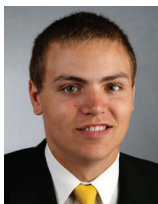

- 1 QB Nate Stanley threw three touchdowns passes in the season opener, raising his career total to 55, fourth all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74), Drew Tate (61), and Ricky Stanzi (56) on the all-time list. (page 6)
- 2 QB Nate Stanley has made 27 consecutive starts at QB. Iowa is 18-9 in those starts, 9-9 in the B1G, and 11-4 at Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes have averaged 30.0 ppg the last 27 games. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active QBs. (page 7)
- 3 DE A.J. Epenesa is named to four preseason All-America first teams, is listed on six preseason watch lists, and is preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.com. The junior led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks last season. (page 6)
- 4 WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette has been named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, an honor bestowed to the most versatile player in college football. Smith-Marsette led the Big Ten and ranked No. 2 in the country last season, averaging 29.5 yards on 24 kickoff returns. (page 7)
- 5 DB Michael Ojemudia recorded Iowa's first theft of 2019, a fourth-quarter interception returned 14 yards that set up Iowa's final touchdown in Week 1. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten and tied for second in the country in 2018 with 20 interceptions. Over the last two seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. (page 8)
- 6 RB Mekhi Sargent led the team in carries (14), rushing yards (91), and receiving yards (65) in Week 1. He tied for the team lead and matched his career high with four receptions. He added a 2-yard touchdown rush while making his fifth career and fifth consecutive start. (page 7)
- 7 Ten different Hawkeyes had at least one reception in Week 1, including sophomore Oliver Martin. The Iowa City native and Michigan transfer hauled in a 9-yard TD pass on his second play from scrimmage.
- 8 Iowa has won five of its last six Big Ten openers. The Sept. 7 calendar date is the earliest date for a Big Ten opener in school history. Rutgers is making its first ever trip to Iowa City for a football game.
- 9 Iowa is one of 15 teams to win at least eight games in every season since 2015. The Hawkeyes are 37-16 since 2015. (Alabama, Appalachian State, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Iowa, LSU, Memphis, Michigan, Ohio, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Stanford, Washington State, Wisconsin).
- 10 Head coach Kirk Ferentz's 153 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (153). Ferentz is on the preseason Bobby Dodd Trophy watch list. (page 5)

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,247 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 651-557-39 (.537). That includes a 406-221-16 (.643) record in home games, a 245-336-23 (.425) record in games away from Iowa City, a 329-378-25 (.465) mark in Big Ten games and a 290-186-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

When Iowa hosts Minnesota on Nov. 16, it will mark the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell.

THE SERIES

Saturday's game is just the second in the history between the two schools. Iowa won the only previous meeting, 14-7, on Sept. 24, 2016, in Piscataway, New Jersey. Rutgers is making its first visit to Iowa City.

WIN, GRADUATE, DO IT RIGHT

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 21st season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 153 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 91 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 144-80 (.643) overall mark and an 87-58 (.600) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 13 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 153-101 (.602) and an 91-72 (.558) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 153 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 165-122 (.575).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz's 153 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (153).

Ferentz has 91 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 91 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz (153-101) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 21st season in 2019.

Both Ferentz (153, 91) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 21st seasons on Iowa's staff. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), enters his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

STANLEY CLIMBS SCHOOL AND CONFERENCE CHARTS

QB Nate Stanley threw three touchdowns in the season opener, raising his career total to 55 touchdowns passes, fourth all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74), Drew Tate (61), and Ricky Stanzi (56) on the all-time list.

Stanley is named to six preseason watch lists and listed on the preseason Big Ten third team by Phil Steele. He has started the last 27 games at quarterback, and the Hawkeyes have averaged 30.0 points per game in those starts. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active quarterbacks.

Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes in 2018, second most in the Big Ten, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for the most in single season school history, and tied for second most all-time in single season history. Stanley also threw 26 touchdown passes in 2017. Stanley's 52 touchdown passes over the last two seasons are the most ever in school history over a two-year span. Long tossed 49 touchdown passes from 1984 (22) to 1985 (27).

Stanley threw for a career-high 2,852 yards in 2018, the seventh-highest single-season total in school history. He ranks eighth in career passing yards (5,603) and ninth career total offense (5,512).

EPENESA NAMED PRESEASON FIRST-TEAM ALL-AMERICAN

DE A.J. Epenesa is named to four preseason All-America first teams, is listed on six preseason watch lists, and is preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.com.

The junior led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks in 2018. He ranked second in the conference and 16th nationally in forced fumbles (4), and ranked fourth in the Big Ten in tackles for loss. He totaled 37 tackles, four pass breakups, eight QB pressures, and a blocked punt in 2018. He recovered his own forced fumble and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown at Illinois.

Epenesa recorded at least one sack in nine of 13 games last season and was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media, and second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches.

The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten last season with 35 sacks, the second highest single-season total in the Ferentz era (2002, 40).

RETURN TO SENDER

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette has been named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, an honor bestowed to the most versatile player in college football.

In Iowa's season opener, Smith-Marsette matched his career high with four receptions, including a 6-yard touchdown catch. He returned one kickoff for 19 yards.

Smith-Marsette averages 29.7 yards on 29 career kickoff returns. The Big Ten record of average kickoff return yardage (minimum 40 returns) is 28.8, set by Stan Brown of Purdue (1968-70).

In 2018, Smith-Marsette led the Big Ten and ranked No. 2 in the country last season, averaging 29.5 yards on 24 kickoff returns. He was named Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year in the Big Ten Conference. He had 23 receptions for 361 yards and three touchdowns. His 15.7 yards per catch led the Hawkeyes (minimum 20 receptions).

THE O-LINE SHUFFLE

The Hawkeyes used nine offensive linemen in their season opener. Outland Trophy contenders LT Alaric Jackson and RT Tristan Wirfs anchored the starting lineup. Redshirt freshman Tyler Linderbaum started at center in his first career game as an offensive lineman, and LG Landan Paulsen and RG Levi Paulsen became the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since 1980. Landen was making his first career start. Levi was making his fourth (Iowa has won each of Levi's four starts).

The personnel changed when Jackson left the game with an injury in the first quarter. G Kyler Schott entered the game, flipping Wirfs to LT and Levi Paulsen to RT. Redshirt freshman Cody Ince, sophomore Mark Kallenberger, and true freshman Justin Britt also saw action. Ince and Britt made their collegiate debuts. Schott played in one game in 2018, and Kallenberger saw action in four games in 2018.

Collectively, the unit led Iowa to 213 yards rushing, averaging 5.2 yards on 41 carries. They were also charged with just one sack, an intentional grounding penalty on QB Nate Stanley. The offensive line allowed 16 quarterback sacks last season, tied for fewest in the Big Ten (Rutgers).

SARGENT LEADS RUNNING BACK BY COMMITTEE

RB Mekhi Sargent led the team in carries (14), rushing yards (91), and receiving yards (65) in Week 1. He tied for the team lead and matched his career high with four receptions. He added a 2-yard touchdown rush while making his fifth career and fifth consecutive start. Sargent is named on the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List.

The Hawkeyes totaled 213 yards on the ground in Week 1. RB Toren Young netted 48 yards and one touchdown on nine carries, and true freshman RB Tyler Goodson rushed nine times for 36 yards. QB Nate Stanley rushed for a career-high 20 yards.

Juniors Ivory Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young shared the workload in 2018. The trio combined for 392 carries, 1,723 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns (nine by Sargent, five by Young, and two by Kelly-Martin). Sargent had 40.6 percent of the carries (159-745), Young had 34.7 percent of the attempts (136-637), and Kelly-Martin has 24.7 percent of the carries (97-341).

Sargent rushed for 100-plus yards in each of the last two regular season games. He rushed for a career-high 173 yards on a career-high 26 carries against Nebraska in Week 12. He added a rushing score (15) and touchdown reception (5). In Iowa's 63-0 win at Illinois in Week 11, Sargent rushed for a then career-high 121 yards, becoming Iowa's first 100-yard back since RB Akrum Wadley in Week 12 of 2017. Sargent had a pair of touchdowns against the Illini. He led the team with 10 total touchdowns.

GRAND THEFT SECONDARY

DB Michael Ojemudia recorded Iowa's first theft of 2019, a fourth-quarter interception returned 14 yards that set up Iowa's final touchdown in Week 1. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten and tied for second in the country in 2018 with 20 interceptions. Over the last two seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. The Hawkeyes have 42 interceptions since 2017. Boston College has 39. Appalachian State, Cal, and Troy have 35.

SS Geno Stone tied for the team lead with four interceptions last season (Amani Hooker and Jake Gervase are now in the NFL). Three of Stone's four thefts were in the fourth quarter. He intercepted Trace McSorley on the Penn State 24-yard line and returned it for a touchdown in Week 8. He intercepted Minnesota inside the 5-yard line on Minnesota's final play of the game, and had a fourth quarter interception against Indiana in the end zone. He started at strong safety Weeks 5-13, his first career starts.

Entering this season, Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 11 seasons, and 16 of the last 18 seasons.

SEEING DOUBLE

Senior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

The last twins to start for the Hawkeyes were SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980.

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa is ranked No. 19 in the preseason coaches poll and No. 20 in the AP preseason poll. It is the 24th time Iowa has appeared in the AP preseason poll, and the first time since opening at No. 17 in 2016.

Iowa has five opponents ranked in the AP preseason top 25 (#7 Michigan, #15 Penn State, #19 Wisconsin, #21 Iowa State, #24 Nebraska). A year ago, Iowa was 1-2 against teams ranked in the AP Top 25. The Hawkeyes fell to No. 18 Wisconsin, 27-17, on Sept. 22, lost, 30-24, on Oct. 27 at No. 17 Penn State, and defeated No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, on Jan. 1 at the 2019 Outback Bowl.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 16th season in 2019.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted, as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2019. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his eighth year on staff, his third as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 12th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has seven players on its 2019 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: TE Drew Cook (Marv, 1985-88), DL A.J. Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), DE Nathan Nelson (Jeff, 1990-92), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick, 1984-85).

Iowa has two sets of the brothers on the team: OL Landan Paulsen and OL Levi Paulsen, and TE Bryce Schulte and WR Quinn Schulte.

Iowa has three players whose brothers played at Iowa: LB Nick Niemann (Ben in 2014-17), FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15), and DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11).

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

TROPHY GAMES

Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2019. Iowa is 13-3 in its last 16 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all three losses coming to Wisconsin. Iowa has also won its last two bowl games, claiming trophies at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl and 2019 Outback Bowl.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 17 of the last 18 seasons. Iowa is 8-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (9) and Wisconsin (8) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 16-15-1 in 32 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (152-101) replaced Fry and completed his 20th season in 2018. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 318 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 69-46 (.596) since 2010.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 180 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz’s first year as head coach (70 draft picks/110 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (42 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 17 years, 150-of-175 (86 percent) of Iowa’s senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 12 years, Iowa has had 44 NFL Draft picks, fourth most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (45), and Michigan (45). Since 2010, Iowa has had 37 players drafted in the NFL, tied for fourth most in the Big Ten – Ohio State (62), Penn State (39), and Wisconsin (37).
- Iowa has had six first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a seven-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as Iowa’s offensive coordinator, was New England’s tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz (inactive), WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Entering the 2019 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (14) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team. The NFL has employed 16 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/5 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa’s starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

Iowa (1-0) defeated Miami, Ohio (0-1), 38-14 on Saturday at Kinnick Stadium

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Nate Stanley threw 3 touchdowns to raise his career total to 55, 1 behind Ricky Stanzi (56) for third all-time in program history. He has 15 career multi-touchdown games.

QB Nate Stanley had 252 yards passing, raising his career total to 5,603 and passing C.J. Beathard for eighth all-time in school history.

LG Landan Paulsen and RG Levi Paulsen became the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

K Keith Duncan scored 8 points (1 FG, 5 PAT). Duncan had not played in game since January 1, 2017 at the Outback Bowl.

WR Oliver Martin made his Hawkeye debut and caught a 9-yard touchdown. Martin had one receiving touchdown for Michigan in 2018.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa is 97-32-2 (.740) in season-opening games, including a 18-3 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz. The Hawkeyes have won six straight season openers and are 18-1 since 2001. Iowa has won nine straight nonconference games over the last two seasons.

Iowa opened the season under the lights at Kinnick Stadium for the first time in program history. Iowa has hosted 19 night games in Kinnick Stadium's history, holding a 13-6 record in those contests.
