals and shooting 42.6 percent from 3-point range.
